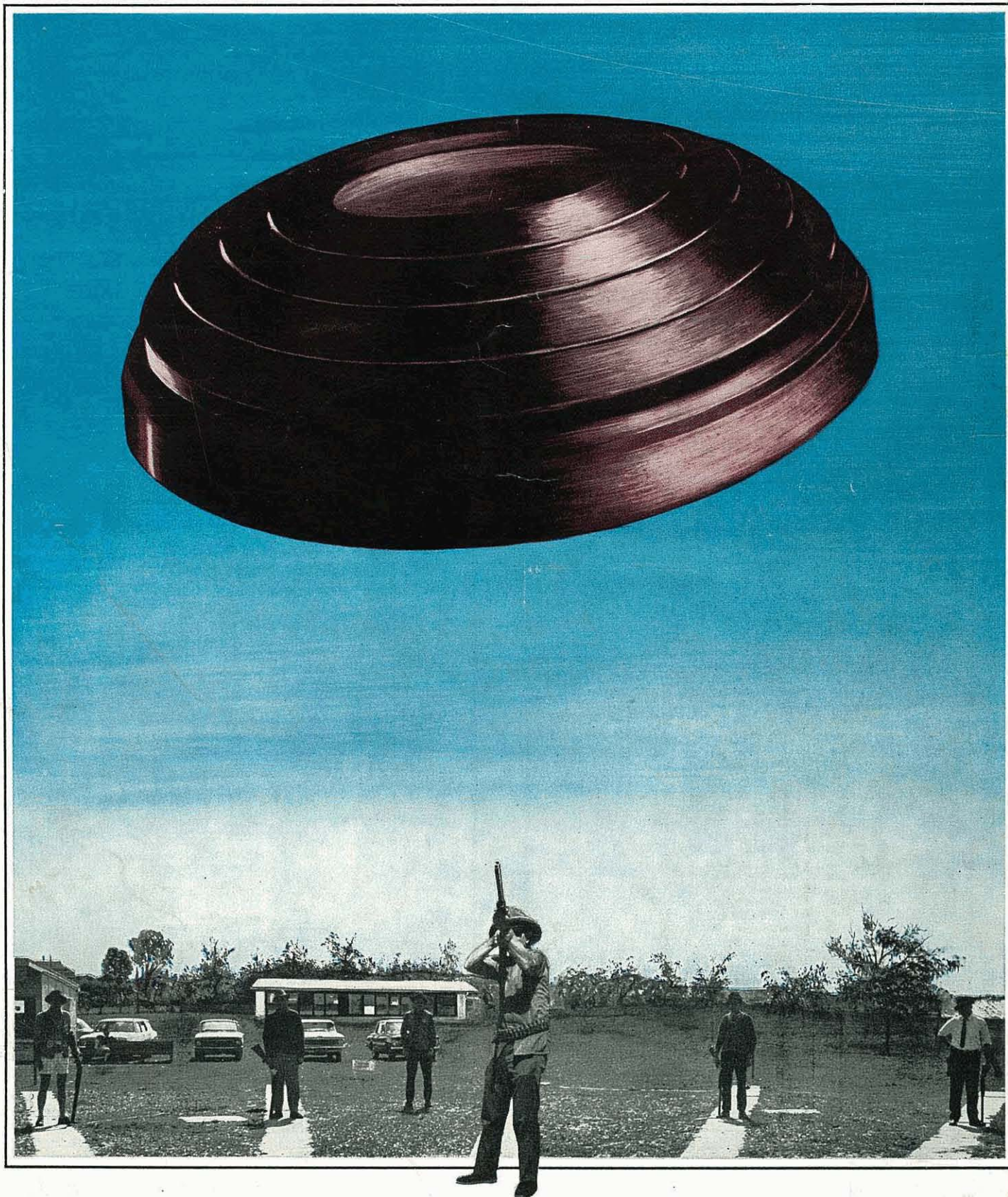

# Editor's Notes



## ACTA 1971 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

Applications for open championships to be contested during 1971 (that is, Commonwealth, State and District Titles) are required to be lodged under Rule 27 by member Clubs, in writing on the prescribed form number 16, not later than Friday, July 31, 1970.

Such applications shall be collated and submitted to the Executive Committee for consideration and allocation. Member Clubs are requested to measure their applications and to apply only for championships which can be satisfactorily conducted between January 1 and December 31, 1971.

The allocated championships for the calendar year 1971 shall be published in December 1970 "Clay Target Shooting News."

From this published list of allocations, Clubs then choose their own respective 1971 programmes to include these title events as so allotted, and submit shoot requests (Form 16) to A.C.T.A. for consideration, showing the required date(s) concerned.

Approvals are subject to correct interpretations of A.C.T.A. Rules and are designed to avoid clashing of major programmes with nearby Clubs.

Commonwealth, State or District championships will not be allocated to Clubs who fail to either apply the handicapping formula correctly or who fail to submit handicap returns for each shoot.

No trophies or prize monies may be handed to any shooters without the previous submission of current handicap cards — Rule 18.

A number of Clubs are still using the word "birds" in their reports for this and other publications. It is a request of the Executive Committee, from all public relations connections that Club reports use the word "targets" — after all, the sport is precisely shooting at clay targets.

There is no doubt that many of us use reloaded shotshells, and, with satisfying results. However, some guns are harder on shells than others and reloading equipment can vary in results for you and me, but to hear the stories of "I reload more times with the same shells" should be taken with a grain of salt. All ammunition manufacturers are constantly testing their products and they market products which are tested to specific limits.

Reloaders must watch these limits as lack of caution can be injurious to both the shooter and his equipment. The use of plastic shellcases and plastic protector wads has greatly increased the shooting results of all shot-gunners.

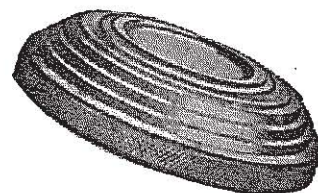
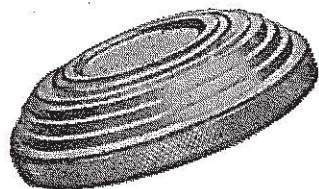
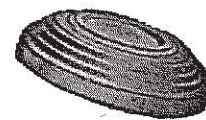

**The Animal and Birds Protection Board of Box 422 E, Hobart, Tasmania, 7001, announce:—**

1. The Mutton Bird Season as from March 27 (in the North) and 10 a.m. on March 28 (in the South) until April 30, 1970. Licence fee and bag limits — Commercial Licence (in North only) — \$15. No bag limit. Non-Commercial (Season) Licence (in North only) — \$5. No bag limit.

Day Licence (for the whole State) — \$2. Bag limit — 25 in the South, 50 in the North.

Notes: (a) Line from Sandy Cape on West Coast to Eddystone Point on East Coast divides North and South.

(b) Sanctuaries and protected areas exist in both divisions.

2. The Black Swan Season — over April 18 and 19 (two days) 1970. Licence Fee \$2. Bag limit 3 per day. Only Swan with complete adult plumage may be taken.

3. The Wallaby season is April 1 until November 30, 1970. Licence fee on Crown Land — \$2, no bag limit.

Notes: (a) Only Bennett's and Rufous Wallaby may be taken.

(b) The Forester Kangaroo is wholly protected.

**A 1969 Commonwealth Police Regulation concerning the entry or re-entry of firearms into Australia has become effective in 1970 in all States of the Commonwealth.** All shooters who travel abroad whether by sea or air with their shotguns (or rifles or pistols) and/or those who purchase a firearm abroad and bring it into Australia must surrender the firearm on demand at the time of entry to the **Customs Department** for safety **checking** by the ballistics section of the local Commonwealth Police. As this could take from one to three days, all such intending travellers must be prepared to assist the authorities at the inward customs of the airport or seaport concerned.

Production of a current A.C.T.A. handicap card with the actual submission or a letter, written well in advance of such arrival, could possibly speed the firearm checking process to a matter of hours. The principal arrival points and addresses for such early contact are to the Collector of Customs, Department of Customs and Excise:

## **OVERALL HIGH GUN WINNERS**

Annually since 1966 a Browning under-and-over shotgun has been presented to the highest gun scorer over the main D.T.L. trap events viz. Champion of Champions, Double Barrel, Double Rise, Single Barrel, Australia-New Zealand and the Grand Australian, with the provision that each shooter can gain this award only once. If a shoot-off is necessary to determine the High Gun Winner, then the shoot-off shall be shot under handicap conditions. The Association is very grateful to the makers of these fine trophies, Messrs Fabrique Nationale of Belgium and to their Australian agents, Messrs Commercial Marketing Co. Pty. Ltd. of Sydney.

A similar Browning shotgun is presented annually at the Spanish and other National Championships and by common agreement, between the New Zealand Gun Clubs' Association and the A.C.T.A., each shooter winner can only gain this award once. Such winners to date have been:—

# MISFIRES

*The photograph at left shows a girl about to droptest a Shotgun cartridge case. The two ounce ball, supported by an electromagnet, can clearly be seen near the centre of the picture. The case holder is situated just above and to the left of her right hand.*

*The ball is dropped by switching off the current to the electromagnet, which allows the ball to fall freely and hit the firing pin protruding from the top of the case holder.*

One of the most perplexing problems to any shooter and manufacturer in the world of shooting is a "misfire." The firing pin seems to have done its job, the gun is in good condition — it has fired many thousands of rounds without incident —and yet the cartridge doesn't go "bang." To the clay target shooter this means a "no-bird," to the field shooter a missed quarry and to both a loss in confidence until the problem has been diagnosed.

In considering this vexed problem let us look at the ignition system in a shotgun cartridge. **Fig. 1** shows a cross section of the cap anvil and chamber of a typical shotgun cartridge. There are variations between manufacturers, of course, but the principle is the same in all types.

When the trigger is pulled the hammer is released; this in turn strikes the firing pin, which hits the base of the cap shell and "pinches" the priming composition between the inside of the cap shell and the point of the anvil. This minute movement of the composition, which is gritty by design, generates sufficient heat, by friction, in a localised area, to ignite the composition. This in turn creates a flash of flame which escapes through the flash hole and ignites the powder.

As we are not concerned in this article with what happens after this point, I will confine my discussion to the reasons why a flash is not produced.

Firstly, we have manufacturing faults which will always cause a misfire. The most common of these are listed below:—

1. No anvil.
2. Damaged anvil.
3. No flash hole in the chamber.
4. Unprimed cap, i.e., no composition.

Due to most stringent quality control procedures followed by ammunition manufacturers, I would estimate that about one cartridge in three to five million would misfire due to one of the above faults.

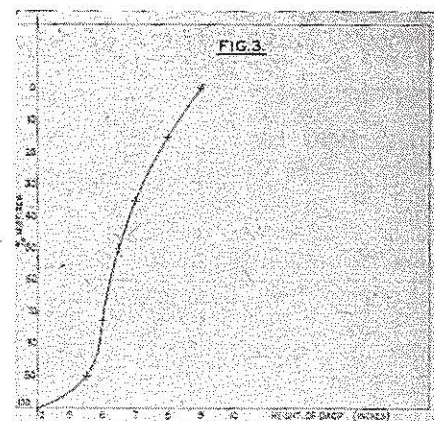
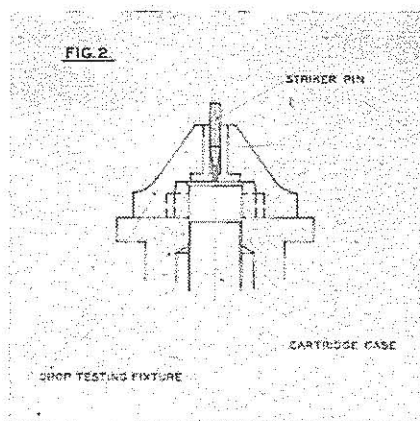
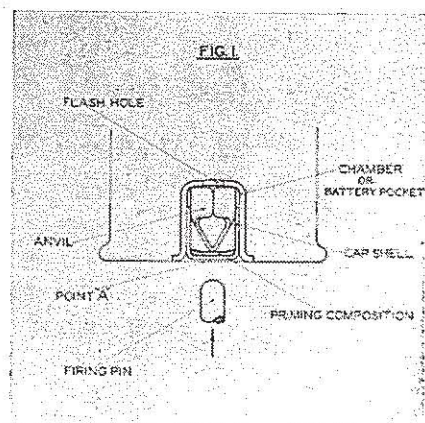
The other most likely causes of misfires are related to gun faults, and the most typical of these are:—

1. Off centre striking pin.
2. Weak striker blow.
3. Insufficient striker pin protrusion.
4. Excessive headspace in gun.
5. Damaged Firing Pin.
6. Sluggish Firing Pin.

As shooters may not be familiar with all these terms I will discuss each one in detail.

### 1. Off Centre Striking Pin

Due to poor assembly or machining, the gun may be assembled in such a way that the firing pin consistently hits the cap away from the centre. Occasionally the shooter has a gun with a loose fitting firing pin, (that is, the pin is much smaller than the hole which guides it) and due to this sloppy fit the firing pin occasionally hits off centre. If for any of these reasons the firing pin does hit off centre, the composition will not be properly nipped between the cap shell and the point of the anvil, and a misfire may result.

### 2. Weak Striker Blow

Due to a weakened mainspring, dirt in the action, gum around the firing pin, and a variety of other causes, the striker blow may be weakened. Depending on just how weak the striker blow is, misfires will occur with a frequency dependent upon the strength of the blow. It is always difficult to explain to a shooter why he only gets one misfire in a packet of twenty-five cartridges, and perhaps the only way to explain it is to go back to fundamentals.

In testing a cartridge for sensitivity the primed case is held in a special fixture, as shown in Fig. 2.

I should point out that at this stage the case is primed, but for obvious reasons does not contain powder, wads and shot. A two ounce ball is then dropped from varying heights on to the firing pin. If we do a series of tests, by dropping the ball from heights of two inches, three inches and so on up to nine inches, and plot the percentage of misfires against the height of the drop, we get a graph similar to the one shown in Fig. 3.

From this graph it can be seen that a gun with a striker blow equivalent to a four inch drop will give 95% misfires, while a gun with a striker blow equal to a six inch drop will give 72% misfires, and so on.

### 3. Insufficient Striker Pin Protrusion

Occasionally one comes across a gun where the striker pin does not protrude far enough through the

breech face. In such a case, although the striker pin blow may be strong enough, the firing pin is unable to indent the base of the cap shell sufficiently to set off the ignition system. In other words, this is the equivalent of a poor striker blow.

### 4 Excessive Head Space in the Gun

If for some reason the gun has excessive head space, or to put it another way, the rim space is too deep, when the firing pin moves forward it pushes the cartridge forward until the excess head space is taken up, and at this stage it may or may not have sufficient energy left to fire the cap. This is a similar situation to that of insufficient striker pin protrusion and will eventually cause a misfire.

### 5. Damaged Firing Pin

The most common form of damage is a chip off the nose of the firing pin, or some other damage which reduces the area of the end of the pin. This in turn reduces the area of the composition which is "nipped," and may again lead to misfires.

### 6. Sluggish Firing Pin

The whole essence of consistent firing is to have a crisp rapid action from the release of the sear to the firing pin hitting the cap. Sears get worn, and instead of the hammer getting away to a flying start, it creeps away — rather like comparing the start of a 100 yard sprint to the start of a marathon. I have previously mentioned "gumming up," which can be caused by over oiling and inadequate cleaning. Sometimes the main spring gets gummed up and loses its crispness. There are lots of causes, but if the action is not crisp, misfires will result.

I believe I have covered the more general, or common, causes of misfires. With modern manufacturing techniques I believe more misfires are caused by gun faults than by manufacturing faults. Equally, I am prepared to admit that one day a new cause will turn up — one of those unexplained mysteries. But if you do get a misfire, the first thing to do is to find the cause. Once this is found, the cure is generally easy.



## Inter Services Trap Shoot

The 1970 Inter-Services Teams' Match was conducted at HMAS Cerberus Gun Club on March 18.

In this very exciting shoot, Army and Navy tied 74/90 with RAAF third 71/90. The Army caught up with Navy in the last 15 targets.

Army won the shoot-off to enjoy the ICIANZ Ltd. perpetual shield for 1970, 99/120; Navy 98/120.

(Each of the six shooters, shoots five targets in such a shoot-off, taking total possible targets to 120).

Only one possible 15/15 was scored in the actual shoot which was shot under gusty conditions. However, facilities provided by the Navy were excellent including a luncheon for the contestants.

The throwing of targets was faultless by the newly-installed Winchester trap.

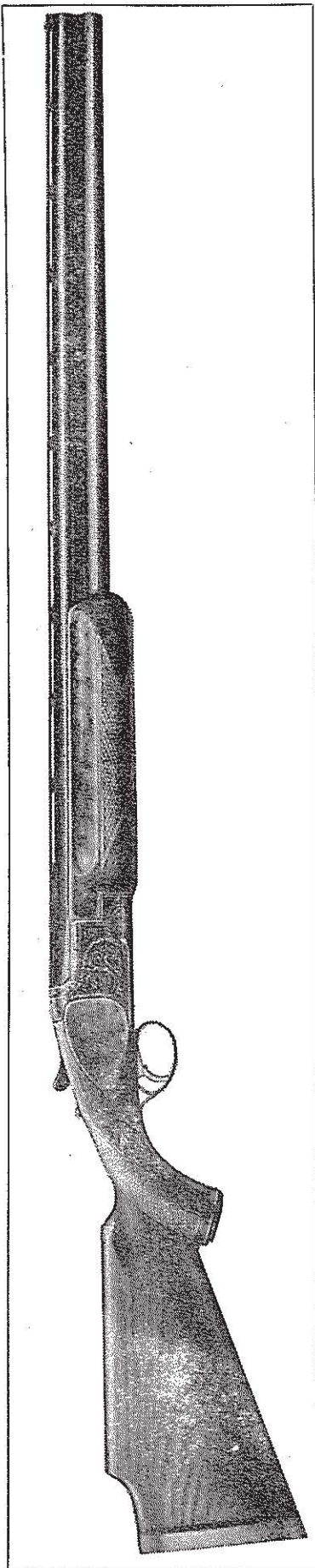

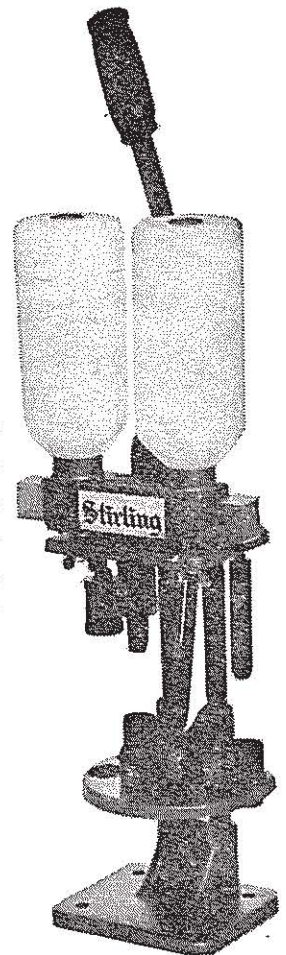

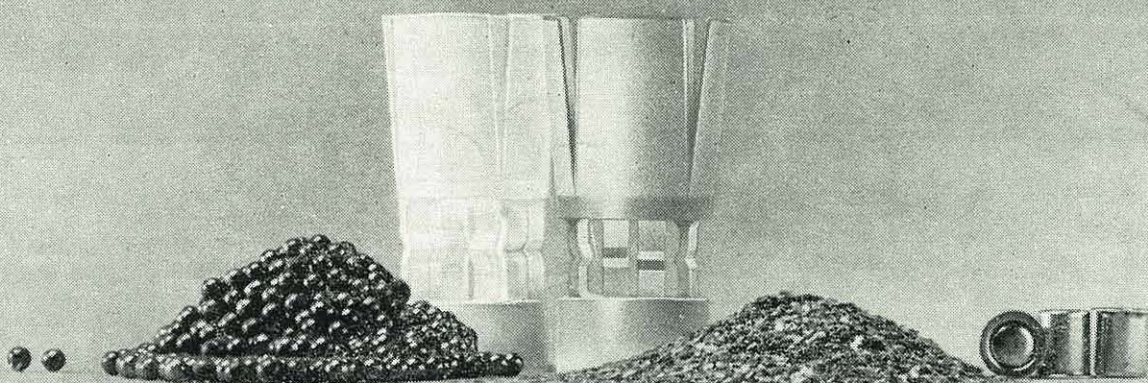
