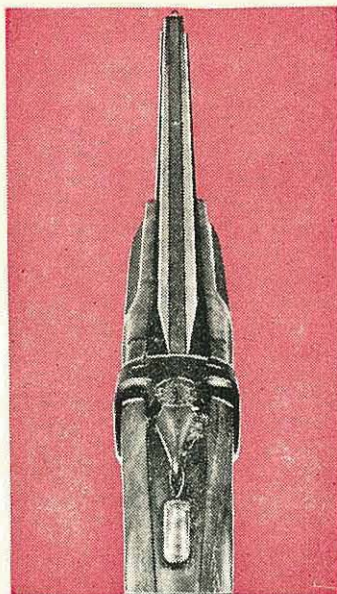

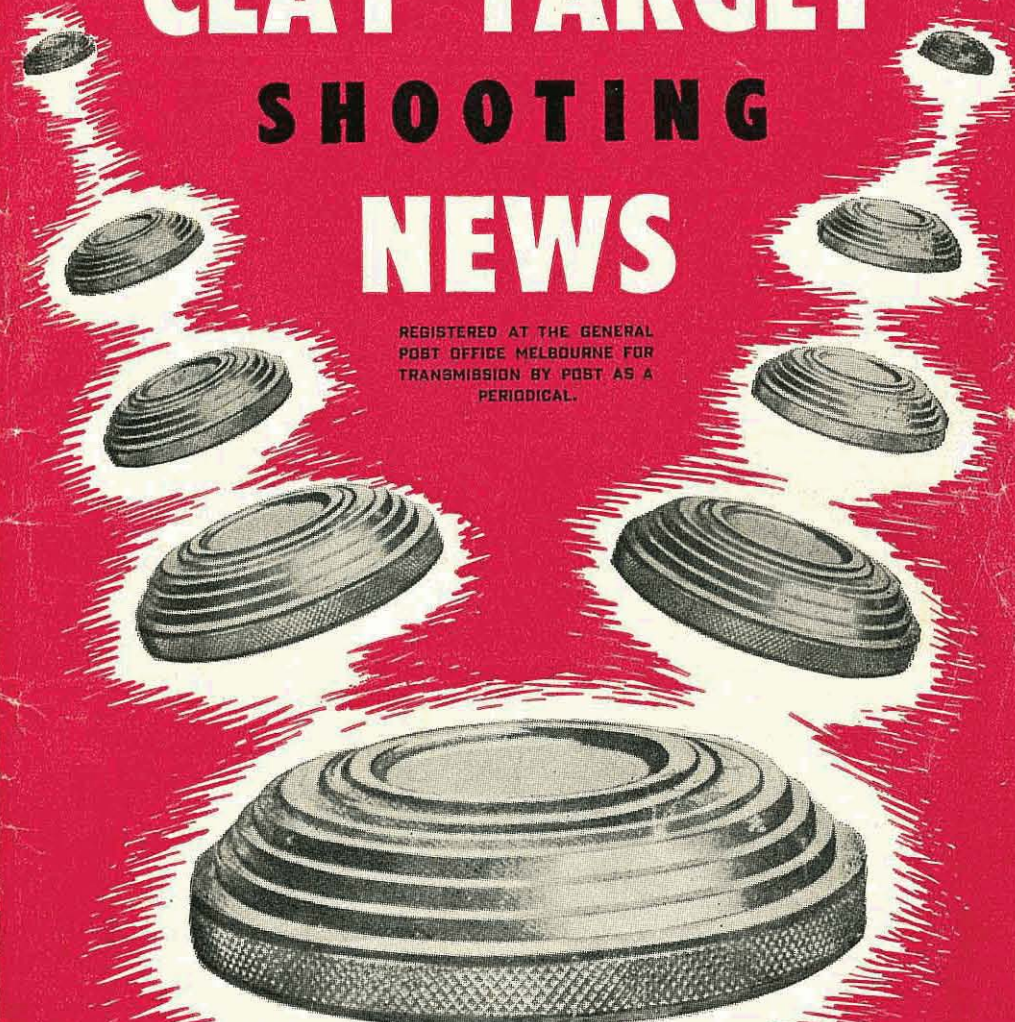

Results of the Twentieth International Teams' Match are withheld until after the International Tournament which will be held on Friday, July 15, at Warwick, Warwickshire, England. Any A.C.T.A. registered shooters visiting U.K. at this time are invited to attend this programme and may obtain further details from the Secretary, A.C.T.A.

Interstate Teams' Matches (1966)

Victorian Section was conducted at the Metropolitan G.C. on April 23. South Australian Section was conducted at Alexandra G.C. on May 1.

Results are withheld until each State has contested and the respective results are received and listed.

All such information is to be lodged by September 7, 1966, with score sheets signed by both referees.

Attention is drawn elsewhere in this issue to the additions and amendments to A.C.T.A. Rules and Championship Conditions (see February 1966 "News") applicable as from June 1, 1966. Paragraph 3 of Rule 101 will be applied as stated.

Some 15 Australians participated in the 1966 New Zealand International Titles conducted by the New Zealand Gun Clubs' Association over the period March 27 till April 2 at Christchurch Gun Club, Yaldhurst, New Zealand. They had the following successes:—

New Zealand Single Barrel — Don Scowcroft (N.S.W.) was placed third.

Fred Lewis (N.Z.), a frequent visitor to Australia, was first with 49/50. Father Kelly (N.Z.), also well known here, beat Don Scowcroft in a shoot-off for second place.

New Zealand Double Barrel — John Thompson (N.Z.) was first with 166/166. M. Fuller (N.S.W.) was second with 165/166. This score was a record for the New Zealand D.B. Championship.

Skeet — First, Bert Walker (N.Z.) with 100/100. Top Australian scorer was M. Fuller (N.S.W.) with 48/50.

Double Rise—First, W. Hall (N.Z.) with 30/30. Top Australian scorers were M. Fuller (N.S.W.) and D. McCraith (Metro.) with 28/30.

High Gun Trophy — First, Alan Donald (N.Z.) with 194. Top Australian scorers were M. Fuller (N.S.W.) with 191, D. McCraith (Metro.) with 189 and D. Scowcroft (N.S.W.) with 187.

In the Double Rise Sweepstakes B. Hill (Sydney) had an outright win with 20/20.

The Australian Skeet Teams Championship was held for the first time. The New Zealand team beat the Australian team by 5 points. The Australian team consisted of F. Hudson, B. Hill, D. McCraith, D. Scowcroft, M. Fuller.

Mr. J. M. Tyquin (President A.C.T.A.), before presenting the New Zealand Team with Australian diaries, was introduced by New Zealand Gun Club Association President, Mr. Tom

Glenn. Mr. Tyquin was the first shooter of the 1966 Australian contingent to receive a dividend during the shoots. Australian shooters present at the New Zealand National shoots were: J. R. Morrison (V.), R. G. Bryant (V.), L. R. Talbot (N.S.W.), J. M. Tyquin (N.S.W.), R. Hogarth (Qld.), G. Hogarth (Qld.), J. Fuller (N.S.W.), K. F. Cameron (Qld.), R. Brady (N.S.W.), F. H. Thompson (N.S.W.), M. L. Wilkins (N.S.W.), F. R. Hudson (N.S.W.), B. Hill (N.S.W.), D. McCraith (V.), D. Scowcroft (N.S.W.), B. D. Doyle (Qld.).

The New Zealand meeting was well conducted and well attended, with nominations of over 250 in the National Double Barrel.

In 1967, the New Zealand Cham-

pionships will be held in Hamilton, New Zealand, during April, and the visit can be highly recommended to A.C.T.A. registered shooters who would shoot from two yards in front of their Australian handicaps.

The new grounds of the South Coast Gun Club at Southport on the Gold Coast (Queensland) are reported to be everything the Association could desire. A.C.T.A. President will be visiting these grounds before the Executive Meeting in October.

Following A.C.T.A. success in obtaining permission to conduct Sunday shoots in New South Wales, the Melbourne "Age" (Friday, 29/5/66) states, "Provisions to allow all sporting gun clubs to hold shoots on Sundays are recommended in a report to Parliament."

NOTICE TO CLUB SECRETARIES

The Articles of Association require all clubs to lodge with the Association's Secretary a copy of their Constitution.

Clubs, when registering annually, are also to state whether they are:

(a) An incorporated Club

or

(b) An un-incorporated Club

and in either case are to state annually the name of their representative (for (a) above) or delegate (for (b) above).

Several member clubs, and some potential member clubs, have recently requested the Association to provide them with a draft Constitution for their clubs. Such a draft is being furnished to them.

It is eminently desirable that so far as is practicable there be uniformity in the Rules of member clubs, particularly those which are un-incorporated, and the Australian Clay Target Association will be happy to provide a set of draft Rules for adoption by members, in substitution for existing Rules, with a view to bringing about throughout the Association a uniformity and simplicity in Rules and administration of the Clubs.

Club secretaries are invited to apply for copies of the "standard Rules for Clubs".

BIG SUCCESS FOR BROADRIBS

at AUSTRALIAN 1966 INTERNATIONAL MEET

The big success by Champions and leading place-takers proved the value of the Broad Rib. The many benefits gained by these users was clearly demonstrated during the 1966 International Meeting. Here is the amazing record:

- Preliminary Handicap** — 1st, Stirling Broad Rib
- Preliminary D.B. Championship** — 1st, Stirling Broad Rib

How a Broad Rib improves shooting was demonstrated by the Winner of the Grand Australian Handicap. Using a Broad Rib Stirling for the first time in this event, this shooter went on to shoot 212 straight. This is probably not so surprising when it's realised that the Broad Rib gave him these seven important benefits:

1. A level and longer sighting plane for easier and surer alignment.
2. The channel in the rib gives clearer vertical perception.
3. The extra width gives a keener sense of elevation, which stops missing the occasional straight away.
4. Miraging is eliminated — the major cause of lost birds in long shoot-offs.
5. The forward balance of a Broad Rib keeps you swinging, eliminates the gun stopping — the cause of many lost birds.
6. The clearer sighting definition permits you to measure your targets, to shoot deliberately, to point them out, as is done by most U.S.A. champions.
7. Greater stability of barrel eliminates whip and makes you a much better second-barrel shot.

The following additions and amendments to A.C.T.A. Rules and Conditions (see February 1966 "News") are applicable as from June 1, 1966:

Rule 101 — Registered Referees

To become a registered referee, a candidate shall approach his club Secretary and President, who (when they consider the candidate has achieved a satisfactory standard), shall recommend to the nearest REGISTERED REFEREE EXAMINER that the candidate be given a practical and oral examination.

When the candidate has passed this examination to the **Examiner's entire satisfaction**, the Examiner will then notify the A.C.T.A. Secretary, who will issue the official A.C.T.A. Referee Badge to the candidate and place his name on the official list of referees.

On receipt of a complaint from any AFFILIATED CLUB or REGISTERED REFEREE EXAMINER, the A.C.T.A. Secretary shall immediately recall the referee's badge and remove from the list of referees the name of any registered referee who refuses to take his turn at refereeing at any shoot or is considered in any way to be incompetent.

Rule 15 — after "when the target is unbroken" ADD "except in Double Rise shooting or Points Scoring".

Rule 64 —

(i) after "and shall be scored" ADD "and called by the referee";

(ii) after "to count as one point" ADD "In the event of a tie, to be shot off squad system, first miss-out, best of each pair, until finality".

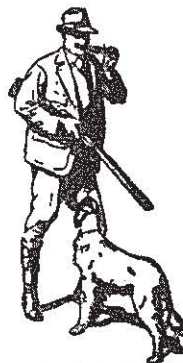

OUT OF THE PAST

Twenty-five Years Ago

Bob Elliott, a trainee pilot in the R.A.A.F., about this period 20 years ago, won one of the main events at a Nobel fixture. Those who recall the event will remember that Elliott was quite a youngster, but he shot with plenty of confidence. Elliott hailed from Wellington in New South Wales. Nothing has been heard of him since those far-off days.

The late Laurie Tewksbury was in good form at a Blackburn meeting, winning outright the first three events listed on the programme.

About this time the late Donald Mackintosh instituted a Fund which was taken up by the sporting newspapers of the day. The Fund was termed the "Fags for Fighters" Fund. At a shoot at Benteigh for the Fund Mr. Mackintosh presented a Gold Cup for competition, and this was won outright by the Colac shooter Eric Ball, who defeated a field of 40 and ran up a string of 41 straight for the day. Laurie Tewksbury, maintaining his good form of the period, bettered this break with 44 straight and shooting 63/64 for the day. Lance Cockett of Boronia, who has recently returned

from a trip abroad, was under notice at Blackburn, winning two events. Cockett has always shot under the nom-de-plume of "Lance". Proceeds to the Fund from this shoot totalled \$100.

Shooting at Camberwell, Harold Ogg and the late Laurie Tewksbury gave a splendid display of combination shooting to win the Metropolitan Deauville Doubles Championship, dropping one pair only. Tewksbury was also again under notice with a 38/40 in another "Fags for Fighters" Fund shoot.

Jock Wilson, using his famous shooting name of "Jock", was apparently seeing them well during a Blackburn shoot late in June 1941. He defeated a namesake in Don Wilson of Hobart (Tas.), who was then a member of the R.A.A.F., on the 30th round, with Tewksbury in third placing. The late T. J. Saville, formerly of Mentone, won a front-marker award on the same programme.

The late Ray Chandler won a skeet event at Coburg Club. The Coburg Club does not now shoot skeet.

Fifteen Years Ago

Jack Headland, a member of the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee, who rarely shoots in competition, returned the only 49/50 to win the Australian Jubilee Handicap at East Burwood. The contest was a 50 birder, and Headland missed only his 27th release. The tie shoot for places went: the late Lionel Byrne (second) 55/57, Stan Thompson (one-time secretary of the Shepparton Club) 54/57

(third), then followed Keith Styles 53/56, George Copeland 51/54, Clem Mudford 48/51.

At St. James in north-eastern Victoria the main event of the day went to A. Parker, a local shooter, 21/22, from A. Roberts (Yundool) 20/22; front-marker was the now prominent rifle shot, J. J. Callaghan, of Shepparton, 15/16.

Ten Years Ago

NORTHAM (W.A.) held its Annual Championships at its improved site at Grass Valley under good conditions after a fortnight's continuous rain. Approximately 60 shooters faced the traps over the events, with over 60,000 clays being released over the

two days. All clubs in the State were represented. In the shoot-off for the District Deauville Doubles, ten pairs shot the possible, and in the shoot-off, which went to 65 pairs, P. Humphrey and B. Humphrey (Northam), D. Hilton and T. Young (Katanning)

and A. Coutts and R. Holtfreter (Northam) were still shooting when the failing light put an end to the day's shooting.

NARRANDERA (N.S.W.)—A team of shooters from Cowra were wrongly directed from Wagga, and on the outskirts of Narrandera their car went into a hole in the middle of the floodwaters on the highway. Although these now very wet shooters had been travelling since 3 a.m., and their car was now almost submerged, they landed at the club full of smiles ready for the shoot. The Championship was won by Fred Hudson from Alf Campbell (Cowra). E. Alberts and R. Bushby won the

Hudson Challenge Shield for the third time in succession.

WONTHAGGI (V.) staged a successful shoot, with a profit of \$100, in aid of the Wonthaggi Citizens' Board.

BOTHWELL (Tas.) — Under cold and gusty conditions excellent shooting by Paul Marshall, scoring 15/15 at clay sparrows.

HERBERT RIVER (Qld.) — In the shoot-off for the special trophy donated by E. J. Ford, both shooters, W. Hughes (winner), R. Russo (second), scored a 55-bird break.

CLAY TARGETS

Clay Targets are made to Clay Target Association specifications, and in 1956 the "pigeons" were easy prey in Melbourne for Olympic shooters. About 80,000 targets were produced recently for the Association's Championships, held at Bankstown, New South Wales, last month.

The targets are black when they come off the moulding machine, but some are painted white to show clearly in the lighting used for night shoots, and others are capped with orange, to sharpen visibility against dark backgrounds.

There are three sizes — midget, sparrow and pigeon.

The manufacturing process involved is simple, but to meet the heavy demand the operators are kept well occupied.

Raw materials of crushed limestone and hard pitch are fed into a mixing pot, in the appropriate proportions, and the mixture heated. It is then fed into the moulding machine, and the black targets are lifted off, and stacked on a bench.

Made up in stacks of 25, they are packed in cartons of 200.

The moulds are checked regularly so that uniformity of size is maintained, and that the production flows smoothly from the moulding machine.

HOW TO BECOME A CHAMPION TRAPSHOOTER

(Written by Someone who Should Know)

Lt. Col. E. S. Throckmorton was the first man to register 100 straight from 27 yards. Lt. Col. Throckmorton's historic feat was recorded at the Cortez (Colo.) T.C. on July 19, 1964. Only three others since then have been able to equal his record. Lt. Col. Throckmorton had been on the 27-yard line just one week before setting the record, long enough to register just 300 targets from that mark. The Missouri native is a career Army man, currently with U.S.A. Artillery in Omaha, Neb. He has been shooting trap since 1956. A former Texas State singles champion, Lt. Col. Throckmorton was named to the 1965 All-America men's first team.

Trapshooting is refined gun pointing, so, to become a trapshooter requires more than basic ability in shooting a shotgun. Information in this area is readily available through solicited and unsolicited advice.

Whether you are a new shooter or an old shooter, advice given to you is usually worth what it costs. So, a person must evaluate all he hears and sift out the best of it. What is good advice for one may be poor advice for another. Some day in the not-too-distant future a person will be able to consult with the gun club "pro" to obtain advice and help much in the same manner as golfers and skiers have professional help today. But until that time the best thing to do is to pick out a shooter of known and established shooting ability and implore him to help you. After the first "help" session, observe your appointed instructor while he is actively engaged in shooting to see how he shoots — that is, how he mounts his gun, checks the stock, his stance and position of feet, where he points the gun prior to calling for the bird and all manner of other instructions which he gave you. Watching other good shooters can be as beneficial in some ways as instruction itself, provided the observer analyses the actions of the shooter. Once an instructor is selected, a person should be exceedingly reluctant to solicit or listen to advice from other self-appointed instructors,

for doing so usually serves only to confuse.

As in every other sport of physical skill, technique and refinements come along only after much shooting and concentrated self-analysis and constructive criticism of one's actual shooting. While not immediately apparent, physical condition is a factor in trapshooting. It can mean the difference between a 199 and a 200. Physical stamina should be sought so that you can lift an eight-pound weight 100, 200 or more times in an hour or so, for this is the least of what you do when shooting a 100, 200 or marathon-target event. So, rather than brute force, enduring stamina is needed.

The time-worn adage about "practice makes perfect" holds true in trapshooting more than any other shooting sport in which I have engaged. Even so, I have seen shooters who could break them all in practice fairly come apart at the seams during a registered shoot, the difference being competitive pressure. There is but one cure for this malady (pressure), and that is lots and lots of match (registered) shooting.

Eventually confidence is gained and the pressure is reduced — never completely eliminated, but reduced.

Early in the season I try to attend a 500-bird marathon, for I find that this has a decidedly beneficial effect on my shooting the rest of the year. In shooting these 500 birds, I concentrate more on stance, swing and timing than I do on making a good score. However, this is not to say that I do not care about the score; for with every shot I fire, I analyse it, subconsciously at times, for ways to improve my next shot. The 500-bird marathon provides sustained opportunity for this analysis and further assists in removing the over-the-winter kinks and bad trap-shooting practices brought about by free and loose live-game shooting.

A person's mental outlook plays a big part in trapshooting. While usually over-worked, the word "concentration" cannot be emphasised enough. Concentration to me con-

tures up one thought — break THIS bird NOW! If you shoot each bird, ONE at a time, your score will reflect it with more straights! All too often we think about the 100 straight before breaking the next bird out — which breaks the concentration, but not the clay pigeon. I find during practice that if I can work up some kind of contest with one or more members of my squad, I tend to concentrate more on my shooting. Further, I have observed that many of the better shooters throughout the country practice once, twice and more often each week in addition to the registered matches which they attend. This gives more substance to "practice makes perfect!"

What makes a champion? Many things, I guess, but the best advice that I can give can be summed up in one sentence — get out to the trap range and SHOOT until you can break ALL the birds ALL the time!

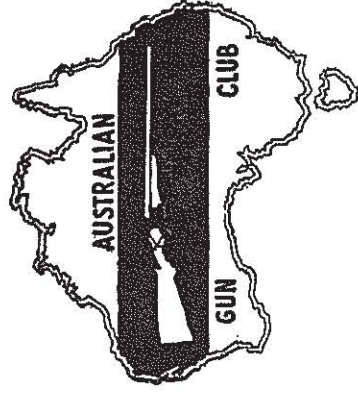

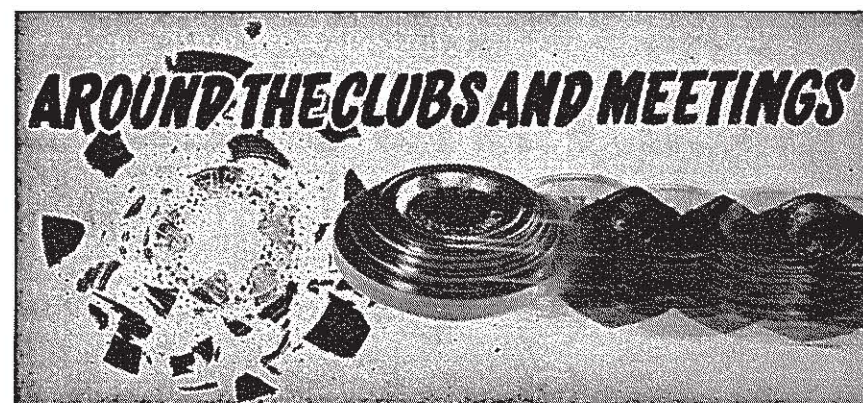

BRISBANE GUN CLUB has a project well under way for re-establishment on a new site and will be able to offer unique facilities to Clay Pigeon Shooters.

The site is at Belmont, on twelve hundred and fifty-one acres of Commonwealth-owned land under the administration of the Queensland Rifle Association.

The main shooting fraternity of Brisbane will be centred in the area, and already established is the Sporting Shooters' Association, with fifteen bench-rest positions, a 50-meter range and a clay target trap; the 303 shooting fraternity, with two ranges up to 900 yards, totalling forty targets; the small-bore shooters, with sixty positions up to 100 yards; two pistol ranges which will subsequently cater for up to one hundred shooters simultaneously, and a complete archery area, including fifty field targets, a clout and normal target area which caters for up to fifty firing shoulder to shoulder.

The archers also use one of the 303 ranges for their flight practice.

Facilities already available to the Brisbane Gun Club comprise men's accommodation in the form of five brick motel units with four rooms in each unit, a large dining room and amenities area, washing and laundry facilities and sewerage, all being of modern construction.

Very suitable facilities are therefore available to trap shooters who travel with a caravan and prefer to live at the site when major trap shoots are conducted.

By June of this year, main access gravel roads within the area will be bitumen sealed.

With the ready co-operation of Mr. John Tunstall, Inspector of Rifle Ranges in Queensland, and Mr. Arthur Penwam, Committee Chairman of the Queensland Rifle Association, a very suitable site has been allocated for the Brisbane Gun Club.

Considerable clearing and earth works is completed to allow for the immediate installation of four traps and the addition of two further traps when required.

As Brisbane's climate is considered ideal for night shooting, lighting will be installed for this purpose, and at a later stage, skeet shooting facilities will be added.

A modern brick and steel club house with a glass frontage is to be erected with an adjacent children's playground area.

Recently elected President of the Club, Mr. Bill Edwards, Jr., son of "Big Bill" Edwards, probably best known at the moment as President of the Australian Lawn Tennis Association, is a chip off the old block, and under his capable administration, Brisbane Gun Club members and visitors will be assured of shooting facilities of a high standard.

The grounds are ideally situated, being nine miles from the centre of the City, less than an hour's easy drive from the Gold Coast, and only a few miles from pleasant sea-side resorts.

The move from the Club's present site at Tingalpa to the new Belmont site will take place by May of this year.
