


Installation and testing of the 15 field trap layouts at the Melbourne Gun Club 30th May, 1973



Looking along and down into the mouth of an Olympic trench at the Melbourne Gun Club. There are two such trenches, with provision for a third trench. The red danger flag is in position at the trench steps. The roof of the trench is awaiting its thick bitumastic covering. The scene shows how the trenches were set ahead of the existing down-the-line traphouses whilst at the rear of the d-t-l traphouse is a small section of the I.S.U. style concrete walkways. When normal d-t-l traphooting is used, the I.S.U. sloping concrete at the trench mouth. When I.S.U. shooting is taking place, provision has been made for the d-t-l traphouse to be removed.

Melbourne Gun Club has four skeet layouts superimposed over d-t-l layouts — visible are skeet grounds one, two and three.

This photograph was taken from a viewing position facing a little north of west — all shooting grounds and layouts at Melbourne Gun Club face a little south of east.




Shooter Lindsay Baxter, who installed the complete electronics on his own — to the complete satisfaction of the suppliers (Beretta-Fiocchi of Italy) is seen distributing targets to the respective traps prior to shooting.


Note — Lindsay was photographed at the precise moment of juggling targets from one hand to the other. as provided in the regulations of the International Shooting Union for the 1973 World Moving Target Championships (Clay Target Section)

Mr Norino Sossoroli, 35-year-old Specialist Technician from Beretta-Fiocchi of Italy loads a standard I.S.U. target, as made by I.M.I. Australia Pty. Ltd., onto the Olympic throwing arm of a Beretta-Fiocchi fixed directional trap when checking the completely new I.S.U. Trench shooting installations at Melbourne Gun Club.

These traps are approved by the International Shooting Union.

I.M.I. Australia Pty. Ltd. have developed a new clay target to full international specifications and to withstand faster flights.





Before loading with a clay target, Mr Norino Sossoroli cocks trap number fifteen under the watchful eyes of, from left to right, committeemen Jack Mollica who acted as interpreter, Larry Teague and Melbourne Gun Club President, Bob Buchan.

Next group from left to right are Mervyn Berry, A.C.T.A. Secretary; Neil Newnham, Manager, Feature Service, the Melbourne Herald and Weekly Times Limited; Ian Cook, Plant Manager, I.M.I. Australia Pty. Ltd., manufacturers of Blue Star shotgun cartridges and Bronze Wing clay targets.



Shooters are Jack Henwood (shooting from position one; Ian Cook having shot from position one is now waiting at position two; Newton Thomas having shot from position two is now waiting at position three; Bill Hailes having shot from position three is now waiting at position four; Graham Carroll having shot from position four is now waiting at position five; Mal Hastie having shot from position five is walking around to the waiting position behind shooting position number one.

"Close-up" picture of a trench squad of six shooters in action — number 5 shooter of the squad is moving quietly along the circular walkway from number five position to take his place of waiting at the rear of shooting position number one. Shooter number 6 has moved forward to shooting position number one and having called is taking his shot at the target released by his call of "Pull" transmitted through the "phono-pull." (Note that a "scrambler-box" at the rear, only actuates one phono-pull at a time — it is controlled by manual switches for each shooting position and for repeat targets to replace broken targets.

Shooters 2 to 4 have each moved to the right to their next numbered positions. Shooter number 4 of the squad (with ear muffs) is observing the current shot before fully stepping to shooting position five — which has just been vacated by shooter number 5 of the squad who (as described above) is walking to the waiting position at the rear of shooting position number one.



At shooting positions four and five, shooter number 4 has called, the phono-pull has activated the target release electronically and the shooter is about to pull the trigger to break the target, seen to the high right. Shooter 5 is awaiting his turn to call and shoot. Looking past the knees of both shooters, the uncompleted trench roof is visible — it was awaiting its bitumastic coating which will not only render it safe to the loaders within the trench, but it will also be indistinguishable from the rest of the terrain.

Note that the white marker post in the centre foreground is not applicable to trench shooting — this marker belongs to British/American/Australian down-the-line trapshooting procedures.

The shooter at left, at shooting position four, is Ian Cook.
The shooter at right, at shooting position five, is Newton Thomas.

Our Cover

Depicts the newly adopted motif for the A.C.T.A. green reefer jacket. The motif shows our native golden Contamundra wattle surrounding a map of Australia which contains the coats of arms of each Australian State. The coats of arms from left to right are those of New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia and Tasmania.

Shown also for artistic purposes, is an Australian Aboriginal "Didgeridoo." A didgeridoo, an ancient aboriginal musical instrument is a hollow tube of wood some four or five feet long and about three inches in diameter. It is extended from the mouthpiece, held close against the mouth, with the lips inside it. to the toes which keep the other end raised just clear of the ground. It is a formidable-looking instrument and only few natives master the art of playing it properly.



At a meeting of the Australian Shooting Association in Melbourne on Sunday 13th May, 1973 a motion was carried "that the A.C.T.A. be included as a full affiliate of the A.S.A." — the meeting having noted that A.C.T.A. solicitors are arranging for the inclusion of the amateur requirements in A.C.T.A. memorandum of Association as required by the International Shooting Union and by the Australian Olympic Federation. Both the 1971 and 1973 Annual General Meetings of the A.C.T.A. had accepted these requirements and the provision within our written Memorandum and Articles.

Each member nation of the International Shooting Union and of the Olympic Games Federation is required to have a national body of which the members must be the controlling bodies of their respective types of shooting. Member organisations within the Australian Shooting Association are:—

Australian Small Bore Rifle Association.
Sporting Shooters Association of Australia.
Australian Clay Target Association.

Such a national body as the Australian Shooting Association is able to co-ordinate the various aspects of shooting at national levels, to the best national advantage and to the greatest common benefit.

At this stage of going to press, we have been informed verbally by Messrs. Guthrie & Co. Australia Pty. Ltd. of Melbourne that "Messrs. Armi P. Beretta, of Gordone, Italy, in association with their Australian distributors Messrs. Guthrie & Co. seek to donate to the A.C.T.A., a Beretta "SO4" Sidelock trap gun valued at some \$1,200, for an annual high gun scorer within the Australian National Championships."

This will be submitted on their behalf to the Executive Committee for constitution.

Meanwhile, we note that both the gold medals and bronze medals for trench shooting shooting at the 1972 Olympic Games at Munich were won by similar such Beretta shotguns.

Separately within this publication is a "Procedure Information for A.C.T.A. Eliminations prior to 1973 World Moving Target Championships," (Clay Target Section) and in addition is a self-explanatory set of photographs "by courtesy of the Herald and Weekly Times Ltd."

Procedure information for A.C.T.A. Eliminations prior to 1973 World Moving Target (Clay Target Section) Championships

There are four accepted methods of clay target shooting throughout the various countries of the world, including Australia.

These are: —
Automatic
Continental
Universal
Olympic Trench

Automatic — this is the accepted British/American/Australian single automatic oscillating trap system. (Note: oscillates laterally — A.C.T.A. accepted method).

Continental — single multi oscillating trap as accepted only to National Championship or Commonwealth Games Championships but NOT for Olympic or International Shooting Union World Championships. (Note: oscillates laterally plus vertically).

Universal — 5 single fixed traps in a trench. This is used by some countries but is not accepted for World or Olympic Championships.

Olympic Trench — 15 single, fixed traps in a trench, in five banks each of 3. This is the standard Olympic Trench or I.S.U. World Championship requirement.

We in Australia are currently preparing, through a number of eliminations in the various States, to select our Australian members to represent us in the 1973 World Moving Target Championships within the International Shooting Union.

Various approved clubs are conducting local eliminations within the above four shooting methods, but, the final selection by A.C.T.A. will be made after all initial qualifiers have come to Melbourne Gun Club and have further established their required skills.

At Melbourne Gun Club, the 15 trap Olympic Trench system was first completed and tested on 28th May, 1973, whilst a preliminary shoot had been conducted 25-5-73.

On May 28, the Melbourne Herald Newspaper was kind enough to be represented by its Sporting Editor Mr Terry Vines and its Photographer Mr Neil Town.

Messrs: Beretta-Fiocchi of Italy were represented by Mr Norino Sossorili age 35 from Milan and by Messrs: Guthrie & Co. as their Australian Agents through whom Melbourne Gun Club purchased 46 special Olympic traps — 10 for skeet (4 layouts) and 30 for trench (in 2 × 15 trap Olympic trench) plus 6 spares, plus "phono-pulls" and electric "roulette" scrambler boxes. The club has also imported two special hopper-fed Beretta-Fiocchi traps for I.S.U. standard skeet shooting. Each such hopper fed trap holds some 500 targets and is then entirely automatic from its electric releasing. Also purchased was a combination automatic and continental hopper fed down-the-line electric trap which holds some 400 targets — this is to be used for practice and instructional use.

The club is to be complimented for their unity of thought, action and effort in rising to this task of preparing themselves and their club facilities to full world standard. The Melbourne Gun Club can now stage British/American style shoots plus Olympic Trench/World I.S.U. Championships and is believed to be "the only club in the world, at this stage, which contains all such facilities at the one venue."

This statement emanates from Mr Norino Sossoroli the special technician sent to Melbourne in May 1973 to assist with the installation of the electronics for these new facilities. Mr Sossoroli is employed by Messrs. Beretta-Fiocchi solely to install these systems throughout the world and to develop new such systems. Prior to coming to Australia he had just installed three separate Olympic/I.S.U. Trench systems in Russia and passed his unsolicited remarks on Melbourne Gun Club without fear or favour. The club is grateful for his dedication, his simple sincerity and for his skills.

The Melbourne Gun Club had sub-divided itself into various working committees headed by their dedicated President of four years, Mr R. F. (Bob) Buchan. Thence interwoven came Administration under Mr R. (Rusty) Fox; Finance under Mr Mal Hastie; Building under Mr Neville Moore with Mr John Summers as Architect; Ground Beautification under Mr Rupert Henwood; Technical Layout and Trap Installation under Mr George Biggs. As to the technical layout requirement, special commendation came from Mr Sossoroli for Mr Lindsay Baxter for his professional skill in completing all the trap installations to full operative working conditions before Mr Sossoroli's arrival.

The procedure of Olympic Trench/I.S.U. World Championship operation using the above equipment is:—

Each 15 trap trench layout is a reinforced concrete trench measuring 60 feet by 10 feet by 10 feet to house 15 independent electrically released, single throwing, fixed position, Olympic-arm traps, and each of these is separately hand-cocked and loaded. Such a trench requires a minimum of three loaders or trap operators. The trench is not apparent to the shooters vision, as the roof of the trench is flush with ground

level and for loader/trap operator safety the roof is covered with a minimum of four inches of bitumastic on a base of steel. The roof is of black colour so as not to disturb the shooter's vision.

Shooters are squadded in squads of 6 in order to maintain a required sequence of predetermined elevations and angles of target flights. (Squads of under six could provide an irregular target sequence for some shooters as opposed to others in this or that squad).

Running parallel with the trenches is a three feet wide concrete walkway containing five shooting positions, each designated by a numeral within the concrete and also by a "phono-pull." A "phono-pull"— the word is self explanatory— is a small electric microphone enclosed in a weather-proof cone shaped housing, and standing on a 2½ foot high stand. This "phono-pull' is directly in front of the shooter, at the shooter's feet. The leading edge of the concrete is 15 metres from the front wall of the trench. Traps are set within the trench with the pivot point slightly back from this but the target release point is approximately 50 centimetres below the trench ceiling. The sixth shooter stands some six feet to the rear of number one shooter.

Maximum and minimum target elevations are one metre and four metres respectively, measured at a point eleven metres from the front of the trench. Each bank of three traps covers a ninety degree target area being 45 degrees either side of a centre line. Each shooting station faces such a bank of three traps.

Minimum target travel distance is to be 70 metres.

Each shooter releases his own target by making an approved call of "pull" which activates the trap release switch by travelling through the "phone-pull" connections.

Behind the shooters, stands the referee who can move at will, and to assist him are line referees stationed one on either side, at the ends of the concrete shooting lane.

In order that all competitors receive an equal distribution of target angles and elevation, predetermined settings are made to a special electric "scrambler box" which is controlled by an operator seated at the rear of the referee.

Shooters move laterally to the right to the next shooting position after each shot and the safety procedure for the fifth shooter is that he walks along a semi-circular concrete walkway, behind the referee but in front of the scrambler box, to take his place behind the shooter on number one position, who himself has just moved forward from the sixth or "waiting" position. Actually, by the time he makes this walk, 'tis almost his time to shoot from number one position.

Twenty-five (25) targets are shot at by each shooter per visit.

(Note: These technical details were supplied by Mr George Biggs, an elected Executive Committeeman and an appointed Trap and Skeet Referee Examiner of the Australian Clay Target Association. He is available voluntarily for clubs seeking specialised advice).

(Note: It is recommended that clubs desirous of simulating the trench system of shooting would achieve best results by installing a continental trap housing with its roof at ground level and the trap to have the pivot point of the throwing arm 50 centimetres below the ceiling of this traphouse. A sloping apron should also be prepared, leading downwards to the bottom of the traphouse door, so that targets when released, have clear initial flights).

(Note: Clubs, if considering I.S.U. trench layouts are advised to seek free guidance from the Melbourne Gun Club, on installation and cost factors, as many unforeseen pitfalls occur in such a major undertaking).

I.S.U. Trench Shooting

At the respective approved clubs, proven and registered amateur shooters who have each completed and lodged a satisfactory Schedule "A" form will initially qualify for TRENCH selection — by shooting and breaking 85 per cent or better, that is 85 or more of 100 targets on at least two occasions, with practice targets not to count — between April 1 and end September, 1973. Nomination \$10 per shooter per 100 targets, standard 1½ ounce or 1½ ounce cartridges of shooter's own choice and provision of either factory or home loads. Club must forward all details to A.C.T.A. of their qualifying shooters by October 2nd, 1973.

Only these qualifying shooters shall be eligible for, and invited to, the final 1973 Commonwealth Eliminations at the Melbourne Gun Club on October 5, 6 and 7 at their own expense. Melbourne Gun Club will conduct eliminations over the 15 trap I.S.U. Trench system on September 27, 28, 29 and on the afternoon of the 30th. Each contestant will be squadded to shoot three rounds of 75: 75: 50 totalling 200 trench targets. This may be used by shooters to establish their 85, or better, percentage, if they have not already done so at some other location. Nominations \$10 per shooter per 100 targets, standard 11/6 or 11/4 ounce cartridges of shooters own choice, and provision, of either factory or home loads.

From these eliminations, those who qualify will be required to contest again on October 5, 6 and 7 (Friday, Saturday and Sunday), at their own expense, at the Melbourne Gun Club, the National I.S.U. Trench Eliminations, of 300 trench targets per shooter, shot in three stages of 100 targets per shooter over each of the three days, October 5, 6 and 7. Nominations \$7 per shooter per 100 targets, with up to 1½ ounce cartridges of factory load and of shooter's own choice and provision.

From these National I.S.U. Trench results, up to ten shooters may be selected on October 5, 6 and 7, according to their performances, for Australia's 1973 International Trench Team and Trench Individual shooters, plus reserves.

I.S.U. Skeet Shooting

At the respective approved clubs, proven and registered amateur shooters will initially qualify for Skeet selection — by shooting and breaking 85 per cent or better, that is, 85 or more of 100 I.S.U. Skeet targets on at least two occasions between April 1 and end September 1973 — with practice targets not to count. Nominations \$10 per shooter per 100 targets. Standard 1½ ounce cartridges of shooter's own choice, and provision, of either factory or home loads.

Only those qualifying skeet shooters shall be invited to the final 1973 Commonwealth Skeet Eliminations at the Melbourne Gun Club on October 5, 6 and 7 -at their own expense.

Melbourne Gun Club will be conducting I.S.U. skeet elimination on September 27, 28, 29 and during the afternoon of the 30th of 75: 75: 50 = 200 targets.

These events will be open to all registered A.C.T.A. shooters who have each lodged the amateur schedule "A" form and who have their handicap cards so marked. Shooters may qualify over this shoot for the final on October 5, 6 and 7—Friday, Saturday and Sunday at Melbourne Gun Club.

Nominations \$10 per shooter per 100 targets only.

Standard 11/8 ounce cartridges of shooter's own choice and provision of either factory or home loads.

The actual and final National I.S.U. Skeet Eliminations will be conducted at the Melbourne Gun Club. Victoria, over the successive October days of Friday 5, Saturday 6 and Sunday 7. Entrants only to be those invitees from the State eliminations who each achieved the required qualifying skeet scores. These skeet scores to be with A.C.T.A. Secretary by Tuesday, 2nd October.

This National I.S.U. Skeet Elimination to be of 100 skeet targets per day totalling 300 skeet targets per shooter over October 5, 6 and 7. Nominations \$7 per shooter per 100 targets. Only 1½ ounce cartridges of shooter's own choice and provision but of factory load.

Up to best ten Australian I.S.U. Skeet shooters will then be selected on October 5, 6 and 7 according to their respective elimination performances from whom Australia's 1973 International Skeet Team and Skeet Individual shooters, plus reserves, will be chosen.

The Melbourne Gun Club will provide free morning—afternoon teas and luncheons for each of the Commonwealth Eliminations contestants—Trench and Skeet.

Dear Sir,

Since graded shooting has begun, there has been a point which has arisen quite often.

Example:

Three A Grade shooters score 20:20. One B Grade shooter scores 19:20. One C Grade shooter scores 20:20.

The point has arisen when B Grade shooter claims, as he is a grade winner, that he should shoot for overall trophy or badge, even though he has shot an inferior score than other grade winners.

There seems to be two schools of thought. One thinks B Grade shooter is correct, while other school thinks that, as B Grade shooter has inferior score, he does not shoot-off for overall trophy or badge.

Could you please give me A.C.T.A. official interpretation of this query please?

Only the common top scorers are eligible to further compete for the overall championship.







(2) At the time of each annual shooter re-registration, a one yard inward will be granted by A.C.T.A. and shown on the handicap card, as issued accordingly - excepting those shooters who request to remain on their earned handicaps.

COMMON MARK SHOOTING

- (i) Shooters are to be classed into three classes by their performance, excluding shoot-offs, over each 500 targets from 16 yards, double barrel, single barrel or points score with broken targets to count.
- (ii) Handicapping procedures are applicable in cham-pionships and class events, in accordance with Rule 149, to shooters who are competing on or behind their handicap marks.
- (iii) Shooters may compete in one class only. Any shooters may nominate in any class higher than his own, but by doing so he forfeits the right to compete in his own class.
- (iv) Shooters mark their own cards progressively for common mark shooting and at November 30 annually AND/OR after 500 programmed targets the card must be submitted to the club secretary for correct classification and reporting to A.C.T.A. central records.
- (v) The classes are to be: Australian A class = 90% to 100% Australian B class = 85% and under 90% Australian C class = all under 85%
- (vi) A shooter's open handicap is achieved under the handicapping formula applicable to handicap events







Jim was one of four who qualified with a clean score of 50:50, then went on to 75 targets to take second place to High Gun Newton Thomas.


However he had to forfeit his place as team member at the shoot on the following day, in view of a promise to attend a family event; a regrettable loss to the team.




Veteran Mildura skeet shooter Cedric Purdue (70 plus) was proud of his team rosette.


