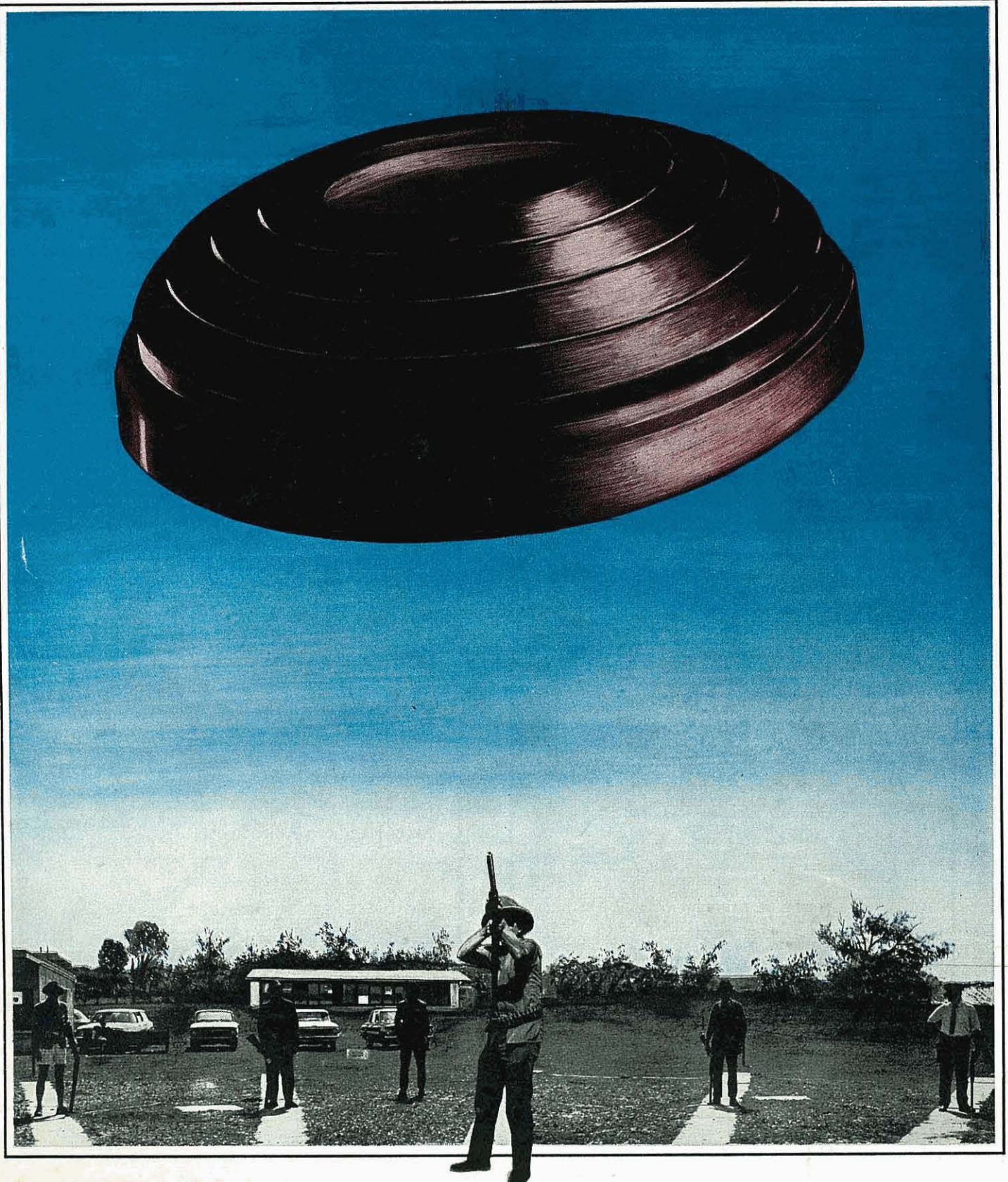

# Editor's Notes



We are now in Perth, Western Australia, for the 1970 Australian National Clay Target Championships.

The series is being conducted over the six successive days of February 28, through to March 5 at the Perth Gun Club and a Stop Press announcement should appear in the April publication of "Clay Target Shooting News." This announcement shall show the placegetters within the respective National events. A complete list showing the results of the six-day programme shall appear in the May publication.

At the 1970 National's, number one shooter of each squad may observe a target at his first visit and any subsequent visit to any layout.

However, in the International Teams' Match, the rules accepted by all contesting countries, up to and including year 1970, contain the provision that such team members "are permitted up to five practice targets before the competition."

As advised in February, the April 1970 publication shall be late in appearing because of the dates of the 1970 National Championships in Perth and also because of the normal Easter shutdown of printers and general business.

The 1970 shooter registrations have been arriving steadily since our first request and all such 1970 handicap cards have been processed and despatched by almost return mail to the Club Secretaries.

### Northern Territory:

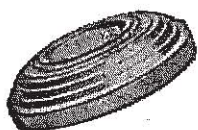
Alice Springs — State SB DB DR (Standard Targets).

The respective rosters for Commonwealth Clay Target Championships (published on page 40) were approved at the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee in October 1969.

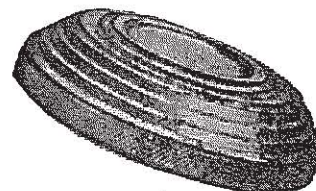
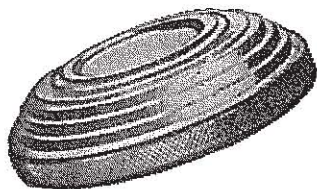
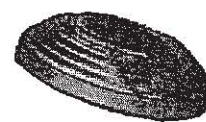

**The 1969 Winchester Claybird Tournament in the United States of America** was the fourth such event to be held.

The venue was the Grand Bahama Skeet and Trap Club, West End, Grand Bahama Islands, Bahamas and over October 29/30 the West team scored 1830.6 on 2000 targets to edge the second place Midwest team by a score of 4.5.

The team members each won trophies similar to those in the 1969 Australian Winchester Tournament.

Lashed by a cold front that brought winds up to 46 m.p.h. during shooting and a deluge of rain that defied measuring instruments, the Bahaman Island paradise became the scene of one of the greatest endurance contests ever engaged in, in either trap or skeet.

Low house targets flew higher than high house ones, unbroken skeet targets soared to adjoining fields, 50 yard trap targets appeared to go 50 yards straight up at times, guns were whipped away from faces and shooters fought to stay on their posts throughout the competition. **(And if you didn't shoot at least three feet to the right of screaming left angle, you were in trouble).**

Shooting was held up for an hour on the second day. (Acknowledgments to "Trap and Field," USA).

Editor's Note: Sounds very similar to the 1967 Australian National Championship programme at Southport, Queensland in June, 1967, when although weather bureau statistics and all publicity literature said "Come to the Gold Coast in June," we had cyclonic winds and inches and inches of rain. But despite the rain and bogging of cars we shot on, Australian's and New Zealander's alike, to establish some record Australian scores whilst shoot marshal Harry Cox padded about (minus shoes and sox) ankle deep in mud. Shooters are the same, the world over.

# OUT OF THE PAST

## THIRTY YEARS AGO

The Commonwealth Mixed Targets Championship of 1940 was originally listed for decision on the Camberwell Club's grounds at North Balwyn on March 2, 1940. However, it was found that the date practically coincided with the Victorian Duck Season opening, so the Club sought Association permission to defer the event. The Association agreed and a new date, June 22, was arranged.

It was also mentioned that "due to the war" there would be no International Match in 1940.

Jack Bryant Snr. of Blackburn, whose name appears regularly about this period, was apparently at the zenith of his form. It is noted that he "successfully defended" his Commonwealth Double Barrel title. The event was shot on the Nobel grounds, then at Bentleigh. Five tied, each with 24/25. In the shoot-off Vic Fankhauser was first to fall out, finishing fifth with 28/30. Fred Burns and C. Lancaster were next out, each with scores of 33/35. Bryant ultimately won 39/40 from Reg Ilett (Harrison) 38/40. Bryant used only three seconds in the contest at 25 targets from 20 yards.

At the first open shoot conducted by the old Werribee Club on the Werribee Racecourse, Bryant again won the main event, at double rise on this occasion, scoring the moderate total of 8/15 pairs to win from Texas (C. Lancaster).

## TWENTY YEARS AGO

At Echuca in February, 1950, there is a report of F. Bradley having his first shot over the traps and returning high gun figures for the day.

Len Robinson, still Secretary at Sale, is reported to have won a double at the now extinct Yallourn-Morwell Club. Miss Nyla Fankhauser, the only woman shooter to ever gain a place in a Victorian Interstate Team, shot one of the best performances at a Coburg meeting with 23/23.

At a Griffith (N.S.W.) fixture 106 shooters competed. The Club introduced an unusual scheme for arranging team competition. Each competitor paid in 2/6 and names were then drawn in teams of four. The winning combination comprised Ted Matthews (Bowena, N.S.W.), E. E. Albert (Barellan, N.S.W.), E. Fromholtz (Secretary at Griffith) and Owen McLoughlan of Cohuna (Vic.). This type of event proved very popular at that period and it could be well tried out again. "Dinky" (Bill Catlin) and W. Wager (Melbourne) cut the first two places in a £50 handicap at a Holbrook (N.S.W.) meeting.

Eric McCrae, now President of the Hobart Club and incidentally manager of 7 HO Hobart, is under notice about this time with several good scoring runs, including 50/52, 56/59 and several others over 30.

A story comes from Queensland about this period in 1950. It refers to a death struggle between a fox and

a large snake. The fox had the snake's head in its mouth whilst the snake had its body tightly coiled around the body of the fox. Both were exhausted when found by the narrator of the story, and he at once despatched both snake and fox. On measurement the snake was found to be ten feet long — the length of the fox was not stated.

In a Hobart (Tas.) shoot no fewer than 23 of the 40 entrants in a double barrel event carded possibles. The miss-out rule applied in the shoot-off, which went to J. M. Tyquin, now of Brisbane, on the 29th Round.

The Commonwealth Skeet Championship of 1950 was shot at Leeton by the then local Club. Nearly 60 entries were received. The title went to Narrandera sportsman, Tom Whillans. Newton Thomas was runner-up and R. Brown of Coonabarabran (N.S.W.) third.

## TEN YEARS AGO

"Bid farewell to our popular and efficient President, Mr A. J. Cunningham, who is on transfer to Biloela. Mr W. Carrington expressed his personal regret, and that of all present, at the loss of the sport in Charters Towers, and to the town itself, and wished Mr Cunningham every happiness and success in the future. He was ably supported by Mr J. Carrington, Sgt. A. Bianchi, H. Lavery, P. Penberthy. Mr Carrington then presented him with a Sunbeam electric razor suitably inscribed."

Crookwell (N.S.W.) Jack Cullen from Yass and local shooter Harry G. Anderson both recorded 75 Breaks.

Dulverton (Oatlands, Tas.) — First Association shoot to be held at Oatlands, attendance 48 and both R. Powell and Sperry Marshal agreed that the layout was the best in the State.

Geraldton (WA) the Past President complimented the members on the installation of the new night shooting additions. Through scrounging of an old motor car, a rejected generator, a very fine and efficient plant has been put together, and the Club now has a good as any night shooting ground in the State. Night shooting has become very popular in this district, due to the long summer evenings, and through its popularity quite a few new members have joined up. At the moment the Club boasts a membership of 56, with an average shooting line up of 25 shooters.

Mildura (Vic.) conducted sweepstake events only in order to test all three automatic traps for the forthcoming major shoots.

## QUALITY CONTROL in an AMMUNITION FACTORY

A number of special factors highlight the importance of quality control at the ICIANZ sporting ammunition factory at Deer Park, Victoria.

From April, 1970, this factory will become part of a new company, IMI Australia Ltd., but the same precise conditions and control of manufacture will continue.

Firstly, in any engineering design, be it a bridge or a domestic cake mixer, the designer uses a "factor of safety" of about six. This means in the case of a bridge, that the designer calculates the size of rivet required in a particular joint and then uses six rivets, or a rivet six times as strong.

In the design of ammunition the factor of safety is about one and one third. In other words the case is only one third stronger than it need be to withstand the pressure generated when the cartridge is fired.

The second difference is that the bridge designer can, by appropriate legislation, control the end user of his product. That is to say he can limit the load and type of load, which can legally be on the bridge at any one time.

The ammunition designer on the other hand has no control over the condition of the weapons in which his cartridge will be fired. He has to assume the worst situation likely to occur in practice and make his cartridges to suit. It is surprising of course, just how neglected some guns do become; having seen firing pins made from nails, top levers on shotguns held with rubber bands and broken stocks tied up with string, I have after 20 years in the business ceased to be amazed at anything.

The final point which makes quality control of ammunition during production so important is that when you reach the final stage of a loaded cartridge there is only one test left — you have to fire it to be certain that it will function. Obviously we can't fire them all, or we would have none left to sell. The only solution therefore is to resort to sample testing and this is only effective if you control production at every stage.

The first of these tests is on the incoming raw material. Every consignment of material is checked to ensure that it complies with specification. For instance



on brass strip, apart from the obvious checks of copper and zinc content, we do a spectrographic analysis for ten different "impurities," the maximum permitted on any one "impurity" being 0.01%.

Other raw materials are subjected to similar rigid analysis. Even when a raw material passes the specification, we occasionally put through a small batch before processing the whole consignment. This could occur for instance if the previous consignment from the same supplier had been rejected.

Having passed initial inspection the material is then issued to the production section and at each stage of the operation a variety of further tests are made.

Each of more than 1,000 different tools used is individually checked to ensure that particular criteria are met before it is passed to the toolstore for issue and having obtained the right tools, the toolsetter sets up the machine and production commences.

The product is checked by the toolsetter to ensure compliance with specification and this is normally done with a multitude of gauges. For instance, on a rimfire cup we check outside and inside diameter, base thickness, overall length and wall thickness and also make a visual examination. Random inspection and control then continues throughout the production run. This applies to all types of cartridges and it would be appropriate to consider separately the ballistic testing of the three main types — rimfire, shotgun and centre-fire.

## RIMFIRE CARTRIDGES

After the sensitive initiating explosive has been placed in the rim of the cartridge case it is subjected to a "drop test" to ensure that it will fire. This test consists of putting the case into a special holder and dropping a 2 oz. ball from nine inches on to a firing pin. A misfire at this stage means that the batch of cases is scrapped.

Cases which have passed this test are batched and then "caseproofed." This consists of loading the cases to a proof load at least ten per cent above normal. This gives us a "factor of safety" and to further ensure the quality we fire these cartridges in a variety of "casualty" rifles. These rifles are specially selected to detect any case weakness and the sample must pass this test before being issued for loading.

During the loading operation each case is individually checked for correctness of powder volume prior to bulleting. In addition regular checks are done on powder weight to ensure that the average charge weight does not vary. The cartridges are then bulletted and cannellured ready for waxing and packing. During loading, samples are taken from each cannelluring machine and fired for pressure, velocity, accuracy and functioning. This is done twice daily from each machine.

After waxing and packing random samples are taken from each lot and subjected to similar tests.

Pressure testing ensures that the pressure is not too high for safety. As a matter of interest these "little"

cartridges develop peak pressures in excess of ten tons per square inch.

Control of velocity is important on the different types of cartridges to ensure that the point of impact remains consistent from one batch to another and accuracy proofs are fired over various ranges depending on the type of cartridge. Normally five ten shot groups are fired on each test, the rifle or pistol being held in a specially designed rest. The group size is measured by the smallest diameter circle which encloses the centres of the extreme shots.

## SHOTGUN CARTRIDGES

As with rimfire ammunition the first testing of a shotgun cartridge case occurs with the "caseproof." In this instance samples are taken from each capping machine and loaded to a pressure about 15 per cent above normal. These are fired in selected firearms to ensure that the case strength is adequate. In addition to the functioning test, cases are droptested with a 2 oz. ball from a height of ten inches, this being considered less than the equivalent of the minimum striker blow likely to be encountered in practice.

If the cases pass this caseproof they are then loaded. During loading, regular checks are made for powder weight, correctness of wadding, shot weight and turnover pull. This latter test measures the force required to open the crimp and is important because of the effect it has on ballistics.

In addition samples from each loading machine are X-rayed to check that nothing untoward has happened inside the cartridge to adversely affect its performance.

If these checks are all satisfactory the cartridges from each loading machine are then checked for ballistics. This involves firing the cartridges in a pendulum gun, which as the name suggests, is a special gun, mounted on wires, such that it swings like a pendulum. As well as measuring pressure (about 3-3½ tons per square inch) we also measure velocity and because the gun is free to move we measure the recoil.

The only other feature we check is the pattern performance which we normally do over 40 yards range. The pattern percentage is calculated by counting the number of pellets inside a 30 inch circle and expressing the result as a percentage. In a full choke gun we expect to average above 70 per cent.

In addition to the daily proof we fire functioning tests in a variety of guns. These include single barrel guns, side by side double barrelled guns, U/O guns, and all types of semi-automatics.

## CENTREFIRE CARTRIDGES

These cartridges are somewhat different to the others in that they are manufactured in relatively small batches and even more important they are loaded to extremely high pressures. The pressure level can in fact, exceed 20 tons per square inch so every care must be taken to make sure that the cases are correctly made.



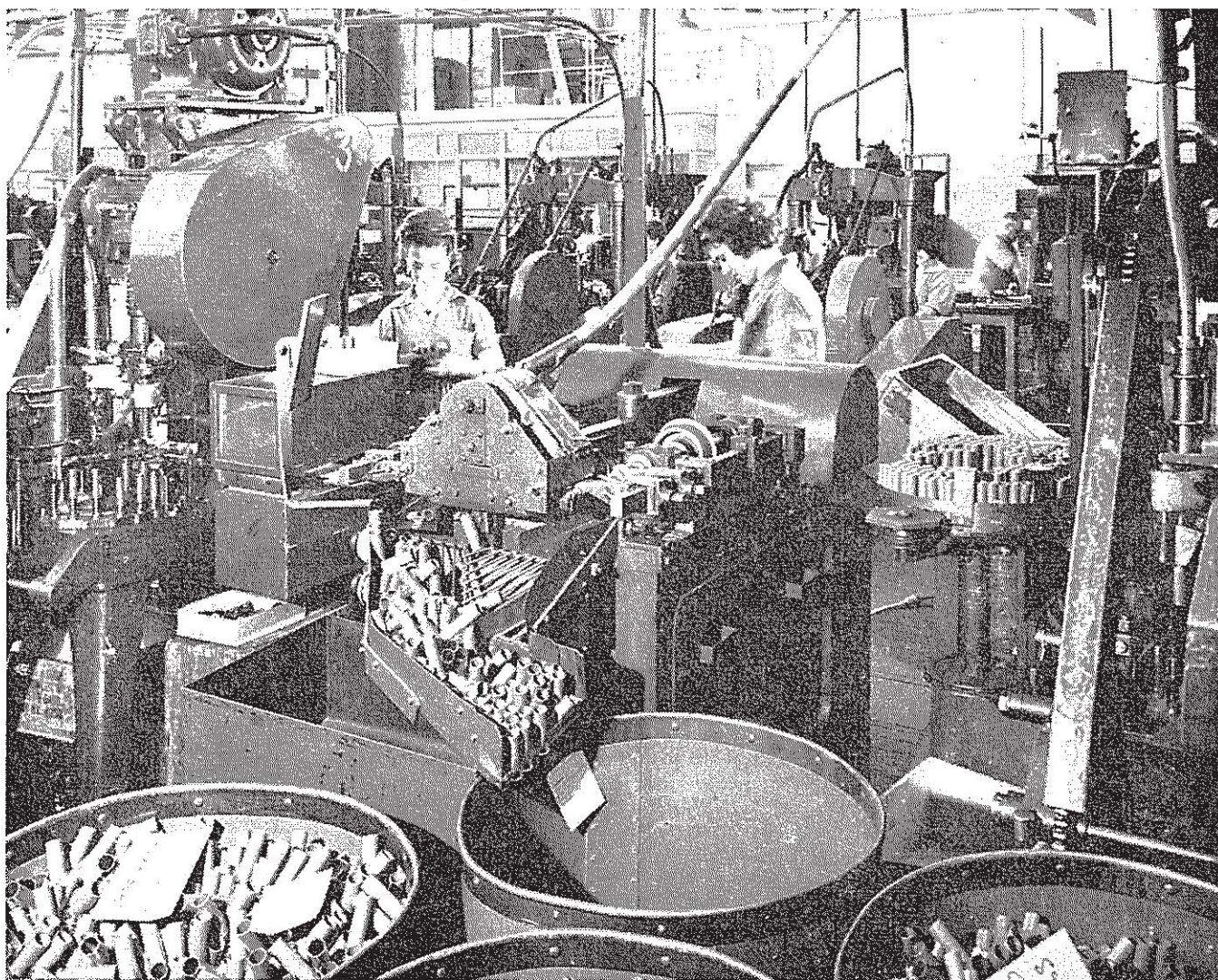
To ensure the cases are up to standard we take a sample from the batch when it is about half way through the manufacturing process and put it through the remaining operations and load it for full ballistic testing.

After passing this test called a "Manufacturing proof" the batch of cases is submitted to a case proof prior to loading, where they are submitted to daily proof and final proof both of which consists of pressure, velocity, accuracy and functioning tests.

As you can see we go to a lot of trouble to make sure that cartridges are made and loaded to the correct specification. However, in addition to the tests noted

above we do storage tests at a variety of conditions such as hot-dry, cold-dry, hot-moist, cold-moist, normal-dry, normal-moist and anything else we can think of to answer a specific problem.

In our Proof Range we fire over one million rounds per year and to do this we have over 100 rimfire rifles, about 50 shotguns and 20 centrefire rifles. Most of these are in better condition than the average field rifle but by the same token we have quite a few "torture" weapons which test our products much more severely than they are ever likely to be tested in practice. As proof of this we average less than one justified complaint per million rounds produced.

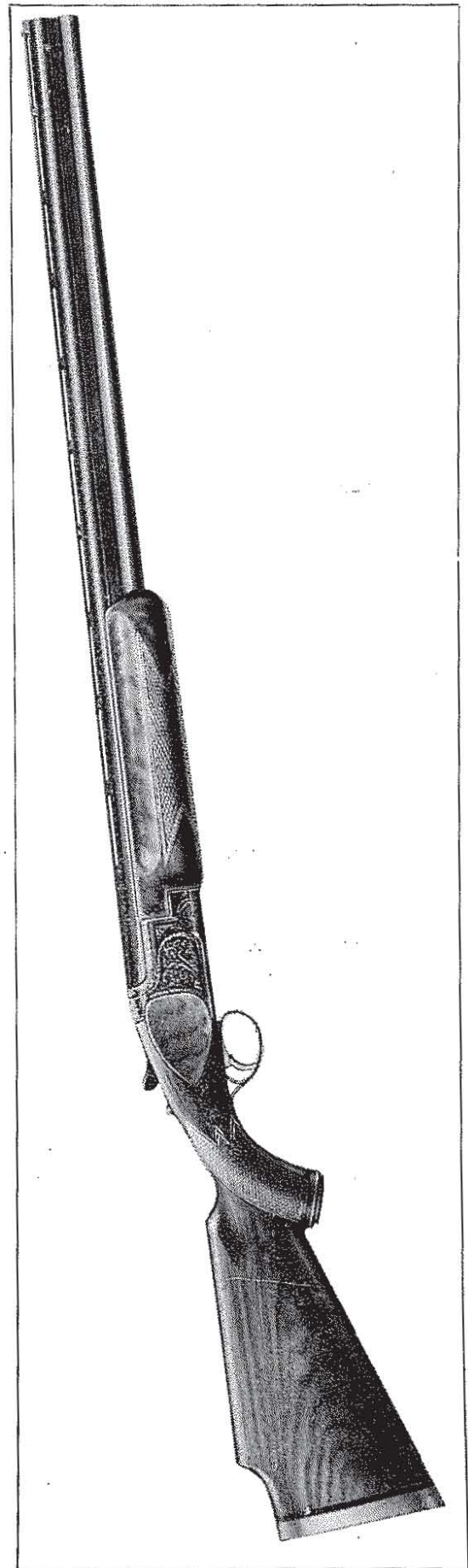

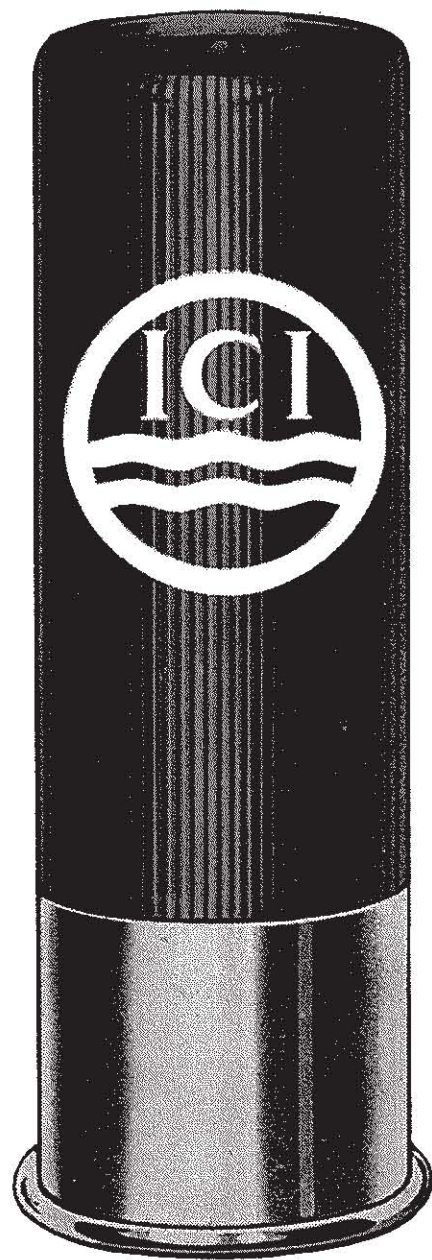
