

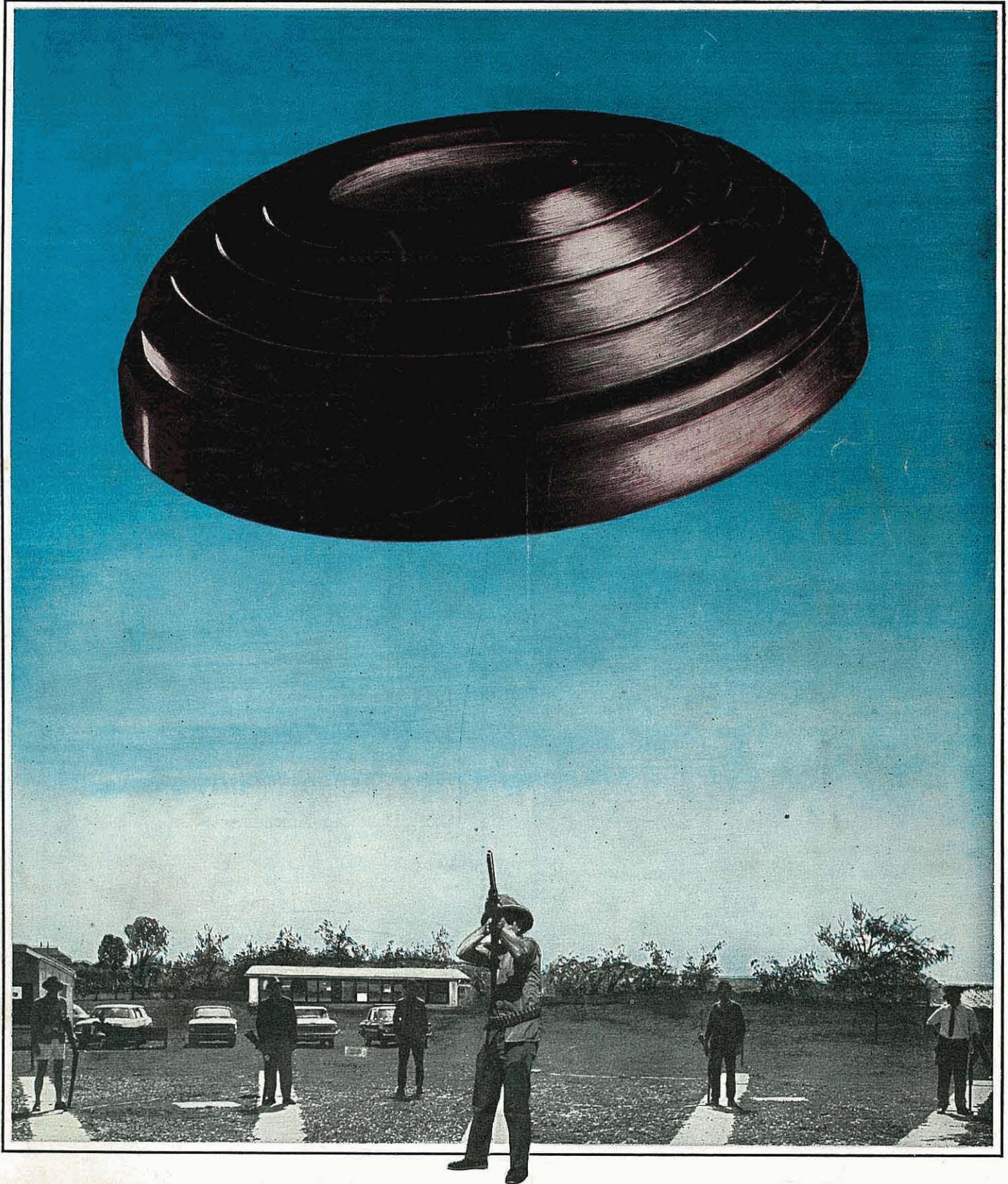

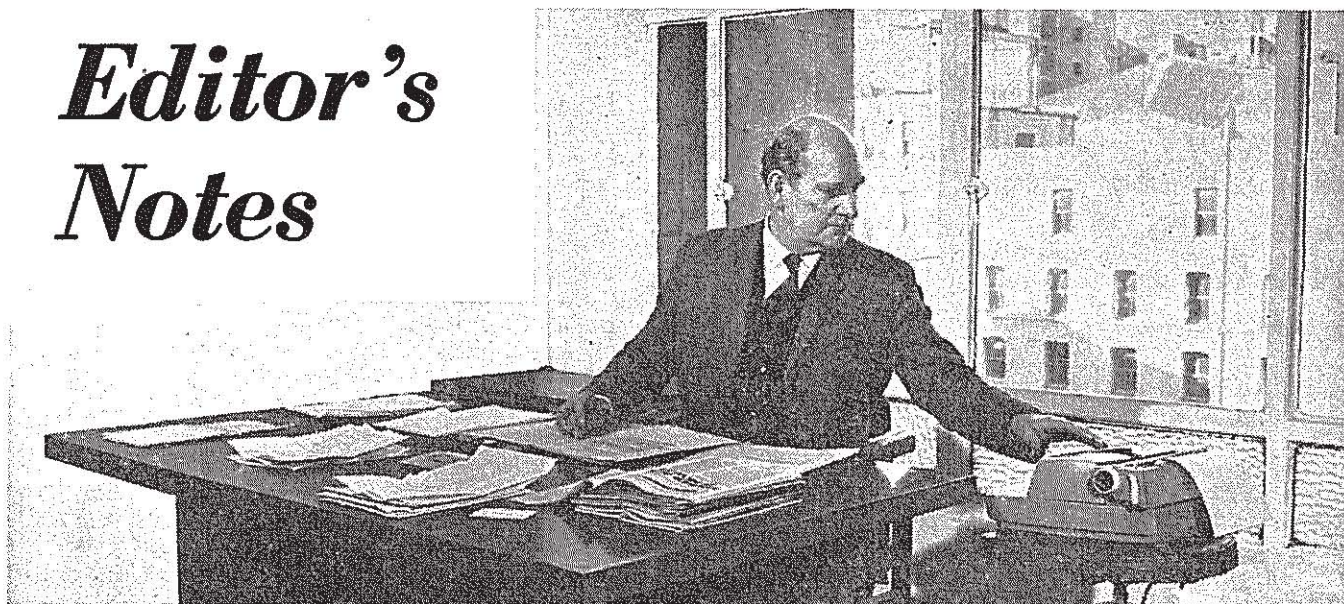

Editor's Notes



The A.C.T.A. 1971 National Clay Target Championships and the International Teams' Match (Australian Section) shall be conducted by the Association at the grounds of the Brisbane Gun Club, Queensland, commencing 8 a.m. daily over the seven successive days of Saturday, June 12 through to p.m. Friday, June 18.

The programme (which includes the Queen's Birthday holiday on the Monday) has been extended, to avoid a carry-over of any event, by having one major event each day. All shooting will cease daily around 4.30 p.m. because of approaching darkness. Where possible, \$300 value handicap events shall be conducted. Five down-the-line traps will be in use throughout the trap programme whilst a sixth trap may be available for practice — this shall be made known daily by the shoot marshals. Clay targets in the trap events shall be orange domed.

Shooters from America and New Zealand have arranged to be with us and many old and new acquaintances shall be met.

The **first day Saturday**, will see the winner of the coveted Champion of Champions Cup event. This is shot from 20 yards and is open to all registered shooters. The 1970 winner was Douglas Smith of Queensland 115/115.

A newly adopted teams match shall then have taken place. This shall be a 10 shooter teams match, consisting of the ten best Australian scores in our National Champion of Champions Cup event. These scores shall then be mailed to the Secretary of the South African Clay Target Association for comparison with their ten best scores in South Africa's Championships probably August 5, 6 and 7, 1971. The teams match for 1971 was suggested by South African President Mr Cyril Emphy and agreed to by Australian Honorary Vice-President Mr Jules Steiner, with the approval of A.C.T.A. President Mr Gordon Hall. South African clubs conduct their shooting programmes

principally from February to November each year. (Mr Steiner has just returned from an extensive European and African tour. He shot with and discussed all Olympic shooting with the World Shooting Federation — International Shooting Union — committeemen).

On the **second day, Sunday**, the National Double Barrel Championship will be conducted off 16 yards. This is essentially a British or Australian event as many countries shoot mainly single barrel events. The 1970 winner was Jim Ellis of New South Wales 370/370. In conjunction with this event will be the National Intermediate Double Barrel Championship, limited to shooters whose handicap does not exceed 16 yards on that day. The 1970 National Intermediate Double Barrel Champion was Jim Bailey of Western Australia. Shoot-offs to determine the winners of the National DB and Intermediate DB Championships shall be conducted separately and in that order.

Day three, Monday, shall commence with the National Single Barrel Championship, which was won in 1970 by Jim Ellis with 50/50 after he had already won the National DB event. This 1971 event shall be followed by the National Intermediate Single Barrel Championship, from contestants whose handicap is 16 yards or less on that day. The 1970 National Intermediate Single Barrel Champion was Chas F. Russell of Western Australia 49/50.

Day four, Tuesday, will commence with the Australia/New Zealand Championship. The winner of this points scoring event in 1970 was J. Newton Thomas of Victoria with 180/180 consecutive targets.

This will be followed by the Australia/New Zealand Trap Teams Match. This is a six man team event comprised of the best six Australian scorers in the ANZ Championship event versus six New Zealand shooters as chosen by the New Zealand team captain. For the match they shall each shoot at 20 targets from the 16 yard mark and should there be a tie score then they shall shoot off at 10 targets per shooter until one

team survives. Cartridges for this event are to be provided by the contestants.

In 1970 the event was shot in New Zealand and was won by a New Zealand team with a total score of 116/120 targets.

Time permitting a \$300 value handicap may then follow.

The fifth day, Wednesday, will commence with the Australian Section of the International Teams Match for the Mackintosh Trophy. This is a 30 man team event and each member will have won his place in the team from his scores over the previous three days. A distinctive badge will be given to each of the 30 members of the Australian team. Any shooter who has been selected for the team, because of his progressive scores in the National DB, SB and ANZ events, shall not be entitled to a team badge unless he competes in the actual team match. Immediately following this team match, the National Double Rise Championship will be conducted (1970 winner was N. Johnson of Queensland 48/50), whilst in conjunction will be the National Intermediate Double Rise Championship (1970 winner was R. Ritchie of Western Australia). Contestants in this Intermediate DR event are limited to those whose down-the-line trap handicap does not exceed 16 yards on that day.

The sixth day, Thursday, will commence with the Grand Australian Handicap, open to all registered shooters who must shoot from their own registered handicap ratings as at that day. The 1970 winner was Barney Rooke of Wagga, NSW with 56/56. Subject to time available, a trap handicap or sweepstake event may be conducted and this will then conclude all scheduled down-the-line trap shooting events for the programme. It may also be possible to conduct some skeet practice, subject to the time and light available, and this would be limited to one round of 25 targets per shooter, or less, as decided by the Committee.

The Highest Gun Scorer (kills only) over the six principal down-the-line trap events of the programme (Ch of Ch, DB, SB, ANZ, DR, Gd H'cap) shall receive, together with the A.C.T.A. High Gun Sash, an engraved Browning Special Trap 5 Shotgun with the compliments of the makers Messrs Fabrique Nationale of Belgium and their agents Messrs Commercial Marketing Co. Pty. Ltd. of Sydney.

Previous winners of a similar such high gun trophy in Australia or New Zealand are excluded from competing for this high gun trophy. The A.C.T.A. has passed its acknowledgment to the makers and their agents for this fine trophy.

The J. Newton Thomas Perpetual High Gun Cup shall be presented for the first time to the high gun winner of the six principal events who shall hold it until the 1972 National Championship series when it must be returned to the A.C.T.A. for further competition. Annually the name of each winner, with his score, shall be engraved on the cup. The trophy dates from 1966. Holders of this cup may not necessarily be "Browning Gun" high gun scorers because of any previous such wins.

A Stirling Broadrib trophy shotgun will be presented by Fuller Firearms of Sydney "to any New Zealand

shooter who wins any of the five annual Australian Championships." These five events concerned are the Ch of Ch, DB, SB, ANZ and DR events.

The seventh day, Friday, shall be for skeet shooting only and two skeet layouts, using black targets, shall be in operation. From 8 a.m. the National Skeet Championship shall be conducted (1970 winner was J. Newton Thomas 60/61). This shall be followed by the Australia/New Zealand Skeet Teams Match, consisting of five shooters per team, each shooting one round of 25 skeet targets of the quick round method. The Australian team shall consist of the six highest Australian shooter scorers in the National Skeet Championship. The New Zealand team shall be six New Zealand shooters as selected by the captain of the New Zealand shooting contingent. Cartridges for this event are to be provided by the contestants. The 1970 Australia/New Zealand Skeet Teams Match was shot in New Zealand. The New Zealand team won with the score of 119/125.

A Referee Discussion Night on rules interpretations shall be held at the Brisbane Gun Club on Friday night June 11 — this is the evening before the commencement of the National series. Any registered shooter or referee may attend. The chairman shall be Queensland Executive Committee member, Mr W. A. Edwards. He shall be assisted by two other Executive Committeemen, each of whom shall be a Referee Examiner. The discussion is designed to achieve a common interpretation of rules by shooters who meet possibly only annually. The meeting is not designed to reframe or alter any rule.

The 35th Annual General Meeting of the Association shall be held in the clubhouse of the Brisbane Gun Club from 6 p.m. on Monday, June 14, 1971, and all member club delegates or representatives shall receive due notice with the agenda of the meeting.

During the whole programme of the National series, the attention of all concerned is directed to the following arrangements and to the complete advertisement in this publication:—

1. The Shoot Marshal shall be Mr George Parker of Beerwah, Queensland.

2. The Assistant Shoot Marshal shall be Mr Harry Williamson of Apsley, Victoria.

3. Referees for the National Championships shall be published in April 1971 "Shooting News." No further applications are invited for either trap or skeet appointments.

4. Shooters must check their scores before leaving the tracks and scorers shall only record the decisions of the referees. Gun malfunctions (rules 67, 68 and 76) shall be recorded. The Secretary's office shall total, then issue all scores to the noticeboard for publication.

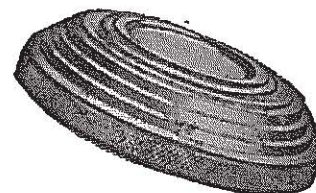
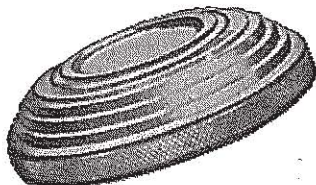
5. No trap, in either down-the-line or skeet events, shall be altered without the permission of the Shoot Marshals.

6. Shooters shall use only those branded cartridges, as sold by the Association, for the National Championship events. There shall be a choice of two brands

BALLISTICS

Part two — EXTERNAL BALLISTICS

Once the shot or bullet has left the gun the two things in which we are interested are the velocity and the direction in which it travels. I will consider these items separately, although they are, of course, related.

VELOCITY

The measurement of velocity has intrigued man since guns were invented. Mathematicians over the years have tried to calculate the velocity and this is reasonably easy providing one assumes that the projectile is moving in a vacuum. However, in air, the projectile is retarded by air resistance and the amount of resistance varies with the velocity. The variation is not a straight out mathematical formula, although the resistance does increase with velocity and not surprisingly there is a rapid increase when the projectile gets above the speed of sound. This is clearly shown in Fig. 1.

If one can measure the velocity of a projectile over various ranges it is easy to draw up a table giving the velocity and time of flight and one can then use this table for other projectiles by using a factor called the Ballistic Coefficient. The Ballistic Coefficient is virtually the ability of a projectile to overcome the air resistance. It is usually calculated by the formula—

$$\frac{W}{nd^2}$$

where W = weight of projectile in pounds
d = base diameter of unfired bullet
n = coefficient of form.

The "coefficient of form" depends upon the shape of the projectile and, roughly, the sharper the bullet the lower "n" is in value.

This all sounds very easy, the only problem being how does one find the velocity of a bullet at different ranges. Surprisingly enough this was solved by Benjamin Robins about 1750, when he invented the ballistic pendulum. This consisted of a large circular block of wood, suspended like a pendulum, into which the bullet was fired at different ranges. When the bullet hit the block, the energy of the bullet was transmitted to the block, causing it to swing like a pendulum and all one had to do was to measure the distance the block swings back and, knowing the mass of the bullet and the mass of the block, the calculation of the bullet velocity became a simple mathematical problem.

In 1897 Lord Cottesloe, following upon various other improvements on the Robins Pendulum, designed a new pendulum, which was installed at the private range of Colonel Henry Mellish of Hodsock Priory, England. In company with Colonel Mellish, Lord Cottesloe carried out many firings over a period of about two years and later on Mr F. W. Jones, O.B.E., used their results and produced a book entitled "The Hodsock Ballistic Tables for Rifles." These are rather tedious to use, but providing one can establish the correct ballistic coefficient, the results obtained are extremely good. An example of a ballistic table calculated from the Hodsock Tables is shown below.

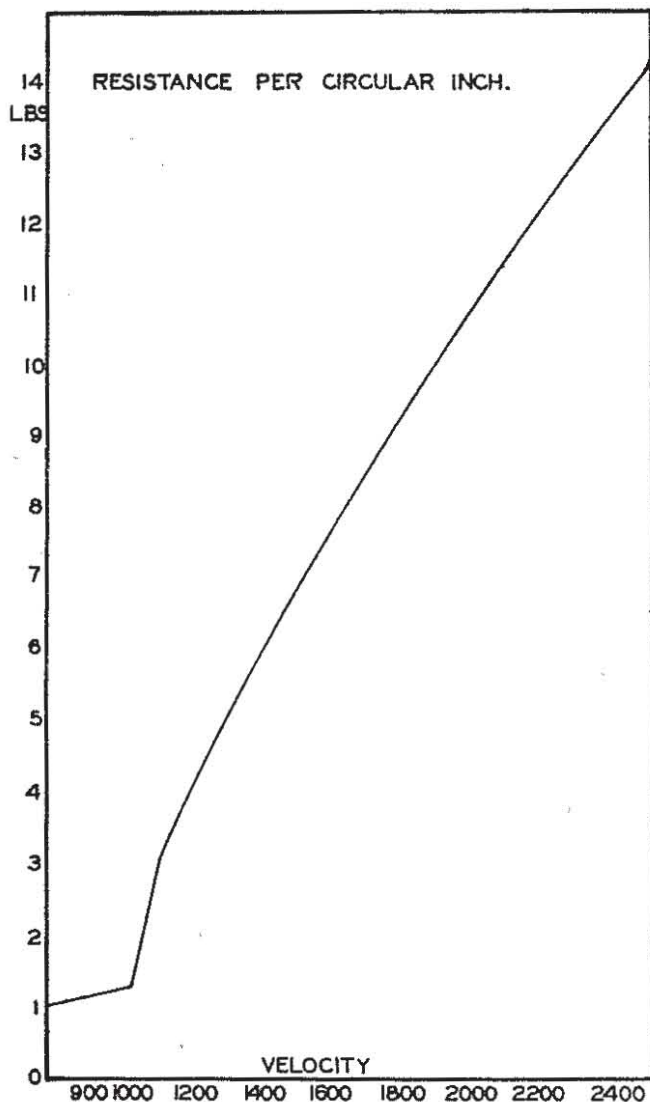
Fortunately there have been many improvements in velocity measurement over the years and we now use Electronic Counter Chronographs to measure the

time of flight between photo-electric screens or induction rings. There has also been a corresponding simplification in ballistic tables and we can now, with a minimum of effort, draw up a ballistic table for any bullet, providing we know the velocity at a given point.

When a high velocity Long Rifle bullet leaves the muzzle it is rotating at about 250,000 revolutions per minute. This, of course, makes it into a miniature gyroscope and tends to keep it "on course." However, if the bullet is not perfectly round, or if its centre of gravity is minutely off centre, this rapid rotation causes it to veer off course quite rapidly.

It is also important that the bullet is balanced and it seems to be generally accepted that a light nose will unbalance the bullet and if carried far enough this will cause the bullet to tumble in flight, as is the case of the Armorlite bullet.

If the base of the bullet is not square to the axis, or damaged, the bullet can be tilted as it leaves the muzzle and it will then go off at an angle.

These are a few of the imperfections which cause poor accuracy, but in a shotgun cartridge the position is infinitely worse. For a start, the pellets are not perfect spheres and hence they must be out of balance. When the initial impact of the gas pressure hits the shot charge the pellets are compressed and further damage occurs. This damage of course can be minimised by an effective cushion of wadding. Having suffered these initial setbacks, the shot starts out on its way up the barrel under rapid acceleration, and the shot in contact with the barrel suffers further damage.

Thus it is a relatively deformed charge of shot that eventually leaves the barrel at about 800-900 miles per hour. This explains why the pellets spread so much after they leave the barrel. The plastic shot concentrator, by providing a good cushion against the initial shock of pressure and then further protecting the shot on its way up the barrel, without tightening the centre of the pattern very much, certainly reduces the extreme spread.

and each shall be sold at \$2.40 per packet of 25 shotshells, by the Secretary's office.

7. Shotguns up to 12 gauge are permitted and all cartridges may be inspected on demand by the Shoot Marshals and Referees.

8. A gunsmith shall be available on the grounds.

9. A caterer shall be on the grounds with full meals or take-away snacks available from 7 a.m. until 3.30 p.m. throughout the programme.

10. The Brisbane Gun Club shall conduct two days of shooting, as eye-openers, on Thursday/Friday, June 10/11.

11. Recommended accommodation/travel agent is Patrick Travel Service of 431 Queen Street, Brisbane, telephone 31-1871 or through their Sydney or Melbourne offices (see page 31, February 1971, "Shooting News").

12. At the Gold Coast, some 45 minutes driving time via the highway, is "Number Ten-the-Esplanade" (see advertisement in this publication).

GENERAL

All A.C.T.A. approved championships under Rule 27 must be conducted over automatic angling traps. Where clubs do not possess these traps then only club standard championships can be conducted.

The attention of skeet shooters is drawn to rules 71 and 74. — Rule 71 pertains to the first target missed. That is, if this is the shooter's first miss, then the procedure is now fully explained in all situations and all examples are stated. However, this rule reads more clearly if these words be deleted from lines two and three — that is, delete "when the 2nd target is released, broken or."

— In Rule 74, there is no "lost target" as this rule only describes a pair that has not been thrown complete.

The 1971 New Zealand National Championships shall be conducted at Hamilton, 3 miles from G.P.O. along Collins Rd., from March 27, to April 3 inclusive. Hamilton is in the North Island, near Auckland.

AUSTRALIAN CLAY TARGET SHOOTING NEWS

Firearms entry regulations for T.P.N.G.

Overseas shooters (this includes Australians) wishing to compete in clay target shotgun shooting events conducted by affiliated member clubs of the A.C.T.A. are required to comply with certain firearms regulations if they wish to import their own shotguns.

On arrival at Port Moresby (or other port of entry), shooters accompanied by their shotguns must produce to the customs officials a permit issued by Territory Police together with their current A.C.T.A. handicap cards.

Failure to supply both documents is likely to result in the gun(s) being impounded.

For the benefit of shooters wishing to compete in New Guinea, or at the Rabaul Easter Championships shoot, you are advised to send immediately a \$2.50 cheque or money order made payable to the "Treasury." This must be mailed in advance to the Secretary Rabaul Clay Target Club, P.O. Box 1000, Rabaul T.P.N.G., with the following particulars — shooters full name and address, the particular club(s) to be visited in New Guinea, make of gun, type, calibre, capacity (of number of cartridges), gun serial number and A.C.T.A. current handicap card number.

A permit may then be issued and mailed to the shooter(s) concerned.

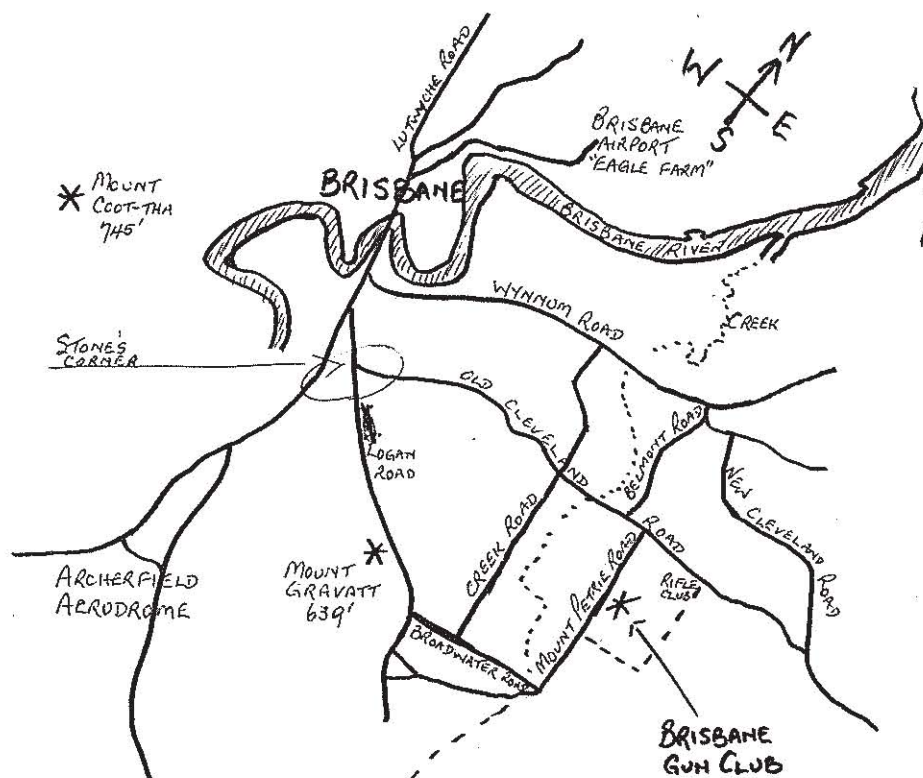

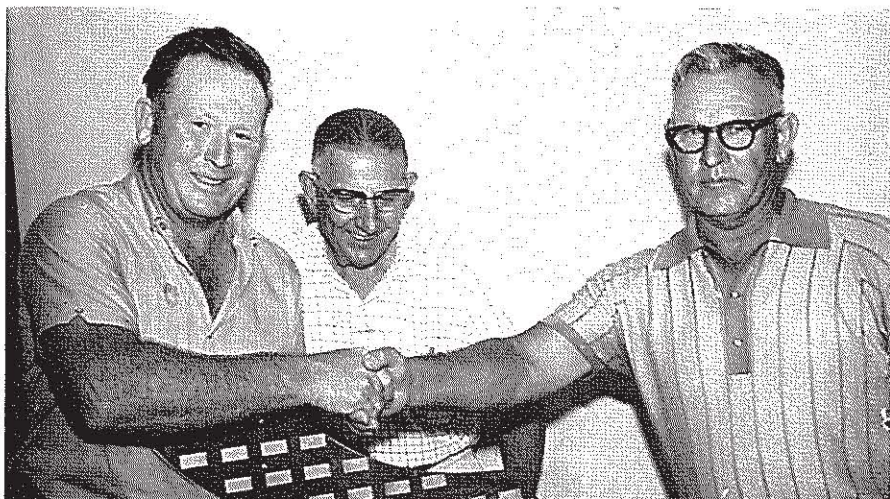
