

A.C.T.A. SHOOTING "NEWS"

Commencing with this (October 1966) issue, we have now entered the 20th year of publication of the "News".

No publication will be made for the month of January 1967, as the printing trade is on vacation over the greater part of that month. Those submitting copy and advertising matter concerning January and early February are reminded that all this must appear in the DECEMBER publication, for which the deadline is November 1. The deadline for February "News" is December 15 ACTUAL.

Each team consisted of 30 shooters, as in the past, but for the next five years (1966-1970) only the 25th highest scores are to count, with each team shooter facing 100 targets, from 16 yards in four stages of 25 targets over four traps. Two barrels are allowed, scoring 3 points for a first-barrel kill and 2 points for a second-barrel kill. (Highest possible score: 7500 points.)

The International Match of 1967 will be held on Friday, July 21, near Dublin, Ireland, by The Clay Pigeon Shooting Association of England, who have cordially invited any registered Australian shooters wishing to attend this 1967 Tournament in Ireland to give advance notice to A.C.T.A. Secretary.

A.C.T.A. RULES AND CONDITIONS

1. AMENDMENTS:

Many shooters and some recent candidates for Referee examinations have not read or absorbed the Amendments to A.C.T.A. Rules and Conditions as published in June 1966 "News".

2. WINNERS OF CHAMPION-SHIPS — HANDICAPPING:

(a) A shooter winning a championship which is shot from in front of his current A.C.T.A. handicap receives no alteration to his recorded handicap.

(b) A shooter winning a championship which is shot from behind his current A.C.T.A. handicap receives an immediate handicap alteration to that of the championship.

(c) A shooter winning a championship which is shot from his own current A.C.T.A. handicap receives an immediate adjustment according to the Handicapping Formula and the prescribed Championship Trophies.

3. DUTIES OF A REFEREE:

(a) Referee should check all traps for correct heights and angles.

(b) Referee should "pull" or release all targets and should have an independent scorer.

(c) Referee should never score, as this distracts his attention.

4. SLOW PULL:

Some shooters seem to consider they can decide whether a pull is

"fast" or "slow", but this is NOT SO.

The DECISION of the REFEREE in all cases coming under his jurisdiction, as set forth in A.C.T.A. Rules, shall be FINAL (Rule 14).

Also, Rule 31 states clearly -

"NO TARGET" shall be declared when a trap is sprung at a material interval of time before or after the call of "PULL". Thus, no referee would permit a delay (as in letters received) of up to three seconds within the meaning of this rule.

In the years 1947/9 a small handful of gun enthusiasts living on what is now known as the Queensland Gold Coast made a habit of congregating every now and then in some handy paddock with a plus trap, a case of clays, and proceeded to enjoy the sport of clay target shooting, making up their own set of rules as required. Two or three shoots were successfully organised to assist some local charity, organised to assist some local charity, and from this humble beginning, the idea of forming a club emerged, and after a good deal of spade work the South Coast Gun Club came into being in 1949 under the chairmanship of the late Genge Martin. Tracks were laid down in the centre of the Southport Base Course an

of the Southport Race Course, an automatic trap installed, and an ad-vertisement inserted in the "News" to the effect that we would hold a

two-day shoot in January. A roll-up of something like 20 shooters was hoped for, but by Friday night we knew we had 90, and work proceeded late into the night installing a plus trap. Not one member of the club had ever been to an organised shoot, much less run one, and

I shudder to think of the present-day referees' reaction to some of our decisions. Nevertheless the right spirit was there, and this January shoot became the South Coast January Carnival, and has been held ever since on the grounds next to the Race Course. Three Internationals have also been held there.



This year 1966 will be a proud one for the club, which changed its name recently to the Gold Coast Club, as the long-cherished ambition of own-ing our own grounds has been fulfilled and the opening shoot will take place early in November. We were successful in purchasing 50 acres of freehold land only 12 miles from Southport and 42 miles from Surfers Paradise. Five traps have been installed and a magnificent club house and office erected under the supervision of Ray Hogarth, an expert at this sort of thing. I feel sure all visiting shooters will appreciate the visiting shooters will appreciate the bush setting and general lay-out, and although much remains to be done, everything will be in apple-pie order for our next January Carnival. My apologies for being long-winded, but thought use may be interacted

but thought you may be interested in this bit of history.







who unfortunately is in hospital after a serious car accident. Everyone will wish Harold a speedy recovery and hope to see him back before too long.







A new Australian record was established at the Cobar Gun Club (N.S.W.) on Sunday, August 14, 1966, when a 27-yard shooter, shooting through a number of events and finishing up under floodlights, shot 501 successive clay pigeons.

He is Kevin Heywood, Narromine farmer and grazier, the President of Dubbo Gun Club.

The programme at Cobar included the New South Wales State Team Elimination (50 targets D.B. from 18 yards) and was attended by a large gathering of shooters from all over the State, including professional representatives of shotgun cartridge manufacturers.

· Shooter Heywood made the team and scored in the top 10 shooters (results are withheld pending the results from each State).

The next event was a 40-bird D.B. Handicap Event, and Kevin, shooting (from "Scratch") from the 27-yard mark, missed his third bird and ended up with a score of 39/40, which is outstanding for a 27-yard shooter.

After missing, he went on to shoot the other 37 and began to accumulate the greatest unbroken score that has ever been put up by a shooter in Australia in the one day.

Next on the programme was the Far Western District D.B. Championship (20 birds from 16 vards). Fifteen scored 20/20, but 90 minutes later three shooters were left — D. Scow-croft (I.C.I.), M. Burgess (Cobar) and K. Heywood (Dubbo). Scowcroft missed his 354th target and retired with 3rd place. Heywood and Burgess continued shot for shot till it became too dark.

It was then decided to continue shooting under floodlights using white clays. A delay of 45 minutes occurred whilst waiting for it to become dark enough for the targets to be seen clearly in the floodlights. Upon commencing, Burgess missed his 384th target, making Heywood the winner with 384/384.

This score is an Australian record for the number of targets shot by a shooter in the one event.

Next was a 15-bird D.B. Handicap event - Kevin got them all, making a total unbroken score of 436.

The record for an unbroken score on the one day, at this stage, was 454, held by Newton Thomas of I.C.I., established at the A.C.T.A. National Championships, Sydney (N.S.W.), in 1962.


In the following Cobar Gun Club D.B. Championship (20 birds from 16 yards), Kevin shot the 20 birds and went on to win it, scoring another 35 in the shoot-off, giving a total unbroken score so far of 491. At this stage everyone wanted to see if he could make it to 500, so a 10-bird

sweepstake event off handicaps commenced.

Kevin shot the 10, making a total of 501 and establishing a record that will be difficult to break.

This was a wonderful exhibition of shooting not only by Kevin, with his Stirling Broadrib, but also by Scow-croft and Burgess (both champions in their own right), who had the ability and staying power to run him so far in the championship.

There was no more time for further events, so it was not possible to see just how many more targets this brilliant shooter would have broken before missing one.

OBITUARY

LESLIE MCKINNEY

The Riverina area of New South Wales and trap-shooting generally suffered a grievous loss when it was recently announced that Mr. Les. McKinney, a long-time Secretary of the Hay Gun Club, had passed on after a very brief illness. His demise took place on Tuesday, August 30.

McKinney took up the reins of office as Secretary of the Hay Gun Club about 1954, following the distinguished John Houston in these duties. (Mr. Houston, it will be recalled, later became President of the A.C.T.A.)

McKinney's enthusiasm and outstanding organizing ability was soon to be proved following his acceptance of secretarial duty with the club. Not the least of these efforts was his determination to put Hay Gun Club really on the trap-shooting calendar by conducting the first car shoot ever held in New South Wales. The only previous attempt at conducting a car shoot anywhere in Australia was in the Victorian Wimmera town of Rainbow. However, the Rainbow Club did not pursue this type of competition, whereas McKinney was convinced that the gamble was worth while, so much so that today the annual Easter Car Shooting Carnival is a must for many shooters from all States of the Commonwealth and even from as far away as New Zealand. Annually the Hay Easter Shoot is now one that is looked forward to and many confine their major yearly effort to "shooting for the car at Hay". McKinney approached the staging of a car shoot with a business-like outlook and convinced himself and his committee that if his one gamble came off, the club was on the high road to success. That his scheme has been successful year after year is now history. The club is now one of the most affluent in the Commonwealth and the major part of this success is in no small measure almost entirely attributable to McKinney's masterly organizational ability and will ever remain a monument to his memory.

He had few interests outside his regular business activities. The Hay Club grounds are part of the local Agricultural Society's reserve and was for a time, during the last war, an internee detention camp. McKinney made it a regular daily duty to visit the grounds to tender and water the well-laid-out gardens attached to the club. These gardens are today the envy of many clubs for their picturesque and pleasant lay-out.

A senior partner in the long-established firm of R. C. McKinney & Coy., Stock & Station Agents — established about the 1880's — McKinney's chief interest, outside watching the interests of the Hay Gun Club, was horse racing and his regular visits to Melbourne for the Melbourne Cup carnival were well known. In a letter the writer received from him two days before his demise, McKinney advised that he had already reserved grandstand seats for his wife and himself right over the judges' box at Flemington for the whole period of the Cup series. Alas, his reservations will not now be taken up. He was a true son of the Riverina, having been born and bred in Hay in the Murrumbidgee area of N.S.W.

He was 67 years of age and leaves a widow, to whom the deepest sympathy and regret is extended by the shooting fraternity everywhere.

CLAY BIRD SHOOTING MARATHON

Four trap shooters each recorded 162 straight kills in some of Tasmania's best shooting at the Central Districts D.B. Championship (20 birds off 16 yards) at the Dulverton G.C. (Oatlands) on Sunday, August 7, 1966.

From 20 starters, 13 shooters broke the possible score. The shoot-off featured brilliant efforts from the State's best marksmen.

Four of them, each with a score of 162 straight kills, had to be halted towards evening because it was too dark to sight their targets. SEVEN SHOOTERS BROKE MORE THAN 100 BIRDS STRAIGHT — this is believed to be a record in any one day.

In the shoot-off, D. Perry was the

first to drop out at 23/24. He was followed by B. Filby 38/39, R. Kringle 42/43, K. Pulford 57/58, R. Blake 86/87, H. Bye 87/88. At this stage the event developed into a marathon, with 67-year-old Oatlands shooter Mr. Richard Monks breaking bird for bird amongst young marksmen.


However, Mr. Monks, with his best score ever, dropped out at 119/120. He was followed by top Oatlands shooter Ray Wightman at 129/130. D. Gray followed with 151/152.

Reg Ward of Oatlands, G. Richardson of Hobart, John Blake (Cressy) and Sperry Marshall (Howrah) were still shooting brilliantly when darkness prevented any further progress. The shoot was decided to be continued on September 4.


