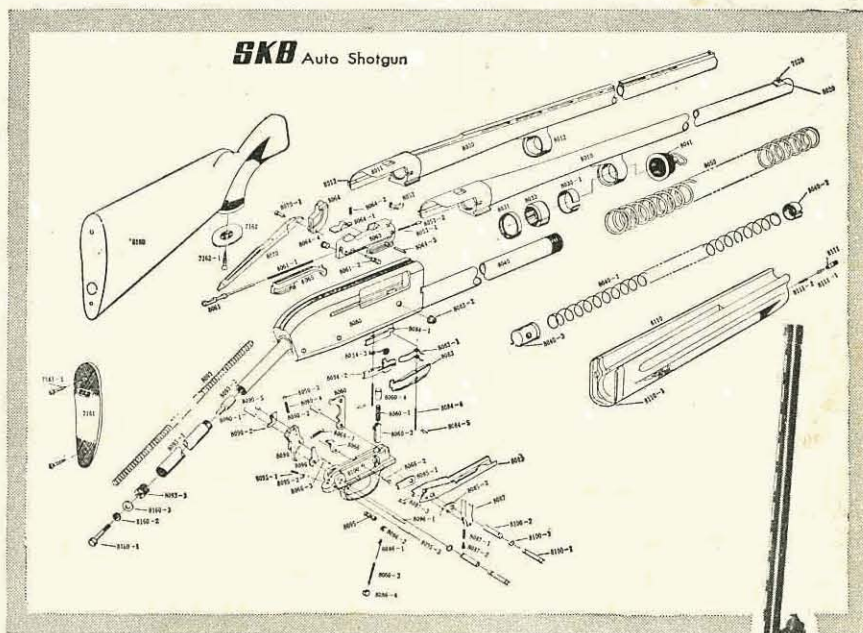

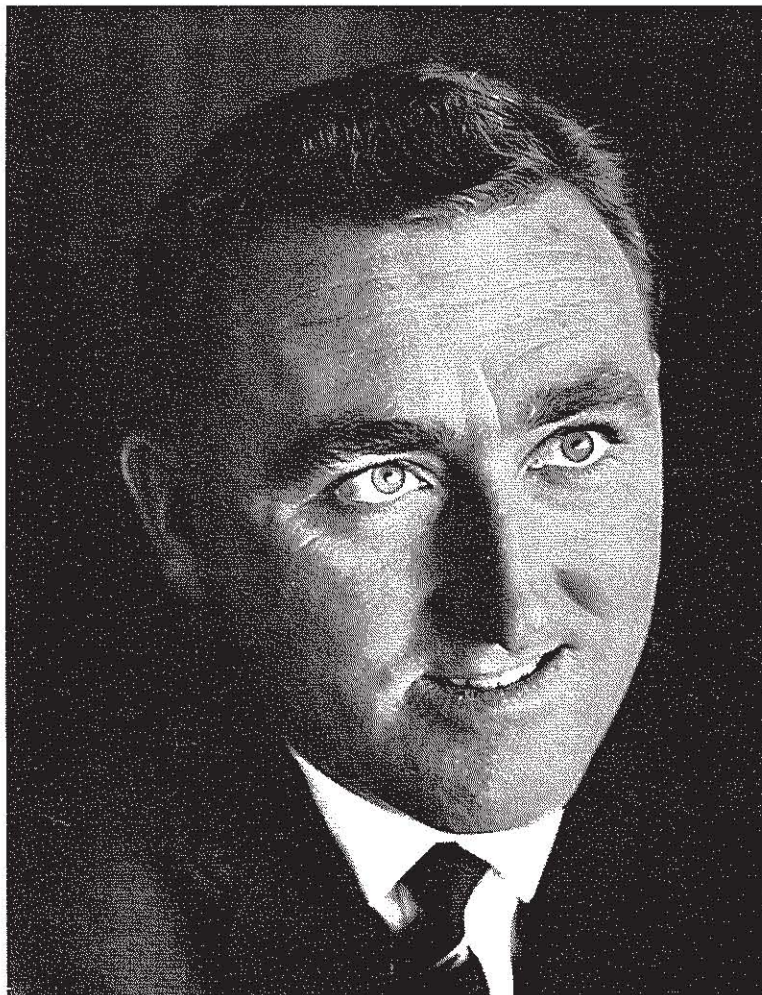

Results of the 21st International Teams' Match are not available until all other competing countries have conducted their matches, of which the final series will be conducted on Friday, July 5, near Carnarvon, Wales, and a cordial invitation has been extended by the Clay Pigeon Shooting Association to any Australian shooters wishing to attend.

It is an undisputable fact that competitive sport fulfills certain pedagogical, psychological and social functions which cannot be rated highly enough in a modern society geared to high performance. In no other sphere of life are strength of character and conduct taken so much into account in judging a performance than in sport.

Sports and games are inconceivable without the determination and the will to win, without competitions and championships. Outstanding performances stimulate new impulses and society expects these of sport.

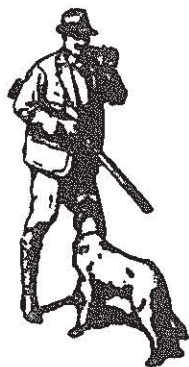

Timaru is a growing city with a population of 28,000 and the centre of a district population of 54,000.

Its port is considered by some as one of the best man-made ports in the world. It is the second largest meat-exporting port in New Zealand. All - weather mechanical handling equipment has been installed, capable of loading 50,000 carcasses per day. The equipment can load meat both in carcase and carton form. The Molyneux Report recommends that Timaru and Bluff should export the majority of frozen meat for the South Island. To cope with the larger cargo vessels appearing on the New Zealand coast, the harbour board is calling tenders for a diesel tug.

Caroline Bay is the safest and best equipped beach in New Zealand. Among the amenities are children's playing areas, concert hall, sound

shell with permanent seating, tennis and basket-ball courts, bathing sheds and picnic facilities set in lawns and gardens of over 30 acres.

Each year thousands of holiday-makers from far and near spend their holidays in and around Timaru, with its pleasant climate of an annual average of over 2,000 hours of sunshine and just over 20 inches of rainfall. The city has a habit of attracting sportsmen, visitors for a holiday, or delegates to a conference, and turning them into citizens.

A 90-minute unforgettable and scenic flight by DC3 aircraft is available for \$26. The flight is to Mount Cook, thence over Tasman, Franz and Fox Glaciers to Mount Aspiring, Milford Sound, Lake Te Anau, Queenstown, Wanaka, Hawea and Benmore Dam.

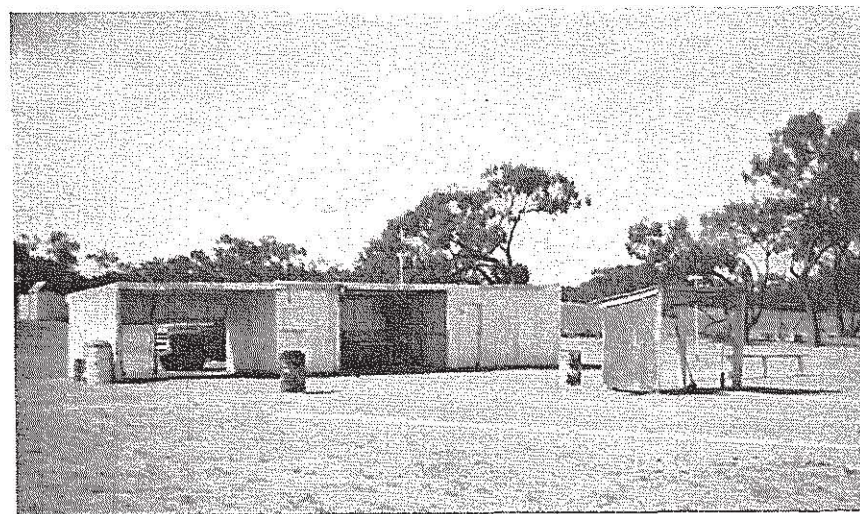

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS OF SAFETY

1. Treat every gun with the respect due a loaded gun. This is the cardinal rule of gun safety.
2. Carry only empty guns, taken down or with the action open, into your car, camp and home.
3. Always be sure that the barrel and action are clear of obstructions.
4. Always carry your gun so that you can control the direction of the muzzle, even if you stumble.
5. Be sure of your target before you pull the trigger.
6. Never point a gun at anything you do not want to shoot.
7. Never leave your gun unattended unless you unload it first.
8. Never climb a tree or a fence with a loaded gun.
9. Never shoot at a flat, hard surface, or the surface of water.
10. Do not mix gun powder and alcohol.

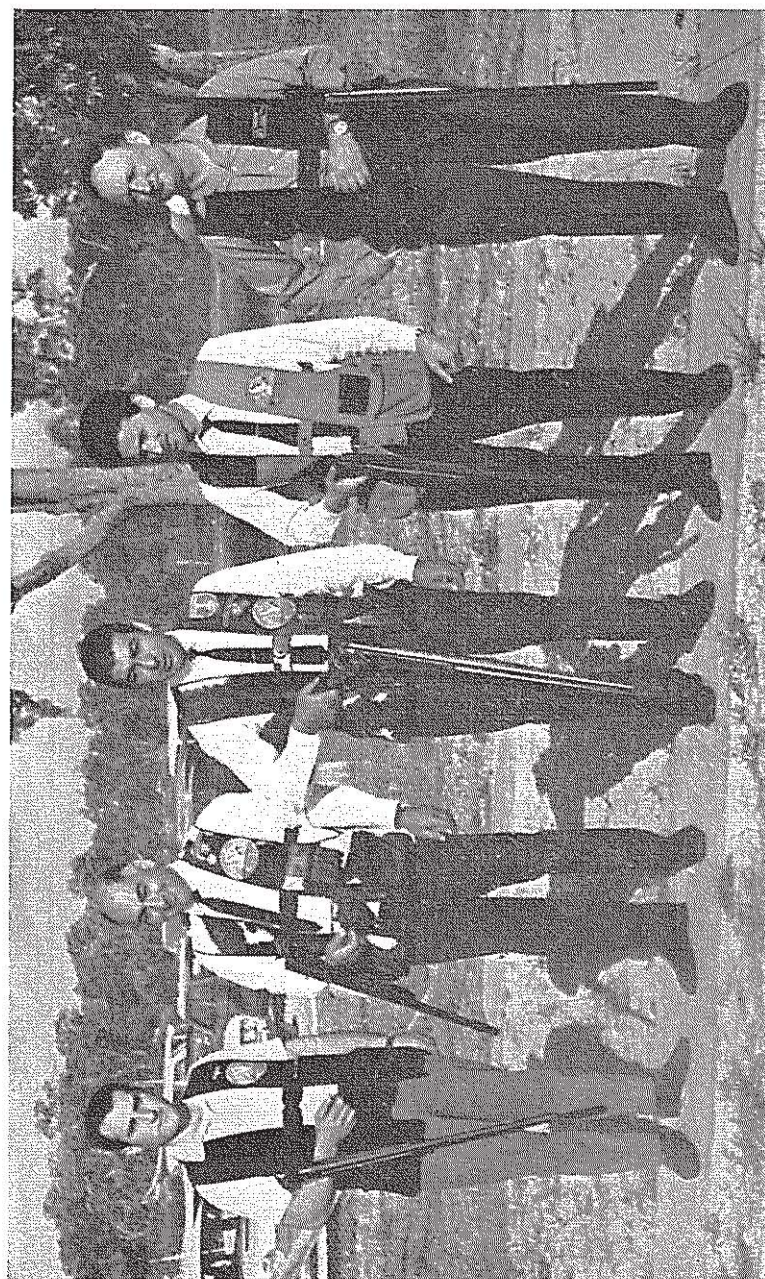

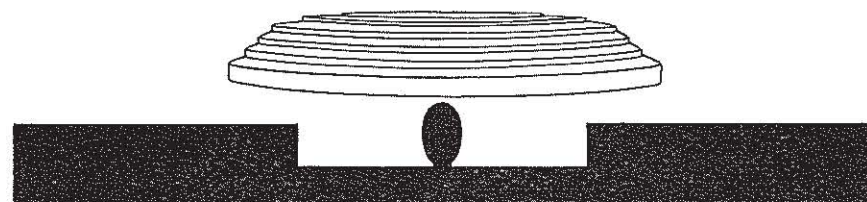
