

# The Editor's Notebook



#### **1969 ANUUAL MEETING**

The 1969 annual meeting of affiliated club delegates and representatives of member clubs will be held on Sunday, March 9, at the Carlton Hotel, Geelong, Victoria. Delegates and representatives to assembly at 7.30 p.m. and the meeting to begin at 8.00 p.m.

Only such items as submitted within the Association Articles and published on the Agenda shall be discussed.

A.C.T.A. Secretary shall be available for discussion at 7.00 p.m.

#### DELEGATE APPOINTMENT

Affiliated units of the A.C.T.A. are reminded that they are entitled to one delegate (Article 15) to represent their interests at the Annual Meeting. However, delegates can only be accepted providing the Association "Articles of Association" are complied with. This involves the completion of the necessary forms, namely "Acceptance of Membership" (Article 5(a)), "Nomination of Representative" (Article 21) (in the case of a corporate club, or "Nomination of Delegate" (Articles 5(c) and 16) (in the case of an unincorporated club), followed finally by "Notice of Acceptance of Delegates". Official printed forms as applicable are obtainable from the A.C.-T.A. office. It should be noted that nomination of a representative or member delegate can only be accepted providing all subscriptions and monies due by either the nominee or the club, to the Association, have been paid as provided for in Article 49.

It is also pointed out that where a representative or delegate has been appointed previously, and this has not been officially rescinded, the appointment as previously made will stand, until the

Association is advised or instructed otherwise. In accordance with the Articles of Association, clubs cannot appoint a delegate other than on the prescribed form (letters are unacceptable).

Each 1968 financial affiliated member club has been mailed a Delegate Card (for unincorporated clubs) or a Representative Card (for incorporated clubs). These cards must be presented by the respective financial shooters concerned to obtain permission to attend and be eligible to vote at future annual general meetings.

The election of seats on the Executive Committee of the Association will take place during the holding of the 33rd Annual General Meeting of the Australian Clay Target Association to be held at the Carlton Hotel, Geelong at 8.00 p.m. on Sunday, March 9, 1969.

#### REGISTERED SHOOTERS

Article 49 of the Articles of Association of the Australian Clay Target Association states: (a) The Association shall keep a register of shooters and no person may enter or compete at any Association competition or event conducted by a member Club of which a Delegate is a member of the Association unless such person is registered with the Association and is not in arrears with his subscription.

(b) Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall BEFORE THE THIRTY-FIRST DAY OF JANUARY IN EACH YEAR supply the Secretary with a full and accurate list of all members and shooters registered with such club for the year commencing on the first day of January of such year and shall at the same time remit to the Secretary the subscription of such Club members and shooters. Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall also promptly forward to the Secretary of the Association the names and subscriptions of any person joining such club or registering as shooters after the thirty-first day of January in any year.

The above information is given for the benefit of secretaries and shooters alike. In the past, the cost to the Association of the preparation and mailing A.C.T.A. shooting "News" to unfinancial shooters has been far too heavy. MARCH 1969 "NEWS" WILL BE MAILED ONLY TO SHOOTERS FINANCIAL (actually received by the A.C.T.A.) AS OF FEB-RUARY 17, 1969.

A.C.T.A. 1969 NATIONAL CHAM-PIONSHIPS AND INTERNATIONAL TEAMS' MATCH will be conducted over five traps at the grounds of the Geelong Clay Target Club (one mile from the centre of the City of Geelong,

facing Corio Bay) from 8.00 a.m. daily over six days — Friday, March 7, until p.m. Wednesday, March 12, inclusive.

The programme has one major title event each day, with, in addition where possible, a D.B. Handicap event.

On the first day, Friday, March 7, will be the coveted Champion of Champions Cup event (1968 winner was P. Marshall of Hobart, Tas.), to be followed by a \$300 value D.B. Handicap.

On the second day, Saturday, March 8, the Australian National Double Barrel Championship shall be conducted (1968 winner was M. Burgess of Cobar, N.S.W.). In conjunction shall be the Australian National Intermediate Double Barrel Championship (1968 winner was J. Brook of Roma, Queensland).

On the third day, Sunday, March 9, shooting shall be within the hours of 12.00 noon until 6.00 p.m., as prescribed under the Victorian State Firearms Act. The sole event for this day shall be the Australian National Double Rise Championship (1968 winner was W. Rae of Warren, N.S.W.).

The fourth day, Monday, March 10, shall commence at 8.00 a.m. with the Australian National Single-Barrel Championship (1968 winner was J. Hutchings of the S.A.G.C., South Aust.), thence shall be two \$300 value D.B. Handicaps.

The fifth day, **Tuesday**, **March 11**, will be a full and interesting day with the **Australian New Zealand Championship** (1968 winner was T. Catling of Katanning, West. Aust.) and a \$300 value D.B. Handicap.

The sixth and final day, Wednesday, March 12, will see the Australian Team shoot the Australian Section of the Twenty-third International Teams' Match for the Mackintosh Trophy, of which the scores shall be sealed until July 18, when the final section will be contested in Edinburgh, Scotland, by the Clay Pigeon Association. Competing countries will then receive the results by cable. The Clay Pigeon Shooting Association of Great Britain have advised that up to five targets may be permitted for practice before the Competition. The Australian High Gun scorer in the 1968 International Team was M. Burgess of Cobar, N.S.W.

[NOTE: This event commenced in 1939 with the cup being presented, for competition in perpetuity, by the late Donald Mackintosh of Melbourne, Victoria. Competing countries are England, Scotland, Wales, Ireland, Rhodesia, South Sydney, for this fine gesture annually Africa, Canada, New Zealand, Australia. Australia has won this event eight times in the last eleven years, and although varying methods of scoring have been used over the years, the 7355/7500 total score recorded by Australia in both 1966 and 1968 has established the highest total to date and all contestants can be justly proud of their contributions. A double perfect score of 300/300 each was registered in 1967 by J. N. Thomas (Mel-bourne) and M. Burgess (Cobar), then again in 1968 by M. Burgess (Cobar) and S. Marshall (Hobart).

The Twentieth Grand Australian Handicap event shall then be contested (1968 winner was E. Johnson of Latrobe, Tas.) and, subject to time available, a further \$300 value D.B. Handicap shall complete the programme.

Shooters will note that the trophies for the National Championships appear to be in excess of the Olympic Federation requirements but when expenses of travelling to and attending the shoot are deducted, the values are satisfactory.

For the information of all concerned, the accommodation agents have ample accommodation of 500 beds available for all fastidious tastes, plus 150 caravan sites. Agents are Dalgety & Co. of Geelong. Travel agents are Patrick Travel Service of Melbourne. (See December advertisement — the early use of the self-explanatory tear-out forms is recommended.)

Cartridges to be used in the 1969 National Clay Target Championships and in the Twenty-Third International Teams' Match shall be of the same load and specifications, contained in a plastic shell with appropriate markings, as for the 1968 National Championships. Competitors may use any cartridges of their choice in the respective handicap events.

A "Browning" under-and-over shotgun shall be presented to the highestgun-scorer over the six main events, viz. Champion of Champions, Double Barrel, Double Rise, Single Barrel, Australia/ New Zealand and the Grand Australian, with the provision that each shooter can gain this award only once. If a shoot-off is necessary to determine the High-Gun winner, then the shoot-off shall be shot under handicap conditions. The gun is a broad rib, 30 inch barrel, half and full choke, Grade B2(d). The Association is very grateful and records its compliments to the makers of this fine trophy, Messrs. F. N. Browning & Co. of Belgium, and to their agents, Messrs. Gollin & Co. of since 1966.

The Association also appreciates the offer of Fuller Firearms of Sydney, who will present a Stirling Broadrib Trophy Gun to the first New Zealand shooter who wins "any of the five Australian championships held annually".

All empty shells on the ground during the period of the 1969 National Championships shall be the property of the Geelong Clay Target Club. (NOTE: An empty cartridge outer case - with flaps excluded --- can contain 350 empty shells. The marketable price of such quantities of empty shells is a club affair. One well-known club imposes a penalty of \$5.00 on any person who picks up empty shells before completion of the whole programme. - This is a worldwide trapshooting safety precaution.)

On the night of Monday, March 10 at 8.00 p.m. at the Geelong Clay Target Club shall be an open invitation to all A.C.T.A. Referees to be guests of the Association for an open discussion on rules interpretations.

Contestants and visitors entering Geelong from the Melbourne Highway (Route Number 1), may, after passing the Ford Motor Works proceed two miles into Geelong then turn left into Bell Parade, then follow the beach two miles to the Geelong Clay Target Club and so skirt the city.

As no cars shall be parked within the club grounds proper, the area behind tracks one to five shall be free for spectators. The brick clubhouse shall be available for spectator use and as a shooter rest area.

Cars may be parked under the trees in the huge parkland across the roadway from the club grounds. Also space exists for 100 cars in an enclosed area eastwards of trap layout number one.

All cars will find parking space as close as at any gun club.

New Zealand shooters shall be guests of the A.C.T.A. for luncheon each day.

The 1969 New Zealand National Championships will be conducted at Hamilton (North Island) from March 23 to March 29 inclusive.

The Clav Pigeon Shooting Association cordially invite any Australian shooters to the final section of the 1969 International Teams' Match to be conducted at Edinburgh, Scotland, on July 18.

The 1970 National Championships shall be conducted at Perth, Western Australia, dates yet to be confirmed.

Because of printer's errors in the December 1968 publication, the A.C.T.A. Rules, Conditions and Formulae are reprinted in this edition in their corrected form. The principal corrections being:-

(a) Trap Rule 98 = D.R. quoting 79 should read 81; Trap Rule 98 = D.D. quoting 89 should read 90; Trap Rule 98  $\doteq$  W.U. quoting 91 should read 92.

(b) Trap Handicapping Formula -the 1968 and 1969 amendments concerning procedure whereby "only the club and Association Handicapper have authority to amend shooters' cards."

(c) Skeet — page 49 December 1968 news, last two lines should read "it shall be scored as first target "dead", and the second target "lost".

The A.C.T.A. Rules having been clarified, regrouped and published in this March 1969, Volume 22, Edition number 5 supersede any previous such publica-tions. Copies of A.C.T.A. Rules and Championship conditions are available in brochure form through Club Secretaries. Price one dollar (\$1.00) per copy. Noticeboard copies have been issued

to club secretaries.

The attention of all club secretaries is drawn to the last paragraph of the handicapping formula which reads "Handicap returns must be lodged within seven days." Records are only as accurate as the information supplied and received and if one shooter's handicap is not correct, then all other shooters are penalised.

2. And all shooters are reminded that HANDICAP CARDS CURRENT MUST BE PRESENTED AT ALL SHOOTS.

2. Due to the high costs involved, club secretaries do not receive a gratis copy of the A.C.T.A. Clay Target Shooting News. The Executive Committee is aware of the present-day increases of all attendant costs and wishes to remind clubs and shooters accordingly. Secretaries should register as shooters.

3. Annual shooter registration fee of \$4.00 for the year commencing January 1, 1969, must be forwarded through a club Secretary. No pro-rata rates are accepted.

4. To non-shooter subscribers A.C.T.A. Shooting "News" is \$5.00 per annum. No pro-rata rates are considered.

5. The POSTCODE reference is vital for all "News" addressees - otherwise the publication will be rejected by the postal authorities.

6. The Handicapping Formula is calculated on the retail value of trophies.

7. Handicapping — The Formula commences "Cash or Trophy value wins and divisions obtained in one day" this includes yardage prizes. Thus, a shooter may be handicapped after his results in, say, the first event, but, unless that plus his results in the following events do not total in excess of \$101, then only one yard per day can be applied to the shooter.

8. Handicap cards must be handed to the club Secretary when nominating at any shoot. The card will then be marked whether, or not, of any alteration under the handicapping formula, or with an asterisk (\*) where the full programme has not been contested. A.C.T.A. must then be informed, within seven days, by use of the handicap return form as available to all clubs. Shooters shall collect their cards at the completion of the day's programme. (See Dec. '67 "News" for full details.)

9. In all handicap events a shooter shoots from the handicap last listed on his current handicap card, or as in A.C.T.A. "News".

10. The total of all wins or divisions for the day should be shown on the shooter's handicap card.

11. The next step is to apply those wins or divisions, of trophy values and/ or compulsory sweepstakes, against the shooter's handicap recorded on his card from his last attended shoot as provided for within the values listed in the handicapping formula.

NOTE: For possible inward movement calculations, the value(s) listed must include any wins or divisions in novelty events.

Thus, please show any such wins/ divisions, then enter the correct handicap rating (whether new or amended or unaltered) on the handicap card and return it to the shooter.

Such handicap amendments must be listed on the Handicap Forms (as pro-

vided). These forms must reach A.C.T.A. office within seven days of the shoot concerned.

12. Championships-

(i) A shooter winning a championship which is shot from in front of his current A.C.T.A. handicap receives no alteration to his recorded handicap.

(ii) A shooter winning a championship which is shot from behind his current A.C.T.A. handicap receives an immediate handicap alteration to that of the championship.

(iii) A shooter winning a championship which is shot from his own current A.C.T.A. handicap receives an immediate adjustment according to the Handi-capping Formula and the prescribed Championship Trophies.

13. A.C.T.A. Rules require that all Commonwealth, State and District Titles, plus any event over \$100 value, must be applied for on the prescribed form. The lodging of an advertisement only, without any application, merely holds up the procedure involving return mails.

14. Enamelled metal championship badges are struck by the makers only against firm orders by A.C.T.A. office. Club Secretaries only may request these badges using the prescribed form. The badges will be of the standard A.C.T.A. insignia with the surround, containing the year, the championship title, the winner's initials and name. Such lettering on the surround will be in the following colours:---

Commonwealth Championships - Blue State Championships — Red District Championships — White Club Championships — Green

Clubs are charged for each badge ordered.

15. Championship SASHES only may be ordered direct from the makers by club Secretaries. Recommended and official makers are W. FLATTELY & SON, 11 ORR STREET, CARLTON, 3053. Colours for the respective gradings of championships are AS FOR BADGES as shown above.

16. Break badges in cloth form are available for \$1.00, but only where score sheets, are submitted by the club Secretary on the prescribed form, clearly show the shooter has earned this right. Break badges are for 50, 75, 100, 150, 200, 250 and 300 breaks (see Rule Number 80).

17. Available on request by club secretaries at nominal prices are:-

(a) A.C.T.A. pocket insignia on navy cloth background:


- (b) A.C.T.A. ties with embroidered insignia on navy background;
- (c) A.C.T.A. tie bars:
- (d) A.C.T.A. metal car badges:
- (e) club shoot record books;
- (f) club shoot report forms.

18. CLAY TARGET SHOOTING ON SUNDAYS - STATE OF VICTORIA - permission is subject to approval of the Victorian State Government Chief Secretary through the controlling central body. A.C.T.A. will forward, when requested, the appropriate forms for application. Clubs must then at least, one month in advance, submit through A.C.T.A.:

1. Standard A.C.T.A. shoot request for mshowing programme and date(s) concerned;

2. "Sunday shooting" forms (two copies) — [NOTE: Four copies must be completed, of which one is to be lodged with the club's local municipal authority, another with the officer in charge of the Police Station nearest to the gun-club range, thence two copies to A.C.T.A. for submission to the Chief Secretary's office.]

The A.C.T.A. will advise the club of the outcome as soon as it is available. NO firearms may be discharged without this permission in writing, also Sunday shooting of clay targets is permitted between 12 noon and 6 p.m. only.

A Game Licence (Quail) must be obtained direct from National Parks and Wild Life Service, G.P.O. Box 39, Sydney, 2001 during April.

# NEW BREAK RECORDS

The standard of shooting, world wide, has risen remarkable in recent years, with credit due to the shotgun makers, and to the cartridge manufacturers for their constant research and application of technical knowledge, BUT, the shooter, over the years, has continually proven himself with the results of his skill in the field or at clay target shooting through his co-ordination of sight, reflexes and stamina. In the developed countries of our modern world field shooting has diminished as the taking of fauna is a controlled privilege, not an inherent right. Consequently, from about 1870 the sport of clay target shooting has developed and two types of shotgun shooting have emerged. These are:

(a) "Trap" or "Down-the-line" shooting which simulates game flushing then flying away, directly ahead of the shooter.

(b) "Skeet" shooting which simulates flushed game flying close in, from left or right, across the shooter's line of vision.

The earliest of shotgunmakers realised the different shooting situations between far and near targets and the smooth bored shotguns commenced with either long or short barrels accordingly. It was then found that by boring the barrels, a further variation of result could be achieved, and controlled, at the target position. Currently, shotguns are manufactured with varying "choke" borings from "full choke" for long distance shooting down to "improved cylinder" for short range requirements of either skeet (clay target) shooting or for quail shooting in the field.

The wooden stock of shotguns has always been of selected timber for its strength to withstand shock and for its eye appeal. Gun stocks for field shooting were originally designed to blot the game out for the correct moment of pulling the trigger and had about 21 inches drop at the heel. This was alright for single barrel shooting but where a second barrel shot was required, the target had to be re-found by the shooter. When clay target shooting became popular it was found beneficial to raise the drop at the heel of the stock to 11 inches or 15 inches from a 11 inch start at the comb --- thus, the line of vision of the

shooter was raised, keeping the target in view at all times, his second barrel shot was away faster than before and also at a much shorter range. A 'Monte Carlo' stock is designed to drop 14 inches at both front and back and is supposedly flat with the high comb on the same plane as the sighting rib along the barrels. This particular stock is satisfactory for trapshooting but presents problems for either skeet or field shooting.

(Individual shooters of note have found that better results are obtained (a) in a following wind by lowering the head slightly so that the sighting plane is closer to the target; (b) in a head wind, by raising the head

for your line of sight shot.)

The ammunition makers have progressed from paper to plastic shofgun shells principally to overcome storage and/or damp weather conditions. Whilst the charges or propellants have been improved, the wad pressures are the controlling internal factors of the modern shotgun cartridges.

Shotgun shooters have been known to establish phenomenal results either in the field or at glass ball and other man made targets but in the sport of clay target shooting, the current trap record appears to belong to Austin Dorr of New Jersey, U.S.A., who in September 1968 shot 730 straight in one day during a 1000 target marathon. He ended with 995 x 1000.

The first Australian 100 break recorded appears to have been established in 1951 in Victoria by a Melbourne dentist. Gus Russell.

Australian shooter Kevin Heywood of Narromine (N.S.W.) had previously established the world record of 501 consecutive broken targets in the one day at Dubbo in 1966.

This Australian record has now been increased to 544/544 by 2 Vic. shooters when competing on January 11, 1969 at Lilydale Gun Club in two events — a ten target (points scoring) eye-opener off 16 yards and the Lilydale District Double Barrel Championship. Mr. Jim Anderson and Mr. J. Newton Thomas shot until 7.40 p.m. when fading light

made continuation impossible. The weather conditions were perfect with a temperature of 85°, virtually no wind and good natural light.

Shooter J. Newton Thomas, known to most Australian shooters has, over the years, won each of the Australian National Trapshooting Championships and some of his recorded efforts read as follows:

1951 shot 183 straight at Burwood (Vic.).

1953 shot 321 straight at Cootamundra (N.S.W.).

1959 shot 454 straight at Bankstown (N.S.W.) (this was eclipsed by K. Heywood's 501 at Cobar in 1966).

1969 shot 544 straight at Lilydale (Vic.)

His efforts around this time at three

successive shoots attended were: January 1st at Geelong (Vic.) 35/35.

January 11th at Lilydale (Vic.) 544/ 544.

January 18th-19th at Gold Coast (Qld.) 5 target eye-opener 5/5.

Annual Bauman Gold Cup Event 140/ 140. (He has now won this event two years in succession).

On the second day missed his 35th target 34/34.

TOTAL FOR THREE CONSECU-TIVE SHOOTS 758/758.

To all these and other similar shooters go the compliments of shotgunners all over the world with the knowledge that no shooter can achieve these records unless another contestant is pushing him all the way.

"Under and Over" Shotguns. as also did English representative shooter, Bob Braithwaite in winning the Clay Target Shooting Gold Medal at the 1968 Mexico Olympiad.

#### Dear Sir,


Thank you for your letter of 14th November. It was most kind of you to invite me to attend your next Championships and I also appreciate your Executive Committee's good wishes.

#### TRAP SHOOTING RULES

#### 1. TRAP LAYOUT

A standard trap lay-out shall consist of five firing points arranged on the arc of a circle of radius 16 yards and whose centre is the trap, firing points to be 3 yards apart, numbered 1-5 from left to right when viewed from the firing points and facing the trap, with No. 3 firing point directly behind the trap.

A horizontal line joining No. 3 firing point and the trap and prolonged indefinitely will be known as the "Centre Line".

#### 2. FIRING POINTS FOR HANDICAPS.

These firing points are situated at intervals of 1 yard from 12 to 27 yards behind the trap on lines from the trap extended through the firing points for standard trap lay-out. These firing points may be referred to as "Handicap Marks".

#### 3. SHOOTING TRACKS.

This collection of firing points, forming a fan-shaped pattern, shall be known as the "Shooting Tracks" and on these, distances should be clearly marked to signify the forward limit of each firing point.

#### 4. SHOOTING SQUARE.

When firing, the competitor's feet must be behind the firing mark assigned to him, and he must stand with both feet completely within a 3 ft. square; this square shall extend 18" either side of the centre of the shooting lane and shall extend backward 3 ft. from the assigned handicap mark.

#### 5. TRAP HOUSES.

Trap houses shall be used to give full protection to the trappers. These houses shall be 3'3'' high in front, tapering or sloping to 2'9'' at the back, and shall be 6'0'' from front to back, 8'0'' wide. A tolerance of 3'' either way is permissible on these dimensions. All height measurements shall be taken from the level of the centre line. The trap shall be mounted in a manner which will bring the top centre oscillation of the throwing arm 14'' above the level of the centre line. A tolerance of 1" either side of this dimension is permissible.

#### 6. LEGAL TARGETS.

Targets, to be legal, whether single or doubles, shall be thrown out not less than 45 yards nor more than 55 yards (measured horizontally at trap level) with a flight of 9 feet above the centre line at a point 10 yards from the trap, with a margin of tolerance of not more than 18" above or below. Except in double target shooting, the flight of targets shall be at unknown angles, thrown within an area subtending an angle at the trap of 45 deg. right and left of the centre line.

7. As an aid in determining the legality of targets, where possible three pegs at least 3 ft. high are to be placed on the arc of a circle (known as the "Distance circle") of radius 50 yards and whose centre is the trap; one on the centre line—"the Central Peg"—and one other each 45 deg. to right and left of the centre line respectively. These two pegs will be known as the "Lateral Limit Pegs". Concrete blocks and measuring sticks for measuring target heights are to be standard equipment at all clubs.

#### 8. LEGAL TARGETS - DOUBLE.

Each double shall be thrown as a right and left quarterer respectively into an area subtending an angle of 25 deg. at the trap; each area having as one boundary a line to the Lateral Limit Peg as defined, and as its other a line drawn 20 deg. to the right or left respectively of the centre line.


#### 9. SERGEANT SYSTEM.

Five single traps, 5 yards apart, constitute the Sergeant System. The targets are thrown from unknown traps at unknown angles. Maximum throw of traps to be 55 yards, minimum 30 yards. Limit mark to be 16 yards, shot from centre track. In this and any multitrap lay-out, the centre trap must be on the "Centre Line".

#### 10. TARGETS.


No target shall measure more than four and five-sixteenths inches in diam., nor more than one and one-eighth  $(1\frac{1}{2})$ inches in height. LEGAL TARGETS — SINGLE

### TO BE THROWN IN SHADED AREAS




### LEGAL TARGETS - DOUBLE

#### GUNS AND LOADS

#### 11. MAGAZINE GUN.

The term "Magazine gun" applies alike to automatic guns, pump guns (so called) and other guns not directly dependent on hand loading and are permissible for clay target shooting.

12. No gun whose gauge is larger than 12 gauge is permitted.

13. For Championship events (Commonwealth, State, District) the load is limited to 14 ounces struck measure or equivalent, shot size not larger than No. 6. Re-loads are permitted in all events except National Championships.

14. For Handicap events, load is restricted to 14 ounces struck measure or equivalent, shot size not larger than No. 6.

#### 15. CHALLENGE.

A competitor may challenge the load of any other competitor. On receipt of a written challenge, with \$2 forfeit, the Management shall obtain a cartridge from the challengee, and if after public

examination of it the Management finds the challengee has violated requirements, he may be disqualified or not accordingly as the offence was wilfully committed or otherwise. In case the challengee is wholly innocent the forfeit shall be paid to him, otherwise it shall be returned to the challenger. The Management of any club, or of any tournament has the power to examine any competitors' cartridges at their discretion, without involving themselves in any penalty.

#### **OTHER SHOOTING**

16. The Management of any Club holding a tournament or competition under these rules has the authority to reject any entry in the said tournament, or other competition without giving any reason, therefore, and to disqualify in whole or in part any competitor who acts in an ungentlemanly or disorderly manner, or who handles his gun dangerously.

#### **COMPETITOR AND COMPETITION**

17. Wheresoever the word "Competition" may be used in the following rules, it is to be understood to refer to each particular event, and must at all times be construed by the Management in whose charge the carrying out of such "Competition" has been entrusted.

18. A competitor is one who has nominated for a particular event, and whose name appears on the official score sheets or score board. A competitor can compete only once in each event. Each competitor shall carry his Handicap and Registration Card at all shoots.

19. Every competitor entering competitions agrees to accept all official decisions, and to abide by the rules controlling the competition.

20. All competitors must be registered by the A.C.T.A. before taking part in competition. Unregistered competitors are not permitted to compete at any time. (Registered competitors who shoot at unregistered or unaffiliated Clubs render themselves liable to disqualification.)

21. Competitors must at all times use their correct names when entering a competition. Shooting nom-de-plumes are not permitted.

22. If a competitor withdraws or is disqualified from a competition, he forfeits all rights to resume.

23. The No. 1 shooter may request a target be thrown at his first and sub-sequent visit to each trap.

24. All clay targets — broken or otherwise — at all times remain the property of the club and not the competitor. The competitor only pays for the privilege of shooting.

25. Should darkness, bad weather, or other cause interfere with the competition the Management shall have the right to decide when and how the competition shall be continued, provided that this is not postponed longer than 14 days. Any competitor who defaults in respect of such postponed competition forfeits all his rights and standing therein.

26. Shooting for targets only, is a term which shall be held to define the status of a competitor in any given event, or events, or in an entire tournament programme, and shall signify that a competitor is "shooting for targets only"

and has no interest in any trophy or trophies, nor any interest in money or monies in any specific event or events or in the entire programme. The competitor's name shall be placed on the squad board, signifying that he is shooting for targets only. "Shooting for targets only" shall not be allowed at open shoots. Shooting for targets shall be permitted at normal Club shoots only, and then at the discretion of the Club.

27. Open shoots, that is Commonwealth, State and District Championships and open competitions (cases where more than \$100 is allotted for distribution in any one event), must have the approval of the A.C.T.A. before being advertised or conducted. (This rule applies both to the actual event and the proposed date of holding.) 28. A manual automatic or electric oscillating trap must be used at all open shoots.

#### SAFETY

29. A competitor shall hold his gun in a position of safety, with breech open at all times.

30. Shooting on the grounds at any place other than the firing point at legitimate targets only is prohibited except where a pattern plate is installed.

31. Holding the gun "Pistol" fashion, using one hand only, is barred. Any competitor acting in this way is to be warned against continuance — if continued, the competitor is to be disqualified from competition forthwith and the matter reported to the Executive Committee (Penalty, fine \$10).

32. When it is his turn to shoot, a competitor shall close his gun only when at the firing point and facing the traps. He must remove the cartridge or cartridges from his gun before turning from the firing point on No. 5 track and proceeding to No. 1 track. The cartridge or cartridges must be removed from any magazine gun between each track and not replaced until the competitors turn to shoot.

#### PROCEDURE

33. A competitor must be at the firing point within two minutes after having been called by the official referee, scorer or a member of the Club Management. Failing therein, he may be disqualified or penalised with loss of targets or may be re-squadded in the last squad at the discretion of the Club.

34. A competitor is duly notified to compete when his name is called out by the referee, scorer or other person authorised to do so by the management or when his name appears on the score board. If a "Squad hustler" is furnished it is a matter of courtesy only and does not in the least relieve the competitor from responsibility. It is the duty of each and every competitor to be promptly on hand to compete when called upon to do so.

35. When firing, the competitor's feet must be wholly within the limit of the correct Firing Square.

36. When at the firing point ready for competition, the competitor shall distinctly give the command "pull" to the puller and thereafter the competitor is in the competition.

37. Unless, in the opinion of the referee, it is contrary to the equity of the competition, a competitor taking part in a competition may shoot at pieces of his own target, if he so wishes.

38. No competitor shall make, negotiate, or discuss any bet (either on his own shooting or that of any competitor) while he is at the firing point or shooting tracks, nor shall he leave the firing point or the shooting tracks for the purpose of making, negotiating or discussing any bet. If any competitor infringes this rule, he may be disqualified by the referee.

#### HANDICAP SHOOTING

39. No competitor is permitted to shoot from other than his A.C.T.A. handicap except in graded shoots, which may be shot from 16 or 18 yards or a mark designated by the Club conducting the event. Trophies of equal value must be provided for place-getters in each handicap yardage group.

Other exceptions are Novelty events and Championships, and eye-openers preceding Championships, which may be shot from the same yardage as the Championships. Eye-openers are restricted to five targets per trap or ten targets when only one trap is used. All clubs are permitted to run one Pre-International shoot per annum, when Clubs at their discretion may shoot any

event from 16 yards. Such shoots must be held within 30 days prior to the advertised date of the commencement of the International programme. Prizes or trophies must not exceed \$200.00 value on any one event.

40. Club handicaps must not be less than Association Handicaps.

#### SQUADS

41. Competitors shall be in squads with a maximum of 6; where there are withdrawals from a squad or squads after the competition has begun, squads will be closed up before each run over any track. No. 1 competitor in each souad shall always start the shooting. The Club, at its discretion, may require competitors to change starting lanes on each trap as follows:-- No. 1 Competitor shall commence shooting from Lane 1 on Trap No. 1, Lane 2 on Trap No. 2. Lane No. 3 on Trap No. 3, and so forth over all the traps. Preserving the continuity of lane changing on each visit to the traps. This rule shall also apply to Double-rise.

42. Managements have the right to divide the number of targets by the number of traps available, shooting 6, 7 and 8 targets per visit per trap. Illustration No. 1: 15 targets, 2 traps, 1 visit. No. 1 competitor shoots 8 targets on Trap No. 1, finishing on Lane 3. No. 1 competitor now starts on Lane No. 4 on Trap No. 2, and shoots 7 targets, finishing on Lane No. 5.

Illustration No. 2: 30 targets, 5 traps. 6 targets per trap, one visit. Clubs must preserve equality by lane changing between traps.

43. All competitors in a squad automatically change lanes as soon as the next competitor has shot, and not wait until all competitors have shot. All members of a squad shall remain at the firing track until the last shot of the squad is fired.

#### SHOOTING UP

44. "Shooting up" after the first round of a competition is not permitted in any circumstances, except in the instance of competitors taking part in the Annual International Match.

#### REFEREE

45. To become a registered referee, a candidate shall approach his Club

Secretary and President, who (when they consider that the Candidate has achieved a satisfactory standard) shall recommend to the nearest REGIS-TERED REFEREE EXAMINER that the candidate be given a practical and oral examination. When the candidate has passed this examination to the Examiner's entire satisfaction the Examiner will then notify the A.C.T.A. Secretary, who will issue the official A.C.T.A. Referee Badge to the candidate and place his name on the official list of referees.

On receipt of a complaint from any affiliated club or Registered Referee Examiner, the members of the Executive of the State concerned shall investigate the complaint and if substantiated, the A.C.T.A. Secretary shall immediately recall the badge of the referee concerned and remove his name from the list of Registered referees. The same penalty may apply to any Registered referee who refuses to take his turn at refereeing at any shoot or is considered in any way to be incompetent.

46. The Referee's decision in all cases coming under his jurisdiction as set forth in these rules, shall be final. Referees should wear their official badges at all shoots.

47. The Referee, besides attending to special duties set forth in these rules, shall adjudicate the competition, he shall distinctly and loudly announce the result of each shot by calling out "Kill" when the target is broken, and "Lost" when the target is unbroken, except in Double Rise shooting and point scoring. He shall decide all other issues which arise in relation to the direct competition.

48. An assistant referee for Deauville Doubles and Double Rise competition is permitted and recommended. The Chief Referee to give his decision following the call of the assistant referee.

49. If the Referee is negligent, or inefficient, impairing thereby the equity of the competition, the Management may forthwith remove him. This rule applies also to scorers, pullers, trappers and any other of the staff.

50. The referee is empowered to challenge the ammunition used by any competitor.

20

51. The referee has power to alter his decision. If altering his decision on "Lost target" or "No target", "Baulk", etc., during a competition, this must be done within the period of the following 5 targets, or before the squad leaves the tracks.

52. The officiating referee, Executive member or the Management MUST adjust the trap immediately it is not throwing regulation targets. Immediately following such alteration a target must be thrown and the competition continued.

#### SCORER AND PULLER

53. The Scorer shall keep an accurate record of each shot. According to the referee's call "Kill" or "Lost". He shall mark the figure 1 for "Kill" or 0 for "Lost", for either single-barrel or double-barrel shooting. Double barrel denotes that 2 shots are allowed per target, each shot equal scoring value. Double barrel "points" denotes 3 points for a "Kill" on the first barrel, 2 points for a "Kill" on the second barrel, and no points for "Lost". These points scores will be called by the referee and scored by the scorer accordingly.

For Double-rise scoring, see rule No. 81.

54. The official score must be kept on a score sheet and be available for inspection by the competitor.

55. It shall be the responsibility of the competitor to check his score with the score sheet before leaving the shooting track. Any protest on his score must be lodged with the referee immediately, i.e. before leaving the shooting track. Such protest can only be made against incorrect score.

56. The Puller shall pull the trap, or traps, instantly in response to the competitor's call of "Pull".

57. The Puller shall have an uninterrupted view of the competitors at the firing points.

#### BROKEN TARGET

58. A "broken target" (kill) is one which has at least a visible piece or pieces, or the centre section broken from it, or which is completely reduced to dust, or which has a visible section from it, even when such section is broken into dust by the competitor's 69. "No target" shall be called when a round fired is sufficiently faulty as

59. A "dusted" target is one from which more or less dust is detached by the competitor's shot, but which shows no visible diminution in size therefrom. A dusted target is not a broken target and is a "Lost target".

#### NO TARGET

60. After "No target" has been called by the referee under any of the following conditions it thereafter plays no part in the competition and is irrelevant to it.

61. "No target" shall be called when a target is released without the call of "Pull" or at a material interval before or after the call of "Pull".

62. "No target" shall be declared when a broken target is released.

63. "No target" shall be called when, in single target shooting, two targets are released at the same time.

64. "No target" shall be called when a target does not conform to the definition of legal target as regards height, distance, or angle thrown (see Rules, 6, 8).

65. "No target" shall be called when a competitor shoots out of turn, or from the wrong track.

66. "No target" shall be called when two competitors, or a competitor and non-competitor shoot at the same time, at the same target.

67. "No target" shall be called when a misfire or malfunction in either barrel caused by the competitor's gun or misfire of the cartridge due to no neglect on the competitor's part. In the event of misfire of the second barrel the competitor must fire a live cartridge in the general direction of the target, and is permitted to score with the second barrel only. If the competitor accidentally breaks this target with the first barrel, "no target" shall be called and another thrown. If he again breaks this with the first barrel, "Lost target" shall be scored.

68. "No target" shall be called when a simultaneous or near simultaneous discharge occurs, i.e.: from any cause both barrels are discharged together or nearly together; after the second occurrence "Lost target" shall be declared.

69. "No target" shall be called when a round fired is sufficiently faulty as to leave an obstruction in the barrel or the cartridge is faulty in the opinion of the referee.

#### BAULK

70. Any extraneous occurrence which, in the opinion of the referee, materially interferes with the equity of the competitor after he calls "Pull" constitutes a baulk.

Under no circumstances will a baulk be granted unless claimed by the competitor immediately it occurs, or if, in the opinion of the referee, a baulk has occurred, he may restore the competitor's target.

#### LOST TARGET

71. "Lost target" shall be called when the competitor fails to break the target.

72. "Lost target" shall be called when the competitor fails to shoot because his gun is unloaded, or uncocked, or because the safety was faultily adjusted or jarred back whether from his own oversight or not, or because of any other cause chargeable to his own oversight or neglect.

73. A competitor having an apparent misfire or malfunction will forthwith call the referee for his decision, otherwise the referee shall declare it a "Lost target". The competitor must not turn around, must not open his gun and must keep his gun pointing in the direction of the traps until the referee has given his decision.

74. "Lost target" shall be called if in single-barrel shooting the competitor loads two cartridges into the gun. A competitor is allowed to load one cartridge only and is not permitted to load an empty shell or dummy cartridge.

75. "Lost target" shall be declared if a competitor shoots from his wrong handicap mark, or the competitor's stance violates Rule No. 35.

76. "Lost target" shall be declared on the third and subsequent misfire or malfunction of a gun in any one event.

77. "Lost target" shall be declared when over any one trap the competitor has a second or subsequent misfire with a cartridge which has already misfired once in the competition, or is using the score.

78. "Lost target" shall be declared when a target is "dusted" (see Rule 59).

#### ABIDE BY RESULT

79. Should a gun misfire in the first barrel and the competitor fire the second barrel in such guns where this is physically possible, the competitor shall abide by the result. (Also see rules 90-91.)

#### BREAK RECOGNITION

80. The A.C.T.A. will recognise breaks in sequences of 50, 75, 100, 150, 200, and 250, and so on, providing same are shot over an automatic trap under double or single-barrel conditions and in regular competition on one day only excepting over two or more successive days. No practice between events is permitted and breaks must be continuous. To shoot in other than double or single-barrel events immediately concludes the break. Actual score sheets, clearly marked, showing where break occurred, must be produced to the A.C.T.A., together with the prescribed form and \$1.00 per badge, before recog-nition can be granted. Break badges, once they have been obtained, will not be repeated. "27 yard" badges will be available to those attaining this as their registered handicap.

#### OTHER TYPES OF SHOOTING

#### 81. DOUBLE TARGETS.

Double-rise shooting may be off handicap marks or such marks as the Club may decide, except in the case of championships, and shall be scored and called by the referee, 1-1 or 0-1 or 0-0, whichever the case may be, each target to count as 1 point. In the event of a tie to be shot off, squad system first miss-out, best of each pair until finality.

82. The competitor must shoot at a complete pair of targets on every occasion, each "Kill" shall score (1) one point. Two barrels must not be fired at one target.

In the event of a misfire or malfunction on the first barrel the referee shall declare "no targets" and another pair thrown. AUSTRALIAN CLAY TARGET SHOOTING NEWS

91. Any misfire or mechanical failure in Deauville Doubles does not entitle the competitors to another pair of targets and they must abide by the result.

#### 92. WALK-UP.

Walk-up events shall be shot double barrel from No. 3 track, squad system. The competitor shall load his gun at the 22-yard mark; when ready in this position he commences to walk at a normal walking pace, holding his gun at any position of safety. The puller shall release the target between the 20-yard and 15-yard marks inclusive, the mark being unknown to the competitor, having previously been determined by an indicator or dice. No. 1 competitor shoots at one target, he then returns to the rear of the squad, each competitor doing the same in turn.

#### 93. WALK-UP POSITION OF SAFETY.

A loaded gun shall be deemed to be in a position of safety when it is the competitor's turn to shoot and he faces and points the gun in the general direction of the trap house, having the gun either mounted on the shoulder or in the gun-down position.

#### 94. TOWER.

Tower events shall be shot double barrel, both barrels equal value, 5 to 10 targets per competitor per visit to the tracks, squad system, competitors in a straight line left to right, with centre (No. 3) competitor standing 5 ft. in front on the centre of the tower. Whilst at the firing point the competitor must not turn towards the tower, but must face directly to the front throughout the competition.

The trap shall be 35'0" above the ground, plus or minus 30" either way, mounted on a tower. Targets shall be thrown at standard angles, i.e.: 45 deg. either side of the centre line. Targets shall be thrown a minimum of 45 yards and maximum of 65 yards.

#### SWEEPSTAKE DEDUCTION AND CASH DISTRIBUTION

95. Possible deduction from sweepstakes by clubs, in club contests, shall not be more than 50 per cent. (inclusive of targets).

96. No deduction is permitted by clubs in optional sweepstakes.

97. In all cash distribution handicaps or sweepstakes, the distribution shall be on the basis of 60% (1st), 30% (2nd) and 10% (3rd). A competitor scoring the only possible on an event wins only 60% first place. In these events division shall be compulsory unless the majority concerned agree otherwise.

#### TIES

98. Commonwealth, State and District Championships shall be shot off squad system, first miss-out. All competitors to commence on the same trap, competitors shall be squadded in the order they qualified. Competitors shall close up after each five targets per shooter, and be re-squadded as soon as it is practicable, i.e.: at the commencement of each run.

**Double Rise.** Squad system, first missout, best of each pair until finality as per rule No. 81.

**Deauville Doubles.** First miss-out shot from tracks 2 and 4 as per Rule 90.

Walk-up. To be shot squad system as per Rule 92, best of five targets until finality.

Mixed Targets. To be shot from No. 3 Lane, 2 double barrel, 2 single barrel, 2 walk-up, 2 pair double-rise. Total 10 points until finality.

#### HIGH GUN

99. The high gun for a shoot shall be over the advertised programme or such events as the club, at its discretion, has advertised. In the event of a tie for High Gun, where such programme includes both championship and handicap events, it shall be shot off squad system, first miss-out from handicap marks "double barrel". International Teams and State Teams Hiigh Gun excepted.

#### DUTIES OF OFFICIAL REFEREES AT ALL TOURNAMENTS

- 1. He must have complete knowledge of the Rules of the A.C.T.A. and shall adjudicate the competition at all times as set out by the management.
- 2. It is his responsibility to announce the conditions as set out in the Rules

for each event before the competition commences, also to displace shooters to their correct firing lanes.

- 3. As shooting proceeds he must observe that shooters are standing on their correct yardage, not shooting out of turn, handling their guns with safety, and using the correct shells as laid down for each individual event.
- 4. He must at all times observe that the trap is releasing regulation targets and may at any time challenge the heights or angles thrown.
- 5. The referee must distinctly and loudly announce the result of each shot and shall decide all other issues which arise in relation to the direct competition.
- 6. The referee must be efficient and alert at all times and it is most important that he should gain the confidence and respect of each and every competitor.

#### DUTIES OF A SHOOT MARSHAL ARE:

- 1. He must observe all the duties of the official referee.
- 2. He must be present at all shoot-offs.
- 3. He must see that all traps are checked for correct height and angles prior to shoot-off.
- 4. The shoot marshal shall be in charge of all operations and personnel including referees relating to the shoot and may be responsible only to the management.
- He must instruct and roster the duties of all personnel prior to the commencement of each day's shooting.
- At International Teams events he shall announce that teams photos be taken as instructed by the Executive Committee.

Each competitor to shoot five to ten clay targets at each visit from five tracks squad system. The management shall provide three trophies-1st, 2nd and 3rd. Maximum Entrance fee for Championship \$4, opt. sweepstakes, to be divided, first 60 per cent., second 30 per cent., third 10 per cent. of sweep money received, without deduction, are permissible. In the event of ties to be shot off squad system, first miss-out. The management shall clearly indicate on the official score sheets and score board those who have entered for the optional sweep.

#### STATE SINGLE-BARREL CHAMPIONSHIP

The Championship shall be shot at 30 clay targets from 18 yards One barrel only. The competitor shall load one cartridge only in his gun. Each competitor shall shoot from five tracks squad system at five to ten clay targets at each visit. The management shall provide three trophies - 1st, 2nd and 3rd. Maximum Entrance fee for Championship \$4, optional sweepstakes, to be divided, first 60 per cent., second 30 per cent., third 10 per cent. of sweep money received, without deduction, are permissible. In the event of ties to be shot off squad system, first miss-out. The management shall clearly indicate on the official score sheets and score board those who have entered for the optional sweep.

#### STATE MIXED TARGETS CHAMPIONSHIP

The Championship shall be shot in the following order at five clay targets from 18 yards, double barrel, either barrel to be of equal scoring value, and score as one point. Five clay targets from 18 yards single harrel, one cartridge only allowed in gun, each kill to count as one point. Five walk-up clay targets. double barrel, competitor to have gun loaded and ready to commence his walk from the 22 yards mark. The competitor advances at an ordinary walking pace — to shuffle or walk slowly is a "no target". The clay target is released between 20 and 15 yards inclusive, and the mark to be unknown to the competitor, being predetermined by an indicator, or dice arrangement, and is determined each target the competitor is to shoot at. Five pairs of double-rise clay targets from 16 yards, each target to count as one point, making possible total 25 points. In the event of ties to be shot at two double barrel, two single barrel, two walk-up and two pair double rise, from number 3 lane total ten points, until finality. Maximum Entrance fce \$4 for Championship, optional sweepstakes, to be divided, first 60 per cent., second 30 per cent., third 10 per cent. of sweep money received, without deduction, are permissible. The club management to provide three trophies --1st, 2nd and 3rd. The management shall clearly indicate on the official score sheets and score board those who have entered for the optional sweep.

#### STATE WALK-UP CHAMPIONSHIP

The Championship shall be shot at 20 clay targets, double barrel, either barrel to be of equal scoring value, and count as one point. The competitor shall load his gun on the 22 yard mark. When ready in this position he commences and continues to walk at a normal walking pace. To walk slow or shuffle constitutes a "no target". The puller will release the target between the 20 and 15 yards mark inclusive, the mark to be unknown to the competitor, being predetermined by an indicator or dice arrangement. The competitor will shoot at five to ten targets at each

visit, in the order laid down in Rule 96. Each competitor shoots from centre track. Maximum Entrance fee to Championship \$4, optional sweepstakes, to be divided, first 60 per cent., second 30 per cent., third 10 per cent. of sweep money received, without deduction, are permissible. The management shall provide three trophies — Ist, 2nd and 3rd. In the event of ties, to be shot off in lots of five clay targets until finality. The management shall clearly indicate on the official score sheets and score board those who have entered for the optional sweep.

#### STATE DOUBLE-RISE CHAMPIONSHIP

The Championship shall be shot at 15 pairs of clay targets from 16 yds. Each competitor to shoot at five pairs at each visit five tracks squad system, and score each "kill" as one point. In the event of ties to be shot off squad system, first missout, best of each pair until finality. The management of club conducting Championship shall provide three trophies—1st, 2nd and 3rd. Maximum Entrance fee for Championship \$4, optional sweepstakes, to be divided, first 60 per cent. second 30 per cent. third 10 per cent. of sweep money received, without deduction, are permissible. The management shall clearly indicate on the official score sheets and score board those who have entered for the optional sweep.

#### STATE DEAUVILLE DOUBLES CHAMPIONSHIP

The Championship shall be shot from 22 yards at 20 pairs of doubles. The competitors will stand with four shooters on the ground at one time, the first pair of shooters using tracks one and five for the first round, changing over to tracks two and four for the second round. The second pair of shooters to alternate with first pair. The competitors can arrange between themselves which track they will take and who shall call for the release of the clay targets, which will be released on the call of Pull. In the event of a false call by either competitor they must abide by the result. Only pairs

shall count, and as one point. Either shooter can help his partner after he has broken his clay target. In the event of a misfire by either gun, another clay target or targets will not be given that competitor, and he is required to abide by the result. Each two competitors will shoot at five pairs at each visit. In the event of ties, to be shot off first miss-out from Nos. 2 and 4 tracks. Maximum Entrance fee for Championship \$4 for each competitor, optional sweepstakes, to be divided 60 per cent. first pair, 30 per cent. second pair, 10 per cent. third pair, from money received, without deduction, are permissible. The management shall clearly indicate on the official score sheets each pair that have entered the optional sweep. The management shall provide for trophies - two for 1st and two for 2nd.

## **District Championships**

#### DISTRICT DOUBLE-BARREL CHAMPIONSHIP

The Championship shall be shot at 20 clay targets from 16 yards. Two barrels are permitted and either barrel shall be of equal scoring value and shall score one point. Each competitor to shoot from five tracks squad system at five to ten clay targets at each visit. The management shall provide three trophies — 1st, 2nd and 3rd. Maximum Entrance fee for Championship \$3, optional sweepstakes, to be divided, first 60 per cent., second 30 per cent., third 10 per cent. of sweep money received, without deduction, are permissible. In the event of ties to be shot off squad system, first miss-out. The management shall clearly indicate on the official score sheets and score board those who have entered for the optional sweep.

#### DISTRICT SINGLE-BARREL CHAMPIONSHIP

The Championship shall be shot at 20 clay targets from 16 yards. One barrel only. The competitor shall load one cartridge only in his gun. Each competitor shall shoot from five tracks squad system at five or ten clay targets at each visit. The management shall provide three trophies-1st, 2nd and 3rd. Maximum Entrance

fee for Championship \$3, optional sweepstakes, to be divided first 60 per cent., second 30 per cent., third 10 per cent. of sweep money received, without deduction, are permissible. In the event of ties to be shot off squad system, first miss-out. The management shall clearly indicate on the official score sheets and score board those competitors who have entered for the optional sweep.

#### DISTRICT MIXED TARGETS CHAMPIONSHIP

The Championship shall be shot in the following order at five clay targets from 16 yards, double barrel, either barrel to be of equal scoring value, and score as one point. Five clay targets from 16 yards single barrel, one cartridge only allowed in gun, each kill to count as one point. Five walk-up clay targets, double barrel, competitor to have gun loaded and ready to commence his walk from the 22 yards mark. The competitor advances at an ordinary walking pace — to shuffle or walk slowly is a "no target". The clay target is released between 20 and 15 yards inclusive, and the mark to be unknown to the competitor, being predetermined by an indicator, or dice arrangement, and is determined each target the competitor is to shoot at. Five pairs of double-rise clay targets from 16 yards, each target to score and count as one, making possible total 25 points. In the event of ties to be shot at two double barrel, two single barrel, two walk-up, and two pair double rise, total ten points, from number 3 lane until finality. Maximum Entrance fee for Championship \$3, optional sweepstakes, to be divided, first 60 per cent., second 30 per cent., third 10 per cent. of sweep money received, without deduction, are permissible. The club management to provide three trophies — 1st, 2nd and 3rd. The management shall clearly indicate on the official score sheets and score board those who have entered for the optional sweep.

#### DISTRICT WALK-UP CHAMPIONSHIP

The Championship shall be shot at 20 clay targets, double barrel, either barrel to be of equal scoring value, and count as one point. The competitor shall load his gun on the

22 yard mark. When ready in this position he commences and continues to walk at a normal walking pace. To walk slowly or shuffle constitutes a "no target". The puller will release the target between the 20 and 15 yards mark inclusive, the mark to be unknown to the competitor, being predetermined by an indicator or dice arrangement. The competitor will shoot at five to ten targets at each visit, in the order laid down in Rule 96. Each competitor shoots from centre track. Maximum Entrance fee for Championship \$3, optional sweep-stakes, to be divided, first 60 per cent., second 30 per cent., third 10 per cent. of sweep money received, without deduction, are permissible. The management shall provide three trophies -1st. 2nd and 3rd. In the event of ties, to be shot off in lots of five clay targets until finality. The management shall clearly indicate on the official score sheets and score board those who have entered for the optional sweep.

#### DISTRICT DOUBLE-RISE CHAMPIONSHIP

The Championship shall be shot at 10 pairs of clay targets from 16 yards. Each competitor to shoot five tracks squad system at five pairs at each visit, and score each "kill" as one point. In the event of ties, to be shot off squad system, first miss-out, best of each pair until finality. The management of club conducting Championship shall provide three trophies — 1st, 2nd and 3rd. Maximum Entrance fee for Championship \$3, opt. sweepstakes, to be divided, first 60 per cent., second 30 per cent., third 10 per cent. of sweep money received, without deduction, are permissible. The management shall clearly indicate on the official score sheets and score board those who have entered for the optional sweep.

#### DISTRICT DEAUVILLE DOUBLES CHAMPIONSHIP

The Championship shall be shot from 20 yards at 20 pairs of doubles. The competitors will stand with four shooters on the ground at one time, the first pair of shooters using tracks one and five for the first round, changing over to tracks two and four for the second round. The

second pair of shooters to alternate with first pair. The competitors can arrange between themselves which track they will take and who shall call for the release of the clay targets, which will be re-leased on the call of Pull. In the event of a false call by either competitor they must abide by the result. Only pairs shall count, and as one point. Either shooter can help his partner after he has broken his clay targets. In the event of a misfire by either gun another clay target or targets will not be given that competitor and he is required to abide by the result. Each two competitors will shoot at five pairs at each visit. In the event of ties, to be shot off miss-out from Nos. 2 and 4 tracks. Maximum Entrance fee for Championship \$3 for each competitor, optional sweep-stakes, to be divided, 60 per cent. first pair, 30 per cent. second pair, 10 per cent. third pair from money received, without deduction, are permissible. The management shall clearly indicate on the official score sheets each pair that have entered the optional sweep. The management shall provide four trophies — two for 1st and two for 2nd.

# Tower Championships

#### COMMONWEALTH TOWER CHAMPIONSHIPS

To be shot at 20 clay targets, squad system, as in Rule 94, five feet directly in front of centre of Towerfive to ten clay targets to be shot on each visit to the track. Normal setting of trap, clay targets to be thrown at usual angles. Two barrels permitted, and each barrel to be of equal scoring value, and score one point. Ties to be shot off squad system, first miss-out. Competitors must not turn towards the Tower and must face directly to the front throughout the competition. Maximum Entrance fee for Championship \$5, opt. sweepstakes, to be divided, first 60 per cent., second 30 per cent., third 10 per cent. of sweep money received, without deduction, are permissible. The management shall provide three trophies—1st, 2nd and 3rd. The management shall clearly indicate on the official score sheets and score hoard those who have entered for the optional sweep.

#### STATE TOWER CHAMPIONSHIP

To be shot at 20 clay targets squad system, as in Rule 94, five feet directly in front of centre of tower. five to ten clay targets to be shot on each visit to track. Maximum Entrance fee for Championship \$4, thence same conditions as Commonwealth Championship.

#### DISTRICT TOWER CHAMPIONSHIP

Same conditions as in State Tower Championship. Maximum Entrance fee \$3.

#### INTERMEDIATE DOUBLE-BARREL CHAMPIONSHIP COMMONWEALTH, STATE AND DISTRICT

The Championship shall be shot at 20 clay targets, double-barrel, either barrel to be of equal scoring value, and count as one point. Shooting will take place from 16 yards. Each competitor to shoot from five tracks, squad system. Each competitor to shoot at five to ten clay targets at each visit. The event is restricted to shooters whose Association handicap does not exceed 16 yards on day of competition. The management shall provide three trophies - 1st, 2nd and 3rd. Maximum Entrance fee \$5 Commonwealth, \$4 State, optional sweepstakes, to be divided, first 60 per cent., second 30 per cent., third 10 per cent. of sweep money received, without deduction, are permissible. In the event of ties, to be shot off squad system, first miss-out. The management shall clearly indicate on the official score sheets and score board those, who have entered for the optional sweep. (Intermediate Deauville Doubles

will be shot from 18 vards.)

#### INTERMEDIATE

SINGLE-BARREL CHAMPIONSHIP Same conditions as Commonwealth, State or District above, except where double-barrel is stated, single-barrel should be understood, with the addition that competitor shall load one cartridge only in his gun.

CLAY SPARROW TITLES Same conditions as applicable to clay targets.

NIGHT SHOOTING CONDITIONS Same as foregoing, maximum en-

trance fee \$0.50 extra.

In all walk-up events the position of the gun shall be optional, providing complete safety conditions are observed. A loaded gun shall be deemed to be in a position of safety when it is the shooter's turn to shoot and he faces and points the gun in the general direction of the trap house, having the gun either mounted on the shoulder or in the gun-down position.

#### CARTRIDGES

Standard Shell for Championships. Shells used in all open championships (Commonwealth, State and District) are required to be restricted to 11 oz. of shot, struck measure, or its equiva-lent, No. 6 shot size or lighter. Shells marked by reputable manufacturer as complying with this regulation are approved. Re-loaded cartridges are permitted.

Home-loaded or re-loaded cartridges may be used in all events excepting International Champion-ships and events, National Championships and Interstate matches and events.

#### CHAMPIONSHIP TROPHIES

Championship trophy value (in-clusive of badge or sash) for Commonwealth Championships is fixed by the Association at \$80. Similarly with State Championships the amount fixed for trophies (inclusive of sash or badge) is fixed at \$60. In District and Club Championships the value of trophies is left optional and at the discretion of the club conducting the event.

#### TIES

All tie shoots in Commonwealth, State and District Championships (except walk-up, mixed targets and Deauville Doubles) must be shot off squad system, first miss-out.

#### SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

Conditions for all open skeet championships: Commonwealth, two rounds of 25 targets (= 50); State and District are one round of 25 targets. Maximum nomination in each event \$5, \$4 and \$3 respectively.

Skeet Tie Shoot Rules. - Skeet tie shoots shall be shot squad system, miss-out.

Reloaded or home loaded cartridges are permitted in all events excepting International or National Championships events and Interstate Teams matches.

### A.C.T.A. TRAP HANDICAPPING FORMULA

As from January 1, 1969, the following Handicapping Formula, approved by the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee, is efective.

CASH OR TROPHY VALUE WINS and DIVISIONS (Obtained in ONE (1) Day)

- 12 varder. Immediate movement of 1 yard back on receipt of a win of \$2. or division, or equivalent trophy value. (A 12 yarder once having left the mark mentioned cannot be returned to that mark.)
- 13 varder. 1 vard back on winning \$4 or equivalent trophy value.
- 14 yarder. 1 yard back on winning \$7 or equivalent trophy value.
- 15 yarder. 1 yard back on winning \$10 or equivalent trophy value.
- 16 varder. 1 vard back on winning \$13 or equivalent trophy value.
- 17 varder. 1 vard back on winning \$15 or equivalent trophy value.
- 18 yarder. 1 yard back on winning \$17 or equivalent trophy value.
- 19 varder, 1 vard back on winning \$19 or equivalent trophy value.
- 20 varder. 1 vard back on winning \$20 or equivalent trophy value.
- 21 yarder. 1 yard back on winning \$22 or equivalent trophy value.
- 22 yarder. 1 yard back on winning \$24 or equivalent trophy value.
- 23 varder, 1 vard back on winning \$26 or equivalent trophy value.
- 24 yarder. 1 yard back on winning \$28 or equivalent trophy value.
- 25 yarder. 1 yard back on winning \$30 or equivalent trophy value.
- 26 yarder. 1 yard back on winning \$32 or equivalent trophy value.

The following will apply to all vardages:

A win or division or equivalent trophy value of \$101 to \$300, 2 yards back.

A win or division or equivalent trophy value of \$301 to \$400, 3 yards back.

A win or division or equivalent trophy value of \$401 or more, 4 yards back.

MARCH, 1969

In graded shoots the handicapping will be double the handicapping formula values. (Examples: 12 yarder—1 yard back on winning \$4 or equivalent trophy value; 16 yarder—1 yard back on win-ning \$26 or equivalent trophy value.)

**OPTIONAL SWEEPSTAKE** winnings and High-gun trophies should NOT be included.

Winners of championships or other events gained behind their A.C.T.A. Handicap automatically go back to the mark from which the win or division was obtained.

No shooter can be handicapped on a win or division gained in front of his A.C.T.A. handicap mark.

A shooter, once having attained the mark of 16 yards, on merit, cannot be handicapped in front of that mark again.

#### INWARD MOVEMENT

Shooters who compete and shoot right through four consecutive FULL DAILY PROGRAMMES, and receive no trophy or division of any description, may receive inward movement from Club Secretaries (except in case where the shooter concerned is the Secretary, then the President or Club handicapper). Such recommendations must be accompanied by fullest details on the Official Handicap Return Form. No recommendations of more than one (1) yard on each recommendation, unless the shooter is suffering from some physical disability, will be accepted.

No shooter can come forward more than one yard in any six month period.

Recommendations from individuals or personal requests will not be entertained - by order of the Executive Committee.

#### GENERAL

Club Presidents and Secretaries are instructed that during any shoot, the management must immediately rehandicap each and every shooter who, for any of the reasons prescribed in the A.C.T.A. Handicapping Formula,

qualifies for backward movement off his handicap. Such adjustments are to strictly comply with the Formula. No shooter is to be permitted to compete in another event should he refuse to accept his new mark. Handicap details concerning on-the-spot adjustments are to be forwarded within two days, to the A.C.T.A. official Handicapper for ratification. Should the shooter ignore his latest handicap, irrespective of mark shown in "News", he will be penalised a further yard if he shoots inside his latest handicap.

Only the Club and Association Handicapper have authority to amend shooters' Handicap Cards.

Club managements have the right to re-handicap any obviously under-handicapped shooter immediately, providing the Association is notified within TWO DAYS and the reason given on a Handicap Return Form. If these details are not completed, such handicap movement cannot be ratified. No shooter can come forward more than **ONE** yard in any six month period.

Clubs when registering a shooter for the first time must clearly indicate whether the shooters is a complete novice gun handler, or has had field or other experience, before a 12-yard mark can be approved. Failure to provide this information will result in the shooter being placed on 16 yards.

No handicaps are assessed on Tower, Deauville Doubles, Double-Rise, Walk-Up and Mixed Targets. All other novelty contests to be handicapped in accordance with this Formula.

Club managements are informed that a Handicap Return must accompany every result sheet forwarded to the A.C.T.A. office within SEVEN DAYS of each shoot being held. (Handicap Return Pads are available on application to the A.C.T.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, 3001.)



# A.C.T.A. Skeet Shooting Rules and Regulations

APPLICABLE AS FROM 1st JANUARY, 1969

#### SECTION I

#### FIELD LAYOUT - TARGETS

1. A Skeet field shall consist of eight shooting stations arranged on a segment of a circle of twenty-one (21) yards radius, with a base chord (exactly one hundred twenty (120) feet, nine (9) inches long), drawn six (6) yards from the centre of the circle. The centre of the circle is known as the target-crossing point and is marked by a stake.

Station 1 is located at the left end of the base chord, and Station 7 at the right end when facing the centre while standing on the periphery of the segment. Stations 2 to 6, inclusive, are located on the periphery at points equidistant from each other (the exact distance between Stations 1 and 2, 2 and 3, etc., is twenty-six (26) feet, eight and three-eighths (\$) inches. Station 8 is located at the centre of the base chord.

Shooting Stations 1 to 7, inclusive, are a square area, 3 feet on a side, with two sides parallel to a radius of the circle drawn through the station marker. Shooting Station 8 is a rectangular area 3 feet wide by 6 feet long, with the long sides parallel to the base chord. The location of each shooting station shall be accurately designated by a suitable marker, not easily removable, not more than 30 inches high and so constructed as not to interfere with the free swing of a shooter standing on the shooting station. The marker for Shooting Stations 1 to 7, inclusive, is on the centre of the side nearest the target crossing point. The marker for Shooting Station 8 is on the centre point of the base chord.

A shield should be installed at the target opening of each traphouse so that the trap operator is not visible to the shooter when he is firing at Station 8. This precaution is desirable as a safety factor for the protection of the trap boy from possible injury from direct or ricocheting shot.

As a safety precaution there should be a barrier (wire or rope) located 7 to 10 yards behind the shooting stations 1 to 7, and roughly following the course of the semi-circle on which these stations are located. No spectators should be allowed within this barrier and the referee should be responsible for the enforcement of this rule.

One target should emerge from a traphouse (called High House) at a point three (3) feet beyond Station Marker 1 (measured along the base chord extended), and ten (10) feet above the ground level. The other should emerge from a traphouse (called Low House) at a point three (3) feet beyond the Station Marker 7 (measured along the base chord extended), and two and one-half (21) feet from the base chord extended (measured on side of targetcrossing point), and three and onehalf (32) feet above the ground.

Suitable markers shall be placed at points forty-four (44) yards and fifty-five (55) yards from both the High House and the Low House, to indicate the shooting boundary limit (44 yards). These distances shall be measured along a line and the flight of a regular target (55 yards) from the opening (where target emerges) in traphouse through the targetcrossing point.


#### SECTION II

#### SHOOTING PROCEDURE

1. Definition of Terms.

(a) Shooting Position.

Standing with both feet entirely within the boundary of the shooting station.



#### (b) Gun Position.

Any position which is comfortable or satisfactory to the shooter and is consistent with safety.

(c) No Target.

(i) A No Target shall be called in the event of a mal-function or misfire at the second target when double loading.

(ii) Any target thrown for which no score is recorded, or failure of a target to be thrown within the prescribed time limit of one second. This permits the throwing of "instant" targets, but gives a short time period in order to prevent a contestant from refusing a target which does not appear immediately after his call. If a shooter fires upon a target which appears after one second has elapsed between his call and the emergence of the target, and also before the referee calls, "No Target", the result of his shot shall be scored. If he withholds his shot after such an declare the target, "No Target", pro-vided he, in his sole judgment, decides that the delay exceeded the one second time allowance. The pull is not required to be "instantaneous."

(d) Interference.

Any circumstance beyond the shooter's control which unduly affects his opportunity to break any particular target. The appearance of a target, or a piece of a target, from an adjoining field shall not be ruled as interference, unless such target, or piece of target, strikes or threatens to strike, the shooter or his gun, and provided that such interference occurs after the shooter has called for his target and before he fires upon it.

(e) Regular Target.

A regular target is one that appears after the shooter's call and within a period not to exceed one (1) second, and which passes within three (3) feet, horizontally or vertically, of a point fifteen (15) feet above the target-crossing point. This target, in still air, must carry to a distance equivalent, on level ground, to fifty-five (55) yards from the traphouse, but under no conditions exceed sixty-five (65) yards.

(f) Irregular Target.

(1) An unbroken target that has MARCH, 1969

not conformed to the definition of a regular target.

(2) Two targets thrown simultaneously in singles.

(3) Target thrown broken. Under no circumstances shall the result of firing upon a broken target be scored.

(g) Regular Double.

A regular target thrown from each traphouse simultaneously.

(h) Irregular Double.

Either or both targets of a double thrown as irregular targets. Only one target is thrown.

(i) Proof Double.

A repeat of a double.

(j) Shooting Bounds.

For Stations 1 to 7, inclusive, an area forty-four (44) yards in front of the traphouse from which the target is thrown. For Station 8, the distance from the traphouse to a point directly over a line with Stations 4, 8, and the target-crossing point.

(k) Baulk.

Failure to shoot at a regular target or double.

(1) Malfunction of Gun.

Failure of gun to operate or function through no fault of the shooter.

A gun doubling shall be considered a malfunction for the second shot.

The "fan-firing" of the second shell in doubles, caused by a shooter holding back the trigger after the firing of the first shot, shall be considered as the fault of the shooter and is not an allowable malfunction.

(m) Defective Ammunition.

Failure of ammunition to fire or function due to structural deficiency.

(n) Dead Target.

A target from which a visible piece is broken as a result of having been fired upon and seen by the referee.

(o) Lost Target.

A target from which no visible piece is broken as a result of having been fired upon.

(p) Doubles, First and Second Shot.

The first shot shall be the first shot fired. The second shot shall be the second shot fired.

#### (q) Optional Shot.

The shot fired after the first twenty-four targets have been scored dead in any one round.

(r) Shooting Procedure.

In shooting single Targets, except from No. 8 Station, a competitor may load two cartridges if he so desires, using one cartridge for each target.

#### 2. General.

A normal skeet squad is composed of five shooters. The squad shall start shooting singles at Station 1 in the order in which the names appear on the score sheet, and shall proceed through the singles at stations as numbered, shooting the high-house target first and the low-house target second. Each shooter shall shoot at both targets before leaving the shooting station, except at Station 8, where each shooter shall shoot at a target from high traphouse before any member of the squad shoots at a target from low traphouse.

Doubles shall be fired upon at Stations 1, 2, 6, and 7 in that order, shooting the first shot at the target emerging from the nearest traphouse and the second shot at the target from the farthest traphouse. However, the shooter shall have the option of reversing the order of the first and second shot, in which case the referee must be notified before shooting. If a double is not com-. pleted before any reason beyond the control of the shooter, another double shall be fired upon, and is known as a proof double; except, however, if a shooter fires upon the first target of a regular double and fails to fire upon the second target because of the fault of the shooter, the result of the firing upon the first target shall be scored and the second target shall be scored "lost."

A round of Skeet for one person consists of twenty-five (25) shots, the object being to score the greatest number of dead targets. Twenty-four shots are fired as stated above. The first shot scored lost in any round shall be repeated immediately and the result scored as the twenty-fifth shot. Should the first shot lost occur in a double, the lost target shall be repeated as a single with the result of this shot scored as the twentyfifth shot. If the first shot scored "lost" should be the first target of an irregular double, then a proof regular double shall first be fired upon to determine the result of the second shot, and then the first target scored "lost" shall be repeated as a single and scored as the twenty-fifth shot.

Should the first twenty-four targets of a round be scored "dead," the shooter shall have the choice ("optional") of trap and station for this twenty-fifth shot.

In the interest of conserving time, the shoot management may elect to have shooters fire upon their doubles at Station 1 immediately following the shooting of singles at that post and follow the same procedure at Stations 2, 6 and 7. When this policy is adopted, shooters who have not missed a target after having fired upon doubles at Station 7 shall then take their optional shots at that station (7). The squad will finish out the round by shooting singles in the usual manner at Station 8. Taking the "optional" shot by all "straight" shooters while they are at Station 7 is intended to prevent confusion and cross traffic that would result in taking the twenty-fifth shot after finishing at Station 8. Clubs adopting this speed-up policy, in the interests of uniformity, require all squads to follow the same procedure.

(Singles and doubles to be shot from one visit to the appropriate stations to speed things up.)

At the beginning of each round, when the squad is assembled at Station 1, the squad shall be entitled to observe one (1) regular target from each traphouse and shall have the option of observing one regular target after each irregular target, except where said irregular target was fired upon.

No member of a squad shall advance to the shooting station until it is his turn to shoot, and until the previous shooter has left the shooting station. No shooter shall order any target or shoot at any target except when it is his turn. The penalty for shooting out of turn without permission of the referee shall be to score all targets so fired upon as "lost."

No member of a squad, having shot from one station, shall proceed toward the next station in such a way as to interfere with another snooter. The penalty for wilful interference in this manner shall be disqualification from the event.

No shooter shall unduly delay a squad without good and sufficient reason in the judgment of the referse in charge of his squad. A shooter who persists in deliberately causing mexcusable delays after receiving a first warning from the referee shall be subject to disqualification from the event.

Broken Gun. When a gun breaks in such a manner so as to render it unusable, the shooter has the option of using another gun if such gun can be secured without delay, or dropping out of the squad until the gun is repaired and finishing the event at a later time when a vacancy occurs or after all other contestants have finished the event. Nothing shall prohibit the shooter from missing one round because of a broken gun, having the gun repaired and then rejoining the squad for all later rounds that the squad have not started. In that case the shooter will finish any or all rounds, starting with the shot where the breakdown occurred, that were not shot because of a broken gun, on the proper fields and in the first vacancy that may occur, or after the event has been finished by all other contestants.

Shooting Up. Where a shooter has entered but does not show up to start

an event with his squad, he will not be permitted to shoot up after the first man in the squad has fired the first shot at Station 2. He may join the squad for all later rounds, but the round missed because of lateness must be shot on the proper field in the first vacancy, or after all other contestants have finished.

#### 3. Scoring.

(a) The score in any one round shall be the total number of "dead" targets.

(b) Targets declared "no target" shall not be scored.

(c) One "lost" target shall be scored on:

(1) A baulk or failure of gun to fire due to fault of shooter. Should this include both targets of a regular double, it shall be scored as first target lost, and a proof double shall be thrown to determine the result of the second shot only.

If a baulk should occur, or his gun fail to fire because of the shooter's fault, when a proof double is thrown and the result of the first shot has already been scored, the second target shall be scored as "lost".

(2) Each excessive malfunction or malfunctions of the gun.

(3) Doubles fired upon in reverse order

without notifying referee of intention. (4) Target broken after it is outside the shooting bounds.

(5) Each target fired at when shooter fires out of turn without permission of referee.

(6) Each target fired upon and allegedly missed because the shooter's gun had a bent barrel, or a bent compensator, or

(d) No claim of irregularity shall be allowed, either on singles or doubles, where the target or targets were actually fired upon and the alleged irregularity consists of deviation from the prescribed consists of deviation from the prescribed line of flight, or because of an alleged "quick pull" or "slow pull", unless the referee has distinctly called "no target" prior to the firing of the shot in the event of the "quick pull", or prior to the emergence of the target from the traphouse in the event of a "slow pull". Otherwise, if the shooter fires, the result shall be scored.

#### 4. Repeat of Target for Malfunction of Gun or Defective Ammunition.

Only two malfunctions of any one gun in the same round shall be allowable.

The third and all subsequent malfunctions of the same gun shall be excessive. Provided, however, that when more than one person is using the same gun in the same round, this rule shall apply to each of said persons separately.

A shot shall be repeated for each instance of defective ammunition. If a shell having once misfired is used again, and fails to fire, the result shall be considered a fault on the part of the shooter and scored "lost".

#### 5. Double or Proof Double.

(a) (1) If the first target of a double is thrown irregular as deviation from the prescribed line of flight and is NOT shot at, a proof double shall determine the score for both shots whether the second target is fired upon or not. The score for both shots, whether the referee shall be the sole judge of irregularity.

(2) If the first target emerges broken, the double shall, in all cases, be declared "no target" and a proof double shall be thrown to determine the result of both shots.

(3) If the shooter fires at the irregular target described in (1) above, then the result shall be scored for the first shot and the following rules pertaining to the second shall apply:

(b) In shooting doubles, if the shooter is deprived of a normal second shot because (1) the second target is thrown broken, or (2) the second target is thrown irregular as to deviation from the prescribed line of flight and is not shot at, or (3) the second target is not thrown at all, or (4) the second target is not thrown simultaneously, the result of the first shot shall be scored, and the second target only shall be declared "no target" and a proof double shall be fired to determine the result of the second shot. If the shooter fires at the irregular target described in

(2) above the result shall be scored.

(c) If a double is thrown but the targets collide, before the result of the first target is determined, it shall be declared "no target", and the result of a proof double shall determine the score of both shots.

(d) If a double be thrown but the shooter is deprived of a normal second shot for any of the following reasons, the result of the first shot shall be scored, and the second target

only shall be declared "no target", and a proof double shall be fired to determine the result of the second shot only.

(1) Both targets are broken with the first shot.

(2) The wrong target is broken with first shot. (For proof double ruling, see par. F. below.)

(3) The first shot is lost and a collision occurs before the result of the second shot is determined.

(4) The second target collides with fragments of the first target, properly broken, before the result of the second target is determined.

(5) The result of the first shot is determined, and interference occurs before the second shot is fired.

(6) An allowable malfunction occurs on the second shot. If such malfunction is excessive, not allowable, the second target shall be scored "lost."

(e) If a double is thrown and an allowable malfunction occurs on the first shot, it shall be declared "no target", and the result of a proof double shall determine the score of both shots. If such malfunction is excessive, not allowable, the proof double shall be thrown to determine the result of the second shot only.

(f) There shall be no penalty for withholding the first shot when either target of a double is irregular. A proof double shall determine the score of both shots thereafter.

(g) In shooting a proof double after the first target (of a double) is "lost," if the shooter fires at, or breaks the wrong target first, said proof double shall be declared "no target"; but, if this same procedure is repeated at the same station by the same shooter, it shall be scored as both targets "lost." If, in such a proof double and the first target (of a double) is "dead," the shooter fires at, or breaks, the wrong target first, said proof double shall also be declared "no target"; but if the same procedure is repeated at the same station by the same shooter, it shall be scored as first target "dead", and the second target "lost."

SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS. Conditions for all open skeet championships: Commonwealth, two rounds of 25 targets (= 50); State and District are one round of 25 targets. Maximum nomination in each event \$5, \$4. and \$3 respectively.

Skeet Shooting is single - barrel shooting and all consequent handicapping is defined as a method whereby each competitor has an equal chance of reaching the possible with his allotted handicap.

A skeet shooter with no past performance or handicap rating shoots for targets to acquire a handicap. He shoots at 25 targets which comprise a round of skeet.

On his first performance he shoots with no handicap at 25 targets and, say, breaks 18 targets - this 18 is now his basis for handicapping until further scores are available. To ensure that he improves. THE KEY FIGURE OF 24 TARGETS (not the possible 25) is noted and the handicap allotted is the difference between this figure (24) and his average of 18 (i.e. 24 less 18 = 6). Thus handicap rating is now 6 whilst he is shooting the next event.

After he shoots his second skeet round both his first performance (18 targets) and his second performance (say he breaks 20 of 25 targets) are added together (18 + 20 = 38, resulting in an average of 19 targets). The difference between this average of 19 and the KEY FIGURE OF 24 TARGETS gives his handicap for his next round of skeet as being 5.

After the third round of skeet an average is taken of the three performances of the shooter as described above and a handicap is awarded accordingly. The difference between this average and the KEY FIGURE OF 24 is now his handicap.

After four rounds of skeet have been shot (e.g. 18, 20, 17, 22), even if over a several-year period, during which the club keeps such records, discard the lowest of these four rounds (e.g. 17) and average the remaining 3 rounds to the nearest number of targets

(e.g. 
$$\frac{18+20+22}{3}=20$$
)

This average of 20, subtracted from the key figure of 24, produces the handicap of 4 targets for the next round of skeet.

After the fifth round of skeet, where, say, 19 of 25 targets are scored, the NORMAL SKEET HAN-DICAPPING FORMULA is now applicable, which is:--

Take the last four (4) rounds, each of 25 targets, and discard the lowest score. The remaining three (3) scores are averaged. Thus from the above example, scores were 18, 20, 17, 22, 19, from which the initial figure of 18 is eliminated and the lowest score (17) of the remaining four scores is discarded, leaving 20 + 22 + 19 = 61, of which the average is 20<sup>‡</sup>. The nearest whole figure of 20 is the accepted average. Take this average of 20 from the KEY FIGURE of 24 to arrive at the handicap of 4 targets.

THIS IS THE PROCEDURE FOR ARRIVING AT THE HANDICAP OF A SKEET SHOOTER AND SUCH CALCULATED RESULTS MUST APPEAR ON THE CLUB HANDICAP RETURNS AS LODGED WITH THE A.C.T.A.

Once a shooter attains an average of 24 targets, from these calculations, then his handicap becomes NIL. In Skeet Championship events, kills only are counted.

In Skeet Handicap events, kills and handicap targets (figures from the above formula) are added together to arrive at the total score. A Skeet possible can only be 25 targets.

#### NOTES:

- 1. Maximum skeet handicap is to be 10.
- 2. Once a shooter attains a skeet handicap of 3 or less, he cannot be handicapped forward of 3 unless there are unusual reasons.
- 3. Where no previous skeet handicap rating exists, clubs should handicap as follows:—

4. A Skeet handicap applies to every skeet round contested except in Skeet Championship shooting.

#### **Skeet Sweepstakes:**

The normal method in a Skeet Handicap is to divide the sweepstakes amongst those shooters attaining twenty-five killed (broken) targets, with handicaps included.

(example) Smith 25/25, Handicap 3, total = 25/25. Jones 22/25, Handicap 3, total = 25/25. Brown 19/25, Handicap 7,

total = 25/25.

The same method is used on the very few occasions a half-round is shot.

Skeet Shoot-offs (Handicaps):

Where several competitors attain a possible with or without handicap and a shoot-off becomes necessary, the method of finding the winner is as follows:—

#### (a) Club Competition —

Put the finalists in squads in the order they qualify.

Halve their initial handicaps (some clubs reduce to a quarter handicap here). Shoot a half-round of twelve targets. Add the half-handicaps to scores off the gun. Those with a total of twelve or more targets qualify for a further halfround and so on till the event is finalized. Where there are no shooters with a nil handicap in the shoot-off, a quicker method is as follows:— After halving the handicaps take the lowest handicapped shooter(s), put him back to nil and deduct the number of targets (taken away) from each of the others.



This leaves the competition quite fair, but usually shortens the time required to reach finality.

#### (b) Open Competition --

Shot first miss-out. Each shooter is allowed his allotted handicap and shoots at rounds of 25 targets until his allowed number of targets is used. Thus, a shooter on a nil handicap drops out after his first miss; a shooter with two targets drops out when his third miss is recorded, and so on to finality — unless a scratch marker is in the group, then reduce each shooter's handicap by the amount of the lowest marker in the group.

A half-round comprises twelve targets: Stations number 1 to 7 = one alternative target from each, starting with the high house; station number 8 = one target from the high house; double targets from stations 2 and 6 = TOTAL twelve targets.


