MUTURA CONFERENCE IN TRANSPORTATION CONFERENCE AND A CONFE

In the September and October 1971 publications of A.C.T.A. "Shooting News," it was announced that thanks to the personal submissions of Mr Jules Steiner at the August 1971 meeting of the International Shooting Union in Western Germany, the 1973 I.S.U. World Moving Target Championships were allocated to Australia, to be conducted at the Perth Gun Club during October 1973.

Since then, various circumstances led Perth to relinquish this honor in favor of the Melbourne Gun Club (Victoria).

At the time of going to press, no further details are known but more news should be available in our next publication.

A.C.T.A. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING

The next scheduled meeting of the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee will be held in Melbourne, Victoria, at the Naval and Military Club, 27 Little Collins Street, on Monday/Tuesday, October 9/10, 1972.

Some clubs have been conducting shoots during 1972 with trophies for the first, second, third and front marker placegetters in their events off 16 yards.

December 1971 "Shooting News," page 5, column 1, stated that 'Common Mark shooting, with shooters classed into three grades, was applicable for 1972, and that during and after the year 1972, "intermediate" shooters would be Class "C" shooters.

Thus, 1972 was to be a transitionary year to permit the completion of all allotted Intermediate Championships.

Clubs are requested to commence common mark shooting and consequent trophy/sash allocations as in rule 100 (k) as soon as possible during this 1972 year — this is in line with overseas developments and the outcome of Australian discussions on uniformity with the end desire of maximum benefit to the shooters.

Thus we have two types of shooting, neither of which has reference to the other for individual grading. These are:—

1. Handicap events which are considered under the handicapping formula (this is shooting skill at a particular time).

2. Common mark shooting which automatically indicates a class grading (this is shooting skill over a period and is the most equitable).

Each shooter is required under rule 100 (f) to progressively mark his own card with his 16 yard results, and, after 500 programmed targets and at November 30 (annually when re-registering), the card must be submitted to the club secretary for correct classification and verification and reporting to A.C.T.A. central records.

Photographs of shooting interest frequently arrive in the mail and we prefer plain black-and-white gloss photos for best reproduction. The problems then are (a) what space is available; (b) do the photos achieve justice with clarity.

Most submissions attempt to include too much detail, thus 'they 'obscure the wood with the trees." Clubs and shooters alike, all love to see themselves, or their efforts, duly recorded if and when this is possible.

The actual shooting dates and sequence of events for our 1973 National Championships in Adelaide will be made known in our December 1972 publication. At our 1972 Nationals at Griffith, we had a two-day invasion of North American shooters. Latest information is that they may be with us at Adelaide — sounds as though they enjoyed us as we enjoyed them.

1972-73 Winchester clay target tournament

TRAP EVENT

The Tournament will be conducted as a graded event between November 1972 and June 1973, at nine club locations in Australia.

Each club will be requested to conduct the Tournament as part of a major shooting carnival.

THE EVENT

The event will consist of 50 targets double barrel from 16 yards, broken targets to count, shoot-off to determine places under first miss-out conditions; overall high gun at each location will qualify to shoot a long run break which will be judged against other locations to determine the overall Tournament winner. Host clubs have the choice of shooting the event to best suit the clubs layout as:—

(a) the number of traps;

(b) the number of visits.

GRADES

Class A: Class B: Class C.

PRIZES

At each location for each class as follows:— 1st — Badge and 1 Model 201 Super Grade

The overall high gun winner at each location will be supplied with Winchester shells free-of-charge with which to continue the long-run break following the shoot-off. The club cost of long-run break clay targets, following the shoot-off, will be to Winchester's account (clubs reimbursed for actual usage).

Nominations: \$15.

Winchester will provide all trophies to the clubs free of cost to the clubs.

CARTRIDGES

Cartridges to be used must not exceed $1\frac{1}{8}$ oz. shot weight with no restriction on brands or home loads. The long-breaks following the shoot-offs will be shot with Winchester cartridges supplied free at each location.

ELIGIBILITY

The event is open only to registered A.C.T.A. shooters who will be required to present their handicap cards when nominating. A shooter may enter at more than one location but, having qualified for high gun at a location, may not enter at another location. **FINAL**

The overall winner will be determined by the longrun break results.

The overall winner will receive:

Name engraved on the Perpetual Winchester Gold Cup with miniature replica cup to keep. Sash and badge.

October, 1972-2

A return air ticket to attend the 1974 Australian National Championships from residential State capital city to city of Nationals venue **or**

\$100 cash to assist with expenses in attending.

SKEET EVENT

The event will consist of two rounds of skeet in three divisions at each location and be conducted between November 1972 and June 1973. One club in each State to conduct the event.

THE EVENT

The event will consist of two rounds each of 25 targets (total 50) shot the quick round method with "off-the-gun" scores to count. Shoot-offs to determine placings shall be under first miss-out conditions. Overall high gun at each location will qualify to shoot a long-run break which will be judged against other locations to determine the overall Tournament winner. The long-run break score will include the shoot-off score but not the event score.

DIVISIONS

\$425

The high gun winner at each location will be supplied with Winchester shells free-of-charge with which to continue the long-run break following the shoot-off. The cost of the long-run break targets following the shoot-off to determine the event high gun winner, will be to Winchester's account. (Clubs reimbursed for actual usage.)

Nominations: \$8.

CARTRIDGES

Cartridges to be used must not exceed $1\frac{1}{5}$ oz. shot weight with no restriction on brands or home loads. The long-run breaks following the shoot-offs will be shot with Winchester cartridges supplied free at each location.

ELIGIBILITY

The event is open only to registered A.C.T.A. shooters who will be required to present their handicap cards when nominating. A shooter may enter at more than one location but, having qualified for high gun at a location, may not enter at another location.

FINAL

The overall winner will be determined by the longrun break results.

The overall winner will receive:

Name engraved on Perpetual Winchester Gold Cup with miniature replica cup to keep.

Sash and badge.

\$100 towards expenses in attending the 1974 National Skeet Championships.

TIPS AND TALES



Alice Springs (NT) — four trap referee candidates recently travelled 700 road miles to Mount Isa in Northern Queensland to shoot and to undergo an examination by Referee Examiner, Mr R. H. (Bill) Moyse, who himself had to travel 548 miles from Blackall, Central Queensland, and a like amount on the return, to meet them. These are credits to personal enthusiasm all round, and put to shame some of the grizzles that some shooters bring forward. Some 40 odd shooters gathered for the two-day shoot. Mount Isa is an interesting city of 27,000 people with

good wide streets and first class hotels/motels.

Melbourne (V) — conducted one of their prospective referee candidate meetings on Monday, August 7. Attendance was 37 including two very interested school children. Two shooter candidates from Mansfield, some 70 miles away attended. Commencing at 8 p.m. all the shooting rules were explained and discussed simply and easily by the meeting leaders both of whom are trap and skeet referee examiners - Club President, Bob Buchan and Executive Committeeman, George Biggs. All types of shotguns were discussed and demonstrated in front of the meeting. The club provided a supper, then films on trapshooting, skeet shooting and field shooting were shown with the compliments of the two manufacturers IMI Australia Ltd. and Winchester Australia Pty. Ltd. The descriptive films were most interesting and are available on request from the companies, subject to normal provisions. This rules and shoot procedure explanation will be continued, on other nights to be arranged, before any of the candidates are considered for possible practical then oral examinations.

Deniliquin (NSW) — as was stated on page 6 of September, "Shooting News" had their clubhouse damaged by fire when no-one was in attendance and had very little insurance coverage on the building. Consequently the club has CANCELLED their 1972 Grand Prix which had been scheduled for October 13/14 — see "special announcement" in the New South Wales section of this publication.

Sydney (NSW) — Secretary is now Alan Vidler.

Kyneton (V) — Secretary now is Brian Fleming. Club's next shoot is September 10.

Australian Showmen's (somewhere on the road, October, 1972-4 south from Northern Territory) — the big event of the Northern Run for showmen is the annual contest between Don Davenport and Frank Foster for the Best, Damper Maker. The only winner will be a well known charity. Frank Foster always wants judges of his own choosing when in the North Queensland area. Don Davenport put on a trial run damper recently and according to reports "the Foster chap can get his cheque book out, for sure — he's beaten before he mixes the dough." Don and Frank are keen trapshooters and visit shoots as they are near clubs. (Acknowledgments to "The Outdoor Showman.")

Kavieng (PNG) — VALE — John Stanfield, aged 41, died on June 28 and was buried at sea. John, a foundation member of the Kavieng Club and owner of our shooting grounds put a great deal of time and expense into getting our Club started. Missed by all.

Bothwell (Tas.) — Secretary now is K. Waddell, 544 Churchill Avenue, Sandy Bay.

Wallerawang (NSW) — Secretary, Alex Blackadder, has been keeping the surgeons in business lately but now writes "all seems to be OK now." (All are happy to have him back on deck.)

Werribee (V) — owing to a delay in obtaining the new grounds, the club is in temporary recess and all news information will be published as soon as possible.

Burdekin (Q) — Secretary now is Miss S. Gifford of P.O. Box 584, Ayr.

Charleville (\mathbf{Q}) — will conduct District DB and SB Championships on Sunday, December 3.

Champion of Champions — this is one of the highest possible awards in the Australian National Clay Target Championships. It is an open event shot from 20 yards and consequently, it means what it says "Champion of Champions." However, some clubs appear to aspire to strange senses of value by including "Club Champion of Champions" events in their programmes. Such event names over-rate the circumstance of purely local competitions.

Australia's Shotgun Competitor at the 1972 Olympic Games at Munich — Sperry Marshall, 41, of Hobart Gun Club, who in practice at Munich on 23/8/72, shot and equalled the previous world record of 198/200 trap targets with a Browning Under and Over. In the actual Olympic competition his 186/200 score placed him 9th in the world field of 175 contestants. Winner Scalzone of Italy, 199/200, a new world record. Used many second barrels dropping only one.

Australian shooters at Singapore 'Little Olympics'

The Singapore Gun Club invited the A.C.T.A. to field two six-man teams to participate in International Skeet and Trench Competition during August 10 to 13 at the 1972 Singapore Pesta Sukan Festival of Sports. The Singapore Sports Promotion Board also invited Australian pistol and rifle shooters to attend. Fourteen shotgunners and ten rifle and pistol competitors flew to Singapore on August 6, to compete. They returned on August 17. Four wives also accompanied the shotgun shooters. The group flew by Qantas at group fare rates and were met at the Singapore Airport by several members of the Singapore Gun Club. One of the members of the Singapore Gun Club, Peter Ho is security officer at the airport and made the clearance of shotguns and other firearms much easier. His assistance both arriving and leaving made the travel extremely easy and he is to be complimented.

All had been flying for eight hours at high altitude and on arrival at Singapore Airport, during the normal customs inspection, the shotguns, pistols and rifles were found to be saturated from condensation. The Singaporeans voluntarily stripped, cleaned, oiled and reassembled the lot before placing them into the security magazine. Later, after each daily shoot the firearms were cleaned, again by Singapore Gun Club, ready for use the next day. The team travelled to Seaview Hotel in buses provided and all firearms were placed in security magazines.

Singaporean Lieut-Colonel Peter Law also was of immense assistance in clearing the pistols and rifles for the pistol and rifle teams and made their stay most enjoyable.


All members attended the National Day Parade on August 9, but did not march, on the suggestion of local friends, because of the oppressive heat and humidity.

Practice shooting was made available at the Bukit Timah range prior to the events. Skeet was shot on 11th and 12th and trench on 13th and 14th August.

New Zealand was represented for the first time and although they did not fare too well in awards, did shoot extremely well and kept the other countries on their toes.

An A.C.T.A. plaque showing the Australian Crest was presented by Executive Committeeman Mr Donald Taylor of Hobart.

Mr Taylor also bestowed a banner of the State of Tasmania on behalf of the Tasmanian shooters present.

Mr W. (Bill) Delaney presented a Melbourne Gun Club banner and received in exchange an autographed banner from the Singapore Gun Club.

A prize giving dinner was held on the night of August 14, and Australia really scooped the pool in most shotgun, pistol and rifle events. Australian pistol shooter Terry Anderson won a silver medal whilst an Australian pair won the team gold medal.

The prizes were given out most charmingly by the Honorable Mrs E. W. Barker, wife of the Minister of Law and National Development.

The team captains were invited to be seated at the official table and were unanimous in their praise of the vivacious Mrs Barker, who, together with our old friend Milton Tan and Chairman of the Singapore Rifle Association Mr Fung Lok Nam, entertained them royally.

Many of the shooters were entertained privately by Singapore members and among the hosts were David and Frank Oh, Lt. Col. Peter Law, Dr. Peter Wong, Dr. E. G. Leonard and Dr. Sonnie Ng.

As in 1972 His Highness the Tunku Mahkota of Johore invited the Australians, New Zealanders, Singaporeans and Malaysians to shoot at his private range in Johore and then entertained them in the evening at the Palace where the Johore shoot prize-giving ceremony took place. This is a complete I.S.U. layout with 15 trench traps each with German Nimrod traps plus an I.S.U. Skeet Layout.

Her Royal Highness was a perfect hostess and made all present feel perfectly at ease at the palace. Her Highness graciously wore both an opal pendant and an opal ring which were presented to her as tokens of the teams' appreciation of her kindness during the 1971 visit.

His Highness was also presented with an autographed personal Melbourne Gun Club banner as a memento of the visit.


The Australians were also guests at the Mt. Vernon Range for a Chinese dinner and at the Singapore Gun Club for a Chinese and Malaysian dinner.


The shotgun teams experienced the same tough conditions found at Singapore in 1971 where humidity, sun, some rain and difficult backgrounds made good scores extremely hard to achieve. Clay targets again were observed bouncing unbroken after hitting the ground and earthen banks on either side. Dusted targets were common in spite of $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz. loads used in trench shooting.

Dr. Graham Carroll shot the only 25 straight at Skeet (or trench) in Singapore and Christopher Carroll, his 19-year-old son, shot the only 25 straight at Johore.

The Skeet was shot under the International Shooting Union method, that is, with a time delay of up to three seconds after the call of "Pull" whilst the gun butts must be touching the hip. Each of the six shooters in each team to shoot 150 targets of which only the highest four scores were to count, then the best two scorers from each team to shoot on, to compete for the individual prizes, which would be for 200 targets.

The trap section was shot consisting of six shooters in each team, with the four highest scores to count. Each team to shoot a total of 150 rounds and the two best scorers from each team to then shoot on, to compete for the individual prizes which would be for 200 targets.

Graham Carroll at Singapore and Chris Carroll at Johore received 25 break awards and Graham Carroll won high gun at Singapore.

Australian shotgunners won the Singapore-Australian Skeet Team Badge awards but Singapore won the Trench Team Badges.







- (1) As of 1/1/72 past A.C.T.A. rules allowing inward movement on handicap ratings are discontinued, except for extreme physical disabilities.
- (2) At the time of each annual shooter re-registration, a one yard inward will be granted by A.C.T.A. and shown on the handicap card, as issued accordingly excepting those shooters who request to remain on their earned handicaps.

COMMON MARK SHOOTING

- (i) Shooters are to be classed into three grades by their performance, excluding shoot-offs, over each 500 targets from 16 yards, double barrel, single barrel or points score with broken targets to count.
- (ii) Handicapping procedures are applicable in championships and graded events, in accordance with Rule 149, to shooters who are competing on or behind their handicap marks.
- (iii) Shooters may compete in one grade only. Any shooters may nominate in any grade higher than his own, but by doing so he forfeits the right to compete in his own grade.
- (iv) Shooters mark their own cards progressively for common mark shooting and at November 30 annually AND/OR after 500 programmed targets the card must be submitted to the club secretary for correct classification and reporting to A.C.T.A. central records.
- (v) The initial gradés are to be: Australian A class = 95 to 100% Australian B class = 91 to 94% Australian C class = 90% and less
- (vi) A shooter's open handicap is achieved under the handicapping formula applicable to handicap events only.
