



REGISTERED SHOOTERS

Article 49 of the Articles of Association of the Australian Clay Target Association states: (a) The Association shall keep a register of shooters and no person may enter or compete at any Association competition or event conducted by a member Club of which a Delegate is a member of the Association unless such person is registered with the Association and is not in arrears with his subscription.

(b) Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall BEFORE THE THIRTY-FIRST DAY of JANUARY IN EACH YEAR supply the Secretary with a full and accurate list of all members and shooters registered with such club for the year commencing on the first day of January of such year and shall at the same time remit to the Secretary the subscriptions of such Club members and shooters. Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall also promptly forward to the Secretary of the Association the names and subscriptions of any persons joining such Club or registering as shooters after the thirty-first day of January in any year.

Club Secretaries and shooters are reminded that all fees for 1971 are due and payable on January 1, 1971. Club affiliation fee is \$10.00 and shooter registration fee of \$5.00 must be forwarded through a Club Secretary. Subscribers (i.e., non-Club members) may send \$5.00 direct to A.C.T.A. for "News" publications only. No pro rata rates are accepted and such fees are for the calendar year concerned.

The POSTCODE reference is vital for all "News" addresses — otherwise your "News" will be rejected by the Postal Authorities.

NOMINATIONS FOR 1971 OFFICES IN A.C.T.A.

All interested shooters are hereby notified that nominations for all offices in the Association close at 5 p.m. on Friday, December 31, 1970. Nominations must be lodged with the Secretary, A.C.T.A., G.P.O. Box 2038 S, Melbourne, 3001, Victoria. Any nominations received after this hour or date will not be accepted. Nomination forms are available from the Secretary, A.C.T.A.

Those lodging nominations are reminded that such nominations must be lodged in accordance with Article 27 of the Association Constitution, which reads: "Nominations for all offices in the Association and membership of the Executive Committee must be in writing signed by the Secretary of the member Club or by the DELEGATE member of an unincorporated club making the nomination, and must reach the Secretary of the Association on or before December 31, in each year prior to the Annual General Meeting."

It is advised that private nominations will be rejected. Nominations received must have the official backing of the club and be approved by the committee of the member club concerned.

December, 1970-1

The A.C.T.A. Executive Committee at its recent meeting:—

1. Congratulated the New Zealand Team for its winning score of 7304/7500 points in the 1970 International Teams' Match for the Mackintosh Trophy. The general feeling was that it was a good thing that the trophy had been won by another country as Australia had won the trophy nine times in the previous twelve years.

It was then recorded that the final section of the 1971 International Teams' Match for the Mackintosh Trophy would be conducted at Ashbourne, near Dublin, Eire, on Friday, July 23, 1971, under the same

conditions until 1975.

2. Noted that the 1971 New Zealand National Championships shall be held at Hamilton but that no dates were available.

3. Congratulated the New South Wales Interstate

Trap Team for their winning score of 495/500.

4. Noted the progressive results of the Interstate Skeet Teams' Match and (a) accepted the delay of the Victorian Section due to flooding at the Melbourne Gun Club, (b) agreed that where Queensland and New South Wales have a tie score of 470/500, the surviving team, under Skeet Rule 113 countback method, is Queensland.

5. Appointed the following Referee Examiners:

6. Agreed that written examinations and tests may be arranged, under Trap Rule 45 and Skeet Rule 84, for referee candidates in far distant areas. Only clubs in areas without access to referee examiners may apply to the Secretary, A.C.T.A. submitting names of registered shooter candidates.

- 7. Decided that the venue for the 1972 Australian National Clay Target Championships will be confirmed during June at the 1971 National Championships.
- 8. Agreed that the 1971 National Clay Target Championships shall be conducted over the seven successive days of June 12 to 18, and that the programme sequence shall be:

FIRST DAY — Saturday, June 12, 1971. Event No. 1: 31st Australian National Champion of Champions Cup followed by \$300 value Double Barrel Handicap (time permitting).

SECOND DAY — Sunday, June 13, 1971. Event No. 2: 19th Australian National Double Barrel Championship and shot in conjunction . . . 24th Australian National Intermediate Double Barrel Championship.

THIRD DAY — Monday, June 14, 1971. Event No. 3: 17th Australian National Single Barrel Championship and shot in conjunction . . . 2nd Australian National Intermediate Single Barrel Championship.

FOURTH DAY — Tuesday, June 15, 1971. Event No. 4: 10th Australia/New Zealand Championship followed by 12th Australia/New Zealand Trap Teams' Match followed by Event No. 5: \$300 value Double Barrel Handicap (time permitting).

FIFTH DAY — Wednesday, June 16, 1971. The Twenty-Fifth International Teams' Match followed by Event No. 6: 11th Australian National Double Rise Championship and shot in conjunction . . . 2nd Australian National Intermediate Double Rise Championship followed by Event No. 7: \$300 value Double Barrel Handicap (time permitting).

SIXTH DAY — Thursday, June 17, 1971. Event No. 8: The Twenty-Second Grand Australian Handicap and, time permitting a DB Handicap or Sweepstake then, time permitting Skeet Practice — 25 Targets.

SEVENTH DAY — Friday, June 18, 1971. Event No. 9: 2nd Australian National Skeet Championship followed by 6th Australia/New Zealand Skeet Teams' Match.

- 9. (a) High Gun (previous such winners excluded) shall be over the six events—Champion of Champions, Double Barrel, Double Rise, Single Barrel, Australia/New Zealand and Grand Australian kills only to count. Prize winners are not eligible for Yardage Awards.
- (b) Noted their appreciation to the makers of this fine trophy, Messrs Fabrique Nationale of Belgium. Such a "Browning" under-and-over shot gun trophy has been donated annually since 1966 and the agents, Commercial Marketing Co. Pty. Ltd. of Sydney, have already arranged that this shotgun shall be available at the commencement of the 1971 Nationals. The gun is an engraved Special Trap 5 gun and all previous winners of these trophies are excluded from the final selection.

10. Agreed to the N.Z.G.C.A. request to conduct the Australia/New Zealand Skeet Teams' Match for the first time in Australia. This is a five-man team event, shooting one round of 25 skeet targets. The team to consist of the five highest Australian scorers in the Australian National Skeet Championship.

11. Noted with appreciation that a perpetual high gun cup is to be donated for the first time by, prob-

ably Australia's outstanding shooter of the present day, J. Newton Thomas of Melbourne, who has won, at some stage or other, at least one of each major clay target shooting events conducted within the Commonwealth.

12. Recorded that a Stirling Broadrib trophy gun will be presented by Fuller Firearms of Sydney "to any New Zealander who wins any of the five annual Australian Championships."

At a resumption of the meeting, the committee:-

- 1. Agreed that a sub-committee of the Executive Committee shall select the referees for the International Teams' Match on the day prior to the match.
- 2. Decided that the 35th Annual General Meeting of the Association shall be held in the Clubhouse of the Brisbane Gun Club from 6 p.m. on Monday, June 14, 1971.
- 3. Welcomed the news that some overseas shooters would visit the 1971 Australian Championships.
- 4. Amended the National Championships trophy prize lists to bring all major events to a common basis to avoid the problems of trophy distribution and division. (NOTE full programme advertisement early 1971 shall also include descriptive local road map.)
- 5. Resolved that shooters be instructed that they check their scores before leaving the tracks, that scorers record only the decisions of the referees and that the Secretary's office totals all scoresheets and scores.
- 6. Resolved that traps cannot be altered without permission of the Shoot Marshal.
- 7. Agreed that a choice of shot gun cartridges shall be available from the cartridge controllers at a common price in exchange for receipts as issued by the A.C.T.A. Secretary.
 - 8. That gunsmiths shall be available on the grounds.
- Agreed that clay targets to be used during the 1971 National Championships shall be orange domed for down-the-line trap events and all black for the skeet events
- 10. Resolved that a Referee Discussion Night on rules interpretations be held at the Brisbane Gun Club on Friday night, June 11, under the chairmanship of Queensland Executive Committee Member, Mr W. A. Edwards, and two others, yet to be named, to assist in answering the questions.

- 11. Decided that the Shoot Marshal shall be Mr George Parker of Beerwah, Queensland and Assistant Shoot Marshal shall be Mr Harry Williamson of Apsley, Victoria.
- 12. Agreed that there shall be a Commonwealth Points Score, a State Points Score, a District Points Score and a Club Points Score Championship available on application by clubs under Trap Rule 27.

It was further agreed that these would be in rotation by starting off with a State that did not already have other similar Championships this year.

- 13. Agreed that the Brisbane Gun Club may instal a sixth down-the-line trap for use as a practice trap for the 1971 Australian National Championships.
- 14. Resolved that all Referees be reminded that they must keep abreast of the rules particularly those Referees not actively participating.

Further, that Referees holding a badge and not desiring to continue as a Referee, be asked to notify the A.C.T.A. Secretary and to return their badges.

15. Decided that until clubs have a suitable constitution lodged with the A.C.T.A., those clubs will not be entitled to be represented by a representative or delegate at the Annual General Meeting.

It was also noted that clubs without constitutions could not be covered under any Association insurance policy.

- 16. Decided that the existing handicap card be redesigned so that shooters can keep their own scores.
- 17. Decided that a direction from the Executive Committee be published in A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" that publication on minor shoots be of a limited nature and that culling of all details shall be at the discretion of the Secretary.
- 18. Noted that additional mailing costs shall be incurred with the new Australian Post Office mailing rates.
- 19. Expressed thanks to A.C.T.A. Secretary and staff.
- 20. Agreed that the next scheduled meeting of the Executive Committee shall be over Monday/Tuesday, October 11/12, 1971, at the Naval and Military Club, Melbourne.

Fred Lang also won the Warana Skeet Championship at Brisbane G.C., 25/25. The Executive Committee then decided that the following amendments to rules be effective as of January 1, 1971:—

DOWN-THE-LINE - TRAP

Rule 2 — add section "2 (b) — the 12 yard mark is to be measured from the top centre pivot point of the trap."

Rule 5 — both lines 7 and 10 — amend words "line" to read "lane."

Rule 5 — delete "oscillation" from the second last sentence. Sentence now to read — "The trap shall be mounted in a manner which will bring the top centre pivot point of the throwing arm 14 inches above the level of the centre line."

Rule 6, line 4 — amend "line" to read "lane."

Rule 6 add section 6 (b) — "where practical, three minimum distance pegs shall be placed at 45 yards."

Rule 45 — existing rule to be designated Rule 45 (a) and a further section 45 (b) be added "written examinations and tests may be arranged for down-the-line trap referee candidates in distant areas. Only clubs in areas without access to trap referee examiners may apply to the Secretary A.C.T.A., submitting names of registered shooter candidates."

Rule 56 — amend to read "The target shall be released instantly in response to the competitor's call of 'PULL'."

Tower — Rule 94 — delete first paragraph and substitute.

TOWER

94. Tower events shall be shot double barrel, both barrels equal value, 5 to 10 targets per competitor per visit to the tracks, squad system, competitors in a straight line left to right, with centre (No. 3) competitor standing in front of the centre of the tower. Whilst at the firing point the competitor must not turn towards the tower, but must face directly to the front throughout the competition.

Shooters stand nine feet apart at the rear of the concrete track, as for down-the-line trap shooting. The track is five feet from front to rear and each shooter must stand at the rear of this track until it is his turn to shoot. He then steps forward up to, but not over, the leading edge of the track which then puts him five feet in front of a vertical line from the centre pivot point of the trap. After shooting, he empties and breaks, or opens, his gun and returns to the rear of the track.

When Number 5 shooter has shot, he walks to the rear of the tower, around to number one station. (This takes no longer than an 18 yarder, on a down-the-line track, walking around the other shooters and also gives protection from the muzzle blast).

Rule 95 amend to read — "Possible deduction from sweepstakes by clubs in contests, shall be not more

than 50% (inclusive of targets)."

Rule 149 amend to read — Team 15 members. 10 highest scores to count. 50 targets per member from 18 yards double barrel, kills to count. 5 track, squad system, to be shot in two stages of 25 targets per visit, over one or two traps but two traps where possible. 5 targets from each track per member before changing tracks. In the event of a tie for High Gun, to be shot-off squad system, first miss-out. International load shells, 1½ oz. shot, No. 6 size or lighter, only

manual automatic or electric oscillating traps to be used.

158 (ii) Points Score Championships — (to be renumbered later). Commonwealth Points Score, State Points Score, District Points Score and Club Points Score Championships are available on application by clubs under Trap Rule 27 and shall be allocated in rotation, commencing with a State that does not already have other similar championships.

The events are to be conducted as for double barrel events with two barrels permitted. A first barrel kill scores three points, a second barrel kill scores two

points, and no points are scored for a miss.

Rule 158 (iii) Continental Championship Rules — (to be renumbered later). Continental Championships shall be shot single barrel and double barrel and shall be shot from the same yardage and rules as set out for Commonwealth, State and District Championships, EXCEPTING that the trap shall be set as follows:

HEIGHT OF TARGETS

Low target shall be thrown 5 ft. above the level of the centre lane at a point 10 yards from the trap, with a tolerance of 6 in. above or below.

HIGH TARGET

Shall be thrown 16 ft. above the **level** of the **centre** lane, at a point 10 yards from the trap, with a tolerance of 12 in. above or below.

DISTANCE

The low target shall be thrown a minimum 50 yards and a maximum 55 yards.

ANGLES

The flight of targets shall at unknown angles be thrown a maximum 45 deg. and minimum 35 deg. right and left of the centre line.

Rule 196 amend to read — "All rules and conditions are applicable to both standard target and mini target

events."

Rule 201 amend to read — CHAMPIONSHIP TROPHY VALUE (inclusive of badge or sash) for Commonwealth Championships is fixed by the Association at minimum \$50 retail value. Similarly, with State Championships, the amount fixed for trophies (inclusive of sash or badge) is fixed at minimum \$40 retail value. In District and Club Championships, the minimum retail value is left optional and at the discretion of the club conducting the event.

TRAP Rule 203 (handicapping formula) at commencement after "effective," add, "with the exception that, at any shoot, if there are less than twelve shooters and thus, only small events can be conducted, then such programme is not to be counted for handicapping

purposes."

Rule 203 (handicapping formula) amend bold

heading to read:-

"CASH OR MINIMUM RETAIL TROPHY VALUE WINS AND DIVISIONS (Obtained in ONE EVENT OR AS A TOTAL IN ONE DAY)."

Rule 204 — before the final DEFINITION add:— The following will apply to all yardages:

A win or division or equivalent trophy value of \$101 to \$300, 2 yards back.

A win or division or equivalent trophy value of \$301 to \$400, 3 yards back.

A win or division or equivalent trophy value of \$401 or more, 4 yards back.

December, 1970-4

SKEET

Rule 71 amend to read — If the first target lost be the first target of an irregular double, when the 2nd target is released broken or when the competitor is deprived of the opportunity of shooting at a 2nd target then a proof double shall first be fired upon to determine the result of the second target, and then the first target lost shall be repeated as a single and scored as the 25th target.

Rule 74 — delete existing rule and substitute "no target shall be called when one of a pair is thrown broken OR when only one target is thrown instead of a pair."

Rule 84 — existing rule to be designated Rule 84 (a) and a further section 84 (b) added "written examinations and tests may be arranged for skeet referee candidates in distant areas. Only clubs in areas without access to skeet referee examiners may apply to the Secretary, A.C.T.A., submitting names of registered shooter candidates."

Rule 101 — CHAMPIONSHIP TROPHY VALUE (inclusive of badge or sash) for Commonwealth Championships is fixed by the Association at minimum \$50 retail value. Similarly, with State Championships, the amount fixed for trophies (inclusive of sash or badge) is fixed at minimum \$40 retail value. In District and Club Championships the value of trophies is left optional and at the discretition of the club conducting the event.

Rule 103 amend to read — Conditions for all open skeet championships: Commonwealth, two rounds of 25 targets (= 50 targets). State = minimum one round of 25 targets (= 25 or 50 targets). District = one round of 25 targets.

Rule 104 amend to read — Maximum nominations shall be: Commonwealth = \$5 per shooter. State = \$4 per 25 targets OR if 50 targets are used then nomination shall be \$5. District = \$3 per shooter.

Rule 107 — line two, insert "minimum" before figure 25 and again insert "minimum" inside the bracket, becoming "(minimum one round)."

A.C.T.A. Rules require that all Commonwealth, State and District Titles, plus any event exceeding \$100 value, must be applied for on the prescribed form. The lodging of only a proposed advertisement merely holds up the procedure and involves return mails.

Enamelled metal championship badges are struck by the makers only against firm orders by A.C.T.A. office. Club Secretaries only may request these badges, using the prescribed form. The badges will be of the standard A.C.T.A. insignia with the surround, containing the year, the championship title, the winner's initials and name. Such lettering on the surround will be in the following colors:

Commonwealth Championships = Blue; State = Red; District = White; Club = Green. Clubs are charged for each badge ordered.

Championship SASHES only may be ordered direct from the makers by Club Secretaries. Recommended and official makers are W. FLATTELY & SON, 11 ORR STREET, CARLTON, 3053. Colors for the respective gradings of championships are AS FOR BADGES as shown above.

Break badges in cloth form are available for \$1.00, but only where score sheets, as submitted by the Club Secretary on the prescribed form, clearly show the shooter has earned this right. Break badges are for 50, 75, 100, 150, 200, 250 and 300 breaks.

Available on request by Club Secretaries at nominal prices are:

- (a) A.C.T.A. pocket insignia on navy cloth background;
- (b) A.C.T.A. ties with embroided insignia on navy background;
- (c) A.C.T.A. tie bars;
- (d) A.C.T.A. metal car badges;
- (e) Club shoot record books;
- (f) Club shoot report forms (padded) for "News;"
- (g) Trap (D.T.L.) score sheets (padded);
- (h) Skeet score sheets (padded);
- (i) A.C.T.A. trap (D.T.L.) and skeet shooting rules.

Throughout all sports in all countries, some contestants must move on to greater achievements or scores than others, BUT, all have one common happening — the practice which developed these skills was developed and made available at a small club. Each small club is an essential part of our being and each club provides and contributes to the heart throb of our Association. 1970 AUSTRALIAN INTERSTATE SKEET TEAMS' MATCH

Both the Queensland and New South Wales teams shot 470/500, but on a countback under Skeet Rule 113, the winning team is Quensland who clearly won the first 15 targets.

Originally teams of 5 but now teams of 10 members, 10 scores to count, 50 targets per member, shot in two rounds of 25 targets. In the event of teams scoring ties then the countback system is applied to achieve a decision

Team members with tie scores are positioned after applying the countback system.



Open season for protected game shooting throughout the Commonwealth during 1971

Today, in all civilised countries, the taking of fauna is a controlled privilege, not an inherent right. Native fauna is at all times the property of the Crown and is (a) permanently protected, (b) protected, or (c) pest fauna.

The sale of wild game is forbidden in most States and eggs must not be taken for any purpose.

Complete information is available from the various State departments as listed. Licences may be obtained from these addresses or from the various police stations.

Western Australia

Department of Fisheries and Fauna, 108 Adelaide Terrace, Perth, 6000, from whom a free guide is available.

All visiting interstate or overseas shooters should present handicap cards, identification papers and firearms at the first police station encountered in Western Australia for licensing.

Wild Ducks — from 6 p.m. Saturday, December 18, 1970, until 8 p.m. Sunday, January 10, 1971. Bag limit 8 ducks per day.

Quail — two open seasons for Stubble Quail but all other species of quail are protected.

- (a) In all that part of the State lying north of the 30th parallel, the season is usually December 1, through to March 31.
- (b) South of that parallel, the season usually opens March 1, through to June 30.

South Australia

Department of Fisheries and Fauna Conservation, Box 901E, G.P.O., Adelaide, 5001. No person shall—

- (a) shoot at animals or birds on any Sunday;
- (b) have a gun in his possession on any Sunday for the purpose of shooting at animals or birds on that day;
 - (c) traps, nets, snares, nooses are prohibited.

Gun licences cost \$2 annually to those over 18 years. A firearms licence for persons under 18 years must be obtained from a Police Station. Gun licences do **not** authorise persons to shoot without the consent of the owner or occupier.

Dates awaiting confirmation and gazetting are:-

Duck Season — 5 a.m., Saturday, February 20, until 10 p.m., Saturday, June 26, 1971.

Bag limit 12 ducks per person per day of the following species only — Wood Duck (Maned Goose, Black, Mountain, Grey Teal, Blue-Winged Shoveller, Pink-Eared, White-Eyed, Chestnut.

Note: Musk, Blue-Billed and Freckled Ducks must not be taken.

Quail Season — 4 a.m., Saturday, April 3, until 10 p.m., Saturday, July 24, 1971.

Bag limit 25 per person per day.

Snipe Season — The Australian (Japanese) Snipe Season opened October 3, 1970 and closes 5 p.m., Saturday, March 6, 1971.

Special Note: No ducks of the species listed above may be sold at any time and all ducks, quail and snipe taken alive during the open season must be released when the season closes.

Northern Territory

Animal Industry Branch, Northern Territory Administration, P.O. Box 291, Alice Springs, 5750.

All firearms must be declared at the nearest police station into Northern Territory for licensing and/or registering within two days of entry.

Ducks and Geese (except Magpie Geese, Burdekin Ducks and Pigmy Geese) — open season in all of Northern Territory, north of the 18th parallel of south latitude, from July 1, till October 30, annually.

Magpie Geese open season in all of Northern Territory north of the 18th parallel of South latitude from August 1, to December 30, each year.

Buffalo and marine crocodile or red kangaroo are now protected over the entire Northern Territory and may be shot only under licence.

Other partly protected animal species may be taken after procurement of special licences.

Pests which may be destoryed at any time, other than in sanctuaries, include Feral (wild) rabbits, donkeys, pigs, camels, cats, goats, foxes, dingoes, wedge-tailed eagles and snakes of all species.

Victoria

Fisheries and Wildlife Department, 605 Flinders Street, Melbourne, 3000.

Expected 1971 game season dates are — Wild Ducks — From 5 a.m., February 20, to April 24. Quail (Stubble Quail only) — From March 6, to March 27 and from May 1, to June 26. Snipe (Jack Snipe only) — From July 1, to May 31.

These dates will be confirmed approximately two weeks prior to the opening of the respective seasons.

Game (Duck) Licence \$2.

To carry or discharge a firearm over any property in Victoria without the landholders consent is an offence.

Tasmania

Animals and Birds Protection Board, 127 Bathurst Street, Hobart (G.P.O. Box 422E, 7001).

Game seasons are reviewed annually during the Board's November meetings, however, it has been decided that the snipe open season shall be from October 3, 1970, through to January 31, 1971.

Open seasons for other game in 1970 were Wild Duck — March 7, to May 31, licence \$2, bag limit 12 per day.

Mutton Bird — South: 10 a.m., March 28, to April 30.

Mutton Bird - North: March 27, to April 30.

Licence Fee and Bag Limit — Commercial Licence (North only) \$15, no limit; Non-Commercial (Season) Licence (North only) \$5, no bag limit; Day Licence (whole of State), \$2, 25 birds in South, 50 birds in North.

Note: North and South are designated by a line running from Sandy Cape on the West Coast to Eddystone Point on the East Coast. Birding on Petrel Islands, Bass Strait restricted to Day Licence only.

Wallaby — April 1 to November 30, Crown Land Licence \$2; Forrester Kangaroo wholly protected, Bennetts and Rufus Wallaby only may be taken.

Black Swan — April 18 and 19 (two days). Licence \$2. Bag Limit 3 per day — with complete adult plumage.

Water Rat — May 1, to July 31; Licence to take and sell is 50 cents.

Brown Quail — May 2, to May 31. Licence \$1. Bag Limit 24 per day.

Brush Possum — Licence to take and sell from Crown and Private land \$2.

Male Pheasant — King Island only, June 6, to 15. Licence \$2, no bag limit.

Snipe — October 3, 1970, to January 31, 1971, State-wide Licence \$2, no bag limit.

Closed Seasons — there were no open seasons during 1970 for Cape Barren Geese or Wattle Birds.

New South Wales

National Parks and Wildlife Service, ADC Building, 189 Kent Street, Sydney, 2000.

Written authority is necessary from the landholder. Game (Duck) Licence \$2.

Details not available unless specifically requested. (Editor's Note: A.C.T.A. asked for the information but has received nothing in reply at date of publication.)

Queensland

Department of Primary Industries, William Street, Brisbane, 4000.

The only game in Queensland are wild duck and the decision for an open season is made annually.

Shooters must obtain prior permission from the owner or occupier of the land concerned.

All islands forming part of the State of Queensland and certain other areas have been declared sanctuaries.

Wild Ducks — Bag Limit 15 per day per person.

An open season may be declared from time to time for Black Duck (or Grey or Brown), Grey Teal (Wood, Slender), Hardhead (White-Eyed, White-Winged, Barwing, Brownhead), Maned Goose (Wood Duck), Plumed Tree Duck, Whistling Tree Duck.

An open season is never declared for Green Pigmy Goose, White-Quilled Pigmy Goose (Teal); White-Headed Shelduck (Burdekin or Mangrove), Pied Goose Magpie, Black/White, Blue-Winged Shoveller (Spoonbill, Stinker), Chestnut Teal (Chestnut-Breasted, Green-Headed, Black or Mountain Teal), Musk Duck (Mould Goose), Pink-Eared Duck (Zebra, Pink-Eyed, Widgeon), Black Swan.


