

Separately within this publication is a complete report on the 1971 National Clay Target Championships conducted by the Association over June 12 to 18 at the Brisbane Gun Club, Queensland.

During the programme the Executive Committee met. Small handicaps were withheld and only the principal events were conducted because of the record attendances.

Mr G. H. Hall was appointed a Skeet Referee Examiner.

It was decided that the empty shotshells go to New Zealand through the good offices of the Brisbane Gun Club.

From a recommendation by the NSW Executive Committeemen, the full Executive ratified the 1972 National Championships venue as the Griffith Gun Club at dates to be decided. (NOTE: It is probable that the dates shall be March 11 to 17 inclusive).

The President of the New Zealand Gun Club's Association Mr Allan Brown together with his fellow New Zealand Councillors Messrs R. Meads, J. Begg, P. Matheson, G. Thomas, M. Havill, P. Hayman and C. Scott, met A.C.T.A. President Mr Gordon Hall and the Australian Executive Committee at an informal discussion on various shooting rules. Visiting USA shooter, Mr Elgin T. Gates was also invited to this informal discussion.

The A.C.T.A. 35th Annual General Meeting of affiliated club delegates and representatives was held in the clubhouse of the Brisbane Gun Club, Belmont, Queensland, from 6.10 p.m. on Monday, June 14, 1971.

In attendance were 94 shooters as delegates/representatives plus a number of observers. Messrs J. Steiner (WA), W. E. H. Rainbird (Tas.), K. Oldfield (NSW) and N. Wells (WA) checked the registers.

By invitation visiting shooter Mr Elgin T. Gates of California, USA, also attended and spoke at the meeting.

Appointment of Auditor — Messrs R. W. Fox, C. A. Gregory and Associates were re-appointed as auditors.

Ballots were then conducted for the elections of Executive Committement.

Chairman/President — Mr Gordon Hall was declared re-elected unopposed after the Secretary announced that Mr W. A. Edwards had withdrawn his nomination — acclamation.

EDITOR'S NOTES (continued)

The meeting decided that submissions be passed to the next Executive Committee meeting for consideration—

1. that from 1972 a new handicapping system based on a shooter's performance be adopted.

2. that from 1972 shooter insurance coverage be adopted with clubs collecting the prescribed premiums and forwarding them to the Association with registrations. (Special Note: See pages 2 and 3 of May 1971, "Shooting News" — Only member clubs with satisfactory documentation, appointed delegates and constitutions in writing under the Companies' Act shall be able to have this coverage for their shooters).

3. that clubs when applying for Commonwealth or State Title events must submit a proposed shoot date to avoid clashing.

4. that consideration be given to adopting International-type shooting within A.C.T.A. Rules, in addition to the existing methods of clay target shooting.

At a meeting of the International Shooting Union in Munich on July 16, honorary vice-president Mr. Jules Steiner was granted the 1973 World Moving Target Championships to be conducted by the A.C.T.A. at the Perth Gun Club. This is for international type shooting under I.S.U. rules which use five fixed traps per layout (see A.C.T.A. Rule 9). The International Shooting Union also decided to adopt the quick round method of skeet shooting as is shot in Australia.

Dear Mr Berry,

On behalf of my family and myself, I want to extend our sincere thanks and appreciation for the friendship and hospitality that was extended to us during the National Championships at Brisbane.

We had a marvelous time overall, and enjoyed very much the opportunity to compete with the many fine shooters from Australia and New Zealand. Your system of qualified referees and their excellent pulling is much better than what we have in the United States. Further, the tournament as a whole was very well run. You had an excellent shoot marshal and many other people who kept things moving. Most of our shoots are not as well organised.

Among other things, we prefer your method of firing one shot from each track to our own system of five shots from each track before moving. We also enjoyed your double barrel events although we did rather poorly, not being used to firing a second shot when needed. All of our events in the US are single barrel, i.e., only one shot at each target.

After returning home on June 21, I competed in the California State Championships from June 22 through to 27th, and did quite well. It was readily apparent that our targets are easier than what I had just shot in Brisbane, mainly because our angles are not as wide. Our targets are usually thrown about 22 degrees to the left or right of centre, whereas yours are the full 45 degrees to right or left. I have an idea that some of your shooters would do very well here if they could get used to the idea of not having a second shot to rely on.

Once again, let me say how much we enjoyed ourselves in Brisbane, and I hope we can return again if possible.

Editor reports on 1971 Australian nationals


The 1971 Australian National Clay Target Championships were conducted by the Association over the seven successive days of Saturday, June 12, through to Friday, June 18, at the grounds of the Brisbane Gun Club.

Weather conditions were perfect for the first four days then on the morning of day five prior to the International Teams Match gusty changeable winds arose. The weather itself was overcast with light rain. This rain, with wind, then continued throughout day five and the National Double Rise Championships. Day six was of excellent shooting conditions with the weather fine and clear. Day seven, the final day, opened cool and clear but soon became overcast with heavy showers from 4 p.m.

Record attendances made for a happy carnival spirit. We had one American family of three trapshooters (father and two sons) together with his wife and youngest son. New Guinea, Mount Hagen and Lae Gun Clubs were represented. Some shooters came from the far north (over 1000 miles) of Queensland and others from the far north-west of Queensland, some 1600 miles. From Western Australia, Geraldton sent a contingent of some eleven shooters with their wives who had to travel some 3200 miles just to get to the shoot. Others came from Busselton, some 150 miles south of Perth, Western Australia.

Most enjoyed their air, rail and road journeys. Many friendships were established and many old acquaintances renewed. All States of the Commonwealth were well represented.

We had with us the largest contingent ever to leave New Zealand for any single sporting venue or event some 130-odd NZ'ers mingled happily with their Australian shooting cousins. A meeting was held of the New Zealand Gun Clubs' Association Council members present, with the Australian Association Executive Committee, and with Mr Elgin Gates of USA, by special request. Many shooting ideas on rules



and interpretations were discussed and ultimately these may appear in print to our joint common good. Three generations of one shooting family from Drouin, Victoria, were present.

We were unable to conduct any handicap or other supporting events during the seven days as the wonderful attendances in all events left no spare daylight hours. In fact, we commenced taking nominations each night for an early commencement the following day as darkness falls in Brisbane at this time of the year, around 4.40 p.m.

The trap programme was scheduled to be conducted over five down-the-line traps, but, because of the large nominations, a sixth trap, originally installed for practice only had to be brought into use. Winchester Traps were used and they were faultless.

Day one, Saturday, June 12, commenced with the Australian 31st National Champion of Champions event. From some 326 nominations in this 20 yard event, Ray Kimber of the South Australian Gun Club, won with his score of 86/86, the Mackintosh Perpetual Cup. Best lady shooter was Mrs Dorothy Sansom of Gloucester, NSW, 48/50.

From this Champion of Champions event, scores of the ten highest shooters were totalled for mailing to the South African Clay Target Association who will then select their ten top scorers in their prime National event for comparison. The ten each had a perfectly clear score of 50/50 targets totalling 500/500.

On the second day, Sunday, June 13, from a field of 340, and from some 78 possible scorers, Douglas Smith of Brisbane, won the 19th National Double Barrel Championship with his 249/249 score and repeating his 1967 and 1969 performances received the J. M. Wilson Perpetual Cup. Best lady shooter was Mrs Dorothy Sansom of Gloucester, NSW, 51/54.

In conjunction was the 24th National Intermediate Double Barrel Championship. This was won by West Australian shooter N. Featherby of Perth with his 76/76 score.

Day three, Monday, June 14, saw R. McDonald of Geraldton, Western Australia, win the 17th National Single Barrel Championship with his 73/73 score, from a field of 303. He was a very proud person when holding the W. Rainbird Perpetual Cup. Best lady shooter was Mrs Dorothy Sansom of Gloucester, NSW, 43/50.

In conjunction was the 2nd National Intermediate Single Barrel Championship. This was won by Ray Simpson of Brisbane, 46/50.

Day four, Tuesday, June 15, commenced with the 10th Australia-New Zealand Down-The-Line Trap

Championship. J. Ellis of South West Gun Club at Busselton, Western Australia, won this points scoring event with 192/192 points, from a field of 282 shooters. Best lady shooter was Mrs J. Paget of Ballandean, Queensland, 118/150 points.

For the first time, Messrs I.M.I. Australia Ltd., with permission, had produced a round, sterling silver badge depicting the stars of the Southern Cross as a symbol for the winners of this Australia-New Zealand points scoring event, both past and future. Those previous shooters who won this event since its commencement in 1962 shall each receive a similarly engraved and inscribed badge.

Immediately following this event was the annual challenge match between Australia and New Zealand for the Tom Glenn Cup. The Australian team consists of the six top Australian shooters from the A-N.Z. trap championship whilst the New Zealand captain is permitted to select a team from his New Zealand shooters. (The reverse then applies when in alternate years, the event is conducted in New Zealand). Australia won the toss and elected to shoot first, which is a round of ten targets. The event is of two rounds each of ten targets. The result was a complete tie of 118/120 and it is by mutual agreement that when any such ties occur that no shoot-off is to be considered. This further strengthens our combined liking for this match.

A most symbolic and looked for gesture between Australia and New Zealand is the exchange of neck ties by each member of the two teams in the teams match. Shooters and spectators alike were most impressed with this exchange.

A high gun trophy for the best NZ shooter in this event was won by NZ shooter W. Counsel.

From the results of the three National Events of Double Barrel, Single Barrel and the A-N.Z. Championships — this last being points scoring — an Australian fully representative team of 30 top shooters emerged, with a possible 250 figure, to shoot as an Australian team in the 100 target points scoring International Trap Teams Match for the Mackintosh International Perpetual Trophy. New Zealand won this event in 1970 with the score of 7304/7500 points. The actual scores are withheld until the final section is shot in England during July. Results shall be available probably for September publication.

This match was conducted during the morning of Wednesday, June 16, under overcast conditions with gusty variable winds.

Three trophies are given to the three best high gun scorers in this match. These scorers were Douglas Smith (Brisbane, Qld.) and J. Newton Thomas (Melbourne, Vic.) both 298/300, then Keith Cameron (Roma, Qld.) 296/300. As a sash and a sterling silver badge are produced for the highest such scorer, the two equal scorers agreed to share without a shoot-off. Douglas Smith took the badge whilst Newton Thomas took the sash to the intense satisfaction of the spectators.

Following this match, 221 shot for the 11th National Double Rise Championship in light rain and 1 very gusty conditions which played havoc with the AUSTRALIAN CLAY TARGET SHOOTING NEWS pairs of targets. D. Cosgrove of Warren, New South Wales, won the J. M. Tyquin Perpetual Cup with his 52/56 score. Best lady shooter was Miss J. R. Marstella of Gold Coast, Queensland, 30/50.

In conjunction was the 2nd National Intermediate Double Rise Championship which was won by C. E. Buchanan of New Zealand 50/60.

Day six, Thursday, June 17, was the final day of the down-the-line trap events. W. Garraway of Geraldton, Western Australia, won the 22nd Grand Australian Handicap from a field of 232, second was R. H. Wann, also of Geraldton, Western Australia 72/73, followed by the third placegetter Jim Ellis of South West Gun Club, Western Australia 64/65. There was general acclamation for this strong winning group from this so far away State.

Since 1966, at this stage of the programme, the highest gun scorer in all the six major trap events receives a Browning under-and-over presentation shotgun from the makers Fabrique Nationale of Belgium and their agents Messrs Commercial Marketing Co. P/Ltd. of Sydney. We were most honored to have visit us at this stage, by the Premier of the State of Queensland, The Hon. Mr Jo. Bjelke-Petersen, who made the presentation on behalf of the makers. Vincent Ryan of Cosgrove, Victoria, had truly earned this magnificent, engraved trophy gun and the crowd then expressed their feelings with acclamation.

The final shoot-off for this magnificent gun had been between a top shooter from each of three contesting countries — Vin Ryan of Australia, Elgin Gates of USA and R. Wales of New Zealand, whose scores were 337/349, 336/349 and 319/332 respectively. The spectators were hushed and spellbound during the shoot-off then a very proud but humble Ryan received the cheers from the hundreds present.

The State Premier then shot at and broke a target with this gun, to the sheer delight of all present. The gun is a B2 grade number 25961/S.O., Special Trap 5, U/O, 28-inch barrel, chrome-lined, with gold engraved nameplate in the stock. By agreement no shooter in either Australia or New Zealand may win such a trophy gun more than once.

An unscheduled but most acceptable point at this stage of the proceedings was the most thoughtful and generous donation by American Trapshooting Association shooter Mr Elgin T. Gates of California, of a gemstudded belt buckle for presentation to the winner of the 1971 A.C.T.A. Grand Australian Handicap. Mr Gates has several similar such buckles, which we saw, and of which he is most proud, having won them in open handicap conditions in the USA. His present visit to the 1971 Australian Nationals prompted the thought of such a donation and A.C.T.A. President Mr G. H. Hall, with his Committee, were most humble in their appreciation of such a thoughtful gesture. The 1971 Grand Australian Handicap winner W. Garraway was ecstatic in his appreciation.

Because of the extremely large numbers of shooter contestants, it was decided that, immediately following the Grand Handicap that the 2nd National Skeet Championship be commenced, and this event would thus be contested over the two available skeet layouts for the remaining set period of one and a half days. This was a wonderful decision as the skeet event was decided only at the point of darkness on the final scheduled day of Friday, June 18, after special squaddings of those scoring possibles in each skeet round.

One of the skeet layouts was fitted with automatic self-loading Winchester Skeet Traps, whilst the second layout was fitted with manually-operated traps. All of these skeet traps behaved perfectly.

The 2nd Australian Skeet Championship was won from a field of 131 by B. Anderson of New Zealand with his magnificent skeet score of 164/164, this was clearly the foremost skeet break established in Australia to that moment, BUT, Anderson then shot a perfect 25 in the following Australia versus New Zealand Skeet Teams Match event, thus his record score is now 189/189. A personal skeet trophy depicting a skeet shooter with gun at the hip was donated by Evans & Balfour of Melbourne.

The highest overall scorer in both the trap and skeet events was to receive the newly donated J. Newton Thomas Perpetual Trophy. This highest scorer was Ron Wales of New Zealand 337/350. There were no lady skeet shooters contesting this event.

For some years, Messrs Fuller Firearms Company of Sydney have offered an under-and-over shotgun to any New Zealand shooter winning any National Clay Target Championship and a broad rib Miroku underand-over gun number 578651 was presented on behalf of the donors by A.C.T.A. National President Mr Gordon Hall to the proud winner B. Anderson of 150 Marine Parade, Mount Maunganui, North Island, New Zealand.

Following this event the programme was completed on the second skeet layout by the 6th Australia versus New Zealand Skeet Teams' Match which had not been conducted in Australia before. The teams match was

won by New Zealand 122/125 to Australia 115/125, leaving New Zealand undefeated since the inception of this skeet teams match. The Australian team members gave their opposite New Zealand team members an A.C.T.A. embossed neck tie to commemorate the occasion.

Throughout the entire programme the grassed areas of the Brisbane Gun Club stood up to the ever constant pounding of traffic by vehicles, contestants and visitors alike. The caterers, Messrs K. A. and R. J. Macfarlane without doubt, served the best meals we have had at any past National Championship meeting and all were loud in their praise of the food as available from 7 a.m. daily.

Brisbane Gun Club President Mr W. A. (Bill) Edwards and his Committee are to be commended for the quality of their preparations and for their untiring attention to detail throughout the programme. A number of other visiting Queensland shooters assisted the Brisbane G.C. Committee workers with their daily chores.

The Brisbane Gun Club clubhouse is on two levels. The undercroft rooms were used by the Association for administration whilst the upper level complete with its verandah was a shooter rest area throughout the programme. Large potted umbrella and palm trees were on the verandah. There was a stone-walled area also of potted plants on the forecourt of the club, the trees were decorated with staghorns and other tropical orchids whilst, at the foot of a tree, was a potted pineapple plant complete with 22-menth-old pineapple in its natural growing state. 














