



# The Editor's Notebook



### REGISTERED SHOOTERS

Article 49 of the Articles of Association of the Australian Clay Target Association states: (a) The Association shall keep a register of shooters and no person may enter or compete at any Association competition or event conducted by a member Club of which a Delegate is a member of the Association unless such person is registered with the Association and is not in arrear with his subscription.

(b) Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall BEFORE the THIRTY-FIRST DAY of JAN-UARY IN EACH YEAR supply the Secretary with a full and accurate list of all members and shooters registered with such club for the year commencing on the first day of January of such year and shall at the same time remit to the Secretary the subscriptions of such Club members and shooters. Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall also promptly forward to the Secretary of the Association the names and subscriptions of any persons joining such club or registering as shooters after the thirty-first day of January in any year.

The above information is given for the benefit of secretaries and shooters alike. In the past, the cost to the Association of the preparation and mailing A.C.T.A. Shooting "News" to unfinancial shooters has been far too heavy. MARCH 1967 "NEWS" WILL BE MAILED ONLY to SHOOTERS FINANCIAL (ACTUALLY RECEIVED BY THE A.C.T.A.) AS OF FEBRUARY 17, 1967.

### 1967 ANNUAL MEETING

The 1967 Annual Meeting of affiliated club delegates and representatives of member clubs will be held at the Gold Coast Gun Club, Southport, Queensland.

### DELEGATE APPOINTMENT

Affiliated units of the A.C.T.A. are reminded that they are entitled to one delegate (Article 15) to represent their interests at the Annual Meeting. However, delegates can only be accepted providing the Association "Articles of Association" are complied with. This involves the completion of the necessary forms, namely "Acceptance of Membership (Article 5(a)), "Nomination of Representative" (Article 21) (in the case of a corporate club, or "Nomination of Delegate" (Articles 5(c) and 16) (in the case of an unincorporated club. followed finally by "Notice of Accept-ance of Delegates". Official printed forms as applicable are obtainable from the A.C.T.A. office. It should be noted that nomination of a representative or member delegate can only be accepted providing all subscriptions and monies due by either the nominee or the club, to the Association, have been paid as provided for in Article 49.

It is also pointed out that where a representative or delegate has been appointed previously, and this has not been officially rescinded, the appointment as previously made will stand, until the Association is advised or instructed otherwise. In accordance with the Articles of Association.

clubs cannot appoint a delegate other than on the prescribed form (letters are unacceptable).

The election of seats on the Executive Committee of the Association will take place during the holding of the 1967 Annual Meeting of the A.C.T.A. at the Gold Coast Gun Club, Southport, Queensland.

### 1967 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

The official allocation for the 1967 Open Championships, as allocated by the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee at its recent meeting, was published in December 1966 A.C.T.A. "News". This official allocation as printed should be accepted by all interested and shooting dates applied for on the prescribed forms. No further advice in this regard will be issued.

Clubs shall apply on the prescribed forms for District Championships not so listed. e.g., Canberra District Championships could only be applied for by a Canberra Gun Club.

A.C.T.A. 1967 NATIONAL CHAM-

PIONSHIPS and INTERNATIONAL MATCH will be conducted at the grounds of the Gold Coast Gun Club (formerly the South Coast Gun Club), (formerly the South Coast Gun Club), Queensland, commencing at 8.00 a.m. daily over the five days, Saturday, June 10, until p.m. Wednesday, June 14, inclusive. The programme (which includes the Queen's Birthday holiday on the Monday) has been amended to avoid a carry-over of events and will progress as follows, with the provision that, subject to time permitting each day, a \$300 Cash Han-dicap event will be added. The first day, Saturday, will see the winner of the coveted Champion of Champions Cup (1966 winner was M. Burgess of Cobar, N.S.W.). On the second day, Sunday, the National Intermediate Championship (1966 winner, T. Holmes, N.S.W.) will be shot in conjunction with the National Doublejunction with the National Double-Barrel Championship (1966 winner, V. Ryan, Vic.). The third day, Monday, will commence with the National Single - Barrel Championship (1966 winner, D. Glover, Vic.), followed by the National Double Rise Championship (1966 winner, W. Charlton, N.S.W.). On the fourth day, Tuesday, from the Australia - New Zealand Championship, the six top scorers will comprise the Australian team for the Australia - New Zealand Teams' Match. A \$300 Handicap event is then scheduled to take place. For the fifth and final day, the Twenty-first International Teams' Match will be conducted (Australian Team to be conducted (Australian Team to be the 30 highest aggregate scorers in the Aust.-N.Z. Championship and the Aust. Nat. S.B. and D.B. Championships — of which only the best 25 scores are to count. Final scores are to be withheld pending complete results from overseas). The last scheduled event is to be the Eighteenth Grand Australian \$550

Handicap. The High Gun Trophy will be a B2, Grade (d), Special Trap 2 model Under and Over shotgun, the broad-rib type with 30-inch barrels, donated annually since 1966 by the makers, Fabrique Nationale of Belgium and Gollin & Co. of Sydney (as agents for N.S.W., Q'land and S. Aust.), with the provision that it may be won only once by any shooter. This will be competed for over the programmed events numbered 1 to 7 inclusive.

During the programme all New Zealand shooters will shoot two yards back from their New Zealand handicaps and ALL SHOOTERS MUST SHOW CURRENT HANDICAP CARDS WHEN NOMINATING FOR EACH EVENT.

TEN (10) REFEREES are required for the 1967 A.C.T.A. National Championships — see advertisement for applications for consideration.

The official photographer at the A.C.T.A. National shoots will be F. LANG of P.O. Box 40, TWEED HEADS. N.S.W.

Trophies will be presented daily from a dias after each event.

Attention is drawn to December 1966 issue of A.C.T.A. Shooting "News", which contained:

- 1. Rules and Championship Conditions
- 2. Skeet Rules
- 3. Handicapping Formula

NOTE: THESE RULES WILL NOT BE ALTERED FOR TWO YEARS. They are applicable as from January 1, 1967, and have been supplied to clubs in broad-sheet form for notice-board display. In the interest of clarity, a number of amendments have been made so that the interpretation is simpler to follow. Copies in brochure form may be ordered through club secretaries as follows:—

- (a) A.C.T.A. Rules and Championship Conditions — 50 cents.
- (b) A.C.T.A. Skeet Rules 25 cents.

Later in 1967 all A.C.T.A. Rules and Conditions will be repeated, meanwhile would all concerned please note that Skeet Championships shown in 1966 December "News", pages 41 and 49, should read:

- 1. Conditions for all open skeet championships are: Commonwealth, two rounds of 25 targets (= 50); State and District, one round of 25 targets. Nominations are \$5, \$4 and \$3 respectively.
- 2. Skeet Tie Shoots shall be shot squad system, miss-out.

It is the responsibility of all shooters to now read these Rules and Conditions and to follow them, BUT there is one further responsibility—that of enforcing the Rules and abiding by the Conditions and the Handicapping Formula as laid down—this rests with the men elected or chosen, by clubs and by shooters, to run these clubs.

### Club Secretaries are advised:-

- 1. That A.C.T.A. Shooting "News" advertising rates were increased as of January 1, 1967.
- 2. And all shooters are reminded that CURRENT HANDICAP CARDS MUST BE PRESENTED AT ALL SHOOTS.
- 3. Club secretaries must enter the correct handicap yardage on handicap returns, otherwise shooters may be penalised unnecessarily.
- 4. All Commonwealth, State and District Titles, plus any event over \$100, must be applied for ON THE PRESCRIBED FORM.
- 5. Break badges in cloth form are available free to shooters, but ONLY where the HANDICAP RETURN and SCORE SHEETS as submitted ON THE PRESCRIBED FORM to A.C.T.A. Secretary, clearly show the shooter has earned this right. Break badges are for 50, 75, 100, 150, 200, 250 and 300 breaks (see Rule No. 91). Such a badge is also available free, on application by club secretaries, for shooters who have attained the handicap of 27 yards.
- 6. Enamelled car badges are available at \$2.50.
- 7. Enamelled metal badges are only struck by the makers against

firm orders by this, your Association office. Club secretaries only may request these badges ON THE PRESCRIBED FORM, which will be of the standard A.C.T.A. insignia with the surround, containing the year, the championship title, the winner's initials and name. Such lettering on the surround will be in the following colours:—

### Commonwealth Championships

Clubs are charged \$2.50 for each badge ordered.

- 8. Championship Sashes only may be ordered direct from the makers by club secretaries. Recommended and official makers are W. FLATTELY & SON, 11 ORR STREET, CARLTON, N.3, VICTORIA. Colours for the respective gradings of championships are as for BADGES as shown above.
- 9. ANNUAL SHOOTER REGISTRATION FEE of \$3.00 is payable via club secretaries. Any shooter attempting to by-pass the club by mailing direct to A.C.T.A. will NOT receive his handicap card or any copies of A.C.T.A. Shooting "News" until the club secretary signifies to the A.C.T.A. that the shooter's club membership is financial.
- 10. The method of allocating trophies and prizes is:
- (a) First, second and third trophy winners cannot take part in yardage prizes.
- (b) Yardage prizes are a separate entity and are virtually a bonus for the respective best scorers within the groups concerned.
- 11. Some clubs have attempted to run "graded shoots" with graded or yardage prizes only. This is quite contrary to the Rules, which require a 1st, 2nd and 3rd trophy, THEN yardage prizes may be given.

### 12. Handicapping -

(a) The Formula commences "Cash or Trophy value wins and divisions obtained in one day" — this includes yardage prizes. Thus, a shooter may be handicapped after

his results in, say, the first event, but, unless that plus his results in the following events do not total in excess of \$101, then only one yard per day can be applied to the shooter.

### (b) Championships -

- (i) A shooter winning a championship which is shot from in front of his current A.C.T.A. handicap receives no alteration to his recorded handicap.
- (ii) A shooter winning a championship which is shot from behind his current A.C.T.A. handicap receives an immediate handicap alteration to that of the championship.
- (iii) A shooter winning a championship which is shot from his own current A.C.T.A. handicap receives an immediate adjustment according to the Handicapping Formula and the prescribed Championship Trophies.

Club managements have the right to re-handicap any obviously underhandicapped shooter IMMEDIATELY (see Handicapping Formula). "Immediately" can be interpreted as completing one round.

It is noted for all concerned that a number of supposed novice shooters were newly registered during 1966 and within 5 or 7 months they have been handicapped, according to their winnings, from 12 yards to either 15, 17 or 22 yards.

Clubs when advertising and in submitting shoot results on handicap returns must show the retail values of all prizes.

A.C.T.A. approved plans for (a) traphouses and (b) night lighting should be available during February 1967 at a nominal price to clubs.

Clubs should be prepared to interest the shooters with their advertisements and must show

- (a) number of birds
- (b) whether handicap event OR Championship off (?) yards
- (c) whether sweepstakes are conditional
- (d) whether sweepstakes are optional
- (e) the price of shooter nominations otherwise a good programme or venue may simply appear uninviting to either prospective shooters or spectators.

Referees are reminded to watch all shooters and to observe the types of ammunition being used, as, under the varying conditions of light, the plastic wads as inserted by some manufacturers may be mistaken for a chip of the clay target.

All are reminded that when a target is broken, then the target usually deflects slightly one way or the other—either up or down, left or right.

Would all Club Secretaries please amend the Club Notice Board copy of A.C.T.A. Handicapping Formula to conform with December 1966 "News" as follows:

1. "A win or division or equivalent trophy value of \$101."

2. "A win or division or equivalent trophy value of \$301."

3. "A win or division or equivalent trophy value of \$401."

### DUTIES OF A REFEREE

- 1. A Referee should wear his badge at all times.
- 2. When wearing such badge a Referee may be requested, by the club concerned, to referee the shoot and is obliged to assist accordingly.
- 3. He should check all traps for correct heights and angles.
- 4. He must only referee the event, but may release the targets where electric release is provided.
- 5. He should never score, as this distracts his attention.

In 1967 the New Zealand Championships conducted by the New Zealand Gun Clubs' Association will be held in Hamilton, N.Z., during the period April 2 to April 8 inclusive. The team to represent Australia in the Australia - New Zealand Team shoot during this series shall be the six highest scorers in the New Zealand Single Rise Championship. The Australian Team shall consist of six shooters who will shoot against six New Zealanders at twenty (20) targets per shooter for the Tom Glenn Trophy. Air fares to New Zealand are \$158.70 return (from Sydney) and hotel accommodation is slightly cheaper than comparable accommodation in Australia. It is advisable to book well ahead, as accommodation generally in New Zealand is a little harder to get than in Australia. The visit can be recommended to A.C.T.A. registered shooters who must show their handicap cards when nominating, thence they will shoot from two yards IN FRONT of their Australian handicaps. A cordial invitation comes from the New Zealand Gun Clubs' Association to registered Australian shooters to attend this shoot. Accommodation requirements should be directed to Mr. I. K. # HOT SHOTS FROM THE U.S.A.

As advised by A.C.T.A. Hon. Vice-President, R. A. MILES. of Spokane, Washington. -

Del Grim of Lincoln, Nebraska, claimed before the Grand American Del Grim of Lincoln, Nebraska, claimed before the Grand American Handicap at Vandalia, Ohio, on Aug. 27, that "his box of shells had 100 straight in it". Grim, aged 47, shot from 23 yards and won with his 100 break to become the seventh man in the 67-year history of the Grand to win with a perfect score. He started with a "Daisy" (B-B gun), thence became a field shooter on duck, quail and prairie chickens. In the Grand he won about \$U.S.6,000 without the options (which may have produced another \$3,000) and is reported to have said, "... to buy some things for home and mother — that's my wife. She'd go without shoes so I could shoot." Junior champion with a 98 was Pat Cooper of Plainview, Texas, and Al. Kees of Richmond, Indiana shot 94 for the past Grand champions' title. The 1966 Grand drew a record 3,465 shooters, an increase of 434 over last year. crease of 434 over last year.

Second to Grim, with a score of 99, in the Grand was 26-year-old Don Slavich of Sacramento, California, who is in business with his father and brothers in the vending machine/ music-box industry. Slavich, a six-foot, 200 - pound ex - college rugby player, has been shooting since he was six years old and once shot 37 mudhens in a row, but started on clay mudnens in a row, but started on clay targets only five years ago. The only lost bird was a silent angle to the left, but "two guys told me they saw dust but no chips". In the previous day's preliminary he shot 88, using a low style, but changed to a high gun, and it paid off. He is earnestly seeking to increase his handicap from 26% to the maximum 27 yeards. 26½ to the maximum 27 yards.

Dan Orlich, at 42 years, a casino Dan Orlich, at 42 years, a casino night manager in Reno, Nevada, was the only shooter in the record field of 1,032 to break 200 straight from 16 yards, earning the singles championship. A 6-foot-6, 230-pounder, he is the only man in U.S.A. to break three runs of 100 from 27 yards, and in handiagn events to hit 100 and in handicap events to hit 100 successive targets, five times straight in doubles. He won the U.S.A. Champion of Champions event in 1963, 4 and 5, but missed by one of the 100 targets off 16 yards in 1966 to the co-winners (100 each) — Bueford C. Bailey, Big Springs, Nebraska, and Don Mackerman, Newton, Iowa.




