

The Editor's Notebook



THE A.C.T.A. 32nd ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING of affiliated club delegates and representatives was held at the Blair Athol Hotel, Adelaide, South Australia, from 7.58 p.m. until 9.48 p.m. on Sunday, Mar. 10, 1968.

In attendance were 82 shooters, made up of 63 delegates/representatives and 19 observers.

The Chairman (a) welcomed to the meeting F. L. Rimmer, Delegate from the Kar Kar Island Gun Club of New Guinea.

- (b) congratulated the 1967 Australian International Team on its fine win.
- (c) congratulated M. Burgess of Cobar (N.S.W.) for his High Gun victory from J. N. Thomas (Vic.) and S. Marshall of Hobart, third.
- (d) congratulated the Victorian State Team for its 495/500 victory in 1967.
- (e) congratulated the 1967 Victorian State Skeet Team for its third time in succession victory.
- (f) In 1967 we won the New Zealand Australia Teams' Match in New Zealand.
- (g) congratulated the South Australian Gun Club on the condition of their grounds for this current 1968 series.

Appointment of Auditor-Mr. R. W. Fox of R. W. Fox, C. A. Gregory and Associates of Moorabbin (Vic.) was re-appointed as Auditor.

The elections for the Executive Committee by the various States resulted as follows:—

Queensland — Messrs. W. A. Edwards and L. S. R. Stewart were re-elected.

New South Wales — Messrs. K. Soames and A. E. Cregan were re-elected.

Victoria — Messrs. A. Pedersen and H. Smith were re-elected.

Western Australia — Mr. N. Wells was re-elected unopposed.

South Australia — Mr. R. Mules was re-elected unopposed.

Tasmania — Mr. W. E. H. Rainbird was re-elected unopposed.

Scrutineers throughout were J. Steiner and R. Burton of W.A. and D. Taylor of Tasmania.

Elected as Hon. Vice-Presidents for 1968 were:

Chairman submitted that Mr. F. Hudson would be in Mexico for the 1968 Olympic Games and could act for the A.C.T.A. at no cost to the Association at any discussions between the members of the British

Commonwealth Shooting Federation and the International Shooting Union. This submission was resolved.

A.C.T.A. Shooter Annual Registration Fee:

After a discussion on current values it was decided by a show of hands that as from January 1, 1969, the A.C.T.A. Shooter Registration Fee shall be \$4.00 annually.

(NOTE: Shooter Registration Fees must be forwarded to A.C.T.A. by the club secretaries concerned.

Subscriber fee for interested nonshooter readers of A.C.T.A. Shooting News is \$5.00 annually.

No pro rata rates are entertained.)

Extracts from the minutes of Executive Committee meetings at the South Australian Gun Club over the period March 9 to 13, 1968:—

1. Handicapping — Due to the detail of work involved, cards must be presented for any win or division to be paid and if a shooter, who has not had a win or division, wants his card marked for Inward Movement, he should present it to the club Secretary after the shoot. The onus is on the shooter to have his card so marked for Inward Movement.

All wins or divisions must be shown on handicap cards.

(NOTE: Our handicap recording methods conform with Olympic requirements.)

2. Venue for 1969 Australian National Trapshooting Championships:-

(a) Geelong Clay Target Club (Vic.), dated 31/1/68, submitted that their club be considered as a venue for the 1969 National Championships.

(b) Metropolitan Clay Target Club (Vic.) dated 5/3/68, "offer the use of their club grounds for the International shoot in 1969."

(NOTE: Selection of venue for the 1969 Nationals shall be decided by the Executive Committee at their October 1968 scheduled meeting.)

Olympic Games

The full conference of the Australian Olympic Federation has advised the Australian Joint Shooting Council (of which the A.C.T.A, is a

member) that the composition of the 1968 Olympic Team will be decided in conjunction with the respective sports, taking into consideration the standard of the applicants in comparison with Olympic standards and that only those applicants that display a sufficiently high standard will be considered for inclusion. The cost of sending the selected team members will be fully borne by the A.O.F. if its current appeal is successful, or proportionally by the controlling bodies for any deficiency.

Unless the previous decisions of the A.O.F. conference are reversed, it will not be possible to include the names of persons willing to pay their own expenses in the Olympic team.

Shooting has been allotted a team of three members and a section manager.

The above information was dated 5/3/68 from the A.J.S.C., which met at Narrabeen, N.S.W., on 26/11/67. In attendance were Chairman, Mr. G. Armstrong; Secretary - Treasurer, Mr. R. Johnson; Sporting Shooters' Association, Messrs. D. Lyall, B. A. Jackson; Aust. Pistol Shooting Union, Aust., Messrs. J. MacGillivray, T. Gonczol; Aust. Small Bore Rifle Assn., Messrs. C. Shadbolt, L. Marshall and K. W. Swan (Secretary ex officio). Admitted to the meeting as observers were Messrs. Young, Secretary N.S.W. J.S.C., and J. M. Tyquin, President A.C.T.A.

(NOTE: In paragraph 3 above, the word "shooting" covers small and large bore rifle shooting, pistol shooting and shotgun shooting.)

The Inter Services Trap Shoot for the I.C.I.A.N.Z. Shield was contested by the three Services—R.A.N., A.M.F. and R.A.A.F.—at the Army establishment, Puckapunyal, Victoria, on Wednesday, March 27, 1968. Results will be published when available, meanwhile final scores were:—

R.A.A.F. 85/90, R.A.N. 81/90, A.M.F. 80/90. High Gun was Wally Ford (A.M.F.), 73/73, from Bob Watson (R.A.A.F.), 72/73.

CLUB SECRETARIES (1) are reminded that the A.C.T.A. follows standard practice in that receipts are not issued unless so requested.

(2) are requested to note that at any shoot if there are less than twelve (12) shooters and thus only small events can be conducted, then such programme is to be recorded as a "Picnic Shoot" and is not to be counted for handicapping purposes.

1968 NATIONAL TRAPSHOOTING CHAMPIONSHIPS

This series was conducted in ideal shooting conditions at the South Australian Gun Club, Bolivar, South Australia, over the five successive days March 9 to 13 inclusive.

The programme commenced on the Saturday with the Champion of Champions Cup. This attracted a field of 224 shooters, and after the regulation 50 targets, some five shooters had scored the possible 50/50. An interesting shoot-off saw the well-known Paul Marshall of Hobart, Tasmania, take out this coveted award with a score of 92/92. Event No. 6, a \$300 Handicap, was then brought forward on the pro-gramme, and from a field of 213, some 20 shooters shot the possible 25/25.

On the second day, Sunday, a field of 233 contested the National Doublebarrel title. From these, some 46 shooters shot the possible 50 targets. After a lengthy shoot-off, the title was won by the brilliant Cobar (N.S.W.) shooter M. Burgess with a score of 188/188.

The Intermediate Double - barrel Championship, which attracted 49 shooters, was won by J. Brook of Roma, Queensland, with a score of 58/59.

On the third day, Monday, the National Single-barrel title was won by a very excited J. Hutchings of the local South Australian Gun Club with a score of 56/56 from 220 shooters.

(NOTE: Cheering spectator friends were unable to catch him to pass their congratulations.)

The National Double Rise Championship was then won outright by Wally Rae of Warren G.C., N.S.W., with a score of 48/50 from 192 contestants.

The fourth day saw the Australia-New Zealand Championship, shot pts. scoring. This attracted a field of 210 shooters, and in one of the most interesting shoot-offs for this event, Tim Catling of Katanning, Western Australia, shot 153 single barrels to win with a score of 459/459 points.

The Australia-New Zealand Teams' Match for the Tom Glenn Cup was won by Australia with a score of to 113. The Australian Team consisted of T. Catling, N. Thomas, B. Watson, K. Soames, R. Kimber and M. Fuller. The New Zealanders fielded a touring team led by Bevan Begg. His team mates were Leon Brown, Fred Lewis, John Hughes, Bruce Wilson and 78-year-old shooter Donald Campbell. The High Gun trophy for the New Zealand team was won by L. Brown.

On the fifth and final day, commencing at 8.00 a.m., the thirty highest scorers in the three events, D.B., S.B. and A.N.Z. Championships, shot as the Australian International Team for the Mackintosh Trophy. Such scores are sealed until all other contesting countries have submitted their scores to England. A list is published of this 30-shooter team.

High Gun Scorer in this Australian Team, and 1968 holder of the Bauman Cup, was M. Burgess (Cobar, N.S.W.) 339/339, after a shoot-off with S. Marshall of Hobart, Tas., whose score was 338/339. Third High Gun Scorer was N. Thomas of Victoria, 299/300.

The last and final event was the Grand Australian Handicap, which attracted a field of 139 shooters. This event was won by the Tasmanian shooter E. Johnson of Latrobe with a score of 56/56.

Included in the Australian team was Daryl Gibbs of Griffith, N.S.W., age 15 years 10 months, who was down only six points from the possible to gain inclusion in the team. It is noted that other such youthful International Team contestants in past years have included M. Burgess at 16 years, and in 1957 Alan Mace (age 15 years) of Rockhampton. Alan Mace was the first Queenslander to achieve a 300 break at Barcaldine in the Queensland section of the Interstate Teams' Match.

The over-all High Gun Scorer was M. Burgess of Cobar (N.S.W.), 312/ 325, but as he had received in 1967 the Browning Gun trophy, this was

handed to a very proud R. Kimber of S.A.G.C. (South Aust.), whose score was 311/325.

The grounds of the South Australian Gun Club were a credit to President Bob Mules and his untiring and co-operative committee.

The Association is grateful for the continued support and co-operation of I.C.I.A.N.Z., who donate the targets for the Champion of Champions Cup and International Teams' events, and also the cartridges for this International Teams' shoot.

It was noted that — Bob Mules and a few others stayed out at the South Australian Gun Club on Wednesday night after the National shoot. and had things fairly well cleaned up and had things fairly well cleaned up by midday the next day. During the cleaning-up operations a rather funny incident occurred. Bob picked up about 500 disposable paper cups and placed them in a 44-gallon drum, which had been burning earlier, but had gone out. Bob placed some petrol in the drum and initiated it from a crack in the bottom, when the whole thing started to growl and went off with a rather loud whoomf, shooting the 500 cups into the air, spreading them around a wider area than from where we had picked them up. Poor old Bob did not know whether to laugh or cry, and whilst sitting on a stool looking at the mess, it was said, "Hell, Bob, that was a good

pattern," and this helped him to see the funny side of life.

The Clay Pigeon Shooting Association will read out the results of the 1968 International Teams' Match at their banquet in Cardiff, Wales, after the English section of the tournament on July 5, 1968. If any Australian shooters anticipate being in England at that time would they please contact A.C.T.A. Secretary as soon as possible.



that the Association has been accepted by the Australian Joint Shooting Council and the way is now clear for our shooters to qualify to shoot for Australia, the Empire and the Olympic Games so long as they qualify under the rules of eligibility published below.

This is a major milestone for our sport and must result in us obtaining press coverage as enjoyed by other sports in the course of time.

Under the Olympic rules, costs of shooting, travelling and the set rates of accommodation are a debit against the wins or divisions and your club Secretary has been written to, covering these points.

Rules of Eligibility for the Olympic Games

THE OLYMPIC GAMES ARE RESTRICTED TO AMATEURS

Only persons who are amateurs within the definition laid down in Art. 26 of the Rules of the I.O.C. may compete in the Olympic Games.

Article 26.

An amateur is one who participates and always has participated in sport as an avocation without material gain of any kind. He does not qualify:

- (a) If he has not a basic occupation designed to ensure his present and future livelihood:
- (b) If he receives or has received remuneration for participation in sport;

Shooters will be most interested (c) If he does not comply with the Rules of the International Federation concerned, and the official interpretation of this Rule No. 26.

Official Interpretations.

So far as the Olympic Games are concerned, these rules must be complied with, even if they appear to conflict with the Rules of any other organisation.

Amongst others, the following are not eligible for the Olympic competitions:-

Those who have participated for money, or have converted prizes into money or, without permission of the National Federation within the Rules of the International Federation concerned, have received prizes exceeding 50 dollars in value, and those who have received presents which can be converted into money or other material advantage.

Those who are paid for teaching or coaching others for competition in sport.

A competitor is permitted to receive:

Travelling and living expenses corresponding to the actual outlay during competitions, including the Olympic Games, and for a very limited period of training (no more than four weeks), subject to approval of his National Olympic Committee.

Clothing and equipment as required for practising his sport from his amateur sport organisation.

Pocket money to cover petty daily expenses during the Games, but only from his National Olympic Committee.
