

The Editor's Notebook



A.C.T.A. 1967 NATIONAL CHAM-PIONSHIPS and INTERNATIONAL MATCH will be conducted at the grounds of the Gold Coast Gun Club (formerly the South Coast Gun Club), Queensland, commencing at 8.00 a.m. daily over the five days, Saturday, June 10, until p.m. Wednesday, June 14, inclusive. The programme (which includes the Queen's Birthday holiday on the Monday) has been amended to avoid a carry-over of events and to avoid a carry-over of events and will progress as follows, with the provision that, subject to time permitting each day, a \$300 Cash Handicap event will be added. The first day, Saturday, will see the winner of the coveted Champion of Champions Cup (1966 winner was M. Burgess of Cobar, N.S.W.). On the second day, Sunday, the National Intermediate Championship (1966 winner, T. day, Sunday, the National Intermediate Championship (1966 winner, T. Holmes, N.S.W.) will be shot in conjunction with the National Double-Barrel Championship (1966 winner, V. Ryan, Vic.). The third day, Monday, will commence with the National Single - Barrel Championship (1966 winner, D. Glover, Vic.), followed by the National Double Rise Championship (1966 winner, W. Charlton, N.S.W.). On the fourth day, Tuesday, the 1967 Australia - New Zealand the 1967 Australia - New Zealand Championship shall be contested. A \$300 Handicap event is then scheduled to take place. For the fifth and final day, the Twenty-first International Teams' Match will be conducted (Australian Team to be the 30 highest aggregate scorers in the Aust. - N.Z. Championship and the Aust. Nat. S.B. and D.B. Championships — of which only the best 25

scores are to count. Final scores are to be withheld pending complete results from overseas). The last scheduled event is to be the Eighteenth Grand Australian \$550 Handicap. The High Gun Trophy will be a B2, Grade (d), Special Trap 2 model Under and Over shotgun, the broad-rib type with 30-inch barrels, donated annually since 1966 by the makers, Fabrique Nationale of Belgium and Gollin & Co. of Sydney (as agents for N.S.W., Q'land and S. Aust.), with the provision that it may be won only once by any shooter. This will be competed for over the programmed events numbered 1 to 7 inclusive.

If a shoot-off is necessary to determine the High Gun winner, then the shoot-off shall be shot under handicap conditions.

During the programme all New Zealand shooters will shoot two yards back from their New Zealand handicaps and ALL SHOOTERS MUST SHOW CURRENT HANDICAP CARDS WHEN NOMINATING FOR EACH EVENT.

The official photographer at the A.C.T.A. National shoots will be F. LANG of P.O. Box 40, TWEED HEADS, N.S.W.

Trophies will be presented daily from a dais after each event.

Results of the Twenty-first International Teams' Match are to be withheld until after the International Tournament, which will be held on Friday, July 21, 1967, near Dublin, Eire, by the Clay Pigeon Shooting Association of England. Any A.C.T.A. registered shooters visiting U.K. at this time are invited to attend this programme and may obtain further details from the Secretary, A.C.T.A.

Dear Mr. Berry,

A.C.T.A. Olympic Acceptance:

Would you please publish in the June News a brief outline of the following details that Club Delegates will be required to vote on at our Annual Meeting.

I will not go into lengthy details for the sport to have participation, other than to say that the only Shooting Body authorised by the Australian Olympic Federation is the Australian Joint Shooting Council, with whom we would have to be affiliated to nominate us.

This brings up the Amateur Rules applying to this sporting body, and as far as I can ascertain, has some wide effects upon our current shooting procedure.

It will not materially affect small clubs, but it will definitely not permit us to shoot for large cash prizes, or for motor cars. We can, however, shoot for a gun of any value, and if money is won, it can be a credit at the shooter's home club, where it is credited to him for his actual costs, which may include:

- 1. Entrance fees, or nominations
- 2. Ammunition
- 3. Travelling expenses
- 4. Cost for meals and lodgings, not exceeding \$10 per day.

He can win cartridges, guns, shooting coats, or belts, vests, etc.

Anyone whose principal profession is test shooting of guns, or ammunition, or an instructor, cannot be an amateur under the rules.

The actual competitor himself would have to follow the rules of an amateur as laid down by the National Olympic Committee of his country; the principal consideration here is the activities of the competitor during the previous two years.

If we desire to compete in the Olympics in Mexico in 1968, the delegates will have to vote on whether we are prepared to accept the requirements of the Olympic Federation, on which the writer would hope to have full details for discussion at the Annual Meeting.

I regret it has not been practical to give more notice to Clubs of this important step, but you are well aware of the pressure that we have been under to get as far forward as we have, and I would like to thank you for the great amount of work that you have personally put into this project of A.C.T.A. Olympic acceptance.

Looking forward to a record International Shoot at the Gold Coast.

Ten Years Ago -

Full particulars from the Secretary, T. S. Young, Katanning, or President, Neville Beeck, who will be visiting as many E.S. clubs as possible from April to August. Neville also conducts a Wild Life Sanctuary on his property "Summerfield", Katanning. Apart from the shooting, Katanning will offer interest to visitors. It is situated 178 miles from Porth and situated 178 miles from Perth, and is the centre of the wool and stud industry in W.A. and conducts annually the second biggest Stud Merino Sale in the Southern Hemisphere.



At our last Bundella (N.S.W.) Club shoot we tried out Deauville Triplets. This novelty event had been suggested to me by Boyce Siddins, worthy President of St. George (Qld.) club. A sparrow is sandwiched between two pigeon clays on the trap which is set to throw double-rise, and partners as in ordinary Deauville Doubles attempt to get the three birds—often with embarrassing results. It certainly has more spectator appeal than its forebear, and surely provides a truer indication of the shotgunning ability of the partners.

I read of a miniature clay game used in America wherein small targets are fired at with smooth-bore .22's loaded with rat shot. They call it "Aw Shucks!" a name aptly descriptive, in this instance, of the discomfort caused by that unscathed sparrow.

At Bundella two pairs shot 14/15 and in the shoot-off Bruce Gittoes and Ken Ballard collected their first three, but the sparrow slipped past Vic. Eather and Don Saunders—Aw shucks!

A point to ponder is that Deauville Doubles scores are rarely high, although George Biggs and A. H. Brenk shot 215 pairs straight in 1955. This is the highest score to come under my notice. The smallest in high-grade events must surely be the 1965 N.S.W. Championship at Dubbo, when out of a field of 62 only two pairs shot the possible, and the shoot-off lasted one pair each, Jim Crampton and T. Powell emerging the winners, 21/21.

When it is considered that the flight of the bird is known beforehand, one has visions of astronomical scores. That this is not so demonstrates the inability of the human body to repeat a relatively simple set of movements indefinitely, especially when there is a slight uneasiness

of mind, occasioned in this instance by thoughts of the second bird. Many shooters would probably prefer more challenging targets, even with attendant lower scores.

Another novelty event was intro-duced to Narrabri Club by the perambulating Don Scowcroft. This, called a quail shoot, smacks some-what of Skeet, and is very interesting. The first shot is taken about 20 yards to the left of No. 1 lane and as far forward as possible withand as far forward as possible with-out risk to the trapper. The next two positions work back towards the lanes, in line with No. 1. Stations 4, 5, and 6 are repetitions of the first three, but on the opposite side of the trap-house, No. 7 is shot standing on the trap-house roof, and No. 8 is directly in front of the trap and facing away from it. This No. 8 is a kind of macabre Tower shot—one gets a crawly feeling in the back of the neck where an ill-flung clay might attempt to saw its way through, and there is a sudden illumination as to the meaning of the name "Quail". Two birds are taken at stations 1 and 4, making a round of 10, and a "possible" with an oscillating trap is not usual.

The suggestion of Jim Simson (Gunnedah, N.S.W.) also could add variety to a day of straight shooting. variety to a day of straight shooting. This is an orthodox double barrel event, but the gun is held down (but below fore-arm) and the bird is not called for — that being left to the pleasure of the puller. This simulates field shooting to some extent and is not so time-wasting as walk-ups. Nor is it hampered, as the latter is, by the "gun position" rule in which a person has to bear either the considerable handicap of holding the gun "down", or the slightly ludicrous feeling which accompanies advancing with it in the mounted position.



Before taking his title Fred Hudson had to shoot off with 14 other competitors of the record field of 286. These 15 finalists shot possibles of 50 targets in the match and contested a first miss-out shoot-off for the title. The final went to a further 40 targets before Hudson emerged the victor.






