

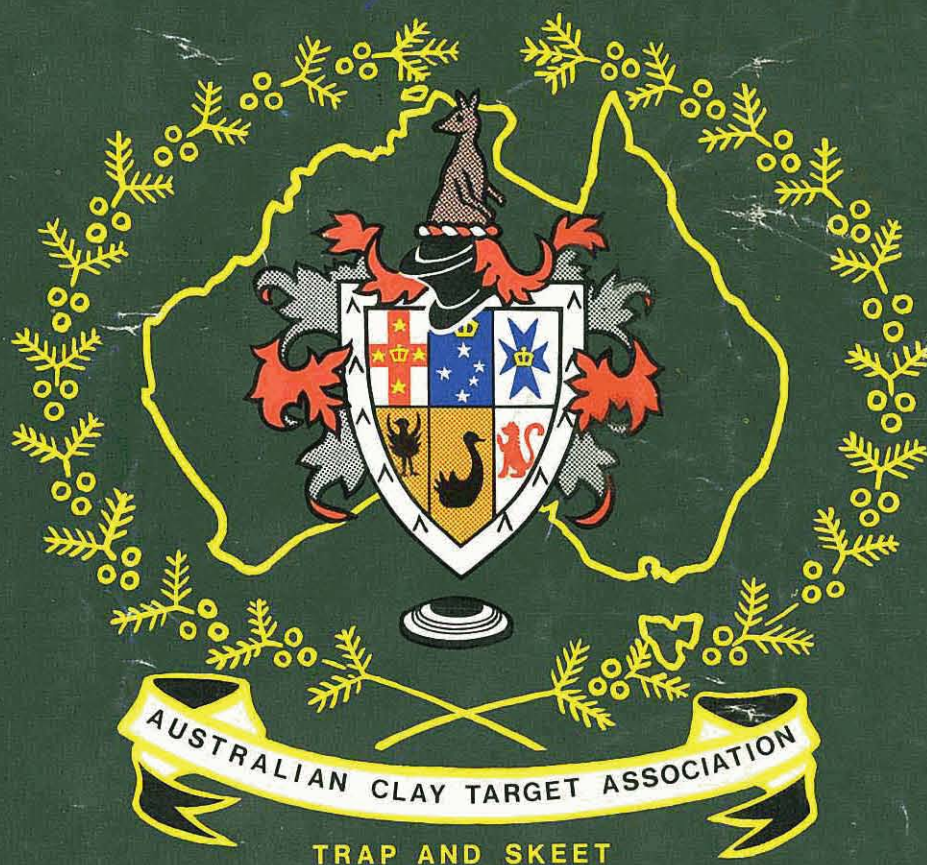

Our Cover

Depicts the newly adopted motif for the A.C.T.A. green reefer jacket. The motif shows our native golden Cootamundra wattle surrounding a map of Australia which contains the coats of arms of each Australian State. The coats of arms from left to right are those of New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia and Tasmania.

Shown also for artistic purposes, is an Australian Aboriginal "Didgeridoo." A didgeridoo, an ancient aboriginal musical instrument is a hollow tube of wood some four or five feet long and about three inches in diameter. It is extended from the mouthpiece, held close against the mouth, with the lips inside it, to the toes which keep the other end raised just clear of the ground. It is a formidable-looking instrument and only few natives master the art of playing it properly.

Editor's Notes



At this stage, in this section of the Australian shotgun competitive shooting scene, our thoughts are centred around the preparations at the Melbourne Gun Club which will be the venue of the trench and skeet sections of the 1973 World Shooting Championships at Moving Targets—within the International Shooting Union.

All states are conducting their respective area eliminations seeking the best shooters in both trap and skeet. For these eliminations, all states are using the I.S.U. shooting regulations as have been published in A.C.T.A. Shooting Rules handbooks and as contained in our national publication A.C.T.A. "Shooting News." However, we have just received some further skeet rule amendments and these are contained elsewhere in this publication. (See pages 4-5).

Concerning the world-wide written and accepted rules of amateurism these next three paragraphs are the contents of a fully self-explanatory letter we have received from the Australian Shooting Association and its contents must be observed and applied accordingly.

"1. One of the important sections of the new (amateur) rule bars all those whose names or photographs have been used at any time with commercial advertising."

The above ruling has been confirmed by the International Shooting Union and the Australian Olympic Federation and, as such, the shooter concerned would not be regarded as an amateur under the requirements of the I.S.U. and the A.O.F.

"2. The fact that a person's sole livelihood concerns the sale and distribution of a sporting goods manufacturer's product does not bar that person from competing as an amateur as long as his sporting activities are not used as a form of commercial advertising."

Host clubs for Australia's area preliminary eliminations vary in their respective capacities, as most have only the single oscillating "continental" type trap, whilst others have the five fixed trap "universal" system or the standard Olympic/ISU fifteen fixed trap system. All host clubs are tightening the adjustment settings on their single traps so that their targets are being thrown the increased distances as stipulated in Olympic/ISU regulations.

However, all Australian contestants are warned that the throwing of ISU targets by the Fiocchi-Beretta fixed trap system at the Melbourne Gun Club is a sight to see in that the speed of the targets far exceeds the normal British/American down-the-line speeds. We trust that all Australian candidates are practising hard as during November 13 to 22, many of the world's top shotgunners, who have proven themselves at this trench type shooting, will be out on the 15 metre mark — aiming to win for their respective countries. As to skeet shooting, the speed of the ISU targets is likewise in advance of the standard American/British/Australian targets.

Whilst we are discussing targets — IMI Australia Ltd. have conducted considerable research into their targets and have now achieved a magnificently balanced target which will throw the required ISU distances and speeds — those concerned in this specialised production have our full compliments for the results of their step-by-step painstaking efforts.

Australia's respective area contestants have been given an 85 per cent or better qualification requirement in either their ISU trap/trench or skeet shooting qualifying scores. ISU regulations normally permit only 96 "percent-ers" to compete, however, for Australia's internal eliminations a local national figure of 85 per cent was prescribed as this has been our first-ever such shooting. Consequently the final invitees to be nominated in writing to A.C.T.A. Secretary by 10 a.m. Tuesday, October 2, 1973, may

be border line 85'ers as — who knows — at the actual October 5/6/7 Australian finals we may have some outstanding newcomers emerge as Australia's World Championship contestants.

Australia's final elimination and team selection procedures are shown on page 23 within this publication, as a final page addendum to the shoot advertisements of the Melbourne Gun Club.

Shooters are alerted with the generous offer by Guthrie & Co. (Aust.) P/L of a magnificent SO4 sidelock U/O trap gun, valued at \$1200, which will be donated for handing to the winner of the 1973 Australian ISU Trench Championship — (see Melbourne G.C. advertisement in this publication) — scheduled for September 28 to 30.

New Zealand may have some interested observers with us, watching the Australian eliminations, likewise we expect some from New Guinea as both of these are preparing teams for the 1973 ISU World Championships and also for the 1974 Xth British Commonwealth Games.

Australia is to select (1) a team of four trench shotgunners plus two reserves totalling six trench shooters.

(2) A team of four skeet shotgunners plus two reserves totalling six skeet shooters.

Each team members shoots in the World Championships, at 150 targets being two rounds each of 75 targets per team member over two days. Thus, each nation has a team score which will decide the winning nation. However, additionally there is an individual champion and to achieve this, from the teams best scorers, the top individual scorers then shoot at a further 50 targets and the highest individual scorer of these — now 200 targets — becomes the

1973 World Champion Trench or Skeet shooter, winning his appropriate Trench or Skeet gold medal. There are also silver and bronze medals for the second and third placegetters respectively.

Venue — Sporting Shooters' Association at Springvale, Victoria, some 15m (24.14km) south-east of Melbourne along Princes Highway (Highway 1)—known also as Dandenong Road. Grounds then on the left, opposite Sandown racecourse.

(NOTE: As of July 1974 all Australian road signs will be expressed in kilometres).

At this stage of going to press, applications, from member countries within the International Shooting Union, have been received from Britain, USA, Sweden, Western Germany, New Zealand, Thailand, South Korea Singapore — others are due.

The procedure for the World Championships is yet to be granted for publication, however, the flags of all competing nations will be flown at the Melbourne Gun Club and when the first three placegetters of the winning nations step onto the dais to receive their gold/silver/bronze medallions, the national anthem of the country/countries concerned will be played over the loud speakers in salutation.

The combined opening ceremony may possibly be at the Melbourne Gun Club because of the quality of its clubhouse and facilities.

The team of each competing nation will march onto the grounds wearing the uniform of their national shooting association. The Australian team will be clad in an Olympic green reefer jacket (single breasted with three plain gold buttons, patch pockets, centre vent, gold lining and the breast pocket to be of a special 1973 World Shooting design, as especially approved by the ISU). Other garments common, will be a shirt, green tie, tan shoes, hat.

Officials, including ISU referees (who are especially provided from Europe at Australian cost) will be clad in blue reefer jackets plus other garments as for the Australian team.

The A.C.T.A. as the host association for the shotgun section must bear some administrative costs, meanwhile, the Melbourne Gun Club, entirely on its own has committed many thousands of dollars to the setting up of their facilities to the required standard — some of these funds include donations both industrial and private, donations from a number of A.C.T.A. member clubs, donations from several shoots at other member clubs and also ground preparation assistance from the Victorian State Government. Subsequently, a list of these respective donors will be published. However no A.C.T.A. funds have been used despite several anonymous letters received. The Melbourne Gun Club will probably complete the period with a bank balance estimated to be some \$20,000 in the red.

At the October 5/6/7 final eliminations at the Melbourne Gun Club, Australia will also be selecting a team of two I.S.U. trap shooters and two ISU skeet shooters to be part of the overall Australian Shooting Team for the Xth British Commonwealth Games scheduled for January 25 to February 1, 1974, at Yaldhurst, near Christchurch, New Zealand. These shotgunners will also be clad similarly to the above mentioned Australian team but may be asked to wear a different (yet to be decided) breast pocket insignia.

The cost of the clothing, transport and accommodation of this Commonwealth Games team must be met, and in anticipation, we are grateful for

those generous industrial donors who are currently being approached by the respective Olympic Councils in each State of Australia. The balance of the required total amounts must be met by the Associations concerned.

Contained at the rear of this publication is the Amateur Rules Schedule "A" form. Shooters are urged to complete and lodge this as soon as possible.

The 1973 International Trap Teams' Match was won by the Canadian team with the combined score of 7341/7500 points, Australia was fourth with 7302/7500 points. All details are shown elsewhere within this publication.

The final section of the 1974 International Trap Teams Match will be held in England on Friday, July 19, 1974 and a cordial invitation has been received seeking any of the Australian team, or any A.C.T.A. registered shooter — with the request that "if they bring their guns they will be most welcome to compete in the British Open DTL Championship on the day following our International Teams Match."

Attention is drawn to the magnificent letter from Australian shooter Laurie Sim as contained in the "Letters to the Editor" section. Such simplicity and depth of written words can only emanate from training through intense study thence successful public examination and qualification.

A club recently gave four trophies for a common mark event but the overall winner was not declared as also being the winner of his class.

Rule 100 (k) provides that "managements may provide a minimum of one equal value prize or trophy for each grade."

Thus, where two shooters shoot-off for the overall then one becomes the overall champion whilst the other is quite definitely the runner-up and as such is only entitled to an acknowledgement, and/or a further trophy for his grade. However:

(a) Where the two concerned are from different classes, the higher scorer becomes both the overall winner plus the winner of his own class. His runner-up is the winner of his particular class.

(b) Where the two concerned are from the same class then the higher scorer is both the overall winner plus his class winner whilst the runner-up is merely a runner-up (for which a club may deem a further trophy is appropriate).

Published within the Letters to the Editor section is a copy of an explanatory letter from A.C.T.A. public liability insurers.

ERRATA

INTERNATIONAL SHOOTING UNION (UIT)

Skeet Regulations Amendments

Revised June 30, 1970 Edition

The following changes have been approved by the UIT and become effective on January 1, 1973.

General — Delete "yards," "Feet," and "inches." All specifications to be metric.

Article 1—No change.

Article 2—No change.

Article 3—Changed.

"The traps are set so that a target properly released will pass through a circle 91 cm in diameter. The centre of the circle being 4.57 metres above the target crossing point. The target crossing point . . . at a distance of regular target."

Article 4—No change.

Article 5—Target specifications (redefined).

"Diameter: 110 mm (+ or - 2 mm). Height: 26 mm (+ or - 1 mm). Weight: 105 grams (+ or - 5 grams).

Color: All black, all white, or all yellow; or the full dome may be painted white or yellow, or, a ring may be painted around the dome in white or yellow.

The color and country of manufacture will be included in all programs for competitions which are under the supervision of the UIT.

Articles 6-8—No change.

Article 9—Changed.

"A squad shall start shooting at Station 1 in the order in which the names appear in the score sheet. The first shooter shall start shooting at singles at Station 1, shooting the high house target first and the low house target second. The first shot scored 'lost' in the round shall be repeated immediately as his optional shot. Then, loading two cartridges, he shall proceed to shoot doubles (shooting the first shot at the target emerging from the nearest house and the second shot at the target from the farthest house) before leaving the station.

The second shooter shall then proceed likewise, followed by the other members of the squad in their turn. Then the squad shall proceed to Station 2 and repeat the same sequence as on Station 1. The squad shall then proceed to Station 3 where each shooter will shoot at a single target from the high house first and then a single target from the low house before leaving the shooting station. Each shooter in the squad will follow in sequence. The same procedures will be followed at Stations 4 and 5.

Upon advancing to Station 6 the first shooter will shoot singles in the same sequence as at the previous

stations. Then, loading two (2) cartridges, he shall shoot doubles by shooting at the low house target first and the high house target second before leaving the station. The other shooters will follow in their turn.

The same procedure will be followed at Station 7.

The squad will then advance to Station 8 where each shooter shall shoot at a target from the high house before any member of the squad shoots at a target from the low house. The squad shall then turn to the low house on Station 8 and the first shooter will shoot at the target from the low house. If the shooter has scored the first 24 targets "dead," he shall repeat the shot at another low house target for the 25th cartridge before leaving the station. The other shooters will follow in turn."

Article 10—Changed.

Delete entire last sentence re: "Optional."

Articles 11 through to 23—No change.

Article 24—Change line three, third sentence . . . "The pellets shall be only spherical in shape, made of lead or lead alloy, and 2 mm in diameter (North American sizes No.'s 8 and 9 are authorised). (. . . pertaining to ammunition)."

Article 25—Changed: Line 15 ". . . Two (2) repeat targets . . ."

Article 26—No change.

Article 27—Changed.

"Gun position . . . so that the gun butt touches the body along the normal waist line and a part of the butt is clearly visible under the elbow when the elbow is dropped down in a normal hanging position. No prolongation of the gun butt is permitted. To aid the Referee in controlling the position of the gun, a firmly fixed mark will be made on the body of the outer garment where the tip of the elbow falls. (See figure — rule 27)."

Article 28—Changed: Paragraph 2.

"At stations 1 and 8 only, the shooter is allowed to raise his gun to his shoulder two (2) times for practice aiming. When calling for his target and until the target appears he must remain in the ready position. (Article 27 and figure — rule 27)."

Article 29—No change.

Article 30—Changed 30 (d) the third (3rd) or subsequent.

Article 31—No change.

Article 32—No change.

Article 33—Changed.

"Line four '. . . maximum of two (2) times . . .' Line six 'upon the third (3rd) and succeeding . . .'"

Article 34—No change.

Article 35 (b) (1) . . . THIRD and . . .

Articles 36 through to 47—No change.

(PROTESTS—Page 5)

Protests— Changed—line four—Fee of \$10.00 (US).

Added after Article 57: "If a shooter has been designated as assistant referee and is late or fails to present himself or to provide an acceptable substitute without delaying the squad, he shall first receive a warning in the case of being late and shall be penalised by one target by the jury if he fails to appear or provide an acceptable substitute."

Articles 58 through to 67—No change.

STOP PRESS INTERPRETATION

The following is a copy of a self-explanatory cablegram as received:

"ISU Skeet Rules STOP Article 28 revision 1 Jan. 1973 STOP Station One STOP One dry mount allowed each single and 1 for double STOP Station Eight 1 for high 1 for low STOP No dry mount at other stations."

STOP PRESS – ANNOUNCEMENT

1. New Zealand South Island Championships were originally planned for November shooting at Timaru, but, these are now to be conducted during the N.Z. Labour Weekend of Saturday/Sunday/Monday, October 20/21/22, 1973. The change has been decided upon to provide both New Zealanders and Australians with the ability to be present at the important shoots being conducted in each country during that period.

(Note: Australia will be conducting the World Shooting Championships at Lilydale, near Melbourne, Victoria, from November 12 to 22.)

I would point out that we have increased the price of Clay Targets by 2½ per cent only.

You have my permission to print both these letters in the A.C.T.A. News.

Dear Customer,

We wish to inform you that we will increase our prices as from July 27, 1973. Our last price adjustment was made in November 1972 and since then we have incurred the following cost increase on basic raw materials and wages.

Copper — 50 per cent increase (and still rising).

Lead — 11 per cent increase.

Packing Materials — 5 per cent increase.

Award Wage Rates — 11 per cent increase.

In view of the magnitude of these increases I believe you will agree that our 7 per cent—8 per cent price increases are fairly modest.

We are of course aware of the activities and scope of the proposed Prices Justification Tribunal, and are willing to appear before them if necessary with every confidence that they will agree that our price increases are justified.

As far as imported lines are concerned you will notice that the majority of prices remain unaltered. It is our intention to leave these prices unchanged until such time as our overseas suppliers increase their prices to us.

In conclusion we assure you that we have made these price increases with a great deal of reluctance, but we felt that it would be impossible to continue to absorb cost increases of the magnitude stated above.

You must have sold your Stirling gas operated automatic. Beretta has always made a good automatic and I guess they are easy on the shoulder. Glad to hear you have a hunting partner. I have been keen on German short-haired pointers. They would be an ideal dog here as there is plenty of upland game. Hungarian partridge, ruffed grouse and sharp-tail grouse are fairly common around Edmonton and of course pheasant which are most plentiful about 200 miles south around Calgary and Lethbridge. I didn't have a very good duck season last year. They change their feeding patterns from year to year and it took me a while to find where they were in big numbers. They feed in the wheat fields in big mobs and when you locate one of these feeding places the night before then you have a guaranteed shoot next morning. The shoots only last about an hour and then you have your possession limit (16). I ended up with 40 for the season. Glad to hear you had a good season on ducks and next season should be better now that you have your dog. Our season here is in the Autumn-September 1 to freeze-up—which occurs about the third week of October. When the lakes freeze over there is no place for the ducks to roost during the day so they move south into the US. Some mornings are pretty cold like 10 deg. Fahrenheit, but the ducks are grain fed and big — the mallard is the equivalent of our Australian black duck as far as cunning and wing speed are concerned. There are teal here too, smaller than the Australian teal but not as good eating, fast flying mind you but they are puddle ducks and do not feed on grain. I don't shoot them because I don't eat them.

The American pintail is also a common duck here, a grain feeder and pretty fast. He decoys fairly easily so is easy to bag. There is a lot of sense in using decoys and a duck call. Early in the season they will turn ducks half a mile away. Singles and doubles will often land amongst the decoys. So much for ducks.

Well, I graduated on May 29 with a four-year degree (Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering). I am now working for a firm of consulting engineers, whom I worked with for 12 months before starting university and I worked for them during the summer holidays. Am not sure how long I'll stay with this firm — there is not much variety in the work — it is mainly sub-division development, design and construction. Edmonton is a rapidly growing city of about 500,000 so there is plenty of work in the sub-division development field. We planned to work here for two years until I'm qualified as a professional engineer then we could come back to Australia at least for a holiday, perhaps to stay. That depends on many

things. It's pretty hard to find bird hunting there to equal that here.

We have just bought a '69 Volkswagen camper that we will be able to use during the duck season. It is propane equipped and has a little furnace to keep the interior warm during winter. We will be able to go duck spotting in the evenings, eat and sleep on the spot, then have a shoot next morning and be back in town in time for work.

Have been doing some trap shooting recently but with not much success. Started off this season holding my gun differently and couldn't figure out what was wrong but have discovered just this week what I was doing wrong and my scores have improved proportionally. There are few tournaments up here. Went to one two weeks ago but was shooting badly. I have to shoot from 22 yards handicap in B class which is common for all beginners until they have shot enough competition targets to be graded properly. The front mark in handicap here is 18 yards. It's all single barrel here as you know. There is a big shoot coming up in two weeks time and I'll be in form for it. Well, Dad, that's about all the news for now. Laurie has just finished teaching and she is not going to teach next year so we will not be making money hand over fist as we anticipated. My wage is pretty average but will improve fairly quickly I expect as I get some experience as a full blown engineer. Should be able to afford to shoot clay pigeons anyway. We still live in an apartment but spend much time out at Laurie's parents place during the summer. They have an acreage (3 acres) and there are more things to do here than in an apartment.

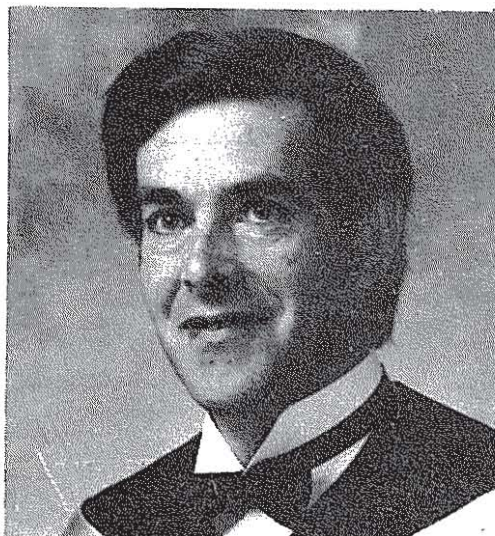

Re: Public Liability Insurance Policy M5/10406.

We refer to a number of conversations with you, over the past year, wherein we have discussed the extent of the cover granted by the above policy, and trust that the following explanation will clarify the situation.

In brief, the Operative clause of the Policy reads as follows:—

To Indemnify the insured association and/or its registered shooter members against their legal liability for accidental bodily injury to persons, and/or damage to property, whilst participating in an organised shoot or acting as individuals at a closed range, which is an Association approved and/or properly licensed range.

Extensions:—

(i) Liability of one Registered Shooter member to another.

(ii) Liability for Food and Drink poisoning.

Territorial Limits: Anywhere in the Commonwealth of Australia and Territory of Papua and New Guinea.

Our discussions have also concentrated on the question of the establishment of the status of a Registered shooter member. Under Article 49 (a) of the Associations' Articles of Association, it is obligatory for member clubs to ensure that no person may enter or compete at any competition or event unless such person is registered with the Association.

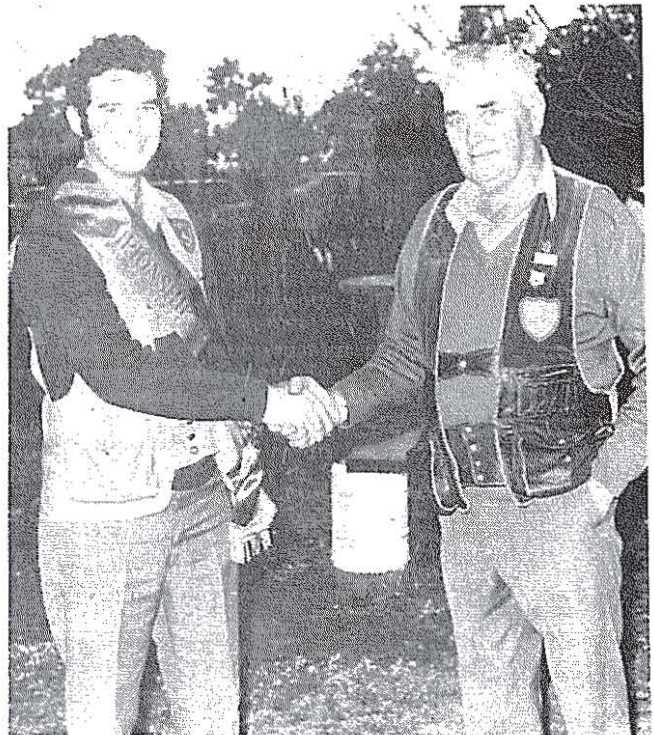
However, as you have pointed out, other persons, who may be competing at a range, would fall into the categories of Honorary and/or visiting shooters.

On discussing this aspect with the Company, it has been resolved that, providing that such persons are included on a Score Card and/or are properly introduced and entered in the Visitors' Book of the Member Club, such persons will be treated as a Registered Shooter Member.

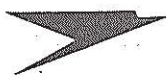

Secretary from various approved host club eliminations.

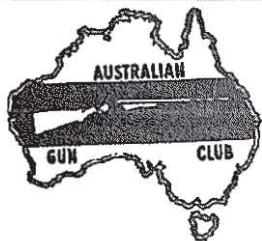

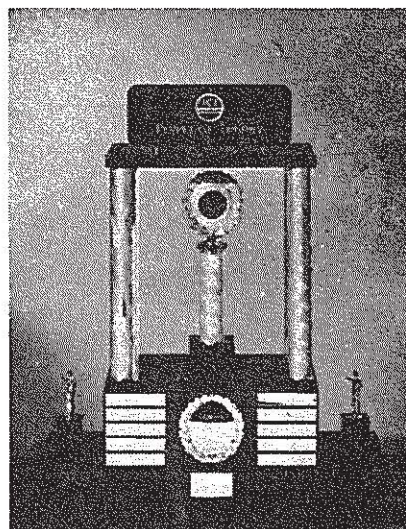

- (1) As of 1/1/72 past A.C.T.A. rules allowing inward movement on handicap ratings are discontinued, except for extreme physical disabilities.
- (2) At the time of each annual shooter re-registration, a one yard inward will be granted by A.C.T.A. and shown on the handicap card, as issued accordingly — excepting those shooters who request to remain on their earned handicaps.

COMMON MARK SHOOTING

- (i) Shooters are to be classed into three classes by their performance, excluding shoot-offs, over each 500 targets from 16 yards, double barrel, single barrel or points score with broken targets to count.
- (ii) Handicapping procedures are applicable in championships and class events, in accordance with Rule 149, to shooters who are competing on or behind their handicap marks.
- (iii) Shooters may compete in one class only. Any shooters may nominate in any class higher than his own, but by doing so he forfeits the right to compete in his own class.

- (iv) Shooters mark their own cards progressively for common mark shooting and at November 30 annually AND/OR after 500 programmed targets the card must be submitted to the club secretary for correct classification and reporting to A.C.T.A. central records.

- (v) The classes are to be:

Australian A class = 90% to 100%
 Australian B class = 85% and under 90%
 Australian C class = all under 85%

- (vi) A shooter's open handicap is achieved under the handicapping formula applicable to handicap events only.

AMATEUR RULES

A. The principles of amateurism, laid down in the declaration of the International Olympic Committee at its Congress of 1947 are valid for all members of the International Shooting Union.

B. Money prizes up to \$25U.S. or its equivalent are considered as a compensation for costs. If there is a shooting contest covering several days, money totalling \$100 or its equivalent within the same week are also considered a compensation for costs without detailed specification from the competitors. Money prizes exceeding the above-mentioned sums must be given to the club to which the competitor belongs. The competitor may receive from his club only the sum corresponding to his actual costs, which may include:

1. Entrance Fees.
2. Ammunition.
3. Travelling expenses.
4. Costs for meals and lodgings (in relation to the general level and normally not exceeding 10 dollars or 3 pounds or 35 Swiss francs, etc., per day).

C. This article applies to all categories of shooting supervised by the International Shooting Union.

D. An amateur should not be considered as:

1. Anyone who gives an exhibition in marksmanship for any pecuniary reward.
2. Anyone whose principal profession is test shooting of guns or ammunition. The operator of a test shooting machine is not necessarily included in this category.
3. Anyone who is a professional instructor in shooting.
4. Anyone who accepts money prizes in excess of those allowed according to the rules of amateurism.

E. Paragraphs D2 and 3 categories do not apply to a member of the armed forces, who acts as an instructor, if his work is solely educational and cannot be considered as coaching of shooters for competition.

F. The competitor should fulfil the qualifications of amateurism laid down by the National Olympic Committee of his country.

G. In judging the status as an amateur according to article D and E, the activities of the competitor during the past two years should be considered.
