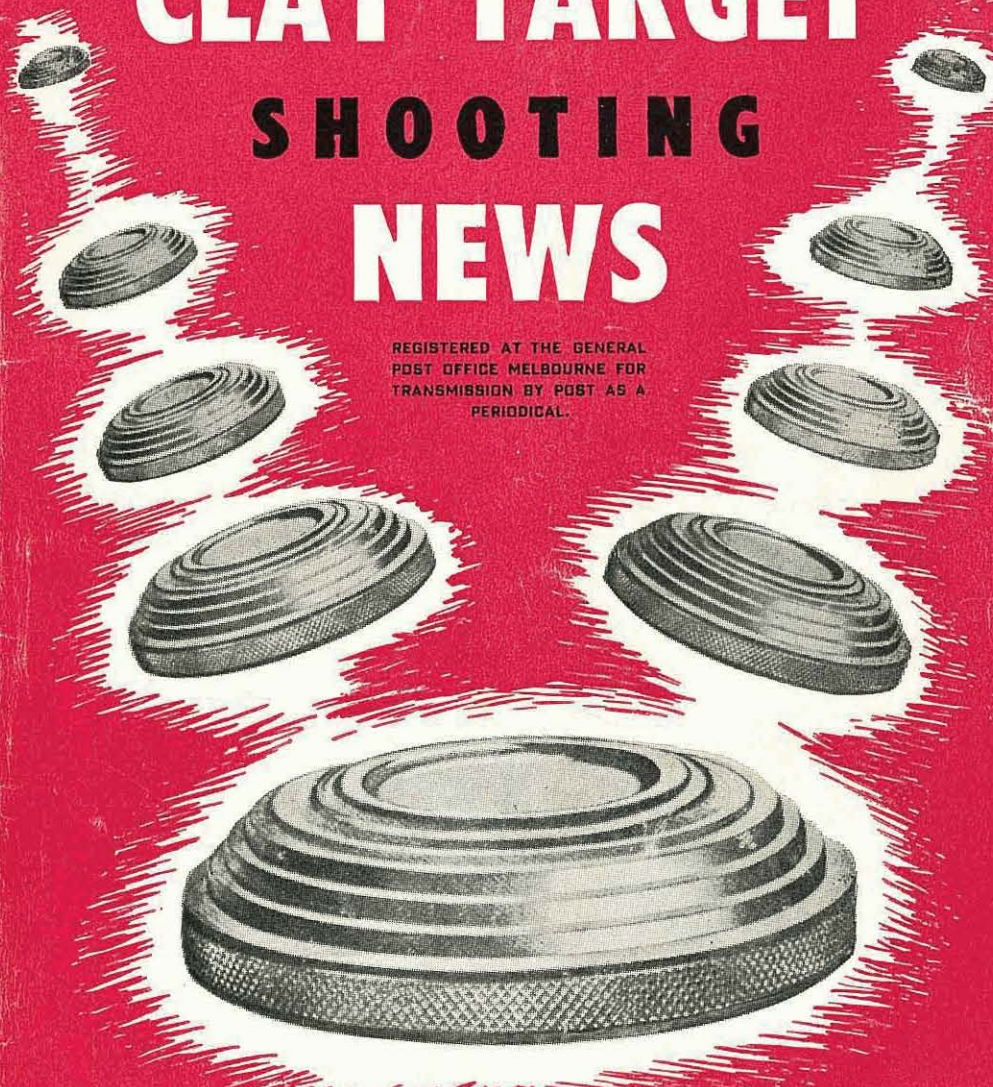

A.C.T.A. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING.

The next scheduled meeting of the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee will be held in the R.A.C.V. in Melbourne over the period Thursday - Friday, October, 6-7, 1966.

Those interested or concerned are requested to lodge, in writing, any matter for inclusion on the Agenda of that meeting with the Secretary, A.C.T.A., G.P.O. Box 2038 S, Melbourne, C.I., Vic., not later than August 31, 1966.

NOTICES OF MOTION.

Notices of Motion referring to the Articles of Association and the Constitution of the A.C.T.A., are required to be submitted in writing to the Secretary, A.C.T.A., G.P.O. Box 2038 S, Melbourne, C.I., Vic., on or before September 30, 1966, in accordance with Article 43 (D). All Notices of Motion are required to be first submitted to the Executive Committee for approval before being presented to the next Annual General Meeting.

A.C.T.A. 1967 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS.

Applications for open championships to be contested during 1967 (that is, Commonwealth, State and District Titles) are required to reach the A.C.T.A. office, in writing, not later than Thursday, September 1, 1966.

Such applications shall be collated and submitted to the Executive Committee for consideration and allocation.

Member clubs are requested to measure their applications and to

apply only for championships which can be satisfactorily conducted during the period concerned.

Attention is drawn to the last paragraph of the Handicapping Formula (see February 1966 "News"). Handicap Return forms are required for all shoots.

A.C.T.A. Championship Badges and Club Championship Badges are to be ordered on the prescribed form, via A.C.T.A. office, and will be invoiced accordingly to the member club concerned by the A.C.T.A. (see February 1966 "News", pages 5 and 6).

A quotation and exclusive design will be submitted, by the makers, to the Secretary of the club concerned.

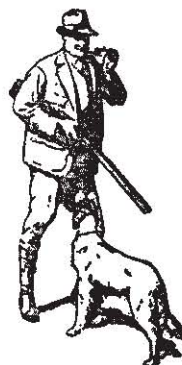

GUN GOSSIP—April 1966 A.C.T.A. "NEWS" — gave the story of the "LJUTIC TRAPGUN":

In November, 1964, a fire destroyed the home and business, plus much of the equipment of Mr. Al and Mrs. Nadine Ljutic. On March 23, 1966, Ljutic Industries Inc. were re-established at 918 N, 5th Avenue, Yakima, Washington, U.S.A., with 11 persons on the pay-roll and an estimated production rate of 25 of the hand-worked guns a month. A wad business has produced a further saleable product—the left-over board from the punched fibreboard is sold as a starter for charcoal and similar fires.

RE-LOADERS — When re-loading plastic hulls wash them first in hot water. It will make the primer pockets tighten again and seems to re-condition the ends of the hulls.

Two shooters recently were re-loading when the re-loader blew up. The full plastic powder hopper was too close to a light bulb on the re-loading bench, and the plastic acted like a magnifying glass. Luckily no one was hurt in the fire—just singed. The loader melted and the fire in the house was extinguished with little damage, BUT advice is "Keep light bulbs at a safe distance—this may save someone's house and maybe their eyes."

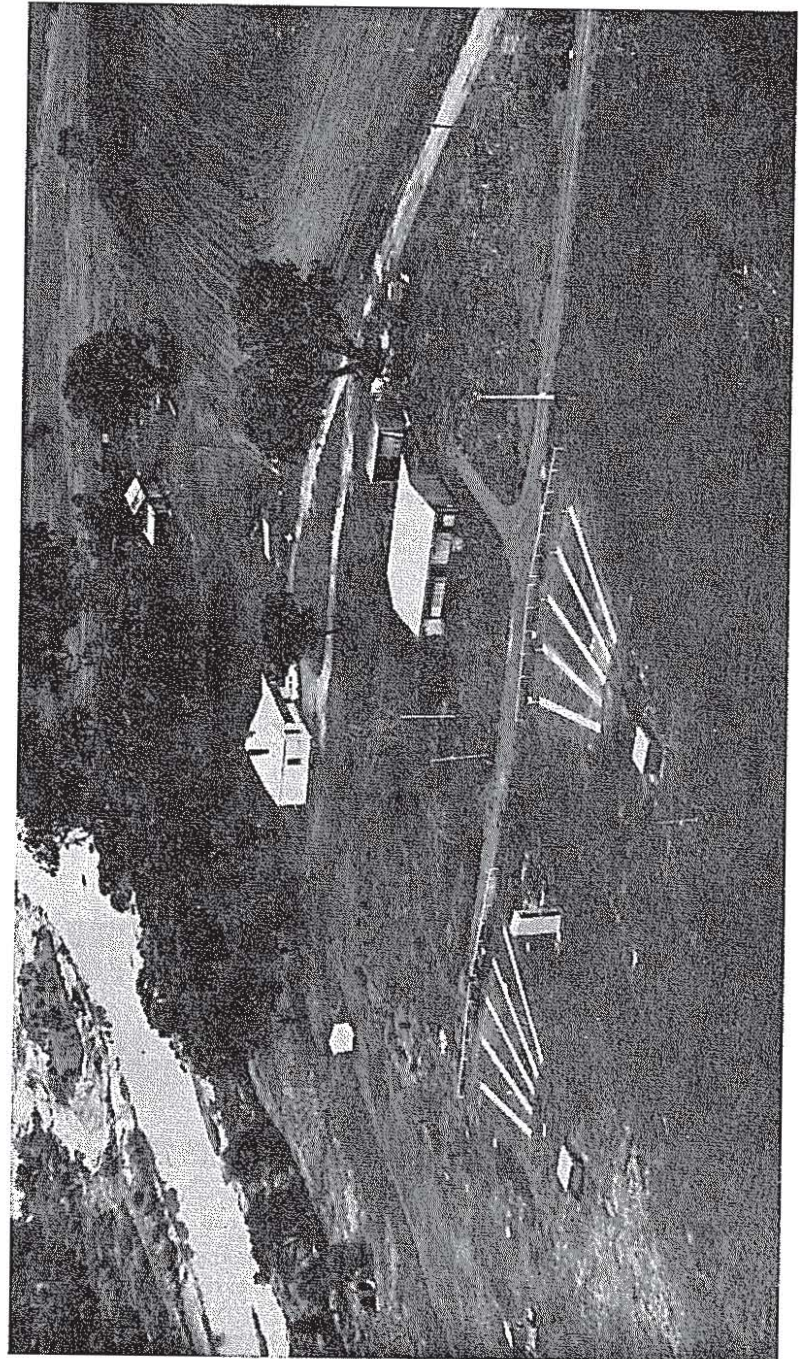
The idea of forming a Gun Club in Northam was first mooted in 1953, the first meeting being convened on the 13th December of that year. On 6th June, 1954, the Club conducted its first shoot on a site at Grass Valley, kindly made available by a local farmer.

Since its inception it has been the ambition of Club members to obtain their own property for a Club site and in 1963 the Club purchased a 55-acre property known as Island Farm, situated one mile from the Northam Town-site. Since then, by virtue of many voluntary working bees, the Club has developed into one of the best in the country. Already two complete electric down-the-line lay-outs are in operation, and a third will be completed prior to the Championships and Interstate Teams Shoot, which will be held on the 3rd-4th September this year.

A skeet lay-out is also in operation and is fitted with electric release mechanism. As shown in the photograph, the new Clubhouse is an imposing structure with its glass front and aluminium roof. Amenities include refrigeration, gas stove and septic toilet facilities. Over 100 shade trees have been planted to provide a picnic area in the years to come. In the background of the photograph is the Avon River adjoining some of the cultivated land which will again be seeded to wheat this year. The house on the property is rented. The revenue from both these projects provides capital for the development of our grounds and facilities.

The Club is within one mile of the main shopping area of the town of Northam, which has excellent facilities, including a new motel to cater for the needs of the many shooters who may care to attend the events advertised in this issue.

Eastern States shooters would be particularly welcome and a visit to the "Wildflower State" at this time of the year is highly recommended.

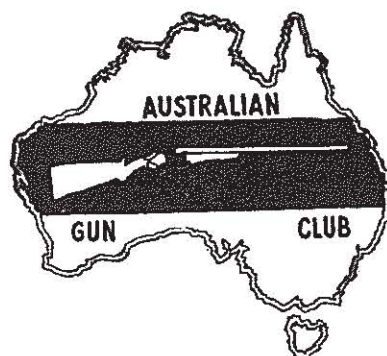

SAFETY RULES

for
People
Going
Bush



In this country of extreme, dehydrating heat, a person should not go into the bush, or anywhere off the beaten track, unless he has first ascertained all available information about the area he intends to visit, and has properly equipped himself with water, food and reliable transport.

At the request of many shooters and with ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS TO THE COMMISSIONER OF POLICE (N.T.) and THE NORTHERN TERRITORY TOURIST BUREAU, the following hints are being published progressively in A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" over July to September, 1966.

Most visitors have no difficulty when visiting the Northern Territory, and this information is intended for the guidance of those planning to drive away from the main highways in the Territory or elsewhere within the States of Australia, BUT, REMEMBER, "you are in the bush very, very soon after leaving any highway or major road."

(Issued by Authority of the Commissioner of Police in association with the Northern Territory Tourist Bureau)

(PART 2)

RECOGNISED DISTRESS SIGNALS

Recognised distress signals are:—

3 shots, or 3 shouts, in quick succession.

3 fires, or 3 smoke columns, in a row.

3 flashes from a torch, mirror or similar article.

For this reason, be careful not to do any of these things without genuine cause, thus misleading others to assume them to be distress signals.

When trying to attract attention vocally, the names of your party would naturally be worth using. Upon hearing their names shouted, they will surely realise that something is wrong and that they, specifically, are required to do something about it.

For long-distance calling the old "Coo-ee" is well worthwhile. Spread the "Coo" out into a long, high-pitched sound like a siren, and bite the "ee" off in a sharp, whip-like finale. It carries a long way and is unmistakable as a bush call.

If you get no results, stay where you are and repeat at intervals, or change over to one of the other recognised signals.

At the same time, remain calm and continue dispassionately to try to recall all useful landmarks so as to fix your position and the direction that should take you back to camp or party. Until you are clear and confident on this point, stay where you are and keep signalling. Keep as much as possible in any shade that is available. Conserve energy. Conserve water. Keep calm.

If there is high or rising ground nearby, it is desirable to get up on it. It gives you a better chance to pick out landmarks, signs of camps or buildings, tracks, dust, flashes from vehicle wind-shields, water-courses, etc., and gives others a better chance to hear or see your signals. These are the only circumstances under which you should move, unless the higher outlook gives you the desired lead as to the direction you are seeking.

If you make this move, blaze a trail from your starting point to your new position—shave or bruise tree

trunks, snap and leave hanging small branches, saplings and tall grass, and leave boot-marks as clearly defined as you can. Every unnatural disturbance of earth, grass or foliage will assist searchers to follow your trail. Arrows marked out on clear places are helpful pointers to those who may be looking for you.

Walk without haste, with a steady, swinging stride, and use only steady, deliberate exertion in marking your trail.

At night keep the signal fires burning. Signal shouts and shots could be repeated, as sound travels a great distance at night.

At daylight, again make a calm and dispassionate survey of the countryside, but unless you are completely confident of finding your way, stay where you are, to conserve both energy and body fluids, and to avoid the heart-breaking probability of missing your searching companions en route. If you feel confident enough to move, move steadily and only in the early morning or the cool of the evening. Conserve water. Make as much use of shade as possible. Blaze your trail distinctly.

DO NOT PANIC

Whether moving or waiting, think deliberately and avoid panic. Panic is the great killer because it leads to despair; deprives you of the ability to reason, and drives you to foolish, desperate exertions that spell only one terrible word—death.

Use psychology in your own favour, not against yourself. The awful thought of perishing is the real source of panic and surrender. But the happy and inspiring fact remains that people can and do survive for long periods in spite of thirst, hunger and other circumstances. In the Northern Territory in 1963 there were two good examples of this. One man was found alive after being lost in the bush in arid country, with great temperature extremes, for a fortnight; another, fortunate enough to come across a river, was found alive after a full month. The only food these men had, consisted of the roots and stems of some bush plants. The lesson is very clear—never give up hope of rescue.

You may not get into a situation in which you become lost—but you may easily be travelling in a motor vehicle that breaks down in an isolated area and cannot be started again. The information you have previously gathered about this particular area, and particularly the observations you have made on the way in, will indicate whether there is a camp or other source of help

within easy reach, or whether there is any water to go back to in the event of your supplies running out. (It is useless and could be fatal to go back, blindly hoping, to a dry waterhole or creek.)

GENGE S. MARTIN

(Southport, Qld.)

Genge S. Martin, a former President of the South Coast Gun Club at Southport (Qld.) rang down the curtain on a lifetime of sporting activity when he passed away on June 25, 1966.

For many years Genge Martin was the life-blood of the emergence from lowly obscurity of the sport of clay target shooting in Southern Queensland. Always noted for his unbounded enthusiasm in any enterprise he undertook, Martin played no small part in the establishment of the now active South Coast Gun Club (now Gold Coast Gun Club) at Southport. He followed the Cunnamulla grazier Eric Ryland as President of the South Coast Club and was actually the first resident President—the club being largely made up of Western Queenslanders who only visited the club when they decided to have a spell at Surfers Paradise. With the former Surfers Paradise postmaster, the late "Ike" Sturgess, whose P.O. was then in Pacific Highway (not to be compared with the present spacious Post

Office in Cavill Avenue), and who was the able Secretary of the South Coast Club, Martin, with Eric Ryland, worked untiringly to ensure that the South Coast Club got under way. All three spent practically all their leisure moments "doing something for the club".

Martin was for some years a member of the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee and was a regular competitor at the A.C.T.A. National Championships and International meeting in every State where the series was held. In later years he was nominated as an Honorary Vice-President of the A.C.T.A. and only resigned from this position a few months ago.

Generous to a degree, Martin was a first-class host and was noted for his hospitable arrangements at his gracious beach-front home, "Amaroo", Surfers Paradise.

South Coast will not seem the same without the presence of Genge S. Martin.

Deepest sympathy is extended to his widow and family.

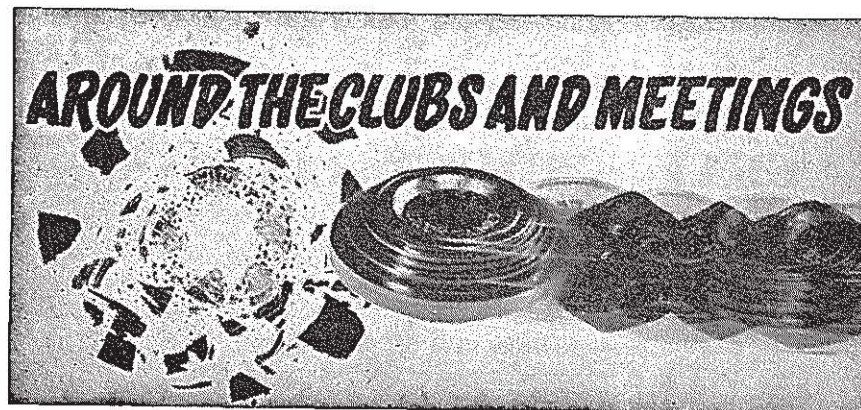

DAMO TRAP PROCEDURE

Recently the N.S.W. Gun Club installed two Damo Electric Skeet Traps, and a special Damo Auto Electric Continental Trap. These traps have created great interest to all who have seen them and shot over them, and it is considered that the following details will be of interest to all shooters.

Damo Electric Skeet Traps. These units consist of the standard electric Damo trap body mounted on a non-oscillating base, the trap cocking automatically, the boy in the skeet house only having to place the clay in position. The trap is then fired by the Referee, who presses a button in a three (3) button control which he carries around with him. This control can be mounted on a piece of board so that the referee can score as well as press the button. The button on the left will fire the high tower, and the button on the right will fire the low tower, while the centre button will fire both traps simultaneously, the targets crossing exactly on the centre line. A feature of these skeet traps is the great accuracy with which targets are thrown and all unbroken targets can be picked up in a circle four feet in diameter. All parts for these traps are interchangeable with the standard Damo.

Damo Auto Electric Continental Trap. This unit throws varying targets both in height and in angle, no two targets are the same. The trap consists of the standard Damo trap body and base, with special attachments welded on to allow the trap to oscillate in the vertical plane and at the same time to oscillate in the horizontal plane.

The trap has different oscillating frequencies for both vertical and horizontal oscillation, therefore you may get a low right-hand target and the next target could be a high right-hand one. The trap has a vertical adjustment which, when set in No. 1 position, will throw its low target 5 ft. above the ground, and the high target 20 ft. above the ground; this means you could get a target anywhere between 5 ft. and 20 ft. high. When set on No. 2 position, the variance would be 5 ft. to 30 ft., and No. 3 position gives you 5 ft. to 40 ft. While this variation on any setting is constant, the trap can be adjusted to make the low target 2 ft. above the ground; the variation would be the same, therefore, if the trap were set in No. 1 position and the low target set at 2 ft. high, then the high target would be 17 ft. high, and so on.

The advantage of this trap is that it can be used for straight down-the-line shooting, throwing regulation targets, or it can be used as above. It will throw Double Rise and all targets the same as the Standard Damo. No tools are required to make the change-over from one type of targets to another; all you do is switch on the vertical oscillation motor for Continental targets, or leave it switched off for regulation targets.

This trap now fills the requirements of those shooters who get a little tired of down-the-line shooting, and who feel that the regulation targets are too easy. These shooters are assured that with the trap wound up to throw the targets 65 yards, and with all oscillations set on maximum, they will find their skill tested very fully.

This trap, when set for Continental targets, is invaluable for practice before a big shoot or the International. As we all know, we get used to shooting regulation targets which come out at the same height, and we develop a rhythm in shooting them. Then suddenly we get a high or a low target and our sub-conscious reflexes do not make the necessary adjustment and we have a lost target. These Continental targets train you to treat each target on its merits. Your sub-conscious is taught to read each target as it leaves the trap and to shoot at what you see, and in this manner your concentration is helped quite considerably.

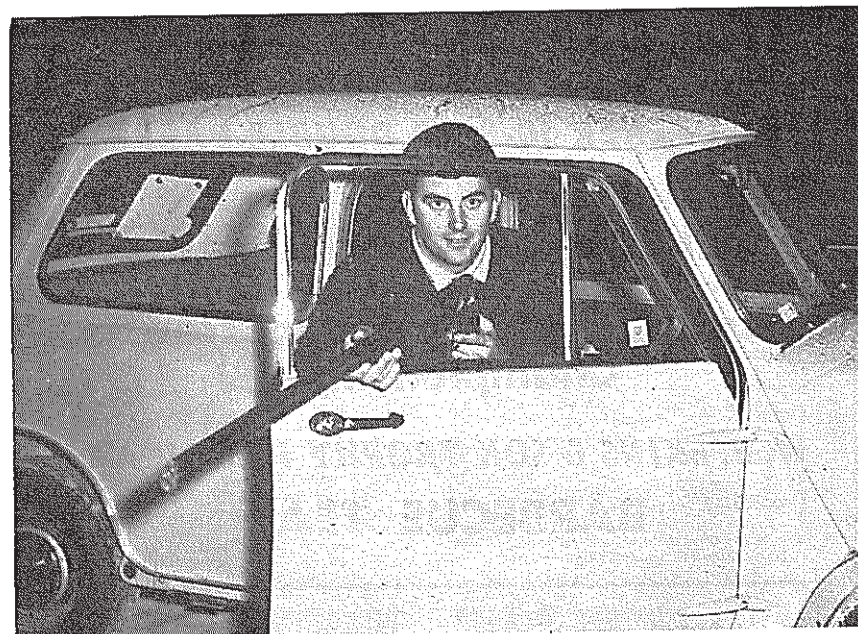

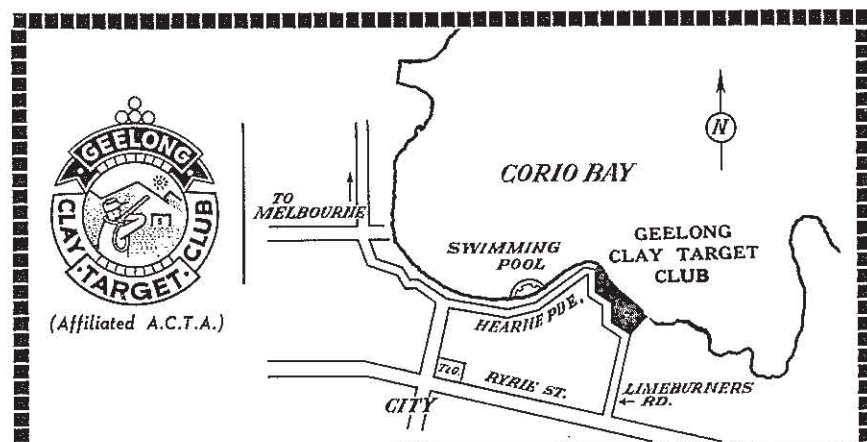

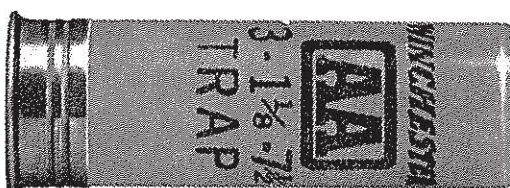
