



Editor's Notes



The attention of all shooters is drawn to TRAP RULE 30 which reads: "Shooting on the grounds at any place other than the firing point at legitimate targets only is prohibited except where a pattern plate is installed."

The instance made known on page 8 of June 1974 "Shooting News," was a safety matter of necessity as indicated, BUT, two other instances in other states have been reported after local club action was taken reference Rules 19, 30 and Association Articles 34 (d) and 34 (f).

Rule 19 reads — "Every competitor entering competitions agrees to accept all official decisions, and to abide by the rules controlling the competition.

Association Article 34 reads — "without detracting from the generality of the powers conferred on the Executive Committee it may" ———.

"(d) Suspend or disqualify from participation in any clay target trap shooting competition or meeting for such period as it shall seem proper ———."

"(f) Refuse any entry at any meeting, competition or event."

Whilst this July publication was at press and then being mailed to all shooters, the final elimination and selection for an Australian shotgun team was being conducted at the Melbourne Gun Club preparatory to a full shooting team assembling and departing Sydney by British Airways Flight 921 on Friday, September 6, 1974, for Zurich, Switzerland, for the 41st World Shooting Championships within the International Shooting Union.

The full shooting team will consist of 43 shooters taken from small bore rifle, pistol, shotgun and running boar associations. Overall shooting team manager will be W. R. (Bob) Morgan, who being a veteran representative of a number of such teams in

recent years, has been so appointed by the Australian Shooting Association because of his past such background and for his organising ability. Mr Morgan is currently the 1974 president of the Hobart Gun Club of Tasmania.

The shotgun section manager will be Mr Jules Steiner of Perth, Western Australia. The Australian Clay Target Association as an affiliate of the Australian Shooting Association within the International Shooting Union plans to field a team of four trench and two skeet shotgunners against the respective best clay target shooters of other member nations.

The Australian team is due to return to Sydney at 8 a.m. on Monday, October 7, 1974.

The A.C.T.A. must initially provide the fares for these shooters, thence the hope is to recoup some of this from the Federal Government and from various industrial and private donors. The cost for each member of the shooting team is around \$2000.

A private donation of \$10 has been received from shooter Henry Weitzel of Metropolitan Clay Target Club (Vic.) towards the costs.

On May 14, the Minister for Tourism and Recreation, Mr Frank Stewart made some further grants to sport in general from a \$1,000,000 budget allocation to aid amateur sport in Australia. On top of some 75 previous grants he made a further \$54,970 on May 14 to seven different sports and included was \$21,500 to the Australian Shooting Association which is yet to be received and distributed by the A.S.A. to the shooting associations whose teams are competing at Berne, Switzerland in September, 1974.

The six selectees are — Trench (4) Jim Ellis, South West; Ken Lowry, Melbourne; "Pud" Burgess, Cobarr; Sperry Marshall, Hobart; Reserve, Peter Wray, Melbourne. Skeet (2) Chris Carroll, Melbourne; Mark Little, Metropolitan. Additional two skeet

selectees subject to finance allotment are — Robin Bailey, Perth and Don Jones, Hobart, with reserve Graham Carroll, Melbourne. The reserves are hereby recorded simply to have names available in the event of any unforeseen personal circumstance. These selectees were accepted for the respective performances at the final eliminations conducted over June 22/23/24, at the Melbourne Gun Club from 63 trench and 29 skeet nominations. The skeet selectees averaged 185 per cent.

Shotgun team manager is Jules Steiner of Perth. Shotgun assistant team manager is "Pud" Burgess.

Wyong (NSW) — Secretary now is Mrs Beverly F. Britton.

Port Moresby (PNG) — Universal ISU layout now completely installed with phono-pull and scrambler and is functioning perfectly. Skeet traps are also being installed.

Bairnsdale (V) — Secretary now is Mr Gary Howard.

To whom it may concern — an unincorporated club is purported to have considered handling or selling spirituous liquors from within its club property during the conduct of a shoot. Whether the club is incorporated or unincorporated, such traffic is contrary to any known State or Commonwealth law unless the club concerned has a current licence issued under the appropriate Licensing Act. Most shooters are aware of this understandable provision and are also aware that should any accident or problem occur then the entire shooter insurance coverage as arranged by the Association is at stake. Goodwill is not a permanent asset — it can be lost in a departure from the ethical way of life or of doing business. Changes in personnel can have an adverse effect on some peoples' thinking and can cause goodwill to decline. Goodwill must be earned and no amount of glamour or publicity can take its place. The cause of many down-gradings can be traced to the simple facts of self-discipline, dependability and moral obligations.

Attention member clubs within the State of Victoria

1. The following self-explanatory letters and documents show the method by which member clubs can legitimately claim recompense for their actual FIREARMS TRAINING FOR JUNIORS.

2. The letter from the Government of Victoria, Chief Secretary's office, indicates the availability of some funds to assist such training schools. This is followed by an application form as designed by the Chief Secretary's office which must be completed by the club then submitted to the A.C.T.A. (the parent body) for recommendation and onward submission.

3. (a) Clubs seeking to lodge claims within the above arrangements may request a "Form for Firearms Training" from the A.C.T.A.

3. (b) One club has already lodged an application for training assistance, BUT, the club sought \$300 for the purchase of a new trap!! Consequently, the Chief Secretary's office has asked that applications be received by the A.C.T.A. up till August 31, 1974, that they be then reconsidered for further submission from an Association point of view. The Chief Secretary's office might then make an overall grant for distribution by the Association with such distribution in keeping within the existing capacity and meaning of the fund as indicated in the following letter from the Under Secretary.

4. As a number of member clubs within the State of Victoria do conduct shotgun shooting training, usually in conjunction with a recognised school, Mr Harry Brooksby, Instructor (and a master) at Warrnambool North Technical School was asked by A.C.T.A. Secretary for details of his current shooting arrangements.

5. Copies then follow herewith of (a) Mr Brooksby's reply of May 24, 1974.

(b) Warrnambool North Technical School's form for pupil's parents to complete, sign and lodge.

(c) Warrnambool North Technical School Gun Club shooting training programme for the second term (May 30 to August 22) of 1974.

6. A.C.T.A. Secretary Comment — The Australian Clay Target Association being a registered non-profit company in the State of Victoria, has many excellent member clubs throughout the Commonwealth of Australia, some of which assist the firearms training of youth both male and female, in the use of shotguns at clay targets, that is, synthetic wild game shooting. These clubs provide their shooting facilities plus recognised shooters and A.C.T.A. Referees for the safe and instructive conduct of these shoots. In this specific instance Mr Brooksby — himself a registered A.C.T.A. shooter — is one of that band of people who have chosen teaching as a lifetime career. We are all indebted to those of the calibre of Mr Brooksby in

that, by-and-large, and not being of industry, they do not see their finished products of youth growing into manhood and womanhood. Suffice to say that our next generation(s) are in excellent care in the hands of Mr Brooksby and those others like him.

Dear Sir,

Firearms (Amendment) Act 1972

As you will be aware, Section 22AC (7) of the above Act provides for the establishment in the Treasury of a "Firearms Training Fund." The Fund came into operation on 1st January, 1973, and is made up of fees paid for Junior Shooters' Permits. Sub-Section (8) of Section 22 AC (7) provides that, once in every year, the Chief Secretary shall determine the distribution of the moneys standing to the credit of the Firearms Training Fund amongst clubs and organisations approved by the Minister for supervising and conducting the training of persons in the handling and use of firearms.

The Minister is aware that there are many clubs which might consider that they can advance claims for payments from the Fund. In order to create an appropriate system of determining eligibility for payment, the Chief Secretary has decided that he will invite applications for such payments from "parent" organisations on behalf of their constituent members. The Chief Secretary would be pleased if you would agree to have your organisation process claims on behalf of member clubs.

The Minister has in mind that your organisation should invite applications from constituent members for payments from the Fund and, after appraisal of the applications, forward them to the Minister with recommendations as to the appropriate order of priority for payments having regard to the need for assistance and the capability of the clubs to conduct training in the manner envisaged by the Act. The amount available from the Fund at this time is not extensive as it contains approximately \$8,000. Having regard to this situation, it will be appreciated that it will not be likely that all applications for payment from the Fund in this financial year will be successful. This is a particular reason for the need to place applications in order of priority.

I attach a copy of an application form which might be used by member clubs in seeking payments from the Fund. From perusal of this form, you will appreciate the type of expenditure which the Minister considers would be a proper charge against the Fund.

Dear Merv.,

Please find enclosed a copy of our Gun Club program for the second term which I spoke to you about last weekend. I hope that this may be of some use to you.

The Warrnambool North Technical School started its Gun Club as a sports activity for interested students in 1971. Although we do call ourselves a Gun Club, I sometimes feel that Gun Safety Club would be a better term, as this is our main aim for the students during the time we have them.

In our first year we had 19 students, and the Club has been showing a steady increase in membership ever since. This year we have approximately 32-35 students from all walks of life in forms 3, 4 and 5, who have joined the Club. Of this number, there would be only about eight boys who were in the Club last year.

As you can see by our program, we shoot once a fortnight at the Warrnambool Gun Club. On the weeks that we don't shoot, the boys are shown films and given lectures. These lectures are given by the Police Department, Fisheries and Games Inspector and films shown on Reloading of Shotgun Shells, Gun

Care, etc., which we hope does make the students appreciate the do's and don'ts for proper gun handling, and hopefully an understanding of what conversation is all about.

The practical shooting is carried out the same way as would be experienced at any registered Gun Club, but only single barrel shooting is allowed for safety reasons. All students are required to take their turn in the traphouse, scoring and cleaning up of the grounds after the shoot, which helps in their development as club members.

Throughout the year all scores are recorded for a High Gun Trophy and we usually wind up having a barbecue and championship before the school year finishes.

Over the past three years members of the local Gun Club have given assistance with instruction and trophies for the boys. We would also like to thank I.M.I. and Winchester for the interest and support they have contributed to the members of this club.



Re: Public Liability Insurance Policy M5/10406.

We refer to a number of conversations with you, over the past year, wherein we have discussed the extent of the cover granted by the above policy, and trust that the following explanation will clarify the situation.

In brief, the Operative clause of the Policy reads as follows:—

To Indemnify the insured association and/or its registered shooter members against their legal liability for accidental bodily injury to persons, and/or damage to property, whilst participating in an organised shoot or acting as individuals at a closed range, which is an Association approved and/or properly licensed range.

Extensions:—

(i) Liability of one Registered Shooter member to another.

(ii) Liability for Food and Drink poisoning.

Territorial Limits: Anywhere in the Commonwealth of Australia and Territory of Papua and New Guinea.

Our discussions have also concentrated on the question of the establishment of the status of a Registered shooter member. Under Article 49 (a) of the Associations' Articles of Association, it is obligatory for member clubs to ensure that no person may enter or compete at any competition or event unless such person is registered with the Association.

However, as you have pointed out, other persons, who may be competing at a range, would fall into the categories of Honorary and/or visiting shooters.

On discussing this aspect with the Company, it has been resolved that, providing that such persons are included on a Score Card and/or are properly introduced and entered in the Visitors' Book of the Member Club, such persons will be treated as a Registered Shooter Member.
