



Have you arranged your accommodation in or near Launceston for the 1975 National Championships? Some 364 shooters and others have made their arrangements with the travel agents - Contact Mr. Ray Walker of Ansett Airlines, 54 Brisbane Street, Launceston, 7250.

Michaelis Bayley Trading have indicated to us that they will donate a model 600 SKB shotgun (value \$379 retail) to the best overall scorer in the "B" class at the 1975 National Championships.

F. C. Lovelock Pty. Ltd. have indicated that they wish to donate, on behalf of Texan Reloading Presses, one Mark IV Texan Reloading Press (value \$480)) as a trophy for decision by the Executive Committee apropos the 1975 Nationals.

IMI Australia Ltd. will donate a Luigi-Franchi Skeet Gun to the best overall scorer in the 1975 National Skeet Championship.

Winchester Australia will provide, on a continuing basis, a Winchester Presentation Grade U/O shotgun for presentation to the National Championship's overall trap events high gun winner.

The Winchester 1974 Trap Tournament Final Round is to be conducted at the Brisbane Gun Club on October 27 (see separate details elsewhere in this publication).

The full Australian 1974 Shooting Team of 43 members - comprising small bore rifle, pistol, running boar and shotgun shooters - gathered at a reception, 4 p.m. till 6 p.m. at the Travelodge Motel, Tullamarine International Airport, Melbourne, on Wednesday, September 5. Joint hosts were IMI Australia Ltd. and Winchester Australia Pty. Ltd. The team departed by British Airways for Switzerland the following day.

Separately within this publication are the definitive time-tables of this world series plus a list showing the world's ten best shooters prior to the conduct of these 41st world shooting championships.

Whilst the A.P.S.U.A. (Amateur Pistol Shooting Union of Australia) and other kindred sporting associations provide for progressively accumulating funds, year by year, to send their shooters abroad to Olympic Games, Commonwealth Games and International Shooting Union World Championships, the Australian Clay Target Association has financed the 1973 and 1974 teams from surpluses achieved at past national championships. Regretfully this 1974 year at Melbourne, saw no such surplus.

However, at this stage, the action of sending Australia's intial teams abroad into the highly competitive international field is to be applauded as, at our first such entry, an Australian team secured bronze trench shooting medal placings against the world's best shotgunners (see A.C.T.A. "Shooting News," Vol. 27, No. 1, January-February, 1974), and a bronze skeet shooting medal (see A.C.T.A. "Shooting News," Vol. 27, No. 2 of March, 1974).

The A.C.T.A. must initially bear the cost of such entries into the international shooting field, as by such participations, our own betterment of shooting has been achieved in all its varied and ancillary aspects.

Support from shooter and gun club levels for our team has been disappointing, however, subsidies/donations received to date by the A.C.T.A. towards the costs of sending the shotgun shooters (four trap and three skeet shooters, with the fourth skeet shooter to be selected by the shotgun section team manager from those Australian trapshooters present) to Switzerland are \$3500 from the Federal Government via the Australian Shooting Association, \$10 from shooter Henry Weitzel of Metropolitan Clay Target Club (Vic.) and \$20 from shooter Don Sullivan of Hay Gun Club (NSW).

Throughout the Commonwealth, rainfall during the end of the 1974 winter period, exceeded all past records and floodings have been reported from gun clubs in many areas.

Melbourne Gun Club (Vic.), has been flooded for the fourth time within the last three years and their August 24 scheduled shoot had to be cancelled because of this latest such happening.

Wagga Gun Club (NSW), experienced the Murrumbidgee River relentless overflow and flooding during the first weeks of September 1974, when the flood waters became two feet deep over some miles of surrounding flat ground, BUT, what we are concerned with - the waters just lifted the traphouses right out of the ground. Whilst this area of New South Wales has known rising water problems before, this August-September 1974 period has surpassed all previously known historical records. As a consequence the scheduled NSW State section of the Interstate Trap Teams Match, scheduled for October 5 and 6 will now be held at the nearby Ganmain Gun Club over their three down-the-line traps - thanks to the courtesy of the Ganmain Gun Club. Details of the shoot are contained elsewhere in this publication.

Hay Gun Club (NSW), was also flooded. (See News and Views).

During 1974, the Australian economy has experienced the initial brunt of current rising costs and their resultant first effects on business in general, and at the stage of going to press with this publication our Association has had to meet and accept the effects of this confusing and unstable economic climate, together with other unscheduled costs (see earlier paragraph).

We have had major problems to date in attempting to maintain our charges for advertising, badges, stationery and the like but recent incoming advices leave no alternative but to restructure these schedules. In fact our advertising rates to industry, and our separate (subsidised) rates to member clubs had remained unaltered since 1968-1969 - this fact, has been known to the Executive Committee and steps are being taken to meet the situations.

# Australian shooters in New Caledonia

Australia was well represented during August 10 to 14, at the New Caledonian National Championships by nine shooters. New Zealand sent a strong contingent of 32 shooters and the rest of the field was made up from local New Caledonian shooters and Pacific Islanders.

The shooting ground, a Universal five trap trench system, was right up to world standards but the fish tail winds made shooting conditions most difficult.

Ten teams contested the International Teams Event and Australia and the Melbourne Gun Club were represented. In virtually a shot by shot encounter with the lead changing from round to round, the local New Caledonian crack shots Carreyre, Dupuy, Le Saulnier and Bareth finished two points ahead of the Australian team of Brian Mark, Brian Lowry, Bill Stone and Geoff Mark. The Melbourne Gun Club team of Tom Lucas, Peter Morton, Max Howell and Roy Garwood finished a further 25 points behind but 11 points ahead of the New Zealand team and took out the bronze medal.

#### Notes:

- (1) The New Zealanders fielded two teams a number 1 team and a number 2 team.
- (2) The official scoreboard showed Australian Team Number 1 and Australian Team Number 2—and there were obvious rumblings—(a) that individual club team entrants are rather unusual! (b) they also noted that Roy Garwood hails from Hobart Gun Club and Max Howell hails from Dundonnell in Victoria's Western District, and not from Melbourne Gun Club! (c) that Bill Stone (who is President, Australian Gun Club) deserved each and everyone of his trophy awards.

To date this was probably the most victorious Australian team to ever leave our shores as the final tally of 14 medals, three cups and two other trophies was far in excess of the wildest speculation.

The Individual Open Trench Championship saw another close finish with local New Caledonian Carreyre taking out the event by one point from W. Stone (Aust.) and Bareth of New Caledonia taking out the bronze medal. Only nine points separated the top 10 shooters and Australian shooters accounted for six of these. In order of finish Carreyre (NC), Stone (Aust.), Bareth (NC), Howell (Aust.), Lowry (Aust.), Parker (NZ), B. Mark (Aust.), Dupuy (NC), Morton (Aust.), Garwood (Aust.).

The International Trench Individual Event Category 1 for shooters not being resident of New Caledonia, the gold medal was won by W. Stone (Aust.) from M. Howell (Aust.) and Brian Mark (Aust.).

Category 2 gold medal was won by D. Parker (New Zealand) from T. Lucas (Aust.) and M. McDonald (New Zealand).

Category 3 gold medal was won by Geoff Mark (Aust.) from D. Welsh (New Zealand) and D. Benson (New Zealand).

Aggregate event for visiting shooters saw the medals go to Bill Stone (Aust.), Max Howell (Aust.), Brian Mark (Aust.) and Peter Morton (Aust.).


The aggregate held over the first 150 targets of the Individual Trench for visiting shooters saw Australia again in dominance with their respective winners W. Stone (Aust.) from Max Howell (Aust.) and Peter Morton (Aust.).

The closing ceremony and presentations were made by the Governor and the duly appointed Chief Organiser of all sports in New Caledonia.

The trophy value of the medals, cups, etc., ran into many thousands of dollars and the celebrations, after the completion of the trophy presentations, had to be seen to be believed. Everyone participated — officials, shooters, wives, TV crews, pressmen and even the large crowd of spectators drank dozens of bottles of French Champagne and ate mountains of savories and caviar and the celebrations went well into the night.

All the Australians were loud in their praise of the efficiency and hospitality of the whole of the population of New Caledonia, who really made them feel most welcome. This applied from the highest officials right down the line to the local taxi drivers and the trophy winners are eagerly awaiting to return to the 1975 Nationals.



They are not perpetual but are the winners to keep. These are the cups and trophies that go with the medals.






above ground level at scoreboard. referee, scorer as shown but check referees were at rear Station 1 showing trench at left of referees head. Note



present were invited to drink champagne from the winners' cups.


Clay target shooting in New Caledonia is expensive by Australian standards in that cartridges cost 21 francs each. (Exchange rate is 129 "CP" - or New Caledonia francs to the Australian dollar). In the eye-openers, targets-only cost 10 francs each. The air fare Sydney/Noumea/Sydney plus accommodation per shooter costs a minimum of \$252 Australian currency exclusive of food over the nine days. Meals at the gun club were around 400 francs plus wines which are plentiful. Restaurant meals were around 800 francs plus wines. Most Australians were accommodated in the luxurious "Chateau Royale" which is one of Noumea's best hotels.

Including three days of shooting nominations, fees and cartridges cost around 6000 francs per shooter to shoot the full programme.

Tours are available throughout the 200 mile by 30 mile island of Noumea plus the many nearby other islands. Fiji is three hours flying time and Sydney is two hours 40 minutes away.

Customs are severe on gun entries — some guns were held up to three days on arrival!

Most New Zealanders were accompanied by their wives whilst Mrs Garwood of Hobart was the only Australian lady present. Ample interesting boat, bus and air tours were available for the ladies, and for




