

As fully described in May 1971, A.C.T.A. "Shooting News," the 1971 Australian National Clay Target Trapshooting Championships shall be conducted by the Association at the Brisbane Gun Club, Mount Petrie Road, nine miles out of Brisbane, Queensland, over the seven successive days of Saturday, June 12, through to p.m. Friday, June 18.

Member clubs are requested to instruct their delegates/representatives to discuss Olympic representation during the Association Annual General Meeting on Monday night, June 14, at the Brisbane Gun Club. The intention is to ascertain current views. (See the comprehensive April report by Jules Steiner).

Some 136 New Zealand shooters are expected and we may have some top American shooters with us. Many new friendships will be established and many annual shooter reunions will discuss all aspects of shotgun shooting.

The Brisbane Gun Club shall conduct two days of 16 yard and handicap events on the Thursday/Friday as eye openers.

Over each of the seven days of June 12 to 18, shooting shall commence at 8 a.m. with one major event for each day, in the following sequence:----

FIRST DAY-Saturday, June 12, 1971. Event No. 1: 31st Australian National Champion of Champions Cup, followed by \$300 Value Double-Barrel Handicap (time permitting).

SECOND DAY—Sunday, June 13, 1971. Event No. 2: 19th Australian National Double-Barrel Championship and shot in conjunction 24th Australian National Intermediate Double-Barrel Championship.

THIRD DAY—Monday, June 14, 1971. Event No. 3: 17th Australian National Single-Barrel Championship and shot in conjunction 2nd Australian National Intermediate Single-Barrel Championship.

FOURTH DAY-Tuesday, June 15, 1971.

Event No. 4: 10th Australia/New Zealand Championship, followed by 12th Australia/New Zealand Trap Teams' Match, followed by Event No. 5: \$300

Value Double-Barrel Handicap (time permitting). FIFTH DAY-Wednesday, June 16, 1971.

The Twenty-Fifth International Teams' Match, followed by Event No. 6: 11th Australian National Double-Rise Championship and shot in conjunction 2nd Australian National Intermediate Double-Rise Championship followed by Event No. 7: \$300 Value Double-Barrel Handicap (time permitting).

SIXTH DAY—Thursday, June 17, 1971.

Event No. 8: The Twenty-Second Grand Australian Handicap and, time permitting, Double-Barrel Handicap or Sweepstake and, time permitting, Skeet Practice up to 25 Targets.

SEVENTH DAY—Friday, June 18, 1971. Event No. 9: 2nd Australian National Skeet Championship, followed by 6th Australia/New Zealand Skeet Teams' Match.

A trophy for the National Skeet Event will be kindly donated by Evans & Balfour Pty. Ltd., Gunsmiths of Melbourne, Vic.

To be conducted under A.C.T.A. Rules and Conditions, effective as from January 1, 1971 and within the requirements of the Olympic Federation.

High Gun (previous such winners excluded) shall be over the six events - Champion of Champions, Double-Barrel, Single-Barrel, Australia/New Zealand, Double-Rise and Grand Australian - kills only to count. Prize-winners ineligible for yardage awards.

International Teams' Match under agreement and direction of the International Committee of Great Britain.

Time permitting \$300 DB H'caps may be conducted daily after the completion of programmed events.

On Pages 6 to 8 of this publication is a complete list to date of all Australian National Championships, the Mackintosh International Teams' Match Trophy Event, Interstate Teams' Matches, Grand Handicap Event and High Gun Trophy winners.

As complete details were not kept until the end of 1965, the compilation of this listing has taken five years of research and checking.

A.C.T.A. 1971 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

Applications for open championships to be contested during 1972 (that is, Commonwealth, State and District Titles) are required to be lodged under Rule 27 by member Clubs, in writing on the prescribed form number 16, not later than Friday, July 30, 1971.

Such applications shall be collated and submitted to the Executive Committee for consideration and allocation. Member Clubs are requested to measure their applications and to apply only for championships which can be satisfactorily conducted between January 1 and December 31, 1972.

The allocated championships for the calendar year 1972 shall be published in December 1971 "Clay Target Shooting News."

From this published list of allocations, Clubs then choose their own respective 1972 programmes to include these title events as so allotted, and submit shoot requests (Form 16) to A.C.T.A. for consideration, showing the required date(s) concerned.

Approvals are subject to correct interpretations of A.C.T.A. Rules and are designed to avoid clashing of major programmes with nearby Clubs.

Commonwealth, State or District championships will not be allocated to Clubs who fail to either apply the handicapping formula correctly or who fail to submit handicap returns for each shoot.

No trophies or prize monies may be handed to any shooters without the previous submission of current handicap cards — Rule 18.







Clay target shooting at Rabaul, T.P.N.G.

If a shooter has a liking for the tropics, or wishes to shoot clay targets in a tropical paradise or wants to combine business with pleasure, or maybe he wishes to view a magnificent harbour before viewing or reminiscing over World War 2 relics and experiences, then a trip to the Rabaul Easter Shoot will satisfy all this, and more.

The Rabaul Gun Club's single trap layout and tower is beautifully situated in a coconut grove, on the beach at Blanche Bay, four miles from Rabaul, on the island of New Britain, T.P.N.G.

A White Flyer Trap was used and therefore targets were thrown according to A.C.T.A. specifications. All clay targets for T.P.N.G. clubs are made and distributed by Mr Les Berkefeld of Rabaul.

Shooters travel big distances to and from shoots in the islands, but do not have the road systems, which an Australian mainland shooter is used to. For instance, one Rabaul club member travels 45 miles by small boat to reach the spot where his car is garaged. Then a further 35 miles by road to the club. This member owns a plantation in a remote part. Another member travels 180 miles by boat and plane and so on.

Port Moresby, Mount Hagen, Kar Kar Island or Madang shooters would travel approximately 600 air miles.

Shooters from Kavieng, Port Moresby, Lae, Madang, Kar Kar Island, Mount Hagen Gun Clubs and Bougainville Island attended the Easter 1971 T.P.N.G. State Championships. Also Queensland, New South Wales and Victoria were represented. So, as you can see, this is really an annual reunion as many of these shooters have the opportunity to meet only once each year. Visiting shooters are all accommodated by Rabaul Gun Club members and the hospitality extended by these members is of a very high standard indeed and leaves nothing to be desired.

The trap and tower opened for practice Friday afternoon and night and a very good idea was introduced "pay \$2 and shoot as many as you like."

Then on Saturday morning exactly at 9 a.m., as advertised, the shoot was started with the first squad on the tracks. Club President Mr W. Nicholls, Secretary Mr R. Pearson, Shoot Captain Mr Les Berkefeld plus a very active committee together with a most enthusiastic group of members' wives, did a grand job through Saturday and Saturday night, then again on Sunday.

And on Sunday evening a beautifully organised barbecue (the best I have ever been to) got us all together for the trophy presentations, etc.


The standard of trophies either donated by W. D. & H. O. Wills, The "Complex" Trophy, Winchester, I.M.I. or Rabaul Gun Club, would have to be seen to be justly appreciated.

Even if a stirrer arrived he could not have faulted either the selection of trophies or the management.

In summing up, I would say that this is a first class shoot and I am proud to have been one of the contestants.

Then on Monday, visiting shooters were treated to a very interesting tour of war relics, which, although World War 2 has been over for some 26 years, material relics still in this area are considerable and well worth seeing.

OVERALL NATIONAL D.T.L. TRAP HIGH GUN WINNERS

Annually since 1966 a Browning under-and-over shotgun has been presented to the highest gun scorer over the main D.T.L. trap events viz. Champion of Champions, Double Barrel, Double Rise, Single Barrel, Australia-New Zealand and the Grand Australian, with the provision that each shooter can gain this award only once. If a shoot-off is necessary to determine the High Gun Winner, then the shoot-off shall be shot under handicap conditions. The Association is very grateful to the makers of these fine trophies, Messrs Fabrique Nationale of Belgium and to their Australian agents, Messrs Commercial Marketing Co. Pty. Ltd. of Sydney.

A similar Browning shotgun is presented annually at the Spanish and other National Championships and by common agreement, between the New Zealand Gun Clubs' Association and the A.C.T.A., each shooter winner can only gain this award once. Such winners to date have been :---

1971 New Zealand National Championships

These were conducted from March 27 to April 3 inclusive at the Hamilton Gun Club, in the North Island, near Auckland.

The tournament was a great success although unfortunately, the International Trap recently purchased for \$3040 (N.Z. currency) broke down irreparably after only 54 shooters from the field of 168 had contested. This event was then abandoned as it will be necessary for parts to come from Sweden before this trap can be used again.

At the Annual Meeting on 31/3/1971 of the New Zealand Gun Clubs' Association it was agreed that the 1972 New Zealand Trapshooting Clay Target Championships will be held on the Timaru Gun Club's grounds, Timaru Airport, over the period April 8 to 15 inclusive.


Office bearers of the N.Z.G.C.A. who were elected for the coming year were:---

Some eight referees were then appointed within the North Island and eight referees within the South Island for the coming year.

Some 23 Australian shooters attended and contested the events and the longest traveller was Norman J. Camps of Mount Hagen, New Guinea.

On Saturday 27/8/71, from 140 entries, 52 possibles divided a 15 target handicap then from 133 entries, 20 divided a 30 target sweepstake. This was followed by a 10 pair double rise handicap (72 entries) divided by 8 possibles.

On Sunday 28/3/71, C. W. Lusby, a 30-year-old salesman in private life, travelled home in style after winning the 1971 Morris 1100 motor car shoot (valued at approximately \$2400), and this day was also his wife's 27th birthday. From 151 entries, Lusby with 11 others, shot the possible 30/30 targets and then contested the miss-out shoot-offs. Lusby has been shooting for a little over one year only.

On Monday 29/3/71, Malcolm J. Fuller of Sydney (Australia) won his second New Zealand Fern from a field of 183 shooters in the N.Z. National Skeet Championship with a 50/50 possible then a perfect round in the shoot-off. Fuller is one of the most experienced shooters in the Southern Hemisphere and has shot and competed in many countries. In 1965 he won the New Zealand National Single Barrel Championship. The next event was the N.Z. "International" Championship which was abandoned when the International-type trap broke down.

On Tuesday, March 30, the N.Z. National 25 Target Clay Sparrow Championship from 16 yards was won by 33-year-old Napier building contractor, S. Mackie after a shoot-off. (In 1969 he won the North Island Double Rise Championship). The field was of 221 entries.

The N.Z. National Double Rise Championship followed and from a field of 205 Vin Ryan of Cogrove, Victoria, Australia, won after a shoot-off. This is a 15 pairs target event off 16 yards.

On Wednesday, March 31, from a field of 194, J. R. Thomson of Rotorua won the 50 Target Single Barrel N.Z. National Single Barrel Championship after a shoot-off.

On Thursday, April 1, the 50 Target New Zealand National Single Rise Championship was conducted and from 307 entries only F. R. Manson (Waimate), A. W. H. Walker (Hakataramea) and R. W. S. Cavanagh (Wellington) shot the possible. It was won by 37-yearold Manson 83/83.

In conjunction was the N.Z. Junior Single Rise Championship won by P. Bretherton of Wairoa.

On Friday, April 2, the qualifying sections were held for the Mackintosh Trophy International Teams' Match.

The New Zealand Champion of Champions was A. W. H. Walker (Hakataramea). He also won the Browning Trophy Gun and was the top qualifier in the International Team to win the Luigi Franchi Trophy. The joint high guns in the 1971 N.Z. International Team for the Willoughby Norrie Trophy were J. R. Thomson (Rotorua) and A. W. H. Walker (Hakataramea).

After the New Zealand team had shot its section of the International Teams' Match, a concluding 20 target sweepstake was held and the three possible scorers who divided, included Fred Lang of Tweed Heads, New South Wales, Australia.




