



We commenced the 1972 Australian National Clay Target Championships with a most satisfactory attendance in absolutely perfect weather on the morning of Saturday, March 11, at the Griffith Gun Club in the centre of the Riverina irrigation area of New South Wales.

The grounds and layout were in excellent condition and lawn grass was at its best, but some two afternons previous, a strong, but most unpredicted easterly wind arose which blew the rice husks just as creeping sands on a seashore. For explanation the club is in the centre of Australia's rice growing area which is reputed to be he highest yielding such area in the world. The club obtains rice husks and spreads them beyond the traphouses for some 100 yards to cover the red soil, provide a very satisfactory shooting background and also to control weed and other growth. Thus, from the strange wind the husks came right to the 27 yard mark. Later, during the competition, competitors and referees stated that they felt that the temperature on the actual tracks was some 10 to 15 degrees higher than the spectator area and that this appeared to emanate from moisture being held by the rice husks.

We shot over a six trap layout with a further spare trap used for practice. All traps were Winchesters and behaved to our entire satisfaction.

The practice trap was immensely popular, especially so, for the 34 competitor shooting section of the visiting 62-member American "South Seas Safari Group." Shooters generally indicated that for future Nationals an A.C.T.A. conducted practice trap is a must.

The scoreboard and squad indicator board were supplied and donated respectively by the ammunition suppliers I.M.I. Australia Ltd. and Winchester Australia Pty. Ltd.

Both these companies added to the atmosphere of the shoot by dispensing their cartridges from small marquees in their own distinctive colors of blue/white and yellow/red respectively. This, with the wonderful weather conditions, had shooters and friends alike, dress in colorful clothing and accessories. The club is to be complimented for the excellence of its preparations and for their general assistance throughout the programme.

The shire council had kindly regraded the approach road and assisted greatly by watering this daily plus supplying and attending to other facilities. All shooters spoke highly of the efforts of the townsfolk to generally add to the carnival spirit.

Catering at the shoot was of good standard and it was complimentary to see the numbers dropping in for a midway cup of tea or coffee. Meals both hot and cold from 8 a.m. till up to 8 p.m. satisfied the entire attendance in quantity, variety and price.

Before the shoot commenced, many shooters and friends gathered at the Ex-Servicemen's Club at 7.30 p.m. on Friday, March 10, for a general get together and dinner combined — this was rated a highly desirable and satisfactory pre-National shoot idea.

We were all made honorary members of the various clubs in Griffith.

Saturday morning, March 11, saw the programme commence with 286 shooters contesting the 50 target 23rd Grand Australian Handicap. As with each other day on the programme, competitive shooting did not commence until approximately 8.45 a.m., with shooters facing a little south of east, on cloudless days with temperatures 75 deg. to 85 deg. This event was won by dairy farmer John Green of Korumburra, Victoria, shooting off a handicap of 19 yards. His winning score was 76/76 from W. Shelton of N.S.W. Gun Club 75/76 (off 14 yards) followed by Vin Peterson of Kokatahi Gun Club, New Zealand 66/67 (17 yards).

Sunday, March 12, the "blue ribbon" event of the programme and the 20th National Double Barrel Championship of 50 targets off 16 yards was won by K. Lowry of the South Australian Gun Club 252/252. The shoot-off for this event was carried over till the following morning because of fading light. Second was K. N. Perkins of Illawarra Gun Club, New South Wales 251/252 from M. Burgess of Cobar, New South Wales 235/236. Best Lady Shooter was a tie between Miss R. Evans of Brisbane Gun Club, Queensland and Mrs

G. Daly of Deniliquin Gun Club, New South Wales, with the common score of 45/50 broken targets.

In conjunction with this event was the 25th National Intermediate Double Barrel Championship of 50 targets off 16 yards. This event was won by J. H. Griffiths of Geraldton, Western Australia 56/56 from C. Carroll of Melbourne, Victoria 55/56 and R. Aquilina of N.S.W.G.C. and A. E. Burgess of Cobar who tied for third with 49/50. This was the last of these Intermediate Championships, as, under the shooting rules effective as of 1/1/72, all Intermediate shooting, as such, ceases during the 1972 year with the following 1973 year having provision only for graded class shooting on performance.

National Intermediate DB Championship winner J. H. Griffiths of Geraldton, WA, was overwhelmed with emotion when he was presented with an S.K.B. Trap Model under-and-over shotgun number 548923 on behalf of the agents Michaelis Bayley Trading of Melbourne.

After these shoot-offs on Monday, scheduled events for Day Three then followed and the 18th Australian National Single Barrel Championship of 50 targets off 16 yards was won by A. James of Maryborough, Victoria, with a score of 121/121 — this appears to be an Australian record for this event — from D. Byrne of Queanbeyan/Canberra Gun Club 120/121 and V. Ryan of Cosgrove, Victoria 94/95. Best Lady Shooter was Mrs Ruby Jenner of Wisconsin, USA 49/50.

In conjunction with this event was the 3rd National Intermediate Single Barrel Championship won by J. Jones of Hobart, Tasmania 49/50 from R. A. Poore of Finley, NSW 48/50. Third placegetter from a shoot-off after scores of 47/47 was R. J. Cadd of S.A.G.C. 65/68 from M. Allen of Ganmain, NSW 64/65.

The Association 36th Annual General Meeting had been scheduled for a 6 p.m. start but was delayed till 8 p.m. because of the lateness of the shooting. Some 99 cl:ub delegates/representatives attended and the annual balloting for seats on the Executive Committee resulted:—

President — Mr G. H. Hall, re-elected unopposed.
State of Queensland — Mr R. H. Moyse and Mr L. S. R. Stewart were re-elected.

State of New South Wales — Mr K. Soames withdrew his nomination and Messrs A. Cregan and K. Oldfield were automatically named as the incoming NSW Committeemen.

State of Victoria — elected were Messrs A. Pedersen and H. Smith.

State of Tasmania — re-elected unopposed was Mr W. E. H. Rainbird.

State of South Australia — re-elected was Mr R. C. Mules.

Stafe of Western Australia — elected was Mr R. M. Holtfreter.

The meeting was conducted in the Ex-Servicemen's Bowling Club at Griffith and items from the meeting are published separately following this report.

Day Four, Tuesday, March 14, saw the 11th Australia/New Zealand D.T.L. Trap Championship of 50 targets points scoring off 16 yards won by J. Ellis

of South-West, Western Australia 252/252 points. Shooter Ellis is the first shooter who has, as yet, won this event twice — he won this in 1971 at Brisbane with 192/192 points. Next was D. Byrne of Queanbeyan/Canberra G.C., with 251/252 points from N. Berry of Tatura, Victoria 194/195 points. Best Lady Shooter was Mrs Ruby Jenner of Wisconsin, USA 141/150 points, but we noted with acclamation that this lady was using a single barrel, repeat, a single barrel shotgun.

A \$300 value 25 target double barrel handicap followed — this was divided compulsorily by eleven possible scorers.

With us from America were Mr Herschel Cheek, past-President A.T.A., Mr Hugh McKinley, Manager A.T.A., and Mr Roy Foxworthy, leader of a group of some 62 Americans, Canadians and Alaskans.

These were officially welcomed together with their compatriots by A.C.T.A. President, Mr Gordon Hall.

Each in turn spoke highly of the hospitality, refereeing and general administration of the shoot and culminated this with a surprise presentation of a sterling silver belt buckle to A.C.T.A. President and Secretary respectively, on behalf of Mr Elgin Gates and the American visitors.

This "invasion" stemmed from the favorable publicity attached to our 1971 National programme by visiting shooter Mr Elgin T. Gates and family of California, USA.

To welcome these shooters from across the Pacific and to introduce them to a local Australian industry, we all met at 7.30 p.m. at a small, but very efficient, nearby winery for an evening barbecue and wine tasting. Everyone thoroughly enjoyed the evening and many friendships were firmly established.

Day Five, March 15, commenced clear but gusty and the 30 top scorers in the qualifying events of National DB, SB and ANZ Championships assembled at 9.10 a.m. to receive their highly prized special "International" badges. They then each shot at 100 targets double barrel, points scoring, with the highest 25 scores to count for the 26th Australian International Team. High gun in the team was J. Ellis of South-West G.C., Western Australia 324/324 points from B. Kable, N.S.W.G.C. 321/324 points.

This was followed by the 32nd Australian National Champion of Champions Cup event, shot over 50 targets from 20 yards, double barrel, both barrels of equal value. Winner was J. Green of Korumburra, Victoria 83/83 from J. Ellis, South-West, WA 82/83 and R. H. Gates of California, USA 76/77. There was no lady entry.

The day was completed by a 10 pair Double Rise sweepstake, compulsory division.

Day Six, Thursday, March 16, saw the 12th Australian National Double Rise Championship (25 pairs off 16 yards) won by R. Mules of S.A.G.C., SA 55/58.

For this event and henceforth the Executive Committee decided at Griffith that the recent A.C.T.A. down-the-line trap shooting rule number 82 (a) is rescinded, thus directing that this rule now reads that whilst shooters must call for the targets in the normal

manner, that they are no longer required to indicate to the referee which target is going to be shot at first, and added that each trap must have both a referee and a check referee.

Shot in conjunction with this event was the 3rd Australian National Intermediate Double Rise Championship — this was won by C. Carroll of Melbourne, Victoria, with 45/50 from R. Aquilina of N.S.W.G.C. 48/56 from L. J. Hubbard of Metropolitan, Victoria 47/56.

This concluded the trap events of the programme and the overall trap high gun scorer was presented with a Browning under-and-over shotgun number 27013-S70/B2 on behalf of the makers Fabrique Nationale of Belgium. John Green of Korumburra, Vic., with the aggregate score of 292/300 broken targets was so proud to receive this most distinguished award, he was speechless and unable to express himself in front of the tumultous acclamation.

Throughout the whole of this programme our recently found and highly esteemed US shooter Mr Elgin T. Gates had voluntarily provided an especially produced sterling silver bejewelled belt buckle to the winners of each of the principal National down-theline trap events of Grand Handicap, Double Barrel, Single Barrel, Australia/New Zealand, Champion of Champions and Double Rise events, and the Overall trap high gun scorer.

Following these presentations the 3rd Australian National Skeet Championship (50 targets using the quick round method) was commenced and this continued into the following day Friday, March 17, being day seven, the final day of this national programme. The winner of this event was R. G. Clark of Hawkesbury, NSW 96/100 from Vince Peterson of Kokatahi Gun Club, New Zealand 95/97 from George Biggs of Melbourne, Victoria 85/86. Best Lady Shooter was Mrs Pat Byrne of Queanbeyan/Canberra 26/50.

To conclude the programme, all present assembled to acclaim the overall high gun scorer of the programme John Green of Korumburra, Victoria, with the complete score of 338/350 who was handed the coveted Newton Thomas Perpetual Cup for the Overall High Gun score.

The 1973 National Clay Target Championships are scheduled to be conducted at the South Australian Gun Club, near the thirteen mile post on the Port Wakefield road, eastwards out of Adelaide, South Australia, over the seven successive days of March 10 to 16. For those planning their attendance, a most modern "Bolivar Gardens Caravan and Tourist Park" now exists "at the 12 mile post on highway one." Caravans can pull up and plug into running water, power, sink and sewerage waste disposal. First class laundry and washrooms, By March 1973, a 24-unit motel with 36 chalets (each accommodate to six) should be completed. Further details will be published when available and, we trust, self-explanatory advertisement will be made. The S.A.G.C. have arranged with Winchester for a full set of Winchester traps for the programme.

Geoff Kable of Sydney, won both the NZ National DR and Clay Sparrow Championships on 11/4/72. He is the first Australian to win two NZ titles in one NZ programme. The 1972 Australia/New Zealand

Skeet Teams' Match was a tie.

Extracts from the 36th Annual General Meeting minutes:—

#### **ELECTIONS**

President: Mr Gordon H. Hall was declared reelected unopposed.

Mr Hall replied — those of you who were present last year will recall I had four objectives of which three had been achieved—

- 1 that the rules be redrafted and that we could shoot under international rules;
- 2 that the "Shooting News" be changed into its new form, hopefully more readable, but advertisers are loathe to be with our limited circulation;
- 3 from our last President I undertook to raise the financial statements of this Association to a better level and with this I feel you should be satisfied;
- 4 possible amendments to our constitution will be read to you later during this meeting.

Thank you for your confidence and I will endeavor to make this Association better in every sense of the word. This Association has not reached the prestige I hoped — 'tis one of the largest sports in the Olympic sphere and I would like Australia to have full knowledge of this and that A.C.T.A. Shooters wear an A.C.T.A. blazer to show we are a prominent body.

I feel that next year must decide where we must go — increasing only one per cent yearly or want to develop into what I believe our members deserve to be known as top sportsmen and not semi-professionals.

#### **FINANCES**

It is my concept that until we adopt the USA ground fee of possibly 50 cents per shooter per day, we will not have financial independence for fostering grounds to carry out what shooters would like and not dream about. Some other body, I hear, put a small fee on their shooters to send a team overseas but I feel we could spend otherwise. The cost of living is rising but you are not being asked for a registration increase, because of the Brisbane shoot profit. This Association depends on whims during one week each year. The overall cost of being a member could be spread so that all levels could shoot. I feel that being in this position (as President) I see more than others

#### GENERAL BUSINESS

Chairman:-

- 1. The Executive Committee have ratified the dates for the 1973 National Championships at the South Australian Gun Club in Adelaide to commence on Saturday, March 10, 1973.
- I approached the legal people regarding ideas on gaps in our present constitution — for example, we do not have a Vice-President and other matters.
- 3. I asked the Executive for suggested amendments to our constitution I got very few but I will read our solicitor's letter to you. (This 2/3/72 letter of several pages was then read.) The amended draft will be sent to each club for consideration and return for further amendment and/or adoption.

- I want suggestions in writing and not from the floor of this meeting — any thoughts for further investigation. I would be pleased to hear from a member.

Moved: Messrs Burton (Geraldton), Burgess (Cobar), that the Executive Committee seek further assistance from the solicitors on the constitution. Carried.

Moved: Messrs Hawkins (Sunny Corner) and M. Burgess (Cobar), that the Executive Committee pursue the arrangements of a general shoot fee. Carried.

Moved: Messrs Steiner (Perth), Papps (Queanbeyan/Canberra), that the Executive carry on with handicapping on a performance basis. Carried.

Moved: Messrs Oldfield (Cootamundra) and J. B. Clarke (Warrnambool), that Messrs R. W. Fox, C. A. Gregory and associates be re-appointed as Auditors. Carried.

Moved: Messrs Burgess (Cobar) and Oldfield (Cootamundra), that a notice of appreciation be made on the retirement through ill health of Mr K. Soames.

- (2) At the time of each annual shooter re-registration, a one yard inward will be granted by A.C.T.A. and shown on the handicap card, as issued accordingly — excepting those shooters who request to remain on their earned handicaps.

#### COMMON MARK SHOOTING

- (i) Shooters are to be classed into three grades by their performance, excluding shoot-offs, over each 500 targets from 16 yards, double barrel, single barrel or points score with kills to count.
- (ii) Handicapping procedures are applicable in championships and graded events, in accordance with Rule 203, to shooters who are competing on or behind their handicap marks.
- (iii) Shooters may compete in one grade only. Any shooters may nominate in any grade higher than his own, but by doing so he forfeits the right to compete in his own grade.
- (iv) Shooters mark their own cards progressively for common mark shooting and at both June 30 and December 30 annually AND/OR after 500 programmed targets the card must be submitted to the club secretary for correct classication and reporting to A.C.T.A. central records.
- (v) The initial grades are to be:

  Australian A class = 95 to 100%

  Australian B class = 91 to 94%

  Australian C class = 90% and less
- (vi) A shooter's open handicap is achieved under the handicapping formula applicable to handicap events only.


