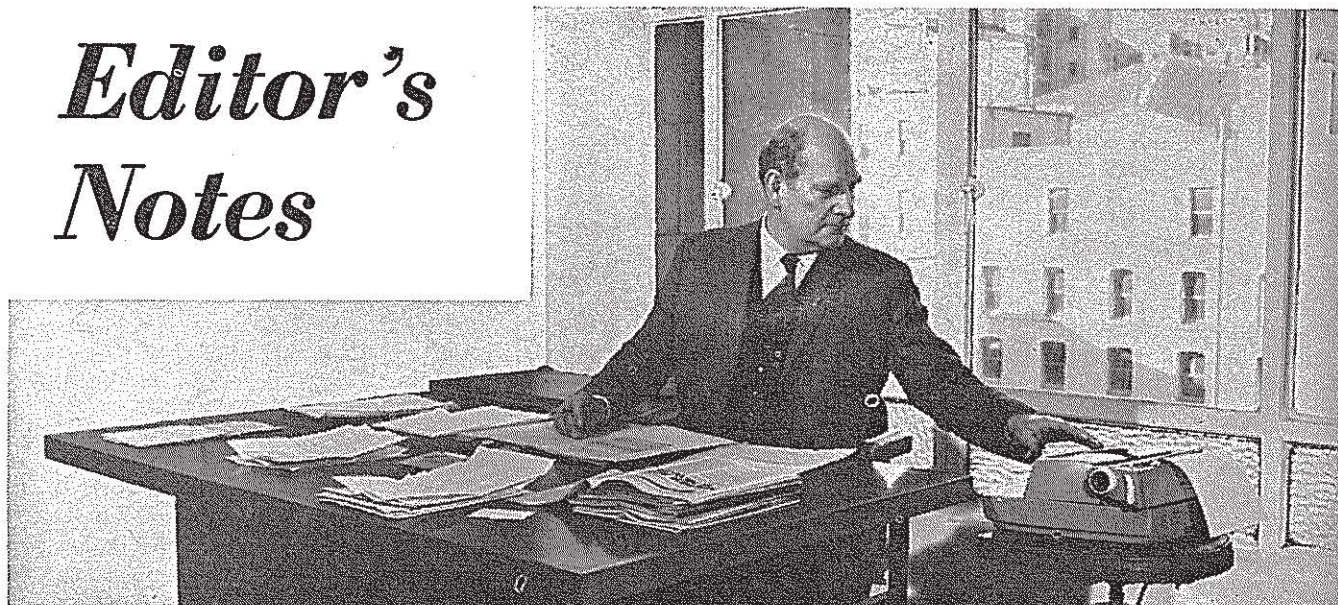

Editor's Notes



A team of six trap shooters and a team of six skeet shooters from the A.C.T.A. will compete by invitation at Singapore over August 10 to 13. The shoot is part of a festival of sports and is locally called Pesta Sukan. Originally the festival was to be conducted during September and the invitation was quite clearly, only for shooting members of the Australian Olympic Team when returning from the 1972 Olympic Games at Munich. When it was found that Australian Olympic Team participants cannot break their return air flights without incurring much personal expense, the Pesta Sukan organisers amended their dates then asked A.C.T.A. to field a team.

Gladly we then accepted this invitation but it is difficult to find top class shooters who have both sufficient free time available almost on demand at a common time and also the ready thousand dollars or so, as all expenses are borne by the team members themselves. However, the Singapore Gun Club has most graciously arranged special hotel accommodation at a very much cheaper price than normal.

Full details of the team and shoot will be made known in our first available publication after the information is received, however, we are attempting to have earlier information if we are invited in 1973 and if so, then most likely an elimination shoot may be centrally conducted in Melbourne. We had asked some time ago whether we could send an "A" and a "B" team in both trap and skeet, thus leaving selections available for other areas in Australia. To this, the reply has been understandably quite firm and only one team of six shooters for each of trap and skeet is required, preferably to arrive, shoot and depart as a group — these requirements have been observed for 1972.

Meetings of the British Commonwealth Games Federation in London in May 1972, and at Munich in August during the Olympic Games, will discuss all sports but with emphasis on programme revisions of cycling, athletics, swimming and shooting.

The athletic and swimming proposals are mainly for

revision of the daily programmes and in swimming this could mean the addition of an extra session to the existing eleven.

Swimming programmes for the Jamaican and Edinburgh Games were found to have limitations in that they were too demanding on swimmers in some categories of competition, with not enough rest between events. Canada and Australia have proposed other schedules.

Two new events may emerge from the cycling proposals for there is support for the addition of a 4000 metres pursuit event. However, a suggestion that a 100 kilometres time trial on the road should be held, may not be successful, as there is not very much support for the event in the Commonwealth.

Shooting, which is introducing trapshooting for the first time at a Commonwealth Games, is also looking for support in introducing running boar, smallbore hunting type competition.

However the major task facing shooting is in the trapshooting sector where it wants to establish a completely new set of competition rules.

Trapshooting officials believe that Olympic type rules are too restrictive in their equipment demands for Commonwealth Games competition, and, whilst New Zealand suggests a set of rules based on the "Mackintosh Trophy" competition, Australia is also supporting America and others, seeking a permanent change from the fifteen trap existing layout (fifteen traps releasing targets in preset directions, with the traps in three layouts of five traps), to the single oscillating trap as is used in the Americas and British Commonwealth countries. Reasons are for cost of less traps, in that one would replace five, and also that half the number of pit boys or trap boys are required for reloading.

The skeet competitions will be held under the American rules as these are the most commonly used throughout the world. (See I.S.U. Skeet Rule 9 which prescribes that the singles be shot before the doubles—

Australia has varied this in that we shoot the Quick Round Method of skeet by moving from stations 1 to 8 shooting the singles and doubles progressively, during one visit, to speed things up. Frankly, slow procedures can cost a club too much in administration and limit the number of shooters within any prescribed period of time).

Of interest to all is the information that the Clay Pigeon Shooting Association of Great Britain still has a shooter membership of around 2,000. This Association, has had ICI Ltd. — latterly I.M.I. Limited — as its main financial and directive prop over the period of its existence. There are moves afoot for the C.P.S.A. to stand on its own feet.

In America, New Zealand and Australia, the respective Associations have always conducted and controlled their own affairs, with of course, the best of relations with ammunition, clay target, trap and shot-gun manufacturers.

Percentagewise of population, Australia is far ahead of America in its number of registered trapshooters, and most obviously so with those of Great Britain.

Separately within this publication are self-explanatory letters and articles on international type shooting both trap and skeet; release trigger guns by Australia's adopted U.S. Liaison Officer Elgin Gates of California and others of general interest, however; concerning international type shooting, the following is the personal finding of a very capable Australian shooter who has shot extensively in Europe and America but who prefers that his name be withheld:—

"In Europe Clay Target Shooting is Olympic Trench style which is costly from all angles. Briefly there are 200 millions of people in the Common Market area and it would be hard to find **more than 100 shooters** participating in Olympic Trench over the whole of Europe in any normal weekend — reason, so few people are capable of shooting this method who can also afford it. Whereas in the USA there are many thousands shooting clay targets at weekends, (because it is a cheaper method), each of whom is contributing somewhat to the overall cost.

"In reality Olympic Trench shooting does not repre-

sent a significant proportion of the world's clay target shooting.

"Olympic Trench shooting appears to be a delight for the "AA" class shooters only and a horror for the average shooter.

"Australia appears to be on the right lines continuing down-the-line and at the same time developing skeet shooting."

Some letters have arrived concerning handicapping, in line with common mark shooting, for say, a 23 yarder now coming up with a "C" class rating on his first 500 targets off 16 yards — this can be so, as these are two distinctly different types of shooting and these are recorded as such. The time has come when the "initial conversion" method of early 1972 is to be discarded.

Thus, a 23 yarder alters his handicap by his trophy wins within the handicap events as listed within the handicapping formula, whilst for common mark shooting his scores, as listed on his card, bring him to a particular class and this could even be a "C" class.

Clubs are hereby requested to use their existing handicap return forms to A.C.T.A. central records with "Common Mark" matters expressed in the "Remarks" column.

Standards of refereeing are bound to alter by virtue of personal interpretations of this or that circumstance. To achieve a common interpretation throughout Australia the standard of our referee examiners is by most careful selection, the shooting rules have now been updated, reprinted and distributed to every affiliated club and registered shooter. We conduct a rules interpretation discussion night during each National Championship series. At the Melbourne Gun Club a further method is carried out in that intending referee candidates are invited to attend lectures to prepare themselves for the oral examinations which they must survive before undergoing practical examination. The Melbourne Gun Club using Referee Examiners George Biggs and Bob Buchan, is conducting its next such preparation evening on Monday, August 7, and barbecue facilities are arranged. Prospective candidates must realise throughout the Commonwealth that Referee Examiners are honorary, that they cannot be expected to race here and there examining willy nilly but that shooter candidates must firstly be recommended as fit to examine, in the opinion of their own clubs, and they must then be prepared to be examined, preferably not on their home club grounds.

Editor's Comment:

This proposed legislation has, at the time of our going to press, already passed the first reading stage in New South Wales. A similar situation is in Victoria. Tasmania and Western Australia already have such laws.

A.C.T.A. was represented at each of the respective State discussions before the bills were presented to the State Parliaments.

The toughest spot in international skeet?

(With acknowledgements to "U.S. Rifleman")

Which is the toughest skeet target?

My feeling is that it's the one I have just missed! This feeling comes over me, alas, many times in a round.

But this does not seem like a very scientific way of approaching the matter, so I took a good look at the results of the 40th World Shooting Championship, shot at Phoenix in October 1970.

At the World Championships in skeet, some 82 men shot the 200-target course, 75 on each of the first two days, 50 on the third day. Eight ladies completed their 150-target course. We shot by the rules of the International Shooting Union, which limited each country to four men shooters and two lady shooters. Generally speaking, these were the best in their country, so this was a tough, experienced group of gunners.

This was international skeet, which is much more difficult than the US game. The gun must be held with the butt touching the shooter's hip until the target appears. It can be thrown any time within three seconds after the call, and when it does come, it is fast! The target normally travels 65 metres (or 72 yds.), considerably farther than the US recommended 60 yds., or permissible 55 yds. To stand the rougher handling in the trap, the international target must be a little stronger and less liable to break in the trap — and likewise less likely to break when you hit it with a stray pellet.

I ran tabulations of targets lost by these 90 best-in-their-country shooters, using all scores. I also ran a sub-total on rounds which had scores of 20 and over, figuring that scores down in the teens aren't really representative of the best shots. The bar chart shows graphically the misses at each station in all these scores of 20 and over.

A look at the results shows that all stations are tough. Targets were missed in singles and doubles at all of them. Surprising to me was the rather large number of misses at the relatively easy straightaway targets at one high and seven low.

But there's no question which is the toughest station. Number eight wins, hands down, with more misses from each house than from any other position.

WHAT PRICE AN INTERNATIONAL CLAY PIGEON FIELD?

Renton Fish and Game Club built its own at 1/5 contractor's bid

Many clay pigeon shooters will vie for the honor of representing the US in the Olympic Games in Munich, Germany, this August.

The two-man US Olympic clay pigeon team will be chosen in try-outs at the 12th NRA International Shooting Championships at Phoenix, Arizona, in early June.

And in one important respect the contest for the coveted team positions will be an uneven one.

This is because international clay pigeon, the game fired in the Olympics and in International matches, is shot over a 15-trap trench.

Shooters who have had a chance to practice over such a trench have a decided competitive advantage over those whose practice has been limited to a course with a conventional trap house.

But a 15-trap trench is hard to find on US soil. Some 2,300 American clubs have one or more conventional trap houses. But only 17 — four of them on military bases — have 15-trap trenches. And of those 17 only 11 currently are in operation. By contrast, Russian International clay pigeon shooters can avail themselves of 30 15-trap trenches in the Greater Moscow area alone.

Quite a few US clubs have considered putting in a 15-trap trench, but high costs have kept most from proceeding. Fifteen working traps plus spares, electrical controls and timers, the long trap house, landscaping, a control tower and miscellaneous expenses can run the per field cost of such a course as high as \$30,000.

This is why the NRA program for International Clay Pigeon provides for shooting over a multi-oscillating trap in a deep-pit trap house. The International Shooting Union does the same for Regional and Continental Championships.

Given mind, muscle and initiative, however, the elusive 15-trap trench need not be out of reach of gun clubs with modest finances. The experience of the Renton Fish and Game Club of Renton, Wash., is conclusive proof of this.

Merlin Martin, President of the Renton Club, explains that back in 1964 three Renton shooters made it to the Clay Pigeon Final Try-outs for the Tokyo Olympic Games. The trio managed this feat without benefit of practice over a 15-trap trench. But their success bred hopes and raised expectations. Why shouldn't Renton have its own trench, so members and guests could get the full flavor of the international clay pigeon game?

A step in this direction was made in 1966 when club members rolled up their sleeves, pitched in and built a four-trap range for domestic clay pigeon. In the process they cleared and graded 200,000 square feet of timberland and built concrete forms — all without outside assistance.

But the next move — from four traps to 15 — was a big one. Mike Tipa, NRA Director of International and Shotgun Activities, supplied blueprints of the trench in Weisbaden, Germany, where the ISU World Championship had been fired in 1966.

A contractor's construction estimate, based on the blueprint, came to \$25,000 — a far cry from the \$4,500 the club would be able to scrape up over the next two years.

Undeterred, the Renton Club took the only alternative to abandoning its dream. It fell back on its now well-established do-it-yourself tradition.

With a couple of small rented bulldozers, club member operators gouged out a trench 64 ft. long, 10 ft. wide and 7½ ft. deep one spring weekend in 1967.

Over the next 10 months, club esprit, plus the attraction of free food and shooting, ensured a turnout of six or seven volunteers on every clear weekend.

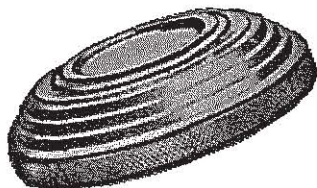
Low cost and their reputation for rugged dependability dictated the choice of Italian-made Serena traps. Seventeen were ordered, including two complete spares, control box, 15 extra solenoids and five extra arms.

With the traps installed, all that remained to be done was to install wiring, regulate the traps, and debug the system. NRA provided a set of six programs for different daily trap settings and throwing order. A Canadian firm, Caldwell Industries of North Vancouver, B.C., supplied the extra-durable clay targets needed to withstand the throwing velocity of international traps.

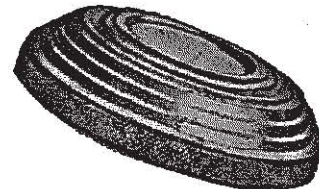
By early 1968, the Club's international set-up was completed. And the membership's sweat, the loan of some equipment and donations of a small amount of materials had kept the cost within the Club's \$4,500 budget.

Since then some of the best international clay pigeon shots in the US have fired in NRA registered events over the Club's budget trench, notably the US Air Force and Army teams. This spring, with the Olympic try-outs only a few weeks away, the Renton trench will be getting an especially stiff work out.

What the Renton Club has done, other clubs can and must do, an NRA spokesman says, if American clay pigeon shooters are to do well in the prestigious international events.

State of Queensland — open season for duck shooting — as of 1973 a fee of \$2 to \$5 is proposed from beginning June till August 26 in the south-eastern and south western areas whilst in other areas it may be from July 1 to September 30. Seven of the 15 species of wild duck common in Queensland can be shot during the open season. At this stage duck shooters do not pay any fee for a permit for their sport but they must have permission from property owners before actually shooting — this restriction exists under previous Queensland legislations.

Classifications:—

All A.C.T.A. registered shooters — 16 yards.

Old boys — shooters who have shot in competition or a similar event — 16 yards.

New boys — shooters who have never shot in competition or a similar event — 16 yards.

Girls — all girls except registered A.C.T.A. shooters to shoot from — 14 yards.

Events for all grades:—

No. 1—10 target Single Barrel for Individual Trophy — 16 yards. Girls — 14 yards.

No. 2—Shot in conjunction with Event No. 1. The Inter Town Teams' Match — teams of five shooters from their own town.

No. 3—Interstate Teams' Match — the 10 highest scorers from each State become the State Team, then to shoot a further 10 targets each from 16 yards to decide the winner.

Nominations for all events close on August 16, 1972, addressed to Mr Barney Rooke, 55 Murray Street, Wagga Wagga, NSW, 2650 (whose telephone number is 21-3894). Nomination forms, as mailed to many clubs list shooter's name, age, school, town, shooting class nomination, thence the team nomination form requires the competitor names plus the town represented. Both these forms must be signed by either the school principal or the parent. Luncheon will be a choice of two pies and drink, two "hot dogs" and drink, two salad rolls and drink. There will also be an adult lunch available. Should sleeping billets be required by those from long distances then this information must also be written clearly on the forms.

I am directed by telephone by many irate members of this Association to express their "dismay and disgust at your front page presentation of the Melbourne 'Herald' dated July 3, 1972."

On this page, you have approved publicly of an illegal following which has been banned by all States of Australia and also by most countries of the world for many years.

Live bird shooting from captive traps has been classed as a repulsive blood sport by most nations and the Melbourne "Herald," has, with other newspapers in the past always expressed disgust at such pursuits, but it does appear that its policy has altered.

Your article also states that "Mr Veall is a good shot. He has been Australia's outstanding trapshooter for many years. He cannot count the number of gold medals and trophies he has won."

As this Association is the governing body of clay target shooting, or trapshooting, in Australia, with vast records on our thousands of shooters we do point out that Mr Veall is not registered with any of our many member clubs throughout Australasia.

Clay target shooting is simulated field shooting at targets, shaped like a saucer, which are thrown from a mechanical device for shotgun shooters to test his/their shooting skill and to provide competition shotgun shooting. The sport of clay target shooting has a worldwide following of amateurs, and competitive shooting of all types is the second largest entry in the Commonwealth Games and the third largest entry in the Olympic Games.

Mr Editor, the many telephone calls received also stated "that is the last Melbourne 'Herald' I will buy."

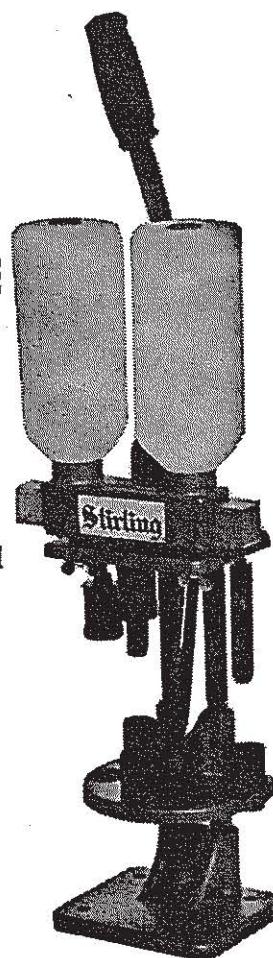

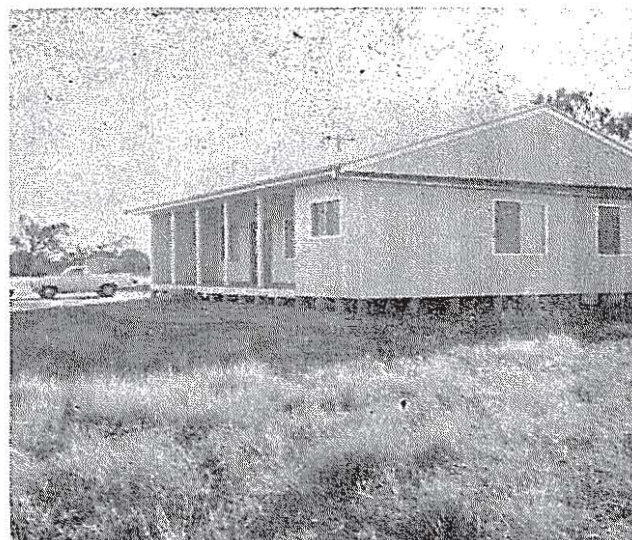
Warren Gun Club to open new club building

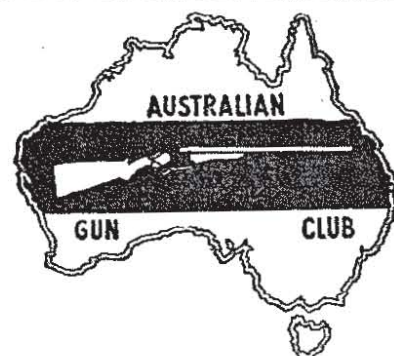

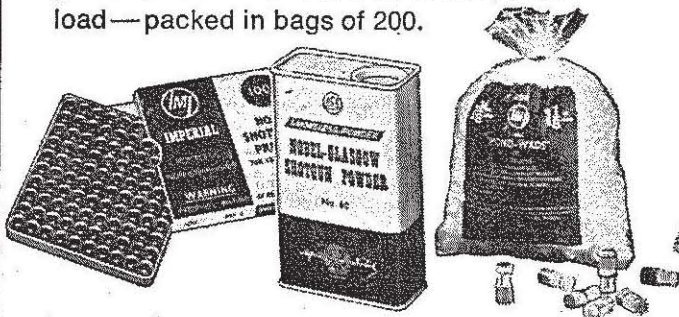

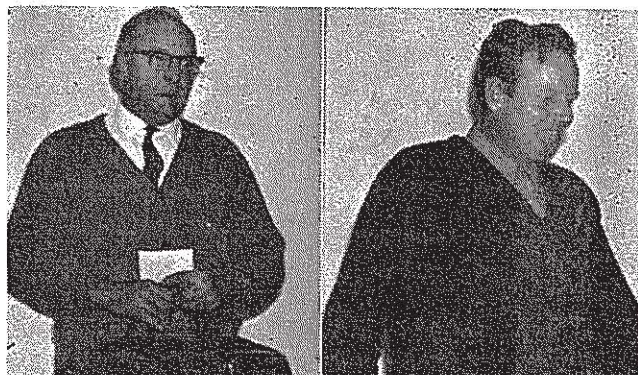

- (1) As of 1/1/72 past A.C.T.A. rules allowing inward movement on handicap ratings are discontinued, except for extreme physical disabilities.
- (2) At the time of each annual shooter re-registration, a one yard inward will be granted by A.C.T.A. and shown on the handicap card, as issued accordingly — excepting those shooters who request to remain on their earned handicaps.

COMMON MARK SHOOTING

- (i) Shooters are to be classed into three grades by their performance, excluding shoot-offs, over each 500 targets from 16 yards, double barrel, single barrel or points score with broken targets to count.
- (ii) Handicapping procedures are applicable in championships and graded events, in accordance with Rule 149, to shooters who are competing on or behind their handicap marks.
- (iii) Shooters may compete in one grade only. Any shooters may nominate in any grade higher than his own, but by doing so he forfeits the right to compete in his own grade.
- (iv) Shooters mark their own cards progressively for common mark shooting and at November 30 annually AND/OR after 500 programmed targets the card must be submitted to the club secretary for correct classification and reporting to A.C.T.A. central records.
- (v) The initial grades are to be:
 Australian A class = 95 to 100%
 Australian B class = 91 to 94%
 Australian C class = 90% and less
- (vi) A shooter's open handicap is achieved under the handicapping formula applicable to handicap events only.

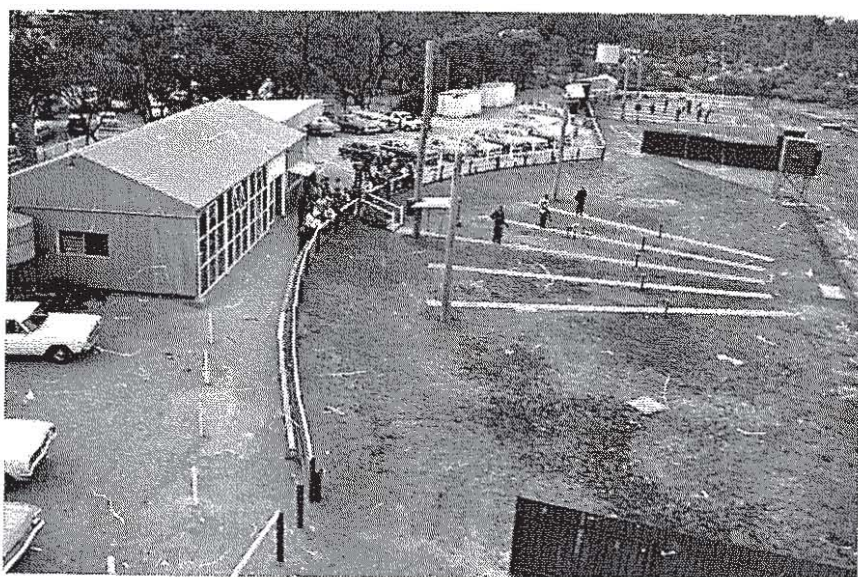
