A.C.T.A. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING

The next scheduled meeting of the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee will be held in Melbourne, Victoria, at the Naval and Military Club, 25 Little Collins Street, on Monday/Tuesday, October 11/12, 1971.

Items for inclusion on the agenda paper of this meeting are to be in the hands of the Secretary, A.C.T.A., G.P.O. Box 2038S, Melbourne, 3001, not later than Friday, August 27, 1971, after which all documents relating to the meeting are collated and forwarded to the Executives prior to the meeting.

GENERAL

Full details of the 1971 International Trap Teams' Match for the Mackintosh Trophy are shown elsewhere in this publication. Canada won with 7314/7500 points from South Africa 7274 and Australia 7223.

Mrs Lorna Shelton, a tall willowy person from North Strathfield, Sydney, commenced competition clay target shooting at the New South Wales Gun Club in August 1966. She earned her 50 break badge on 10/5/69, then after competing with distinction at the 1971 National Championships at Brisbane, went home to her own club and shot and broke 102 successive targets in open events plus the high gun on 3/7/71. This appears to be the highest break on any one day by a lady shooter in Australia and has been recorded accordingly.

Tower shooting — in the interests of shooter safety and shooter equity, it is essential that all traps

in tower shooting be electric release by the referee who stands, as usual, on the ground at the rear of the shooting squad. A shoot has been reported where the call of PULL could not be heard in the tower where a sound but very early model trap was installed. Whilst the day was windy, shooters became upset and the shoot had to be slowed for safety.

In our August 1971 publication, were two brief items which were inserted at final press concerning (a) a proposed shoot between teams from Thailand, Malaysia, Singapore and Australia

(b) the 1973 International Shooting Union World Shooting Championships.

We have been in touch with Singapore for some two years and were happy to agree to this quick request to arrange an Australian team.

Briefly — August 9 was scheduled for the National Parade Day in Singapore. Then, using August 10 for an eye-opener day, the Singapore Shooting Association was to conduct a Peska Sutan Competition over four days, commencing 9 a.m. daily. They shoot under International Shooting Union Rules. An opening ceremony was scheduled for 9 a.m. August 11, thence over the August 11/12 skeet shooting would take place.

(In I.S.U. Skeet, the gun butt must be touching the shooter's hip and there is a time delay of up to three seconds after the call of PULL). Trapshooting under I.S.U. rules was for August 13/14, that is, shooters standing on a common yardage, traps to throw at fixed directions (not oscillating traps) and targets to go some 80 yards).

Teams from Malaysia, Thailand, Singapore and Australia each of six shooters with the four highest scores to count. Each team to shoot a total of 150 rounds and the best two scorers from each team to then shoot on to compete for the individual prizes which would be for 200 targets. The games village to be the Seaview Hotel. Some 50 odd clubs throughout Australia, New Zealand and New Guinea were hastily circularised.

They were accompanied by Mrs Pamela Carroll, Mrs Jo Wann and Mrs Agnes Connors.

Team Captain, by common consent, was Bill Delaney and it was agreed that the actual team selection would be after the August 10 eye-opener.

(Special Note: See hurriedly received results, Page 3).

Grateful appreciation is extended to the Puckapunyal Army Gun Club who obtained some shoot details and stated W/O Kevin Ramsdale (an A.C.T.A. shooter) from the nearby barracks was available, also to the RAAF at Butterworth, Malaysia, where A.C.T.A. Trap Referee Sergeant Keith Hawkins is stationed.

Concerning the allocation of the 1973 World Shooting Championships by the International Shooting Union — this allocation was made after careful consideration, by the International Committee at their meeting in Munich, Austria, on July 16, of the prepared submission by Mr Jules Steiner of Perth against the submissions of a number of other member countries. Consequently, the 1973 I.S.U. World Shotgun Shooting Championships shall be conducted at the Perth Gun Club by the Australian Clay Target Association from October 15, 1973. Each competing country may field a team of ten shooters only, these to be pre-selected and to be—

- 4 trapshooters plus 1 reserve
- 4 skeet shooters plus 1 reserve.

It was also decided that the I.S.U. adopt the Quick Round method of skeet shooting as is shot in Australia. (NOTE — there is a time saving of ten minutes per squad and round when using the Australian method which was originally planned by Geraldton shooter Dick Burton and A.C.T.A. Secretary Mervyn Berry from knowledge of a similar but not widely used method in America. The I.S.U. and USA methods shoot first the singles, then the doubles whilst Australia combines these in one visit at the appropriate stations.)

As a local addition and prelude to the planning of the 1973 World Shotgun Shooting Championships in Perth, it is probable that around the end of September the Australian I.S.U. method Championships may be held, to be followed by probably the South-East Asian I.S.U. Championships.





The 1967 Australian Nationals were conducted at Southport, Queensland, during an unscheduled cyclonic storm in June which lashed us with 10½ inches of rain in one of the days of shooting. Many, many valuable shotguns had to be stripped either then, or later to overcome swelling of stocks or forearms and to make the lock mechanisms workable. Several shooters, including field shooters have rung A.C.T.A. office recently with similar troubles recommending one of the products from spaceship designers — use "WD40," it is claimed to free anything, including fingerprints on metal. It is designed to get under the skin of water. The makers have promised a free case of WD40 for the 1973 World I.S.U. Championships in Perth. (Do they anticipate rain in October?)

Australia wins shoot medals

Australia won second placing silver medals in the skeet and trench events at an International Shooting Union competition in Singapore over August 10 to 14.

Two members of the team, Dr Graham Carroll, of Kangaroo Ground, and Jack Henwood, of Blackburn South, won individual third placing bronze medals in the skeet and trench, respectively.

Countries which took part in the shoot were Australia, Thailand, Malaysia and Singapore.

Winchester tournament 1971-72

The Fourth Winchester Tournament in Australia will be conducted between September 1971 and February 1972, by clubs under the following arrangements made by Winchester.

Club rounds will be conducted in all States and the outright winner at each club location of trap or skeet will be offered, in addition to the nominated prize, a \$100 travelling allowance to attend the Winchester Tournament Finals to be conducted at the Griffith Gun Club during the pre-national club programme in March 1972.







New ground for clay target club

The Club plans to have the most modern shooting ground outside any capital city by October, Mr Santon said. It will incorporate two down-the-line trap layouts, both lit for night shooting with the latest type electric traps. The project is at the stage where the brick club-house is practically finished on the outside. Septic toilets are still being constructed, and beautification work has started on the grounds. A dam has been sunk and it is intended to sow the area with lawns and a


pressure pump will be connected to the dam for watering.

It is estimated that the project will cost \$3500, and it is planned to have the amount paid off by the time the Club holds its opening shoot on Saturday, October 2.

"We have told Mr Hughes that we will run one charity shoot a year for Eaglehawk Rotary for the help he has given our Club. He sold the eight-acre site to us at a very favorable price and then donated the sum to Eaglehawk Rotary," said Mr Santon.

The Club has approximately 55 members and will continue shooting at the old Huntly ground until the new grounds are opened in the spring. The Club will then have the facilities to accommodate many new members, Mr Santon said.


