



Editor's Notes



A.C.T.A. OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

Applications for open championships to be contested during 1975 (that is, Commonwealth, State and District Titles) are required to be lodged, under Rule 27, by member clubs, in writing on the prescribed form number 16, not later than Friday, June 28, 1974. Late applications receive no consideration.

Preference will be given to clubs which — (a) have the capacity to conduct the various types of shoots, i.e., the capacity in both equipment and current management. (Note — oscillating traps must be used, that is — Snipe, Damo, Winchester, and the like, but NOT “plus” traps.)

(b) have submitted proposed dates together with their requested title events.

Those championships allocated by the Executive Committee for the 1975 year will be published in November 1974, “Clay Target Shooting News.”

If no club advertising material has arrived two months before a Commonwealth Title event, then the Secretary-Editor is empowered to insert an appropriate advertisement and to charge the club concerned at the late insertion rate.

Clubs allocated State Titles events by the Committee are expected to advertise these State events in A.C.T.A. “Shooting News”.

Clubs failing to submit advertising copy for Interstate Teams’ and similar major events, will not receive such consideration in future Executive Committee allocations.

Shoot approvals will be issued, in writing, and are subject to the correct interpretations of A.C.T.A. Rules by the clubs concerned and are designed to avoid clashing of major programmes with nearby clubs.

Commonwealth, State or District Championships will not be allocated to clubs which fail to either apply the handicapping formula correctly, or which fail to submit handicap returns for each shoot.

No trophies or prize monies may be handed to any shooter without the previous submission of his current handicap card (see Rule 18) correctly classified and progressively marked showing his shooting performance to date. It is the responsibility of each shooter to keep his own handicap card up to date, and this information he always gains by looking at the scoreboard during, and after, contesting any event. It is then the responsibility of the club secretary to notify A.C.T.A. central records, using the handicap return form, of any changes in —

- (a) a shooter’s class for common mark shooting;
- (b) a shooter’s change of handicap as prescribed in the handicapping formula.

All Mini Targets allocations have been rejected by the State of Tasmania and are available for re-allocation.

All applications shall be collated and submitted to the Executive Committee for consideration and allocation. Member clubs are requested to measure their applications and to apply only for championships which can be satisfactorily conducted between January 1 and December 31, 1975.

Attention Victorian Shooters — at the time of this publication going to press the recent heavy flooding has caused a number of sporting activities to be cancelled. These included:

Wangaratta — North Eastern SB C'ship — now held over from May 18 till a date to be decided.

Tatura — Victorian State (Day) Double Rise C'ship — changed from May 17 to June 16.

Melbourne G.C. — heavy local floodings entered the clubhouse and shooting facilities in 1972 and 1973 and also on 16-5-1974.

1975 National Clay Target Championships — by direction of the Executive Committee, an advisory panel consisting of Vice-President, Mr A. Pedersen; Secretary, Mr C. M. Berry and Shoot Marshals, Messrs: B. and A. Wembridge visited the Tasmanian Gun Club, at Launceston, Tasmania over May 11-12 and found the club, its amenities, facilities and management committee all that could be desired.

The club has an excellent ladies auxiliary who are keen to arrange sightseeing trips to places of social and historical interest.

Where as the mainland has partially accepted American styles of modern diet and entertaining, the northern Tasmanians live and maintain their sense of history within their daily living and entertainment.

The Tasmanian Premier Mr Eric Reece will fire the opening shot during the first day, Tuesday, March 4, 1975. The national programme will continue till p.m. Wednesday, March 12.

Reservations have been made for all types of hotel, motel, private hotel, caravan park, hire car services. Some shipping space is available but only for the "early birds."

For the information of those interested, a full gambling casino is being built in Launceston and is scheduled to be operating by end December, 1974.

STOP PRESS

As the costs of clay targets have had a sharp increase, it has become necessary to increase the permitted nominations for District, State and Commonwealth Championships by \$1.00 each to \$4, \$5 and \$6 respectively. This decision is effective immediately by all member clubs concerned.

NATIONAL HIGH GUN WINNERS

Annually since 1966 a Browning under-and-over shotgun has been presented to the highest gun scorer over the main D.T.L. trap events viz., Champion of Champions, Double Barrel, Double Rise, Single Barrel, Australia-New Zealand and the Grand Australian, with the provision that each shooter can gain this award only once. If a shoot-off is necessary to determine the High Gun winner, then the shoot-off shall be conducted as prescribed in A.C.T.A. Rules.

We are sorry to report that Committeeman Mr Don Hughes is very ill and has resigned from the





I recently had the good fortune to spend eight weeks in Great Britain. During this time I was able to visit most of the leading gunmakers, enjoy some rough shooting at wild pheasant and pigeons, and to visit a well-known shooting ground. In the belief that my views may be of some interest to other shooters in Australia, I put my impressions on paper.

For simplicity's sake, this article is divided into several parts. The parts are:

Part 1. The Visitor and the Law.

Part 2. Organisations associated with shooting in the UK.

Part 3. Principal Gunmakers — A Visitor's Viewpoint.

Some General Observations.

PART 1

THE VISITOR AND THE LAW

On arrival in the UK the overseas visitor with a shotgun, providing he arrives at one of the major points of entry, will find that he is treated courteously and efficiently by HM Customs Officers.

The principal legislation concerning firearms in the UK (not N. Ireland) is the 1968 Firearms Act. Sensibly this act, although tough by Australian standards, recognises the many and varied reasons for a sportsman to arrive at a British port with one or more shotguns in his luggage. Provided a full and frank declaration is made to HM Customs and your intentions are strictly honorable the following provisions of the 1968 Act will apply.

A visit of not more than 30 days' duration

No permit is necessary for a stay, the duration of which, is less than 30 days in total. Customs authorities once satisfied of your bona fides may note the weapon types, makes and serial numbers together with passport details. You will be required to report to the nearest police station on arrival at your destination and advise them of the weapons held.

The under 30 days provision is designed to cater for the needs of overseas visitors entering the UK for competitive shoots, sporting game shoots and expatriates returning to the UK for holidays of short duration.

Visits in excess of 30 days' duration

A visitor proposing to stay longer than 31 days and up to six months requires a "Visitor's Shotgun Certificate." This costs one English pound and is valid for a period of six months. Application has to be made to the Chief Constable of the area in which you will be spending the greater part of your vacation. An application form has to be completed at your local police station and witnessed by a suitable person. Do not expect the approval to come through in under several weeks as your application is considered at several levels within the police organisation.

By far the simplest method is to write air mail to the Chief Constable of the area it is intended to visit about six to eight weeks in advance. The forms will be sent to you as will your Visitor's Shotgun Certificate in due course and after payment by bank cheque of the one English pound. By doing this you will have a trouble-free shooting holiday. An added advantage is that you will be able to purchase shotguns from dealers or individuals holding shotgun certificates. You will also be free to trade-in or sell your own guns if you so wish.

Visits in excess of six months

In this category you will be treated as a permanent resident and have to follow the full procedure which requires references from persons not related to you. Reasons for requiring the guns may be quite closely scrutinised depending upon the attitude of the Chief Constable towards shooting.

Northern Ireland

Sufficient to say that in view of the current problems the most stringent of regulations apply. A special Firearms Act applies for Northern Ireland.

Additional information

The potential shooting visitor is well advised to obtain a copy of the free Home Office leaflet "Firearms — What you need to know about the law." This is available from the Central Office of Information, Police Chief Constables, Gunmakers and members of the Gun Trade Association. Presumably,

and I have not checked, it would also be available from the British High Commission.

Protection of Birds Acts 1954-1967

Makes it illegal to shoot certain birds at any time. The Acts also provide that certain other birds may only be shot during the open season prescribed for them.

Game Licences

It is unlawful to shoot game without a game licence and the fee varies according to the length of the validity of the licence. For example a visitor or resident for a period of 14 days will pay two English pounds. For the full season of August 1 to July 31, the cost will be six English pounds.

Cartridges

No restriction applies to the purchase of shotgun cartridges. All other ammunition requires a valid Fire Arms Certificate to purchase.

Reloading components

Are readily available for purchase by all. Powder in most common use is the Nobel 80 and 82 series. This powder has replaced, in the UK, the familiar 60-62-64 powders. The two powders are *not* directly interchangeable.

Curiously Black Powder (Gunpowder) requires a police permit to purchase. A relic of wartime legislation never repealed!

PART 2

ORGANISATIONS ASSOCIATED WITH SHOOTING IN THE UK

In Britain, as in Australia, the shooting fraternity is represented by a variety of bodies looking after sectional interests. I shall confine myself to those bodies associated with shotgun shooting. Before doing so however, I cannot resist the temptation to state my opinion that the time is rapidly approaching when, for our own good in the long-term, we must form some type of National Organisation representing *all* the shooting sports. A case of united we stand — divided we fall.

First and foremost of the organisations from the A.C.T.A. members' point of view will be:

The Clay Pigeon Shooting Association (C.P.S.A.)

This is the UK equivalent of A.C.T.A. and is an association comprised of individual shooters and a federation of clay pigeon clubs. The C.P.S.A., like A.C.T.A., is in close contact with the International Shooting Union (I.S.U.) and other official organisations connected with the sport.

C.P.S.A. is headed by a full-time Director, Mr Peter Page, and a small staff. Headquarters are located at Angel Road, London, N 18. Annual subscriptions are low by Australian standards but then the shooting season is much shorter due to vagaries of the climate.

Clay pigeon shooting is booming in Britain and has been for the past few years. Membership of C.P.S.A. is now many times what it was five years ago.

The C.P.S.A. actively encourage all forms of clay target shooting at all levels from club competitions to International events. In addition to DTL Skeet, "Sporting Clays" are very popular. Sporting clays being a field lay-out designed to test the shooter's skill at targets simulating the various shots that may be encountered in shooting various forms of wild bird life and may include a "bolting rabbit."

The Wildfowlers' Association of Great Britain and Ireland (W.A.G.B.I.)

W.A.G.B.I. — for shooting and conservation — comprises in excess of 25,000 members and actively represents the interests of the wildfowler and rough shooter alike. The title is somewhat misleading to the uninitiated and in 1973 the additional wording "For Shooting and Conservation" was added.

W.A.G.B.I. is most actively engaged in the practical aspects of conservation. It conducts courses for newcomers to the sport of shooting. Very importantly in view of the present British political attitude of appearing to want even more restrictive firearms legislation, W.A.G.B.I. has been in the forefront of efforts to modify the Government's proposals. By rejecting completely the hysterical approach and settling for well reasoned and documented arguments, backed at all times by an active membership. W.A.G.B.I. has assisted in causing the Government to withdraw the more unreasonable aspects of recently proposed legislation.

W.A.G.B.I. Headquarters are located at Grosvenor House, 104 Watergate St., Chester. Annual subscriptions range from one English pound for a junior member under 17 to four English pounds for full membership.

The British Field Sports Society (B.F.S.S.)

The B.F.S.S. caters for all the "field sports" common to Britain. As such its activities range from point to point races, fishing, shooting and deerstalking to mention but a few. Each year the B.F.S.S. conducts a Game Fair designed to bring townspeople into contact with field sports and activities. The Game Fair is staged in a different part of the country each year and draws record crowds each successive year.

B.F.S.S. Headquarters are located at 26 Caxton St., London, SW1.

In addition to the three major organisations already mentioned, the following organisations are worthy of mention.

The Gun Trade Association

Comprises the established members of the Gun Trade both in London and Birmingham and the provinces.

The Shooting Sports Trust

Formed in 1972 from British manufacturers and importers of sporting guns and cartridges who have agreed to contribute 0.5 per cent of their annual UK turnover. Approximately twenty-three thousand English pounds a year are distributed for the benefit of the shooting sports as a whole.

PART 3

PRINCIPAL GUNMAKERS — A VISITOR'S VIEWPOINT

I propose dealing with the London gunmakers first of all. My reason for doing so is that most of the famous names of English gunmaking are to be found within the City of London. Indeed, a London Best Gun is unrivalled by any maker in the world today. The order in which the gunmakers appear is purely coincidental and in no way reflects my own order of merit.

Thomas Bland & Sons (Gunmakers) Ltd. (21 New Row, St. Martins Lane, London, WC2)

The House of Bland was established in 1840 and has been making guns bearing its name since that date. Bland's now only make good quality boxlock sporting guns and the following models are currently available to order:

Delivery time for any of the above guns would be in excess of one year. Bland's are also agents and stockists for most small arms manufacturers and carry a very wide range of accessories indeed. The firm of Thomas Bland & Sons is held in high repute for its mail order dealings with overseas clients.

Boss & Company (13/14 Cork Street, Piccadilly, London, W1)

Boss & Company make only one grade of gun. Best Grade. On entering the Cork Street premises I was a little disappointed. Having expected to see rows of best guns I found the shop rather bare. An elderly craftsman was meticulously cleaning a pair of guns for a client and a few guns were on display behind glass-fronted cabinets.

Boss & Company are the only London gunmakers to my knowledge that specialise in Over and Under guns. In addition, the Boss single trigger mechanism is regarded as the finest in the world. So versatile is the trigger mechanism that it is absolutely safe even when regulated to a pull of only 1 lb. (Australian law requires a minimum pull of 2½ lb. on importation, no matter how fine the mechanism).

Churchill (Gunmakers) Ltd. (7 Bury Street, St. James's, London, SW1)

Churchills, or to give their full title Churchill, Atkin, Grant and Lang, are known world-wide. Founded in 1891 by E. J. Churchill the firm has absorbed those makers now in its title into its organisation. In addition Churchill's have absorbed F. Beesley; Harrison & Hussey; Charles Hellis and Sons and Watson Brothers. The company's claim to have been established in 1821 relates to the former firm of Joseph Lang.

The late Robert Churchill is remembered for the introduction of the world famous XXV inch barrels and the controversy that surrounded their introduction. He is also remembered for his work on forensic ballistics in his book "Game Shooting."

Holland & Holland (13 Bruton St., London, W1X 8JS)

Holland & Holland or Holland's as they are commonly referred to are very much worth a visit. For the shooting man or the collector there is a lot to interest one at Holland's. On entering the premises it becomes obvious that this is no ordinary gun shop. The staff are dressed in black coats and the manager wears a black coat with tails. In the entrance is a magnificent set of armour for a horse. Next to the armour is a fine bronze cannon. Around the walls are glass-fronted cases containing a very fine selection of antique firearms and edged weapons. Every facet of arms collecting is catered for. In addition a fine selection of shooting books both new and collector items is maintained.

Speaking from personal experience I can assure you that underneath the formal air of the staff lies a very real willingness to assist. Nothing is too much trouble. Mr McKelvey, the manager, happily showed me all

sorts of weapons knowing full well that I would not buy one of them.

I doubt if there is a shooting man in the English speaking world who has not heard of the Purdey name. Purdey's commenced business in the reign of King George III and have been making the finest guns for over 150 years. Holders of numerous Royal Warrants and currently gun and cartridge makers to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and Gunmaker to the

Duke of Edinburgh.

The premises are really in two parts. The shop is quite plain and unassuming with very little, apart from a few accessories, on display. The "Long Room" however is quite a different story. Around the walls of red velvet patterned wallpaper are to be found portraits of members of the company, photographs of famous clients and of course glass-fronted cases of guns awaiting collection by their new owners. A very plush and tasteful room.

Waiting time for a Purdey gun from time of ordering to actual delivery is currently 3½ years. Currently available from Purdey's to order are the following guns:



Only a few doors up from Carnaby Street, the premises of John Wilkes and Co. confronts the visitor with an image almost out of Dickens. So packed are the premises with guns, gun cases and pieces of guns that there is hardly room to stand up let alone sit down anywhere.

The original John Wilkes founded the business in 1830 making it is believed weapons for the American Civil War and the Franco-Prussian war. The firm is still very much in control of the Wilkes family and is currently run by the brothers John and Tom Wilkes. So great is the demand for Wilkes guns that the firm ceased advertising quite a few years ago and make only a best sidelock and a best boxlock model. Prices for a best gun start at three thousand pounds and you could wait almost five years for delivery depending upon your individual requirement.

So much for the well-known London makers. Let me now turn to the provincial makers, some of whom are not so well-known in Australia but who, none the less, produce a very high order of craftsmanship.

Westley Richards & Co. Ltd.
(Grange Road, Bournbrook, Birmingham, B29 6AR)

Westley Richards have closed their city showroom in Birmingham and have moved back to their works at Bournbrook. A pity from the shooting visitors point of view as it is not as accessible to the visitor to Birmingham. The Bournbrook works gives the impression of considerable age. Not unreasonably as the firm was established in the reign of King George III.

Westley Richards is of interest to the collector as not only does the firm do restoration work to collectors' weapons but also deals in antique weapons. On the day I visited the works showroom there was available for purchase a wide range of flintlock, percussion and modern pistols, rifles and shotguns. Some of the cased sets of duelling pistols really took my fancy.

Currently available to order are two shotguns:

A best grade sidelock at 2200 pounds and a modified version of the Connaught boxlock at 750 pounds.

Delivery time is believed to be a bit over two years.

William Powell and Son
(35/37 Cars Lane, Birmingham, B4 7SX)

The firm of William Powell has been in existence for over 170 years having been founded in 1802. Powell guns are held in very high regard. Of the non-London makers Powell offers by far the widest


