

As of this month, October 1970, we commence the 24th year of continuous publication of A.C.T.A. "Shooting News."

No publication shall be made for January 1971, as the printing trade is on vacation over the greater part of that month.

Those submitting copy and advertising matter concerning January and early February are reminded that all this must appear in the December 1970, publication for which the deadline is November 1, actual. The deadline for February 1971, "Shooting News" is December 10, actual.

Over October 13/14, the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee shall meet in Melbourne to discuss all aspects of Clay Target Shooting in Australia — the rules, their administration, the handicapping procedures, member club activities and also they shall allocate the respective championships to be shot during 1971, at the selected clubs, from the many requests and submissions lodged in writing by 31/7/70 for consideration. Late submissions have missed the lists for consideration and must abide by the result although they shall be tabled.

WOULD ALL SHOOTERS PLEASE FORWARD 1971 SHOOTER REGISTRATION FEES THROUGH YOUR GUN CLUB SECRETARY DURING NOVEMBER OR DECEMBER OF THIS YEAR 1970, SO THAT 1971 HANDICAP CARDS CAN BE PROCESSED AND FORWARDED TO YOUR CLUB FOR YOUR COLLECTION AND USE AT THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE NEW YEAR. THE RESPONSE TO THIS REQUEST IN 1969 ACHIEVED THE BEST NEW YEAR COMMENCEMENT ON RECORD. SHOOTERS ARE REMINDED THAT AS OF JANUARY 1, 1971, ANNUAL SHOOTER REGISTRATION FEE IS \$5, AS DECIDED BY THE ANNUAL MEETING OF CLUB DELEGATES AND REPRESENTATIVES IN PERTH, WESTERN AUSTRALIA ON MARCH 2, 1970. NO PRO RATA RATES ARE PERMITTED.

Frequently, Club proposed advertisements arrive at A.C.T.A. office, listing programmes that include events covered by Rule 27, yet no previous shoot request form has been lodged.

Clubs should understand that Rule 27 exists not only to maintain A.C.T.A. shoot standards, but also to ensure that Clubs do **not** conduct major competitions too near each other on the same day.

It is quite easy to overlook this requirement and to consider that one club is closer by telephone or geographical distance than another, BUT, any such special contact consumes A.C.T.A. administrative time when frequently no time remains as the advertising copy often arrives at the last moment.

Alternatively, the lodging of a shoot request form commences a recording procedure which, if allowed to break down, will then work to the detriment of the very Clubs concerned by permitting clashing programmes and general confusion.

Some Club Secretaries and office bearers ring or write, from all over Australia, "please push this one through, just for me." The answer is, just what would you do with these arm-twisters — fix their self-inflicted desires and to-the-devil with the rest OR stick to the rules.

Some shooters are inclined to think that the administration of a company and, in this instance, the smooth operations of several hundred active Clubs is a simple affair requiring neither skill nor training. However, procedures have advanced from fifty years ago and we are operating under the latest methods and in some instances are in front of other countries. (Both written and personal confirmations exist to confirm this).

The Association seeks the co-operation of all concerned in the use of the forms provided and the procedure established and proven, over past years.

1970/1971 Winchester Tournament in Australia— The conditions of the Down-the-line Trap section of this tournament were published in full on page 7 of the

August 1970, issue. There are 18 host Clubs throughout the Commonwealth and each Club shall advertise its own full such programme.

Only registered A.C.T.A. shooters may nominate and shoot at any host Club with no geographical restriction. We have received letters of application from shooters far afield, including the Northern Territory, who shall, because of their movements, need entry to a host Club. All such shooters may participate at the host Club of their choice in any State but current trap handicap cards must be submitted when nominating.

The Trap shooting host Clubs and their accepted shooting dates are:—

Queensland — Bundaberg, October 11; Burdekin, October 31, November 1; Gold Coast, January (date not yet decided).

New South Wales — Dubbo, November 1; Guyra, February 20-21; Queanbeyan, February 21; Griffith, February 27-28.

Victoria — Echuca, September 12; Hamilton, October 17; Mildura, October 24; Bairnsdale, November 14; Melbourne, February 6.

Tasmania — Hobart, December 19; Tasmanian, March 13.

South Australia — S.A.G.C., October 25; Mt. Gambier, January 31.

Western Australia — Clubs not yet known.

The conditions of the Skeet section were published in full on page 3 of September 1970, A.C.T.A. "Shooting News." Any registered A.C.T.A. shooters may compete at the host club of their choice but current skeet handicap cards must be submitted when nominating. Skeet host Clubs (one per State) are:—

Queensland - Ipswich, during February.

New South Wales — Hawkesbury, probably February (awaiting second skeet layout).

Victoria — Geelong, November 21.

Tasmania — Hobart, January 30.

South Australia - S.A.G.C., October 24.

Western Australia — Perth, January 9 or 17 (to be decided).





Letter to the Editor


Brisbane Gun Club, August 21, 1970.

Dear Mervyn,

Enclosed are photographs of the accommodation units which are available to shooters attending the 1971 National Championships at the Brisbane Gun Club. These units are on the same area as the Gun Club about half a mile from the club. They are new, brick units with comfortable beds, community showers and toilet blocks and a large canteen block where breakfast and dinner will be available. A new \$25,000 bar has just been completed and will be available for shooters to use after dinner at night. Each room will have four beds each provided with sheets, blankets, pillow and pillowslip. Shooters staying in the units will have to make their own beds. The cost for each bed will be \$2.00 per night with a maximum of \$12.00 for the whole period of the shoot. There are 20 rooms which will accommodate 80 shooters (men only).







Bachelor motel units at the shooting range adjacent to the Brisbane Gun Club, Queensland.


A caravan park is also available next to the units and have electricity supplied to each van point. All other facilities, showers and toilets (men and women), clothes washing room, meals, etc., are available as for the units. The cost is \$5.00 per van for the period of the shoot (private van). For shooters wishing the Brisbane Gun Club to arrange for hire of a caravan on the site, the cost would be approximately \$25.00 per week, depending on the cost of caravan hire. For these hired vans, shooters would have to supply own sheets and blankets. It is recommended that shooters being

accompanied by wives use caravans as the brick units will be for men only—four to a room.

Shooters wishing to avail themselves of this excellent accommodation at very cheap cost, please write to Mr A. C. Fisher, Secretary Brisbane Gun Club, 159 School Road, Yeronga, Brisbane, for bookings. Shooters wishing to share rooms with friends, please state names of all shooters when booking, otherwise beds will be allocated as bookings are received.

A reminder to shooters wanting Private Motel Accommodation that the period of the 1971 championships in June coincides with the big racing carnival in Brisbane and shooters would be advised to make reservations as early as possible. Patrick Travel Agents are the official booking agent and have booked a number of motels for this shoot. However, they cannot hold these bookings after March, 1971. There is ample motel accommodation on the Gold Coast which is only 40 miles from the Brisbane Gun Club along a four-lane highway.

Shoot now, hit later

(With acknowledgments to Winchester-Western, New York, U.S.A., and Geelong, Vic., Australia.)

Shots that you fire next Saturday will echo next November. Or, put another way: this summer's shooting can mean next fall's hitting.

A winter-spring-summer layoff dulls the gunner's eye and hangs cobwebs on his reflexes, and next Fall's bird hunting will pay the most dividends if you invest some time and effort in summer shotgunning. Handtrap targets are good; trap and skeet are even better.

There's not an angle at trap or skeet that doesn't duplicate the flight of game birds. These clay target games have a wide variety of angles, speeds and leads, just as you find in the field. Trap shooting is highly similar to pheasant gunning in open fields, or jump-shooting ducks on rivers and ponds. Trap gives you going-away shots of 30 yards and beyond that veer to left or right and fly straight. It will teach you many things about those little quarter-angle shots that look like they're straight away, but aren't. Allee samee Chinese pheasant.

Your field gun with modified choke will work OK for trap shooting. For skeet, your open-bored quail gun is ideal.

Skeet shooting's speed, close range, and widely varied angles are a close imitation of ruffed grouse, quail, and ducks close-in over decoys.

The quailiest shot in skeet is Low House 7, where the bird whips out from under your right elbow and flies straight away, rising slightly. High House 1 in skeet is an exact duplicate of a ruffed grouse flushing out of a tree behind you and flying over your head, straight away. It looks simple. It isn't.

The mid-field stations in skeet are perfect imitations of ruffed grouse flying across a tote road in front of you, or teal tearing over your decoys low and fast.

Come to think of it, we have seen every trap and skeet angle duplicated in the field, with many species of game birds. A possible exception is Station 8 at skeet, but we've had doves and quail fly at close range almost overhead, coming in.

There is an ancient, moss-grown cliche in shot: gunning: "So-and-so may be fine clay target shooter, but he ain't worth a dang on birds in the field." Or, in another version: "Maybe I can't hit clay targets at trap and skeet, but I can sure hit targets with feathers on 'em!"

Maybe so. But as a friend of ours sagely observes: "The reason most shooters hit better in a weedpatch than on the skeet range is that there's nobody keeping score in the weedpatch."

The more you shoot, the better you'll shoot. The best way to learn wingshooting, of course, is the way granddad learned it: on birds. You can't do that anymore. Bag limits, short seasons and lack of time won't allow it. But there's no bag limit on White Flyers, and summer is open season.

WHITE MEAT OR DARK?

We have a warm letter from Mr J. M. Barker, of Chicago, a grouse-busting gentleman who knows much about game birds, but always wants to know more.

He comments: "Why does a pheasant and ruffed grouse have white-meated breasts, while ducks and sharptails have dark-meated breasts?"

Mr Barker found a clue to this in a Scientfic American article on bird flight. It was noted that such birds as ruffed grouse, pheasant and quail fly only short distances with quick bursts of energy, and don't need a large number of blood capillaries to supply their breast muscles with oxygen and fuel.

Such game birds as geese, ducks, doves and sharp-tails fly longer distances, and need a larger supply of blood in their breast muscles. Those muscles power the wings: the greater the blood supply in muscle, the darker it becomes.

We've never skinned a bobcat or cougar, but mave heard it said that their flesh is often quite light-colored. This has been referred to as "twitch muscle" — muscle capable of sharp bursts of great strength, rather than long endurance. None of the big cats are long-distance runners; they are stalkers and prowlers, masters of the rush attack. We have skinned many foxes and some coyotes, and their flesh is quite dark. They are designed for endurance, and the long run.

Next time you eat a chicken, ponder the drumstick. Raised in total confinement, the modern chicken's legs are almost as white-meated as its breast. When we were kids, and chickens had the run of the barnyard, their drumsticks were dark-meated. They were kept in training by strange dogs, bold foxes, circling hawks, henning and roostering, and Model A Fords driven by reckless lightning rod salesmen.

CLAY BIRDS AND WATER

Broken clay targets, as most shooters know, are tough on hogs. Coal tar materials in the clay targets contain phenolic compounds that can kill a pig that eats them.

Grazing animals such as horses and cows aren't likely to pick up clay target fragments and be affected by them. The real danger is to hogs.

We are often asked if this can be safely avoided by shooting clay targets over farm ponds. But will it kill fish?

Winchester-Western studies with fish and other aquatic life in aquariums indicate, (1) that clay targets don't deteriorate in water, and (2) that target fragments do not harm fish or any other common aquatic creatures.

Open shooting in England

I attended the English Open Down-the-line-Championship at Home Farm, Heathcote, near Leamington Spa, Warwickshire, England, from Friday, June 26, through to June 27, 1970.

With me was Harry Somers, of Melbourne Gun Club, Victoria. There was also an American competitor.

There were five trap layouts using Winchester White Flyer Traps and at the rear of each scorer's hut was a flag pole with, at the masthead, a British flag, i.e., five British flags, but, as soon as the nominations were made and we other National shooter entries were known, one Australian and one American flag were quickly found and substituted on two of the traps to denote these National shooter representatives. We feel this was a nice gesture.

The whole shooting layout including traps, traphouses, scorer tents, caterer marquee (including bar), toilet facilities and office administration was entirely portable. The office administration was contained in mobile caravans supplied free by the Rover Motor Company. Land is too scarce and too valuable in England for any club to purchase and either maintain or let lie idle for shooting only, for a four or five trap layout. idle for shooting only, for a four or five trap layout.

The standard of this 16 yard shooting was very high and was ALL points shooting. The English winner of the English Open of $4 \times 25 = 100$ targets points scoring shot 98 first barrels and two seconds. There were approximately 150 competitors.

The English Open Championship was conducted in five classes; entry fee £9/10/- (inclusive of 125 cartridges, costing £6), or £10 for those competitors who have not entered by post (inclusive of 125 cartridges).

Prizes were:

THE THE PROPERTY OF THE PROPER

(1) OPEN (irrespective of class): 1st, the Championship Cup, Badge and £20; 2nd, Badge and £15 (in addition to a class trophy).

The Leigh and District Gun Club medal for the highest scorer resident in Lancashire.

- (2) CLASS AA (competitors with averages of 94 per cent and over): 1st, The Jhalawur Cup, Badge and £12; 2nd, £8; 3rd, £5; 4th, £4.
- (3) CLASS A (competitors with averages of 90 per cent and under 94 per cent): 1st, The "Referee" Cup, Badge and £12; 2nd, £8; 3rd, £5; 4th, £4.
- (4) CLASS B (competitors with averages of 85 per cent and under 90 per cent): 1st, The Readhead Cup, Badge and £12; 2nd, £8; 3rd, £5; 4th, £4.
- (5) CLASS C (competitors with averages of under 85 per cent): 1st, the Russett Cup, Badge and £12; 2nd, £8; 3rd, £5; 4th, £4. Additional prizes according to the entry in each class.

Shooters take their respective positions on a 16 yard line and place cartridges on their own shelf or stand provided just in front of each shooting position.

There was no five-track layout as this is only 16 yard shooting with contestants shooting at 5 lots of 5 successive targets.

Pool shooting was conducted at the conclusion of each of the two days of this programme. Pool shooting in the United Kingdom is the same as sweepstake events in Australia excepting that in UK only 33-1/3rd per cent is returned to the shooter.

The programme was produced and conducted by the Clay Pigeon Shooting Association using a special shoot brochure listing the events and shoot procedure. Attached was a list of the principal trap shooting events for England, Scotland and Wales through to October.

Procedure to nominate at the English Open Championships is-

- (1) Obtain an entry form from the CPSA.
- (2) (a) Mail it (without fee) to reach the CPSA at least three days prior to the event; or
 (b) pay an additional 10/- (\$1.00) late fee entry
 - at the ground if you do not nominate by mail.
- (3) Shooting commences 9.30 a.m.

- (4) No entries, repeat, no entries are accepted after 11.30 a.m.
- (5) Only special cartridges as supplied by the Association may be used during the events.
- (6) No trading is permitted on the grounds without permission of the CPSA.
- (7) No competitor may take more than one prize in this event.
- (8) Tie Shooting: For trophies and their accompanying prizes, 25 targets, points scoring 3 and 2. For all other cash prizes, add and divide.

I consider this was an extremely well run meeting and was a two event programme each of 100 targets over two days, with minor pools or sweepstakes to follow.

Once nominated to a squad, that group of shooters shoots as the same squad in the same squad number during each of the successive main events during the two or three day programme because of prior nomina-tion. However, for minor pool or sweepstakes this does




