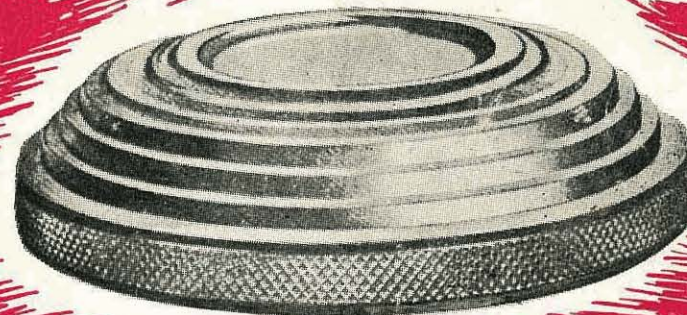

# The Editor's Notebook



## REGISTERED SHOOTERS

Article 49 of the Articles of Association of the Australian Clay Target Association states: (a) The Association shall keep a register of shooters and no person may enter or compete at any Association competition or event conducted by a member Club of which a Delegate is a member of the Association unless such person is registered with the Association and is not in arrears with his subscription.

(b) Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall BEFORE THE THIRTY-FIRST DAY OF JANUARY IN EACH YEAR supply the Secretary with a full and accurate list of all members and shooters registered with such club for the year commencing on the first day of January of such year and shall at the same time remit to the Secretary the subscriptions of such Club members and shooters. Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall also promptly forward to the Secretary of the Association the names and subscriptions of any persons joining such club or registering as shooters after the thirty-first day of January in any year.

The above information is given for the benefit of secretaries and shooters alike. In the past, the cost to the Association of the preparation and mailing A.C.T.A. shooting "News" to unfinancial shooters has been far too heavy. MARCH 1967 "NEWS" WILL BE MAILED ONLY TO SHOOTERS FINANCIAL (ACTUALLY RECEIVED BY THE A.C.T.A.) AS OF FEBRUARY 17, 1967.

## NOMINATIONS FOR 1966 OFFICES IN A.C.T.A.

All interested shooters are hereby notified that nominations for all offices in the Association close at 5 p.m. on Friday, December 30, 1966. Nominations must be lodged with the Secretary, A.C.T.A., G.P.O. Box 2038 S, Melbourne, C.I, Victoria. Any nominations received after this hour or date will not be accepted. Nomination forms are available from the Secretary, A.C.T.A.

Those lodging nominations are reminded that such nominations must be lodged in accordance with Article 27 of the Association Constitution, which reads: "Nominations for all offices in the Association and membership of the Executive Committee must be in writing, signed by the Secretary of the member Club or by the Delegate member of an unincorporated club making the nomination, and must reach the Secretary of the Association on or before the 31st December in each year prior to the Annual General Meeting."

It is advised that private nominations will be rejected. Nominations received must have the official backing of the club and be approved by the committee of the member club concerned.

Advertisers and clubs are reminded that, due to the printing industry vacation, no publication of A.C.T.A. Shooting "News" will be made for January, 1967. Copy for December "News" must reach A.C.T.A. office

**NOISE AND YOUR HEARING**

What is noise? It has been defined as a sound undesired by the recipient, or simply unwanted sound. There are three types of noise:—

Firstly, "broad band" noise, which contains random frequencies which may cover the entire audio-frequency spectrum. Secondly, "narrow band" noise, which generally consists of one or a number of pure tones.

Finally, "impulse" noise such as from riveting, hammering, gun shots, etc. Industrial noise is likely to consist of a combination of all three.

Before discussing the hearing loss caused by high intensity sound levels, it should be remembered that hearing normally deteriorates with age.

There are many types of industrial noises which can cause occupational loss of hearing.

A hearing conservation programme for persons engaged in noisy surroundings should include the usage of ear defenders, and instructions for use are supplied by the Audiphone Co. These defenders will give an attenuation of 15-33 db protection. Ear muffs will give up to 47 db protection for intense noise levels. Frequent and skilled testing of hearing is recommended. Prevention is better than cure. Hearing is precious—act now.

### ***The Cherry Tree Pool Field Championship***

(1) is a novelty event conducted annually by the Katanning Gun Club (Western Australia) as a series of simulated field happenings.

The event for 1966 will be conducted on Sunday, November 13 (see A.C.T.A. "Shooting News", October, 1966, pages 80-81).

(2) The idea originated around 1950 and the following provisions are rigid:—

(a) Shot from standing position, with gun down (i.e. gun touching the hip).

(b) Only allowed one lapse (i.e. lift the gun more than once — out).

(c) No gun or cartridge faults are permitted (if a duck flies past, then, no duck).

(d) If any shooter shoots the possible, then the management will toughen the conditions further.

(e) There are seven (7) shooting stations.

(f) Each shooting station has its own referee.

(g) Each shooter carries his own score sheet.

(h) Venue is over, across and adjacent to a river which is bounded by timber and scrub, thence by open fields.

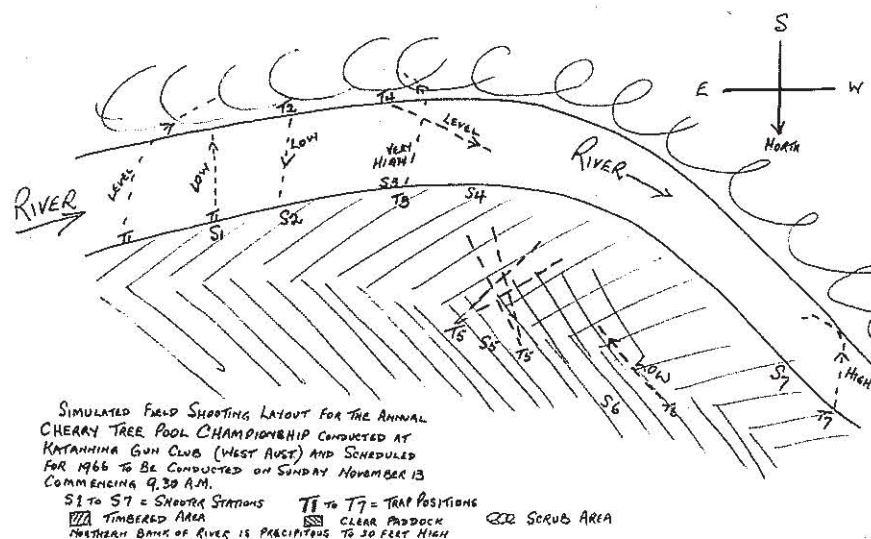
(3) The procedure is as follows:—

At Station No. 1 the shooter loads his gun with two shells at his own call of READY. The bird (standard clay target) will then appear (there are no slow "pulls"). From this Station No. 1 shooter shoots at three (3) pairs from the river bank, some thirty (30) feet above water level. The first is a long, high left bird, thence at the report of the gun, the second is a low bird from straight below the shooter. (3 x 2 = 6 targets)

At Station No. 2 the bird appears out of the scrub from the opposite side of the river, coming 4 to 5 feet high, and disappears into the river bank in front of the shooter.

(3 x 1 = 3 targets)

At Station No. 3 the shooter is down at the water level (just sufficient shore for the shooter to stand between the foot of the bank and the water's edge). There are three (3) targets from overhead, i.e. high, long targets. (3 x 1 = 3 targets)



At Station No. 4, three targets come at right angles, FAST, from left to right, down the river.

(3 x 1 = 3 targets).

At Station No. 5, in the paddock adjoining the river, and called the QUAIL STATION, four (4) targets are thrown twice (i.e. 8 birds in all). Shooter stands between two traps and each trap simultaneously throws a pair, i.e. 4 targets are in the air at once and each pair crosses about fifteen yards in front of the shooter who MUST shoot 2 of the 4 targets. If one breaks, he must still shoot two out of three. Thus, they must be shot quickly, as the clays hit trees about 25 yards from the traps. If the shooter breaks two clays with only one barrel, then only 1 is counted. This station stops even the experienced shooters. (must shoot 4)

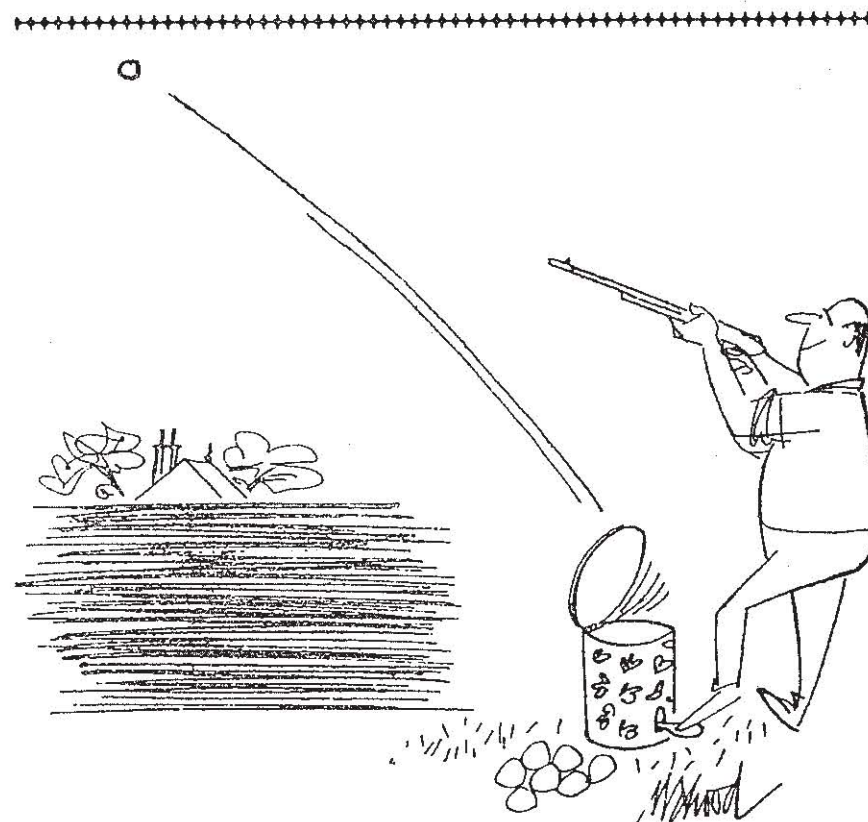
At Station No. 6, called the RABBIT—back in the paddock from the river, as the Quail—single targets from right to left 30 to 35 yards. Target winds across through some very heavy timber.

(3 single but D.B. targets = 3)

At Station No. 7, called the LOG — back on the river bank—shooter must SIT on a log which is partly submerged, holding his gun with the gun butt resting on the log. Target goes from right to left out of the scrub at a tangent, up river. (3 x 1 = 3)

Total is 25. Targets travel 60 yds. if missing timber. Plus traps are used with Olympic throwing arms.
