

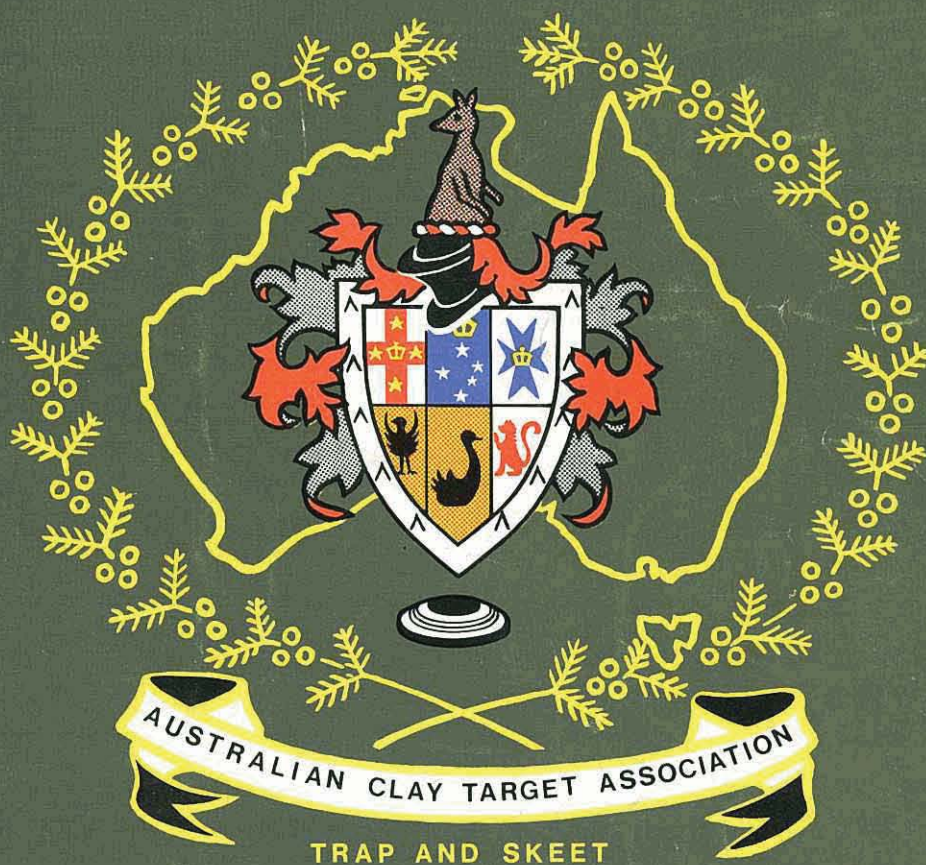

Editor's Notes



As the 1973 Australian National Clay Target Championships were not concluded until March 14 in Adelaide, this publication only contains a STOP PRESS containing the major placegetters in the programme. A full report of the "1973 Nationals" will be contained in our May publication.

The 36th Annual General Meeting of the Association was held in Adelaide on Monday, March 12, and, as a further STOP PRESS to this edition, results of the ballots for office bearers were:—

President — Mr. Gordon H. Hall re-elected unopposed.

Queensland — Messrs L. S. R. Stewart, N. Massey elected.

New South Wales — Messrs A. M. Burgess, E. Hawkins, A. Rowe elected of whom A. Rowe will stand for re-election at the next Annual General Meeting, the others for a term of two years.

State of Victoria — Messrs G. Biggs and K. Dobson were elected.

State of South Australia — Mr. R. Mules was re-elected.

State of Western Australia — Mr. R. Holtfreter was re-elected.

State of Tasmania — Messrs D. R. Taylor and D. Perry were declared elected as candidate Mr. W. R. Morgan voluntarily withdrew. Mr. Perry to retire in one year.

Attendances at the 1973 National Championships created some further records and another satisfactory series.

The Annual General Meeting after considerable and lengthy discussion rejected the 50 cent shooter

fee and substituted a \$10.00 shooter registration fee retrospective to 1-1-73 — clubs are requested to collect this fee and forward to ACTA as soon as convenient. (NOTE: Shoot fees held by ACTA will be refunded to the clubs concerned. Those clubs holding further shoot fees are asked to refund them to the shooters concerned).

Ratified the ACTA Executive Committee action of incorporating the AASA and the inclusion of the amateur clause as required by I.S.U. and A.O.F. (International Shooting Union and Australian Olympic Federation).

Appointed Mr. W. R. Morgan of Hobart an Honorary Vice-President of this Association for 12 months as prescribed in Article 36.

Results of the 26th International Trap Teams' Match will not be available until all other competing countries have conducted their matches, of which the final series for 1973 will be held at Kippen Gun Club, near Stirling in Scotland. A cordial invitation is extended to any Australian shooter to attend, and more particularly for any Australian Team member to be present.

The 1973 New Zealand National Championships will be held from April 6 to 13 at the Hamilton Gun Club, Collins Road, Hamilton in the North Island.

The 1973 South African Championships are scheduled for August 31 to September 3 at the Durban Gun Club, Natal.

Preliminary elimination arrangements are scheduled separately in this publication to obtain eligibility to be invited to the final Australian eliminations to produce I.S.U. Trench and I.S.U. Skeet teams and individual entrants to represent Australia in the 1973 World Shooting Championships.

All Australian shooters must complete and lodge with the A.C.T.A., the Amateur Rules Schedule "A" form, before competing in international events.

Note: I.S.U. General Regulations — January 1, 1972, Article 16 — At the expense of the Organising Committee for the World Championships up to three I.S.U. delegates shall be invited ten to twelve months before the competitions to examine the preparations for organisation, the ranges and other installations, in order to advise the Organising Committee as necessary. **Article 17** — For both World Championships and Olympic Games, at the expense of the Organising Committee, up to three delegates nominated by the International Shooting Union from its Executive Committee and Technical Committee, each in their own field of responsibility, shall be invited to co-operate with the Organising Committee at least a week before the competitions, to ensure that the general arrangements and technical installations are according to the Regulations.

At beginning September 1973, Australian I.S.U. trap and skeet shooters will be selected to represent Australia in the Xth British Commonwealth Games, listed for Friday, January 25 to Friday, February 1, 1974, at Yaldhurst, Christchurch, in New Zealand's South Island.

The opening ceremony of the Xth B.C. Games is January 24 and ten days later the Games will come to an end. Between these dates, the pick of the best available from almost forty Commonwealth countries will contest Commonwealth titles in nine sports — athletics, swimming and diving, boxing, bowls, badminton, wrestling, weightlifting, cycling and shooting.

New Zealand bookings open on February 1 and the special tickets and accommodation brochures on which they are made are available from the official Games ticket agent, N.A.C. and its agents, or from the branches of the Bank of New Zealand. Some 425,000 tickets are to be sold.

Qantas may swing its "jumbo" jet aircraft to Christchurch to assist the Games followers meanwhile three cruise liners may be lying nearby at Lyttleton. For as little as \$44 a spectator will be able to see something of all the nine sports listed above.

There is a 120 mile road cycling event over the demanding flat and hill course in Cashmere and the 26 miles 385 yards gruelling marathon cuts through the heart of Christchurch, as does the 20 mile road walk.

Three thousand commemorative medals, each two and a half inches in diameter will go to all competitors and officials. There will be 581 placewinner's medals each two and a quarter inches in diameter and of which 190 each will be gold and silver then 201 bronze. The odd numbers of bronze is brought about by the awarding of bronze medals to both semi-finalists in boxing.

Christchurch is known as the Garden City, and flowers will be brought to perfection for the Games opening.

Scotland plans to send a 100 member representation to the Games; Canada about 145; Australia a maximum team of more than 200.

Proposed A.C.T.A. Arrangements under I.S.U. Rules for State Eliminations preparatory to the 1973 Commonwealth Eliminations for final selection of Australia's 1973 World Moving Target Championship competitors, both team and individual.

TRENCH SHOOTING

1. As only one club exists in Australia with an internationally accepted complex of I.S.U. Trench Shooting, the final eliminations must be conducted under actual I.S.U. trench conditions at that club — the Melbourne Gun Club.

(Note: I.S.U. Technical Director, Mr Michael Tipa of USA, came to Melbourne during the second week of December, 1972. He has approved the venue, including the clubhouse all trap and skeet shooting arrangements and the targets.)

2. Only registered A.C.T.A. shooters who have satisfactorily completed and lodged the Amateur Schedule "A" form may seek State eliminations.

3. Eliminations in each State may be conducted—

- (a) (i) over any single automatic trap as provided in the "U.I.T. Regulations for Automatic Trap" (as published in A.C.T.A. "Shooting News," pages 7 to 11 and 22 of February, 1973);
- (ii) such single automatic trap layout and equipment must be as approved by the A.C.T.A. under the published U.I.T. regulations;

(Note = U.I.T. = Union Internationale de Tir

translated is

I.S.U. = International Shooting Union);

- (b) alternatively, shooters may elect to contest their eliminations over the existing I.S.U. trench layouts at the Melbourne Gun Club. Individual transport costs are each contestant's own concern;
- (c) nomination \$10 per shooter;
- (d) standard 1¼ ounce cartridges of shooter's own choice, and provision, of either factory or home loads.

4. Australian Trap Shooters contesting the elimination must qualify within their States, or at their nearest recognised club by:—

Shooting and breaking 85 per cent or better, that is, 85 or more of 100 targets on at least two occasions over an I.S.U. 15 fixed trap trench layout, or over a single oscillating international trap (see I.S.U. rules 6.4 and 6.5 of I.S.U. automatic trap rules as published) before end August.

All such percentages must have been shot in actual competition — practice targets not to count.

5. Only these qualifying shooters shall be invited to the final 1973 Commonwealth Eliminations at the Melbourne Gun Club — at their own expense.

- 6. (a) 1st Semi-Final of 1973 National I.S.U. Trench Elimination 75. 75. 50 = 200 targets in 3 visits

followed by

2nd Semi-Final of the 1973 National I.S.U. Trench Elimination 75. 75. 50 = 200 targets in three visits to be conducted at the Melbourne Gun Club over the four successive September days of Thursday 27, Friday 28, Saturday 29 and Sunday (noon to 6 p.m.) September 30. All entrants seeking to contest the final eliminations must enter both these 1st and 2nd National Semi-Final Eliminations.

- (b) Nomination \$10 per shooter.
- (c) Standard 1¼ ounce cartridges of shooters own choice, and provision, of either factory or home loads.
- (d) The actual and final National I.S.U. Trench Eliminations will be conducted at the Melbourne Gun Club, Victoria, over the successive September days of Thursday 27, Friday 28, Saturday 29, Sunday 30, September. Entrants only to be those invitees from the State Eliminations who each achieved the required qualifying trench scores.

This National I.S.U. Trench final selection to be of 100 trench targets per day totalling 300 trench targets per shooter over September 27, 28, 29, 30. Nominations \$7 per shooter. Standard up to 1¼ ounce cartridges of shooter's own choice, and provision, of either factory or home loads.

(Note — the Melbourne Gun Club will provide free morning/afternoon teas and luncheons for each of the Commonwealth Elimination Contestants.)

7. The best ten Australian "I.S.U. Trench System" shooters will then be selected, according to their respective elimination performances, from whom Australia's 1973 International Trench Team and Trench Individual shooters, plus reserves, will be chosen.

SKEET SHOOTING

1. A number of Australian clubs have excellent skeet shooting layouts at which State eliminations may be conducted, subject to A.C.T.A. approval, which will be granted providing all I.S.U. skeet rules are observed, including the correct I.S.U. time delay conditions plus I.S.U. distance of targets.

2. Only registered A.C.T.A. shooters who have satisfactorily completed and lodged the Amateur Schedule "A" form may seek State eliminations.

3. (a) Australian Skeet shooters contesting the eliminations must qualify within their States, or at their nearest recognised club by shooting and breaking 85 per cent or better, that is 85 or more, of 100 I.S.U. skeet targets on at least two occasions between April 1 and end August 1973.

(b) All such percentages must have been shot in actual competition — practice targets not to count.

(c) Individual transport costs are each contestants own concern.

(d) Nominations \$10 per shooter.

(e) Standard 1½ ounce cartridges of shooter's own choice, and provision, of either factory or home loads.

4. Only those qualifying skeet shooters shall be invited to the final 1973 Commonwealth Skeet Eliminations at the Melbourne Gun Club — at their own expense.

5. (a) 1st Semi-Final of the 1973 National I.S.U. Skeet Elimination 75. 75. 50 = 200 targets in 3 visits followed by

2nd Semi-Final of the 1973 National I.S.U. Skeet Elimination 75. 75. 50 = 200 targets in 3 visits to be conducted at the Melbourne Gun Club over the four successive September days of Thursday 27, Friday 28, Saturday 29 and Sunday (noon to 6 p.m. only) September 30. All entrants seeking to contest the final eliminations must enter both these 1st and 2nd National Semi-Final Eliminations.

(b) Nominations \$10 per shooter.

(c) Standard 1½ ounce cartridges of shooter's own choice and provision of either factory or home loads.

(d) The actual and final National I.S.U. Skeet Eliminations will be conducted at the Melbourne Gun Club, Victoria, over the successive September days of Thursday 27, Friday 28, Saturday 29, Sunday, September 30. Entrants only to be those invitees from the State elimination who each achieved the required qualifying scores.

This National I.S.U. Skeet Elimination to be of 100 skeet targets per day totalling 300 skeet targets per shooter over October 5, 6, 7. Nominations \$7 per shooter. Standard 1½ ounce cartridges of shooter's own choice, and provision, of either factory or home loads.

(Note — the Melbourne Gun Club will provide free morning/afternoon teas and luncheons for each of the Commonwealth Elimination contestants.)

6. The best ten Australian "I.S.U. Skeet Shooters" will then be selected according to their respective elimination performances from whom Australia's 1973 International Skeet Team and Skeet Individual shooters, plus reserves, will be chosen.

1973 INTER-SERVICES TRAP TEAMS' MATCH

Hosted by HMAS Cerberus, Victoria

February 23, 1973



1. The R.A.N. was the host service for the inter-service sports this year and consequently the trap shooting event took place on Wednesday, February 21 at the grounds of the Navy Gun Club, HMAS Cerberus.

2. Although at times it appeared that rain was likely, it remained dry and the shoot took place under ideal conditions. The grounds were in perfect condition, the catering arrangements and the barbecue lunch provided could only be described as superb and was thoroughly enjoyed by participants and guests alike. Congratulations to Lieutenant Commander W. Murphy and his team for the fine organisation of the event.

3. The first round commenced in an air of tension with Army dropping two targets, Navy and RAAF each lost one. The second and third squads were unfortunate for Navy and Army who lost one target each whilst RAAF shot a perfect score. However the advantage was short lived as before the round was completed RAAF dropped two more targets, Army one and Navy one each and the second round commenced with Navy leading by one target.

4. At this time the concentration of the respective team members was most apparent and the second round commenced somewhat nervously with each team member losing one target. (It is noted that this was to be the last target lost by RAAF). Another target was lost by Navy in the second squad and this made all teams of equal scores. As the round progressed Army lost two more targets and Navy four giving the RAAF a clear advantage at the conclusion of the round. The scores, although level at the half-way mark, were now RAAF 56:60, Army 54:60 and Navy 52:60.

5. The third round commenced under a lot of pressure with Army and Navy determined to cut the RAAF team down to size and the spectators were treated to some very fine team shooting. However the RAAF team was too consistent and did not lose a target during the round whilst Army lost three and Navy six before the conclusion.

6. The RAAF team finally ran out easy winners. As mentioned the last target they lost was the 33rd and they went on to shoot the remaining 57 without loss. The final scores were:

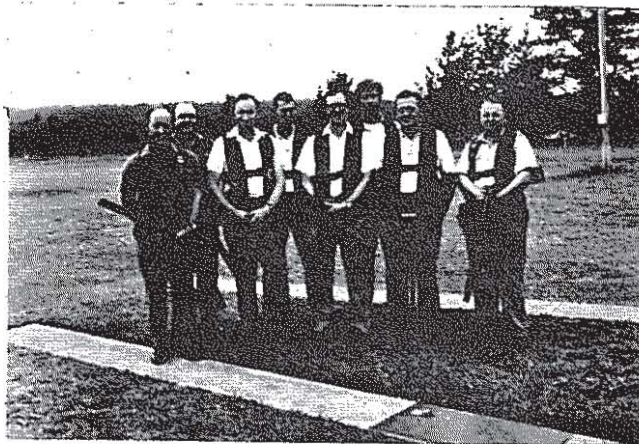

Facts and Figures for Shotgunners.

Many good shooters have proved by their results that it is not necessary to know a lot about ballistics. Yet there are many who are interested to know

a little more about their shooting; hopefully, the following information will be of interest.

CHOKE:

"Choke" is the reduction of the internal diameter of a shotgun barrel in the last few inches preceding the muzzle. Shot in a barrel flows a little like water in a hose. The choke can be likened to a hose nozzle. Some guns, such as the Winchester model 1400 Winchester model, have interchangeable chokes which have an effect like adjusting a nozzle to alter the spray. This enables one gun to be used for many types of shooting. Double barrel guns frequently have one barrel choked more tightly than the other. The accompanying chart illustrates the effect of choke on pattern.

BORE: The internal diameter of a shotgun barrel apart from the choke.

CHROME: A metal used to plate the interior of barrels making them rust-free and resistant to leading. Also used as an alloy to harden steel.

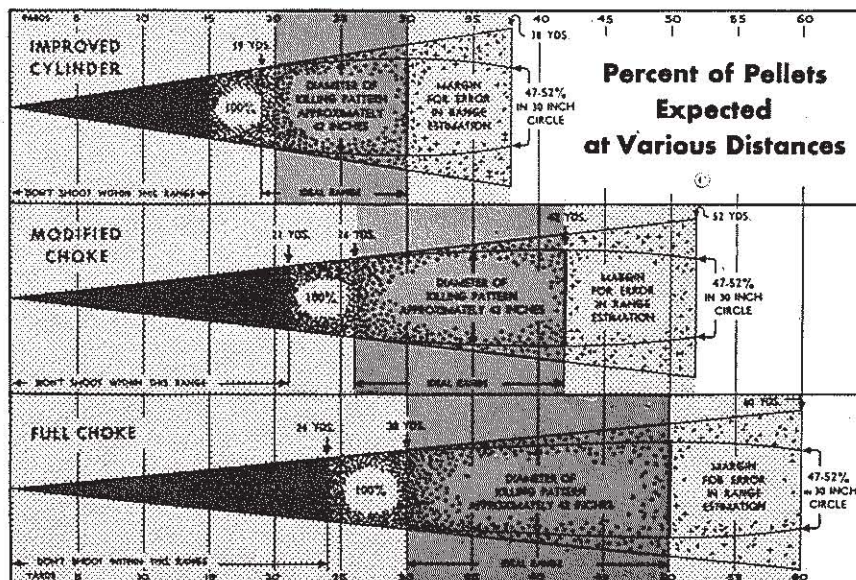
PATTERN: The shape of a swarm of shot in flight. The spread of patterns is most frequently measured by shooting at a large sheet of paper at a distance of 40 yards. A circle 30 inches in diameter is placed over the paper to encompass the greatest number of shot holes which are then counted and expressed as a percentage of the total number of pellets in the cartridge fired. Full choke—more than 65%; Modified choke—50/65%; Improved cylinder—40/50%; Cylinder—30/40%.

DRAM EQUIVALENT: A dram is a unit measurement of weight (being 1/16 oz.) used to measure black powder loads prior to smokeless powders being developed. A load of nitro powder giving the same muzzle velocity to a similar charge weight of shot as a particular load of black powder is said to be its dram equivalent. The term is useful in comparing the power ratings of different shells having the same shot weight. It cannot be used to compare shells of different shot weight. The following Winchester 1-1/8 oz. shells ascend in power 2% dr.eq. AA; 3 dr.eq. AA; 3% dr.eq. New Ranger; 3% dr.eq. Super Ranger.

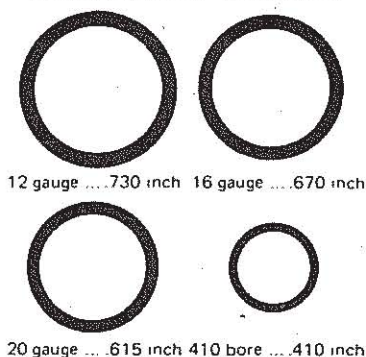
SHOT STRING: The shot column in a cartridge is less than an inch long yet when it leaves the gun it elongates many feet. Patterning a shell gives a reliable indication of the lateral spread of shot but absolutely no measurement of the shot string which is of equal importance in determining hitting power.

NOMINAL BORE DIAMETERS

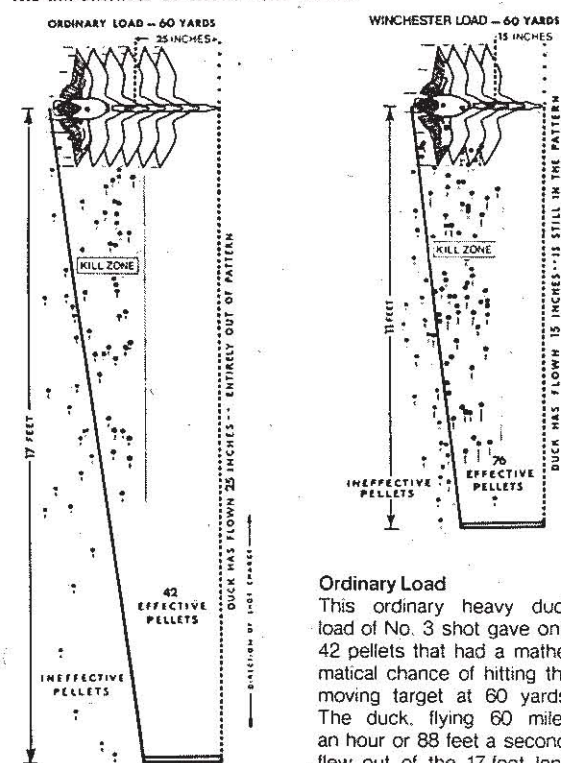

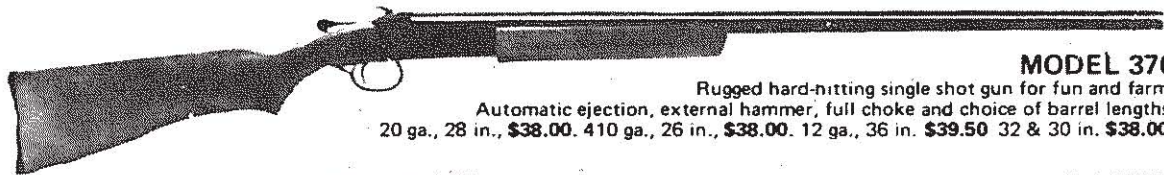


Ordinary Load

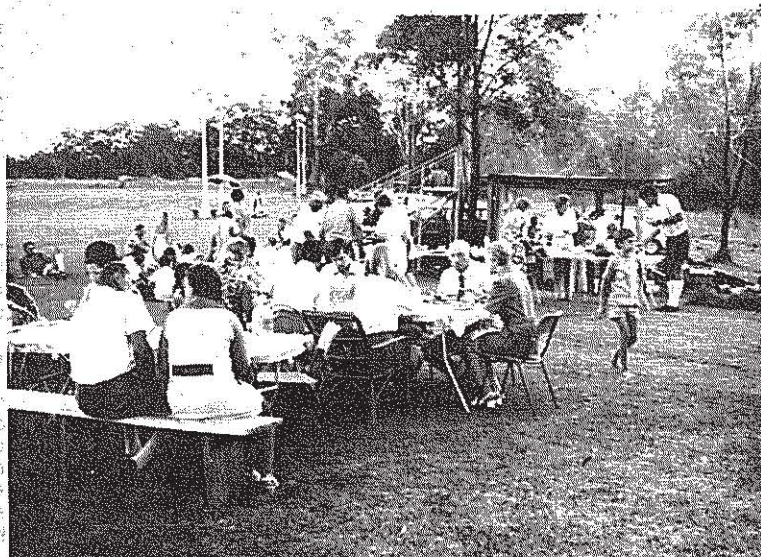

- (1) As of 1/1/72 past A.C.T.A. rules allowing inward movement on handicap ratings are discontinued, except for extreme physical disabilities.
- (2) At the time of each annual shooter re-registration, a one yard inward will be granted by A.C.T.A. and shown on the handicap card, as issued accordingly — excepting those shooters who request to remain on their earned handicaps.

COMMON MARK SHOOTING

- (i) Shooters are to be classed into three grades by their performance, excluding shoot-offs, over each 500 targets from 16 yards, double barrel, single barrel or points score with broken targets to count.
- (ii) Handicapping procedures are applicable in championships and graded events, in accordance with Rule 149, to shooters who are competing on or behind their handicap marks.
- (iii) Shooters may compete in one grade only. Any shooters may nominate in any grade higher than his own, but by doing so he forfeits the right to compete in his own grade.
- (iv) Shooters mark their own cards progressively for common mark shooting and at November 30 annually AND/OR after 500 programmed targets the card must be submitted to the club secretary for correct classification and reporting to A.C.T.A. central records.
- (v) The initial grades are to be:
Australian A class = 90% to 100%
Australian B class = 85% and under 90%
Australian C class = all under 85%
- (vi) A shooter's open handicap is achieved under the handicapping formula applicable to handicap events only.
