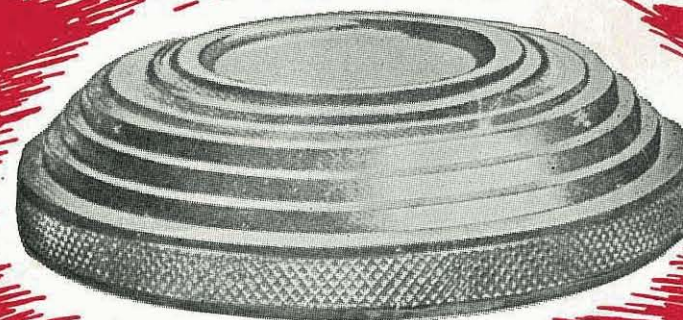

The Editor's Notebook



REGISTERED SHOOTERS

Article 49 of the Articles of Association of the Australian Clay Target Association states: (a) The Association shall keep a register of shooters and no person may enter or compete at any Association competition or event conducted by a member Club of which a Delegate is a member of the Association unless such person is registered with the Association and is not in arrears with his subscription.

(b) Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall BEFORE THE THIRTY-FIRST DAY OF JANUARY IN EACH YEAR supply the Secretary with a full and accurate list of all members and shooters registered with such club for the year commencing on the first day of January of such year and shall at the same time remit to the Secretary the subscription of such Club members and shooters. Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall also promptly forward to the Secretary of the Association the names and subscriptions of any person joining such club or registering as shooters after the thirty-first day of January in any year.

The above information is given for the benefit of secretaries and shooters alike. In the past, the cost to the Association of the preparation and mailing A.C.T.A. shooting "News" to unfinancial shooters has been far too heavy. MARCH 1969 "NEWS" WILL BE MAILED ONLY TO SHOOTERS FINANCIAL (actually received by the A.C.T.A.) AS OF FEBRUARY 17, 1969.

DELEGATE APPOINTMENT

Affiliated units of the A.C.T.A. are reminded that they are entitled to one

delegate (Article 15) to represent their interests at the Annual Meeting. However, delegates can only be accepted providing the Association "Articles of Association" are complied with. This involves the completion of the necessary forms, namely "Acceptance of Membership" (Article 5(a)), "Nomination of Representative" (Article 21) (in the case of a corporate club, or "Nomination of Delegate" (Articles 5(c) and 16) (in the case of an unincorporated club), followed finally by "Notice of Acceptance of Delegates". Official printed forms as applicable are obtainable from the A.C.T.A. office. It should be noted that nomination of a representative or member delegate can only be accepted providing all subscriptions and monies due by either the nominee or the club, to the Association, have been paid as provided for in Article 49.

It is also pointed out that where a representative or delegate has been appointed previously, and this has not been officially rescinded, the appointment as previously made will stand, until the Association is advised or instructed otherwise. In accordance with the Articles of Association, clubs cannot appoint a delegate other than on the prescribed form (letters are unacceptable).

Each 1968 financial affiliated member club has been mailed a Delegate Card (for unincorporated clubs) or a Representative Card (for incorporated clubs). These cards must be presented by the respective financial shooters concerned to obtain permission to attend and be eligible to vote at future annual general meetings.

1969 ANNUAL MEETING

The 1969 annual meeting of affiliated club delegates and representatives of

member clubs will be held on Sunday, March 9, at the Carlton Hotel, Geelong, Victoria. Delegates and representatives to assembly at 7.30 p.m. and the meeting to begin at 8.00 p.m.

Only such items as submitted within the Association Articles and published on the Agenda shall be discussed.

A.C.T.A. Secretary shall be available for discussion at 7.00 p.m.

The election of seats on the Executive Committee of the Association will take place during the holding of the 33rd Annual General Meeting of the Australian Clay Target Association to be held at the Carlton Hotel, Geelong at 8.00 p.m. on Sunday, March 9, 1969.

The 1969 New Zealand National Championships will be conducted at Hamilton (North Island) from March 23 to March 29 inclusive.

The Clay Pigeon Shooting Association cordially invite any Australian shooters to the final section of the 1969 International Teams' Match to be conducted at Edinburgh, Scotland, on July 18.

The 1970 National Championships shall be conducted at Perth, Western Australia, dates yet to be confirmed.

A.C.T.A. 1969 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS AND INTERNATIONAL TEAMS' MATCH will be conducted over five traps at the grounds of the Geelong Clay Target Club (one mile from the centre of the City of Geelong, facing Corio Bay) from 8.00 a.m. daily over six days — Friday, March 7, until p.m. Wednesday, March 12, inclusive.

The programme has one major title event each day, with, in addition where possible, a D.B. Handicap event.

On the first day, Friday, March 7, will be the coveted **Champion of Champions Cup** event (1968 winner was P. Marshall of Hobart, Tas.), to be followed by a \$300 value D.B. Handicap.

On the second day, Saturday, March 8, the **Australian National Double Barrel Championship** shall be conducted (1968 winner was M. Burgess of Cobar, N.S.W.). In conjunction shall be the **Australian National Intermediate Double Barrel Championship** (1968 winner was J. Brook of Roma, Queensland).

On the third day, Sunday, March 9, shooting shall be within the hours of 12.00 noon until 6.00 p.m., as prescribed under the Victorian State Firearms Act. The sole event for this day shall be the **Australian National Double Rise Championship** (1968 winner was W. Rae of Warren, N.S.W.).

The fourth day, Monday, March 10, shall commence at 8.00 a.m. with the **Australian National Single-Barrel Championship** (1968 winner was J. Hutchings of the S.A.G.C., South Aust.), thence shall be two \$300 value D.B. Handicaps.

The fifth day, Tuesday, March 11, will be a full and interesting day with the **Australian New Zealand Championship** (1968 winner was T. Catling of Kataning, West. Aust.) and a \$300 value D.B. Handicap.

The sixth and final day, Wednesday, March 12, will see the Australian Team shoot the **Australian Section of the Twenty-third International Teams' Match** for the Mackintosh Trophy, of which the scores shall be sealed until July 18, when the final section will be contested in Edinburgh, Scotland, by the Clay Pigeon Association. Competing countries will then receive the results by cable. The Clay Pigeon Shooting Association of Great Britain have advised that up to five targets may be permitted for practice before the Competition. The Australia

lian High Gun scorer in the 1968 International Team was M. Burgess of Cobar, N.S.W.

[NOTE: This event commenced in 1939 with the cup being presented, for competition in perpetuity, by the late Donald Mackintosh of Melbourne, Victoria. Competing countries are England, Scotland, Wales, Ireland, Rhodesia, South Africa, Canada, New Zealand, Australia. Australia has won this event eight times in the last eleven years, and although varying methods of scoring have been used over the years, the 7355/7500 total score recorded by Australia in both 1966 and 1968 has established the highest total to date and all contestants can be justly proud of their contributions. A double perfect score of 300/300 each was registered in 1967 by J. N. Thomas (Melbourne) and M. Burgess (Cobar) and S. Marshall (Hobart)].

The Twentieth Grand Australian Handicap event shall then be contested (1968 winner was E. Johnson of Latrobe, Tas.) and, subject to time available, a further \$300 value D.B. Handicap shall complete the programme.

Shooters will note that the trophies for the National Championships appear to be in excess of the Olympic Federation requirements but when expenses of travelling to and attending the shoot are deducted, the values are satisfactory.

For the information of all concerned, the accommodation agents have ample accommodation of 500 beds available for all fastidious tastes, plus 150 caravan sites. Agents are Dalgety & Co. of Geelong. Travel agents are Patrick Travel Service of Melbourne. (See December advertisement — the early use of the self-explanatory tear-out forms is recommended.)

Cartridges to be used in the 1969 National Clay Target Championships and in the Twenty-Third International Teams' Match shall be of the same load and specifications, contained in a plastic shell with appropriate markings, as for the 1968 National Championships. Competitors may use any cartridges of their choice in the respective handicap events.

A "Browning" under-and-over shotgun shall be presented to the **highest-gun-scorer over the six main events**, viz. Champion of Champions, Double Barrel, Double Rise, Single Barrel, Australia/New Zealand and the Grand Australian, with the provision that each shooter can gain this award only once. If a shoot-off is necessary to determine the High-Gun winner, then the shoot-off shall be shot

under handicap conditions. The Association is very grateful and records its compliments to the makers of this fine trophy, Messrs. F. N. Browning & Co. of Belgium, and to their agents, Messrs. Gollin & Co. of Sydney, for this fine gesture annually since 1966.

The Association also appreciates the offer of Fuller Firearms of Sydney, who will present a Stirling Broadrib Trophy Gun to the first New Zealand shooter who wins "any of the five Australian championships held annually".

All empty shells on the ground during the period of the 1969 National Championships shall be the property of the Geelong Clay Target Club. (NOTE: An empty cartridge outer case — with flaps excluded — can contain 350 empty shells. The marketable price of such quantities of empty shells is a club affair. One well-known club imposes a penalty of \$5.00 on any person who picks up empty shells before completion of the whole programme. — This is a world-wide trapshooting safety precaution.)

On the night of Monday, March 10 at 8.00 p.m. at the Geelong Clay Target Club shall be an open invitation to all A.C.T.A. Referees to be guests of the Association for an open discussion on rules interpretations.

The A.C.T.A. Rules having been clarified and regrouped were published in full in December 1968 Volume 22, Edition number 3. These Rules supersede any previous such publications. Copies of A.C.T.A. Rules and Championship conditions are available in brochure form through Club Secretaries. Price one dollar (\$1.00) per copy.

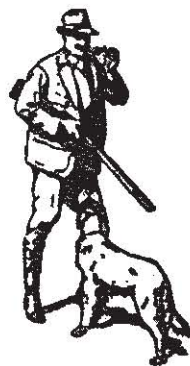
Break Badges. — Under Rule 80, a shooter can only claim one badge at a time, i.e. for a 78 break he can claim either a 75 or a 50 badge but not both. Each break badge, once achieved, cannot be repeated.

Club Secretaries are requested to use the various forms only for the purpose for which they are designed. Some secretaries have written notes in the middle or on the back of either handicap returns or shoot reports — these acts slow up any necessary actions.

Handicapping. — We have a 1968 handicap card which was burnt by a cigarette at the last shown handicap rating!!

Some shooters still persist in not presenting their cards for marking. Some club returns have recorded incorrect handicap ratings. A list has been prepared of all offenders.

for astronauts, a **moonstone**

Many people do not believe in such superstitions but evidently some do as it was recently published that editors are linked to **grindstones**.

When out duckshooting during the open season of 1968 Keith Haig of Hamilton (V.) with his power boat

placed Tim Knight and Clive Plowright at separate vantage points before dawn. Later in the morning after many shots had been fired in one area, Haig and Plowright waded to Knight to check his bag. Imagine their surprise and humour when they found that Knight although in an excellent position had had difficulty in seeing the ducks through the ti-tree scrub so he loosed off 3 to 4 packets of shells to clear the tree tops. The irony of it all — he did not get a duck.

Skeet Shooting — Skeet shooters often prefer shot size 9. The reasons are that open bored guns are used and the smaller shot, having a shorter range, is safer as a skeet range covers an arc of 180° (when compared with trapshooting).

Each year the records prove that the initial handicapping of new shooters is sometimes underrated as during 1968 several have shot their way back from the 12 yard mark to 20 and 23 yards.

At 5.00 a.m. on Sunday, January 12, 1969 in those parts of the State which lie within the boundaries of the South West and Eucla Land Divisions, with the exception of those Shires in (1) above, or those areas defined as closed under the headings 'General' and 'Specific' areas in this publication.

CLOSES

Unless otherwise proclaimed, the season will close throughout the whole of the Eucla and South West Land Divisions at 7.00 p.m. on April 30, 1969.

SKEET SHOOTING EXPLANATIONS

In the event of ties to be shot squad system — miss out.

If the method of halving each shooter's handicap is used then it must be noted that you cannot halve anyone in a group if a scratchmarker is present as a scratchmarker's handicap cannot be halved. Thus, if there are say 12 squads and one squad contains a scratchmarker, then, as all squads must be treated the same, we cannot penalise or interfere with the handicaps and all shooters concerned must shoot-off as follows:

Each shooter is allowed his allotted handicap and shoots at rounds of 25 targets until his allowed number of targets is used. Thus, a shooter on a nil handicap drops out after his first miss; a shooter with two targets drops out when his third miss is recorded, and so on to finality.

Skeet breaks are from "off the gun" scores only and are not from handicap shooting.

RELOADING PRECAUTIONS

Follow these precautions for maximum enjoyment and safety in reloading, and to assure uniform performance of your reloads:

1. Never load in haste.
2. Never smoke while handling powder.
3. Store powder in a cool dry place at all times.
4. Exercise care at all times.
5. Keep powder away from heat, sparks and open flames.
6. Never use a powder unless you are certain of its identity.
7. Use equipment and components as recommended by the manufacturer — don't take shortcuts.
8. Devote full attention to reloading operations — avoid distractions.
9. Do not mix powders.
10. Keep powder out of the reach of children.
11. Never exceed maximum recommended loads.
12. Keep only the minimum necessary quantity of powder in open containers.
13. Develop a loading routine to guard against mistakes.
14. Double check every operation for safety and uniformity.
15. Check powder charge level in shells to ensure against double charges.
16. On new loads, start with charge weights 10% below recommended weights.
17. Always watch for indications of excessive pressures in establishing new loads.
18. Examine every shell before loading to ensure good condition.

EAR PROTECTION FOR THE SHOOTER

Investigations show that many efficient and acceptable ear protective devices are available providing a range of noise protection sufficient to reduce nearly all excess noise to a safe limit.

In many instances, a number of ear protectors are suitable for any particular noise and whilst selection can be made on particular features or on price, it has been found generally that ear muffs provide the greatest value.

Types of ear protectors available are ear muffs, ear plugs (ear defenders), canal caps and medically approved fibre glass wool. Special fibre glass wool and wax impregnated cotton wool balls are disposable.

In assessing deafness it must be remembered that deafness is not necessarily caused by noise and may be associated with other conditions, e.g. disease, hereditary defects or birth injuries.

Noise from shotguns could cause acoustic trauma or deafness. This takes the early form of ringing in the ears with a small notch in the hearing at high frequencies (4000 cycles per second). Initially this causes a temporary deafness then the hearing is restored after a few hours.

With continued exposure, this notch in the hearing response curve becomes wider and deeper until the point is reached where it becomes a permanent impairment (one of the ill effects of this could occur if someone said "Have a drink," and we might not hear it!), but these consequences need not necessarily be so because of the considerable range of ear protective devices available.

In a comparison between ear muffs and ear plugs, personal preference would be a deciding factor. It could be put forward that most earmuffs would be preferable to plugs because they are relatively easier to make an airtight seal over the large, almost flat surface of the side of the head, rather than is the case with ear plugs, namely inside the narrow irregular shaped ear canal. However a satisfactory ear plug can also give adequate protection. Ear muffs give greater attenuation and are obviously required as the excess noise levels become greater.

For consistent trapshooting, ear muffs are probably the greatest protection available, however, in addition there are various type of plugs, and special fibre-glass wool for those shooters who are unable to tolerate the weight and pressure of ear muffs.

In the field, duck shooters could find muffs an obstruction and the smaller types of protection plugs, or fibreglass wool could be more suitable.

Where high noise level causes discomfort and occasionally pain, it is not difficult to motivate people to use ear protectors but it is difficult to convince people of the necessity for the use of ear protectors where noise levels do not have any noticeable subjective effect.

It should be remembered that once hearing is lost, there is no regeneration and shooters should give serious thoughts to the wearing of ear protectors when these are so readily available. New shooters, being attracted into the sport, should be made aware of the problems of hearing loss so that adequate precautions are taken.

All ear protection campaigns are supported by the Commonwealth Acoustic Laboratories in all States of the Commonwealth. These safety measures are fully advocated by all the advanced countries of the world in their preventive measures to reduce deafness from noise exposure.

CLAY TARGET SHOOTING

Considered opinions of European, American and Australian procedures:

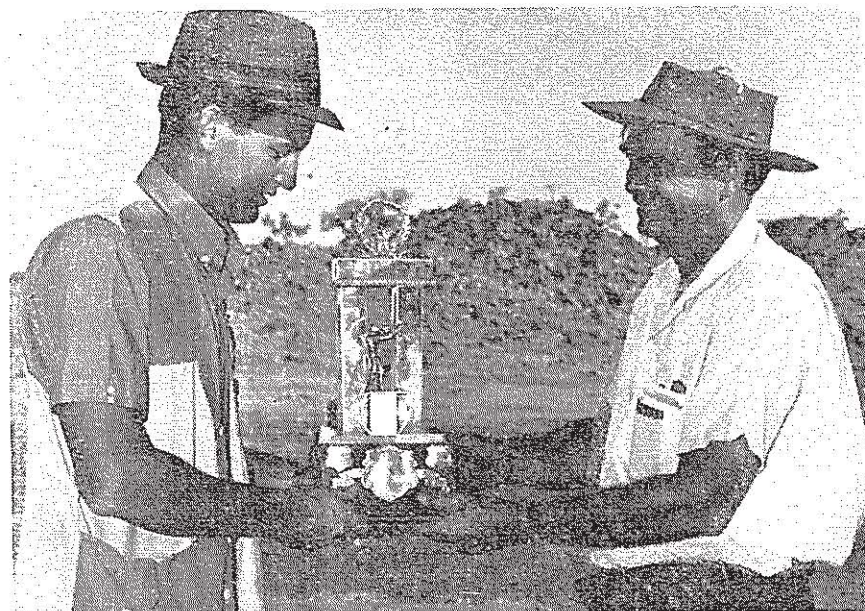
Olympic or Continental style consists of fifteen traps in brackets of three, and each being in front of five stations with shooters 16 metres behind the group(s) of three traps. The target is thrown 80 yards so that second barrel shooting makes this expensive. Five trappers are needed — one trapper to look after each group of three — plus one puller for the five traps. Thus this method of trap-shooting is costly to administer. This method of shooting exists in Japan, Italy, Spain and some European countries but there are not a great many of such shooting grounds overall. Trap-shooting is not prolific in Europe because the sport is costly. Only for the experienced shooter is this wonderful shooting and the novice is easily discouraged. The speed of the target determines how difficult it is. The traps are set at different heights and angles and a round is a

minimum of 25 targets rotating from station to station.

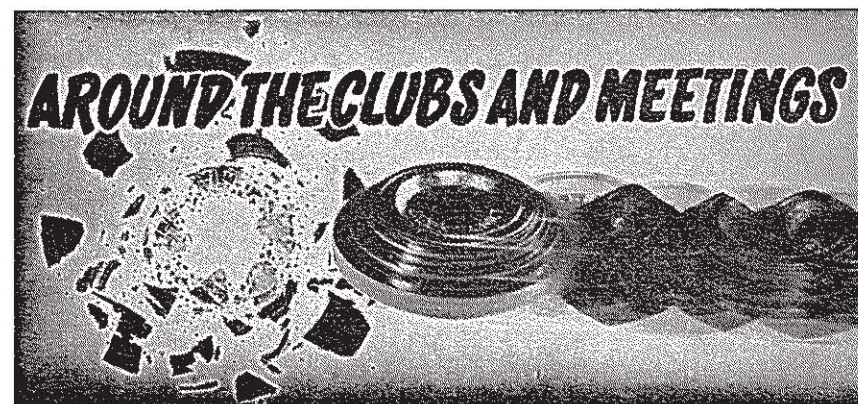
The U.S.A. system is conducted as in Australia but they shoot one cartridge (i.e. single barrel) only. A minimum round is 25 targets with five off each station before moving. The normal U.S.A. event is 100 targets which takes a long time to establish a winner and it is achieved at great cost. This is considered to be not as enjoyable as many small events conducted within the same given period in the United Kingdom, New Zealand or Australia. Thus, for the enjoyment of the average shooter, the Australian method of Clay target shooting is considered the best and most satisfactory.

The shooting methods in the United Kingdom, New Zealand and Australia are very similar.
