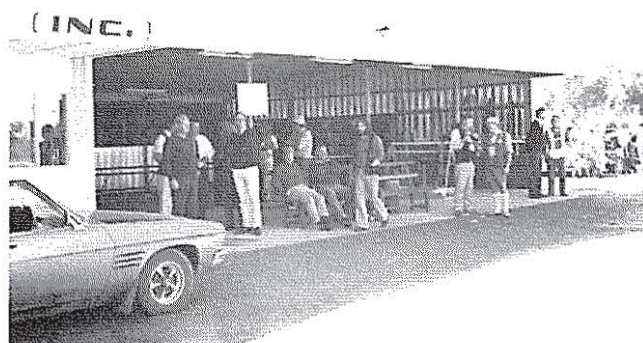

Our Cover

Depicts the newly adopted motif for the A.C.T.A. green reefer jacket. The motif shows our native golden Coolamundra wattle surrounding a map of Australia which contains the coats of arms of each Australian State. The coats of arms from left to right are those of New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia and Tasmania.

Shown also for artistic purposes, is an Australian Aboriginal "Didgeridoo." A didgeridoo, an ancient aboriginal musical instrument is a hollow tube of wood some four or five feet long and about three inches in diameter. It is extended from the mouthpiece, held close against the mouth, with the lips inside it, to the toes which keep the other end raised just clear of the ground. It is a formidable-looking instrument and only few natives master the art of playing it properly.

Editor's Notes



A.C.T.A. registered office is under leasehold till 1-12-74 (still at rates approximately one-third of other ruling rates). The 46-year-old building was sold to an unknown purchaser in June, 1973 and immediately various changes in the administrative continuity became evident. The building may pass to the demolishers within the foreseeable future.

The recent Commonwealth Government budgetary decisions will be reflected by a steep upgrade of the mailing costs of this A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" publication.

As at the time of going to press with this publication, we have a number of shooters recorded as having paid only \$5 of the 1973 annual registration fee. (See Stop Press, page 6, para 3).

Consequently (a) should be an applicable situation occur concerning any of these, the matter of coverage under the A.C.T.A. public liability insurance policy is fairly obvious.

(b) At the completion of any event then any such unfinancially registered shooter becomes ineligible to receive any trophy or sweepstake.

All financially registered shooters have an appropriate self-explanatory adhesive label on their handicap cards.

Technical Procedure of Trench Shooting under the Regulation of the International Shooting Union

In our July, 1973 publication, we published the general procedure of ISU Trench Shooting whilst our May to September publications have contained the Australian elimination procedures prior to the 1973 World Moving Target Championships (Clay Target Section).

At the time of mailing this, the October publication of A.C.T.A. "Shooting News," we will have conducted the area elimination at Melbourne

Gun Club — scheduled for September 27, 28, 29 and also the (Sunday) afternoon of September 30.

A number of shooters who have achieved an average in excess of 80 per cent during area eliminations of either ISU Trap, ISU Trench or ISU Skeet, have expressed a desire to contest the final eliminations at Melbourne Gun Club on October 5, 6 and 7, and this has been approved.

Registered shotgunners who have completed and lodged satisfactory Schedule "A" amateur acceptance declarations and who have each qualified under the prescribed A.C.T.A. score percentage requirements must have all such details lodged, in writing, by the host club concerned to reach A.C.T.A. Secretary, G.P.O. Box 2038S, Melbourne, 3001 by 10 a.m. Tuesday, October 2, 1973.

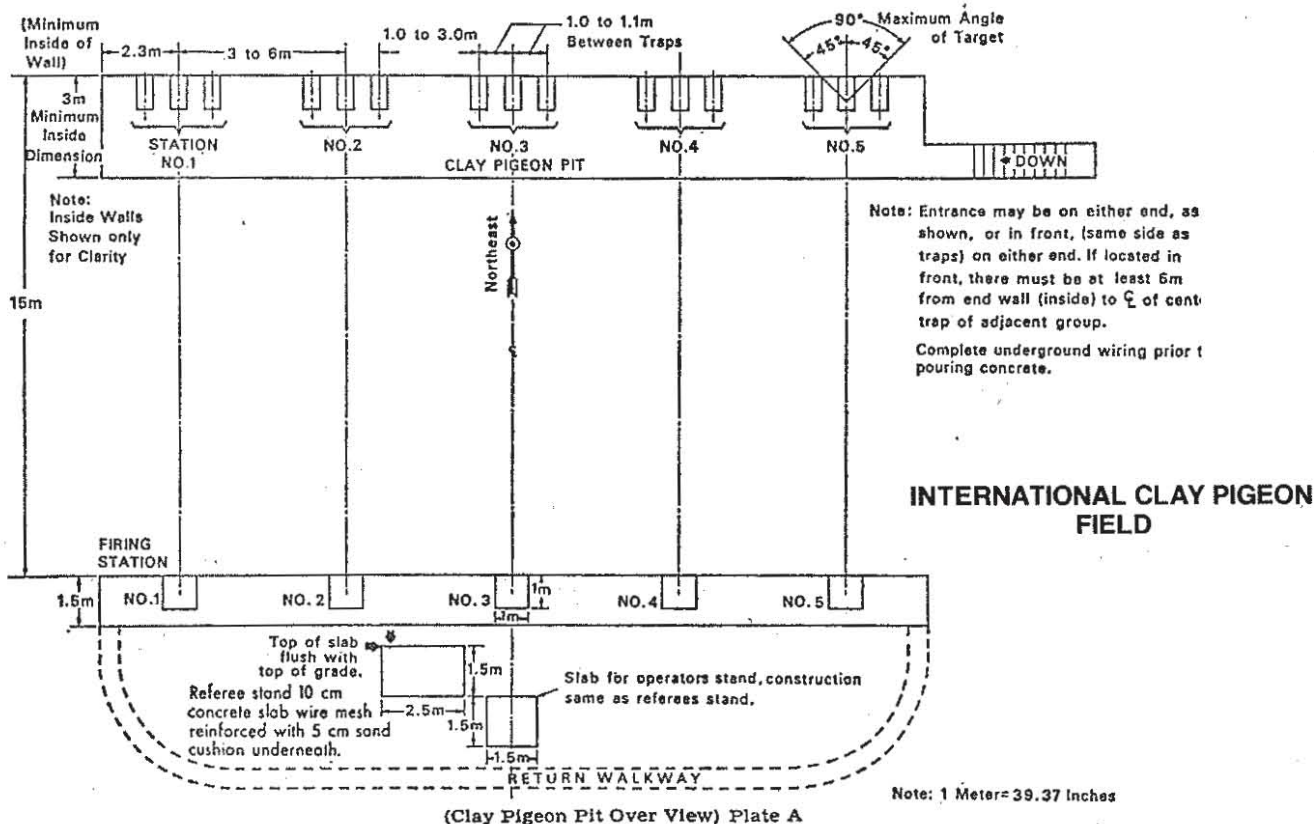
NOTES: (1) Such closing time and date applies to both the scheduled ISU Trench and ISU Skeet eliminations as have been progressively advertised.

(2) As ISU Skeet shooting varies little in layout and procedures from the written American/British/Australian Skeet shooting, very little has been specifically contained in our recent publications for obvious reasons.

(3) Our progressively published TRENCH procedures have been designed to give the known facts, followed by more clarifying information as and when it became available or more clear to us.

(4) The following information has been compiled and should be read in conjunction with the observance of the ISU field, elevation and pit diagrams as published in this issue of A.C.T.A. "Shooting News."

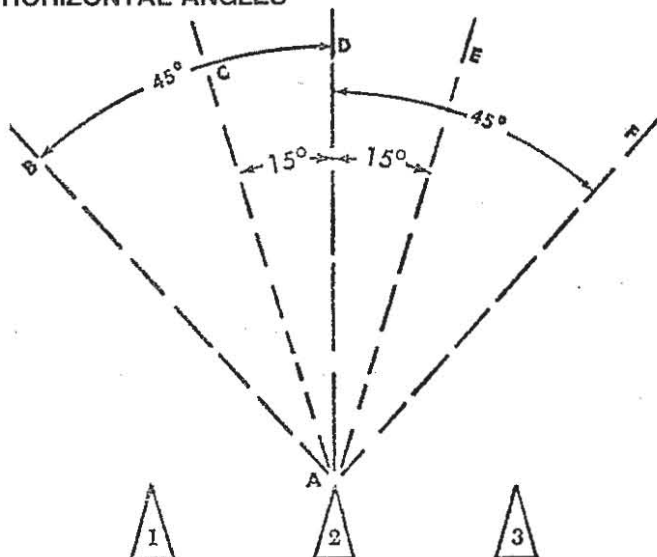
(5) This following section has been compiled in collaboration with Mr George Biggs, an A.C.T.A. elected Executive Committeeman, an appointed Trap and Skeet Referee Examiner, and who is also the leader of the Melbourne Gun Club ground layout sub-committee.



Each ISU Trench shooter faces a bank of three (3) fixed directional traps and these three traps are each set to throw targets in any of the directions shown below:



HORIZONTAL ANGLES

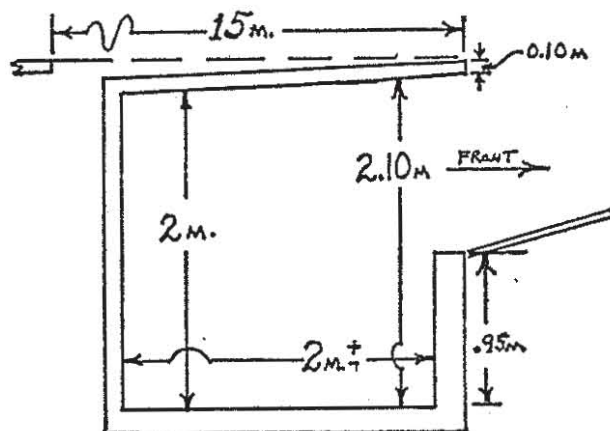

but at varying angles and/or heights to each direction in accordance with a prescribed mathematical formula.

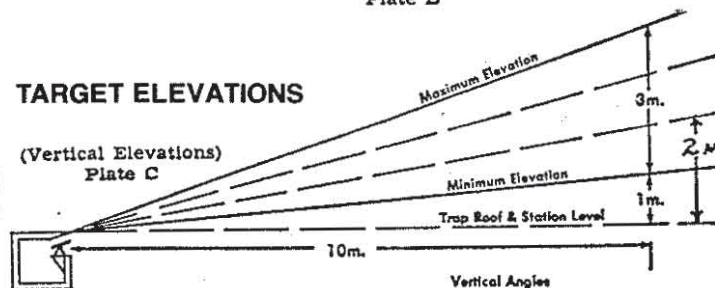
There are nine prescribed variances of this formula and the one selected to be used is decided upon by the chosen "Jury" of four selectees, before each day's shooting.

No shooter gets a target until he, himself, makes an acceptable call of "PULL" from his shooting position directly over the phono-pull (electric microphone) instrument which activates the instantaneous release of the target. Thus, no shooter can complain of a fast or a slow pull. However, if the call of "PULL" is not concise and sharp, the target will not be released.

The "Roulette"/Scrambler Box is designed to open and close the circuit of each phono-pull and to select the trap with its subsequent angle of target flight. It is the duty of the roulette operator to open the switch to the phono-pull *after* the shooter has closed his gun, otherwise the noise or sound of the closing of the gun's mechanical action could activate the phono-pull.

Under the rules of International Olympic Trench Shooting, it is permissible for the competitor on the right of the person shooting to close his gun to speed up the programme.

Each competitor's score is recorded by a scoreboard attendant on a small scoreboard situated on the shooting ground at the rear of, and to the right of, the referee — and also of the scrambler box.

Each such score is visible to all the squad shooting, as the board consists, not of written numerals, but of small metal discs — white for "dead" or red for "lost." (NOTE: In international shooting, the word "dead" is used to denote a broken target).

Thus, the scoreboard operator merely flicks a disc indicating a dead or lost target result.

Two barrels are permitted, each of the same value.

The referee does not call a dead target and his only indication of a LOST target is a "toot" by a horn type "bleep" for the scorer to act upon.

In the event of a NO BIRD, this is called as such by the referee. The shooter then receives a new target repeating exactly the same target — by a special arrangement from within the scrambler box.

There are 25 red, and 25 white, discs after each shooter's name, and, the total score is read by the operator of the master scoreboard who writes this score against the shooter's name on the main scoreboard.

Each shooter has a large cloth number which is pinned to his back. Thus, the main scoreboard clearly contains for each shooter competitor, in this precise sequence — his number, his name, his nationality, his score.

A scorer writes the permanent official score card from a position at the rear of the scrambler box and his scoring is independent of other scoreboard operators. At the conclusion of each round of 25 targets the score card and main scoreboard are checked and should be identical. If there is any discrepancy it must be resolved before the official card leaves the field. The results of the large scoreboard shall be the determining factor. It is the duty of the assistant referee nearest the large board to ensure that the scorer is posting the Referee's decisions correctly.

After a squad completes its series and the results have been verified and read aloud so that they can be clearly heard, the Referee and each shooter must sign or initial the sheet so that it may be quickly returned to the Results Office. Failure to sign the sheet before it leaves the field eliminates all rights to protests of scores which are posted as final results from the sheets.

The decision of the Referee is final as to whether a target is "dead" or "lost." The Referee, when in doubt, should consult the assistant referees then make his final decision.

Australia may select (1) a team of four trench shotgunners plus two reserves totalling six trench shooters.

(2) A team of four skeet shotgunners plus two reserves totalling six skeet shooters.

Each team member shoots in the World Championships, at 150 targets being two rounds each of 75 targets per team member over two days. Thus, each nation has a team score which will decide the winning nation. However, additionally there is an individual champion and to achieve this, from the teams best scorers, the top individual scorers then shoot at a further 50 targets and the highest individual scorer of these — now 200 targets — becomes the 1973 World Champion Trench or Skeet shooter, winning his appropriate Trench or Skeet gold medal. There are also silver and bronze medals for the second and third placegetters respectively.

The programme(s) for the 1973 World Championships (Moving Targets is/are being conducted, with ISU approval, by the respective Associations:

Venue — Sporting Shooters' Association at Springvale, Victoria, some 15m (24km) south-east of Melbourne along Princes Highway (Highway 1)—known also as Dandenong Road. Grounds then on the left, opposite Sandown racecourse.

(NOTE: As of July 1974 all Australian road signs will be expressed in kilometres.)

In general competition shooting there are basically two different types of shooting, and, irrespective of the types of firearms (either pistol, rifle or shotgun), the targets used are either "fixed position" or "moving" targets.

The Moving Target Section of Olympic or International Shooting Union embraces:

(a) Clay Pigeon shooting, where the target size simulates the body structure of a pigeon in flight — minus the wings and feathers. Firearms used are 12 gauge shotguns.

(b) Running Boar shooting — this is simulated field shooting at a paper target sized 51 inches × 29 inches, being a colored replica of a full-sized European Wild Boar, with scoring rings superimposed over the heart/lung area. The target travels back and forward, on an open run, over a 10 metre opening and each shooter at a range of 50 metres has to fire a shot on each run, using a special running boar .22 rimfire rifle. The match is of 30 slow and 30 fast runs per shooter:

Slow = boar covers 10 metres (30 feet) in 5 seconds.

Fast = boar covers 10 metres (30 feet) in 2½ seconds.

The aiming point is approximately 27 inches ahead of the bullseye, depending on the ammunition used.

Both of these types of shooting were included in the 1973 Moving Target allocations to the Australian Shooting Association, two of whose members are the Australian Clay Target Association and the Sporting Shooters' Association of Australia.

The Clay Target Section will be conducted by the Australian Clay Target Association at its member club, the Melbourne Gun Club situated some 30 road miles (48.3 kilometres) east of Melbourne in the Shire of Lilydale and more specifically described as — travel the Maroondah Highway (Highway 34) from Melbourne, thence when reaching the top of Albert Hill, just before the township of Lilydale, turn left at Victoria Road and proceed five miles (some 8 kilometres) due north where the road terminates in the gun club property.

The Running Boar section will be conducted at Springvale which is 15 road miles (24 kilometres) south-east of Melbourne along Princes Highway (Highway 1). The complex is situated on the north side of the highway immediately east of the overpass to Sandown Race Course — this section is conducted by the Sporting Shooters' Association.

Each of such Moving Target Championships are being conducted by the Associations concerned as separate ventures within the combined programme as submitted to, and agreed by the International Shooting Union.

Australia's shotgun entrants for both the 1973 ISU World Championships and the 1974 British Commonwealth Games will be selected by the Association from the highest scorers in the ISU Trench and ISU Skeet finals scheduled for October 5, 6, 7 at Lilydale, Victoria.

The Xth British Commonwealth Games will be conducted at Yaldhurst, Christchurch, New Zealand, over the period January 25th to February 1st and Australia may field four shotgunners — two for ISU Trap and two for ISU Skeet. Opening Day is January 24, but practice shooting will be available from January 14.

Christchurch, the venue city, is only the second Games city to include shooting in the programme. With trapshooting it has commenced a further new competition and from New Zealand comes the information dated 28-8-73.

"... one of the chaps who called in to see me, said the standard of performance was not high and probably only four or five South Islanders will be invited to compete in the final trial September 22, 23. The number of North Island finals trialists will be greater but they still have a shock in store for them as they have not competed over the universal trap ... the speed of the target is completely bamboozling many of our good shots."

Shooting was introduced to the Commonwealth Games at Kingston, Jamaica in 1966. Records are: Smallbore rifle, prone, world 599; Commonwealth 587. Free Pistol, world 572, Commonwealth 544. Rapid Fire Pistol, world 598, Commonwealth 585. Skeet, world 200; Commonwealth none. Trap, world 199; (none for auto-trap); Commonwealth, none. 7.62 rifle, world none; Commonwealth 394.

Running Boar shooting is not a part of Commonwealth Games however New Zealand is staging such a demonstration shoot during the 1974 Games period.

The following Commonwealth Games will be at Edmonton, Canada in 1978.

All shooters are alerted with the information that the British Government is considering imposing a new law referred to as "The Control of Firearms in Great Britain," and as evidently prepared in a document referred to as the "Green Paper."

It appears that the proposals are to prohibit the inheritance by will of gun ownership from father to son/daughter/or chosen heir; to forbid lending or borrowing guns; to cease inheritance of antique firearms; to confiscate automatic shotguns; to disfigure some guns.

A.C.T.A. National President Mr Gordon Hall has written to the Australian Government Federal Minister, Mr G. C. Scholes . . . "I am vitally interested in the reported plan being prepared by the Federal Attorney General, Senator L. Murphy, on National registration of firearms and a central computerised ballistics file . . . As we are a body very much involved in the promotion of safety with the use of guns and with the training of all members in the correct use of guns on and off the competition ground, we are anxious to offer comment on the proposed legislation at the appropriate time."

STOP PRESS

The A.C.T.A. Executive Committee met in Melbourne over September 10, 11, 12 of 1973, to discuss all matters of clay target shooting in Australia.

The following items are motions, or extracts of motions, to be published immediately. These, with other decisions and matters of interest, will be further contained in our next publication.

(1) No release trigger guns are henceforth permitted on any registered member club ground within the A.C.T.A.

(Note: This registration includes all visitors to Australia.)

* * *

(2) It is an A.C.T.A. requirement that all shooters, contesting the elimination events for the 1973 World Shooting Championships and the 1974 Commonwealth Games, ensure that they have each complied with the provisions of amateur status.

* * *

(3) As from October 1973, all shooters not having paid the full \$10 annual registration fee will not be mailed further copies of the 1973 publications of A.C.T.A. "Shooting News." (See May, 1973, page 5).

* * *

(4) In view of production costs and space content, apropos the recent scheduled increases in Australian postal rates, all further publications of A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" will not contain lists of shooter

registrations or handicap amendments but a full list of registrations will be published in the July publication each year.

* * *

(5) To all clubs installing, repairing or rejuvenating shooting grounds:

(a) "Down-the-line" and "Skeet" shooting rules are being converted to the metric system of weights and measurements as from January 1, 1975.

(b) Under the metric system, the handicap marks will be in one metre intervals, from 11 to 25 metres inclusive on shooting lanes, one metre wide, radiating out from the trap at the same angles as existing shooting lanes.

* * *

An A.C.T.A. fund has been established to support the 1973 World Shooting Championships and the fund is to be used for uniforms/badges (gold, silver, bronze), master awards, etc., to be won by the Australian and International Shooters.

(Note: Some cheques and some cash have been lodged with A.C.T.A. to commence this fund but the respective donors seek no personal recognition but merely that the fund be an "A.C.T.A. fund" for the above purpose.) Further donations would be appreciated.

(6) The 1974 Australian National Clay Target Championships both trap and skeet will be conducted at the Melbourne Gun Club, near Lilydale, Victoria within the period Tuesday, March 5 to Wednesday, March 13, with one national event daily excepting Sunday which will be a free day. The daily sequence of events will be Skeet, Double Rise; Grand Handicap; Double Barrel; Free Day; Single Barrel; ANZ Points Decision; thence on the last day will be the International Trap Teams Match and the Champion of Champions event. The grounds will have 7 x DTL trap layouts of which one will be retained as a spare and for practice shooting. Four of these layouts are superimposed with skeet layouts. \$300 value compulsory division handicap events will be conducted if time is available during the programme.

* * *

(7) The 1975 Australian National Clay Target Championships will be conducted at the Tasmanian Gun Club at Launceston, Tasmania, during March, 1975. The actual dates will be decided and made public during the 1974 National Championships at Melbourne, Victoria.

(8) It is noted that in subsequent years that the successive National Championship venues of SA, Victoria and Tasmania may not be so concurrent because of directional considerations of shooter participants.

AMATEUR RULES

A. The principles of amateurism, laid down in the declaration of the International Olympic Committee at its Congress of 1947 are valid for all members of the International Shooting Union.

B. Money prizes up to \$25U.S. or its equivalent are considered as a compensation for costs. If there is a shooting contest covering several days, money totalling \$100 or its equivalent within the same week are also considered a compensation for costs without detailed specification from the competitors. Money prizes exceeding the above-mentioned sums must be given to the club to which the competitor belongs. The competitor may receive from his club only the sum corresponding to his actual costs, which may include:

1. Entrance Fees.
2. Ammunition.
3. Travelling expenses.
4. Costs for meals and lodgings (in relation to the general level and normally not exceeding 10 dollars or 3 pounds or 35 Swiss francs, etc., per day).

C. This article applies to all categories of shooting supervised by the International Shooting Union.

D. An amateur should not be considered as:

1. Anyone who gives an exhibition in marksmanship for any pecuniary reward.
2. Anyone whose principal profession is test shooting of guns or ammunition. The operator of a test shooting machine is not necessarily included in this category.
3. Anyone who is a professional instructor in shooting.
4. Anyone who accepts money prizes in excess of those allowed according to the rules of amateurism.

E. Paragraphs D2 and 3 categories do not apply to a member of the armed forces, who acts as an instructor, if his work is solely educational and cannot be considered as coaching of shooters for competition.

F. The competitor should fulfil the qualifications of amateurism laid down by the National Olympic Committee of his country.

G. In judging the status as an amateur according to article D and E, the activities of the competitor during the past two years should be considered.

- (1) As of 1/1/72 past A.C.T.A. rules allowing inward movement on handicap ratings are discontinued, except for extreme physical disabilities.
- (2) At the time of each annual shooter re-registration, a one yard inward will be granted by A.C.T.A. and shown on the handicap card, as issued accordingly — excepting those shooters who request to remain on their earned handicaps.

COMMON MARK SHOOTING

- (i) Shooters are to be classed into three classes by their performance, excluding shoot-offs, over each 500 targets from 16 yards, double barrel, single barrel or points score with broken targets to count.
- (ii) Handicapping procedures are applicable in championships and class events, in accordance with Rule 149, to shooters who are competing on or behind their handicap marks.
- (iii) Shooters may compete in one class only. Any shooters may nominate in any class higher than his own, but by doing so he forfeits the right to compete in his own class.

- (iv) Shooters mark their own cards progressively for common mark shooting and at November 30 annually AND/OR after 500 programmed targets the card must be submitted to the club secretary for correct classification and reporting to A.C.T.A. central records.

- (v) The classes are to be:

Australian A class = 90% to 100%
 Australian B class = 85% and under 90%
 Australian C class = all under 85%

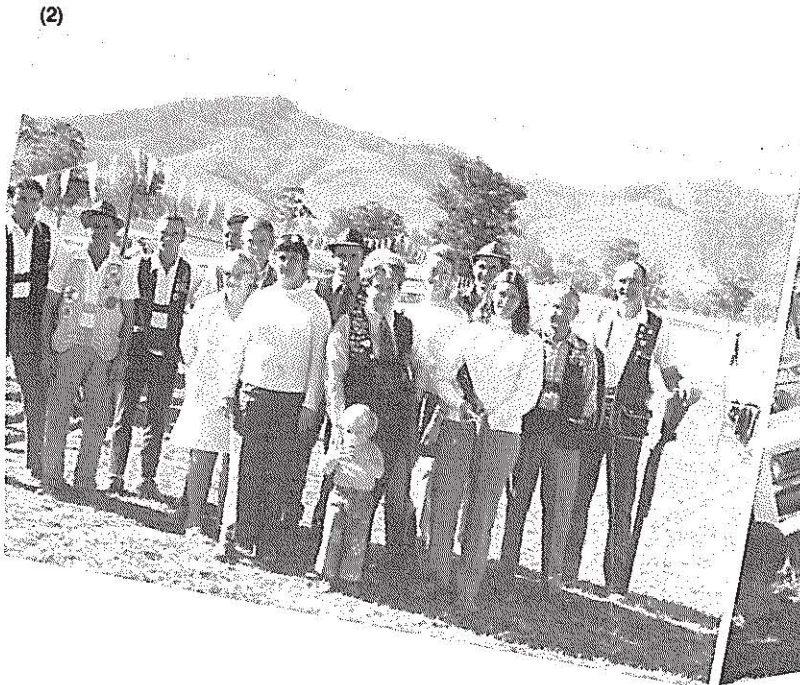
