






The Editor's Notebook



Commencing with this (October, 1967) issue, we have now entered the 21st year of publication of A.C.T.A. "Shooting News".

No publication will be made for the month of January, 1968, as the printing trade is on vacation over the greater part of that month. Those submitting copy and advertising matter concerning January and early February are reminded that all this must appear in the DECEMBER, 1967, publication, for which the deadline is November 1. The deadline for February, 1968 "News" is December 12 ACTUAL.

The Spokane Gun Club Inc. of Washington, U.S.A., held a no-host banquet on June 10, 1967, in honour of their retiring Secretary-Treasurer, Mr. Rex Miles. An Honorary Vice-Presidency was bestowed on our great friend Mr. Rex Miles at the 13th Annual General Meeting of the A.C.T.A. at Scott's Hotel, Collins St., Melbourne, Australia, on November 2, 1949, for his valuable contributions and assistance. The Association wishes him complete happiness in his retirement.

Many shooters and some recent candidates for Referee examinations have not read or absorbed Rule 101, which is quite clearly worded.

The attention of all shooters and club secretaries alike is drawn to Rule 103, which states High Gun for a shoot shall be advertised. The interpretation of Rule 103 is that "it shall be shot off double barrel, irrespective of the type of championship and/or handicap events within the programme and shall be shot off squad system, first miss-out from handicap marks — International Teams' and State Teams' High Gun excepted." Thus, even a novice has a chance of winning a high-gun trophy.

It is repeated (with pride) from our September, 1967, publication that Australia won the 1967 International Teams' Match, results of which were:

and that the similar winning score of 7355/7500 by the Australian team in 1966 was probably an all-time record of "kills". All Australian diplomatic representatives abroad have been advised accordingly by the Commonwealth authorities.

From observations it could now well be that Australia is in the running to continue to be in the forefront of this top-ranking International event for several years to come, as seen by the respective scores of a number of well-known trapshooters, plus those of the new-comers to these recent teams. The final series of the 1968 International Teams' Match will be conducted on Friday, July 5, near Cardiff, Wales, and a cordial invitation has been extended by the Clay Pigeon Shooting Association to any Australian shooters wishing to attend. Any such shooters are asked to advise the Secretary, A.C.T.A., Melbourne, of their intentions as soon as possible.

A few more clubs are adding a skeet lay-out to their grounds (Note: lay-out plans are available, at nominal rates, on application by clubs). Soon we shall have interesting champions when the skilled of both downthe-line trap and skeet events contest a programme.

The attention of club secretaries and shooters concerned is drawn to the brief publication in this issue of the differences between incorporated and unincorporated clubs.

The ANSWER, as received from our solicitors, is presented for the benefit of all concerned.

It will be seen that if a shooter wishes to preserve his liability, then the consideration of a club becoming incorporated would be desirable, and in this case the club must have its own Articles of Association prepared and submitted for the consent of the Attorney General.

For example, a club of, say, 50 members, then each such club member may need to contribute some \$5 to \$10 to cover these costs.



Dear Sir.

During the course of my duties as an Official Referee at an open shoot very recently I noticed a shooter using an automatic gun proceed to place a cartridge in the open chamber whilst awaiting his turn to shoot.

I requested the shooter to unload his gun until it was his turn to shoot, only to be told by the shooter that some referees permitted it.

After the squad was completed, discussion took place amongst shoot-ers and Official Referees present as to whether my ruling was correct or not. Most agreed, but surprisingly two referees quoted Rule 10, which in part reads: "The cartridge or cartridges must be removed from any magazine gun between each track," and so' in their opinion the shooter was permitted to place a cartridge in the open chamber whilst awaiting his turn to shoot, since the rule as quoted did not say he should not.

Some time ago I witnessed an incident where an experienced shooter using an automatic gun (and whose turn it was to shoot) placed a cartridge in the chamber and allowed the breech block to slam closed. The cartridge discharged and luckily blew up the dirt only a few feet in front of him.

It would surprise the number of shooters who have had a similar experience.

An example of the danger involved (if placing a cartridge in the open chamber of an automatic is per-missible) would be when a backmarker using an automatic would only have to accidentally touch the button which operates the breech block, and the life of any one of five shooters on front marks would be in danger.

As I see it, the Rule governing automatic (or magazine guns) should

19th August, 1967. include the following: That no cartridge be placed in a magazine gun whatsoever until it is that shooter's turn to shoot.

> Due to the uncertain and varying interpretations of the present rule by shooters and referees, I would request that my letter and your reply be published in the "News" for the benefit of all concerned.

DECISION — Referee was correct in that:---

(1) Under Rule 14-The Referee's decision is final.

(2) Under Rule 5 - A competitor shall hold his gun in a position of safety with breech open at all times.

(3) Under Rule 10 - When it is his turn to shoot, a competitor shall close his gun. . . .

Dear Sir.

Please find enclosed handicap card, 1 yard increase on handicap for \$14 received at Coff's Harbour 12/8/67.

It is now just five months since losing my right (shooting) eye and allowed 4-vard reduction, for which I am grateful. There were three alternatives: change to left hand, use an outrigger, or give shooting away.

First I tried left hand; the first two shoots went quite fair, only gun kick, and kick it did, but then the rot set in. The next couple of shoots set me back until I felt like crawling up the wall. Thought of outriggers, cross-over stocks, and worked on different ideas after trying an outrigger. The debate started, so wrote the pros and cons of both sides; when it worked out even all round, I felt in a bigger mess than ever. After a discussion with a friend it was decided to stay with left hand, as once the novelty of friends who knew watching "to see how you go" wears off, I wouldn't attract as much attention as with an outrigger.

The next thing was practice. I have a sports store, so with a variety of guns, rifles and air rifles and my of guns, rifles and air rifles and my own trap for clays, I started firing as many shots as time permitted, using a Savage "Four-tenner" insert for the 12 g. and 3" 410 cartridges on the clays from about 12 yds. with a couple of 12 g. to get the shoulder used to the kick.

In four weeks I have fired about 1,000 slugs, 250 12 g. and 410's, 50 odd .22, beside using snap caps with the shotgun for any practice. I have a new starting pistol with two hammers and one trigger, which gives the same effect as double-barrel shooting. All have helped consider-ably and to win enough to get 1 yard has helped the morale as well, and will continue the practice whenever time permits, and hope it won't be long before I'm on 20 yds. again.


Thanks for your kind letter. It was indeed a pleasure to hear from you.



ANSWER: THE AUSTRALIAN CLAY TARGET ASSOCIATION is an Association whose members are incorporated clubs and individual delegates of unincorporated clubs. The only clubs which are members as such are incorporated clubs.

Broadly speaking, the difference between incorporated clubs and unincorporated clubs is that firstly the incorporated body is a separate entity quite independent of the individual entities of the persons who constitute it. This entity is not affected by changes in personnel. The incorporated club may hold property in its own name and deal with the same under its common seal.

An unincorporated club has no separate entity and cannot hold land or property except in the name of all the members for the time being. In certain cases the liability of its members extends to payment for goods or services supplied to the club, whereas the liability of the member of an incorporated club is limited to the amount of his guarantee and then only on a dissolution.

We set out in particular the peculiarities of an unincorporated club which are as follows: An unincorporated club is a society of persons each of whom contributes to the funds out of which the expenses of conducting the Society are paid. These contributions are usually made by entrance fee or subscription, or both. It is not a partnership; it is not recognised as having any legal existence apart from the members of which it is composed. The members for the time being are jointly entitled to all the property and funds of the club, the property being usually vested in Trustees. It is only upon the dissolution, however, that the individual interest of the members in the property become capable of realisation. Until then their only rights are merely to enjoy the use of the club premises (if any) and other privileges of the society in accordance with the rules so long as they pay their subscriptions and con-

tinue to be members. The property and funds of the club belong to the members for the time being jointly in equal shares, but the interest of a member in the property of the club is not transferrable or transmissable and continues only during membership.

No portion of the property may, however, be alienated by the Club except in the ordinary course of the administration of its affairs and for purposes incidental to its objects without the consent of every member.

The entire management of the club and its property is in the hands of the members. The business of the club is either conducted by them in general meeting or, as is usually the case, delegated by them to a Committee in accordance with the Rules.

The Rules of the club form part of the Contract between the members and can be added to or altered only in accordance with the express provision of the Rules themselves except where the addition or alteration is made with the consent of every member.

For instance, where the Rules of a club contain no express provision for their amendment or alteration, but have been altered from time to time in General Meeting and the members have acquiesced in the alteration a member who declines to pay an increased subscription which has been resolved upon in General Meeting is entitled to an injunction restraining the Committee from excluding him from the privileges of the club, even though he himself has acquiesced in some of the previous alterations and the reasonableness or otherwise of the alteration objected to is immaterial.


As an unincorporated club is not a partnership nor an Association which as an Association is legally recognised (e.g. an incorporated club) questions frequently arise as to who are the persons liable for goods supplied to the club or on Contracts professedly made on its behalf. These questions depend on the ordinary principals of agency. The person supplying goods must proceed against the members who gave or authorised the giving of the order.

The Trustees and Committee of the club have only such authority to contract on behalf of the members generally as may be given to them expressly or by necessary implication_ by the Rules. Neither the Trustees nor the members of the Committee, the Secretary or other officials of the club have any authority merely by reason of acting in that capacity to pledge the credit of the members by contracting on their behalf. They have only such authority as may be given expressly or by implication by the rules and the rules will not be construed as giving authority to pledge the credit of the members in the absence of a plain indication of an intention to that effect.

or other agents either because the Contracts are within the scope of the authority given by the rules or because though they are beyond the scope of such authority the members sought to be made liable can be shown to have sanctioned or subsequently ratified the particular transaction. The rights and liabilities of members of a club on contracts made on their behalf are prima facie joint only and all the members should be joined as Plaintiffs or Defendants as the case may be in any action of such a contract. If an action is brought against some only of the members jointly liable and judgment is recovered against them the judgment, although unsatisfied, is a bar to any proceedings against the others on the contract, but any member who discharges more than his own proper share of the liability is entitled to claim contribution from the other members whether they were parties

The members of a club may be liable on contracts entered into by




to the proceedings on the contract or not.


The resignation of a member does not affect his liability in respect of any contracts entered into prior to the resignation, but it protects him against liability in regard to subsequent transactions unless he has continued to hold himself out as a member. Trustees, members of the Committee or their agents contracting or purporting to contract on behalf of a Club may incur a personal liability either by reason of the form or terms of the contract or because in making the contract they are acting in excess of their authority.

The unincorporated club not being a partnership or legal entity cannot sue or be sued in the club name. On

the dissolution of an unincorporated club the property and assets are sold and realised and after the discharge of the debts and liabilities of the club the surplus is divisible equally amongst the members for the time being other than the honorary members subject to any provisions in the Rules of the club to the contrary. We repeat, therefore, that there are circumstances in which members of unincorporated clubs may become personally liable, but that this liability cannot apply to a member of an incorporated club limited as most are by guarantee until the winding up of the incorporated club and then only to the extent of his stated guarantee. This guarantee will not be called upon unless there is deficiency of assets.





President Dick Burton, assisted by Mrs. Costantino, presented the trophies and sweepstakes and thanked members, ladies and visitors for their attendance.




