

A.C.T.A. Executive Committee Meeting

The next scheduled meeting of the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee will be held in Melbourne, Victoria, at the Naval and Military Club, 25 Little Collins Street, on Monday-Tuesday, October 12-13, 1970.

Items for inclusion on the agenda paper of this meeting are to be in the hands of the Secretary, A.C.T.A., G.P.O. Box 2038S, Melbourne, 3001, not later than Friday, August 28, 1970, when the documents relating to the meeting are collated and forwarded to the Executive Committee approximately 14 days prior to the date of the commencement of the meeting.

Notices of Motion

All notices of motion referring to the Articles of Association and the Constitution of the A.C.T.A. must be submitted in writing, to the Secretary, A.C.T.A., G.P.O., Box 2038S, Melbourne, 3001, on or before September 30, 1970, in accordance with Association Article 43 (D).

General

Full details of the 1970 International Teams' Match for the Mackintosh Trophy are shown separately in this publication. New Zealand won with 7304/7500 points from Canada 7245 then Australia 7213 followed.

* * *

Reports have ben received of a different shooter at each of a mid-Victorian club and a south Queensland club — both shooters have walked onto the tracks or from track to track with closed guns. Both shooters also have been seen to stand with hands over the muzzle of a closed gun, whilst the gun butt is resting on the ground or a foot. To those whom the cap fits — we trust the mistakes are rectified, however, should further confirmed reports arrive, shooters shall be named by direction and Referees present asked for explanations.

The sport of clay target shooting has an excellent safety record at known registered clubs and it is our intention to keep that record. It is also the wish of the public at large and of the insurers that the examples are set and maintained within member clubs of this Association.

The first Trap section of the 1970-1971 Winchester Tournament shall be conducted on September 12 at Echuca, northern Victoria. There will be 18 separate sections conducted throughout the Commonwealth before March 20, 1971. These are as follows, but as yet some dates are not decided:—

VICTORIA: Echuca, September 12; Hamilton, October 17; Mildura, October 24; Bairnsdale, November 14; Melbourne, February 6.

NEW SOUTH WALES: Dubbo, November 1; Guyra, February 20/21; Queanbeyan, February 21; Griffith, February 27/28.

QUEENSLAND: Bundaberg, October 11; Burdekin, October 31, November 1; Gold Coast, January (date not yet known).

TASMANIA: Hobart, December 19; Tasmanian, March 13.

SOUTH AUSTRALIA: S.A.G.C., October 26; Mt. Gambier, January 31.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA: Two Clubs yet to be decided.

Total — 18 Clubs.

Shooters may use either home loaded or factory loaded $1\frac{1}{8}$ oz. shot cartridges in the 50 target trap event off 16 yards, which shall be conducted double barrel, kills to count, ties shot to conclusion. Any shooter may nominate and compete in his grade at any number of tournament locations but any one shooter is limited to one first trophy in each grade. The event is to be conducted off 16 yards as a graded event with Grade 1 — 21-27 yds, Grade 2 — 16-20 yds, Grade 3 — 12-15 yds. Three trophies are to be won in each of these three grades at each of the 18 locations.

Scores (long run breaks) achieved at each club in each State shall be compared and the highest recorded State Long Run Break shall be awarded a return air ticket to the 1971 Australian National Championships to be held at the Brisbane Gun Club, Queensland, during June, 1971.

These six State High Gun winners shall shoot as a squad, at the Brisbane Gun Club on Friday, June 11, 1971, at 100 targets, double barrel, kills to count, to establish the overall winner of the 1970-1971 Winchester Clay Target Tournament, using free Winchester shot shells. This squad of State winners shall probably be announced in May, 1971, A.C.T.A. "Shooting News," however, any shooter who has qualified but is not able to attend the final in Brisbane shall forfeit the right and the runner-up shall qualify.

The International Clay Pigeon Shooting Council for Great Britain and Ireland announced in its 36th Annual International Tournament Brochure for the 1970 series:—

"Shooting and Scoring Conditions

Single Rise: Two barrel shooting points scoring: Three points for a first-barrel kill and two points for a second-barrel kill.

Classification of Competitors

Class 'AA' — 94 per cent points and over.

Class 'A' — 90 per cent points and under 94 per cent,

Class 'B' — 85 per cent points and under 90 per cent.

Class 'C' — under 85 per cent points.

The averages to be compiled from the number of points made in registered shoots during 1969. Association Secretaries will supply to the organisers a list on these lines before the meeting and details will appear on the notice board.

When insufficient or no information about a shooter's record is available, the competitor concerned will be classified at the discretion of the International Council.

After the first day's shooting, classes may be revised at the Council's discretion."

[Editor Comments—As stated in item 10, page 4, of December, 1969, A.C.T.A. "Shooting News," — "The A.C.T.A. Trap Handicapping Formula is to continue in its present system for the next 12 months."

This existing handicapping method in use in Australia is good but, as all systems have problems and outgrow themselves, the current method is based on a shooter's luck on the day with trophy values as the deciding factor.

England and America have switched to a simple figure system based on a shooter's skill over a given number of targets — irrespective of the number of events and/or programmes concerned. Thus, any shooter, over a period, shoots himself into a grouping and this is true to life as M. (Pud) Burgess, Doug Smith, Newton Thomas are first raters and could be, say, "AA" grade. Others would be "A, B or C" grade.

It is as simple as that and would automatically satisfy all the long out-dated trophy value problems.

Similarly in, say, a prime event then "A, B and C"

grade trophies could be issued.

Descriptions of the proposed system were contained in A.C.T.A. "Shooting News," October, 1969,

page 5, and February, 1970, page 8.

The reference to points scoring is a matter of outgoing money cost to all shotgun shooters in that for double barrel events, lengthy shoots-off should quickly disappear if such a method of shoots-off, points scoring is adopted.]

Complete details of the Skeet section of the 1970 Winchester Tournament in Australia are listed on page 3 of this publication.

The final section of the International Teams' Match for 1971 will be held at Ashbourne near Dublin, Ireland, on Friday, July 23, 1971 and the conditions will be unchanged, that is, teams of 30, the 25 highest scores in each to count, each team member shooting at 100 targets, two barrels allowed, scoring 3 points for first barrel kill and 2 points for a second barrel kill. Highest possible score per team 7500 points. These conditions shall apply for the next five years, until 1975.

Throughout the year each shooter and his subsequent amended handicap, if any, has been published, consequently by direction, a full list has not been repeated.

1970-71 Winchester Clay Target Tournament — Skeet

The 1970-71 Winchester Skeet Tournament will be conducted in Club rounds one in each State and a Grand Final, the winner of which will be the Winchester Skeet Tournament Champion.

ITEM 1 — CLUB ROUNDS

Two rounds of skeet — 50 targets, off the gun scores only to count.

At each location there will be an overall winner and first and second placings in three grades.

The overall winner from each location will proceed to the final round.

Grades 0-3, 4-6, 7-10.

18 oz. factory or reloaded shotshells may be used.

ITEM 2 — NOMINATION

\$6.00.

ITEM 3 — DATES

To be conducted between September 1, 1970 — March 20, 1971. Location dates to be advertised in A.C.T.A. "Shooting News."

ITEM 4 — RULES CLUB ROUND

- (a) The overall winner and grade winners at each location shall be determined by shoot-offs, if necessary, on the basis of first miss out.
- (b) The overall winner at each location will qualify to participate in the final round.
- (c) A shooter may nominate in each location Tournament.
- (d) Registered A.C.T.A. shooters only can enter and current handicap cards must be produced to determine grading.
- (e) The rounds will be shot by the quick method.
- (f) No employee of Winchester Australia Pty. Ltd. will be permitted to enter the Winchester Tournament.

ITEM 5 — NUMBER OF CLUBS

Six—one in each State. Geelong, Nov. 21., Hawkes-bury, Ipswich, S.A.G.C., Perth and Hobart.

ITEM 6 — OVERALL CLUB PROGRAMME

It is desirable that the Winchester Tournament be included with other events in a club programme but it must be a prominent event on the programme.

ITEM 7 — TROPHIES

- 1. There is an outright winner's (finalist) trophy at each location consisting of a transistor radio of retail value \$60. Additionally, a badge and sash will be awarded.
- 2. At each location in each grade there will be a first prize of 250 shotshells, valued at \$30, and a second prize of 100 shotshells, valued at \$12.

ITEM 8 — FINAL ROUND

In each State the overall winner will qualify to participate in the Grand Final which will be conducted at the Brisbane Gun Club in June, 1971, on the day preceding the National Championships.

Each State finalist will receive from Winchester a return air ticket to Brisbane and one night's accommodation there for the purpose of competing in the final.

A shooter who has qualified but is not able to attend the Grand Final will forfeit and the runner-up will qualify.

At the Grand Final the six State finalists will compete for the title "1970-71 Winchester Skeet Tournament Champion," using shells provided by Winchester. Second and third placegetters will be recognised.

Shooting in the final will be:

Four rounds of skeet — 100 targets — off the gun scores to count. Shoot-off to finality, first miss out.

TIPS AND TALES



Alice Springs (NT) — Should any shooter(s) be in the area, the NT State SB, DB and DR Championships shall be contested on Sunday, September 20.

Quambatook (V) — Office bearers elected for 1970/71 are President, N. J. Nalder; Snr. Vice-President, W. McGrath; Jnr. Vice-President, M. Reynolds; Treasurer, A. Richmond; Secretary, J. Wallis.

Kerang (V) — Office bearers elected at club rooms on 20/7/70, were President, F. James; Vice-President, W. Makeham; Jnr. Vice-President, R. Peacock; Hon. Secretary, B. Vincent; Shoot Secretary, D. James; Treasurer, A. Walker; Captain, W. Makeham.

With acknowledgments to "Trap and Feld," June, 1970, magazine of USA — "As a result of recent bombings and other terrorist tactics using explosives, President Richard M. Nixon, sent a message to Congress in March, requesting more strict regulation of explosives and increased penalties for resultant damage to property or persons.

At the present time, smokeless powders suitable only for use in shoulder arms are not included in existing Federal legislation. The existing explosive statute applies only where illegal use in acts of violence is concerned and does not interfere with normal purchases of smokeless powder."

However, reports are that (1) although smokeless powder can be provoked into exploding under extreme conditions, it is designed for use as a propellant in a limited way and not as an explosive. (2) no form of smokeless powder or propellant is listed as a class A explosive possessing, detonating or otherwise maximum hazard. "(3) it will burn very rapidly, if heated beyond a certain point, it is extremely difficult to cause it to explode violently in any way other than in a firearm. This makes it a distinctly poor choice for improvised bombs."

"Under this proposed (USA) legislation, reloaders would be seriously hampered in pursuit of their hobby by measures such as registration, fingerprinting, proving a "need" for the product, being allowed to possess only a very small quantity of shotgun powder at one time, etc."

The Mackintosh Trophy conditions from 1966 until 1970 inclusive are as follows:—

Teams of 30 to be pre-selected before the shooting match. Each team member to shoot at 100 down-the-line (16 yard) targets, in squads of five, in four 25-target stages, one stage from each of four automatic angle traps. Scoring conditions: 3 points for a 1st barrel kill and 2 points for a 2nd barrel kill. The top 25 scores in the team to count for the competition (i.e., Highest possible score — 7500 points).



The International Clay Pigeon Shooting Trophy for Perpetual International Competition was presented by the late Donald Mackintosh, Esq., of Melbourne, Australia.

Competing countries are England, Scotland, Wales, Ireland, Rhodesia, South Africa, Canada, New Zcaland and Australia.

24th International Teams' Match for the Mackintosh Trophy

The final section of this prized event for 1970 was conducted at Warwick, England, on July 18, after all contesting countries had lodged their sealed scores by mail.

In attendance representing Australia was Perth Gun Club, Immediate Past President, Jules Steiner, who for 1970, is also an Honorary Vice-President of the Australian Clay Target Association.

We congratulate our fellow "down-under" shooters from New Zealand who shot the winning score at Christchurch on April 11. By kind courtesy of Mr W. H. Stewart, Secretary of the New Zealand Gun Clubs' Association, we are able to publish the New Zealand International Team scores for 1970.

Mr Stewart has just completed a private holiday in Australia, commencing with a complimentary flight by Air New Zealand into the newly opened Tullamarine International Airport, some nine miles out of Melbourne, Victoria.

Actual scores of the Australian International Team are also shown.

Australia had won this prestige event nine times in the twelve years to 1969 and although varying methods of scoring have been used, the 1969 Australian figure of 7414/7500 points for this 30 member 100 target event has been the highest score to date.

The Australian Team for 1970 was selected from a group who had much lower scores than in other years. This was indicated by the changed attendance and lack of some ten or fifteen top shooters who normally attend the nationals and who by their consistent shooting, keep the events at a constant high pitch. The dryness of the moat in front of the line of traps at Perth was described, at the time, as providing a lower airspace in the heat, causing eddies to rise and flutter the initial flight of some targets.

However, New Zealand and Canada soared up to the top two placings on their merits and have our heartiest congratulations.



BURST GUNS

One of the most frightening things that can be experienced by a shooter is to have a gun burst when he fires it. Such an event is always accompanied by a loud bang, invariably it is quite unexpected and invariably the shooter will suffer, to put it mildly, a very bad fright.

When he recovers from the initial shock and has established that he is sound in wind and limb (fortunately rarely does permanent physical damage occur to the shooter) he inspects his gun which, at the least, will be badly damaged and the natural reaction is to find someone to pay for the damage. As I will explain later, 95% of bursts are due to shooter negligence or error, so his chances of recovering any damages are fairly slim and under these circumstances it is therefore advisable for all shooters to know why a gun bursts and what he can do to prevent it.

The first thing to recognise is that all guns — and rifles — have an innate tendency to burst and can be provoked into bursting by quite a simple error or act of negligence.

Why do guns burst?

Guns burst for two very good reasons — excessive pressure and defects in the barrel or action.

Excessive pressure can be generated by—

- (a) an incorrectly loaded cartridge; or
- (b) an obstruction in the barrel.

Defects in the barrel or action are caused by incorrect manufacturing methods and can generally only be detected by a skilled metallurgist after the event occurs.


Excessive pressure caused by incorrect loading normally occurs only in hand loaded cartridges. They seldom occur in cartridges loaded by reputable manufacturers because of the stringent quality control procedures followed by such manufacturers. These procedures prevent the loading of double powder charges, an overloading of shot, or an incorrect combination of powder and primer.

If the burst is due to an extremely high pressure, the burst will always be in the region of the chamber and, providing the metal shows no sign of a flaw or ring bulge, the cause can be fairly and squarely attributed to a high pressure cartridge.


Obstructions in the barrel can be caused by innumerable objects, such as—

- (a) a 20G cartridge being loaded into a 12G gun;
- (b) faulty cartridges;
- (c) mud in the barrel;
- (d) cleaning brushes and swabs.

The first cause mentioned above occurs when a shooter using a 12G gun has some 20G cartridges mixed in with the 12G cartridges in a packet, or in the pocket of his shooting jacket. After firing his gun and ejecting the cartridge case he takes a 20G cartridge from his pocket and loads it into the gun. On attempting to fire the gun he gets a "misfire." It is an unfortu-

nate fact that the rim of a 20G cartridge is the right size to allow the cartridge to "hang up" in the "leed" of the chamber. Thus when he opens the gun to see why he got a "misfire," the shooter can't see the 20G cartridge and inserts a 12G cartridge into the chamber. On firing the gun, the firing of the 12G cartridge invariably also fires the 20G cartridge and their combined pressure produces a burst barrel. The centre of the burst in this instance will be about five to 6 inches from the breech.

For this reason it is extremely important that a shooter should never store 12G and 20G cartridges in one container, be it pocket, packet or anything else. The result is quite predictable and equally quite easy to avoid.

The other three causes of bursts are called obstructional bursts, but before discussing each one in detail it may be wise to describe the effect of an obstruction

When a cartridge is fired, the shot charge is propelled down the barrel by gases which are expanding rapidly. If the shot charge meets an obstruction, these expanding gases "pile up" behind the obstruction, causing a highly localised wave pressure which can only expand radially. Depending on the magnitude of the pressure developed, the barrel will tend to bulge. If the pressure is such that the material is stretched beyond its yield point, a permanent set in the form of a ring bulge will result. If the pressure is even higher, the material will be stretched beyond its elastic limit and a burst will result. In both events a ring bulge will occur and this is prima facie evidence that the cause was an obstruction.

I will now explain in detail the various causes of an obstructional burst.

1. Faulty cartridges

It is possible, for a variety of reasons such as a weak cap, low powder charge, tilted wads, damaged wads, for a weak cartridge to be made. Although, for the reasons stated earlier, this is most unlikely to occur in factory loaded cartridges, it can occur with in-

experienced reloaders. However, I should point out that it is not unknown for the very odd factory cartridge to be defective in some way. The effect of these defects is to produce a very low pressure, which does not eject the wads from the barrel. The wads will lodge in the barrel, somewhere between the breech and the muzzle and create an obstruction. This is always accompanied by a report which is weaker than normal and if the shooter hears a weak report he should always look through the barrel to make sure it is clear of obstructions before firing another cartridge.

2. Mud in the barrel

This normally occurs when a gun is dropped in the edge of a creek, used as a "poker" to try to find a shot bird or a rabbit, etc. The end result will, at the best, be a ring bulge and at the worst a burst.

3. Cleaning brushes and swabs

It is not unknown for a cleaning brush or swab to be left in a barrel, due to carelessness on the part of the shooter, or perhaps because he was interrupted in the process of cleaning the gun. The effect will depend on the type of brush or swab used, but an obstruction certainly will be created and damage will occur if a cartridge is fired without the obstruction being removed.

How to avoid bursts and bulges

Statistics show that about 95% of bursts and bulges are caused by obstructions of one sort or another and these can all be avoided if the shooter takes proper care. The points to observe are listed below:

- (1) Before you fire the first shot of the day, check to see that the barrel is clear of obstructions.
- (2) If you experience a weak report, check to make sure that nothing has been left in the barrel.
- (3) If you drop the gun into mud, or it drops muzzle first into dirt, or has been used as a "poker" in a rabbit burrow, check for obstructions before firing.



Editor's Note on Winchester Traps

[Editor's comment: The words "free arm" are local Geelong (Vic.) usage. Briefly, this is Winchester Model 1581A Modified International Trap. Winchester have several types of traps of which the leader is the Western White Flyer, Model 1524A — instantaneous, push-button, random release and since 1955, 53 of these traps have been throwing 2,000,000 targets during the nine-day Grand American shoot. This trap can be modified by Winchester to style 1579A to give the ability to throw vertical angles for simulated International style shooting. Shooters are unable to anticipate the horizontal or vertical angles for simulated International style shooting. Shooters are unable to anticipate the horizontal or vertical angle of flight. A simple adjustment permits the vertical movement assembly to be easily disconnected and connected again in the field, offering the capability of throwing targets for either regulation trap or simulated International trap shooting. A further modification is the same basic trap to the 1581 A which is a further dimension to trap shooting and eliminates long shoot-off. Trap 1581A oscillates from side to side and also upwards to 60 degrees and down to a grasscutter level of three feet above the ground. 


