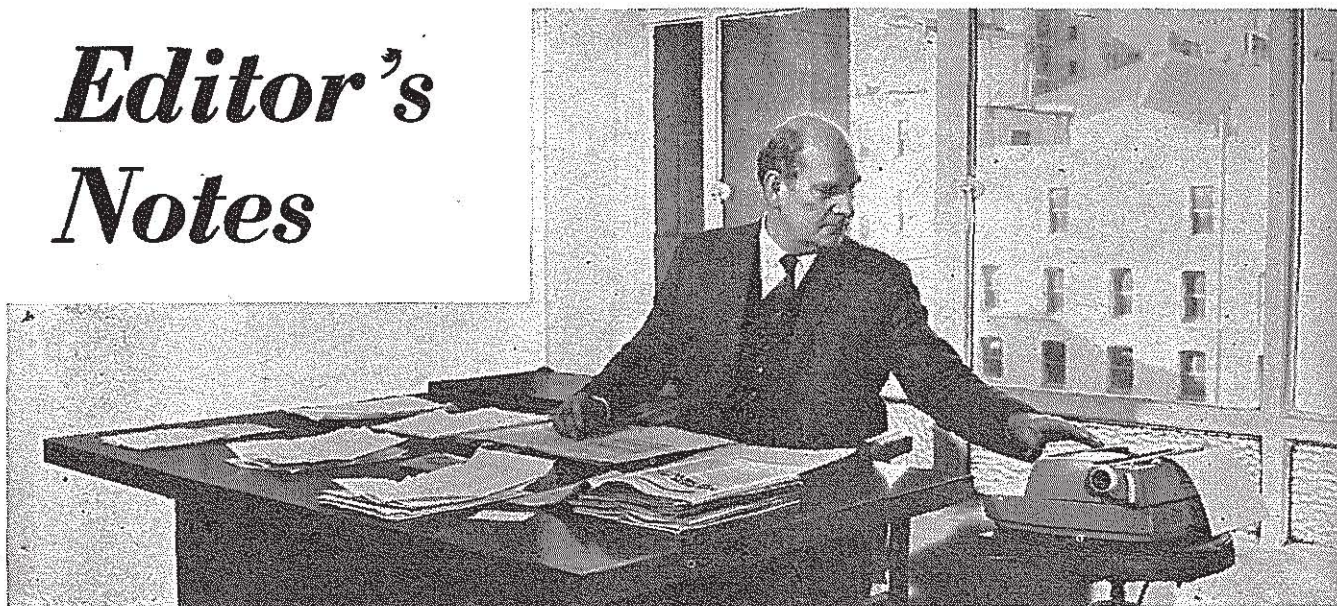

Editor's Notes



A.C.T.A. 1973 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

Applications for open championships to be contested during 1973 (that is, Commonwealth, State and District Titles) are required to be lodged, under Rule 27, by member clubs, in writing on the prescribed form number 16, not later than Friday, July 28, 1972. Late applications receive no consideration.

Such applications shall be collated and submitted to the Executive Committee for consideration and allocation. Member clubs are requested to measure their applications and to apply only for championships which can be satisfactorily conducted between January 1 and December 31, 1973.

Preference will be given to clubs which — (a) have the capacity to conduct the various types of shoots, i.e., the capacity in both equipment and current management. (NOTE — oscillating traps must be used, that is — Snipe, Dams, Winchester, and the like, but NOT "Plus" traps.)

(b) have submitted proposed dates together with their requested title events.

Those championships allocated by the Executive Committee for the 1973 year will be published in December 1972, "Clay Target Shooting News."

If no club advertising material has arrived two months before a Commonwealth Title event, then the Secretary/Editor is empowered to insert an appropriate advertisement and to charge the club concerned at the late insertion rate.

Clubs allocated State Title events are expected to advertise these State events in A.C.T.A. "Shooting News."

Clubs failing to submit advertising copy for Interstate Teams' and similar major events, will not receive such consideration in future allocations.

Shoot approvals will be issued, in writing, and are subject to the correct interpretations of A.C.T.A. Rules by the clubs concerned and are designed to avoid clashing of major programmes with nearby clubs.

Commonwealth, State or District Championships will not be allocated to clubs which fail to either apply

the handicapping formula correctly, or which fail to submit handicap returns for each shoot.

No trophies or prize monies may be handed to any shooter without the previous submission of his current handicap card (see Rule 18) correctly classified and progressively marked showing his shooting performance to date. It is the responsibility of each shooter to keep his own handicap card up to date, and this information he always gains by looking at the scoreboard during, and after, contesting any event. It is then the responsibility of the club secretary to notify A.C.T.A. central records, using the handicap return form, of any CHANGES in —

- (a) a shooter's class for common mark shooting;
- (b) a shooter's change of handicap as prescribed in the handicapping formula.

1. Correction to A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" page 8, column 1, of May 1972, the motion by Messrs

Steiner/Papps was REJECTED by the 1972 Annual Meeting.

2. The A.C.T.A. Shooting Rules, including amendments to date are being published in full in our July publication. Clubs will receive brochure copies as soon as possible.

For the guidance of clubs and shooters alike, the following extracts from current handicap cards show the scores, progress, percentage and class of two separate shooters as they each have recorded, on their own handicap cards. These scores have been applied by the shooters to their own cards when read from the club notice board.

Shooter Andrews reached the "programmed 500 targets" situation, and, because of his progressive total and consequent percentage, was advanced to "A" class.

Shooter Baxter commenced as a "B" class shooter then shot at less than 500 programmed targets up to November 30, thus, his progress is accepted and he is confirmed in "A" class.

The attention of all concerned is drawn to the following clarification concerning 1972 A.C.T.A. Handicap cards:—

1. On the front fold under Common Mark Shooting classification, section (b) should read "November 30."
2. On the rear fold the definition should read "... only Double Barrel, Single Barrel and Double Barrel points score results off 16 yards are to be recorded; novelty events, including teams scores are excluded."

1972 N.Z. championships

At the 1972 New Zealand Championships just concluded in Timaru, Geoff Kable of Sydney won both the New Zealand Double Rise and Clay Sparrow Championship titles. He is the first visitor to New Zealand to perform such a feat.

He took home the D'Arcy Dorreen Memorial Cup for the sparrow championship and the Breda trophy for the double rise event. In addition, Kable collected two of the sterling silver buckles made available to New Zealand by American shooter Elgin Gates.

Kable shot-off for the sparrow title against Jim Marshall (South Otago), Eric Jones (Moa Creek) and Harry Fyers (Huntly). In the double rise he shot-off against Digger Gunn (Hawkes Bay Central), T. Clarke (Waitemata), J. Jeffcote (Huntly) and A. Wakeford (Auckland Metropolitan).

Jim McKenzie emerged the winner of the 1972 Rothmans New Zealand International Trap Championship from a shoot-off defeating G. Smith of Victorian Gun Club (Aust.) McKenzie and Smith were the only two shooters from a field of 180 who had scored possibles.

New Zealand's Steve Knibb (Auckland Metropolitan) collected the 1972 New Zealand Skeet Championship title from a record entry of 206 (last year 180) in which only six raked up the possible: Knibb, Peter Veale (Waitemata), Graeme Webber (Waitemata), Fred Menzies (Hawkes Bay Central), Ralph Hughes (Te Puke/Tauranga) and Jim Marshall (South Otago). Fred Menzies was runner-up to Steve Knibb.

Johnny Thomson (Rotorua) didn't even work up a sweat to retain the New Zealand Single Barrel Championship title he won last year being the only contestant to shoot a possible from a large field of 230. Only three shot 49's behind Thomson — California's Elgin Gates, Kaikohe's Don Hudspith and Whangarei/Otamatea's Ken Donaldson, the young shooter who was this year's Air New Zealand North Island winner who visited the Australian Nationals at Griffith. In the shoot-off for runner-up, Donaldson dipped out on his first target and Hudspith on his fifth leaving Gates in a clear position as runner-up.

Glamour event of the Championships, the 1972 New Zealand Single Rise, went out of the country and was collected by the immensely likeable Canadian A. W. (Deb) Oliver of British Columbia, who, just out of interest, this year also collected a place in the United States All Stars Team — no mean achievement! Thirteen shooters tallied possibles, but after the first 10 targets in the shoot-off only eight were left, including A.C.T.A. President Gordon Hall of Geelong, who gained third placing. On his 80th target Oliver missed with his first barrel, started to put his gun down apparently forgetting he had a second barrel, suddenly remembered and brought it up to break the target just off the ground out by the limit. Under tremendous pressure and somewhat dismayed by this performance, Peter Hayman (Waimate) missed his 81st target, Oliver blasted his into pieces of dust and walked,

grinning, off the ground to collect the coveted title.

The New Zealand v. Australia six-man Teams' shoot for the Glenn Cup followed and was won by the New Zealand team 118/120, and by a margin of one target. The Australian Team consisted of Gordon Hall, Geelong; Graeme Bailey, Perth; Vince Ryan, Cosgrove; T. Salafia, Griffith; Mal Fuller, N.S.W.G.C. and Barney Rooke, Wagga. New Zealand was Fred Manson, Peter Hayman, Peter Veale, Johnny Thomson, Alan Elliott and Bill Brunton.

The New Zealand versus Australia Skeet Teams' Match resulted in a tie at 118/120 targets.

Although the New Zealanders were shooting a lot of second barrels, they went to the last target holding on to their one target advantage and Alan Elliott came up onto the mark to do or die for his country. Tense anticipation. First barrel hissed out onto the airport somewhere, a blast from the second and the crowd cheered (the New Zealanders, that is) as the target broke into little bits and pieces.

Champion of Champions for 1972 was Peter Veale of Waitemata who also gained top placing as first qualifier in the New Zealand International Team to contest the Mackintosh International Trophy Match with a score of 199/200.

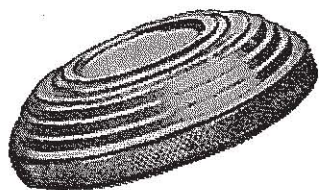
In the Champion of Champions calculations, Veale led with 196 from Johnny Thomson on 195 and Australian Barney Rooke in third place with 194.

The Hawkes Bay Shield, a teams' match in which only the various New Zealand districts are eligible to win the trophy, was won by the Palmerston North combination of Brian Cumings, Ross Meads, Peter Anson, Roger Wasley and Peter Wasley who were the only New Zealand team to score the possible.

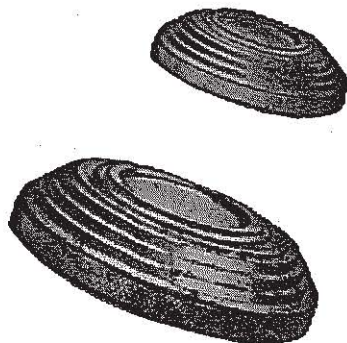
However, the "League of Nations" team comprised of Geoff Kable, Deb Oliver (Canada) and the three Californians Elgin Gates Snr., Elgin Gates Jr. and Randy Gates, also scored the possible in a fine display of international co-operation.

Corbett (Tokoroa), J. McKenzie (Southland), J. Nobbs (Thames), C. Streeter (Amberley), R. Wales (Auckland), E. A. Elliott (Christchurch), G. Webber (Waitemata), J. W. Haugh (Wanaka), J. Hedley (Mataura), A. J. Tomson (Hamilton), J. Sutherland (Southland), G. Denning (Auckland), J. B. Fletcher (Rotorua), K. Jury (Alexandra), B. Lassen (Christchurch), G. W. Shaw (Auckland), R. 3. The SA State DB Championship outcome was 1st R. Mules 52/52; 2nd J. Byrnes 51/52; 3rd I. Campbell 44/45; whilst the SA State Intermediate DB Championship shot in conjunction resulted 1st P. Browne 30/30; 2nd S. Williams 29/30; 3rd M. Whitehead 29/30.

The John Newton Thomas trophy



This 16½ x 12 inch cup has been rejuvenated and fitted with a new wooden base of timber from a myall tree on the New South Wales property of the donor, John Newton Thomas of Melbourne.

The cup was originally donated for competition within the Australian Clay Pigeon Trapshooting Association — which since 1961 has become the registered company known as the Australian Clay Target Association.

The inscriptions to date on the cup refer to page 8 of June 1971 A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" and are:—

"This cup, one of the earliest given for Clay Target Shooting in Australia, was won by J. W. Sutherland (known as Calrossie), who was my mentor and friend in my early trapshooting career.

"It is given in perpetuity for competition at the A.C.T.A. National Championships and is for the best aggregate over all the National Title Events and the Grand Australian Handicap."

Inter-service trap shooting competition — ICI shield

The RAAF were the host service for the competition this year and consequently the event took place at the RAAF Gun Club grounds at Point Cook.

Conditions were ideal for the shoot and the personnel responsible for the provision of the facility at Point Cook are to be congratulated on the appearance of the ground and the catering arrangements which all contributed to a successful and enjoyable day. (For the Army team at least).

The first round commenced with the three members of the first squad notching a perfect score, then disaster struck for the RAAF as in the second and third squads they missed six targets during which time Navy lost one and Army two. The fourth and fifth squads were equally bad for Navy who also dropped six more targets. However, at the conclusion of the first round Army easily led RAAF and Navy the scores being 27, 22 and 21 respectively.

The second round followed much the same pattern as the first, RAAF losing four targets in the 2nd and 3rd squads and Navy losing six in the last three squads. End of the 2nd round scores were Army 54, RAAF 48 and Navy 42.

At this stage it was a foregone conclusion as the Army team were all shooting very consistently and although RAAF gained two targets in the 3rd round

The Association is very grateful to the makers of these fine trophies, Messrs Fabrique Nationale of Belgium and to their Australian agents, Messrs Commercial Marketing Co. Pty. Ltd. of Sydney.

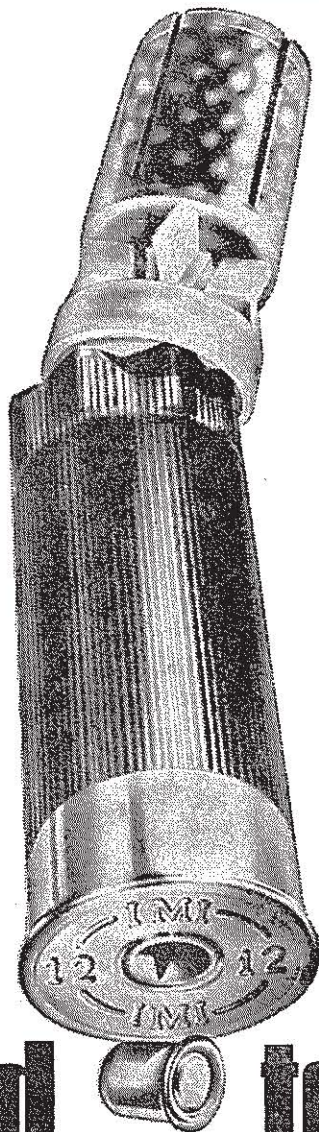

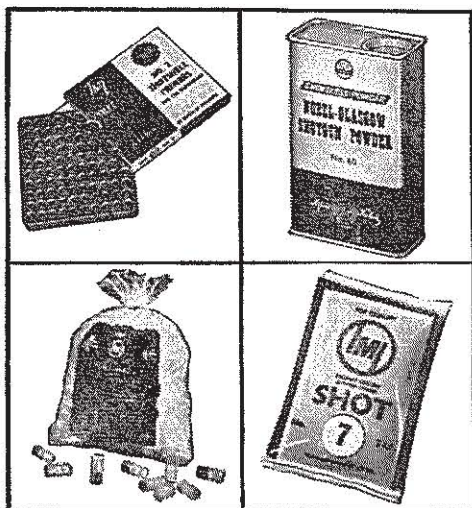

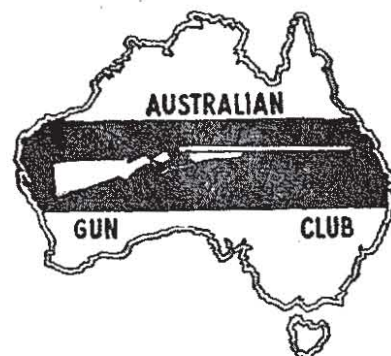

- (1) As of 1/1/72 past A.C.T.A. rules allowing inward movement on handicap ratings are discontinued, except for extreme physical disabilities.
- (2) At the time of each annual shooter re-registration, a one yard inward will be granted by A.C.T.A. and shown on the handicap card, as issued accordingly — excepting those shooters who request to remain on their earned handicaps.

COMMON MARK SHOOTING

- (i) Shooters are to be classed into three grades by their performance, excluding shoot-offs, over each 500 targets from 16 yards, double barrel, single barrel or points score with broken targets to count.
- (ii) Handicapping procedures are applicable in championships and graded events, in accordance with Rule 203, to shooters who are competing on or behind their handicap marks.
- (iii) Shooters may compete in one grade only. Any shooters may nominate in any grade higher than his own, but by doing so he forfeits the right to compete in his own grade.
- (iv) Shooters mark their own cards progressively for common mark shooting and at November 30 annually AND/OR after 500 programmed targets the card must be submitted to the club secretary for correct classification and reporting to A.C.T.A. central records.
- (v) The initial grades are to be:
Australian A class = 95 to 100%
Australian B class = 91 to 94%
Australian C class = 90% and less
- (vi) A shooter's open handicap is achieved under the handicapping formula applicable to handicap events only.
