



The Editor's Notebook



A.C.T.A. 1967 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS and INTERNATIONAL MATCH will be conducted at the grounds of the Gold Coast Gun Club (formerly the South Coast Gun Club), Queensland, commencing at 8.00 a.m. daily over the five days, Saturday, June 10, until p.m. Wednesday, June 14, inclusive. The programme (which includes the Queen's Birthday holiday on the Monday) has been amended to avoid a carry-over of events and will progress as follows, with the provision that, subject to time permitting each day, a \$300 Cash Handicap event will be added. The first day, Saturday, will see the winner of the coveted Champion of Champions Cup (1966 winner was M. Burgess of Cobar, N.S.W.). On the second day, Sunday, the National Intermediate Championship (1966 winner, T. Holmes, N.S.W.) will be shot in conjunction with the National Double-Barrel Championship (1966 winner, V. Ryan, Vic.). The third day, Monday, will commence with the National Single-Barrel Championship (1966 winner, D. Glover, Vic.), followed by the National Double Rise Championship (1966 winner, W. Charlton, N.S.W.). On the fourth day, Tuesday, the 1967 Australia - New Zealand Championship shall be contested. A \$300 Handicap event is then scheduled to take place. For the fifth and final day, the Twenty-first International Teams' Match will be conducted (Australian Team to be the 30 highest aggregate scorers in the Aust.-N.Z. Championship and the Aust. Nat. S.B. and D.B. Championships — of which only the best 25

scores are to count. Final scores are to be withheld pending complete results from overseas). The last scheduled event is to be the Eighteenth Grand Australian \$550 Handicap. The High Gun Trophy will be a B2, Grade (d), Special Trap 2 model Under and Over shotgun, the broad-rib type with 30-inch barrels, donated annually since 1966 by the makers, Fabrique Nationale of Belgium and Gollin & Co. of Sydney (as agents for N.S.W., Q'land and S. Aust.), with the provision that it may be won only once by any shooter. This will be competed for over the programmed events numbered 1 to 7 inclusive.

During the programme all New Zealand shooters will shoot two yards back from their New Zealand handicaps and ALL SHOOTERS MUST SHOW CURRENT HANDICAP CARDS WHEN NOMINATING FOR EACH EVENT.

The official photographer at the A.C.T.A. National shoots will be F. LANG of P.O. Box 40, TWEED HEADS, N.S.W.

Trophies will be presented daily from a dais after each event.

1967 ANNUAL MEETING

The 1967 Annual Meeting of affiliated club delegates and representa-

tives of member clubs will be held at the Gold Coast Gun Club, Southport, Queensland, commencing 5.30 p.m. on SUNDAY, June 11.

After the presentation of trophies on MONDAY, June 12, shooters are invited to a buffet dinner with refreshments, commencing 5.30 p.m. and completing at 7.30 p.m. at the Gold Coast Gun Club.

In 1967 the New Zealand Championships conducted by the New Zealand Gun Clubs' Association will be held in Hamilton, N.Z., during the period April 2 to April 8 inclusive. The team to represent Australia in the New Zealand - Australia Team shoot during this series shall be the six highest Australian scorers in the New Zealand Single Rise Championship. This Australian Team shall consist of these six shooters who will shoot against six New Zealanders at twenty (20) targets per shooter for the Tom Glenn Trophy. Air fares to New Zealand are \$158.70 return (from Sydney) and hotel accommodation is slightly cheaper than comparable accommodation in Australia. It is advisable to book well ahead, as accommodation generally in New Zealand is a little harder to get than in Australia. The visit can be recommended to A.C.T.A. registered shooters who must show their handicap cards when nominating, thence they will shoot from two yards IN FRONT of their Australian handicaps. A cordial invitation comes from the New Zealand Gun Clubs' Association to registered Australian shooters to attend this shoot. Accommodation requirements should be directed to Mr. I. K. Ewart, Secretary, Hamilton Gun Club, P.O. Box 281, Hamilton, N.Z.

Shooters are reminded that substantial reductions in air fares to New Zealand are available, subject to very simple conditions. Applications should be made as soon as possible to any AIR NEW ZEALAND office.

Shooters not registered for the 1967 calendar year are again reminded that they are unable to participate in scheduled events at any affiliated club within the Association whilst they remain unfinancial and as from this (April 1967) publication, their names

have been removed from the A.C.T.A. Shooting "News" mailing list. Annual registration fees should be forwarded through the club of which the shooter is a financial member. (See Rule No. 85—Registration of Shooters.)

All concerned are informed that as of March 1, 1967, clay targets as delivered and invoiced by the respective manufacturers will be charged at an increased price — the first such increase since October, 1955.

DUCK SHOOTER'S LICENCE — WESTERN AUSTRALIA

On February 20th, 1967, six delegates from the Western Australian Clay Target Association approached the Minister for Fisheries and Fauna, the Hon. G. C. McKinnon, about duck-hunting licences. The delegates were Mr. R. Holtfreter (Northam), Mr. K. Barker (Perth), Mr. N. Beck (Katanning), Mr. J. Webster (Perth), Mr. N. Wells (Busselton) and Mr. A. Yozzi (Perth).

The delegation explained that the sport of duck shooting was declining rapidly in Western Australia. The drainage of swamps and other wetland areas was increasing at such a rate that few areas were left for the production of waterfowl. New farming techniques, industrial expansion and urbanisation were consuming many shooting areas, leaving large concentrations of shooters to congregate on the few remaining areas. Each year more new shooters were taking up the sport of duck hunting

and, with better roads and four-wheel drive vehicles, few places were impenetrable to shooters.

It was felt that many of these difficulties could be overcome by the introduction of a duck shooter's licence, the revenue of which could be used for investigations into the problems that were confronting shooters today. Law enforcement officers would benefit from a licence, as regulations pertaining to open and closed areas, daily bag limits and other useful information could be printed on each licence.

The licence could also aid statistical research, this being accomplished by mailing questionnaires to shooters for information on their shooting success during the past season. This information and the information gained from duck-banding projects could give the Department of Fisheries and Fauna the needed material to form a good waterfowl management programme so that future generations could enjoy the sport of duck hunting in Western Australia. The sum of \$2.00 for such a licence was thought to be a reasonable amount.

Mr. McKinnon said that he was very sympathetic towards the views of this delegation and felt that the government would be very interested in their comments. He also stated that the Department of Fisheries and Fauna had a research officer dealing with waterfowl research and that some of the complaints brought forward by this delegation were under investigation at the present time. The additional finance made available by the introduction of a duck-shooting licence would be placed in a special trust fund to be used only for waterfowl research programmes. This financial support by duck shooters would certainly bring dividends in years to come. It is unfortunate that development and population expansion create problems such as these, but it is reassuring to see that organisations such as yours are willing to promote and support wildlife conservation in Western Australia.

In 1965 I met him in Brisbane, where he was at that time buying hay to keep his stock alive, and he knows what it is like to have stock without feed.

We have lost at least 15,000 sheep and over a 1,000 head of cattle, besides pigs, fowls, dogs and horses,

miles of fencing, farming buildings and homes and implements.

I toured a lot of the burnt-out farms and villages, and the devastation is terrible; sheep were standing with their wool and feet burnt off. Loss of human life is around the 62 mark and may be more.

This letter is not to ask for donations, but to thank Mr. and Mrs. Cameron, through your column, for their kind gift from so far away from our little island.

It was indeed a great gesture to help the needy.

Keith is a grand sport, on and off the tracks of a gun club; his rum is also good and it will be my pleasure to buy him and his wife one next time I meet them.

Competitors and friends at the January 28-29-30, 1967, shoot at the Mount Gambier Gun Club (South Australia) witnessed some very fine shooting under clear but rather cool and windy conditions.

Included in the contestants were:—

1. **RAY E. SCHERGER** of Werri-mul, near Mildura, in the north-west corner of Victoria, lost the sight of his right eye several years ago and devised his own "outrigger" to enable the use of his left eye whilst still mounting his Browning Under and Over shotgun from the right shoulder. Ray, a practical farmer, fashioned the sighting plane for 40-yard shooting from a strip of floor boarding tongue. Constant concussion, plus fiddling by other interested shooters, frequently loosens the structure, but some recently added case-hardened bolts may overcome this. Shooting from 18 yds., he was runner-up for the 1964 New Year handicap at Croydon G.C. (Vic.) and a 1965 car shoot.

2. **JOHN TRETHOWEN** of Rand, some 40 miles north-west of Albury (New South Wales), unable to use his disabled right arm, loads, shoots and unloads his U. and O. shotgun using the left arm entirely. His broad grin is known at many Victorian and New South Wales shoots.

3. There are four other shooters within the A.C.T.A. who have had the stocks of their shotguns re-built, permitting them to shoot with the left eye whilst the gun is held against the right shoulder.

They are: Geo. Walker (17 yds.) of Wangaratta, Vic.; F. Williams (25 yds.) of Wagga Wagga, N.S.W.; E. Piccoli (20 yds.) of Boort, Vic., who shoots from a wheel-chair; and Emil Albert (18 yds.) of Narrandera, N.S.W., aged 80 years, who shot 30/30 in the recent Deniliquin Car Shoot, but had to withdraw when feeling faint.

39th WORLD SHOOTING MATCH

At Wiesbaden, Freudenberg, Western Germany, the 39th World Shooting Match was conducted over the period July 14-24, 1966. (The organiser of the 38th World Championships had been the United Arab Republic in 1962.)

This is principally for rifle shooting and required some 400 honorary assistants, who sacrificed their vacations to assist in the rigid, co-ordinated management necessary for such a vast range of shooting events to be conducted smoothly.


The "Rheinblick" clay pigeon competition centre was the only site to be reconstructed. This range is located at a beautiful spot and equipped with two sets of traps for trap shooting and two installations

for skeet shooting, with an acoustic device for the releasing of the clay targets.

As shown in the accompanying photograph, trap shooters under these European shooting conditions stand under oval-shaped, individual canvas umbrellas in "line-abreast" at the pre-determined championship yardage whilst targets are thrown from the various traps which are sunken, trench style. Some 1,023 marksmen from 51 nations participated in the total rifle and shotgun events.

This method is slower and much costlier to operate than the British Commonwealth and American down-the-line clay target shooting and does not lend assistance to variations in the sport for handicapping or the accepted novelty events.



RANDOM SHOTS OF A ROVING SHOOTER



(These comments and observations do not necessarily reflect the opinions of the Executive Committee of the A.C.T.A.).

A constantly increasing number of registered clubs and shooters indicates that clay target shooting is on the up and up in Australia. In addition, greatly increased amenities have been provided at most clubs. In the area coming within the knowledge of this Rambler it is apparent that but for the recent devastating drought, there would have been an even greater number of excellent lay-outs and snug club-houses.

Despite the seasonal advertities, Guyra (N.S.W.), under the presidency of cheerful Athol Creagan, has erected a striking new club-house. This is complete, with viewing-windows overlooking the traps and taking in the lovely scenery. A wide, open-armed brick fireplace hints at chilly evenings warmed by twinkling firelight, good companionship, the passing of the wassail-bowl and many shots re-shot.

Venerable St. George (Qld.), one of the oldest affiliated clubs in Australia, has recently added a caretaker's cottage, sewerred the area and planted ornamental trees—a worthy example to younger offspring of the Association.

In four years Gunnedah (N.S.W.) has climbed from a plus-trap in a bare paddock to two automatics, a spacious club-house and office and a reputation for turning on good shoots. They have now purchased two skeet traps and expect to have the lay-out in operation this year. This is one of the clubs where all members dig in and help, inspired by the dedicated Secretary, Mrs. Ron Brady, and abetted by the old master, Steve Staughton. Steve has been described, completely without malice, as the greatest nuisance on the tracks of the north-west, and the truth of the statement is vehemently vouched for by the hosts who have been "shot-out" by this fine sportsman.

Brisbane Gun Club (Q.) has moved on to new grounds and into the front ranks of clubs with their fine new 4 electric-trap lay-out at Belmont. Sister club, the 17-year-old "South Coast" (now Gold Coast), has also changed location and will be one of the show tracks of Australia when Ray Hogarth and his merry men have finished fussing over it.

Under the fatherly care of Vic. Eather, Boggabri (N.S.W.) have strengthened their earlier unsteady steps and are now in full stride. A new electric trap, with lights, backed by an automatic, and greatly improved facilities are the result of the efforts of he and his aides, the steadfast Nott brothers, Dick and "Tex", old-timer Charlie Cochrane and facile Secretary, Bruce Gittoes. Vic, of course, was born to gun-smoke, his father, the late Wal. Eather, being favourably known on many shooting tracks.

Separated by only sixty miles of perfect bitumen, Narrabri and Moree work in close liaison. The former, fortunate in acquiring their own land with a good background, have built a sturdy new club-house and installed a second automatic trap. Here, time-giving President Athol Palmer has been backed by Eric Saunders, doyen amongst Secretaries, and supported by many club members. Moree have added an electric trap to their indestructable Black Diamond, and their skeet lay-out (the only one at present in the north-west) has been improved by electric releases. A hard core of workers, headed by President Ted Brown, permeated by Fred Thompson, and including Fred Bardsley, Laurie Kee and Reg Morley, keep the club running smoothly. Lucky is the club who possesses, or is possessed by, a Fred Thompson, who hovers watchfully over the area, clucking disconsolately when things are going

fairly well and swearing terribly when they are not, but ensuring that all things are as much in readiness as mortal man can make them.

Scone (N.S.W.), who must surely combine the most picturesque grounds with the most excitable clays outside Newcastle, now have one electric and one automatic trap and perfect lights. These results stem from a band of workers so large that to name names is fraught with the danger of omission, but it is safe to say that the trio comprising devoted President "Hookey" Street, generous Patron the urbane Michael White, and capable Secretary Tom Evans, do not lack ready support.

Tamworth (N.S.W.), riding out the rough water of re-organisation, have added an automatic trap to their electric and promise to go on to greater things in keeping with the population status. This town has one of the largest and most progressive Archery Clubs in N.S.W., and one feels they will some day be equally important with the bow's modern counterpart.

Dubbo (N.S.W.) are now adding lights to their present two automatic-trap lay-out. Further developments may also be expected from this progressive club, whose destinies are largely guided by the deadly Kevin Heywood, "traveller" Jim Scott and affable Jim Crampton.

Virile Ballandean (Qld.) has grown steadily. Three searching traps of unconventional design throw even targets, right "on the peg" as regards angle, and a telephone from No. 3 to club-house is a sensible innovation. This club shoots for high stakes, is well supported by members and well guided by the Smith brothers, "Chub" and Noel, President and Secretary respectively.

The gauge of Cobar's (N.S.W.) progress could well be the State Teams shoot which was recently held there. It was well attended, well run and enjoyed by all over the three electric traps. It was highlighted, of course, by the staggering shoot-off between Kevin Heywood, Mal. Burgess and Don Scowcroft for the Far West Double-barrel Championship, when these three alone broke 1,120

clays before finding a winner in Kevin Heywood. But the significant fact is that the club could run such a shoot so well. Here the workers, headed by the Burgess, father and son, have the fullest support from ideal Secretary Mrs. G. L. Singleton. The unique "Marfeesh" days are, alas, no more, but the Singleton spirit still pervades the club's activities.

"Wingadee", which is the club of well-known horse-racing town, Coonamble (N.S.W.), now has one permanent, lighted electric trap as well as a trap-house, tracks and power for a second. On open days the Warren electric trap is borrowed, and this comfortable and economic arrangement works vice-versa. This is one of the clubs where shooters' wives take a keen interest in its activities. Wherever this does occur, the club seems to be on a surer and more permanent footing. In the club-house are several archery butts, and it was the custom in earlier days for the ladies to so indulge while their men-folk used the noisier weapon. Regrettably, this has now ceased, but other clubs may find the idea worth considering.
