

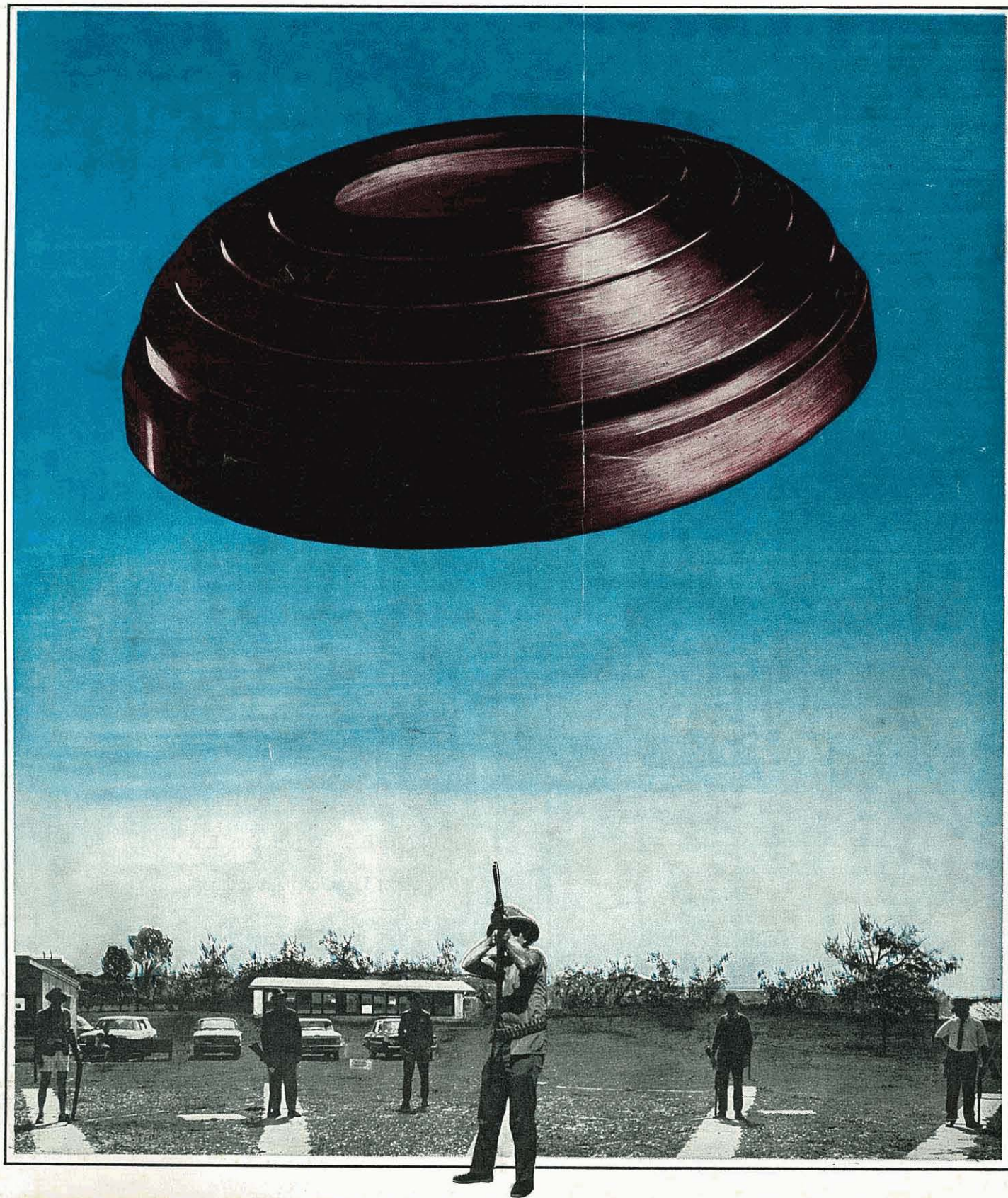

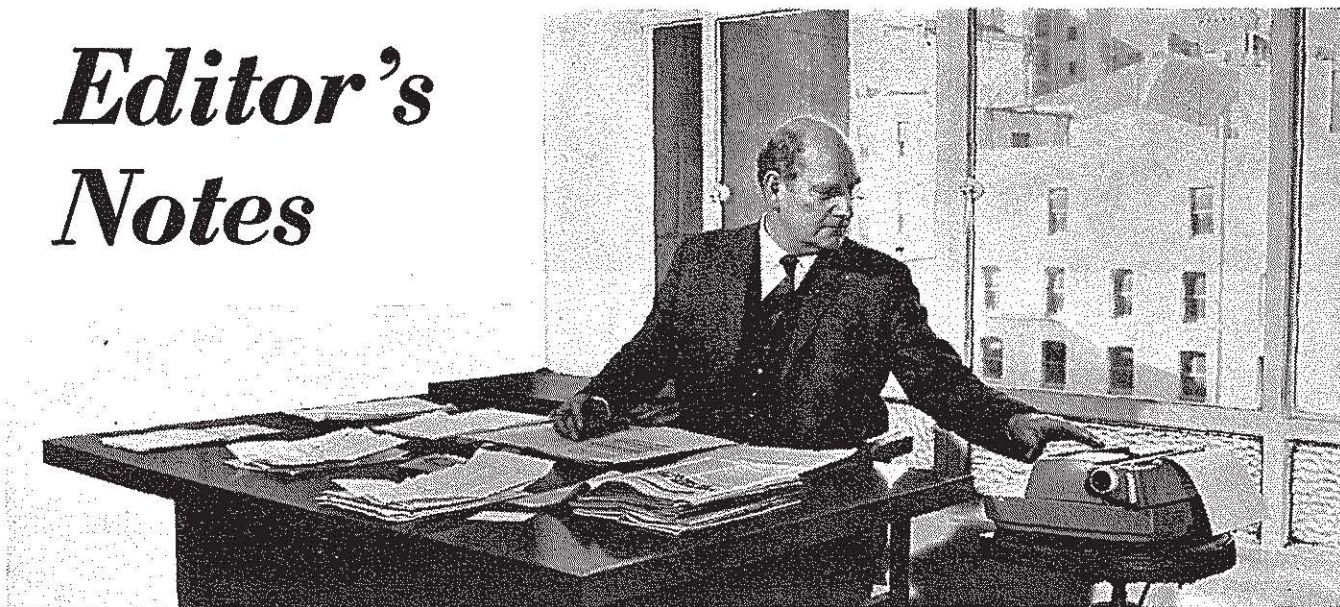

Editor's Notes



NOMINATIONS FOR 1970 OFFICES IN A.C.T.A.

All interested shooters are hereby notified that nominations for all offices in the Association close at 5 p.m. on Friday, December 31, 1970. Nominations must be lodged with the Secretary, A.C.T.A., G.P.O. Box 2038 S, Melbourne, 3001, Victoria. Any nominations received after this hour or date will not be accepted. Nomination forms are available from the Secretary, A.C.T.A.

Those lodging nominations are reminded that such nominations must be lodged in accordance with **Article 27** of the Association Constitution, which reads: "Nominations for all offices in the Association and membership of the Executive Committee must be in writing signed by the Secretary of the member Club or by the **DELEGATE** member of an unincorporated club making the nomination, and must reach the Secretary of the Association on or before December 31, in each year prior to the Annual General Meeting."

It is advised that private nominations will be rejected. Nominations received must have the official backing of the club and be approved by the committee of the member club concerned.

NOTE: Mr D. B. Mott, Executive Committee member for the State of New South Wales, advised the A.C.T.A. President at the recent Executive Committee Meeting that because of his change of residence to Queensland he regrettably tenders his resignation from the Executive Committee of the Association. The resignation shall date from the end of this current term of office.

REGISTERED SHOOTERS

Article 49 of the Articles of Association of the Australian Clay Target Association states: (a) The Association shall keep a register of shooters and no person may enter or compete at any Association competition or event conducted by a member Club of which a Delegate is a member of the Association unless such person is registered with the Association and is not in arrears with his subscription.

(b) Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall **BEFORE THE THIRTY-FIRST DAY of JANUARY IN EACH YEAR** supply the Secretary with a full and accurate list of all members and shooters registered with such club for the year commencing on the first day of January of such year and shall at the same time remit to the Secretary the subscriptions of such Club members and shooters. Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall also promptly forward to the Secretary of the Association the names and subscriptions of any persons joining such Club or registering as shooters after the thirty-first day of January in any year.

Club Secretaries and shooters are reminded that all fees for 1971 are due and payable on January 1, 1971. Club affiliation fee is \$10.00 and shooter registration fee of \$5.00 must be forwarded through a Club Secretary. Subscribers (i.e., non-Club members) may send \$5.00 direct to A.C.T.A. for "News" publications only. No pro rata rates are accepted and such fees are for the calendar year concerned.

The **POSTCODE** reference is vital for all "News" addresses — otherwise your "News" will be rejected by the Postal Authorities.

March, 1971, "News" will be mailed only to shooters financial (actually received by the A.C.T.A. as of February 15, 1971).

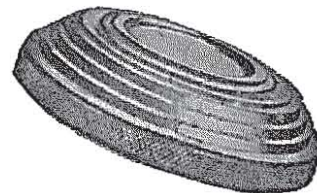

Congratulations are extended to the New South Wales team with its score of 495/500. Actual scores of the contesting teams are listed on page 3 of this publication.

1970-1971 WINCHESTER CLAY TARGET TOURNAMENT IN AUSTRALIA

Section one of the eighteen sections, was shot at Echuca G.C., Victoria, on 12/9/70. The actual grade placegetters are listed on the Club's shoot report in this publication. The overall long run break of 121/122 puts shooter G. Leech of Maryborough (Vic.) in the running against the other long run breaks yet to be established in the State of Victoria at Hamilton, Mildura, Bairnsdale and Melbourne.

The highest long run break over these locations will be the selectee for the return air ticket to Brisbane plus one night's accommodation, with the compliments of Winchester Western Australia Pty. Ltd. of Geelong, for

the purpose of competing against the similar selectees from the other States of the Commonwealth at a Final Round in June, 1971, on the day preceding the 1971 Australian National Clay Target Championships.

The WA State Sections shall be conducted October 24 and 25 at Perth G.C. — both Trap and Skeet. December 13 at Narrogin G.C. — Trap only.

In the Rules Interpretations section of the Down-the-line Trap Handicapping Formula, the reasons for and the method of constructing and using a height measuring stick, within rules 6, 46, 47, 52 and 103, are clearly defined.

For Skeet shooting, one prominent club has produced a measuring device within Skeet Rules 5, 6, 9 and 91. They have constructed a thirty-six inch diameter aluminium circle mounted on a telescopic aluminium pole, which they mount at the target crossing point. (Note—in still air, legal targets pass within three feet, horizontally or vertically, of a point fifteen feet above the target crossing point. The target crossing point is eighteen feet horizontally from the centre of station number 8.) As soon as the traps are set, this height stick is removed, as for the down-the-line checking procedure.



# 1970 Australian Interstate D.T.L. Trap Teams Match

The 1970 Australian Interstate Down-the-line Teams' Match for the "Great Britain and Ireland Trophy" has been won by the New South Wales Team with its score of 495/500.

Teams were of 15 shooters of whom only the highest 10 scores were to count. 50 targets per member from 18 yards, double barrel, both barrels equal value, 5

track squad system, shot in two stages of 25 targets per visit over one or two traps but two traps where possible. 5 targets from each track per member before changing tracks. Team members with common scores were finally recorded for placing in the team after using the countback system.

# Proposed licensing of shooters

## Editor's Comment:

As so many shooters and club letters arrived, concerning a proposed legislation in each State of the Commonwealth for the licensing of firearms and/or shooters, the following is our letter to the Chief Secretary of Victoria. The various Chief Secretaries were meeting in Melbourne to discuss the matter before reporting to their respective State Governments.

Further to our recent telephone conversation concerning the Melbourne "Age" and "Sun" newspaper reports of July 22, 1970, that the Victorian Government is considering a plan to license all shooters in Victoria, Mr Nevin asked for a further letter supporting our June 24, 1968 recommendation, of which a copy is attached.

Currently we have 65 affiliated member clubs in the State of Victoria with a constant minimum of some 2000 registered active shotgun shooters at any one time with many many more shooting intermittently. These shooters are both old and new Australians and are bound by very strict Australian and International rules on safety and gun handling with this Association which is the organising/controlling body of trap-shooting within the Commonwealth and its mandated territories. We publish and mail our own magazine monthly to addresses all over Australia, New Zealand and to other countries. It is not available on the public news stands. Our Association has the strictest gun specification requirements of any such association.

The attitude of these shooters to this proposed legislation has been discussed at length over the past two years and it is their request that the Chief Secretary be informed of their respective feelings.

Firstly, the shooters of British and other nationalities are mindful that Norway, Denmark and other countries were completely disarmed by invading forces in 72 hours in 1940 when those forces used firearm lists kept by the countries concerned.

However, our shooters agree with the several principles behind the proposed Victorian legislation and firmly suggest that any fee be not calculated or applied, on individual firearms, as many, or most, shooters have more than one shotgun — sometimes purely for sentiment. Similarly the shooters do "trade-in" their firearms when purchasing another to obtain the best personal fit for competition shooting. Individual shooter requirements vary with shooter age, experience and spending power.

Our June 24, 1968 recommendation to you was—  
(a) that the present licensing system remain as is

OR

(b) that should any increased charges and/or shooter registration be considered by the Government, that an overall \$5 fee covering all types of field shooting be then adopted.

According to the above mentioned newspaper reports, a shooting licence is being considered with separate and optional varying fees for pests and/or furred or feathered game totalling up some \$10 to \$12.

The question asked frequently over the last two years from shooter to shooter: "You're a duck (example) shooter — would you also take out a snipe or a quail licence?" The answer is on everyone's lips — "NO." The next question is always then asked: "Would you shoot a snipe (or quail, or duck, etc.) if one got up? The answer always is: "What would you do when shooting for the pot?"

Clay target shooters mainly are also active field shooters and their general feeling is that many, many shooters will not, or will never take out separate licences for quail, duck, snipe, hare, rabbit, deer, etc., yet each and every one of them would shoot these as these situations occurred whilst specifically hunting one or the other, even if it meant poaching without a particular licence.

Both old and new Australians are adamant on this point yet they would bow to accept the requirement of an overall shooting licence.

The feeling and belief is that an overall licence of, say, \$5 per shooter or firearm owner to cover both shotguns of all calibres and small bore rifles would be more acceptable to, and by, the shooters at large. It would provide a more static revenue for administration costs and overall would be more beneficial to the wildlife conservation effort besides securing the carrying of firearms by responsible persons.

It is strongly considered that any proposal for different licences for different game hunting is too theoretical and on a business basis would involve the government into far more management, administrative and printing costs than would an all embracing fixed fee licence whilst depleting the government of quite a proportion of any considered intake of fees for specific purposes.

It is requested that the above information be submitted with all respect for the consideration of the Chief Secretary and his ministers.

# BALLISTICS

## Part one — INTERNAL BALLISTICS

Ballistic measurements on ammunition are necessary to ensure satisfactory functioning of ammunition when it reaches the shooter. In addition to this, different cartridge types are loaded to different ballistics and the shooter — not unreasonably — expects that if he buys a packet of cartridges today it should have ballistics similar to the packet he bought last week or last year. If a manufacturer wishes to stay in business he therefore has to control the ballistics to ensure that the variation between different batches of the same ammunition is kept within acceptable limits.

Ballistic measurements are made in two separate areas and are known as Internal Ballistics and External Ballistics.

Internal Ballistics refer to the happenings inside the barrel from the fall of the striker pin to the time the projectile or shot charge leaves the barrel.

External Ballistics are concerned with those things which happen after the bullet or shot charge leaves the barrel.

As these subjects are both quite extensive I will consider Internal Ballistics in this article and External Ballistics in a later one.

### INTERNAL BALLISTICS

The most important feature in considering Internal Ballistics is the measurement of pressure. Pressure is important because if it is too low the powder does not burn properly and erratic pressures occur. These in turn can cause, at the worst, wads or bullets in the barrel and at the best, one can expect to get erratic velocities, which lead to missed targets and unhappy shooters. On the other hand, if pressures are very high they could cause a burst gun, which is most unpleasant.

The limits between "too high" and "too low" are not very wide, being somewhere in the order of plus or minus 10% on the average pressure. Engineers or chemists would regard this as a wide tolerance, but they do not have to contend with the variables found in cartridges, which are manufactured in millions.

Considering shotgun cartridges, we have the cap or primer. These are charged with priming composition — about 0.70 grains per cap, or 10,000 caps per lb of composition. This priming composition is extremely sensitive and is measured out with an accuracy of plus or minus 0.05 grains. These limits may seem very

wide, but any suggestions for improvement on this would be appreciated by any ammunition manufacturer.

The size of the flash hole in the bottom of the chamber has some effect, but control of this is only an engineering problem and is therefore easily achieved.

We then have the powder, say a nominal 23 grains plus or minus 0.5 grains. This is fairly reasonable and the variation is within acceptable limits.

Wadding — and especially felt wadding — can have a marked effect on pressure variation, because there are the variables of density, diameter, thickness, and last of all, wad pressure. I would have no hesitation in saying that no hand loader could compete with a machine as far as consistency in loading felt wads is concerned. In recent years, of course, we have seen the introduction of unitised plastic wads and these have been a boon to both the hand loader and the manufacturer. Once the design has been finalised (generally after exhaustive experiments) the production of these wads becomes an engineering problem, and the variation between wads is something less than minimal.

The weight of shot is a factor in pressures, but these are usually controlled to plus or minus 10 grains or, say, plus or minus 2% in 1½ oz. loads.

The strength of the turnover, or crimp, (we call it Turnover Pull) or the force required to open the crimp, also has an effect and has to be controlled within reasonable limits.

Last of all (or perhaps first of all) we have the case itself. The outside and inside diameters, internal volume and length, have to be controlled within close limits to ensure uniform ballistics. The two diameters affect the fit of the wad prior to and during firing. (During firing the case expands to fill the chamber and if the outside diameter was originally "small," then on expansion the internal diameter becomes "large," and this reduces the pressure.) Internal volume affects the turnover pull.

Having stated all the factors which influence pressure, one then wonders how we load cartridges at all. The answer, of course, lies in the "laws of chance," which briefly means that the chance of getting all of the variables on the low side in the one cartridge is one in millions. If we have a lightly primed cap then it would not be likely that we would have a large flash hole, a light powder weight, small wadding, a low shot weight



and a large case with a low turnover pull. Some would be above average and some below average and they tend to average out.

The other factor which affects pressure is the gun itself. Briefly, a tightly chambered gun will give higher pressures than a gun which is loosely chambered. As ammunition manufacturers are concerned primarily with safety they generally use pressure guns chambered to "minimum gun chamber" dimensions. This ensures that the pressures generated in customers' guns will seldom be higher than that measured at the factory and can therefore be considered safe.

Fortunately the measurement of pressures is a relatively simple process. As we occasionally experiment with very heavy pressures, the pressure gun is always much more robust than a normal gun. They are always

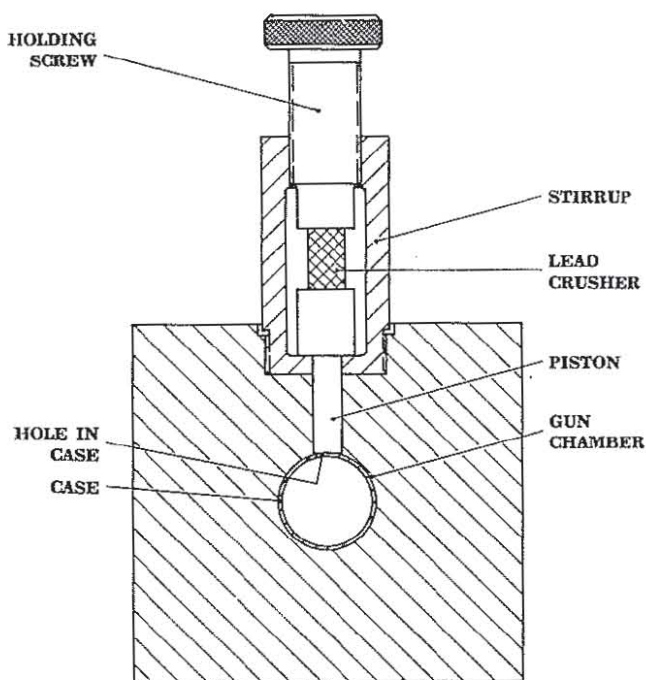

specially made and to check the wear in the gun, standard cartridges, stored under controlled conditions, are fired daily. This ensures that no "instrument error" is present to falsify the results.

The arrangement for testing pressures in a shotgun cartridge is shown in Fig. 1.

Prior to inserting the cartridge in the gun, a hole is drilled carefully through the case wall at a distance of one inch from the breech. This is the point of maximum pressure and therefore the most important point at which to measure pressure.

The cartridge is then inserted into the gun so that the drilled hole exactly lines up with the piston.

On top of the piston there is a lead crusher, firmly held by a holding screw, the assembly being held in a

stirrup which is screwed into the gun. On firing, the pressure generated by the explosion pushes the piston, which in turn squeezes the lead crusher and, in fact, squashes it.

The lead crushers are 0.500 in. long x 0.350 in. diameter, and made from a special alloy. After firing, the length of the "crusher" is measured with a micrometer and the pressure generated is read from a special table.

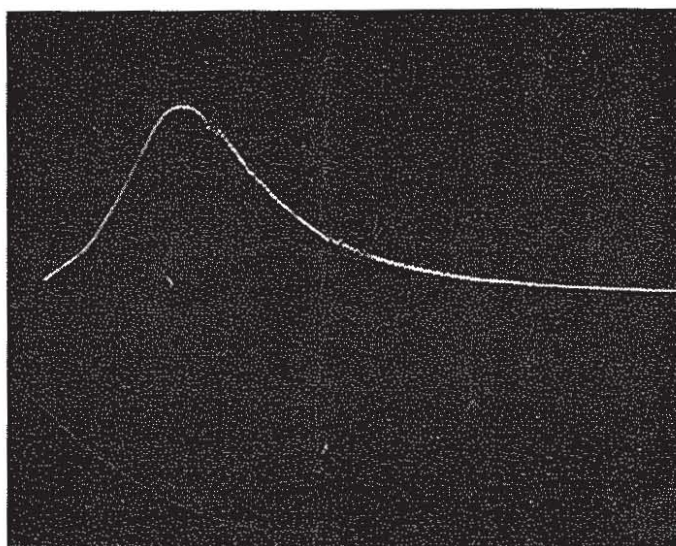
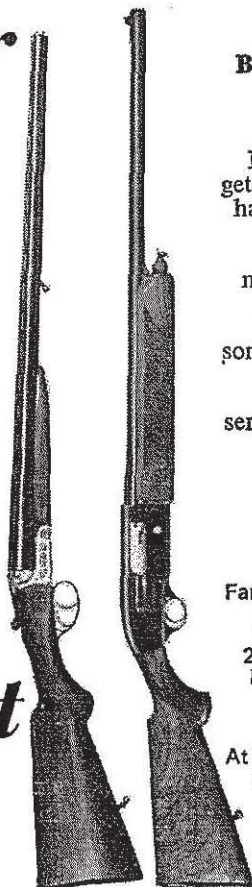


Fig. 2: A typical pressure-time curve for a shotgun cartridge.

During experimental work, pressures are measured by an instrument called a piezo-electric gauge. The principle of this instrument lies in the fact that if a quartz crystal is compressed, its electrical conductivity changes. This change in conductivity can be measured and transferred electronically to an instrument called an oscilloscope and this can produce a pressure time curve which can be photographed. Such a photograph is shown in Fig. 2. These instruments are much more sophisticated than my description suggests and they are only used in experimental work. However, the day will no doubt come when they will be in use in all proof ranges for routine testing.

All my remarks in this article have been directed towards shotgun cartridges. Similar methods are used for centrefire cartridges except that, because of the higher pressures generated, copper "crushers" are used. With rimfire cartridges the piston is placed at the end of the case which is therefore not drilled and, as with shotgun cartridges, lead "crushers" are used.

The method described has the virtues of simplicity and reproducibility. These are essential in high volume production because (a) results are required quickly to ensure that the cartridges are loaded to the correct ballistics, or to put it another way it is useless to find out today that the cartridges you loaded last week are no good, and (b) if you haven't got confidence in the results you get, it is probably better to have no results at all.
