



The Editor's Notebook



REGISTERED SHOOTERS

Article 49 of the Articles of Association of the Australian Clay Target Association states: (a) The Association shall keep a register of shooters and no person may enter or compete at any Association competition or event conducted by a member Club of which a Delegate is a member of the Association unless such person is registered with the Association and is not in arrears with his subscription.

(b) Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall BEFORE THE THIRTY-FIRST DAY OF JAN-UARY IN EACH YEAR supply the Secretary with a full and accurate list of all members and shooters registered with such club for the year commencing on the first day of January of such year and shall at the same time remit to the Secretary the subscriptions of such Club members and shooters. Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall also promptly forward to the Secretary of the Association the names and subscriptions of any persons joining such club or registering as shooters after the thirty-first day of January in any year.

The above information is given for the benefit of secretaries and shooters alike. In the past, the cost to the Association of the preparation and mailing A.C.T.A. shooting "News" to unfinancial shooters has been far too heavy. MARCH 1968 "NEWS" WILL BE MAILED ONLY TO SHOOTERS FINANCIAL (ACTUALLY RECEIVED BY THE A.C.T.A.) AS OF FEBRUARY 16, 1968.

NOMINATIONS FOR 1968 OFFICES IN A.C.T.A.

All interested shooters are hereby notified that nominations for all offices in the Association close at 5 p.m. on Friday, December 29, 1967. Nominations must be lodged with the Secretary, A.C.T.A., G.P.O. Box 2038 S, Melbourne, Vic. 3001. Any nominations received after this hour or date will not be accepted. Nomination forms are available from the Secretary, A.C.T.A.

Those lodging nominations are reminded that such nominations must be lodged in accordance with Article 27 of the Association Constitution, which reads: "Nominations for all offices in the Association and membership of the Executive Committee must be in writing, signed by the Secretary of the member Club or by the Delegate member of an unincorporated club making the nomination, and must reach the Secretary of the Association on or before the 31st December in each year prior to the Annual General Meeting."

It is advised that private nominations will be rejected. Nominations received must have the official backing of the club and be approved by the committee of the member club concerned.

The Association having received legal advice that the election for an Executive Committee member to represent the State of Queensland held on June 13 1967 was invalid and as a consequence there was a vacancy in the membership of the Executive Committee it became necessary for the Executive Committee, in exercise

of the powers in that behalf conferred by Article 30 of the Association's Articles to fill such a vacancy and accordingly Mr. W. A. Edwards was appointed to fill that vacancy until the next Annual General Meeting (vide Article 31).

PUBLICATION A.C.T.A. "NEWS"

NO PUBLICATION will be made for the month of January, 1968, as the printing trade is on vacation over the greater part of that month. Those submitting copy and advertising matter concerning February are reminded that the deadline for February, 1968, "News" is December 12 ACTUAL.

THE 1968 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING will be held on Sunday, March 10, at the Blair Hotel (half-way between Adelaide and the Gun Club on the Prospect Road). Delegates to assemble at 7.30 p.m. and the meeting to begin at 8.00 p.m.

Each financial affiliated member club is being mailed a Delegate Card (for unincorporated clubs) or a Representative Card (for incorporated clubs). These cards must be presented by the respective financial shooters concerned to obtain permission to attend and be eligible to vote at future annual general meetings.

A.C.T.A. 1968 NATIONAL CHAM-PIONSHIPS and INTERNATIONAL MATCH will be conducted over five traps at the grounds of the South Australian Gun Club (S. Aust.) at the thirteen-mile post out of Adelaide on the Port Wakefield Road, commencing at 8.00 a.m. daily over the five days, Saturday, March 9, until p.m. Wednesday, March 13, inclusive. The programme has been amended to avoid a carry-over of events and will progress as follows, with the provision that, subject to time permitting each day, a \$300 Cash Handicap event will be added. The first day, Saturday, will see the winner of the coveted Champion of Champions Cup (1967 winner was W. Stevens, Ipswich, Q.). On the second day, Sunday, the National Intermediate Championship (1967 winner, P. A. Veale, N.Z.) will be shot in conjunction with the National Double-

barrel Championship (1967 winner, D. Smith, Qld.). The third day, Monday, will commence with the National day, will commence with the National Single - barrel Championship (1967 winner, D. Smith, Qld.), followed by the National Double Rise Championship (1967 winner, J. N. Thomas, V.). On the fourth day, Tuesday, the 1968 Australia - New Zealand Championship (1967 winner was K. Heywood, M.S. W.), shell be contested to the property of the contested of the property of the prope N.S.W.) shall be contested; thence the Australia - New Zealand Teams' Match. A \$300 Handicap event is then scheduled to take place. For the fifth and final day, the Twenty-second International Teams' Match will be conducted (Australian Team to be the 30 highest aggregate scorers in the Aust. - N.Z. Championship and the Aust. Nat. S.B. and D.B. Championships - of which only the best 25 scores are to count. Final scores are to be withheld pending complete results from overseas). The last scheduled event is to be the Nineteenth Grand Australian \$550 Handicap. The High Gun Trophy will be donated again by Fabrique Na-tionale of Belgium and Gollin & Co. of Sydney (as agents for N.S.W., Q'land and S. Aust.), with the provision that it may be won only once by any shooter. This will be competed for over the programmed events numbered 1 to 7 inclusive. (1966 High Gun, C. Hartley, N.Z.; 1967 High Gun, M. Burgess, Cobar.)

If a shoot-off is necessary to determine the High Gun winner, then the shoot-off shall be shot under handicap conditions.

During the programme all New Zealand shooters will shoot two yards back from their New Zealand handicaps and ALL SHOOTERS MUST SHOW CURRENT HANDICAP CARDS WHEN NOMINATING FOR EACH EVENT.

The official photographer at the A.C.T.A. National shoots will be F. LANG of P.O. Box 40, TWEED HEADS, N.S.W.

Trophies will be presented daily from a dais after each event.

Ten Referees are required for the 1968 National Championships—applications to be forwarded to A.C.T.A. for submission and consideration.

Cartridges to be used in the 1968 National and International Championships shall be of the same load as in the 1966 series, but contained in a plastic shell with appropriate markings.

Official Travel Agent for the series will be TRANS AUSTRALIA AIR-LINES of 50 Franklin St., Melbourne, Vic.

Official Accommodation Agent is Mrs. Dorothy Dowling Agency of 74 Melbourne Street, North Adelaide, South Aust.

Visiting New Zealand shooters and their wives are invited to a buffet luncheon on the Saturday—admission by ticket from A.C.T.A. Secretary.

New Zealand shooters are reminded that Mr. Malcolm Fuller of Fuller Firearms, Sydney, will donate a high-grade Stirling shotgun to the first New Zealander to win the Australian Double-barrel Championship or the Australia-New Zealand Championship. (With acknowledgments to N.Z.G.C.A. "Gunshot" publication—Sept., 1967.)

The final series of the 1968 International Teams' Match will be conducted on Friday, July 5, near Cardiff, Wales, and a cordial invitation has been extended by the Clay Pigeon Shooting Association to any Australian shooters wishing to attend.

The 1969 Australian National Clay Target Trapshooting Championships will be conducted in the State of Victoria at a place and date yet to be decided.

The 1970 Australian National Championships. The Executive Committee has recommended for the consideration of the 1969 Committee that, subject to bitumen road and rail facilities being A1, the 1970 National Championships be held in Perth (W. Aust.).

The 1967 Interstate Teams' Match was won by Victoria with a combined score of 495/300 (shot at Geelong G.C. 13-5-67). Details Nov. '67 News.

The 1967 Interstate Skeet Teams' Match was won by Victoria with a combined score of 120/125 (shot at Australian G.C. 2-9-67). Details this publication.

I.C.I. Interstate Skeet Teams' Trophy—The Executive Committee have passed their appreciation to Messrs. I.C.I.A.N.Z. Ltd. for their interest and generosity in providing annually, commencing 1968, five (5) individual trophies for the winning team in the Interstate Skeet Teams' Matches.

The 1968 New Zealand Championship series will be conducted by the New Zealand Gun Club's Association at the Timaru Gun Club from Saturday, April 30, through to Saturday, April 6, inclusive.

Club Secretaries are advised:-

- 1. And all shooters are reminded that CURRENT HANDICAP CARDS MUST BE PRESENTED AT ALL SHOOTS.
- 2. Due to the high costs involved, club secretaries will no longer receive a gratis copy of A.C.T.A. Clay Target Shooting News. The Executive Committee is aware of the present-day increases of all attendant costs and wishes to remind clubs and shooters alike of their attention to this matter.
- 3. ANNUAL SHOOTER REGISTRATION FEE of \$3.00 is payable via club secretaries.
- 4. To non-shooter subscribers A.C.T.A. Shooting "News" is \$5.00 per annum. No pro-rata rates are considered.
- 5. The Handicapping Formula is calculated on the retail value of trophies.

6. Handicapping --

(a) The Formula commences "Cash or Trophy value wins and divisions obtained in one day"—this includes yardage prizes. Thus, a shooter may be handicapped after his results in, say, the first event, but, unless that plus his results in the following events do not total in excess of \$101, then only one yard per day can be applied to the shooter.

(b) Championships -

- (i) A shooter winning a championship which is shot from in front of his current A.C.T.A. handicap receives no alteration to his recorded handicap.
- (ii) A shooter winning a championship which is shot from behind his current A.C.T.A. handicap receives

an immediate handicap alteration to that of the championship.

- (iii) A shooter winning a championship which is shot from his own current A.C.T.A. handicap receives an immediate adjustment according to the Handicapping Formula and the prescribed Championship Trophies.
- 7. Referees are reminded to watch all shooters and to observe the types of ammunition being used, as, under the varying conditions of light, the plastic wads as inserted by some manufacturers may be mistaken for a chip of the clay target.

All are reminded that when a target is broken, then the target usually deflects slightly one way or the other—either up or down, left or right.

8. DUTIES OF A REFEREE

- (1) A Referee should wear his badge at all times.
- (2) when wearing such badge a Referee may be requested, by the club concerned, to referee the shoot and is obliged to assist accordingly.
- (3) He should check all traps for correct heights and angles.
- (4) He must only referee the event, but may release the targets where electric release is provided.
- (5) He should never score, as this districts his attention.
- 9. The method of allocating trophies and prizes is:
- (a) First, second and third trophy winners cannot take part in yardage prizes.
- (b) Yardage prizes are a separate entity and are virtually a bonus for the respective best scorers within the groups concerned.
- 10. Enamelled metal badges are only struck by the makers against firm orders by this, your Association office. Club secretaries only may request these badges ON THE PRESCRIBED FORM, which will be of the standard A.C.T.A. insignia with the surround, containing the year, the championship title, the winner's initials and name. Such lettering on the surround will be in the following colours:—

Commonwealth Championships

State — Blue — Red

District " — White Club " — Green

Clubs are charged \$2.50 for each badge ordered.

11. Championship Sashes only may be ordered direct from the makers by club secretaries. Recommended and official makers are W. FLATTELY & SON, 11 ORR STREET, CARLTON, 3053, VICTORIA. Colours for the respective gradings of championships are as for BADGES as shown above.

Messrs. W. Flattely & Son advise that their factory will be closed from p.m. December 21, 1967, through to a.m. January 17, 1968.

- 12. Break badges in cloth form are available free to shooters, but ONLY where the SCORE SHEETS as submitted by the Club Secretary ON THE PRESCRIBED FORM to A.C.T.A. Secretary, clearly show the shooter has earned this right. Break badges are for 50, 75, 100, 150, 200, 250 and 300 breaks (see Rule No. 91). Such a badge is also available free, on application by club Secretaries, for shooters who have attained the handicap of 27 yards.
- 13. Enamelled car badges are available at \$2.50.
- 14. Available to clubs on request at nominal prices are
 - (a) shoot record books
 - (b) shoot report forms (padded) for "News"
 - (c) D.T.L. score sheets (padded)
 - (d) Skeet score sheets (padded)
 - (e) A.C.T.A. Shooting Rules D.T.L.
 - (f) A.C.T.A. Shooting Rules Skeet

15. Rules Interpretations —

- (1) Rule 43 permits two malfunctions of a gun referee will then declare "LOST TARGET". All malfunctions or misfires must be noted on score sheets, then on shoot records.
- (2) All Ties shoot-offs (except Deauville Doubles, which are shot off in squads of two shooters) are shot squad system, in the same manner as the event was shot. All shooters commence on the same trap (except in the case of a major breakdown of the said trap).

Shooters shall be squadded in the same order in which they qualified. Shooters shall close up after each five targets per shooter and shall be re-squadded at the commencement of each run over the trap or traps.

- (a) Single Barrel and Double -Barrel down-the-line (5 tracks) are shot off the same vardage as the elimination event was shot, in squads of 5 or 6, unless insufficient shooters exist for the last squad. First miss-
- (b) Mixed Birds squads of 5 or 6 (as for S.B. or D.B.): (i) two targets Double Barrel; (ii) two targets Single Barrel; 5 tracks (first shooter commences on Number One track); (iii) two targets Walk-up (squads of 5 or 6) from the centre track. Number one shooter shoots at one target, he then returns to the rear of the squad, each shooter doing the same in turn; (iv) Double Rise - two pairs, each target to count as one point . (Total is 10 Points.)
- (c) Walk-up (squads of 5 or 6 as in (a) above) to be shot in lots of 5 targets until finality. All shooters shoot from the centre track, Number one shooter shoots at one target he then returns to the rear of the squad, each shooter doing the same, in turn, as in Rule No. 96.
- (d) Deauville Doubles (first missout) - shot from tracks 2 and 4, one team of two shooters at a time, as in Rule No. 94.
- AT ALL TIMES, A SQUAD IS A SPECIFIC NUMBER OF SHOOT-ERS. thus:--

squad of 5 = normal down-the-line squad of 6 = normal down-the-line last squad of 2 to 6 = normal down-the-line

Squad may be up to 10 (5 pairs) for Deauville Doubles, excepting the case of a last squad.

(3) SLOW PULL:

Some shooters seem to consider they can decide whether a pull is "fast" or "slow", but this is NOT SO.

The DECISION of the REFEREE in all cases coming under his jurisdiction, as in A.C.T.A. Rules, shall be FINAL (Rule 14).

Also, Rule 31 states clearly —

"NO TARGET" shall be declared when a trap is sprung at a material interval of time before or after the call of "PULL". Thus, no referee would permit a delay (as in letters received) of up to three seconds within the meaning of this rule.

- (4) Double-Rise Call. The Committee has instructed that the call in double-rise shooting must now be 0 1 or 11. In the past it has been found that a varying style of calling has been in vogue, and the Committee is most anxious that uniformity should be attained in this matter.
- (5) "LOST BIRD" correct ruling-Shooter shooting double-barrel event has a misfire with first barrel and then shoots the second barrel and does not break the target. Shooter claimed a "no target". Referee re-fused and decision was "Lost Bird". The referee was quite correct in his decision - the shooter lost all equity in another target when he fired the second barrel. Shooters should remember that when they experience a misfire the shooter concerned should immediately hold up his gun above the shoulder (always pointing towards the trap house) and call for the referee. The referee is then required to test the gun by pulling the trigger, and if the gun fails to fire, he gives his decision.

The 1968 Championship allocation list, as decided upon by the Executive Committee at its recent meeting, is detailed elsewhere in this publication.

All State Championships and Interstate Teams' Matches must be advertised in the A.C.T.A. Shooting News.

A.C.T.A. Rules require that all Commonwealth, State and District Titles, plus any event over \$100 value, must be applied for on the prescribed form. The lodging of an advertisement only, without any application, merely holds up the procedure involving return mails.

Due to the volume of work handled by the Secretary, it has been decided that Executive Committee members will adjudicate on shoot queries and procedure.

Would all member clubs and registered shooters please note this and contact their nearest Executive Com-

mittee member accordingly, when so required.

A sub-committee of the A.C.T.A. Executive is currently re-grouping and modernising the rules.

A.C.T.A. Rules are as published 1-1-67, and the decision that these remain unaltered for two years is now rescinded. Home - loaded cartridges may now be used in all events except the National Championships, International Teams' Matches, Interstate Teams' and Skeet Teams' Matches and Australia - New Zealand Championships.

Skeet Handicapping Formula (see pages 7 and 8 of Aug. 1967 "News"). Additions —

- 1. The maximum Skeet Handicap is to be 10.
- 2. Once a shooter attains a skeet handicap of 3 or less, he cannot be handicapped forward of 3 unless there are unusual reasons.

A new type handicap card will be issued in January, 1968 (see description published as received in this issue). Consequent upon the late arrival of this description, December 1967 News may be a little late in production.

Additional appointments to the Referee Examiner list are A. S. L. Stewart (Toowoomba G.C., Qld.), K. Oldfield (Cootamundra G.C., N.S.W.), J. Raleigh (Brisbane, Qld.). See complete list elsewhere this publication.

A.C.T.A. Executive Committee unanimously agreed to a suggestion that W. McCULLOUGH, Secretary A.C.T.A. since its inception until his retirement in 1965, be recommended at the 1968 Annual General Meeting as an Honorary Vice-President under Article 36.

All this travel and convenience will cost about \$75 return — based on 25 shooters and the bus costing 40c per mile, plus living expenses for two drivers. In the event of surplus, there will be a refund.

DANDENONG G.C. (Vic.) grounds are only 12 miles from their fairly densely populated town and, to obviate any possible vandalism, decided on a portable trap set-up.

Other advantages are that the trap can be maintained during the week at the home of the committee man in charge and that if a move has to be made from the present ground, the trap house and trap installation is already fully mobile. (See below)

For shooting, the trailer is parked in a hollow especially designed to accept it, and from the shooting lanes looks no different to any other traphouse. The generator is placed away from the trap out of hearing, is well muffled and, during transport, is housed in the trailer.

This information may be of interest to other country clubs who may have similar problems.


VALE

CLAY TARGET PERSONALITY BOWS OUT

For the past ten years the sign on Don Scowcroft's door read, "Gone Shooting" — in future it will read, "Gone Fishing".

Since 1957, Don, who has become one of the best known sporting personalities in clay target shooting, has held down one of the most unusual jobs in Australia, that of Ammunition demonstrator with I.C.I.A.N.Z., a leading Australian chemical company.

He now proposes to "holster" his guns and become owner/skipper of the trawler "Ivy Lee", operating out of Coff's Harbour, where he and his pretty wife Barbara have purchased six acres overlooking the "Banana Bowl" and are shortly to build the "Scowcroft Hacienda".

During the last ten years Don has travelled 670,000 miles by car and 30,000 miles by plane and covered territory in N.S.W., Queensland, New Zealand, and New Guinea to compete in innumerable clay target shooting competitions. Within this period he has managed to win 133 championships, bringing his total championship winnings to 158. He has been a member of the N.S.W. team eleven times, and ten times a member of the International team.

In addition Don has found time to conduct 174 clay target "Shooters'

One of Don's more interesting duties was to test ammunition and to report to the factory on its performance, both in the field, on the range, and at consumer level. He calculates that during the last ten years he has fired more than 170,000 rounds of ammunition (that's more than half a ton of lead) from an extensive variety of shotguns, rifles and pistols. He explains that Australian - made ammunition has to function under all sorts of conditions in a large number of firearms designed and made by arms manufacturers from all parts of the world.

Commenting upon his retirement from "full-time" shooting (he still intends to keep his hand in at the Coff's Harbour Gun Club), a close friend said: "Don's working career reminds me of a remark made by a nine-year-old boy who said: "I must be the luckiest boy in the world — when I was a little fellow my Dad owned a toy shop and I had all the toys I wanted, and now that I'm a big boy and have acquired a taste for lollies, he has just bought a milk bar"; and Don's two favourite sporting pursuits are fishing and shooting."





Traps Along Bank


Traps are set along the river bank, giving shooters a variance of targets from all directions over the water as well as similated "quail and rabbit" shooting.

President, Mr. V. Eather, and the club Secretary, Mr. Bruce Gittoes, and other members provided visitors with a first-class venue and meeting after much preparation.


Many shooters said it had been the best shoot they had attended and they looked forward to another being staged.

T. HOURITZ, shooter No. 5 Station. C. HERBERT, Referee.




SHOTGUN GREETING

The "HANDICAP FORMULA" as such is not altered at this time, the decision being to give the new system its initial introduction on the Formula as it is.

The card to be issued is not small like the old one, but will be about the size of a sheet of foolscap-folded once, and contained in a plastic envelope for protection whilst carried in the gun case.

The new card will show the shooter's name and address, the club with whom he is registered, and his han-dicap. The card MUST be handed to the Secretary on nominating at any club or open shoot, and upon settlement of the account. On completion of shooting, the Club Secretary will place the club's RUBBER NAME STAMP on the card, plus the date of the shoot and record any winnings OR NOT thereon - sign it and give it back to the shooter.

Club secretaries (or in his absence the President) are the only people authorised to alter a handicap as from the issue of the new card. Handicapping must be carried out strictly in accordance with the Handicap Formula - for either forward or backward movement, and any such alteration must be advised to Melbourne promptly by the Club Secretary.

Melbourne office will record advice of handicap alterations in the register, and will communicate with those concerned, if something irregular seems obvious. Handicap amendments will be published in the "NEWS" as usual.

The sincere co-operation of Club Secretaries and shooters is earnestly sought in this new handicap control scheme, the objects and advantages being:-

(1) A shooter is always in possession of his Handicap Card (except

- when a Club Secretary has it during a shoot). This affords him an interesting record of his shooting — over years if he cares to file his old cards.
- (2) Inwards handicapping will be effective immediately such shows on his handicap card (according to the Handicapping Formula).
- (3) Backwards movement is effective immediately (according to the Handicap Formula); however, a shooter has the advantage of explanation if necessary.
- (4) A saving in some administration costs is expected by the introduction of the scheme.
- A few things should be clarified in connection with the new Handican Control Card.
- (1) In order to avert some unscrupulous person fraudulently writing some imaginary shoots he has attended on the card, clubs MUST use their RUBBER NAME STAMP on the appropriate line provided. The club stamp as used on cheques is acceptable; however, if a club does not possess such a stamp — or they do not wish to use this — or its size is wrong for the space provided then an appropriate stamp for the Handicap Control Card MUST be procured—and USED at every shoot. The importance of the club stamp to be at every shoot cannot be overemphasised.
- (2) Shooters MUST produce their cards to the Secretary on nominating at any shoot. Remember the Secretary cannot record your handicap details without this. The card is designed to go in your gun case — make a habit of putting it there.
- (3) If a shooter arrives at a shoot without his handicap card:-
- (A) The club may allow him to shoot, if reasonably sure of his handicap position; however, he cannot collect any pay-outs or trophies until his card is made available to the Club Secretary concerned - for appropriate check and attention. A shooter should not attempt to shoot elsewhere

until the Club Secretary of his previous shoot attendance has stamped and recorded his handicap

- (B) If a shooter is a regular offender of not producing his card on nominating, then Club Secretaries may (in view of the nuisance and humbug he causes) refuse his nomination.
- (C) If a shooter has completely lost his card, then a new card (on payment of \$1 (one dollar) to the Association) will be supplied from Melbourne. The fee and application for such must come from or through the club with whom he is registered.
- (4) All shooters MUST be registered members of some club. who will issue the new card when received from the A.C.T.A.

CLUB SECRETARIES NOTE

In dealing with the handicap card, a shooter will shoot from the handicap as shown at the last place he shot.

When it is observed that the shooter has not won anything (accord-

ing to the Handicap Formula) during the immediate past four consecutive shoots (including the shoot that you are at present marking), the club's rubber name stamp is to be used once more on the next line (also the date again) and the shooter's new handicap (one yard in) placed in the handicap column. The word ADJUST-MENT is to be written on the line in the "WINNINGS" column and the card signed again.

The same procedure of using the club stamp on the next line—signature, etc.—will apply for backwards movement. The amount of winnings showing justification in accordance with the Handicap Formula.

Cards must always be returned to the shooter, and please remember that it is an imperative MUST that you advise Melbourne at once of any handicap movement.

Please advise the A.C.T.A. Secretary as to the number of handicap cards you require by completing and forwarding the registration forms, plus registration fees, in the usual manner — handicap cards will then be returned in bulk to club secretaries for direct issue.

OPEN SEASON FOR ... PROTECTED GAME SHOOTING THROUGHOUT THE COMMONWEALTH DURING 1968

Today, in all civilized countries, the taking of fauna is a controlled privilege, not an inherent right. Native fauna is at all times the property of the Crown and is (a) permanently protected, (b) protected or (c) pest fauna.

The sale of wild game is forbidden in most States and eggs must not be taken for any purpose.

Complete information is available from the various State departments as listed. Licences may be obtained from these addresses or from the various police stations.

Western Australia

Department of Fisheries and Fauna. 108 Adelaide Terrace, Perth.

Sporting shooters do not require licences to take unprotected fauna and fauna unprotected during an open season.

Note: Dates are unconfirmed and will not be set until early 1968.

Wild Ducks -

It is proposed that season should open throughout the South West and Eucla land divisions at 2.00 p.m. on January 20, 1968.

Quail -

There are two open seasons for Stubble Quail, but all other species of quail are protected:

- (a) In all that part of the State lying north of the 30th parallel the season commences each year on December 1 and closes on March 31.
- (b) South of that parallel the season opens on March 1 of each year and closes on June 30.

South Australia

Dept. of Fisheries and Fauna Conservation, Box 901E, G.P.O., Adelaide.

No person shall

- (a) shoot at animals or birds on any Sunday;
- (b) have a gun in his possession on any Sunday for the purpose of shooting at animals or birds on that day.

Gun licences cost \$2 annually to those over 18 years. A firearms licence for persons under 18 years must be obtained from a Police Station. Gun licences do not authorize persons to shoot without the consent of the owner or occupier.

Wild Duck — 4 a.m. Sat., Feb. 17, to 10 p.m. Sat., June 29. Bag limit 12 ducks per day. (Musk Duck, Bluebilled Duck and Freckled Duck must not be taken.)

Stubble Quail - 4 a.m. Sat., Feb. 17, to 10 a.m. Sat., June 29. Bag limit 25 daily.

Austn. (Japanese) Snipe - 6 a.m. Sat., Oct. 5, to 5 p.m. Sat., March 1. 1969.

Northern Territory

Animal Industry Branch, Northern Territory Administration, P.O. Box 291, Alice Springs.

All firearms must be declared at the nearest police station on entry into Northern Territory for licencing and/or registering.

Ducks and Geese (except Magpie Geese, Burdekin Ducks and Pigmy Geese) - open season in all of Northern Territory, north of the 18th parallel of south latitude, from July 1 till October 31 annually.

Magpie Geese are protected in all of Northern Territory north of the 18th parallel of south latitude from January 1 to July 31 each year.

Other partly protected animal species may be taken after procurement of special licences.

Kangaroo and Wallaby (Forester Kangaroo protected) — Jan. 1 to Dec. 31 Licence 50 cents.



Open seasons for Wild Duck and Quail are decided each year for fauna districts 1, 2 and 3. Intending shooters should make enquiries about the middle of the year.
