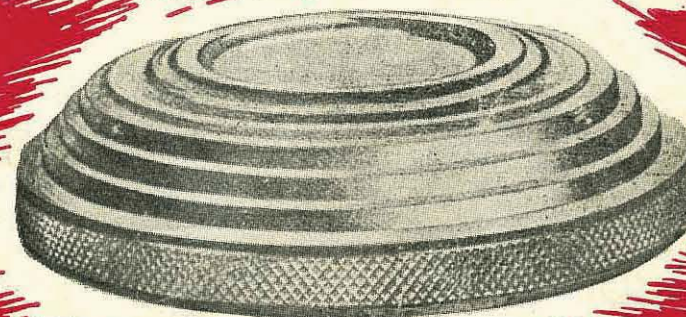

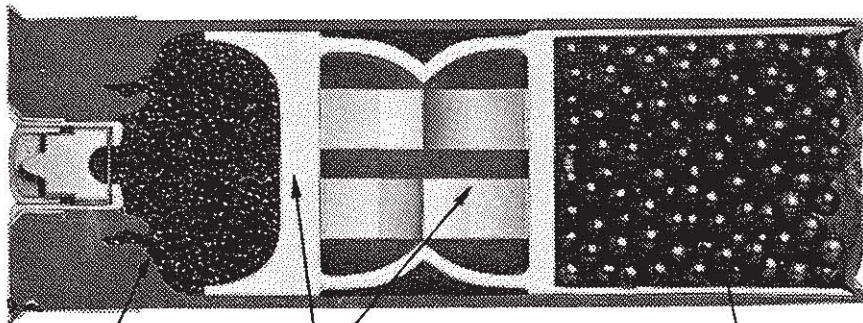

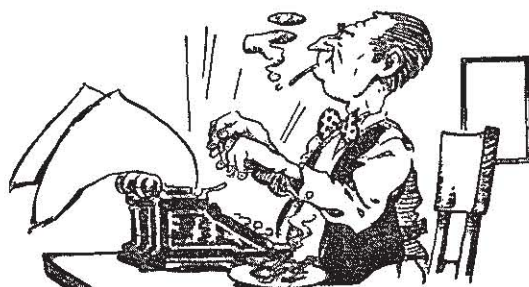

A.C.T.A. NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP RESULTS:

As the 1967 National Championships at Southport, Queensland, were not concluded until June 14, complete details of the results were not available for publication in this issue. However, full information of the programme will be published in August Shooting "News". Meanwhile a "STOP PRESS" is published in this edition.

Results of the 21st International Teams' Match are not available until all other competing countries have conducted their matches. On Friday, July 21, 1967, the Clay Pigeon Shooting Association of England will conduct their section of the International Tournament near Dublin, Eire.

A.C.T.A. 1967 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS:

Applications for open championships to be contested during 1967 (that is, Commonwealth, State and District Titles) are required to be lodged, in writing on the prescribed form, not later than Thursday, Aug. 31. Such applications shall be collated and submitted to the Executive Committee for consideration and allocation.

Member clubs are requested to measure their applications and to apply only for championships which can be satisfactorily conducted during the period concerned.

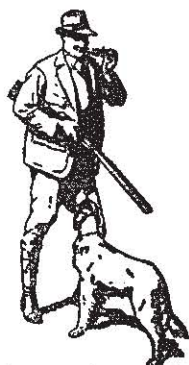

BREAK RECORDS: Indicative of the high standard of clay target shooting in all States, J. M. Sullivan of Macarthur (Western Victoria) defeated a hot field in early May, 1967, with a Victorian Break Record of 288 straight targets.

At the Euroa Gun Club (Central Victoria), on Saturday, May 27, A. James of Huntly G.C. established a further break record for Victoria with 351 straight targets. He won the Club Double-barrel Championship with 349 from V. Bussell 348, then broke two targets from the 26-yard mark. Both these shooters lost count before either pulled a second barrel—well into the 200's. The weather was perfectly calm and clear.

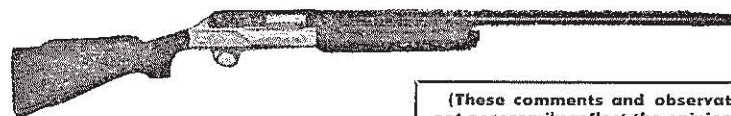

RANDOM SHOTS OF A ROVING SHOOTER



(These comments and observations do not necessarily reflect the opinions of the Executive Committee of the A.C.T.A.).

After a good day at the traps very few of us are concerned with the technical details of success. The targets were big and easy to knock down, so in the dusky evening we have a relaxing round of refreshments with our shooting friends, and the day is pleasantly closed. But in the baffling times, when the clays are fast, jazzy and too often intact, we are apt to critically examine our mode of shooting. Somewhere along the line in this interrogation the question arises as to whether one's stance is all that could be desired. Many top-line shooters attach great importance to this matter and are convinced that it plays a major part in their success. Others, however, dismiss it as unimportant, maintaining merely that one should feel comfortable and capable of swinging to any angle. Joe Hiestand, revered on the American tracks, sums up this view by saying, "Stance is minor. We have had champions who position their feet from straight-on to ninety degrees to the trap. Stand the way you want to and have confidence, but lean forward enough so that you will absorb the recoil and not be kicked back on to your heels."

Watching shooters in action, one is inclined to support this theory, for every conceivable stance by top-line shooters is accompanied by consistently good scores. There comes to mind the "side-on" stance of the highly rated Queenslanders, Keith Cameron and Don Whyte, and the "square on" position of nonchalant Doug. Smith (Qld.) and the late Jack McLean (N.S.W.), with toes placed parallel to the back of the trap-house. The image of sheer alertness projected by the spread-legged, forward-leaning Kevin Heywood (N.S.W.) and the ballet-dance posture of Warren Charlton (N.S.W.) are thrown into relief by the complete orthodoxy of

poker-faced Vic. Eather (N.S.W.), reared in the rough-and-tumble of live-bird shooting, who scores or misses with complete detachment.

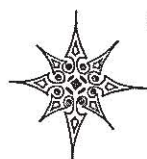
Dave Mackay says Norman Simson "kind of winds himself up" with a wagging right elbow before his cool, slow call for the bird. Unfortunately Norman now finds his health not quite up to competitive shooting. Dave himself sights along the rib and is almost off balance should he have to call on a second barrel, but the second rarely misses. Then there is the bewildering ritual of "Pee-Wee" Thompson, who gets all ready, raises his hat, calls "pull" just as the head-gear is being re-settled amidst a forward-lunging motion, and fires as the gun-butt touches his shoulder. Scores show clearly that these self-imposed tasks do not affect his accuracy.

The precise shooting of dapper Fred. Hudson and tenacious Les. English have a similarity in their close-heeled, rocking posture, while the wider-standing, straight-legged Dave Casson bows politely forward from the waist and politely keeps breaking them.

It seems that the paths to the clay are individual, "rough hew them how we may."

Toepperwein Retires

(With acknowledgements to "Outdoor Life", via C. Ollera of Guyra, N.S.W.)

Adolph P. TOEPPERWEIN, aged 82, of San Antonio, Texas—the unchallenged holder of the greatest shooting record ever made at aerial targets—has retired after 50 years of professional exhibition shooting for Wester-Winchester. In 79 years of shooting he never had a single shooting accident.

In company with his equally famous wife "Plinky", who died in 1945, Toepperwein toured the country for a half-century, giving shooting exhibitions with rifles, shotguns, pistols and revolvers. These performances were so popular that schools and colleges frequently closed down to give their students an opportunity to witness the marksmanship of the famous Texas Triggerman.

Tall, quiet, and unassuming, he was the idol of youngsters from coast to coast. Although no accurate records were kept, it is estimated that in his lifetime Toepperwein fired accurately three million rounds of ammunition.

Toepperwein's greatest feat was performed with a 22-calibre semi-automatic Winchester rifle, Model 03, at the San Antonio Fair Grounds in 1906. In twelve days of shooting he broke 72,491 out of 72,500 aerial targets, beating the greatest previous record of 60,000 out of 60,650 targets made by Dr. W. F. Carver, marksman of Buffalo Bill's Wild West Show. No one since has ever attempted to try for Toepperwein's record, which will probably stand for all time.

Son of a Texan frontier gunsmith, Toepperwein was born in 1869 at Boerne, Texas. Before he was ten, he became a marksman with a cross-bow, a 14-gauge shotgun, and a .22-calibre rifle. By the time he was 21 he had become a cartoonist for the San Antonio Daily Express and had become a local celebrity as a sharpshooter. After several years in big-time vaudeville performing a shoot-

ing act in B. F. Keith theatres, Toepperwein became chief exhibition shooter of Winchester Repeating Arms Company of New Haven, Conn. In 1932, when Winchester was acquired by the Western Cartridge Company, Toepperwein continued as chief exhibition shooter for both Western and Winchester.

With his skill as a cartoonist, Toepperwein originated the "bullet drawing". In this feat he used his pet .22-calibre Winchester rifle and approximately 300 bullets to produce a "picture" in three minutes of rapid-fire marksmanship.

Toepperwein found his wife-to-be loading ammunition at Winchester. Elizabeth Servaty had never fired a gun until she met Toepperwein. Three weeks after he had begun her instruction in the use of a rifle, his wife had become so skilful that she was shooting chalk from between his fingers. This feat was later abandoned as a bad example to inexperienced shooters.

Under her husband's tutelage Mrs. Toepperwein became the greatest woman trapshooter of her time. Her greatest feat, which has never been equalled by either man or woman, consisted of breaking 1,952 out of 2,000 clay targets in 3 hours and 15 minutes of actual shooting time.

Mrs. Toepperwein was popularly known as "Plinky" from her habit of saying "plink" when she pulled a trigger, and she invented the word "plinking" to describe the practice of shooting at random targets.

Toepperwein's last exhibitions with his wife were held during World War II in training camps in the South and South-west.

(NOTE: These are interesting human facts and are wonderful for the manufacturers' productions, but it must be remembered that these would not necessarily be down-the-line shooting conditions.) — Ed.

The programme was to commence with the Grand Prix event of 200 targets, in series of 25, from 15 Olympic traps off 15 metres, and was open to all shooters.

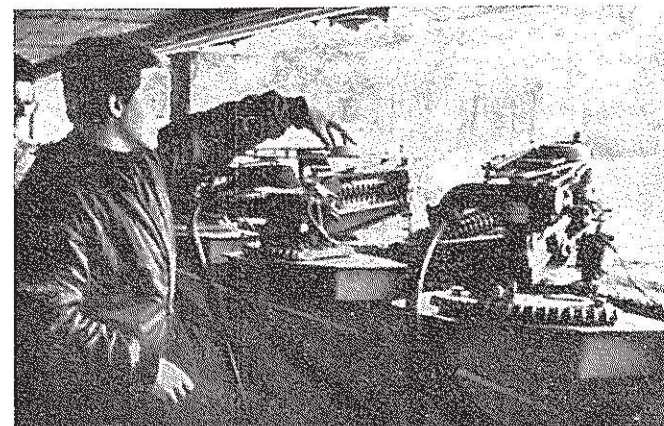
On the second day was a Team Shoot Contest (teams of 3 shooters). The winning team of three would receive a gold medal each. Winners

JAPAN—The Asian Shooting Championships will be conducted on the ranges especially built for the 1964 Olympics at Tokorozawa, some 12 miles west of Tokyo, over the period July 15 to 25, 1967. Registered A.C.T.A. shooters may compete providing that entries are lodged in Australia before July 5 (apply in first instance to A.C.T.A.). Shooters will be billeted at the Olympic village (also built for the 1964 Olympic Games), but the cost is unknown.

The first event will be of 300 Trap targets over three days — 1st day = 100, 2nd day = 150, 3rd day = 50.

The next event will be 200 Skeet Targets — 1st day = 50, 2nd day = 100, 3rd day = 50.

Ten (10) individual shooters per nation may compete in each event OR four (4) shooters may compete as a national team. Trap and Skeet

events will be held July 21 to 23 inclusive. The trap range consists of 2 x 15 machine or trap ranges.

The U.I.T. master's badge is given for a pre-determined standard of marksmanship; i.e. (1) for the first 100 targets of the TRAP event the gold medal standard is 95, the silver medal standard is 90, the bronze medal standard is 85.

(2) for the first series of 100 targets of SKEET the gold medal standard is 96, the silver medal standard is 92, the bronze medal standard is 88.

Ladies are permitted to enter in the respective championships.

—:—:—

ITALY — September 15 to 24, 1967, at Bologna, under U.I.T. technical regulations, will be:

- (a) Skeet=200 targets in 4 stands.
- (b) Olympic Trap=300 targets in 4 stands with 15 machines.

The championships will be held on the grounds of the Bononia Wing Shooting Club at Casalecchio Di Reno, about 10 kilometres from the city of Bologna.

Participation — Skeet and Olympic Trap—a maximum of 6 competitors

will be admitted to each event, for each nation, 4 of which will be members of the team for the World Teams' Championships.

15-16 = official practice in 4 Skeet stands.

17-18 = individual and team Skeet World Championships.
