

Each contesting team consisted of 30 shooters, as in the past, but until year 1970 only the 25th highest scores are to count, with each team shooter facing 100 targets from 16 yards in four stages of 25 targets over four traps.

Shooters of any International Team can be justly proud of their achievements, and the members of the 1966 Australian Team particularly so, in that it appears that, although varying methods of scoring have been used over the years, the year 1966 saw Australia establish probably the highest total score to date.


From these results it will be seen that Australia has now won this International Event seven times during the last ten years.

J. N. Thomas (Melbourne) and M. Burgess (Cobar) were equal high-gun scorers for the 21st International Teams' Match with a score of 300/300 each. Such a double score has never before been recorded in this event in Australia.

The Australian section of the 1967 International Teams' Match was shot in a sea of mud (fortunately on a knoll) during a lull of hours only, in a cyclone, when the air was wet without rain falling, shooters facing eastwards, winds slight south-easterly, visibility clear.



News from America

During September 16-23 gun clubs throughout U.S.A., Canada and the Bahamas will begin qualifying rounds off 16 yards to decide club teams of five champions within respective yardage classifications.

Such five champions will then form the club team and will compete against other clubs in their respective areas (there are four regions in the U.S.A. and one in Canada) for the regional title.

These shooters, amateurs all, shall be seeking a share of more than \$300,000 in prizes within the 1967 Winchester Claybird Tournament.

Regardless of previous experience, all shooters will have a chance at big prizes, and the top prize awaiting the grand championship team is an all-expense-paid trip around the world for each such member and his guest.

Each entrant will shoot 100 targets each of skeet and trap. The scores will be fed into a computer, which

will sub-divide the shooters into five classifications, ranging from novice to expert.

The regional teams, plus their guests, will be flown, all expenses paid, to the Bahamas the last week in October, 1967, for the grand championships.

Club level winners will receive matched sets of Winchester shot-guns — a model 1200 trap grade, and a model 1400 skeet grade. These guns feature special serial numbers, gold plating and excellent wood.

Runners-up at each club will receive one case each of AA ammunition. They will also serve as first alternates in the event club champions are unable to attend the regional or grand championships. One 1966 team included a veteran of 73 years and a novice housewife of 26 summers.

The world tour, via BOAC jets, will take place the first two weeks of February, 1968. The exotic itinerary includes stops in Hawaii, Australia, Thailand, Italy, Germany and England.

say, 40 feet in the air, OR, 4 to 5 feet off the ground. This trap was the "pet" of that well-known shooter, the late Albert Smith of Learmonth Gun Club—Learmonth G.C. is now defunct.] — Editor.



RANDOM SHOTS OF A ROVING SHOOTER



(These comments and observations do not necessarily reflect the opinions of the Executive Committee of the A.C.T.A.).

A recent visit to the New South Wales Gun Club (Terrey Hills, Sydney) was most rewarding. This very old club has three down-the-line traps, a skeet lay-out, a fine clubhouse full of interest and tradition, and a most capable Sec.-Manager in affable Jim Evans.

Testifying to its antiquity are photos of members dated in the 1880's and 1902. These show a marked similarity in guns of the era and an astonishing variety in beards. Doubtlessly the latter prompted club member Barry Kable to make his magnificent effort in facial adornment.

This was my first experience of the wily "continental" trap, with its alarming targets ranging from high-sailing quarterers to mischievous low swingers rabbit-scampering for cover, while the sprinkling of "regulars" merely added to the uncertainty. It was exacting shooting, made extremely interesting by the challenge of the individual birds. It is a pity that these targets are not more common, and any club contemplating installing an electric trap must surely consider the few extra dollars well spent, especially as it can be swiftly returned to throwing regulation birds.


It was a privilege to shoot skeet here with the brilliant old-timer Arthur Robotham. Although over 70 years of age, and handicapped by ill-health to the extent that he now finds it impossible to indulge in "down-the-line", he shoots skeet with nonchalance, grace and a bewildering speed. One pair of doubles were so quickly converted into neighbouring black puffs that it was difficult to determine whether the "out-goer" or "incomer" had been dispatched first.

It was a pleasure to examine Ron McCathie's superb Purdey gun. This was originally supplied with two sets of barrels covering the open and full chokes range, and he later returned it to the makers and had skeet barrels fitted — a full armoury in the

one case. Handling these beautiful weapons, it is not difficult to understand a person becoming addicted to guns. Jack Mawby (Sydney) competed at last year's International at Bankstown with three aristocrats seldom encountered in the lowly boot of one car — immaculate specimens of a Boss, a Purdey and a Browning whose grade-letter was towards the end of the alphabet. The splendid case alone of his beloved Boss would provide quite a substantial amount of the cost of an average gun.

It is interesting to follow the fortunes of clay-bird shooting in other countries. A report for 1966 of U.S.A.'s major event of the year, the "Grand" at Vandalia, reveals a continuing increase in shooters and layouts, and such staggering figures for both that this must surely be the largest shotgunning meet in the world. In 1924 there were 16 traps at Vandalia and 528 shooters competed. In 1966 48 programme traps and five practice traps were used (all in one long line) and 3,464 shooters in 707 squads participated, using over two million targets in the nine days of competition. The main event of the shoot, the Grand American Handicap, was won by Delbert Grim from 23 yards, who shot the only 100 straight. It was the first time for 21 years that a shooter beyond the 22-yard mark had won, and Grim became the ninth shooter to score 100/100 in the history of the 67-year-old event.

OBSERVATIONS AT "EXPOSITION '67"

(with acknowledgments to J. M. Lucas, Director, Myer Melbourne Ltd.)

I spent two days in May visiting Exposition '67 at Montreal, Canada, before going on to Europe.

This huge Exposition is an entirely new affair, built where nothing existed before, on three islands comprising some 120 acres, each island being joined by trains and bridges. It is non-commercial and is merely a portrayal of what each country is doing. The buildings were to have been demolished, but the whole will now be kept as a park.

The first estimate was that some 30 million people would pass through the area within the allotted six-month period, but within two days this estimate was lifted to 35 million, and since to 60 millions of visitors.

The use of two trains covering four stopping places was included in the cover charge. In addition, two small eight-carriage "mini-trains" plied on overhead opposing tracks, collecting up to ten passengers per carriage from various stopping places. These mini-trains were fully automatic, with a porter but no driver and actually run through some pavilions.

A three-ton truck, with canopy, would stop for a half-hour. On its tray were three ice-skating performers going through their antics on four inches of solid ice kept frozen by a special engine. The truck would move to allotted points throughout each day.

The U.S.A. building on one island was global (see photograph) and visitors alighted from either of two trains, then moved about on three sets of escalators. These trains were like an underground "metro". On display was a present-day spacecraft complete with its attendant parachutes as if descending from space. Inside the global building was a future spacecraft to be used on the Moon by scientists from Earth. This spaceship showed how such travellers would live in space in the future.


The Bell Corporation had on display the effects and results of "Telstar satellite" beaming to various points of the Earth. Telephones of the future captured the interest of many, with the face of the person at the other end in a small screen alongside each of the caller's and receiver's telephones.

The Russian building on another island also contained three sets of escalators and a huge wall picture of each of the Moscow underground railway network and of Lenin. Suspended from the ceiling was a large model of a futuristic supersonic aeroplane, designed to carry 600 to 700 people. It was noticeable from the films that everything, including houses, was provided for the scientists, but little for the ordinary people.


The Thai and Mexican buildings were designed and presented in their national architectural styles.

In some 30,000 square feet of space about three million square miles of Australia were presented in various ways in the Australian pavilion. Walking up the approach ramp, we were met at the entrance by male and female attendants and hostesses who were dressed in attractive navy blue and orange, all woollen uniforms. The charming lass who met us gave a standard five-minute dialogue on the features inside—"Australian carpets on the floors, and on some walls, models of Australia here, the arts there, etc. — and then we hope you enjoy yourselves" — to which our humorous reply of "Good-O" brought a squeal of delight.


All sporting activities and outdoor living stories were told by various Australian people through speakers. If the visitor spoke English, then an orange cushioned chair was indicated. If French was required, the green cushion, etc. Some six different stories by 35 different narrators,

covering horse racing to minerals, were available from each chair, and it was amusing to watch a listener stand for six seconds after a story whilst the mechanism re-adjusted for the next narrator whilst others moved from chair to chair. Sir Robert Menzies on the future of minerals stated that these would become what wool and wheat have meant to Australia in the past. Other typical narrators included Harry Hopman (tennis), Alan Marshall (novelist), an engineer from the Snowy Mountains Scheme, a personality from the outback country and a description of the C.S.I.R.O. telescope at Parkes, New South Wales.

People sat and watched surfing at Bondi, tiny children playing in the sand, and the Melbourne Cricket Ground with its pile of empty cans after a football match. In the science section, a model of Canberra and how it was planned as a "model city" was

self-explanatory. An engineer described how they "turned the river back" to use the Snowy River waters to irrigate the inland areas.

After some 2½ most informative hours we waved good-bye to the Kangaroos and the gum trees (these were both on display and the Kangaroos were a very popular item).

Moving on to Europe, we were amazed at the parking of motor cars, as permitted by the authorities in Rome. Many small Italian Fiats would be left on the footpaths, across footways, on corners, or with only the bonnet stuck into a space. This can only be described as chaotic parking conditions.

From a fashion point of view, the world is fashion conscious now more than ever before and all peoples are dressing similarly, with matching accessories in softened, brighter colours.
