No publication will be made for the month of January, 1968, as the printing trade is on vacation over the greater part of that month. Those submitting copy and advertising matter concerning January and early

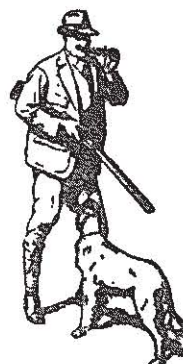

RANDOM SHOTS OF A ROVING SHOOTER



(These comments and observations do not necessarily reflect the opinions of the Executive Committee of the A.C.T.A.).

Reviews of great contests are often introduced with the phrase, "The dust of battle having now subsided..." But this preamble could not, with strict truth, be used in respect of the latest International held at the Gold Coast Gun Club, Queensland. One would have to lean heavily on poetic licence to use the word "dust". We could look anyone straight in the eye and say that there was cloud, and mist, and fairly sloshy mud. But some seventeen inches of rain ensured that there was not a speck of dust other than the imported variety nestling in car boot and gun case. Despite the wretched weather conditions, which were rendered more poignant by the knowledge that June is normally a dry month on the sunny Gold Coast, remarkably good scores were turned in and record entries were received in all events. This indicates the increasing popularity of shotgunning in Australia.

Many people who, in happier circumstances, would have attended were restrained either by the reality of the floodings or the forebodings of the skies, and it must have caused a slight shiver of regretful relief (if such a combination be possible) to the committee and staff to contemplate the additional numbers which sunny conditions would have entailed.

The feat performed by the redoubtable Doug. Smith of Queensland, in winning both the National double-barrel and single-barrel titles assures his position in the very forefront of Australia's 16-yard shooters. The double-barrel was not lightly won, requiring 278 straight to clinch it, and here all praise must go to the unassuming Victorian, Noel Davis of Terang, who piled up a polished 277 in pursuit before dropping one. Doug. gained the dual titles when his 50 straight in the single-barrel championship found no equal.

Malcolm "Pooge" Burgess of Cobarr, N.S.W., turned in an enviable score, commencing with 72/73 single-barrels for second place in the National S.B. Championship, then capturing the programme High-gun with 392/400 (most of the points lost were second-barrels in the point-score event) and finally contributing 100 first-barrels as his share of the Australian team's score.

It was good to see the maestro, J. Newton Thomas, sufficiently recovered from indifferent health to take the National Double-ribe Championship, and then tie with Burgess for High-gun of the International team with 100 first-barrels.

A popular winner in the Champion of Champions event was the staccato-

talking, staccato-shooting Bill Stevens. Bill is one of the stalwarts responsible for the expansion of the Ipswich (Qld.) Club.

The winners of the other two major events demonstrated that weather conditions should not affect shooting form: Kevin Heywood (Dubbo, N.S.W.), scoring 156/156 to take the Australia-New Zealand trophy, and A. Marstella (Gold Coast, Qld.) 63/63 to clinch the lucrative Grand Australian Handicap.

The New Zealanders invaded in the greatest numbers ever, sixty-six shooters and twenty-seven non-combatant ladies making the tour. Although Kiwi names cropped up frequently on the score-board, one felt additionally regretful on their behalf for the uncomfortable conditions, bearing in mind their long

and expensive journey to participate. Other overseas visitors included Vic. Sandr, of New Guinea, and two Americans who happened to be here and who dived in with delight and success. While commiserating regarding the weather, great sympathy is due to the committee of the Gold Coast Gun Club, who watched boot and car churn back to its beginnings much of the advancement gained by their personal efforts.

The organising executive committee and their helpers, the bedraggled referees, scorers, trappers, and car-pushing car-parkers carried on without bravado or irritation. All praise to them. The Association's own flag was at the masthead for the first time, fluttering jauntily in the rain—surely symbolic of the spirit of shotgunning.
