



Our Cover

Depicts the newly adopted motif for the A.C.T.A. green reefer jacket. The motif shows our native golden Cootamundra wattle surrounding a map of Australia which contains the coats of arms of each Australian State. The coats of arms from left to right are those of New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia and Tasmania.

Shown also for artistic purposes, is an Australian Aboriginal "Didgeridoo." A didgeridoo, an ancient aboriginal musical instrument is a hollow tube of wood some four or five feet long and about three inches in diameter. It is extended from the mouthpiece, held close against the mouth, with the lips inside it, to the toes which keep the other end raised just clear of the ground. It is a formidable-looking instrument and only few natives master the art of playing it properly.



At the time of going to press with this publication, most of the full \$10 shooter registrations have been received and yellow pressure sensitive labels have been despatched to the club secretaries concerned for attachment to the respective handicap cards.

All new shooters in 1973 have been mailed a copy of A.C.T.A. shooting rules. All 1972 registered shooters received a copy of the shooting rules within their July 1972 copy of A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" publication.

At the time of going to press with this publication, 264 signed Amateur Rules Schedule "A" forms have been received and recorded — these are listed at the rear of this publication and only such self-declared and club-ratified shooters, as noted in the Association records, are eligible to compete, at this stage, for ultimate selection as Australia's Trap and Skeet Shooting Team and Individual Entrants in the 1973 World Moving Target Championships (Clay Target Section) scheduled for November 12 to 22 inclusive at the Melbourne Gun Club, Lilydale, Victoria, within the International Shooting Union. To all possible entrants — have you lodged your Schedule "A" form yet? The form is contained in duplicate elsewhere in this publication.

The Amateur Rules Schedule "A" Form requirements also apply to British Commonwealth Games participants and selectees.

Australia's shotgun entrants for both the 1973 I.S.U. World Championships and the 1974 British Commonwealth Games will be selected by the Association from the highest scorers in the I.S.U. Trench and I.S.U. Skeet finals scheduled for October 5, 6, 7 at Lilydale, Victoria.

The Xth British Commonwealth Games will be conducted at Yaldhurst, Christchurch, New Zealand, over the period January 25th to February 1st and

Australia may field four shotgunners — two for I.S.U. Trap and two for I.S.U. Skeet. Opening Day is January 24, but practice shooting will be available from January 14.

In general competition shooting there are basically two different types of shooting, and, irrespective of the types of firearms (either pistol, rifle or shotgun), the targets used are either "fixed position" or "moving" targets.

The Moving Target Section of Olympic or International Shooting Union embraces:

- (a) Clay Pigeon shooting, where the target size simulates the body structure of a pigeon in flight minus the wings and feathers. Firearms used are 12 gauge shotguns.
- (b) Running Boar shooting this is simulated field shooting at a paper target sized 51 inches × 29 inches, being a colored replica of a full-sized European Wild Boar, with scoring rings superimposed over the heart/lung area. The target travels back and forward, on an open run, over a 10 metre opening and each shooter at a range of 50 metres has to fire a shot on each run, using a special running boar .22 rimfire rifle. The match is of 30 slow and 30 fast runs per shooter:

Slow = boar covers 10 metres (30 feet) in 5 seconds.

Fast = boar covers 10 metres (30 feet) in $2\frac{1}{2}$ seconds.

The aiming point is approximately 27 inches ahead of the bullseye, depending on the ammunition used.

Both of these types of shooting were included in the 1973 Moving Target allocations to the Australian Shooting Association, two of whose members are the Australian Clay Target Association and the Sporting Shooters' Association of Australia.

The Clay Target Section will be conducted by the Australian Clay Target Association at its member club, the Melbourne Gun Club situated some 30 road miles (48.3 kilometres) east of Melbourne in the Shire of Lillydale and more specifically described as — travel the Maroondah Highway (Highway 34) from Melbourne, thence when reaching the top of Albert Hill, just before the township of Lilydale, turn left at Victoria Road and proceed five miles (some 8 kilometres) due north where the road terminates in the gun club property.

The Running Boar Section will be conducted at Springvale, some 15 road miles (24 kilometres) south-east of Melbourne along Princes Highway (Highway 1) — known also as Dandenong Road — by the Sporting Shooters' Association.

Each of such Moving Target Championships are being conducted by the Associations concerned as separate ventures within the following combined programme as submitted to, and agreed by the International Shooting Union:

Host clubs for ISU skeet eliminations are required to have an acceptable time delay switch in conformity with the I.S.U. rules.

Whilst each registered shooter and each member club has received the conditions of the 1973 eliminations and final events within our May and July 1973 publications, each host club has been additionally asked that:

- (a) each conducting club read and interpret the "nominations" as being "Maximum nominations \$10 per 100 targets."
- (b) Contestants shoot at each 100 I.S.U. type targets in a one day competition

OR

as an event

during any carnival of two to three successive days
BUT

no further lapse, or break period, beyond a three-day carnival is to be permitted.

- (Thus, 25's or 50's totalling 100 over Saturday/Wednesday/Saturday are unacceptable).
- (c) Such qualifying scoresheets, or photostats of the scoresheets, to be lodged by mail as soon as convenient, with all final elimination submissions to be closed at 10 a.m. Tuesday, October 2, 1973, by A.C.T.A. Secretary.

(d) Contestants be informed that they may shoot at any number of host club eliminations as they choose in order to seek invitation to the October 5, 6, 7 final elimination. Thus, contestants may shoot for their "85 or better" scores at any or all of the host clubs, including the Melbourne Gun Club. However, once the required qualifying scores are achieved and reported to A.C.T.A., then any further personal such shooting is purely for practice.

The International Shooting Union has announced that the 1973 European Championships for Olympic Trench and Skeet will be held at Turin, Italy, from September 21 to 30.

Information has it that some shooters are inclined to attend unregistered clay target shoots for one reason or another. Under the terms of our insurance policy, such shooters are entirely uninsured.

A special message to those who attended the 1974 National Championships at Adelaide and who were disappointed with the food at the "get-together function" and the "trophy presentation night" — verbal protests were made at the time by both A.C.T.A. National President and Secretary, then a letter was mailed seeking an investigation by the venue secretary seeking his findings as soon as possible. We have a letter dated June 29 from the Secretary of the South Australian Sportsmen's Association offering a token credit against their invoiced amount but this credit is insufficient to attempt to distribute. However, the following extract from the SA Sportsmen's Association letter dated June 29 is accepted and published, as written:

"In reply to your correspondence, I would firstly like to state that I am most disappointed that your functions, as arranged carefully and amicably between ourselves, did not function as envisaged when planned.

I offer to your Association, my most humble apologies and state that on my going on leave my staff were instructed to give you all the co-operation to help make your shoot and social the success you expect it to be."

Current New Zealand Happenings

With acknowledgments to the June 1973 official publication of the New Zealand Gun Clubs' Association magazine "Gunshot," the following are decisions from their recent annual and council meetings but no dates of these were published:

- 1. "Gunshot" production and publication to be increased from three-monthly to a two-monthly affair.
- 2. Annual Meeting recommended that fixed dates be considered for respective Championships — —, recognised open shoots and teams matches — that rules of team events at open shoots be ratified by the Association.
- 3. Recommended two national shooting grounds one in the North Island and one in the South Island providing that such can be done with the active co-operation of existing clubs.
- 4. Council decided to appoint a liaison officer from among its members for public relations work among

visiting shooters at New Zealand Championships and that this be a regular and annual appointment.

- 5. Council has decided to introduce an Annual International Teams Match to be conducted during the National Championships each year, to be shot in conjunction with the Glenn Cup Match with the standard proviso that visiting teams not be eligible to win the Glenn Cup with the exception of Australia.
- 6. The N.Z.G.C.A. elected as President, Mr M. A. Havill, who announced that: (a) N.Z.G.C.A. annual registration fees . . . increased to \$10 as from July 1, 1973, excepting shooters still at school or college and shooters under the age of 18 years who will each pay only \$5 per annum.
- (b) Executive Committee, of Council has been enlarged and renamed the Management Committee comprising President, the two Island Vice-Presidents and one other member of Council to be drawn from the Island in which the President is not resident: Thus the current Management Committee is comprised of N.Z.G.C.A. President, M. A. Havill; North Island Vice-President, G. B. Thomas; South Island Vice-President, C. W. Scott and Mr J. S. McMillan of Hamilton.
- (c) Committee to meet every two months between the annual and half-yearly meetings of full council and it will be appreciated that this will entail additional cost to the Association.
- (d) Funds to be set aside to build up reserves for the future . . . sending representative teams to World Championships, Commonwealth Games and Olympic Games.



(1) As of 1/1/72 past A.C.T.A. rules allowing inward movement on handicap ratings were discontinued, except for extreme physical disabilities.

(2) At the time of each annual shooter re-registration, a one yard inward will be granted by A.C.T.A. and shown on the handicap card, as issued accordingly — excepting those shooters who request to remain on their earned handicaps.

COMMON MARK SHOOTING

- (i) Shooters are to be classed into three classes by their performance, excluding shoot-offs, over each 500 targets from 16 yards, double barrel, single barrel or points score with broken targets to count.
- (ii) Handicapping procedures are applicable in championships and class events, in accordance with Rule 149, to shooters who are competing on or behind their handicap marks.
- (iii) Shooters may compete in one class only. Any shooters may nominate in any class higher than his own, but by doing so he forfeits the right to compete in his own class.
- (iv) Shooters mark their own cards progressively for common mark shooting and at November 30 annually AND/OR after 500 programmed targets the card must be submitted to the club secretary for correct classification and reporting to A.C.T.A. central records.
- (v) The classes are to be:

 Australian A class = 90% to 100%

 Australian B class = 85% and under 90%

 Australian C class = all under 85%
- (vi) A shooter's open handicap is achieved under the handicapping formula applicable to handicap events only.


