Editor's Notes



A.C.T.A. 1974 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

Applications for open championships to be contested during 1974 (that is, Commonwealth, State and District Titles) are required to be lodged, under Rule 27, by member clubs, in writing on the prescribed form number 16, not later than Friday, June 29, 1973. Late applications receive no consideration.

Preference will be given to clubs which — (a) have the capacity to conduct the various types of shoots, i.e., the capacity in both equipment and current management. (Note — oscillating traps must be used, that is — Snipe, Damo, Winchester, and the like, but NOT “plus” traps.)

(b) have submitted proposed dates, together with their requested title events.

Those championships allocated by the Executive Committee for the 1974 year will be published in November 1973, “Clay Target Shooting News.”

If no club advertising material has arrived two months before a Commonwealth Title event, then the Secretary/Editor is empowered to insert an appropriate advertisement and to charge the club concerned at the late insertion rate.

Clubs allocated State Titles events by the Committee are expected to advertise these State events in A.C.T.A. “Shooting News.”

Clubs failing to submit advertising copy for Interstate Teams’ and similar major events, will not receive such consideration in future Executive Committee allocations.

Shoot approvals will be issued, in writing, and are subject to the correct interpretations of A.C.T.A. Rules by the clubs concerned and are designed to avoid clashing of major programmes with nearby clubs.

Commonwealth, State or District Championships will not be allocated to clubs which fail to either apply the handicapping formula correctly, or which fail to submit handicap returns for each shoot.

No trophies or prize monies may be handed to any shooter without the previous submission of his current handicap card (see Rule 18) correctly classified and progressively marked showing his shooting performance to date. It is the responsibility of each shooter to keep his own handicap card up to date, and this information he always gains by looking at the scoreboard during, and after, contesting any event. It is then the responsibility of the club secretary to notify A.C.T.A. central records, using the handicap return form, of any changes in—

(a) a shooter’s class for common mark shooting;

(b) a shooter’s change of handicap as prescribed in the handicapping formula.

All applications shall be collated and submitted to the Executive Committee for consideration and allocation. Member clubs are requested to measure their applications and to apply only for championships which can be satisfactorily conducted between January 1 and December 31, 1974.

Messages received pertaining to our May 1973 publication, pages 10 and 11, request clarification:—

1. Executive Committee member Mr Noel Massey of Clermont, Queensland, when referring to "Black Friday and Brown Saturday," was commenting on the effect of the record attendances, not envisaged by the Committee, concerning the Skeet/Double Rise and Skeet/Grand Handicap events of days one and two at the 1973 National Championships.

2. The \$10 shooter registration fee came from member club submissions in writing (see March "Shooting News," page 1) to the 36th Annual General Meeting. The Executive Committee later ratified the decisions of the full Annual Meeting.

Concerning the A.C.T.A. arrangements under I.S.U. Rules for State Eliminations preparatory to the 1973 Commonwealth Eliminations for final selection of Australia's participants and the hosting of the 1973 World Moving Target Championships, Melbourne Gun Club has now installed two full I.S.U. 15 trap layouts, complete with "phono-pull" arrangements and the makers are supplying, free, the services of a technician from their overseas factory. All will be in full operation by end May 1973. The costs of these extensive installations have not come from A.C.T.A. funds but have been fully met by the Melbourne Gun Club, donors both industrial and private, donations from a number of A.C.T.A. member clubs, donations from several shoots by other A.C.T.A. member clubs, and also from generous financial assistance from the Victorian State Government. Subsequently a list of these respective donors will be published.

This publication contains no current registration list — all will be published in July.

Published herein is a copy of the Association public liability policy for the 1973 year as issued by our insurers. Claims must be channelled through member clubs to the A.C.T.A. for verification before consideration by the insurers.

The Xth British Commonwealth Games is to be hosted by New Zealand with the clay target shooting sections at Yaldhurst, Christchurch, in the South Island, Friday, January 25 and Saturday, January 26 for shotgun/skeet; Thursday, January 31 and Friday, February 1 for shotgun single rise. Each day's shooting commences at 9 a.m. "Single Rise" is the NZ term for the single target/double barrel Australian terminology. According to the Christchurch weather office, the period is within the hottest part of the year in New Zealand with an average daily temperature of 22 deg. C, a night minimum of 12 deg. C, with possible extremes of up to 40 deg. C and down to 2 deg. c respectively. Winds are normally from the east during daylight hours with a strength of up to 15 knots dying away at night. There could be a hot northwester followed by cooler southwest conditions. Rainfall could be expected on two of the days of the whole Commonwealth Games but may fall at any time during the 24 hours, however, about 60 per cent of rain at this time of the year falls during the hours of darkness. Bright sunshine averages seven hours daily during this period.

Some 46 competing nations are expected to be represented at Christchurch and the 1974 Games will cost more than NZ \$2 million.

Each participating member country would be entitled to send two shooters in each of the six shooting events (2 pistol events, a 50 M. event, a 7.62 shoot plus skeet and single rise events) but the number of shooters must not exceed eight from any one country.

Estimates are that 15 countries would be represented in the single rise and skeet shooting, the estimated number of competitors being:—

Countries have the right to nominate officials for the Games, and such names to be with the Commonwealth Games Organising Committee at least three months prior to the start of the Games. Shooters are permitted to bring in their own ammunition (to 1,000 rounds) on the agreement that unused ammunition would be taken out of the country after the Games by the shooter's concerned.

Christchurch has developed the Queen Elizabeth II Park as a centrepiece and main stadium for the 1974 Games. The track and field side is surrounded by tall poplar trees and the whole site is almost encircled by a golf course with a picturesque backdrop of the port, hills and an ocean beach close at hand.

A slogan could be 'open your door in '74,' says a Games notice.

Commonwealth Games shotgun shooting at Yaldhurst includes two new events for which two gold medal events would be shot — single rise and skeet. The single rise event was requested by New Zealand to be shot under the Commonwealth Mackintosh Trophy rules, but the International Shooting Union meeting at Munich decided that it would be shot under I.S.U. rules. Consequently NZ has had to import new traps and construct new traphouses at a cost of about \$4,000 — traps to be single, multi-oscillating (vertical and horizontal directions) mechanical or electrically operated constructed and mounted to throw at random, and continuously changing angles and elevations, an unbroken target within the vertical and horizontal limits as prescribed within the U.I.T. Automatic Trap Rules effective from 1-1-1972. In the clay pigeon, single rise, there would be 200 targets with a 100 per day per competitor. The world record was 199 set at Munich. For the skeet section, there would be 200 targets with 100 per day. The possible score was 200 and although the 1972 Munich score was 195 it was not a record. During the Games, each competitor would complete a 25 shot round, four times on each day, with a possible score of 100 points a day.

The 1978 XIth British Commonwealth Games will be conducted at Edmonton, Canada. In its application for the Games which it is hoping to run on Can. \$2 million, Edmonton has as its sports, swimming and diving, track and field, badminton, boxing, cycling, wrestling, weightlifting, shooting and lawn bowls.

Whereas Christchurch, New Zealand, is considering rowing and gymnastics as Games demonstration sports, Edmonton will offer something unique in

Canadian football and lacrosse. Shooting will be on a North Saskatchewan Valley river site, already developed as a range but to be upgraded for 1978.

When the Commonwealth Games were allocated to Christchurch, there was a strong possibility that running boar shooting would also be a Games competition, so plans were drawn up incorporating a running boar range. However, this sport was not authorised, but there is still the possibility that it may be included as a demonstration sport.

Reports are that "at Munich, of the number of countries competing, shooting was the third highest, and was sixth with its number of competitors. In Jamaica, shooting was higher on the popularity list and it will be even higher in Christchurch."

This information is acknowledged as extracts from the complementary news report from New Zealand Bottlers of Coca Cola and other sources.

(Note: Union Travel Service, phone Melbourne 67-7361, supply the following information:—

What will a return air fare cost? Surprisingly enough, not as much as you would expect. An Economy Class air ticket, Melbourne to Christchurch and return for an individual booking is \$218.40. A family travelling! You save this way. The husband travels at \$218.40 return, the wife goes at a 50 per cent discount of \$109.20, and any children also travel at 50 per cent off the normal rate. Consider a family of four travelling on a "Family Fare," the total would amount to \$546.00. This works out at a cost per head of \$136.50 return. A similar exercise in comparing the cost for a family to Perth and return would cost \$694.70. For groups of 10 or more there is available a special rate of \$157.00 return.

National President Speaks

Gordon H. Hall, Geelong

This letter is in the form of a report to all shooters and clubs in the A.C.T.A.

It seems to me that far too many shooters are not aware of decisions taken at the executive level and at Annual Meetings despite the fact that delegates/representatives of every club receive the agenda and annual reports and minutes of the annual meetings and relevant points from the executive meetings are published in this magazine.

As you are now all aware, the annual meeting after a prolonged discussion on ways and means of raising additional funds eventually voted for a \$10 per annum registration fee.

Now why the need for more funds and what will the A.C.T.A. do with these funds.

The previous registration fee for 1972 was \$5 plus 90 cents for insurance, in the same year the cost of living rose as we all know, this included a substantial increase in the cost of postage and phone together with a 50 per cent rise in the cost of bulk mailing of the News. These and other items increased the cost of administration by over \$5,000 for that year, therefore to remain liquid, an increase of at least \$1 would have been necessary to retrieve the position, doubtless by the next annual meeting in 1974 a like amount would be needed again, if not more.

Those shooters who attend the Nationals each year made a substantial contribution to the finances of the association and I would suggest that if any money was to be allocated to financing teams to shoot in Olympics, Commonwealth Games or other International events, this money should come from the Nationals surplus if any. Certainly the general administration of the association should not be dependant on the financial success or otherwise of our National program.

It can be readily seen therefore that by 1974 the real probability will be that the association would require approximately \$8 to keep an even keel.

The main point I am making is, that of the \$10 registration now in force, by next year there will only be a surplus of approximately \$2 with which to carry

out the proposals suggested, some of which have already been acted upon.

The first being the \$1 registration for junior shooters (in some States still subject to State legislation) we all appreciate the need to educate young people in the safe handling of firearms and to provide for the continuance of the sport of clay target shooting, unless we promote this aspect of our sport we would find in years to come no-one to compete with.

The next item is one which shooters have needed for years, we now have a \$200,000 cover on all members, the insured are the Federal body, State associations, clubs and members thereof collectively and/or individually including operators and voluntary operators of traps (not otherwise covered by workers' compensation) probationary members qualify as members.

The scope of the cover, covers payment to or on behalf of members or associate members, all sums which the association, club or members shall become legally liable to pay for compensation in respect of bodily injury and/or damage to property, resulting from an accident caused to persons of the public or to other members, whilst the negligent member is properly on any authorised closed range or shooting ground within Australia or its Territories within the jurisdiction of the Association.

The policy also covers injury arising from sale of goods from authorised canteens.

The policy excludes accidents arising out of the use of motor vehicles and is subject to a limit of \$200,000 arising from any one event.

The other items which were proposed under the 50 cent shoot fee motion (which as you know was rescinded at Adelaide) some of which the executive will act upon in September having regard to the amount which will now become available.

In the following list I will show my personal estimate of the amounts required for each item.

1. Insuring shooters and administering same (Commenced) — \$2,700 p.a.
2. No charge for break badges — \$1,000 p.a.
3. Increased values of trophies for the Nationals (Commenced) — \$1,000.

4. Providing badges for State team shoots — \$400 p.a.

5. Financial assistance to State association and for the formation and maintenance of same — \$3,000 p.a.

6. Provision of a ground acquisition and maintenance account in preparation for acquiring an A.C.T.A. ground in each State — \$10,000 p.a.

7. Provision of a travel account in preparation for the time we are able to send teams overseas, i.e. New Zealand or elsewhere — \$1,500 p.a.

8. Provision in conjunction with the above for the provision of blazers and/or Australian team pockets for team members — \$450 p.a.

9. Provision of adequate office facilities to administer the above — \$3,000 p.a.

Obviously some of the large items will have to be deleted from the deliberations of the executive.

However, it is a probability that within 5 years we will need to have a venue in each State for holding a National series probably comprising for example, National C Grade titles, National B Grade titles, National A Grade titles, both for D.T.L. and Skeet plus I.S.U. Trench or Single Trap National titles and again I.S.U. Skeet on a National basis.

This past National at Adelaide saw 1017 A Grade nominations, 571 B Grade nominations and 325 C Grade nominations plus 171 Skeet competitors any one of which could have well been a National series on its own.

This means that a National could be held in each State every year, thus making full use of each State's facilities and giving shooters in every State the opportunity of competing in their own area.

There is one matter which has caused me considerable concern, that is the re-drafting of our constitution with which the legal advisers to the A.C.T.A. seem to be having difficulty.

Some of the points for consideration in the draft will be:

1. Equal representation by each State.
2. Postal voting for elections.
3. Provision for State associations.

This one would give each State body control over allocation of championships within it's State subject to A.C.T.A. ratification, together with the handling of domestic items within the State's borders, as is done in W.A. and S.A. at present.

4. Representation by Northern Territory and P.N.G.

5. Provision for a Vice-President on the executive.

6. Financial assistance to each properly constituted State body.

There are many other matters currently before the executive, they are too numerous to refer to here, I do, however, take this opportunity of commending to all shooters the work done on their behalf by their elected executive members.

In any democratic organisation there will always be those who criticise the governing body and this is as it should be. I urge *all* shooters to take an interest in their association and exercise their right to voice their opinions through their clubs and executive members.

Only in this way can the executive know the wishes of the majority of shooters in the association.

Open Season — for field shooting in Tasmania, under authority of the National Parks and Wildlife Service of P.O. Box 210, Sandy Bay, 7005:—

1. The open season for Male Pheasant on King Island is from June 2 till June 10, 1973; licence fee \$3;

bag limit three birds per day which gives a maximum seasonal limit of 27 birds. Only adult birds may be taken and the consent of landowners or occupiers must be obtained before entering upon private or leased land.

2. The open season for Brown Quail is from May 5 until May 31, 1973; licence fee \$2; bag limit 24 birds per day. Only Brown Quail may be taken. The native Stubble Quail are wholly protected at present. These quail are relatively common only on Flinders Island (within Tasmanian State Boundaries).

3. Licences obtainable from Police Stations.

Regarding common mark shooting, Rule 100 section F (i) and F (ii), I find when taking nominations, that some shooters who travel to different shoots, are having their registration cards altered to different grades depending on percentages shot at each shoot, so that, after being handicapped by A.C.T.A. as an "A" Grade shooter and having a particularly bad result in a graded single barrel event they are regraded by Club Secretary concerned to "C" grade.

This practice has been prevalent in this corner of the State (of Queensland).

Perhaps you could clarify this situation through the pages of "Shooting News" and thereby clear up any abnormalities that may exist.

NATIONAL HIGH GUN WINNERS

Annually since 1966 a Browning under-and-over shotgun has been presented to the highest gun scorer over the main D.T.L. trap events viz. Champion of Champions, Double Barrel, Double Rise, Single Barrel, Australia-New Zealand and the Grand Australian, with the provision that each shooter can gain this award only once. If a shoot-off is necessary to determine the High Gun Winner, then the shoot-off shall be conducted as prescribed in A.C.T.A. Rules.

A similar Browning shotgun is presented annually at the Spanish and other National Championships and by common agreement, between the New Zealand Gun Club's Association and the A.C.T.A., each shooter winner can only gain this award once. Such Browning High Gun winners to date have been:—

- 1967 M. Burgess (NSW) 392:400. (Over 5 C'ships plus H'cap Events).
- 1968 The 1968 overall high gun score over 6 trap events was achieved by M. Burgess (Cobar) 312:325, but having won this trophy in 1967, the next top shooter, R. Kimber of S.A.G.C. (SA) took his high gun prize with 311:325.

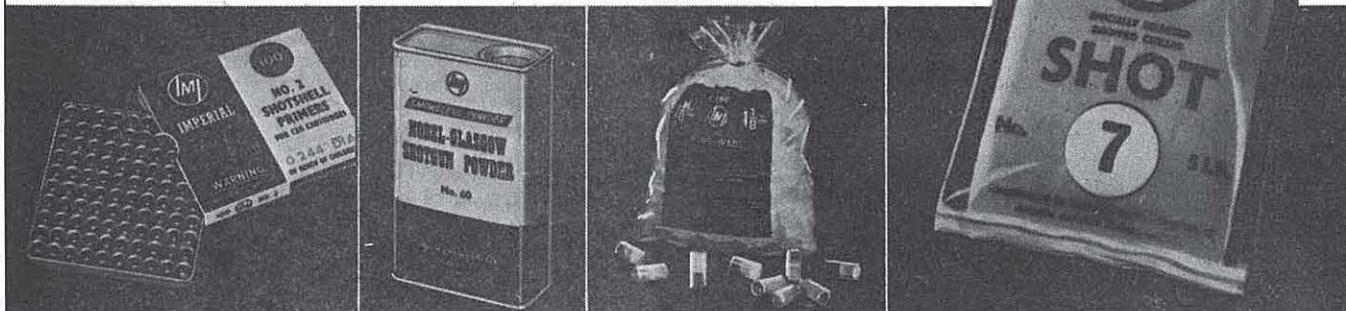

A most reputable Army Officer, who is an earnest clay target shooter, is alarmed with the 28-4-71 publication in one of Australia's widely read magazines — "The Bulletin" — which describes under "the ease of bomb making," that it is easy to buy the ingredients to assemble a home-made bomb capable of killing people and devastating property.

A hardware store with an explosive licence can sell gelnite at 25 cents an 8 inch by 1 inch stick; a 5 pound pack for \$3.30; ten detonators for \$3.00; BUT, to buy more than 25 pounds, a mines department licence and a permit to store in an approved magazine is required by the department.

All Australian home loaders of shotgun cartridges will be keen to know the outcome of the proposal to raise the existing law — which permits 13-year-olds to purchase gelnite — to a different age group, but, the true home loader (and there are many of them) will be trusting that the law planners frame any amendment in a practical and sensible manner permitting the law abiding citizen, or registered shooter, to go about his recreational activity with minimal formality and inconvenience.

Registered shooters could well brief their respective Members of Parliament on the matter and also have their retail and trade suppliers make similar considered representations.

I.S.U. Regulations for Skeet Shooting

See Shooting Range Rule 4 — whilst the "use of a 'Timer' is mandatory" it is recommended that skeet lights be installed to indicate the time delay and to mount these on the trap house they should be clearly visible when standing on number 2 station, looking at the High House, at the side facing the shooter in the top right-hand corner about one foot to one-and-a-half feet downwards and inwards is a heavily frosted sixty watt electric light globe with a cover to stop any beating rain.

Immediately the shooter calls PULL, the light shows for a maximum of three seconds then the light is tripped off when the target is pulled or released.

The above information is a local application to assist clubs in their setting up plans.
