

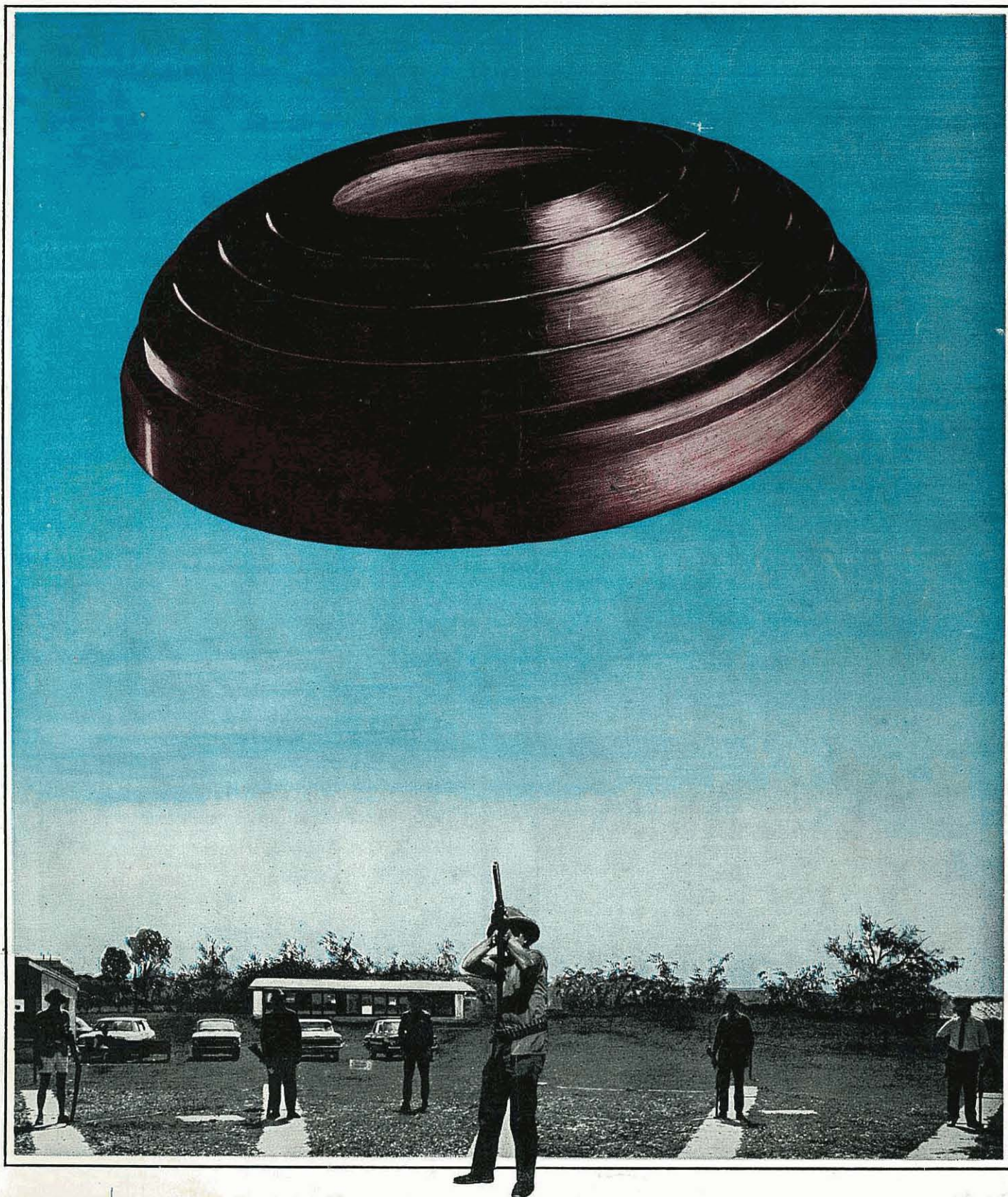

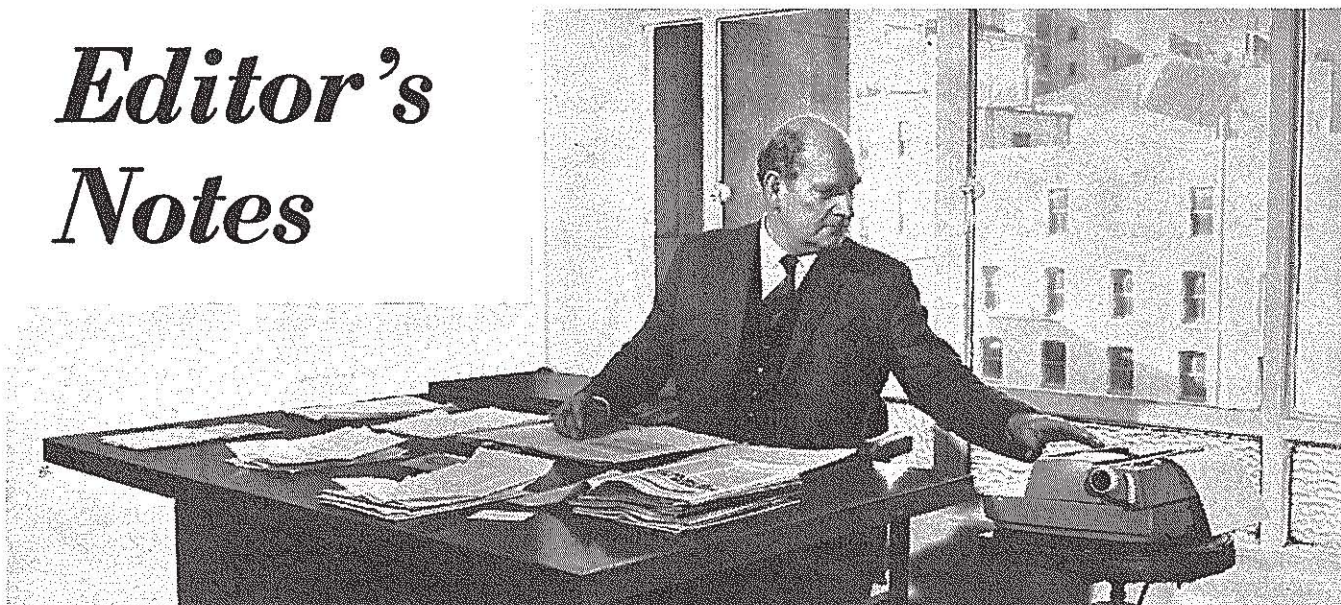

DELEGATE APPOINTMENT

Affiliated units of the A.C.T.A. are reminded that they are entitled to one delegate (Article 15) to represent their interests at the Annual Meeting. However, delegates can only be accepted providing the Association "Articles of Association" are complied with. This involves the completion of the necessary forms, namely "Acceptance of Membership" (Article 5 (a)), "Nomination of Representative" (Article 21) (in the case of a corporate club), or "Nomination of Delegate" (Articles 5 (c) and 16) (in the case of an unincorporated club), followed finally by "Notice of Acceptance of Delegates." Official printed forms as applicable are obtainable from the A.C.T.A. office. It should be noted that nomination of a representative or member delegate can only be accepted providing all subscriptions and monies due by either the nominee or the club, to the Association, have been paid as provided for in Article 49.

It is also pointed out that where a representative or delegate has been appointed previously, and this has not been officially rescinded, the appointment as previously made will stand, until the Association is advised or instructed otherwise. In accordance with the Articles of Association, clubs cannot appoint a delegate other than on the prescribed form (letters are unacceptable).

Each 1971 financial affiliated member club has been mailed a Delegate Card (for unincorporated clubs) or a Representative Card (for incorporated clubs). These cards must be presented by the respective financial shooters concerned to obtain permission to attend and be eligible to vote at future annual general meetings.

1971 ANNUAL MEETING

The 1971 annual meeting of affiliated club delegates and representatives of member clubs will be held in the club rooms of the Brisbane Gun Club, Queensland, at 6 p.m. on Monday, June 14, 1971.

Only such items as submitted within the Association Articles and published on the Agenda shall be discussed. A.C.T.A. Secretary shall be available at 5.30 p.m.

February, 1971—1

The 1971 New Zealand National Championships shall be conducted at Hamilton from March 27, to April 3 inclusive. Hamilton is in the North Island, near Auckland.

The 1971 Australian National Clay Target Championships shall be conducted at Brisbane, Queensland over the seven successive days of June 12 to June 18.

Some clubs write letters to Referee Examiners stating that their candidates will be available at their own clubs. All concerned are asked to remember that Referee Examiners whilst being kindly and knowledgeable are also honorary. Clubs must submit their candidates as being able to be examined at any club layout.

In 1968 the general postal rate increased from 4 cents to 5 cents for each letter. This was a 25 per cent cost increase. On 1/10/1970, this postal rate increased from 5 cents to 6 cents for each letter. This was a further 20 per cent increase. Bulk mailing, in the past, enjoyed special rates — this was for publications and similar communications. This newest rate has increased the cost of mailing one large motoring magazine by \$100,000 to \$185,000 a year. Our own A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" shall cost a further \$2,000 to mail from now on.

The 1971 handicap cards have columns for shooters to maintain a progressive self record of shooting scores so that a percentage of kills is readily available.

Shoot-off scores are **not** to be included. The scores recorded are only to be those in the event itself thus 16/20 or 14/15, etc. Some may seek to include shoot-off scores but please be advised that these would produce incomprehensible statistical phenomena.

A number of clubs are showing trophy values on handicap cards far, far below those they forwarded to A.C.T.A. records. Also, shooters discuss and pass on the information one to another. In some instances these are simple errors. In other instances they are simply favoritism. These acts are ridiculing a good handicapping system for the sake of a few, as in reality, such errors merely penalise all the rest of A.C.T.A. registered shooters. The sooner that Association member clubs, as a whole abide by these rules OR that we decide to adopt a system based on progressive skills (and not luck on any day), then the better it will be for all.

How many of us can follow our own handwriting? How do others read or interpret our handwriting? Frankly, some of the shoot reports received leave a lot to be desired. Some words are colorful but are not in the dictionaries. Many reports require checking with our records for correct shooter names as the handwriting is insufficiently clear. The printers like ourselves are busy, and cannot afford time loss. One recent report took fourteen lines to describe an event with 5/7, yes, five broken targets from seven thrown targets! We even had to ask one report writer to purchase a new ribbon as the typewriting received was only an impression on the paper.

John W. Garner, head of Urban Coalition of USA, warned in his book "Excellence" — "The society which scorns excellence in plumbing because plumbing is a humble activity and tolerates shoddiness in philosophy because it is an exalted activity, will have neither good plumbing nor good philosophy. Neither its pipes nor its theories will hold water."

On November 22, 1970, Hawkesbury Gun Club in conjunction with the Windsor Rotary Club, staged the second of a yearly series of firearms "Safe Handling" demonstrations.

The idea was prompted by several shooting "accidents" in the district and it was decided to try to pass on to the public some of the simple safety precautions carried out at gun clubs and show how these could be applied in the home and field.

Aided by good advance publicity in the local press the demonstration was an outstanding success with over 300 people in attendance. Potential accident locations were created such as climbing through fences, removing firearms from cars, etc., and the crowd were

shown how with a little carelessness someone could get shot and then by applying a few simple rules their actions could be made quite safe.

The club was congratulated after the demonstration by local civic leaders and the press. As well as the possibility of saving some persons life, I believe that a more agreeable public opinion of firearms now exists in our district.

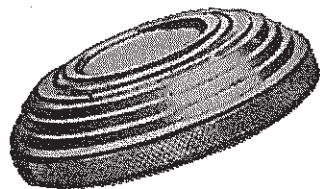

May I thank IMI for the assistance they gave in financial help with advertising and the provision of some 400 safety booklets that were distributed after the demonstration.

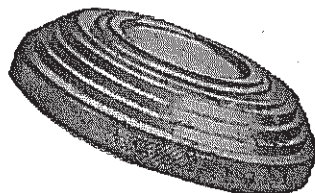
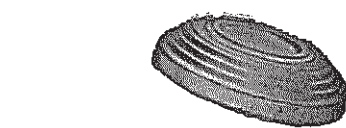

SAFETY PROCEDURES

All affiliated A.C.T.A. member clubs and their registered shooters are familiar with and do constantly put into practice the SAFETY procedures that have been handed down to us from our forbears.

Constant attention to these methods provides the training and confidence required by our sons and daughters so that they in turn can follow their chosen sports with the utmost satisfaction and confidence.

It is the application of these self-imposed procedures that becomes our aim in bringing out the best of all competitors. Safety procedures go hand in hand with competitor satisfaction.

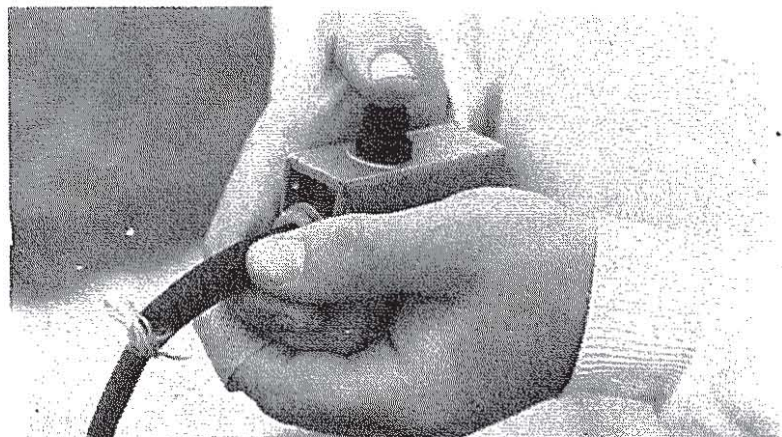
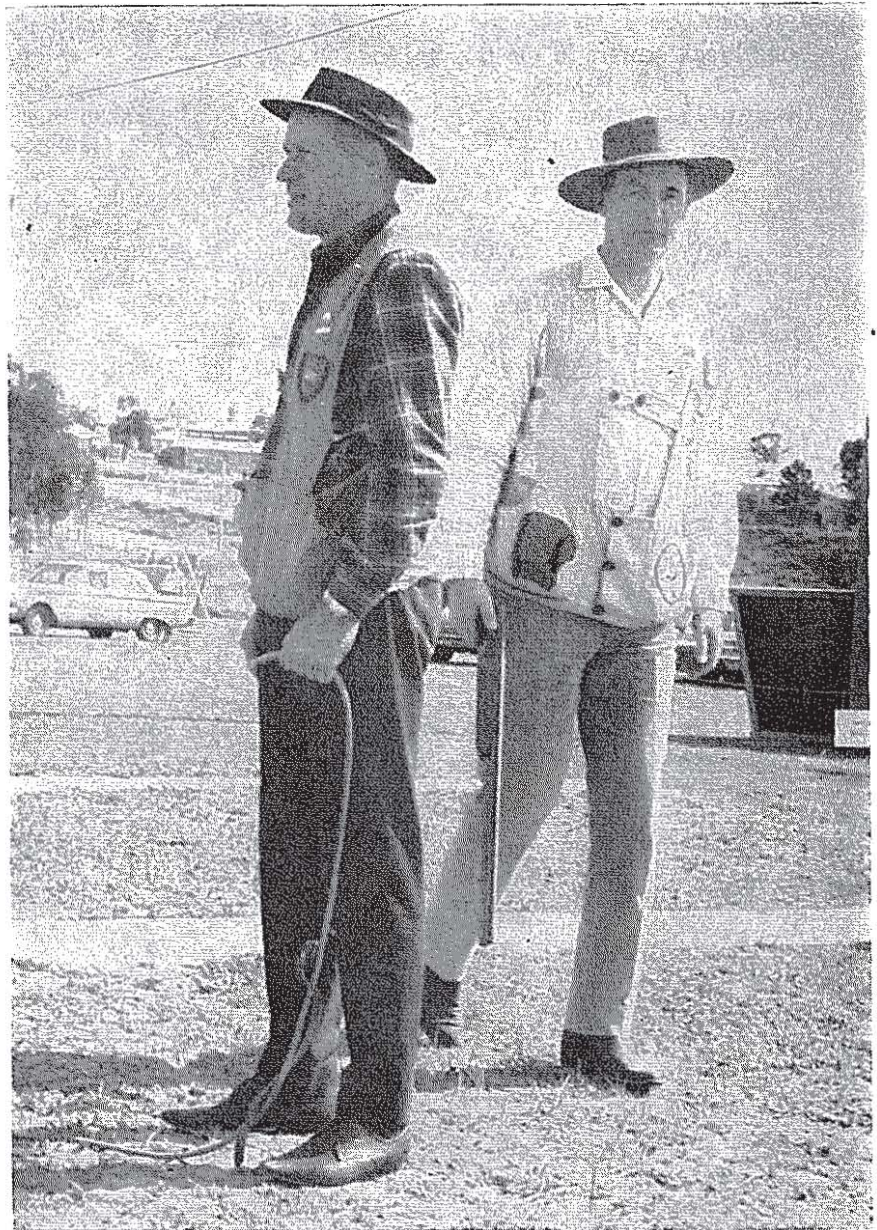
From time to time we shall publish various aspects of shotgun shooting procedures. Although these aspects may principally portray the two accepted methods of clay target shooting, that is down-the-line (or trap) shooting and skeet shooting, we are also covering field shooting, as many of us are still ardent field shooters for furred or feathered game and the safe gun handling procedures are common throughout such usages.

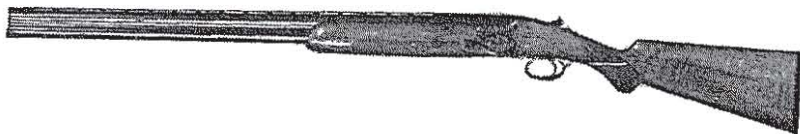
The following sequence of photographs provides a pictorial basis for the training of newcomers to clay target shooting, and the procedures are world wide.

Right: The referee stands at the rear of the shooters, between the tracks, so that he has an uninterrupted view at all times of the tracks, the shooters and the shoot procedure. The decision of the referee is final and he is solely in charge of all operations on the shooting tracks. Shooters when moving to the tracks must keep clear of the referee.

Below right: The **WRONG** way to hold and release the target from an electric release trap. Using the tip of the thumb or the tip of any finger frequently produces a "SLOW PULL."

Below: The correct way to release a button for the instant flight of a target from an electric release trap.

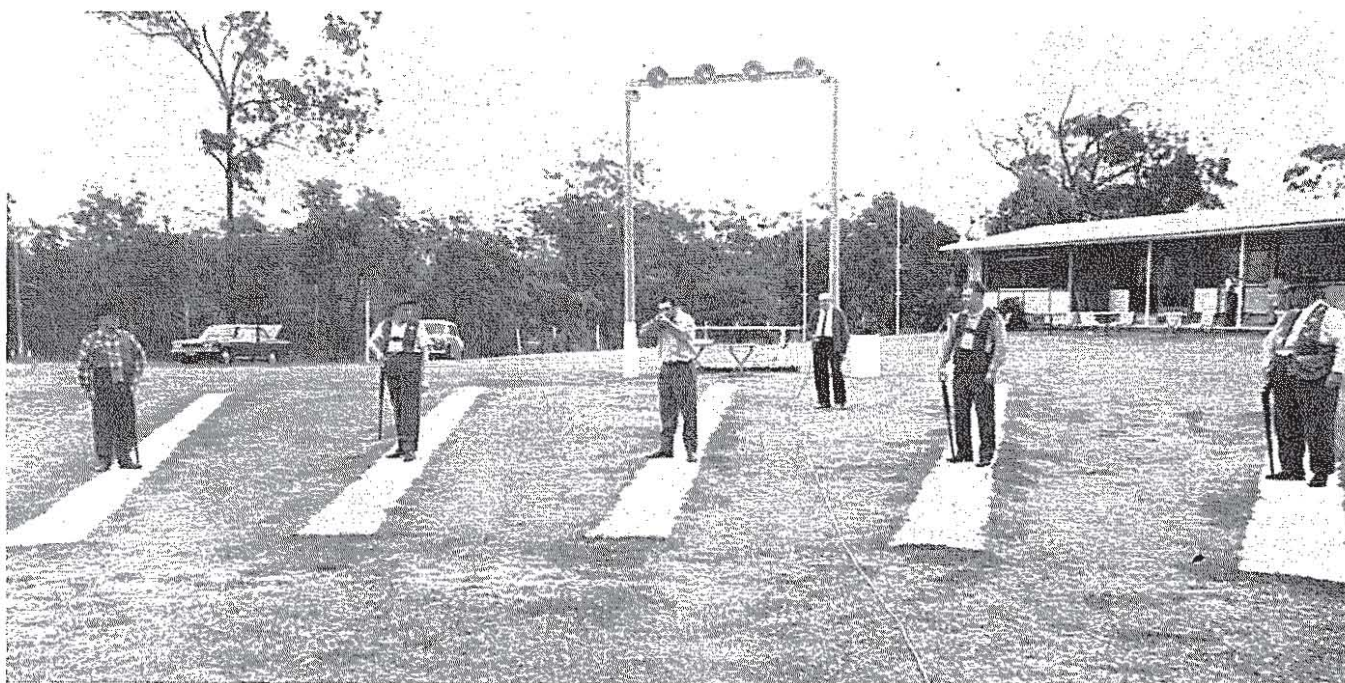




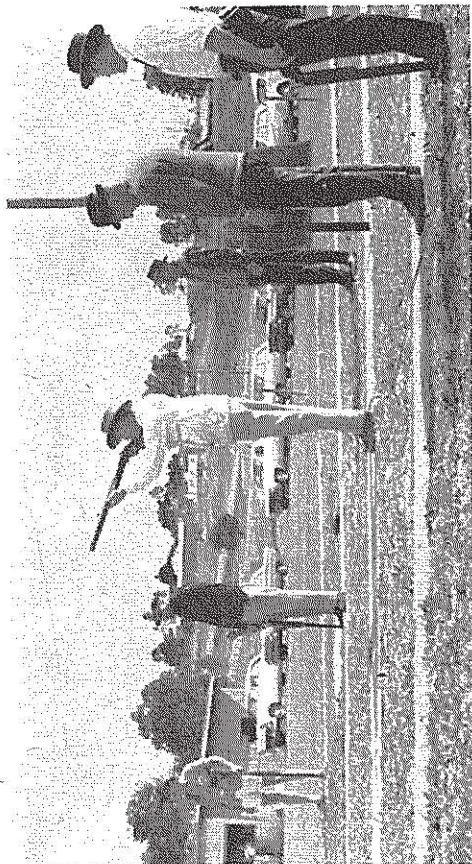
A squad of down-the-line trap shooters in action. Shooter number one (on the right of the picture,) has taken his shot. Shooter number two on track two is taking aim for his shot. Note that shooters one and five are left-handed shooters.



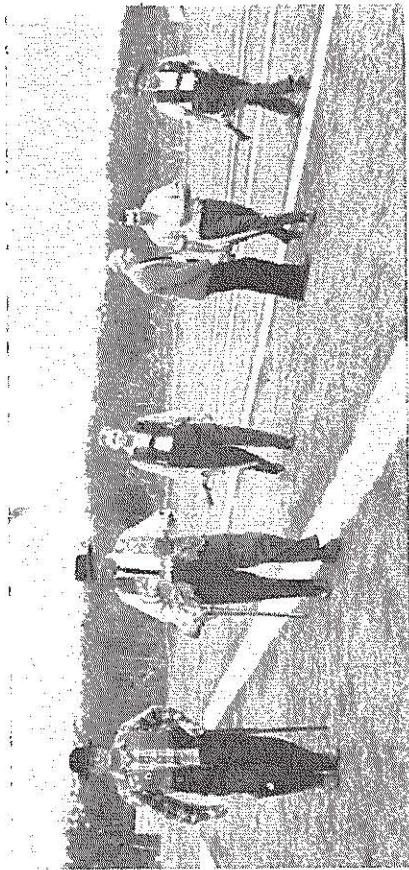
This man might be a successful grazier type but he also knows when and how to place his empty shotgun safely and carefully in the gun rack.



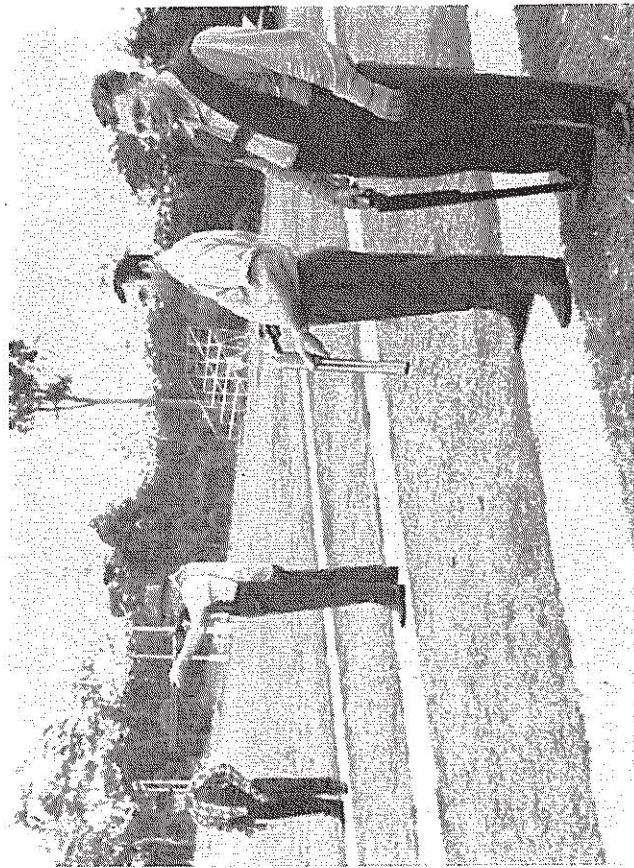
A squad of shooters during a down-the-line event. Reading from right to left—shooters on tracks one and two have shot, shooter one is turning ready to move to track two. Shooter two is waiting for shooter three (on centre track) to take his shot. Note the positions of the unloaded guns of these first and second shooters. The shooter on track four is watching for the correct moment to completely raise his gun to be loaded, then aimed at his target. On the extreme left of the picture is the last shooter of the squad on track five. He is a left hand shooter for whom the waiting, loading, aiming and gun carrying procedures are as for all other shooters. The referee is in his correct position slightly to the rear of the shooters and standing between tracks two and three with the trap electric release button held in the ready position.



A squad of trap shooters showing shooter number three taking aim for his shot. Shooter number one has quietly moved from track one to a position to the rear of shooter number two.



The squad has completed its shooting and each shooter member is free to talk and move to the rear of the tracks so that the next squad may form and shoot. The referee has placed his electric button and card on the ground and has announced clearly for the squad to hear "shooters please check your scores." NOTE: The scorer is out of this picture but is always at the rear of the referee where he listens only to the referee's call which he records as so directed.



Shooter number four on track four has taken aim and is about to fire his shotgun watched by the next shooter on track five. Note that shooter three has raised his unloaded and broken gun to a safe carrying position. Shooter two has moved across ready to take his mark or position as soon as shooter three moves to track four.



Shooter number four is taking his shot from track five. Shooter number five has moved quietly and without talking, across at the rear of the other shooters to track one, without interfering with the others of the squad and is ready to load his shotgun with the two shells ready in his hand when shooter four has completed his shot

Below: Shooter number five on track five having fired at his allotted target and with his empty shotgun in the safe carry position turns and walks across to track one ready to commence the second round in the event. Note that he walks to the rear of other shooters and that shooter number four moves at the same time across to his next position on track five.



The shooting sequence has passed successfully from track one through tracks two, three and four and now shooter number five is loading his shotgun as it is his turn to shoot from his correct firing point. His feet are completely within the 3 foot square firing point allotted to him.

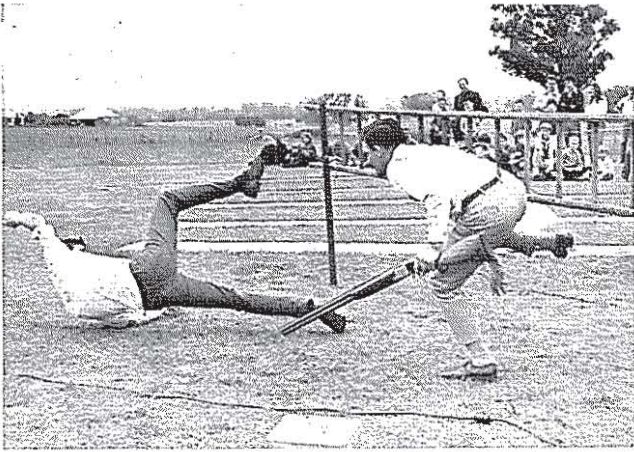

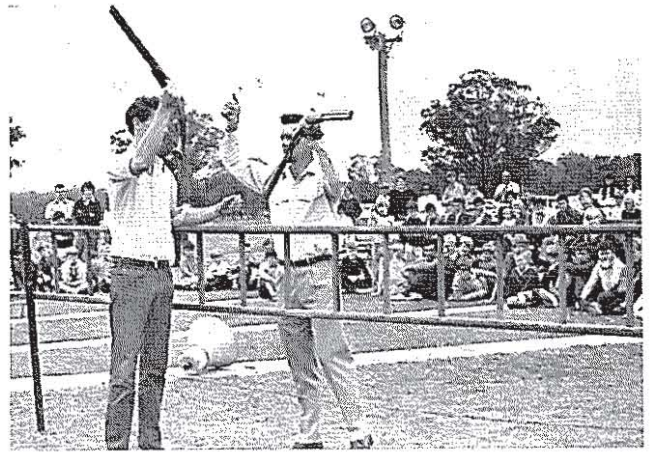

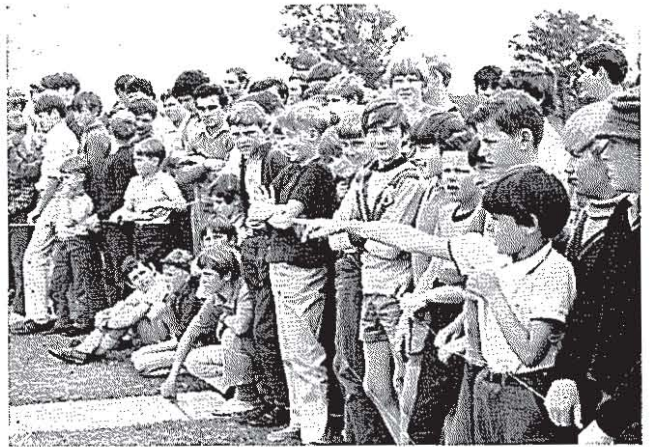

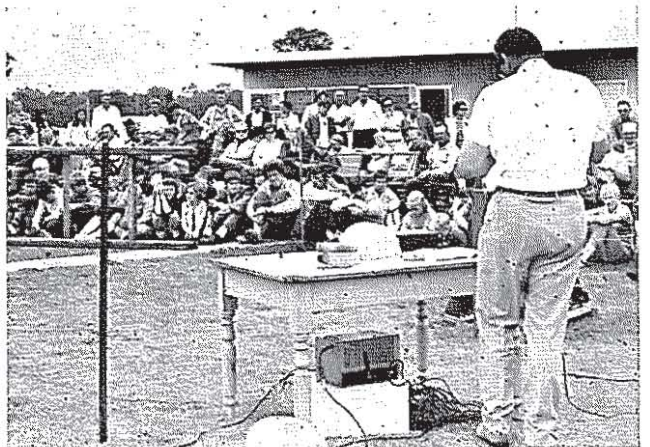
