

# Editor's Notes



## REGISTERED SHOOTERS

Article 49 of the Articles of Association of the Australian Clay Target Association states: (a) The Association shall keep a register of shooters and no person may enter or compete at any Association competition or event conducted by a member Club of which a Delegate is a member of the Association unless such person is registered with the Association and is not in arrears with his subscription.

(b) Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall BEFORE THE THIRTY-FIRST DAY OF JANUARY IN EACH YEAR supply the Secretary with a full and accurate list of all members and shooters registered with such club for the year commencing on the first day of January of such year and shall at the same time remit to the Secretary the subscriptions of such Club members and shooters. Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall also promptly forward to the Secretary of the Association the names and subscriptions of any persons joining such Club or registering as shooters after the thirty-first day of January in any year.

## FEES

Club secretaries are reminded that club 1973 affiliation fee of \$10 is due and payable on January 1, 1973.

All club members are reminded that their 1973 Association fees are due and payable through their club secretaries on January 1, 1973.

These club member fees are \$5 for the 1973 year and are—

1. \$5 under articles 14 and 49; plus
2. Junior shooters — see page 2 herein.

Only subscribers to A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" may send \$5 direct to the Secretary for "Shooting News" publications.

No pro rata rates are accepted and all fees are for the calendar year concerned.

March 1973 "Shooting News" will be mailed only

to those financial — that is, those whose fees are actually received by the Secretary as of February 14, 1973.

Shooters who have not marked their cards with their progressive common mark scores throughout 1972 are to be classed by club secretaries as "A" Class shooters in the 1973 registration lists to be forwarded by club secretaries for A.C.T.A. processing.

Some shooters still tend to think in terms of money values and not in the terms or spirit of the competition. A number of shooters have found a wide divergence of their respective handicap rating and their common mark class. This may be so, as the two forms of shooting are quite different in their methods of action and also in their methods of calculation.

## NOMINATIONS FOR 1973 OFFICES IN A.C.T.A.

All interested shooters are hereby notified that nominations for all offices in the Association close at 5 p.m. on Friday, December 29, 1972. Nominations must be lodged on the prescribed form with the Secretary, A.C.T.A., G.P.O. Box 2038S, Melbourne, 3001, Victoria. Any nominations received after this hour or date will not be accepted. Nomination forms are available from the Secretary, A.C.T.A. Nomination forms are only available on application.

Those lodging nominations are reminded that such nominations must be lodged in accordance with Article 27 of the Association Constitution, which reads: "Nominations for all offices in the Association and members of the Executive Committee must be in writing signed by the Secretary of the member Club or by the DELEGATE member of an unincorporated club making the nomination, and must reach the Secretary of the Association on or before December 31, in each year prior to the Annual General Meeting."

It is advised that private nominations will be rejected. Nominations received must have the official backing of the club and be approved by the Committee of the member club concerned.

These nominations will be published in February 1973, A.C.T.A. "Shooting News."

## **PUBLICATION A.C.T.A. "NEWS"**

Advertisers and clubs are reminded that, due to the printing industry vacation, no publication of A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" will be made for January, 1973. Copy for December "News" closed at A.C.T.A. office on November 1, 1972, (this includes publication of shoots scheduled through till early February).

Copy for February 1973 "Shooting News" must reach A.C.T.A. office not later than December 6, 1972.

### **PRINCIPAL SHOOTS SCHEDULED FOR 1973**

March 9 to 14, Australian National Trap and Skeet Championships at Adelaide, South Australia.

April 7-14, actual — New Zealand National Trap and Skeet Championships at Hamilton, North Island, with practice 10 a.m.-4 p.m. on Monday, April 6.

July 20 — the final section of the 1973 International Trap Teams' Match for the Mackintosh Trophy will be held at Kippen Gun Club, near Stirling in Scotland.

September dates, Australian Shooting Championships, both trap and skeet, under International Shooting Union rules, at Melbourne Gun Club, Victoria.

November 10-15, 1973, World International Shooting Union Championships, both trap and skeet, at the Melbourne Gun Club, Victoria.

### **PRINCIPAL SHOOTS SCHEDULED FOR 1974**

Australian National Trap and Skeet Championship at Melbourne Gun Club, Lilydale, Victoria (dates later).

Xth British Commonwealth Games 1974 — Friday, January 25 to Friday, February 1, at Yaldhurst, Christchurch, in the South Island.

Notes: 1. The New Zealand bottlers of Coca Cola are to be congratulated for their kindness in assisting sport in general by presenting to all British Commonwealth members, progressive news reports on these next Commonwealth Games.

2. Air New Zealand have kindly accepted the appointment as official carriers.

3. The respective shooting dates at Yaldhurst are — Friday, January 25, at 9 a.m. — shotgun skeet. Saturday, January 26, at 9 a.m. — shotgun skeet. Thursday, January 31, at 9 a.m. — shotgun single rise. Friday, February 1, at 9 a.m. — shotgun single rise.

The 1972 Interstate Trap Teams' Match for the Great Britain and Ireland Trophy has been won by the New South Wales team with its combined score of 1463/1500 points — see results in full within this publication. All States competed for the first time in 1972.

The 1972 Interstate Skeet Teams' Match has been won by the South Australian team with its combined score of 475/500 broken skeet targets.

The attention of all concerned is drawn to the "Letters to the Editor" section concerning firearms legislation and other matters.

### **STOP PRESS — from the October 1972 Executive Committee Meeting**

1. The 1974 National Clay Target Championships will be conducted at the Melbourne Gun Club at dates yet to be decided.

2. The 1973 National Clay Target Championships will be conducted at the South Australian Gun Club at Belmont near the 13 mile post, westwards on the Port Wakefield Road, from Adelaide, over the six successive days of A.M. Friday, March 9, through till P.M. Thursday, March 14. Full details will be in the December publication.

3. The use of release trigger guns by registered A.C.T.A. shooters is prohibited.

4. Unanimously adopted the recommendation from the 36th Annual General Meeting, that, effective from January 1, 1973, a charge of 50 cents per shooter per programme or part thereof, be charged by each gun club (excluding the Nationals programmes) and forwarded without deduction together with the shoot report, to A.C.T.A. Secretary within seven days of each shoot and that ten cents of this shoot fee to be then rebated to the clubs concerned.

5. Decided that the present shooter insurance charge be discontinued as a cost to the shooter as of December 31, 1972, that this charge be borne by the A.C.T.A. and that the coverage be extended to \$200,000. The policy coverage will be published as soon as available.

6. Unanimously agreed:—

- (a) To adopting a junior shooter fee of \$1 per junior with nil copies of A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" but that this will not be operative until the laws of the respective States on junior shooters are clearly defined, then, when these are so gazetted, that such junior shooters may compete.
- (b) The age of junior shooters is expected to be defined as being under 18 years.
- (c) Should junior shooters when registering, seek to obtain copies of A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" for the balance of that calendar year, then such junior shooter registration fee shall be \$5 per year.
- (d) Registered junior shooters, irrespective of the class of registration fee, would be included in the shooter insurance scheme.
- (e) A.C.T.A. Secretary will not accept junior shooter registrations until directed to make such an announcement in A.C.T.A. "Shooting News." The ages of all junior shooters must be supplied by club secretaries to the A.C.T.A. Secretary on the registration forms.

7. Decided that—

- (i) consequent upon the experience gained in the 1972 probationary year, that the following class groupings have been found to be the most equitable in Australian shooting and that these be adopted as of January 1, 1973:  
A Class = 90% to 100%,  
B Class = 85% and under 90%,  
C Class = All under 85%;
- (ii) the recent direction is to continue to apply concerning those shooters who when renewing through club secretaries, their annual shooter registration fees, fail to submit their existing handicap cards complete with progressive common mark scores and percentages, shall be reported to A.C.T.A. Secretary who shall register them as "A" Class shooters.

# 1972 Australian interstate D.T.L. trap teams' match

The 1972 Australian Interstate Down-the-line Teams' Match for the "Great Britain and Ireland Trophy" has been won by New South Wales with 1463/1500 points.

Teams were of 15 shooters of whom only the highest 10 scores were to count. 50 targets per

member from 18 yards, double barrel, points scoring. Five track, squad system, shot in two stages of 25 targets per visit over one or two traps but two traps where possible. Five targets from each track per member before changing tracks. Team members with common scores were finally recorded for placing in the team after using the count-back system.

## Re Gun Legislation

Further to my letter of 13/6/72 and your reply of 14/6/72, I have since interviewed Mr Jackett, our local Liberal State Member, on two occasions.

Mr Jackett displayed considerable interest, much more so than most of the shooters who have adopted a very complacent "let George do it" attitude.

## Editor's Comments:

1. Mr Cecil Plummer has been competing at, and assisting with, clay target shooting for many, many years and his recent efforts, concerning the proposed 1973 firearms legislation in the State of New South Wales, are and have been of the highest calibre. We are grateful for his presentation and also for his obtaining the following "press statement."

2. The State of Victoria is also revising its firearms legislation.

3. Full details of all firearms laws will be published when they are available, meanwhile the acceptance by A.C.T.A. of junior shooter registrations is temporarily suspended.

## PRESS STATEMENT

### Proposed New South Wales Firearms Legislation

The Premier, Sir Robert Askin, said on June 25, that Cabinet had approved a recommendation by the Former Chief Secretary, Mr Willis, for the preparation of new legislation to control and regulate the use and possession of firearms in New South Wales.

"For some time there has been increasing public pressure to tighten controls over the possession, carriage and use of firearms and some judicial comment to the same effect," Sir Robert said.

"The new legislation will consolidate in the one Act the provisions of the law relating to firearms which at present are contained in the Pistol License Act and the Police Offences Act.

"Basically the existing strict control in respect of pistols will be retained and there will be certain new provisions to strengthen the law in relation to other firearms," said Sir Robert.

"At present the only dealers required to be licensed are pistol dealers, but in future, dealers in other firearms will also have to hold a licence. Firearms dealers will be required to number all firearms and keep records of all transactions.

"Many dealers already keep these records and they have proved of considerable value to police investigating crimes involving firearms. The Government believes that making this obligatory for all dealers will facilitate police investigations of cases where firearms are involved in the commission of crime.

"Under the new legislation it will also be necessary for persons who carry and use firearms outside their own premises to obtain a Shooter's Licence.

"Persons who have firearms solely for use on their own property, such as farmers and graziers, who require firearms for destruction of noxious vermin, will not be required to be licensed.

"As in the case of licences for pistols, Shooter's Licences will be issued by police."

The Premier said that the age restriction on persons using firearms, at present 16 years, would be raised to 18 years, but provision would be made to enable persons under 18 years to be trained in the use of firearms under responsible adult supervision.

"Provision will also be made for the issue of orders against known criminals prohibiting them from possessing firearms," he said.

"Offences under the proposed Bill will include the shortening of firearms, carrying loaded firearms in a street or public place, and trespassing on private property with a firearm.

"The existing restrictions on the use of military rifles will be lifted but provision will be made for extension of the prohibition on machine guns, sub-machine guns and hand grenades to cover other particularly dangerous firearms and weapons, e.g., walking stick pistols, walking stick guns, noxious gas firearms, sword sticks, gravity knives and flick knives.

"The Commissioner of Police will be authorised to approve ranges used for the purpose of target shooting by organised gun or rifle clubs other than those formed under the Defence Act which are already controlled by the Army Authorities," said Sir Robert.

"Collectors of genuine antique pistols and the police administration will be assisted by a new provision for the issue of Antique Pistol Collectors' Licences for two or more antique pistols owned by the one person. This will replace the existing provision requiring the issue of a separate licence for each antique pistol."

Dear Mr President, members of the Executive of the A.C.T.A.

We thank you for this opportunity to personally report on the events leading up to the present situation where Melbourne Gun Club grounds are to be used for the 1973 World Moving Target Championships.

Last year, Melbourne Gun Club Committee was approached by the Sporting Shooters' Association with a proposal that the Shotgun Section of the World Moving Target Championships be held at the Melbourne Gun Club. The reason for this approach was that there was some doubt that Western Australia, who had agreed to stage the event, was unable to raise the necessary local support and finance to run the championships, and there was concern by the Sporting Shooters' Association who were applying for the Run-

ning Boar Section of the Championships, that, if the Shotgun Section was relinquished by Australia, they may not receive the Running Boar event.

At this meeting held at the home of our Club President, we discussed the matter at length and informed the Sporting Shooters' Association that the event was too large for our relatively small Club to finance, however much we would like to participate.

At the Griffith Nationals, George Biggs and Bill Delaney were again approached on this matter by Bob Morgan of the Australian Amateur Shooting Association and they agreed to raise the matter with the Club President who later arranged a meeting at the Club.

At the Melbourne Gun Club meeting, Bob Morgan and other Tasmanian shooters discussed this matter at length, and we agreed to talk the subject over with our Club Committee.

From this point in time, further discussions took place jointly with the Australian Shooting Association, the A.C.T.A., the Sporting Shooters' Association and the Australian Amateur Shooting Association, because as a Club, we felt we had to have the consent of our National body before we could proceed further.

During these discussions, the following items were resolved in chronological order:

1. Perth Gun Club relinquished their appointment to stage the Championships in favor of Melbourne Gun Club.
2. The Australian Amateur Shooting Association agreed to amalgamate with the A.C.T.A. to enable that body to become the sole Olympic Federation recognised shooting body in Australia for Amateur Shotgun Shooting.
3. The Melbourne Gun Club was given authority to proceed with further investigations on how the event could be staged.
4. Approaches by the A.S.A., A.C.T.A., S.S.A.A. and Melbourne Gun Club were jointly made to both State and Federal Governments for financial aid to stage the event.
5. State Treasury made available \$42,000 for specific works to be carried out at Melbourne Gun Club for the world event.
6. The Secretary Australian Shooting Association as the delegate to the International Shooting Union, Mr Peter Garrett, put the case for both Melbourne Gun Club and Sporting Shooters' Association at Munich, and both local bodies were finally granted the Championships for 1973.

The President of the A.C.T.A. has at all times been involved in the rather loose and sometimes nebulous discussions leading to the promotion of this

event and is fully aware of the value of staging this event in Australia.

May we briefly summarise some of the more obvious benefits which Australian shooting and shooters will receive from this event.

1. The A.C.T.A. will be able to call upon an International standard venue for any major competition either national or international.  
Such a ground has always been envisaged by your President, and would have been achieved eventually, but this World event has brought it to fruition many years earlier.
2. Australia has now been recognised as an acceptable member of the World Olympic Federation with the A.C.T.A. the controlling body for amateur shotgunning in Australia. This opens the way for all shooters who so desire to compete for selection in Olympic, Commonwealth or other International competitions.
3. The International form of shooting will supplement our present forms of shooting and cannot but lift the overall standard of shooting in Australia.
4. Once the world event is over, one of the trench layouts can be made available to another State to broaden participation of Australian shooters in this form of shooting. Naturally, this will be on the understanding that should the A.C.T.A. wish to stage a large competition requiring three layouts, the traps would be returned for the period of the competition.
5. With the advent of large contingents of American and New Zealand shooters attending our Nationals, this large A.C.T.A. ground will enable the Nationals to be conducted reasonably comfortably until such time as other State clubs can increase their grounds to accommodate the large influx of shooters with which we must now contend.
6. An international venue such as this will enable Australia to invite our near-East neighbors to international competition and the interplay of sport with them will without doubt improve our national image and cannot but assist our government relations with these countries.
7. The improved image of shooting facilities will attract those new shooters who, rightly or wrongly, expect amenities equivalent to those given by say, golf clubs. By building up membership the A.C.T.A. will be better able financially to assist in Australia-wide improvements to Clubs, and be able to sponsor shooters for overseas competitions.

All these comments although doubtless obvious, indicate this coming world event will give a tremendous fillip to Australian shooting.

At the moment, Melbourne Gun Club has formed committees to deal with:

- A. Ground layout;
- B. Finance raising;
- C. Administration.

Approaches have been made to various firms for assistance, the Post-Master General has been approached to run special commemorative stamps, designs for a symbol for the event have been discussed and programme covers, competitor badges, souvenirs, medal and marksmanship badges have been considered.

Mr Michael Tipa, of USA, who is technical adviser

for international shooting, and who will be carrying out an inspection of progress in December, 1972, has been contacted for ground layouts and technical information.

B.O.A.C. has been appointed official air carrier in return for three free air fares for international officials who will inspect the work being carried out.

World authorities on traps have been approached for recommendations, and, subject to our findings, traps will be ordered for three trench layouts and three skeet layouts complete with all timing, acoustic and electrical gear.

International clays have been examined and these together with international load ammunition will be manufactured in the near future.

These and many other items are being considered and all information and decisions are being and will in the future, be discussed with your A.C.T.A. Controlling Committee.

It is fully realised that the bulk of responsibility and action will rest on the Melbourne Gun Club, but this does not infer that the A.C.T.A. and for that matter shooters generally, cannot greatly assist and advise on this large undertaking.

In conclusion, we of Melbourne Gun Club thank you, the executive body, for your support, and ask that you further assist us in whatever particular manner you can to make this Australian event a success.

The final result will not be how well Melbourne Gun Club carried out the event, but how well Australian and Australian shooters conducted the event, what sportsmanship was shown and how well our visitors were received and entertained.

Mr President, gentlemen, we thank you for your kind attention.

Australia has been awarded the 1973 World Moving Target Championships for the Union Internationale de Tir (International Shooting Union).

The clay target events of trap and skeet will be conducted by the Australian Clay Target Association over the period Saturday to Wednesday, November 10 to 15, 1973, at the Melbourne Gun Club, Lilydale, Victoria.

All member countries are receiving a copy of this presentation and will later receive actual shooting entry documents.

Overleaf is an aerial impression of the ground layout of the Melbourne Gun Club, together with a numerically descriptive legend. On the reverse is a map showing the location of the Melbourne Gun Club in relation to the City of Melbourne (population 2.3 millions), the Tullamarine International Airport and principal hotels-motels en-route. (The name Tullamarine was derived from an Australian Aboriginal whose name was Tullamarina.)

The additional maps show: (a) major world air routes to and from Australia and Melbourne's Tullamarine International Airport. The official carrier appointed is B.O.A.C.; (b) a map of Australia indicating the respective member States and in particular the State of Victoria and its capital city, Melbourne; (c) native fauna peculiar to Australia.

- (1) As of 1/1/72 past A.C.T.A. rules allowing inward movement on handicap ratings are discontinued, except for extreme physical disabilities.
- (2) At the time of each annual shooter re-registration, a one yard inward will be granted by A.C.T.A. and shown on the handicap card, as issued accordingly — excepting those shooters who request to remain on their earned handicaps.

## COMMON MARK SHOOTING

- (i) Shooters are to be classed into three grades by their performance, excluding shoot-offs, over each 500 targets from 16 yards, double barrel, single barrel or points score with broken targets to count.
- (ii) Handicapping procedures are applicable in championships and graded events, in accordance with Rule 149, to shooters who are competing on or behind their handicap marks.
- (iii) Shooters may compete in one grade only. Any shooters may nominate in any grade higher than his own, but by doing so he forfeits the right to compete in his own grade.
- (iv) Shooters mark their own cards progressively for common mark shooting and at November 30 annually AND/OR after 500 programmed targets the card must be submitted to the club secretary for correct classification and reporting to A.C.T.A. central records.
- (v) The initial grades are to be:  
 Australian A class = 95 to 100%  
 Australian B class = 91 to 94%  
 Australian C class = 90% and less
- (vi) A shooter's open handicap is achieved under the handicapping formula applicable to handicap events only.
