

Over October 11/12, the Executive Committee shall meet in Melbourne to discuss all aspects of clay target shooting in Australia — the rules, their administration, the handicapping procedures, member club activities and they shall allocate the respective championships to be shot during 1972, at the selected clubs, from the many requests and submissions lodged in writing by 31/7/1970, for consideration.

Late submissions can only be tabled and those concerned must abide by the result. Some clubs have omitted to lodge requests and on past performances they blame A.C.T.A. for missing them. Here it is stressed that we are in excellent touch with the postal authorities and the dead letter office. One club has already been bowled out — they finally admitted on the telephone that it had not been mailed.

Would all shooters please forward your shooter registration fees of \$5.00 through your gun club secretary during November or December of this year 1971, so that the new style 1972 handicap cards can be processed and forwarded to your club for your collection and preparation for the new year commencement. These new style handicap cards will show a simple and self-explanatory progressive guide method of obtaining a handicap rating. This method is now in world-wide use and the 1972 year will have no re-

ference to or calculation of trophy values for handicapping purposes. Each shooter will simply have a progressive score of targets broken against targets thrown and the progressive score will automatically place him within a percentage grouping of either A, B, G or D rating which will then be reported to A.C.T.A. central records.

Thus, clubs can omit reference to placegetters and front marker trophies but will prepare for the winners or best scorers in each of these groupings. Provision and guidance will be made for clubs who, on occasions, only have small attendances. All this will be explained fully in December 1971 Shooting News, meanwhile briefly, for championship shooting—

94 per cent and over — A class.

90 per cent and under 94 per cent — B class. 86 per cent and under 90 per cent — C class.

Under 86 per cent — D class.


The handicap rating may be more simply defined.

We are happy to congratulate the Australian Shooting Association delegates to the meeting of the International Shooting Union Administrative Council at Munich during July — Mr Bob Morgan and Mr Peter Garrett — in successfully bidding for the 1973 World Skeet and Trap Championships. They were accompanied by Mr Jules Steiner, Hon. Vice-President of the A.C.T.A., whose assistance contributed a great deal to the success of the mission.

Owing to the interpretation of a short cable received from Mr Steiner, the announcement in the September issue of "Shooting News" was incomplete, however it is confidently expected that, by 1973, all A.C.T.A. registered shooters of accredited amateur status will be eligible to compete in the 14 days of competitions proposed for October 1973, in Perth. This shall be explained in detail in December "Shooting News" when deliberations of the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee are known.

The first such shoot will be on October 31 in conjunction with the Bungendore District DB Mini Target Championship. Mr (Bill) Allen is the club shoot marshal and Mrs Allan is President of the Women's Auxiliary. Each winning team may hold the Shield till the next advertised and scheduled match which shall be at the home ground of the most recently winning team.

CANBERRA. — A senior executive from Winchesters, the U.S. gun makers, yesterday suggested that Australia levy a sales tax on sporting firearms and ammunition to help wildlife.

Dr. Edward L. Kozicky, Director of Conservation, Winchester - Western division, Olin Corporation Illinois, was testifying before the House of Representatives committee on wildlife conservation.

Winchester's interest in conservation, said Dr. Kozicky, was basically good business, because proper game management ensured a future market for the firm's products.

He said the first step towards improved conservation measures in Australia was to carry out a comprehensive survey of the nations animal and bird population.

Not enough was known in Australia about the types of game animal habitats which should be preserved.

Many Australian fauna reserves appeared to have been established out of a desperate wish to do something for wildlife resources rather than on sound management principles.

Protection was only a tool which, if used without

sufficient knowledge, could work to the detriment of the species concerned, Dr. Kozicky said.

He instanced American experience with a certain kind of deer which was allowed to breed to excess, and then died by the thousand when they could not get enough to eat.

"More often than not, proper habitat management is the basis of sound management, not the designation of a faunal area."

Dr. Kozicky supported the greater availability in Australian universities of courses relating to natural resources work.

Dr. Kozicky strongly advocated the establishment of a national wildlife service with wide powers to initiate research and to help in fauna management.

Dr. Kozicky said it was mandatory that a central authority should exist to manage waterfowl and other migratory species. Otherwise, each State would "grab all it could" and not worry about what was happening elsewhere.

To help finance his plans, Dr. Kozicky said the committee should consider the licensing of all hunters at the State level, with possibly an additional Federal licence similar to the American one which permits the hunting of migratory birds.

"A State or national tax on the sale of sporting firearms and ammunition might be earmarked for research and management of game species or the purchase of game lands." he said.

"In my opinion, the sportsmen of Australia would support such a concept."

Comment by Puckapunyal Gun Club who submitted this "Age" news report —

"The views expressed by Dr. Edward L. Kozicky should be cause for concern to ACTA members. A blanket sales tax levied on the sale of sporting firearms and ammunition to help wildlife conservation could have a detrimental effect on clay target shooting in the long term. The immediate effect of such a levy would be to force up the already high cost of shot guns and ammunition irrespective of the use to which they were put.

"A more equitable proposal would surely be that those who wish to engage in the shooting of wildlife be made to pay for this privilege. Funds for conservation of wildlife would then be levied from those engaging in this activity, possibly in the form of game licences, rather than from all shooters, many of whom never shoot at wildlife."

(Editor's note — Ammunition and firearms sales in Australia already carry a fifteen per cent sales tax. Most States already have game licensing and in some States the research and knowledge on furred or feathered game and on fishing is of world class).

Australian shooters at Singapore Little Olympics

Little Olympics Medal awarded by Singapore National Sports Promotion Board.




The Singapore Government has always been conscious of the role of sports in both the task of nation-building as well as the development of the individual.

In 1964 a festival of sports was authorised as a get together of sportsmen and, by the staging of competitive events, to raise the standard of sports. Since 1965 this has been called the Pesta Sukan.

At the August 1971 gathering some 1300 sportsmen and sportswomen from 26 countries were expected to participate. These were Australia, Afghanistan, Brunei, Burma, Cambodia, Ceylon, Cyprus, Guam, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Iran, Japan, South Korea, Laos, Malaysia, Nepal, New Zealand, Pakistan, Philippines, Taiwan, Thailand, South Vietnam, United Kingdom, USA, and Singapore. The competitive sports were archery, athletics, basketball, cycling, football (men), football (women), hockey, karting (go-carting), boxing, lawn tennis, sepak takran (similar to badminton or shuttlecock but players kick the ball over the net with artistic accuracy), swimming, shooting, tenpin bowling and volley ball. Additionally, local teams competed in other games against one another.

The A.C.T.A. was asked to field a team of trap and skeet shooters, and, as the July Shooting News had gone to press, most clubs were circularised the information. At the last moment, six shooters were able to fly to Singapore and compete at their own expense. These were W (Bill) Delaney, Harry Somers, Jack

Henwood, Dr. Graham Carroll of Melbourne, Laurie Connors of Mildura, Victoria and Ray Wann of Kalamunda, Western Australia. Mesdames Carroll, Connors and Wann accompanied their husbands.

The team of six were met at Singapore Airport on Friday evening, August 6, by Singapore Gun Club member Derek de Souza, Superintendent of Police for the central four square mile district of Singapore. Shotguns were cleared through customs (details lodged in advance by A.C.T.A.) and the team was at the Olympic Village (Seaview Hotel) within 20 minutes of touchdown. Within the hotel of 422 rooms were 1000 competitors from 33 countries. The accommodation was good, air-conditioned, with high speed lifts, a choice of four restaurants and a large swimming pool.

The opening ceremony took place on Saturday afternoon. Australia led the march to the parade point, being first by alphabet. This march was a two hour ceremony before the Minister and V.I.P.'s. The Singapore Pesta Sukan flag was delivered by sky diver from an air force plane — instead of an Olympic runner lighting a flame. The flag was raised and the month long games opened, all within two minutes of the scheduled touchdown.

On Sunday, August 8, the Australian Team were guests of Mr Milton Tan (President of the Singapore Gun Club), at the Singapore Turf Club in a magnificent setting. Mr Milton Tan is a committeeman and a racing steward.

Monday, August 9, was Singapore's National Day. This was a most colorful pageant, with thousands of marchers led by banners.

Tuesday 10th and Wednesday 11th, were used for practice shooting on the ranges.

Thursday 12th till Saturday 14, were for two days of Skeet and two days of International Trench Shooting. Then, on the Saturday night was a prize giving dinner for all shooting teams of rifle, pistol and shotgun.

A banner from the Melbourne Gun Club was autographed and presented to Mr Milton Tan.

The Trap teams were to consist of six shooters with the four highest scores to count. Each team to shoot a total of 150 rounds and the two best scorers from each team to then shoot on, to compete for the individual prizes which would be for 200 targets.















2nd, Frank Duckworth, Thailand, 174/200 (Silver Medal).

3rd, Graham Carroll, Australia, 172/200 (Bronze Medal).

The Australian team was also presented with a commemorative pewter salver with the Johore Gun Club crest.

Team Captain W. Delaney was requested to be guest speaker at the Singapore Rotary Central following the address by Mr Milton Tan who, as Finance Organiser for Pesta Sukan, spoke on Pesta Sukan. Australia team members were also invited as guests of Rotary. Similar invitations were received from the Malaysian and Thailand Rotarians for future occasions.

On the Sunday, the team travelled to Johore, as guests of His Highness the Tungku Mahkota of Johore to shoot skeet and trench and to be entertained at the Palace in the evening, with dancing and dining.

Invitations were extended by the Australians to all shooters to attend the October 1973 World Moving Target Championships at Perth, Western Australia.

The team stated shooting conditions were tough, difficult backgrounds, fast targets, some torrential rain, fairly humid, and early morning starts before sunrise did provide hazards for skeet. Our team was unfamiliar with the speed of the targets in trench shooting.

Many Asian shooters have already visited Australia. The son of H.H. the Tungku Mahkota will be attending Geelong Grammar School in Victoria in 1972. The young son of Mr Yap (Captain of the Malaysian Team and winner of the I.S.U. Skeet Individual) is currently in his matriculation year at Wesley College in Perth, Western Australia and has been invited to attend the Perth Gun Club.


SINGAPORE TRENCH LAYOUT

This is a simplified and cheaper (to install and conduct) version of the Standard Olympic Trench Layout — but infinitely harder to shoot because each shooter is covering eight metres of traps as against two metres in the Standard Olympic Layout.

The console scrambler selects a different trap for each shooter, and is operated by what we understand is a "puller," meanwhile the referee is immediately behind the shooters. Scorer and check scorer keep independent records which are checked at the end of the squad round. They stand at the rear of the console scrambler.

The Standard Olympic (and International Shooting Union) layout, comprises some fifteen such fixed direction traps, behind which stand five shooters, each covering only the three traps directly before them. (These will be explained in a later publication).

At Singapore the shooting stations and the traphouses are raised above ground level to reduce cost and to keep the shooters dry during tropical downpours. The relative level of shooters' feet to traphouse is the same as in International Trench Shooting.
