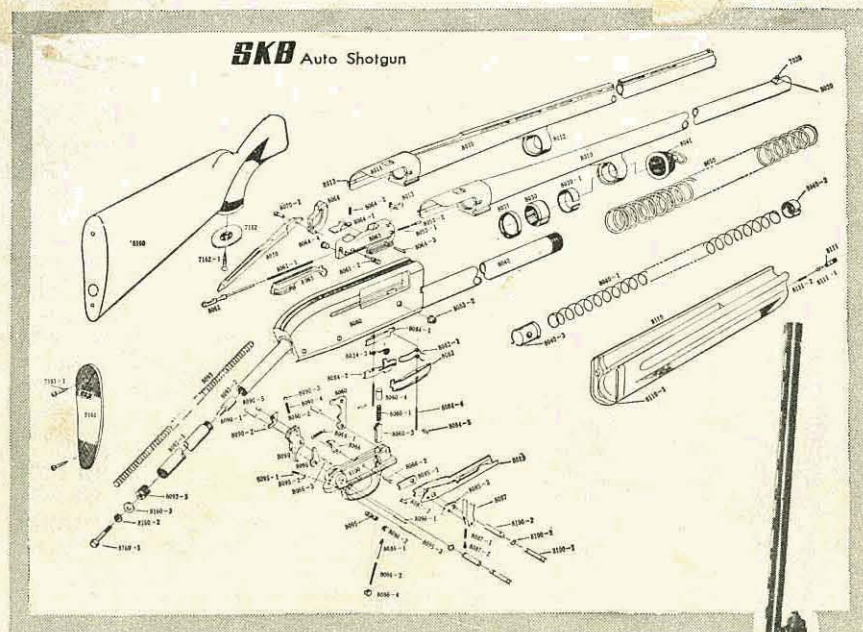

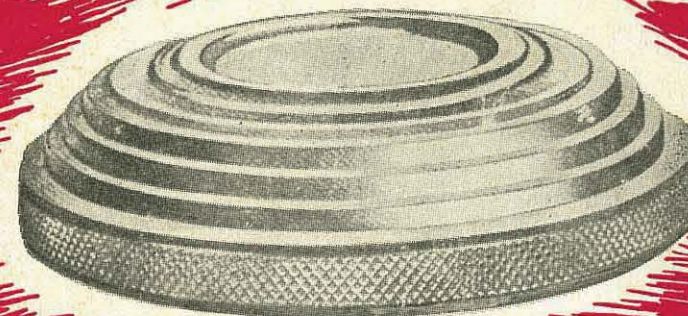

The Editor's Notebook



1968 ANNUAL MEETING

The 1968 annual meeting of affiliated club delegates and representatives of member clubs will be held on Sunday, March 10, at the Blair Athol Hotel (half-way between Adelaide and the Gun Club on the Prospect Road). Delegates and representatives to assemble at 7.30 p.m. and the meeting to begin at 8.00 p.m.

Only such items as submitted within the Association Articles and published on the Agenda shall be discussed.

A.C.T.A. 1968 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS and INTERNATIONAL MATCH will be conducted over five traps at the grounds of the South Australian Gun Club (S. Aust.) at the thirteen-mile post out of Adelaide on the Port Wakefield Road, commencing at 8.00 a.m. daily over the five days, Saturday, March 9, until p.m. Wednesday, March 13, inclusive. The programme has been amended to avoid a carry-over of events and will progress as follows, with the provision that, subject to time permitting each day, a \$300 Cash Handicap event will be added. The first day, Saturday, will see the winner of the coveted Champion of Champions Cup (1967 winner was W. Stevens, Ipswich, Q.). On the second day, Sunday, the National Intermediate Championship (1967 winner, P. A. Veale, N.Z.) will be shot in conjunction with the National Double-barrel Championship (1967 winner, D. Smith, Qld.). The third day, Mon-

day, will commence with the National Single-barrel Championship (1967 winner, also D. Smith, Qld.), followed by the National Double Rise Championship (1967 winner, J. N. Thomas, V.). On the fourth day, Tuesday, the 1968 Australia-New Zealand Championship (1967 winner was K. Heywood, N.S.W.) shall be contested; this will be followed by the Australia-New Zealand Teams' Match for the Tom Glenn Cup.

[NOTE: Results of these Aust./N.Z. contest, to date, were published in February 1968 A.C.T.A. Shooting News.)

A \$300 Handicap event is then scheduled to take place. For the fifth and final day, the Twenty-second International Teams' Match for the Mackintosh Trophy will be conducted (Australian Team to be the 30 highest aggregate scorers in the Aust.-N.Z. Ch'ship and the Aust. Nat. S.B. and D.B. Ch'ships—of which only the best 25 scores are to count. Final scores are to be withheld pending complete results from overseas). The last scheduled event is to be the Nineteenth Grand Australian \$550 Handicap. The High Gun Trophy will be donated again by Fabrique Nationale of Belgium and Gollin & Co. of Sydney (as agents for N.S.W., Q'land and S. Aust.), with the provision that it may be won only once by any shooter. This will be competed for over the programmed events numbered 1 to 7 inclusive. (1966 High Gun, C. Hartley, N.Z.; 1967 High Gun, M. Burgess, Cobarr.)

If a shoot-off is necessary to determine the High Gun winner, then the shoot-off shall be shot under handicap conditions.

During the programme all New Zealand shooters will shoot two yards back from their New Zealand handicaps and **ALL SHOOTERS MUST SHOW CURRENT HANDICAP CARDS WHEN NOMINATING FOR EACH EVENT.**

The official photographer at the A.C.T.A. National shoots will be F. LANG of P.O. Box 40, TWEED HEADS, N.S.W.

Trophies will be presented daily from a dais after each event.

Ten Referees are required for the 1968 National Championships—applications to be forwarded to A.C.T.A. for submission and consideration.

Cartridges to be used in the 1968 National and International Championships shall be of the same load as in the 1966 series, but contained in a plastic shell with appropriate markings.

Official Travel Agent for the series will be TRANS AUSTRALIA AIRLINES of 50 Franklin St., Melbourne, Vic.

Official Accommodation Agent is Mrs. Dorothy Dowling Agency of 74 Melbourne Street, North Adelaide, South Aust.

Visiting New Zealand shooters and their wives are invited to a buffet luncheon on the Saturday—admission by ticket from A.C.T.A. Secretary.

New Zealand shooters are reminded that Mr. Malcolm Fuller of Fuller Firearms, Sydney, will donate a high-grade Stirling shotgun to the first New Zealander to win the Australian Double-barrel Championship or the Australia-New Zealand Championship. (With acknowledgments to N.Z.G.C.A. "Gunshot" publication—Sept., 1967.)

The final series of the 1968 International Teams' Match will be con-

ducted on Friday, July 5, near Cardiff, Wales, and a cordial invitation has been extended by the Clay Pigeon Shooting Association to any Australian shooters wishing to attend.

The 1968 New Zealand Championship series will be conducted by the New Zealand Gun Club's Association at the Timaru Gun Club from Saturday, March 30, through to Saturday, April 6, inclusive.

February 1968 A.C.T.A. News was published on time, but the backlog of second-class bulk mail from the January mail strike received preference for handling within the G.P.O.

CLUB SECRETARIES PLEASE

NOTE:—

In all handicap events a shooter shoots from the handicap last listed on his current handicap card, thence (see December 1967 News, page 6, Item 6 (b) (i)) a shooter winning from in front of his current handicap receives no alteration to his recorded handicap.

However, under the 1968 handicap recording system the total of all wins or divisions for the day should be shown on the shooter's handicap card.

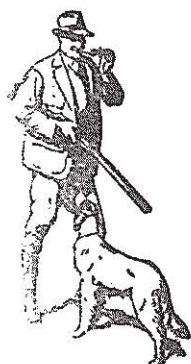
The next step is to apply those wins or divisions, of trophy values and/or compulsory sweepstakes, against the shooter's handicap recorded on his card from his last attended shoot as provided for within the values listed in the handicapping formula.

NOTE: For possible inward movement calculations, the value(s) listed must include any wins or divisions in novelty events.

Thus, please show any such wins/divisions, then enter the correct handicap rating (whether new or amended or unaltered) on the handicap card and return it to the shooter.

Such handicap amendments must be listed on the Handicap Forms (as provided). These forms must reach A.C.T.A. office within seven days of the shoot concerned.

AUSTRALIAN G.C. — 1968 Commonwealth Skeet Sparrows Championship has been allocated to Australian G.C. — date to be considered.

PERTH (W.A.), after the removal of some 2,500 cubic yards of soil, have installed as of 25-1-68 a five-trap layout with three skeet lay-outs (provision for a fourth), plus a tower. Continuous night shooting can be conducted on two D.T.L. and two skeef lay-outs simultaneously (provision exists for a third night lay-out of each). Club shoots every Wednesday and Saturday. Each third Sunday in 1968 shall be a championship event over three lay-outs, with, for practice, one further lay-out available, whilst tower shooting is a progressive happening.

A new self-loading Winchester fully automatic trap has been installed — the first of its kind in Australia.

The winning team of the 1967 Winchester Western International Claybird Tournament (see Sept. 1967 News, page 9) arrived in Sydney on February 5, 1968, led by television and movie star Robert Taylor, who was honorary director of the tournament. He was accompanied by his wife, actress Ursula Thiess.

The visit was part of a 17-day air trip prize offered to the winning team members of the American Trapshooting Association of a combined trap and skeet tournament, designed to give shooters of all degrees of experience an opportunity to win. Qualification for the tournament began July 1, 1967, and attracted nearly 6,000 shooters from 39 States of U.S.A. and nine Canadian provinces.

Qualifying scores were fed into a computer and the shooters were subdivided into five categories ranging from novice to expert. In club-level eliminations, shooters shot only against others in their category. The five club champions then formed the club team to compete for the regional championships on October 26 at West End, Grand Bahama Island.

Club champions received a presentation set of Winchester shotguns, whilst the regional titlists won a trip to the Bahamas for themselves and their guests.

The winning five-man team from San Diego left U.S.A. by air early February, 1968, with scheduled stops at Hawaii, Australia, Thailand, Italy, Germany and England. Special shoots with local teams were arranged in Australia, Italy and Germany.

In addition to other prizes, California shooters George Ellis and Glenn Eubank each won a \$1,000 bonus for having shot Winchester guns throughout the tournament.

More than 400 club-level winners received a matched set of Winchester shotguns (a model 1400 skeet grade and a model 1200 trap grade — these guns feature matching serial numbers and excellent wood.

Mr. William L. Wallace, corporate Vice-President and General Manager of the Winchester Western Division of Olin Mathieson Chemical Corporation, led the winning team during their stop-over in Sydney and was assisted by Mr. Sam Gwynne Jnr., the Winchester Representative for New York State.

A special shoot was arranged at the New South Wales Gun Club at Terrey Hills, some fifteen miles from Sydney, between the U.S.A. team and members of the A.C.T.A. Executive, all of whom had been brought with their wives to Sydney with the compliments of Winchester Western Australia Pty. Ltd. by their Managing Director, Mr. Vernon Christie, and Marketing Manager, Mr. Ross Baillie, both of Melbourne.

No recording was made of the results of this social shoot, but both

the American and Australian shooters, with their wives and friends, formed warm friendships during their few hours together.

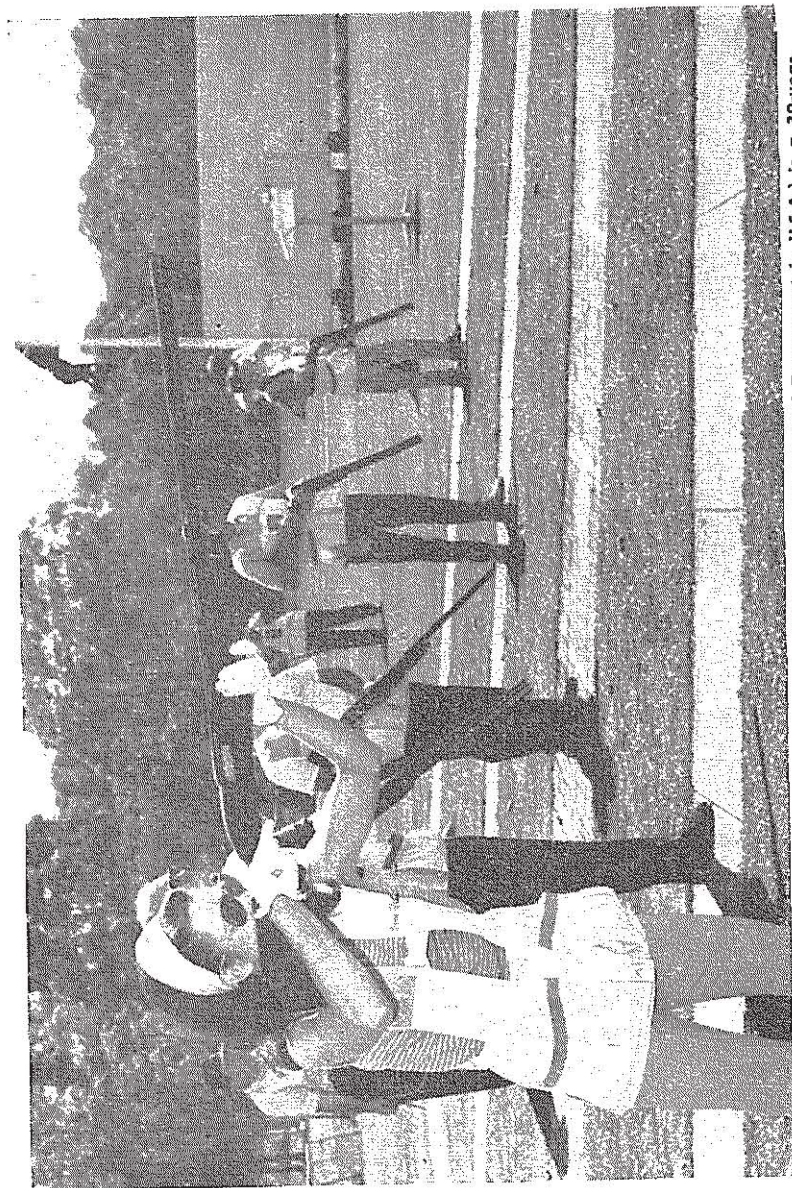

In the evening, despite a heavy downpour of rain, Television Channel "10" of Sydney made a live telecast from 8.00 to 8.30 p.m. of interviews with Robert Taylor and his wife, Ursula Thiess, during a barbecue at the Lane Cove National Park, and A.C.T.A. President, Mr. J. M. Tyquin, was presented a model 1200 Winchester pump gun by Mr. William Wallace when he indicated some of Winchester Western's future policy moves in Australia to further the sport of shotgun shooting.

Some noteworthy remarks by our American friends:—

Amazement at the distances travelled by A.C.T.A. Executive members to be present;

that Australia contained more than kangaroos and koalas;

the warmth and hospitality of the Australians;

the beauty of Sydney and its environs of home gardens and flora;

the percentage of Australian shooter population exceeds that of the U.S.A., per capita;

the children of secondary school age being in school uniforms — a custom not now widely practised in U.S.A.;

little difference in type of motor vehicles in that continental makes are similarly represented in U.S.A. and Australia;

in the U.S.A. if a shooter does not have his current handicap card recorded up to date, he is liable for immediate expulsion from the American Trapshooting Association. This is strictly applied, as otherwise all other shooters are being penalized by the laxity of an individual.

VALE — W. J. Carrington

On 26-1-68 Mr. Carrington passed away. He had been an active member of the Townsville Gun Club (Q'land) and a keen clay target shooter for approximately thirty years. At one period of his shooting career he was a member of the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee, and at the time of his death was an official Referee and Referee Examiner.

HISTORY OF BALLANDEAN GUN CLUB

Although Ballandean itself is a very small township, around 1959 and 1960 there was in the area a number of shooters with considerable interest in clay target shooting. As a result of this interest a meeting was called by Noel Smith for August 8, 1960, to consider the formation of a local gun club. At this meeting the Ballandean Gun Club was formed, with the following office-bearers: President, A. J. Smith; Secretary, Noel Smith; Treasurer, P. J. Lynam. These officials have remained in office till the present day.

One trap was installed and the first shoot took place in September, 1960.

The first open shoot was run in May, 1961, two £100 handicaps being on the programme. Prize money was guaranteed. The shoot was a big success and the club has never looked back.

On 9th and 10th May, 1964, the club made a great success of Queensland's first car shoot.

Queensland won the Australian Teams' Match at Ballandean on 14th and 15th May, 1966. Score 493/500.

The Ballandean Gun Club's shooting grounds are situated at the small railway siding of Lyra, which is 2½ miles south of Ballandean and about eight miles north of the N.S.W. border at Wallangarra.

Club policy is and always has been to return as much as possible to the

shooter. On this policy our success has been built.

The Ballandean Club is the only Gun Club in Australia completely equipped with Andersen traps. These traps are manufactured by one of our members, Eddie Andersen, and for reliability are quite unsurpassed. A feature of these traps is the true-ness of flight of the targets. It is quite impossible for anyone to read them.

Although shooters in the past thought they could read these traps and have, in fact, correctly forecast where a certain target will be thrown, it is a fact that the sequence of birds is far too long for anyone to remember and any shooter trying to read the trap over a number of birds is invariably fooled.

For the second Championship I changed to a Stirling Broadrib, and I went on to win. The next week at Cobar I shot 501 straight, and the following week shot 114 straight at Dubbo, winning the Championship. At Parkes I broke 481 straight, winning 3 championships in one day. In all this shooting there was no sign of heat-wave distortion using my Stirling Broadrib.

Suddenly, with a Broadrib, I became a good second-barrel shot, which is perhaps the most important factor in winning Championships. The Broadrib certainly improved my first-barrel shooting, but improved my second-barrel shooting dramatically.

I believe that there are at least 7 reasons for shooting a Broadrib and that any one of these would make the change worth while. You have only to shoot 100 shots through a Broadrib to know what I mean.

Since changing to a Stirling Broadrib, I have won 6 out of 7 double-barrel Clay Championships with an aggregate score of 1020 out of 1021. Without doubt the Stirling Broadrib has made all the difference to my shooting.

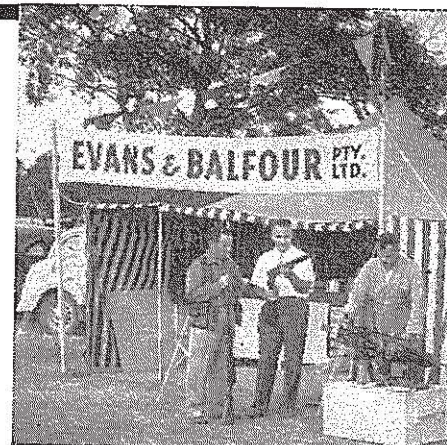

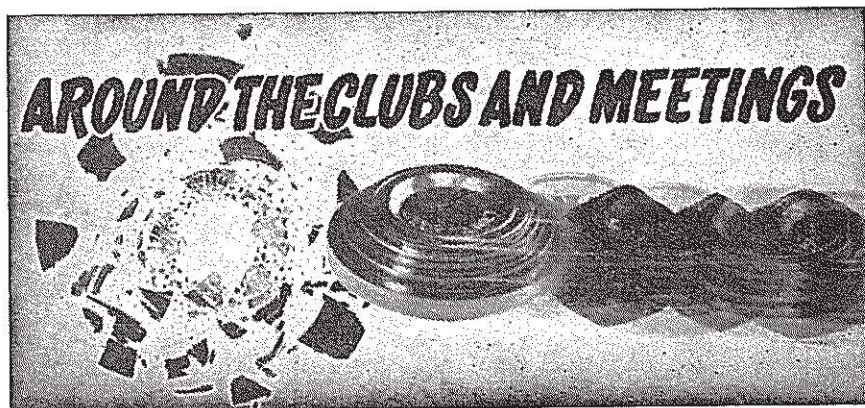

DUTIES OF A REFEREE

It is most necessary that adequate preparations are made to assist the smooth running of a shoot and the duties of the referee in charge on the setting up of the traps. Rule 57 states that the target must be 9 feet from the ground, when 10 yards from the trap, with a margin of tolerance of 18 inches above or below.

There is a tendency among officials to set the trap at 10 feet 6 inches and say that they are within the permissible tolerance. This is not so. The trap so set has no tolerance above, and has 3 feet tolerance below the 9 feet bar. In all cases the trap should be set to throw targets 9 feet high when 10 yards from the trap and should be altered immediately weather conditions cause clays to be thrown outside these limits. All too few clubs set their traps so that they cannot lower them to cope with an oncoming wind.

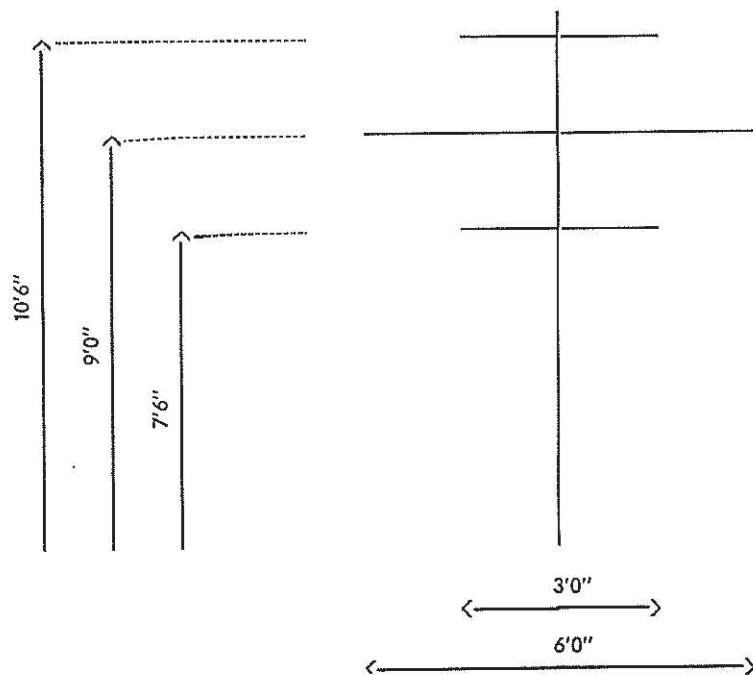
Traps should be adjusted so that both extreme right and left clays are

thrown at the same angles from the centre. It is quite a simple matter to do this, by standing on No. 1 track and observing at what angle the right target is thrown and then going to No. 5 track and checking on the left target.

On the height of targets—all too few clubs have correct height sticks. These should have a horizontal bar at 9 feet high and another two: one at 7'6" and another at 10'6". To judge the correct heights, referees should stand at right angles to the marker so they can see at what height the targets cross the marker.

If this procedure is carried out prior to the eye-opener event (and/or when weather or trap breakdowns necessitate adjustments), then very little problems should occur during the conduct of any programme.

To construct a height stick within Rule 57, obtain either old water pipe or timber and fashion as follows:—

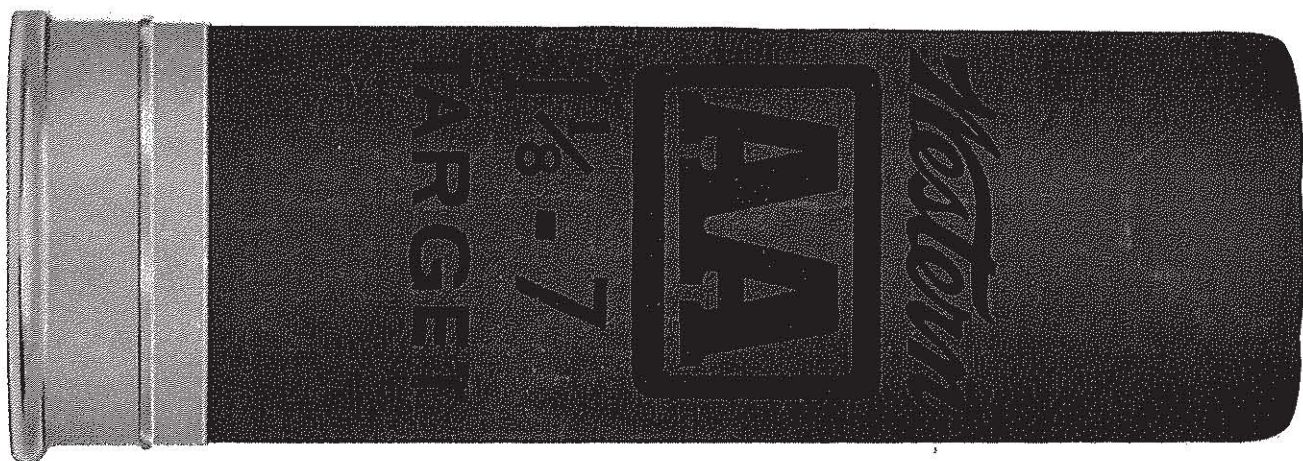
