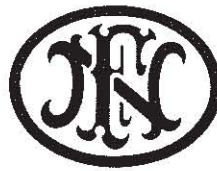

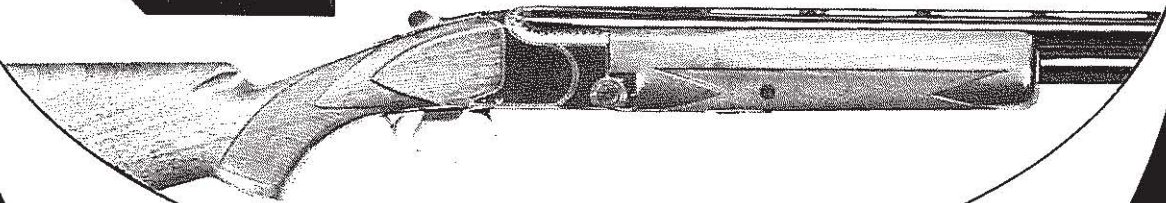

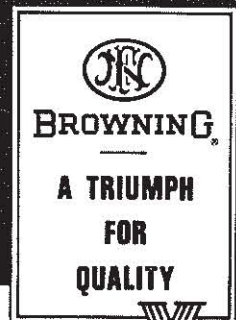

Editor's Notes



To all club secretaries and advertisers alike, copy for February, 1975, A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" closed on December 2, 1974, with the Secretary, A.C.T.A., G.P.O. Box 2038 S, Melbourne, 3001, as previously publicised. No January publication is made because of annual vacations within the printing industry.

REGISTERED SHOOTERS

Article 49 of the Articles of Association of the Australian Clay Target Association states: (a) The Association shall keep a register of shooters and no person may enter or compete at any Association competition or event conducted by a member Club of which a Delegate is a member of the Association unless such person is registered with the Association and is not in arrears with his subscription.

(b) Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall BEFORE THE THIRTY-FIRST DAY OF JANUARY IN EACH YEAR supply the Secretary with a full and accurate list of all members and shooters registered with such Club for the year commencing on the first day of January of such year and shall at the same time remit to the Secretary the subscriptions of such Club members and shooters. Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall also promptly forward to the Secretary of the Association the names and subscriptions of any such persons joining Club or registering as shooters after the thirty-first day of January in any year.

FEES

Club secretaries are reminded that club 1975 affiliation fee of \$10 is due and payable on January 1, 1975.

All club shooter members are reminded that their 1975 Association fees are due and payable through their club secretaries on January 1, 1975.

These shooter registration fees are \$10 for the 1975 calendar year, whilst juniors are registered for \$1 for the year. Juniors receive a handicap card but do not receive any publications of A.C.T.A. "Shoot-

ing News." Registered juniors seeking the publication must register for the full \$10. Irrespective of the class of registration fee, juniors are included in the A.C.T.A. Public Liability Insurance Policy as recently published — coverage is to \$200,000 — whilst the premium is borne by the A.C.T.A.

However, where registered A.C.T.A. persons have a common address, and are related, then on request only one copy of "Shooting News" is to be sent and a reduction of \$2 is permitted for the additional registered shooter at the time of registration.

Only subscribers to A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" may send \$8 direct to the Secretary for "Shooting News" publications.

No pro rata rates are accepted and all fees are for the calendar year concerned.

April 1975 "Shooting News" will be mailed only to those financial—that is, those whose fees are actually received by the Secretary as of February 14, 1975.

In view of the production costs and space content, apropos the recent scheduled increases in Australian postal rates, all further publications of the A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" will not contain lists of shooter registrations or handicap amendments but a full list of registration may be published in one publication each year.

By direction of the Committee, shooters who have not marked their cards with their progressive common mark scores throughout 1974 are to be classed by club secretaries as "A" Class shooters in the 1975 registration lists to be forwarded by club secretaries for A.C.T.A. processing.

Referees who do not fully register for any year, forfeit such status after three months (Association Article 34 (d)).

Separately within this publication is a supplementary 1975 Championship Allocation List. Any further unallocated major championships are withheld pending Executive Committee considerations.

As of January 1, 1975, all competitive clay target shooting in Australia uses the metric system of measurements and weights. The complete metric amendments to A.C.T.A. Shooting Rules were published in November 1974 A.C.T.A. "Shooting News." This December 1974 publication contains amendments to the actual shooting rules. It is envisaged that later in 1975 the A.C.T.A. Shooting Rules may be updated into a fully corrected brochure (pocket size) in handbook form. Each member club will ultimately receive such a rules book for club reference, BUT clubs are requested not to make demands for copies at this stage as all information will be made available in A.C.T.A. "Shooting News." Meanwhile, all concerned are asked to update their own rules books from the recently published amendment lists.

Amendments applicable to the current pocket size rules handbook are contained in these publications of A.C.T.A. "Shooting News": November 1973; pages 9/10; May 1974, pages 3, 4, 5; November 1974, pages 6, 7, 8, 9; December 1974, pages 7-10.

Separately within this publication are A.C.T.A. Break Records, the SKEET results of the 41st World Shooting Championships within the International Shooting Union (note—the TRENCH results were in our November publication), the full results of the 1974 Interstate TRAP and Interstate SKEET Teams' Matches, the 1974 Winchester Tournament TRAP Final, the A.C.T.A. Public Liability Policy with a supporting descriptive letter from our insurers, the Amateur Rules, the programmes of the 1975 Australian National Clay Target Championships, and of the New Zealand National Clay Target Championships.

The I.S.U. World Shooting Championships for shotgun and running boar will be conducted in Munich in September 1975. At this stage, the A.C.T.A. does not contemplate fielding teams at these championships in view of the costs involved. However, more details will be made known when available.

The Amateur Rules and amateur eligibility have been updated to modern thinking, but shooters are hereby advised that under Clause 5 (c) wearing the name of a gun or gunmaker or ammunition or ammunition manufacturer on shooting clothing renders immediate liability to the loss of amateur status. At the 1972 Olympic Games at Munich the International Olympic Committee acted against competitors appearing in track suits which displayed the name of a well known running shoe manufacturer on the back. Clause 2 of the eligibility rules also precludes from being an amateur anyone who sells guns, ammunition or components on a gun club ground.

The next New Zealand National Championships are scheduled to be conducted at the Waitemata Gun Club, some 14 miles north of Auckland, between April 7 and April 12.

The final section of the 1975 International Trap Teams' Match will be conducted by the Irish Clay

Pigeon Shooting Association near Dublin, Eire, on Friday, July 18, 1975. Any Australian team members or shooters visiting in the area at the time are cordially invited to attend the supporting tournament.

During October 7, 8, 9, the Association Executive Committee met and, amongst other items, the following decisions were made:

GENERAL

1. Recorded the death on 14/8/74 of the late Harold Smith recently retired from the Executive Committee after serving faithfully and well from 1964 to 1974.

2. Recorded with pleasure the success of the Australian team in winning the 28th International Trap Teams' Match for the Mackintosh Perpetual Trophy, (as published in September 1974 "Shooting News").

3. Decided that Australia would shoot its section of the 1975 such match from the sixteen metre mark.

4. That the venue for the 1976 National Championships will be the Perth Gun Club, Western Australia.

5. That a travel fund be established as of 1/1/75 by the A.C.T.A. for the express purpose of funding Australian teams for international competition by taking \$1.00 per senior shooter subscription each year, any donations, subsidies or government grants for team promotion plus nett profits from any national series at the discretion of a regular Executive Committee meeting.

6. That until sufficient funds are available in the travel fund account no further overseas teams be funded by the A.C.T.A.

7. That a travel fund be opened with \$500 from the general funds.

8. That a national coaching council of three be formed within the Executive Committee to examine circumstances and report.

9. That A.C.T.A. delegates (two are permitted) to the Australian Shooting Association be from the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee and that these be Messrs. P. Papps and A. M. Burgess with Mr. E. G. Biggs as proxy by arrangement.

10. (a) As from January 1, 1975, clubs must use metric handicap marks on the shooting lanes and targets must be thrown to the metric measurements of legal targets.

(b) All new installations must be constructed to the new metric measurements but it is not intended that existing traphouses or tower shooting stations be reconstructed.

(c) Under the metric system, the handicap marks will be in one metric intervals, from 11 to 25 metres inclusive on shooting lanes, one metre wide, radiating out from the trap at the same angles as existing shooting lanes.

11. That a postal poll of all clubs be held as follows:

1st, 2nd and 3rd outright with further trophies for particular marks (front marker, back marker, etc.) in open championships (District, State and Commonwealth).

12. That a recommendation be made to the next Annual General Meeting to discuss an increase of member club annual affiliation fee to \$25.00 as provided in Article 14—effective as of January 1, 1976.

13. That various trap and skeet rules be amended, effective 1/1/1975. (Note: Skeet amendments as published in November 1974; trap amendments as published in December 1974.)

14. That in any shoot off where one squad still remains in a contest whilst another squad is reduced to one shooter before that shoot off round is completed, that a pacemaker be not allowed and the conditions in Rule 97 shall apply.

15. That the present ordering/manufacturing/mailling method—concerning CHAMPIONSHIP BADGES—be discontinued in view of ever increasing production costs and production delays, and to maintain championship badges to clubs at existing price that A.C.T.A. order badges of blank surround in bulk then sell them to clubs at existing price, giving immediate delivery with provision for clubs to have local jeweller add the required engraving and so enable clubs to have the appropriate badge so available for presentation at any shoot.

16. That a "Ladies" Interstate Teams' Match may be conducted during the same programme as an Interstate Trap Teams' Match using the same targets and conditions except that teams be of six ladies with best of five top scores to count.

1975 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

17.1. During the 1975 National Championships programme, scheduled for March 4 to 12 at the Tasmanian Gun Club, Evandale, near Launceston, Tasmania:

17.2. That the 1975 National Championship dates as decided during the March 1974 meeting be adopted with shooting commencing daily at 8.30 a.m. during:
Tuesday, March 4, Wednesday, March 5 — 6th National Skeet Championship.

Thursday, March 6—15th National Double Rise Championship.

Friday, March 7—26th Grand Handicap.

Saturday, March 8—23rd National Double Barrel.

Sunday, March 9—Free day.

Monday, March 10—21st National Single Barrel.

Tuesday, March 11—14th Aust./N.Z. Championship.

Wednesday, March 12—33rd National Champion of Champions event.

17.3. That shooters present their 1974 and 1975 handicap cards at Launceston to substantiate their "B" and "C" gradings.

17.4. That \$15 prize money be paid to each member of the winning team in the 1975 inter-club teams event, as was paid in 1974—totalling \$75 to the winning team.

17.5. That the Mark IV Texan Reloading Press as donated by F. C. Lovelock Pty. Ltd. take the place of cash as first prize in the 1975 Grand Australian Handicap.

17.6. Acknowledged that High Gun trophies from Winchester, I.M.I., Michaelis Bayley, Guthrie Trading have been assured.

17.7. That Ansett Airlines of 54 Brisbane Street, Launceston, Tasmania, 7250, be the travel and accommodation agents for the 1975 National Championships. (Note: Contact Mr Ray Walker.)

17.8. That shooters may pre-nominate for the 1975 National Championships by forwarding a cheque plus a completed nomination form to arrive at the A.C.T.A. office at the latest by Tuesday, February 11, 1975, i.e., three weeks before the commencement of the Nationals. (Note: This nomination form is contained herein with the 1975 Nationals programme).

17.9. That shooters who had not previously nominated, may nominate on a card at the shoot for the whole or a part of the programme on the same form for the 1975 Nationals.

(Thus, nominations will be accepted any prior day, plus on the actual day of the event. Each such nomination form to contain the shooter's name, home State, his shooting class and handicap, plus the name of his home club.)

17.10. That SCORES be added up at the last point of scoring by the scorer then checked and signed by the referee and the shooter and this score becomes FINAL.

17.11. That the referee take the completed score-sheet to the scoreboard attendant who shall enter the results on the scoreboard and then take the scoresheet to the office. The progressive scoreboard attendants shall take their information from the official scoreboard.

17.12. That the Champion of Champions' event be conducted as a graded event.

17.13. That a progressive scoreboard be adjacent to the main scoreboard to show the scores of those heading for selection for the International Teams' Match and for the respective High Gun trophies.

17.14. That whilst SKEET is in progress that other D-T-L traps be available for practice shooting of Double Rise and down-the-line at the Shoot Marshal's discretion on both days of March 4 and 5.

17.15. That Marshal to announce that no closed guns be carried or pointed on the grounds.

17.16. That I.M.I. and Winchester be the suppliers of cartridges for the 1975 National Championships.

17.17. That cartridges be issued from a common distribution point against cartridge tickets as obtained by shooters when nominating.

17.18. That clay targets throughout the National Championships series be colour BLACK.

17.19. (i) That an "International Trap Teams' Perpetual Trophy," as to be donated be accepted from Messrs. S. E. Rooke (Australia), E. Gates (USA) and J. McMillan (New Zealand).

(ii) That it be shot for at the A.C.T.A. Nationals each year.

(iii) That it be open to teams of SIX from any one country and that when the "Glenn Cup" match is contested in Australia that this International Trap Teams' Trophy be shot in conjunction BUT that the GLENN CUP remains only for competition between Australia and New Zealand.

(iv) The Australian team be of the six best scorers in the A.N.Z. TRAP CHAMPIONSHIP—other teams to choose their own team members.

(v) That in the event of a tied score that this be FINAL as with the Glenn Cup arrangements.

(vi) Each shooter to shoot at 20 targets from 16 metres, two barrels are permitted and either barrel shall be of equal value; ten targets per visit; two visits to the traps; each competitor to shoot from five lanes; squad system. In the event of tied scores the result to be a tie. Cartridges of 32 grams as prescribed in A.C.T.A. Shooting Rules.

(vii) Maximum possible score per team 120/120 broken targets.

(viii) That the trophy remains with the A.C.T.A. at all times.

17.20. That 1975 Nationals nominations be \$12 respectively plus sweepstakes.

17.21. That the fence and gate in the background of TRAP 4 at the Tasmanian Gun Club do NOT constitute a BOULK during the period of the 1975 National Championships, also that aircraft do not constitute a baulk at Tasmanian Gun Club.

17.22. That a daily JURY of three Executive Committeemen will be available as arranged by A.C.T.A. Vice-President, Mr A. Pedersen.

17.23. That Round 2 for each shooter of the Skeet event does NOT immediately follow Round 1 as this is impractical, but will commence when Round 1 is completed by all shooters.

17.24. That TRAP RULE 80 remains as is and that Shooter Gerry Williams of U.S.A. is the current record holder.

(Notes: (1) Reference skeet at the 1973 Nationals.

(2) See A.C.T.A. Break Records as to be published November 1973 A.C.T.A. "Shooting News.")

17.25. That official photographer be Mr Pat Browne of Adelaide, S.A., for the 1975 Nationals.

17.26. Meetings during the 1975 National Championships period:

(i) To a possible civic reception by the Launceston Council on Tuesday night, March 4, when an A.C.T.A. bannerette may be given to the Tasmanian Premier, the Right Honourable Mr Eric E. Reece—only those shooters and ladies as specifically invited

by A.C.T.A. National President and his Committee may attend because of prescribed limitations of numbers. (At this time of going to press, the venue is not known. Premier Mr Reece most graciously allocated funds for the updating of the Tasmanian Gun Club grounds and facilities so that the 1975 National Clay Target Championships could be staged in Tasmania, and at Launceston in this instance. The Association remembers, with respect, that this circumstance emanated from the untiring and dedicated efforts of the late Mr W. E. H. Rainbird, O.B.E., who was an A.C.T.A. Executive Committeeman for almost 40 continuous years.)

(ii) That an A.C.T.A. Committee meeting be held in the "Guvnor's" Convention Room, Colonial Motor Inn, 31 Elizabeth Street, Launceston, from 10 a.m. till around 4 p.m. on Sunday, March 2, 1975.

(iii) That there be an A.C.T.A. Nationals referees meeting to be as called by the Marshals at 4.30 p.m. on Monday, March 3, at the Tasmanian Gun Club with Executive Committeemen present, Messrs. Holtfreter, Mules, Taylor, Williamson, Hawkins.

(iv) Buffet diner, Monday, March 3, from 7.30 p.m.-10.30 p.m. as a get-together for, say, 200 shooters and ladies at the Kings Meadow Bowls Club, Carr Street, Launceston (three miles out of Launceston turn left at Perry's Butchery, then left into Carr Street and left again at the car park. Entrance by ticket at price of \$3.50 per person, but beverages C.O.D. Entree tickets available from A.C.T.A. office at Tasmanian Gun Club during the day.

(v) That a tour for interested shooters and their ladies be arranged.

Note: The Tasmanian Gun Club has since arranged for a 40 passenger bus to depart, probably from the Gun Club, around 9.30 a.m. on Thursday, March 6. Cost per person \$2.50 for the bus ride. Tour of surrounding district and points of interest till, say, 4.30 p.m. A luncheon stop will be arranged but luncheon charge would be additional C.O.D. Should more tourists seek a similar sightseeing tour then, providing sufficient indication is received, another bus may be available OR a similar tour may be possible on a further day.

(vi) GENERAL REFEREE MEETING for rules interpretation discussion, under the same above named Executive Committeemen, on Thursday, March 6, at the Tasmanian Gun Club, at the completion of the event that day.

(vii) 1975 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING to be at Kings Meadows Bowls Club, 7.30-10.30 p.m., Friday, March 7—seating for 150—then around 10.15 to 10.45 p.m. some light refreshments with bar facilities C.O.D.

(viii) A TROPHY PRESENTATION NIGHT be from 9 p.m.-10 p.m., Wednesday, March 12, at the Kings Meadows Bowls Club for, say, 150 shooters and ladies followed by a buffet supper. Entrance by ticket from A.C.T.A. office at Tasmanian Gun Club during the day. Tickets \$2.50 per person but beverages are C.O.D. additional.

Amendments to A.C.T.A. Trap and Skeet shooting rules

Trap rules

AMENDMENTS EFFECTIVE AS OF 1/1/75

Rule 18: Add the following words to the last sentence "before he is allowed to participate (see also Rules 100 (f) (1) and 100 (g))."

Rule 39 (b): The \$200 maximum value of trophies in this rule is being ignored. In fact this committee in a postal vote last February allowed the rule to be broken.

In addition many clubs are conducting high value common mark trophy events that are not championships.

Shooters appear to be patronising these events and I believe firstly that we should decide if we are to allow them to continue or not.

Depending on that decision I make the following recommendations:

(a) If Clubs Are Allowed to Run High Value Common Mark Trophy Events

- (i) Replace Rule 39 (a) with: "No competitor is permitted to shoot from other than his A.C.T.A. handicap mark except in novelty events, common mark graded trophy events or common mark graded open championship events or eye-openers preceding common mark events which shall be shot from the same mark as the common mark event. All common mark graded events must be shot within the common mark rules."
- (ii) Remove existing Rule 39 (b).
- (iii) Renumber existing Rule 39 (c) as 39 (b) and add to the last sentence: "and handicap adjustments shall be applied in accordance with Rule 149 (a) irrespective of the number of competitors in each group."

(b) If Clubs Are Not Allowed to Run High Value Common Mark Trophy Events

- (i) Remove the words "events such as" from the third line of Rule 39 (a).
- (ii) Remove the last paragraph of Rule 39 (a) and add the following sentence to the first paragraph: "All common mark graded events must be shot within the common mark rules."
- (iii) Add to the last sentence of Rule 39 (c), "and handicap adjustments shall be applied in accordance with Rule 149 (a) irrespective of the number of competitors in each group."

Rule 52 (b): Reword the start of the rule: "All misfires, malfunctions or faulty cartridges must be recorded" . . . etc.

Rule 63: Amend the bracketted section to read ("see Rules 6, 8 and 9)."

Rule 67: The wording of this rule infers that simultaneous discharges should be treated separately from

gun malfunctions but I do not believe this to be the intention. I recommend that the words, "after the second occurrence 'lost target' shall be declared," be removed and a new sentence added as follows: "Simultaneous discharges shall be recorded as gun malfunctions."

Rule 68: Add additional paragraph: "Should the faulty cartridge occur in the first barrel in any type of event, and the competitor fires the second barrel where this is possible, the competitor shall abide by the result of the second barrel. (See Rule 78.)"

Rule 72: Reword the rule as follows: "A competitor having an apparent misfire or malfunction will forthwith call the referee for his decision. The competitor must not turn around and must keep his gun pointing in the direction of the traphouse until the referee has given his decision."

Should the competitor attempt to open the gun before the referee examines it the target shall automatically be called lost (also see Rule 78)."

Rule 78: Reword the rule as follows: "Should there be a faulty cartridge, misfire or malfunction in the first barrel, in any type of event, and the competitor fires the second barrel where this is possible, the competitor shall abide by the result and shall have no claim to a repeat target for the first barrel."

Where this happens in a points scoring event and the target is broken with the second barrel the decision shall be as follows:

- (i) If there was no detonation of either primer or powder with the first barrel the score shall be '3';
- (ii) If there was a detonation of either primer or powder with the first barrel the score shall be '2.'

In both cases if the target had been missed with the second barrel the score would be lost."

Rule 90: Reword the rule as follows: "Any faulty cartridge, misfire or malfunction in Deauville Doubles does not entitle the competitors to another pair of targets and they must abide by the result."

Rule 93 (d): That the last sentence of Rule 93 (d) be deleted and replaced by: "Tower targets shall be thrown within a minimum of 75 metres and a maximum of 85 metres, measured laterally from the base point of a vertical line from the centre pivot of the trap. The targets shall leave the trap as near to horizontal as practical"

Rule 113 (a): That the national champion of champions event be conducted as a graded event.

That the words "Maximum entrance fee for championship \$6" be removed from Rules 118 (b), 119 (b), 120 (b), 121 (b), 122 (b), 123 (b) and 124 (b).

Rule 125 (b): Amend to read "December 31" in two places.

Rule 126 (d): Amend to read "December 31."

Rule 126 (a): Reword the rule as follows: "The club conducting the elimination match shall provide

compulsory division prize money of \$150 or 40% of the nomination, whichever is the greater. Where there are no tied scores the distribution will be 60% for first, 30% for second and 10% for third."

Rule 127 (c): Remove the rule because of the reasons given in item (16) above.

Rule 128 (a): Remove "with nominations \$5" from (i). Remove "with nominations of \$8" from (ii). Add new section: "(iii) Commonwealth I.S.U. Championships to be of 200 targets."

Rule 129 (f): Delete the existing rule.

Remove "Maximum Entrance Fee for Championships \$5" from Rules 130 (c), 131 (c), 132 (b), 132 (c), 133 (b), 134 (c), 135 (b) and 136.

Remove "Maximum Entrance Fee for Championship \$4" from Rules 137 (c), 138 (c), 139 (b), 140 (b), 141 (c) and 142 (b).

Remove the sentence: "Maximum Entrance Fee \$4." (Rule 143).

Rule 148: Change existing sub-heading to "Championship Trophy Values and Maximum Entrance Fees." Renumber existing Rule 148 as 148 (a).

Add new Rule 148 (b): "Trophies for I.S.U. or U.I.T. Championships should be limited to sashes, badges or similar. Clubs may provide additional trophies at their discretion but the maximum entrance fee as stated in Rule 148 (c) shall not be exceeded.

Add new Rule 148 (c): "The maximum entrance fees for championships shall be:

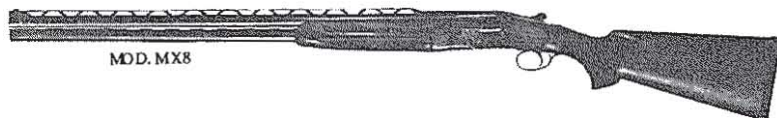

AMENDMENTS EFFECTIVE AS OF 1/1/75

Rule 15: Amend and add to the last sentence as follows: "Each competitor shall carry his handicap and registration card to all shoots and shall present it to the nomination office before being allowed to participate. It shall be the responsibility of the club to enter the competitor's scores on his card and to calculate his handicap at the appropriate times."

Rule 26: Some referees apply Rule 26 too severely. The first man in a skeet squad is at a distinct disadvantage, compared to the rest of the squad, if he is not allowed to move partially to the next station. This is not practical of course on station 7

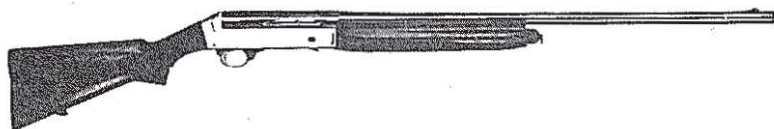

and 8 but can be done quite safely and without distraction on the other stations. I recommend that an additional sentence be added to Rule 26 as follows: "However, when in the opinion of the referee it is done unobtrusively, the first competitor in a squad should be allowed to move across and stand at least three metres behind the next station from stations 2 to 6 inclusive."

Rule 57: Delete the words "after the second occurrence 'Lost Target' shall be declared," and substitute "Simultaneous discharges shall be classed as gun malfunctions."

Rule 63: Rule 62 refers to malfunctions in any one event and Rule 63 refers to misfires in any one round. For the sake of uniformity and to be similar to our trap rules I recommend that "round" in Rule 63 be replaced with "event."

Rule 66: I can see no reason for retaining our normal skeet round rules. Therefore I recommend:

(i) The sub-heading prior to Rule 66 be rewritten as "SKEET ROUND PROCEDURE."

(ii) Delete existing Rule 66 and substitute: "The squad shall start shooting at Station 1 in the order in which the names appear on the score sheet. The first competitor shall start shooting singles, firing upon the high house target first and the low house target second. Then he shall proceed to shoot doubles, firing the first shot at the target emerging from the high house and the second shot at the target from the low house, before leaving the station."

The second shooter shall then proceed likewise, followed by the other members of the squad in turn. Then the squad shall proceed to Station 2 and repeat the same sequence as on Station 1. The squad shall then proceed to Station 3 where each competitor will shoot at a single target from the high house first and then a single target from the low house before leaving the shooting station.

The same procedure will be followed at Station 4 and 5. Upon advancing to Station 6 the first competitor will shoot singles in the same sequence as at the previous stations and then he shall shoot doubles by firing at the low house target first and the high house target second before leaving the station. The other competitors will follow in their turn. The same procedure will be followed at Station 7.

The squad will then advance to Station 8 where each competitor shall shoot at a target from the high house. The squad shall then turn and the first competitor will shoot at a target from the low house. If the competitor has broken his first 24 targets he shall repeat the shot at another low house target to complete his round of 25 before leaving the station. The other competitors will then follow in turn using the same procedure.

Rule 67: Delete the existing rule and substitute: "When shooting doubles the competitor shall have the option of reversing the order of the first and second shot, in which case the referee must be notified before shooting at each pair."

Rule 69: Remove the first sentence.

Rule 70: Remove the first sentence.

Rule 75: Delete the existing rule and substitute: "No targets (both) shall be declared if an allowable misfire, malfunction or faulty cartridge occurs on the first shot in doubles, and a proof pair shall be thrown to determine the result of both shots. If such misfire, malfunction or faulty cartridge is excessive the referee shall declare 'first target lost, and no target on the second barrel,' and a proof double shall be thrown to determine the result of the second shot only."

Delete the sub-heading "Quick Skeet Round" and delete Rules 80, 81, 82, and 83.

Rule 95: Remove the words "using the quick round method."

Delete existing Rules 103 (a) and 103 (b) and insert new sub-heading and new rule 103 as follows: "103.—SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS — NUMBER OF TARGETS AND MAXIMUM ENTRANCE FEES"

Delete existing Rule 104 and insert new rule as follows: "104.—I.S.U. CHAMPIONSHIPS.

(a) Commonwealth, State and District Championships may be conducted under International Shooting Union Rules using standard targets only. Application to be made as in Skeet Rule 21 (b).

(b) Trophies for I.S.U. Championships should be limited to sashes, badges and similar. Clubs may provide additional trophies at their discretion but the maximum entrance fees as shown in Rule 104 (c) shall not be exceeded.

(c) Number of targets and maximum entrance fees shall be:

Commonwealth.

200 targets \$20.00

State.

100 targets \$10.00

District.

50 targets \$5.00"

Rule 105 (c): Amend the rule to read: "Team members shall be chosen by an elimination match of 50 targets, 32 grams shot, No. 7 or lighter, 15 highest scores to automatically become the State Team."

Rule 105 (e): (i) Remove the sentence "The winning team shall be declared at the Annual Executive Meeting each year." (ii) Change "September" to "December."

Rule 105 (g): Change "\$5" to "\$6."

Rule 108: Remove the words "using the quick round method."

Rule 118: Amend the second paragraph as follows: "Each competitor will commence the shoot-off with a handicap allowance equivalent to the surplus of his A.C.T.A. handicap remaining after qualifying

for the shoot-off and will continue in the shoot-off until he has lost one target in excess of the handicap allowance irrespective of the length of the shoot-off. Examples:

- (i) 25 target event. A competitor whose A.C.T.A. handicap is 7 shoots 21/25. He will commence the shoot-off with a handicap allowance of 3 and will be eliminated immediately he loses one target in excess of the allowance. Should he shoot 23/25 in the first round of the shoot-off he will commence the second round with an allowance of 1 target.
- (ii) 50 target event. A competitor whose A.C.T.A. handicap is 7 shoots 40/50. He will commence the shoot-off with a handicap allowance of 4 and will continue in the shoot-off as in (i) above."

Instances are occurring more frequently of shooters firing a second cartridge at their high house single target when they miss it with the first shot. Obviously it is a lost target, and they are doing it to try and determine what they did wrong with the first shot, but should the practice be allowed to continue. Rule 42 states that one cartridge only may be fired at each target but it could be argued that this means only one cartridge to score. I think it is a bad habit because one day the competitor will do this to the first target in a pair of doubles and consequently lose both. We should think about this and decide on a firm policy.

Add New Rule: Skeet shoot-offs by the first miss out method: In all events in which a first miss out shoot-off method is used the following will apply: "When shooting doubles in a first miss out shoot-off, both targets shall be fired upon and recorded even though the first target may have been missed. The score on the second target shall be considered to be part of the competition.

Supplement to 1975 A.C.T.A. Championship Allocations

The official allocations of Australian National Clay Target Championships to be conducted during 1975 within the Australian Clay Target Association are as follows and are to be acted upon by all concerned.

Applications must be lodged on the prescribed form number 16, for consideration and approval of shooting rules.

If no club advertising copy has arrived two months before a Commonwealth Title, then the Secretary/Editor is empowered to insert an appropriate advertisement and to charge the club concerned.

Clubs allocated State Title events are expected to advertise these State Events in A.C.T.A. "Shooting News."

Clubs not advertising Interstate Teams and similar major events, will not receive such consideration in future allocations.

The host clubs of the Interstate Teams' Matches, both Trap and Skeet, should give two months' notice to all shooters within their advertisements in A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" and such matches should be completed by December 31.

A.C.T.A. National Championships and the International Trap Teams' Match will be conducted at the Tasmanian Gun Club, Launceston, Tasmania, over the period March 4 to March 12, Tuesday to Wednesday, excluding Sunday, March 9, which is to be a Free Day. The Executive Committee is grateful to Messrs. I.M.I. Australia Ltd.; Winchester Australia Pty. Ltd.; Michaelis Bayley Trading, Guthrie & Company (Australia) Pty. Ltd. and F. C. Lovelock Pty. 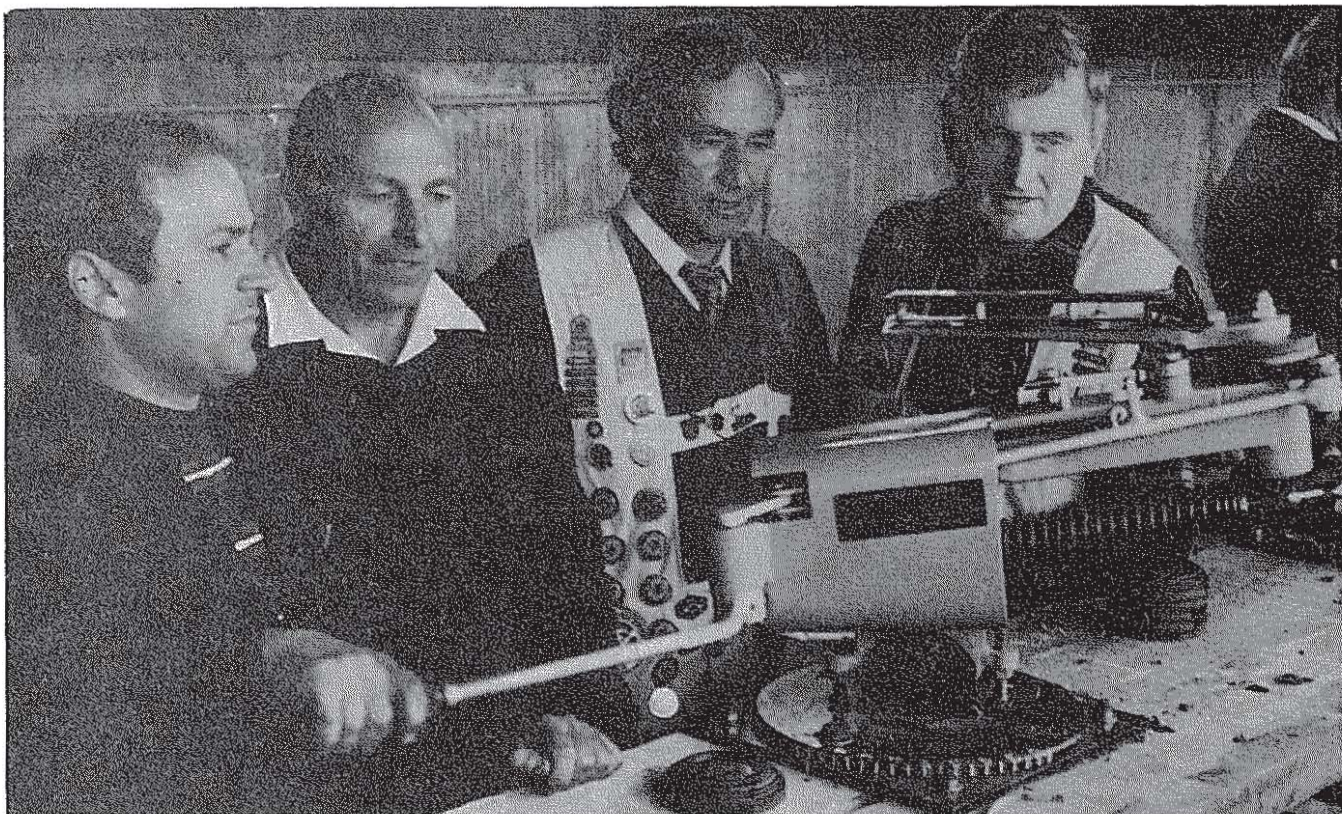

We refer to a number of conversations with you, over the past year, wherein we have discussed the extent of the cover granted by the above policy, and trust that the following explanation will clarify the situation.

In brief, the Operative clause of the Policy reads as follows:—

cessful shoot. Shooters had to be let known of the change and our thanks for your co-operation, this was well done.

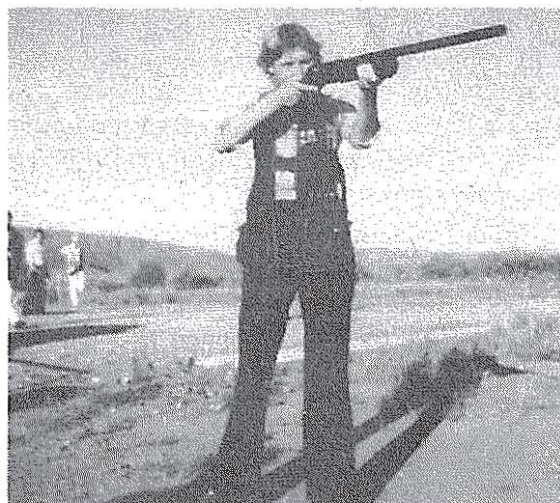

AMATEUR RULES

A. The principles of amateurism, laid down in the declaration of the International Olympic Committee at its Congress of 1947 are valid for all members of the International Shooting Union.

B. Money prizes up to \$25 U.S. or its equivalent are considered as a compensation for costs. If there is a shooting contest covering several days, money totalling \$100 or its equivalent within the same week are also considered a compensation for costs without detailed specification from the competitors. Money prizes exceeding the above-mentioned sums must be given to the club to which the competitor belongs. The competitor may receive from his club only the sum corresponding to his actual costs, which may include:

1. Entrance Fees.
2. Ammunition.
3. Travelling expenses.
4. Costs for meals and lodgings (in relation to the general level and normally not exceeding 10 dollars or 3 pounds or 35 Swiss francs, etc., per day).

C. This article applies to all categories of shooting supervised by the International Shooting Union.

D. An amateur should not be considered as:

1. Anyone who gives an exhibition in marksmanship for any pecuniary reward.
2. Anyone whose principal profession is test shooting of guns or ammunition. The operator of a test shooting machine is not necessarily included in this category.
3. Anyone who is a professional instructor in shooting.
4. Anyone who accepts money prizes in excess of those allowed according to the rules of amateurism.

E. Paragraphs D2 and 3 categories do not apply to a member of the armed forces, who acts as an instructor, if his work is solely educational and cannot be considered as coaching of shooters for competition.

F. The competitor should fulfil the qualifications of amateurism laid down by the National Olympic Committee of his country.

G. In judging the status as an amateur according to article D and E, the activities of the competitor during the past two years should be considered.

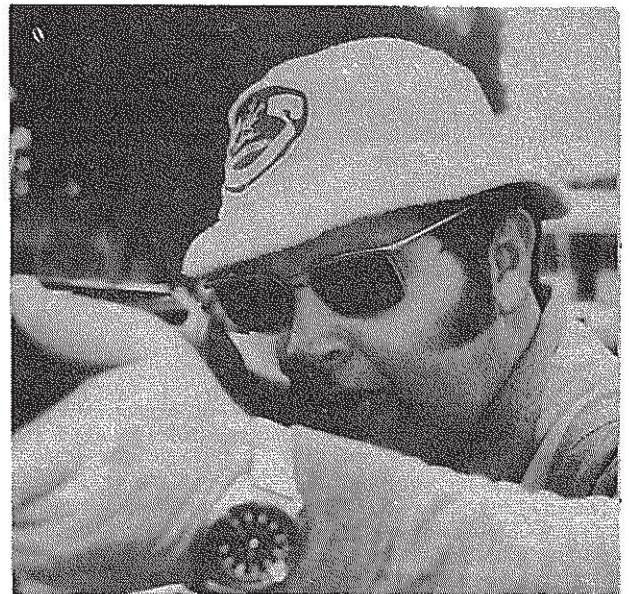

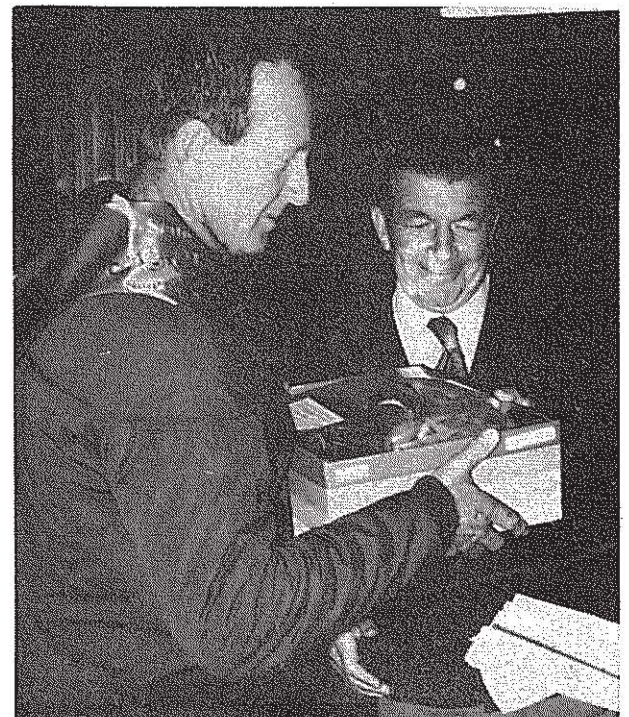

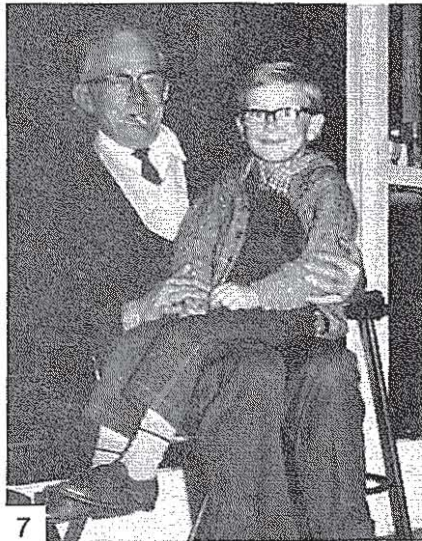

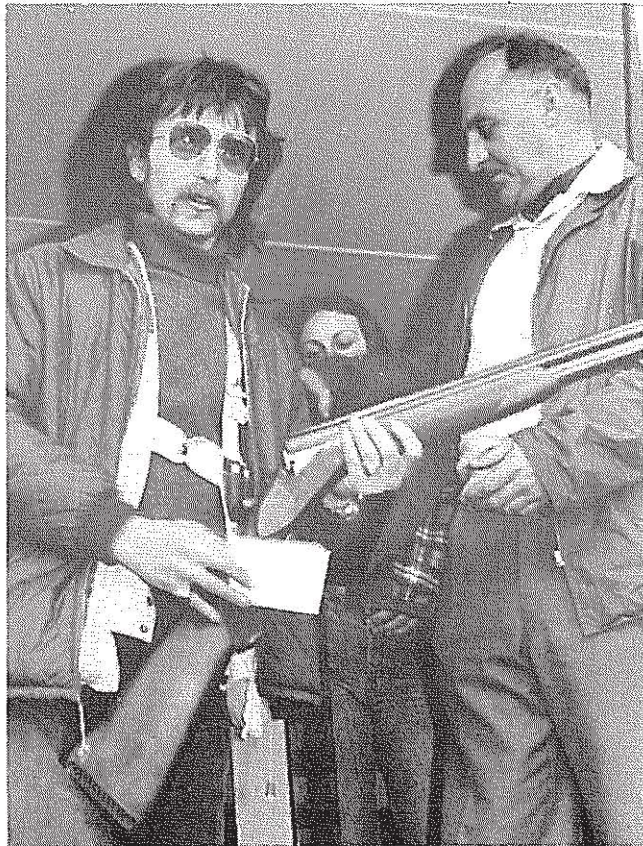

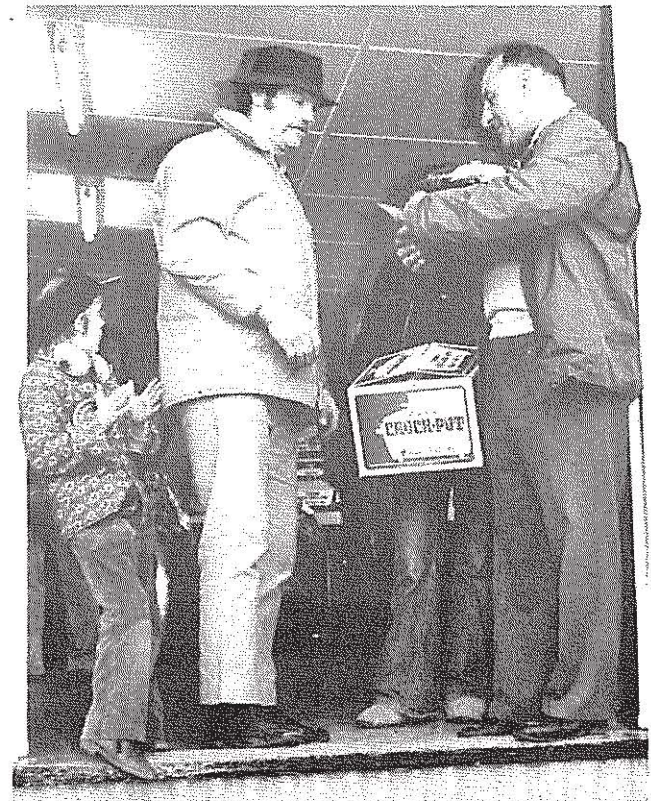
