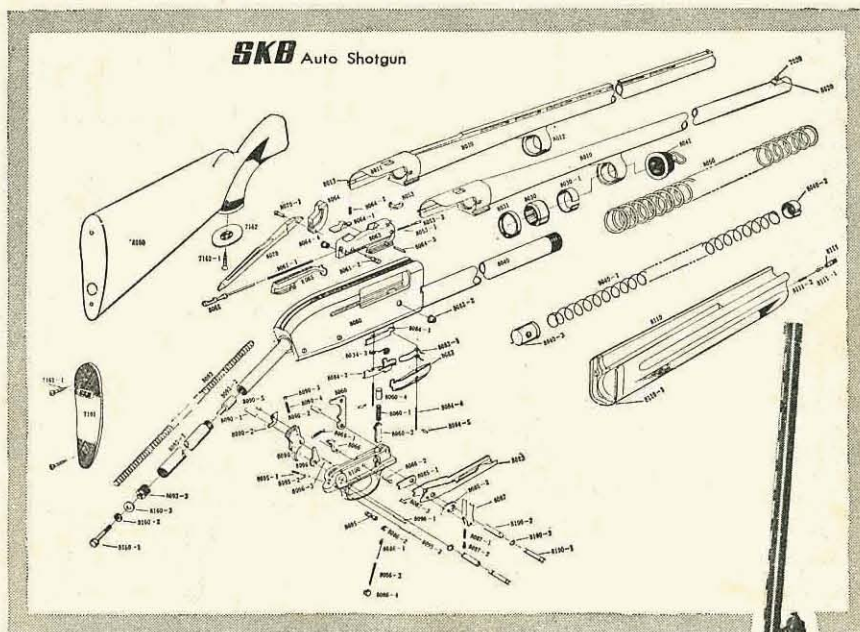

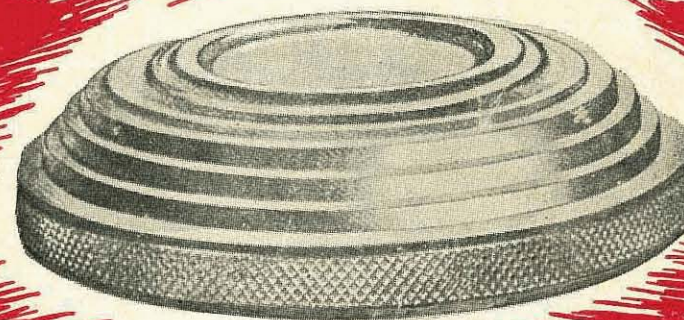

The Editor's Notebook



The 31st Annual General Meeting of affiliated club delegates and representatives was held at the Pacific Hotel, Southport, Queensland, from 8.00 p.m. on Sunday, June 13, 1967, due to flooding at the Gold Coast Gun Club—such alteration was by unanimous shooter approval.

The attendance was the largest ever recorded and all States were represented, plus a number of observers.

The President (1) requested that shooters give a standing ovation to the Committee of the Gold Coast Gun Club for their efforts in the cyclonic winds and sub-tropical rains, and also to their women-folk for their noble and voluntary assistance.

(2) announced that H.M. The Queen had graciously bestowed the Order of the British Empire (O.B.E.) on A.C.T.A. Hon. Life Vice-President W. E. H. Rainbird of Launceston, Tasmania — this was acknowledged with acclamation.

(3) congratulated the 1966 Queensland Team for the best score ever recorded (493/500).

(4) congratulated the 1966 Victorian Team for winning the Interstate Skeet Match (123/125).

(5) congratulated all other 1966 winners and F. Hudson of N.S.W. for his winning scores in New Zealand during 1967.

Appointment of Auditor — Mr. R. W. Fox of Moorabbin (Vic.) was re-appointed as Auditor.

The elections for the Executive

Committee by the various States resulted as follows:—

Queensland — Mr. W. A. Edwards was elected for 1967/1968 years.
New South Wales — Messrs. D. B. Mott and K. Oldfield were re-elected for 1967/1968 years.

Victoria — Messrs. E. T. Baldwin and G. H. Hall were re-elected for 1967/1968 years.

The next scheduled meeting of the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee will be held in the R.A.C.V. Building, 123 Queen Street, Melbourne, over Monday - Tuesday, October 2-3, 1967.

WARNING

Information has been received that a number of shotguns used at the 1967 National Championship shoots at Southport, Queensland, have been stripped by gunsmiths for general servicing and overhaul, consequent upon the heavy rain experienced over that period.

The guns were found to have commencement of corrosion and rusting

in the actions, also some stocks and forearms had either warped or swollen.

All concerned are advised accordingly to have their guns stripped and inspected.

A.C.T.A. 1968 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS:

Applications for open championships to be contested during 1968 (that is, Commonwealth, State and District Titles) are required to be lodged, in writing on the prescribed form, not later than Thursday, Aug. 31. SKEET HANDICAPPING FORMULA

Skeet Shooting is single-barrel shooting and all consequent handicapping is defined as a method whereby each competitor has an equal chance of reaching the possible with his allotted handicap.

A skeet shooter with no past performance or handicap rating shoots for targets to acquire a handicap. He shoots at 25 targets which comprise a round of skeet.

On his first performance he shoots with no handicap at 25 targets and, say, breaks 18 targets — this 18 is now his basis for handicapping until further scores are available. To ensure that he improves, THE KEY FIGURE OF 24 TARGETS (not the possible 25) is noted and the handicap allotted is the difference between this figure (24) and his average of 18 (i.e. $24 - 18 = 6$). Thus handicap rating is now 6 whilst he is shooting the next event.

After he shoots his second skeet round both his first performance (18 targets) and his second performance (say he breaks 20 of 25 targets) are added together ($18 + 20 = 38$, resulting in an average of 19 targets). The difference between this average of 19 and the KEY FIGURE OF 24 TARGETS gives his handicap for his next round of skeet as being 5.

After the third round of skeet an average is taken of the three performances of the shooter as described above and a handicap is awarded accordingly. The difference between this average and the KEY FIGURE OF 24 is now his handicap.

After four rounds of skeet have been shot (e.g. 18, 20, 17, 22), even if over a several-year period, during which the club keeps such records, discard the lowest of these four rounds (e.g. 17) and average the remaining 3 rounds to the nearest number of targets

$$\text{(e.g. } \frac{18 + 20 + 22}{3} = 20 \text{)}$$

This average of 20, subtracted from the key figure of 24, produces the handicap of 4 targets for the next round of skeet.

After the fifth round of skeet, where, say, 19 of 25 targets are scored, the NORMAL SKEET HANDICAPPING FORMULA is now applicable, which is:—

Take the last four (4) rounds, each of 25 targets, and discard the lowest score. The remaining three (3) scores are averaged. Thus from the above example, scores were 18, 20, 17, 22, 19, from which the initial figure of 18 is eliminated and the lowest score (17) of the remaining four scores is discarded, leaving $20 + 22 + 19 = 61$, of which the average is $20\frac{1}{3}$. The nearest whole figure of 20 is the accepted average. Take this average of 20 from the KEY FIGURE of 24 to arrive at the handicap of 4 targets.

THIS IS THE PROCEDURE FOR ARRIVING AT THE HANDICAP OF A SKEET SHOOTER AND SUCH CALCULATED RESULTS MUST APPEAR ON THE CLUB HANDICAP RETURNS AS LODGED WITH THE A.C.T.A.

Once a shooter attains an average of 24 targets, from these calculations, then his handicap becomes NIL.

In Skeet Championship events, kills only are counted.

In Skeet Handicap events, kills and handicap targets (figures from the above formula) are added together to arrive at the total score. A Skeet possible can only be 25 targets.

Skeet Sweepstakes:

The normal method in a Skeet Handicap is to divide the sweepstakes amongst those shooters attaining twenty-five killed (broken) targets, with handicaps included.

(example) Smith 25/25, Handicap 3, total = 25/25.
Jones 22/25, Handicap 3, total = 25/25.
Brown 19/25, Handicap 7, total = 25/25.

The same method is used on the very few occasions a half-round is shot.

Skeet Shoot-offs (Handicaps):

Where several competitors attain a possible with or without handicap and a shoot-off becomes necessary, the method of finding the winner is as follows:—

(a) Club Competition —

Put the finalists in squads in the order they qualify.

Halve their initial handicaps (some clubs reduce to a quarter handicap here). Shoot a half-round of twelve targets. Add the half-handicaps to scores off the gun. Those with a total of twelve or more targets qualify for a further half-round and so on till the event is finalized.

Where there are no shooters with a nil handicap in the shoot-off, a quicker method is as follows:— After halving the handicaps take the lowest handicapped shooter(s), put him back to nil and deduct the number of targets (taken away) from each of the others.

	Half Handicap
(example) Smith	1 — 1 = 0
Brown	3 — 1 = 2
Jones	2 — 1 = 1
Green	1 — 1 = 0
Anderson	4 — 1 = 3

This leaves the competition quite fair, but usually shortens the time required to reach finality.

(b) Open Competition —

Shot first miss-out. Each shooter is allowed his allotted handicap and shoots at rounds of 25 targets until his allowed number of targets is used. Thus, a shooter on a nil handicap drops out after his first miss; a shooter with two targets drops out when his third miss is recorded, and so on to finality — unless a scratch marker is in the group, then reduce each shooter's handicap by the amount of the lowest marker in the group.

A half-round comprises twelve targets:— Stations numbered 1 to 7 = one alternative target from each, starting with the high house; station number 8 = one target from the high house; double targets from stations 2 and 6 = TOTAL twelve targets.

NOTE: ALL CLUBS SHOOTING SKEET ARE REQUIRED TO LODGE (1) A CURRENT ALPHABETICAL LIST OF SKEET HANDICAPS BY SEPTEMBER 1st.

(2) AN ALPHABETICAL LIST OF AMENDED SKEET HANDICAPS EACH MONTH THEREAFTER.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 1967 Australian National Trap-shooting Championships conducted over the period Saturday, June 10, to p.m. Wednesday, June 14, at the Gold Coast Gun Club, Southport, Queensland, were considered to be the most successful series ever conducted by the A.C.T.A., as record fields contested all events of the programme.

For some five days before the programme was scheduled to commence, heavy sub-tropical rains had fallen in the South East Queensland area, accompanied by cyclonic winds which did not abate until the National Championships were completed some ten days later.

Although shooting under extremely wet conditions, the co-operation of the shooters remarkably assisted the smooth running of the shoot. Full meals were provided by the caterers on the grounds over the entire daylight hours and the undercroft of the Gold Coast Gun Club building was fitted out and operated as a successful dining room, with a seating capacity of some 80 diners.

Gold Coast Gun Club President Andy Gordon and Club Captain Ray Hogarth, with their untiring staff, must be commended for their handling of the facilities under such adverse conditions. Some 10½ inches of rain fell over the area during the 24 hours 9 a.m. Sunday until 9 a.m. Monday, but this did not upset Shoot Marshal Harry Cox, who had the admiration of all for his manner and fortitude. Five traps were operating.

Shooters from all States and New Guinea attended, plus a contingent of 66 shooters and 27 ladies from New Zealand.

It is recorded that assistance by some I.C.I.A.N.Z. personnel contributed to the success of the shoot. The Association is grateful for this continued assistance and for the products as donated.

The programme commenced on Saturday, June 10, with the coveted Champion of Champions Award, and saw W. STEVENS, the well-known Ipswich (Qld.) shooter, take out his first National title against a very strong field.

The National Double-barrel Championship, attracting a record field of

300 shooters, was won by D. SMITH of Brisbane (Qld.), who is one of Australia's top trap-shooters. The Intermediate Double-barrel Championship, which was shot in conjunction, was won by J. VEALE of Auckland, New Zealand.

Best Lady shooter was Mrs. Pam Isaacs of Brisbane (Qld.) with a score of 48/50 in the D.B. Championship, which achieved equal fourth placing in the Intermediate Championship. The Ladies' Draw Trophy was won by Mrs. Tapper, whose presence was appreciated at the shoot.

In the National Single-barrel Championship the winner of the Double-barrel Championship, Doug. Smith, accomplished a double title by achieving the only possible score.

In the National Double Rise Championship well-known top shooter J. Newton Thomas of Melbourne (Vic.) defeated a field of first-class shooters. (This shooter has now won, over the years, all national and high-gun trap-shooting titles.)

Shooter K. Heywood of Dubbo (N.S.W.) shot brilliantly to win the Australia-New Zealand Championship.

The Grand Australian Handicap saw the local shooter A. MARSTELLA of the Gold Coast Gun Club (Qld.) take the major prize.

New Zealand shooter L. Brown defeated his fellow countryman J. Begg in a shoot-off for the New Zealand High Gun Trophy.

The well-known Cobar (N.S.W.) shooter M. BURGESS shot brilliantly throughout the six events to win the beautiful Browning Special Trap 2, Under and Over shotgun donated by the makers, Fabrique Nationale of Belgium and Gollin & Co. of Sydney, N.S.W. Burgess compiled a score of 392/400 over the six events.

J. N. Thomas (Melbourne) and M. Burgess (Cobar) were equal high-gun scorers for the 21st International Teams' Match with a score of 300/300 each. Such a double score has never before been recorded in this event in Australia. Results of the 21st International Teams' Match are withheld until after the International Tournament, which will be held Friday, July 21, 1967, near Dublin, Eire, by the Clay Pigeon Shooting Association of England.

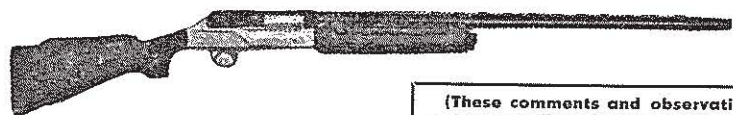

RANDOM SHOTS OF A ROVING SHOOTER



(These comments and observations do not necessarily reflect the opinions of the Executive Committee of the A.C.T.A.).

Why is it that we so often hear a luckless shooter lamenting that the one bird which he dropped was a dead-easy straight-away? This phenomenon has been the subject of lively debate on many gun tracks without any conclusive explanation being offered. Dave Mackay (Newcastle, N.S.W.) is convinced that they can slip through an unfortunate hole in a pattern. This theory is supported by what may be termed the "travel value" of a target in respect of a pattern. When examining a pattern-sheet it is generally noticeable that there are holes sufficiently large to accommodate a clay target, providing the target were stationary within the pattern. Because the target is not stationary it is reasonable to assume that if it moves across the line of flight of the shot-string as in a swinging bird, it would have less chance of survival than if its flight coincided with the line of flight of the shot-string as in a "straight-away". Very able reasoning, my dear Watson, though it does seem strange to me that there are lots more holes in my own patterns than in those of the devastating Scot who propounds this theory.

It seems that accuracy rather than pattern luck should be held responsible.

Ces. Joass (Sydney) supports the latter contention by claiming that it is more difficult to swing a gun steadfastly upwards than sideways. Try following a line drawn straight up a wall as if overtaking a clay, and see how difficult it is to keep the gun barrel from straying, he argues. This is true, as those who have tried it can testify, but whether it is more difficult to follow a perpendicular than a transverse line can be the subject of considerable argument in its own right.

Don Whyte (St. George, Qld.) thinks that to a right-handed shooter

the left hand could be the villain. When a straight-away pops up, there is very little body movement necessary, and instead of making the slight backward sway required, the shooter jerks his left hand up and in consequence often shoots over the top of the target.

There is undoubted truth in the contention of Kevin Constable (Wingadee, N.S.W.), who states that a large number of the so-called straight-aways are, in fact, slightly quartering birds. If these are treated as straight-aways and fired at directly, the shot is inevitably behind.

Whatever the cause, most of us would as soon face a good, honest swinger as one of these "dead-easy" straight-aways.

A most interesting event took place in England early this year when a team of twenty-five shooters from the U.S.A. flew over for a match of two rounds of skeet against an English team. There was no suggestion that either side comprised the twenty-five top shooters of their country, and such outstanding names as the Americans Alex Kerr and Dan Orlich and the Englishmen Wheeler and Braithwaite were not mentioned. However, some of the Americans were champions in National events and all were winners of various classes in a nation-wide contest in which the trip to England was the prize.

The English team were mainly members of the Waltham Abbey Gun Club, which was the venue of the contest, although one squad was drawn from the executive committee of the Clay Pigeon Shooters' Association, and another included three guest shooters.

One round was shot under English rules and the other under International rules. The latter, of course, are more exacting—gun held down

and delayed release—and this would probably explain the lack of brilliant scoring. By my calculations the English side dropped an average of 11½, and the U.S.A. team an average of 14 birds per shooter, from the possible 50. The former won 956/1250 to the latter's 902/1250.

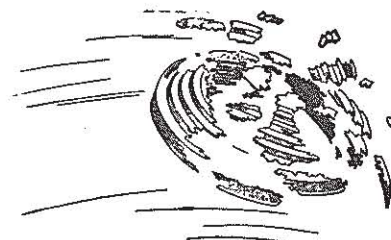
There were some interesting activities for the Americans, apart from the actual skeet shooting. One of the highlights was a wine-tasting party at a famous cellar near the Tower of London; another was a visit to the Holland and Holland shooting school; and one visitor toured the Purdey factory and met all the men who were working on his nearly-completed gun.

The expenses of the trip and the contest were borne by Winchester-Western and the whole affair received a good deal of newspaper, radio and television publicity.

With an ever-shrinking world,

similar visits are increasingly feasible and nothing promotes understanding and friendship between nations more than a mingling of their peoples, wherein the truth is made apparent that human nature is much the same the world over, and neither the virtues of courage, honesty and industry nor the vices of cruelty, intolerance and deceit are peculiar to races or nations, but only to the individuals within them.

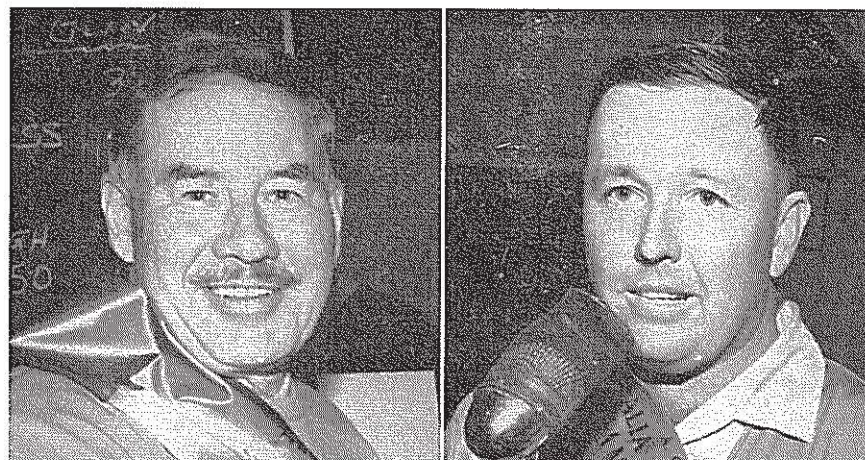

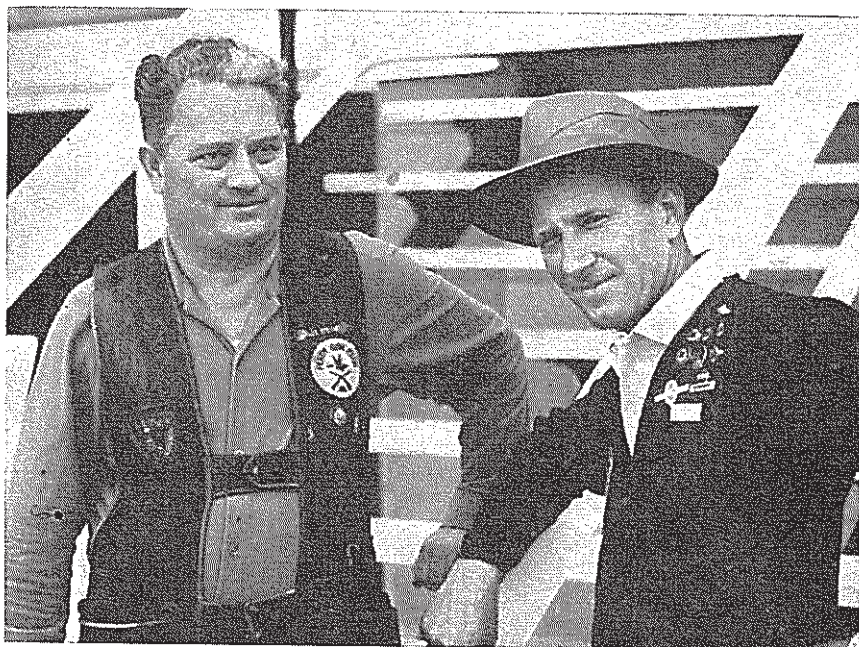

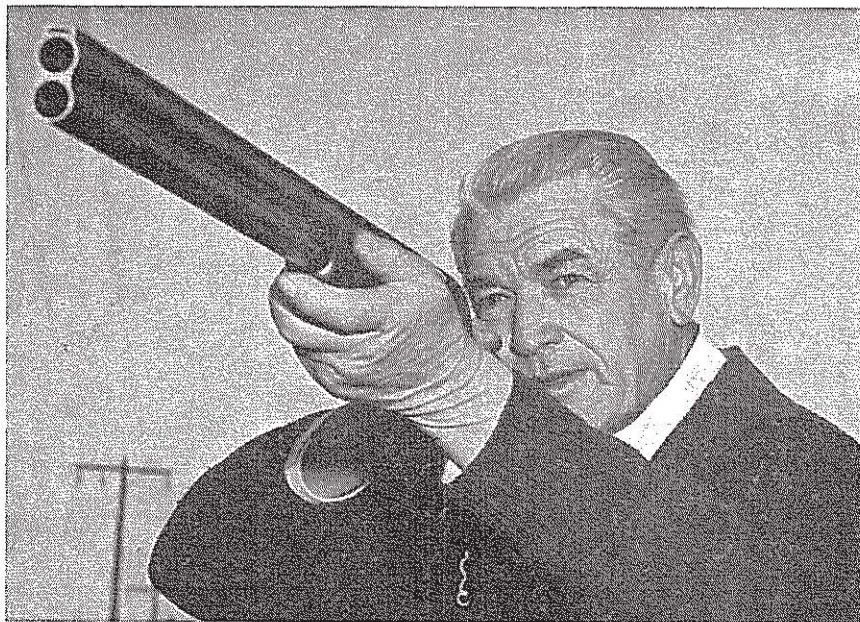
