

Applications for open championships to be contested during 1970 (that is Commonwealth, State and District Titles) are required to be lodged, under Rule 27, in writing on the prescribed championship form, not later than Friday, August 29, 1969. Such applications shall be collated and submitted

to the Executive Committee for consideration and allocation.

Member clubs are requested to measure their applications and to apply only for championships which can be satisfactorily conducted between January 1 and December 31, 1970.

N. R. A. Modified Clay Pigeon Installation and programme adopted by LS.U.

During the International Shooting Union meetings at Mexico City in 1968, the National Rifle Association of America modified clay pigeon installation and programme was adopted for optional use in regional, continental and

other games of that level. However, the 15-trap installation and programme was retained for Olympics and world championships.

Now titled "I.S.U. Automatic Trap", the N.R.A. Modified Clay Pigeon Trap will be used in the 1971 Pan American Games and the 1970 Asian Games. It is the same pit over which Olympic Silver Medallist Tom Garrigus and his Olympic team-mate Larry Stafford trained in Santa Fe.

2—"modified clay pigeon installation" is that in use within British Commonwealth and United States of America, i.e. one electric oscillating trap per set of five tracks which are cheaper to instal and cheaper to operate.)

Please allow me space in the "News" to say:-

MY IMPRESSIONS OF SHOOTING IN WESTERN AUSTRALIA

In some parts of the Eastern States it would appear that there is a falling-off in clay target shooting, due to several factors. It is indeed pleasing to know that this is not general, and one doesn't have to be endowed with an abundance of observance to realise that in Western Australia they have accepted this as a challenge and are really "on the ball". I feel they are honestly endeavouring to build the sport to higher levels and consolidating as they build.

Facts as outlined below must surely emphasise to any visitor that the West Australian boys are determined to make W.A. the foremost Clay Target Shooting State — if they haven't already achieved that status.

- 1. Their public relations outlook is outstanding—not haphazard or casual—but positive; right down the line from their popular Exec. Com. member, Mr. N. Wells, and that energetic, enthusiastic Perth Club President, Jules Steiner, to each and every official and member.
- 2. Their traps (all "white flyers"), insulated trap houses, designed as portable units, that can be removed to another site at a moment's notice, lavish concrete walks, removable safety fences and barriers.
- 3. Good club house, office, kitchen, score boards, adorning membership and honour boards, so well kept and nicely presented.
- 4. Correctly laid-out shooting areas.
- 5. Excellent well-grassed, clean, tidy, parking area.
- 6. First-class tower, with automatic electric trap permanently installed.
- 7. Efficient and rigidly controlled safety requirements and precautions.

- 8. Secretarial and office duties so well organised.
- 9. Excellent lighting for night shooting.
- 10. Full marks to the refereeing and scoring, giving the immediate impression of "firm but fair" approach to all competitors.
- 11. Never before in any part of the world have I seen the allotted Referee's names written into the squads on the score board. I give extra marks to this detail.
 - 12. Boundary Referees for skeet.
- 13. The Scorer repeating the call of the Referee before recording it on the score sheet.
- 14. Perfect background for Trap and Skeet shooting.
- 15. 100% regulation targets.

Yes! I was quite impressed, and only by going out of my way could I think of any minor criticism—not even worth recording.

Don't let anyone have the slightest qualms about these Western Aussies conducting the National Series Shoot in Feb.-March, 1970. They just might show us Easterners a few points, at that.

Skeet is receiving particular attention and it's good to see these nice people carrying out an education policy convincing shooters that they should nominate for the whole programme of mixed events, such as Tower, Skeet and Trap on the one day, and forget about the divisions and cliques that can easily develop amongst shooters who become dedicated to a particular branch of shooting.

I agree that we should all be big enough to have fun at Scattergun shooting and shoot to the limit of our stamina and budget, and overcome the hurt to our ego when our scores are not to our personal satisfaction, in any particular type of shotgunning.

My appreciation to you "Sand-Gropers" for a practical lesson in hospitality, and for being privileged to observe your excellent sportsmanship.

It has recently been my good fortune to have been the guest of Fred Rimmer of Kar Kar Island at the Territory of Papua and New Guinea Championship Shoot on 17th and 18th May.

Kar Kar is an island paradise 40 miles from Madang and is reached by chartered flight to Kinim Airstrip, on which the Gun Club is situated. The weather for most of the year is hot and the hospitality is very warm indeed.

There is a licensed club on the Island, and a social evening was held on the Saturday night, giving visiting shooters a chance to meet the locals.

Principal products of the Island are Copra and Cocoa, and incidentally some pretty good clay target shooters. I am quite sure that the locals expected another Newton Thomas or Don Scowcroft when they heard that I.C.I. were sending me to their shoot, but right from the first event they realised that my shooting ability was just ordinary.

Almost all events were won by Fred Rimmer, who was hard pressed on most occasions by Roger Middleton, Bill Lloyd, John Middleton (Kar Kar), Norm Camps, Jim Rankin (Mount Hagen), Charles Harrison and John Young (Madang). The Territory D.B. Championship and the Madang District double and single barrel were all won by Fred, who is now a 25 yarder. However, the shoot report will disclose the results.

Apparently a motel is to be built on the island, and I can sincerely recommend a visit to any future shoot held by any of the Gun Clubs in the Territory.



What it costs to pull the trigger

When a sportsman buys cartridges at 15/- per 100 he is paying just over 13d. for each. Even when he pays as much as 19/6 a hundred he is still getting a cartridge — and the very best one — for less than 2½d.

It is not realised that in the making of a shotgun cartridge there are well over a hundred operations; moreover, the components (illustrated opposite) have each been most carefully tested and examined before being put on the machines.

"Penny wise and pound foolish" is not the spirit in which to order cartridges. While the cheaper Nobel brands are a marvel of value at the price, the more expensive ones are naturally a better investment.

A good motor car is, admittedly, deserving of good tyres and good spirit; a good gun, surely, is equally deserving of a good cartridge?

30 YEARS AGO

In the early autumn of 1939 the first Commonwealth Double - barrel Championship ever held in Tasmania was conducted at the old King's Meadows shooting grounds of the Tasmanian Gun Club at Launceston. Don shot 324 to beat the record by three, then Newton shattered Don's new record with 454 straight.

SHOOTING DUCK

I was interested to see in an American publication the very sensible suggestion that a modified choke should be a great help to the duck shooter, as it would enable him the better to connect with his quarry at the sort of ranges at which he might accurately shoot. The author was pointing out the error committed by many duck shooters, of imagining that duck could be killed 60 or 70 yards. He quoted 35 yards as being the kind of distance at which accurate shooting may be made by the shooter of just ordinary skill and at which modified choking, by allowing a little more latitude, gives a better chance.

It is not that 35 yards in any way sets a limit. Of course, it does nothing of the kind. Guns and shooters can kill duck much farther out than this. The point is that a lot of chances are, one way and another, presented at about this range, just as in game shooting a lot are presented at about 25 yds. Moreover, many more shooters are at home at this range than at 55 yards.

So it is a good idea to think in terms of 35 yards and to have a degree of choking in the gun which, while giving amply dense patterns, does allow more margin for error than a full choke.

When deciding the degree of choke in a gun it is necessary for the shooter to consider a number of matters, and probably the most vital of these is his own particular skill as a gun pointer. It is seldom that a man can make best use of a full choke. It is also seldom that conditions are such that nothing less than a full choke is capable of doing the job. There is a great deal that can be said for a modified choke, and in skilled hands a gun having both barrels bored modified is a tremendous game killer.

The worst thing about history is that every time it repeats itself, the price goes up.




