



The Editor's Notebook



The 1970 Australian National Trapshooting Championships shall be conducted over the five successive days, February 28 to March 4, at the Perth Gun Club, Koojan Avenue, South Guildford, approximately seven miles from Perth along the Great Eastern Highway of Western Australia. All shooters and friends who make this trip to Perth will find new and renew old acquaintances in this land of the sand groper. Every facility possible is available in this modern clean city and its environs cater for all tastes of outdoor living. The grounds of the Perth Gun Club have been brought to a peak and shooters are expected from near and far, including overseas. As is always the case when known conventions or meetings take place, accommodation and travel arrangements cannot always satisfy unless bookings are made well in advance. For those who travel by car, the road is reported to be completely satisfactory.

A most competitive all-inclusive bus is available. Melbourne — Perth — Melbourne (see May News). Travel Agents James Patrick (see advertisements), can cater for all needs of road, rail, sea, air and accommodation as required in Perth or en route and if sufficient apply, they could provide a return air excursion for \$149.20 from Melbourne (other States by arrangement). Don't delay! Send your enquiry and book your trip now.

For those considering New Zealand in 1970, the N.Z.G.C.A. National Trapshooting Championships shall be conducted at Christchurch (in the South Island) at the Christchurch Gun Club grounds from April 5 to April 11 inclusive and the Australia/New Zealand Teams' Matches will be included in this series.

Skeet shooting varies from Trapshooting and does not draw the quantity of

shooters, however, for those interested in (a)—skeet championship shooting, scores are off the gun; (b)—in skeet handicap shooting, scores are off the card handicap.

Reports have been received of a number of clubs, in their endeavours to establish speedy growth rates, are retaining their permissible percentages of shooter nominations but are issuing very meagre trophies. The clubs concerned will ultimately find their own levels.

* * * *

The 1969 New Zealand Trapshooting Championships were conducted at Hamilton Gun Club, an "A" rating ground, in the North Island of New Zealand over the period March 24 to March 29.

A light drizzle set in during the first morning but the sky soon cleared allowing most of the matches to be shot in bright sunshine and near perfect conditions.

Australian shotgunners present were J. Newton Thomas (Melbourne), M. J. Fuller (Sydney), J. R. Bushby (Narrandera, N.S.W.), F. R. Hudson (Sydney), R. Peacock Kerang, (Vic.), G. Smith (Ascot Vale, Vic.), F. Apted (Glenroy, Vic.), E. Hawkins with his 10-year old shooter son Wade (Sydney), S. Simmonds (Sydney), R. G. Clarke (Sydney) and H. McDiarmid (Portland, N.S.W.).

On Monday March 24 the programme commenced with the New Zealand Skeet Championship. This was won by J. McKenzie, one of New Zealand's leading trapshooters who has now won five such skeet titles over the years 1957, 1959, 1961, 1963 and 1969, all at the Hamilton Gun Club's grounds. From 14 entries in this 50 target event J. McKenzie and R. W. S. Cavanagh both shot 50/50, McKenzie won the shoot off round with

24 against 23. C. F. Gunn and C. W. Hartley both shot 49/50. A two-men Skeet Teams' Championship of 100 targets attracted 24 entries—B. R. Dobbie and J. McKenzie shot 93; R. W. Gunn and C. F. Gunn shot 92; W. F. Hamill and R. O. Hughes shot 90. A five-men Skeet Teams' Championship of 250 targets attracted 10 entries and was won by J. McKenzie, J. Sutherland, A. Brown, J. L. Gorton, B. R. Dobbie with 234 from J. R. Thomson, W. E. Hamill, R. O. Hughes, J. A. Chilcott, R. Sloane whose score was 231.

On Tuesday March 25 the New Zealand Clay Sparrow Championship over 25 targets attracted 198 entries. R. W. Gunn and H. T. Fyers both shot 25/25 then Gunn won the three target shoot off. Some ten shooters shot 24/25 for third placing and these included J. Newton Thomas of Melbourne (Aust.), also in this event was Ian Ballinger of Christchurch N.Z., winner of the bronze medal in rifle shooting at the 1968 Mexico Olympic Games. Ballinger shot 23/25 in the N.Z. Clay Sparrow Championship.

The 1969 New Zealand Double Rise Championship (15 pairs = 30 targets) followed with 176 entries and was won outright by L. V. Evans with 29/30, then from a shoot-off amongst the 28/30 scorers J. Sutherland gained second place. There were nine scores of 27/30 and ten with 26/30.

A 15 target single-barrel match followed with eighteen shooters scoring 15/15 including M. Fuller of Sydney.

After the success of the South Island shooters on the Monday, the North Island shotgunners were prominent on this Tuesday.

On Wednesday, March 26 the New Zealand Single-barrel Championship of 50 targets, 177 entries, was won, after a seven target shoot off, by C. Hartley from fellow 50/50 scorer C. F. Gunn. This was Hartley's fourth New Zealand title—he had won the double rise in 1963 and 1967 and the single rise in 1962—also he was the New Zealand High Gun scorer in the New Zealand section of the International Teams' Match in the years 1955, 1956, 1957 and 1962. (NOTE: C. Hartley was overall high gun scorer at the Australian National Championships in Sydney in 1966). Seven scored 49/50 in this National single-barrel event.

On Thursday, March 27 from a record of 286 entries, R. W. Gunn won the New Zealand Single Rise Clay Target Championship. Gunn along with nine others, including Harry McDiarmid and F. Apted of Australia, shot the possible 50/50 and after such a set of scores, the spectators were all set for a long shoot off, but, at the 10th target Gunn emerged the winner from R. O. Hughes, second and R. J. McGregor, third. The Single Rise Championship concluded the matches for the Champion of Champions and this title went to C. Hartley winner of the single-barrel event and consistent high scorer in the other events.

The series was then concluded with the Australia-New Zealand Six-men Trap Teams' Match for the Glenn Cup. This was won by New Zealand 116 to Australia 114 and the individual scores were:—

The New Zealand Champion of Champions over the series was Charles Hartley but as he had won a presentation Browning shotgun in Australia in 1966, he became ineligible and the next highest scorers were R. W. Gunn (N.Z.)

and J. Newton Thomas (Australia). Newton Thomas had also received a Browning shotgun some years ago from the makers Fabrique Nationale of Belgium and conceded the magnificent trophy to N.Z. shooter R. W. Gunn. His action has been recorded with appreciation in New Zealand.

The New Zealand section of the 23rd International Teams' Match was also part of the programme but all scores have been sealed and forwarded to England to be opened on July 18 at Edinburgh, Scotland. The N.Z.G.C.A. team members were selected from the results of the Single Rise Championship and two 25 target points scoring events

conducted from the 16 yard mark. Of the final 30 members of the team, the top 25 scores only are to count in this 100 target International event with three points for a 1st barrel kill and two points for a second barrel kill.



Rex Peacock of Kerang, Victoria, when at the N.Z.G.C.A. National Championships in March 1969, states he "did not establish a record there but did shoot 70 straight on the last day." He then "—hooked a big blue marlin which gave a half hour fight before it broke the 130 pound breaking-strain line. The fish was estimated when seen

at the surface as probably a 500-pounder". Rex then "shot a 12 point Red Stag. It weighed 319 lbs. and sold for \$86.00 or 27 cents per pound. They export venison to Germany. Beef is worth 19.5 cents per pound to the grower so there is better money raising deer. Several deer farms have already been established."

At the 1968 Olympic Games in Mexico, 43 year old Lancashire (England) Veterinary Surgeon Bob Braithwaite equalled the Olympic record and won the first shooting gold medal for a British competitor for 60 years when he scored 198 points out of 200 in the Olympic Trap Event.

Navy shot consistently to become the

winners with 86/90 in this 15 target points scoring event. R.A.A.F. and Army tied with 81/90 each. High Gun scorer was Corporal R. Watt (R.A.A.F.), 29/29, to the delight of all present as he was runner up in 1968.

Commencing from a picnic shoot at Laverton (Vic.) early in 1935, it was arranged that this be an annual competition between officers of the three services for an I.C.I. donated shield.

For some reason, shoots were not held during the years 1938 and 1939 and World War II disrupted the continuity from 1939 to 1945. In 1947 the match continued as a competition between officers until 1957 when with the approval of I.C.I. the shield was made available to competition between all ranks.


As seen in the following score listing, the competition has been won by R.A.A.F. 13 times, Army 7 times and Navy 6 times.

The match is conducted in squads of three shooters consisting of one R.A.A.F., one Army and one Navy and provides an interesting progressive event for the team members and for the spectators.



Good shooting lies in looking

One of America's top skeet shooters, R. Rodale, said in an article which appeared in the *Skeet Shooting Review*, that the key to good skeet shooting lay in emphasis placed in looking at the target.

He summed up the technique by looking at the target as if he were trying to read the label on the top of it.

"After plugging along at trap for a whole year in that fashion, I suddenly realised that I wasn't looking clearly at the traphouse and consequently the target came out a blur, stayed blurry looking while I shot at it, and landed in one piece still blurred.

"What I was doing was looking at the rib, focussing my eyes at the near distance when I should have focused them at 16 yards. A most basic principal of shot gun shooting is that you focus your eyes clearly on the target, and allow the rib to look like a blur—not vice versa.

"If you are focussing on the rib, there is no quick way to recover and get your eyes instantly on the target. To prove that, try this experiment. Hold your hand in front of you, about 6 inches from your eyes. Now look out the window at the horizon, and focus your eyes there. Look down at your hand and notice that you can instantly focus from the horizon to your hand.

"Try to reverse the procedure and notice that it takes about a second to make the focus transition the other way, from your hand to the horizon. So you can see that if you are focused in close,

that target will travel quite a ways before you can get it clearly in view, and chances are you will pull the trigger before you get a clear look at it.

"Successful skeet shooters know that they can't always be sure of the exact angle or position of the target, so take pains to look at it carefully. But many haven't learned the lesson. They go through the motions of shooting in the right way, their form is good, and the lead looks right to them. But they miss targets once in a while, probably because they haven't focused their eyes at the distance at which the target is flying. That is what I call 'sloppy looking'. If you can correct that habit, I think you will add significantly to your average.

"I go through the procedure of looking down at the centre stake, in the middle of the field, then looking out into the sky and calling for the target. But occasionally I lose my focus while calling for the target, and then am in trouble. There is always the temptation to glance at the rib, especially on high 1.

"The benefits of careful looking at targets aren't necessarily limited to a shooter's optical performance.

"Many skeet shooters go through a set of motions during each round which are, in effect, concentration procedures. Perhaps they do it without even realising it, although many are conscious that careful, repetitive actions can produce a sense of confidence and concentration."

CLAY TARGET RECORDS

ENGLAND

The record number of clay targets shot in an hour is 1,308 by Joseph Nother (formerly Wheater) (born 1918), of Kingston-upon-Hull, Yorkshire, at Bedford on 21 September, 1957, using 5 guns and 7 loaders he shot 1,000 in 42 minutes, 22.5 seconds. (Ref. — Guinness book of records — 1968 edition).

U.S.A.

Austin Dorr of New Jersey ran 730 straight in one day during a 1,000-bird marathon in September, 1968. He ended with 995 x 1,000. (Ref. — Trap and Field U.S.A.)

Adolph P. Topperwein, son of a Texan frontier gunsmith was born in 1869, at Boerne, Texas, U.S.A. and retired at the age of 82 in 1967, at San Antonio, Texas.

Before he was ten he was a marksman with a crossbow, a 14 gauge shotgun and a .22 calibre rifle. His greatest feat was performed with a .22 calibre semi-automatic Winchester rifle, Model 03 at the San Antonio Fair Grounds in 1906. In twelve days of shooting he broke 72,491 out of 72,500 aerial targets, beating the greatest previous record of 60,000 out of 60,650 targets made by Dr. W. F. Carver, marksman of Buffalo Bill's

Wild West Show. No one has attempted to try for Topperwein's record, which will probably stand for all time.

Topperwein then became chief exhibition shooter for Winchester-Western. Under her husband's tutelage, Mrs. Topperwein became the greatest woman trapshooter of her time and her greatest feat, yet to be equalled by either man or woman, consisted of breaking 1,952 out of 2,000 clay targets in 3 hours and 15 minutes of actual shooting time. (Note: These were not normal trapshooting conditions).

Dan Pautler (Jnr.), a high school junior from Alden, N.Y. captured the 66th Grand American Handicap in 1965, in his second year of shooting. He missed his 87th target in a near perfect round when he shattered 99 of 100 targets from 20 yards to outshoot a record field of 3,031 marksmen.

This was the third time that a junior had won this event. Rufus King of Wichita Falls, Texas won the Grand in 1930 and Nick Egan of New York City won in 1954.

OUT OF THE PAST

30 YEARS AGO

1. W. R. Bloomfield of Sandringham gained his most important success when he won the Southern Hemisphere Double-Barrel Championship at the old Nobel's Ground at West Footscray, Victoria. Bloomfield won after a double tie with the then Seymour shooter Pat Reid and aggregated 31/33.

2. The Cunnamulla Club in Queensland held its first "championship" meeting late in 1938.

3. Bill Rainbird of Launceston (who is still an active shooter and also a present member of the Executive Committee of the A.C.T.A.,) outwitted a smart field of class trapshots when he won the Seymour District Championship after a rush trip across Bass Strait.

4. One of the most spectacular items about this period in 1938 was the presentation by the late Mr. Donald Mackintosh of the International Trophy for perpetual competition. The comments of the day were, "It is anticipated that the proposed International series will be a complete success". (How correct has been this anticipation!).

5. Late in 1938 Fred Burns, who now is well on the way to his second 100 in championships at all types of targets is reported as having won his "8th title at clays". (A lot of water has gone by since those days).

6. Big holiday shoots were conducted round about this period a couple of

decades ago — Many clay pigeon shooters were entertained by the Barellan Club in the Southern Riverina area of N.S.W. The Barellan Club (also of the 1st interstate clubs affiliated with the Association), conducted the N.S.W. Premier title Double-Barrel. Success went to what was then described in the following sentence, "Success on the inaugural occasion went to the Victorian Scot, J. M. Wilson, well known among sporting identities as 'Jock'". (Afterwards Association President for a number of years).

20 YEARS AGO

1. Bill Finnegan of Gardenvale, Victoria, won the Duke of Gloucester Cup at an Australian Club fixture late in 1948. This Cup was purchased by a group of Melbourne sportsmen, headed by the late Mr. Donald Mackintosh, to commemorate the occasion of the visit to Australia of Prince Henry, Duke of Gloucester.

2. Wangaratta Club (Vic.) staged its first open championship under Association conditions won by Keith Veall.

3. The Yarram Club in eastern Gippsland held its opening shooting after reforming following the war years.

4. Hay (N.S.W.) held its official open-

ing on the local showgrounds, when the N.S.W. Double-Rise Championship was won by the only Melbourne competitor, W. R. Johns. Of interest is the fact that the present President of the A.C.T.A. John Houston, was secretary of the Hay Club at this period.

5. At Peak Hill (N.S.W.), the Western Districts of N.S.W. Double-Rise Championship was won by W. (Bill) J. McPhee, then of Dubbo, but now a senior police official at Taree (N.S.W.). McPhee won outright with a moderate score of 7/12 pair. The Townsville Club (Qld.) reported great difficulty in obtaining supplies of clay targets. J. E. Melville figured prominently during a shoot there in February, 1949.

Excellent day other than the 110.7 heat wave — Guns ran hot, so did shooters, etc. The large attendance was really excellent for such a day and many shooters did not attend owing to the terrific heat, but on the whole the shooting was really 1st class, and we are looking forward to 60 shooters at our duck-opening shoot. This should get all the boy's eye in for those fast-flying darkies. (Len J. Robinson, Hon. Sec.)

Australian National Trapshooting Championships

Annually since 1966 a Browning under-and-over shotgun has been presented to the highest gun scorer over the main events viz. Champion of Champions, Double-Barrel, Double-Rise, Single-Barrel, Australia/New Zealand and the Grand Australian, with the provision that each shooter can gain this award only once. If a shoot-off is necessary to determine the High Gun Winner, then the shoot-off shall be shot under handicap conditions. The Association is very grateful to the makers of these fine trophies, Messrs. Fabrique Nationale of Belgium and to their agents, Messrs. Gollin & Co. of Sydney.

A similar shotgun is presented annually at the National Trapshooting Championships conducted by the New Zealand Gun Clubs' Association and by common agreement, each shooter can gain this award only once.






