

The election of seats on the Executive Committee of the Association will take place during the 39th

Annual General meeting of the Australian Clay Target Association to be held at the Kings Meadows Bowls Club, Carr Street, Launceston, Tasmania, commencing 8.00 p.m. on Friday 7th March, 1975.

Agenda items to include: -

A recommendation to discuss an increase of member club annual affiliation fee to \$25 — as provided in Article 14 — effective as of January 1, 1976.

#### **DELEGATE APPOINTMENT**

Affiliated units of the ACTA are reminded that they are entitled to one delegate (Article 15) to represent their interests at the Annual Meeting. However, delegates can only be accepted providing the Association "Articles of Association" are complied with. This involves the completion of the necessary forms, namely "Acceptance of Membership" (Article 5 (a)), "Nomination of Representative" (Article 21) (in the case of a corporate club), or "Nomination of Delegate" (Articles 5 (c) and 16) (in the case of an unincorporated club), followed finally by "Notice of Acceptance of Delegates." Official printed forms as applicable are obtainable from the ACTA office. It should be noted that nomination of a representative or member delegate can only be accepted providing all subscriptions and monies due by either the nominee or the club, to the Association, have been paid as provided for in Article 49.

It is also pointed out that where a representative or delegate has been appointed previously, and this has not been officially rescinded, the appointment as previously made will stand, until the Association is advised or instructed otherwise. In accordance with the Articles of Association, clubs cannot appoint a delegate other than on the prescribed form (letters are unacceptable).

Each financial affiliated member club should have a Delegate Entree Card (for unincorporated clubs) or a Representative Card (for incorporated clubs) at the time of the delegate appointment and this entree card remains valid until the named delegate is changed. These cards should be presented to the scrutineer, on his request, by the respective financial shooter delegates concerned to obtain permission to attend and be eligible to vote at future annual general meetings.

The Delegate Registers will be at marked tables inside the door of the annual meeting room at the Kings Meadows Bowls Club, Carr Street, Launceston — (turn opposite 138 Hobart Road) — between 7.30 p.m. and 8 p.m. The registers will be at tables marked according to states. The registers will separately list the member clubs and the registered club delegate. Where a club is not financially affiliated and for where a delegate is not financially registered, then no vote for that club can be recorded, nor can any such voice be made during the meeting.

It is suggested, and recommended that all shooters complete and sign the "Schedule A" amateur declaration — two copies were in the December publication, one for personal record to be retained by each shooter, the other is perforated for easy removal. It is preferable that this copy, which is required for ACTA records, is forwarded by your club secretary, with your registration fee.

Within the amateur rules of Olympic Games, British Commonwealth Games and the International Shooting Union, each shooter must have signed and lodged a satisfactory "Schedule A" form with his national body, for appropriate recording.

These rules were accepted by unanimous agreement at the ACTA annual general meetings at Brisbane in June, 1971 and Adelaide in March, 1973, and are contained in the published ACTA Shooting Rules brochure.

ACTA maintains these records and also stamps "Schedule A" on the respective handicap cards as they are issued. Once a "Schedule A" amateur rules declaration form is lodged, then no further declaration is necessary at this stage, as the records are repetitive.

However, should there ever be a challenge on any shooter's amateurism, the onus of charge and proof are between the charger and the shooter concerned.

ACTA championship badges for commonwealth, state and district title events are available to clubs on immediate mail demand with the surround in blank enabling clubs to have the badges engraved by any local jeweller and consequently on hand when a shooter has won a specific event. This circumstance will be welcomed by clubs in that with ever increasing production costs and delays during 1974, the

cost to clubs of these badges remains unaltered. Clubs may purchase any number of such badges in the usual manner by lodging the form as provided.

Corrections and additions to Trap and Skeet Shooting Rules as published pages 7/8 of December 1974 ACTA Shooting News.

1. Delete existing Trap Rule 9 with new sub-heading "Out of bounds after being fired upon" thence add new rule 9.

The provisions of Rules 6, 7 and 8 shall apply to targets released in still air.

If in the opinion of the referee, a target was legal when fired upon, but was blown out of bounds or fell short of distance due to adverse weather conditions, it shall still be classed as a legal target.

- 2. Delete the Trap Rule 18 amendment and such reference as shown in the December 1974 amendment list.
  - 3. Insert into Trap Rule 32 (a):
- (i) after "No. 1 lane" add the words "and shall not reload until standing on No. 1 lane."
- (ii) add additional paragraph "Provided he is standing on the mark from where he is going to shoot, and there is no person on a more forward mark a competitor using a semi-automatic or magazine type gun may drop a cartridge into the barrel whilst he is waiting his turn to shoot. The breech shall be left open and the gun muzzle shall remain pointed in the direction of the traphouse. The competitor may only close the breech and load the second cartridge into the magazine when it is his turn to shoot."
- 3. Delete the reference to Trap Rule 39 (b) as shown in the December 1974 amendment list.

Correction to page 17, December 1974 Shooting News in that the opening statement "won by Tasmania 1457" should have read "won by New South Wales 1480:1500" — (This was an oversight in typesetting compilation but has doubtlessly been interpreted correctly by all readers concerned when studying the respective State Trap Team scores).

### **ACTA 1975 championship allocations**

The Queensland section of the 1975 Interstate Skeet Teams' Match has been corrected by a sub-committee to read Brisbane G.C. as the host club—at a date yet to be decided.

Separately within this publication are the arrangements for the Winchester Tournament in Australia for 1975 together with such host club shooting dates as are available at the time of going to press.

All member clubs and registered shooters are reminded that in accordance with Australian Governmental requirements this association, as with other sporting bodies, conducts its weights and measures as applicable to competitive shotgun shooting procedures in METRIC as from 1st January, 1975.

Contained herein in a self-explanatory reprint of the SAFETY PROCEDURES as practised within this association.

In an endeavour to somewhat hold existing cost structures, the outside cover of this February 1975 publication of ACTA Shooting News uses merely a different overall color than the 1974 series of publications.

A notification from the Postmaster-General's Department states . . . "As you are no doubt aware, parliament has passed legislation which increases the rates of postage for registered publications — progressively designed to place the service on a more economic basis."

These progressive mailing cost increases have trebled our publication postage cost over the last two years.

## 1975 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. During the 1975 national championships programme, scheduled for March 4 to 12 at the Tasmanian Gun Club, Evandale, near Launceston, Tasmania:

The 1975 national championship dates as decided during the March 1974 meeting are adopted with shooting commencing daily at 8.30 a.m. during:

Tuesday, March 4, Wednesday, March 5 — 6th National Skeet Championship.

Thursday, March 6 — 15th National Double Rise Championship.

Friday, March 7 – 26th Grand Handicap.

Saturday, March 8 — 23rd National Double Barrel.

Sunday, March 9 - Free day.

Monday, March 10 — 21st National Single Barrel.

Tuesday, March 11 - 14th Aust./N.Z. Championship.

Wednesday, March 12 — 33rd National Champion of Champions event.

- 2. Shooters to present their 1974 and 1975 handicap cards at Launceston to substantiate their "B" and "C" gradings.
- 3. \$15 prize money be paid to each member of the winning team in the 1975 inter-club teams event, as was paid in 1974 totalling \$75 to the winning team.
  - 4. The Mark IV Texan Reloading Press as donated

- by F. C. Lovelock Pty. Ltd. takes the place of cash as first prize in the 1975 Grand Australian Handicap.
- High Gun trophies from Winchester, IMI, Michaelis Bayley, Guthrie Trading have been assured.
- 6. Ansett Airlines of 54 Brisbane Street, Launceston, Tasmania, 7250, are the travel and accommodation agents for the 1975 National Championships. (Note: Contact Mr Tom Collins).
- 7. Shooters may pre-nominate for the 1975 National Championships by forwarding a cheque plus a completed nomination form to arrive at the ACTA office at the latest by Tuesday, 11th February, 1975, i.e., three weeks before the commencement of the Nationals. Note: This nomination form is contained herein with the 1975 Nationals programme and any shooter who so pre-nominates but is unable to attend will have his nominations refunded in full.

All shooters competing at the 1975 National Championships will be issued an especially numbered card for each event. Such cards will show each shooter's serial number, his grade and his squad number.

All shooters whether pre-nominated or nominating at the grounds, must collect their above mentioned numbered cards prior to each of the events concerned — otherwise shooters will not be placed in any squad.

All shooters are requested to support this new system — designed to reduce shooter congestion at the windows — by forwarding to arrive ACTA before Tuesday, 11th February, cash plus completed "Nationals Nominations Form."

8. Shooters who had not previously nominated, may nominate on a card at the shoot for the whole or a part of the programme on the same form for the 1975 Nationals.

(Thus, nominations will be accepted any prior day, plus on the actual day of the event. Each such nomination form to contain the shooter's name, home state, his shooting class and handicap, plus the name of his home club).

- 9. Scores to be added up at the last point of scoring by the scorer then checked and signed by the referee and the shooter and this score becomes FINAL.
- 10. The referee to take the completed scoresheet to the scoreboard attendant who shall enter the results on the scoreboard and then take the scoresheet to the office. The progressive scoreboard attendants shall take their information from the official scoreboard.
- 11. The Champion of Champions' event be conducted as a graded event.
- 12. A progressive scoreboard be adjacent to the main scoreboard to show the scores of those heading for selection for the International Teams' Match and for the respective High Gun trophies.
- 13. Whilst SKEET is in progress other DTL traps may be available for practice shooting of Double Rise and down-the-line at the Shoot Marshal's discretion on both days of March 4 and 5.

- 14. The Marshal to announce that no closed guns be carried or pointed on the grounds.
- 15. IMI and Winchester to be the suppliers of cartridges for the 1975 National Championships.
- 16. Cartridges to be issued from a common distribution point against cartridge tickets as obtained by shooters when nominating.
- 17. Clay targets throughout the National Championships series to be color BLACK.
- 18. An "International Trap Teams' Perpetual Trophy" has been donated and accepted from Messrs. S. E. Rooke (Australia), E. Gates (USA) and J. McMillan (New Zealand).
- (i) That it be shot for at the ACTA Nationals each year.
- (ii) That it be open to teams of SIX from any one country and that when the "Glenn Cup" match is contested in Australia that this International Trap Teams' Trophy be shot in conjunction BUT that the GLENN CUP remains only for competition between Australia and New Zealand.
- (iii) The Australian Team to be of the six best scorers in the ANZ Trap Championship other teams to choose their own team members.
- (iv) That in the event of a tied score that this be FINAL as with the Glenn Cup arrangements.
- (v) Each shooter to shoot at 20 targets from 16 metres, two barrels are permitted and either barrel shall be of equal value; ten targets per visit; two visits to the traps; each competitor to shoot from five lanes; squad system. In the event of tied scores the result to be a tie. Cartridges of 32 grams as prescribed in ACTA Shooting Rules.
- (vi) Maximum possible score per team 120:120 broken targets.
- (vii) That the trophy remains with the ACTA at all times.
- 19. 1975 Nationals nominations be \$12 respectively plus sweepstakes.
- 20. The fence and gate in the background of trap 4 at the Tasmanian Gun Club NOT to constitute a BAULK during the period of the 1975 National Championships, also that aircraft do not constitute a baulk at Tasmanian Gun Club.
- 21. A daily JURY of three executive committeemen will be available as arranged by ACTA Vice-President, Mr A. Pedersen.
- 22. Round 2 for each shooter of the Skeet event does NOT immediately follow Round 1 as this is impractical, but will commence when Round 1 is completed by all shooters.
- 23. TRAP RULE 80 remains as is and that shooter Gerry Williams of USA is the current record holder.
  - (Notes: (1) Reference skeet at the 1973 Nationals.
  - (2) See ACTA Break Records published herein.
- 24. Official photographer be Mr Pat Browne of Adelaide, SA, for the 1975 Nationals.

- 25. Meetings during the 1975 National Championships period:
- (i) To a possible civic reception by the Launceston Council on Tuesday night, March 4, when an ACTA bannerette may be given to the Tasmanian Premier, the Right Honorable Mr Eric E. Reece - only those shooters and ladies as specifically invited by ACTA National President and his committee may attend because of prescribed limitations of numbers. (At this time of going to press, the venue is not known. Premier Mr Reece most graciously allocated funds for the updating of the Tasmanian Gun Club grounds and facilities so that the 1975 National Clay Target Championships could be staged in Tasmania, and at Launceston in this instance. The association remembers, with respect, that this circumstance emanated from the untiring and dedicated efforts of the late Mr W. E. H. Rainbired O.B.E., who was an ACTA Executive Committeeman for almost 40 continuous vears).
- (ii) An ACTA Committee meeting will be held in the "Guvnor's" Convention Room, Colonial Motor Inn, 31 Elizabeth Street, Launceston, from 10 a.m. till around 4 p.m. on Sunday, March 2, 1975.
- (iii) An ACTA Nationals referees' meeting to be as called by the Marshals at 4.30 p.m. on Monday, March 3, at the Tasmanian Gun Club with Executive Committeemen present, Messrs. Holtfreter, Mules, Taylor, Williamson, Hawkins.
- (iv) Buffet dinner, Monday, March 3, from 7.30 p.m.-10.30 p.m. as a get-together for, say, 200 shooters and ladies at the Kings Meadow Bowls Club, Carr Street, Launceston (three miles out of Launceston, turn left at Perry's Butchery, then left into Carr Street and left again at the car park). Entrance by ticket at price of \$3.50 per person, but beverages C.O.D. Entree tickets available from ACTA office at Tasmanian Gun Club during the day.
- (v) Tours for interested shooters and their ladies may be arranged see ACTA office at shoot.
- Notes: (1) Thursday, March 6 Trip to Historic "Rock" a very old town 50 miles from Launceston, with a 400 acre park containing some 200 deer and forester kangaroos. Luncheon at the Scotch Thistle Inn (an old hotel now a licensed restaurant).

The tour will include a description of the Rock and all the old convict settlement period.

- (2) Monday, March 11 a boat trip down the Tamar estuary for the day on a charter boat towards the northern Tasmanian coast and the town of Georgetown, distant some 30 miles from Launceston.
- (3) Prices on both yet to be determined, but will be reasonable. Luncheons probably C.O.D. additional.
- (vi) GENERAL REFEREE MEETING for rules interpretation discussion, under the same above named Executive Committeemen, on Thursday, March 6, at the Tasmanian Gun Club, at the completion of the event that day.

(vii) 1975 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING to be at Kings Meadows Bowls Club, 8,00-10,30 p.m., Friday, March 7 - seating for 150 - then around 10.15 to 10.45 p.m. some light refreshments with bar facilities C.O.D.

(viii) A TROPHY PRESENTATION NIGHT will be from 9 p.m.-10 p.m., Wednesday, March 12, at the Kings Meadows Bowls Club for, say, 150 shooters and ladies followed by a buffet supper. Entrance by ticket from ACTA office at Tasmanian Gun Club during the day. Tickets \$2.50 per person but beverages are C.O.D. additional.

The next New Zealand National Championships are scheduled to be conducted at the Waitemata Gun Club, some 14 miles north of Auckland, between April 7 and April 12.

The final section of the 1975 International Trap Teams' Match will be conducted by the Irish Clay Pigeon Shooting Association near Dublin, Eire, on Friday, July 18, 1975. Any Australian team members or shooters visiting in the area at the time are cordially invited to attend the supporting tournament.

# 41st World shooting championships within the International Shooting Union

During the General Assembly at the 40th World Shooting Championships in Phoenix, Arizona, the Swiss Shooting Association was appointed by the International Shooting Association to host and organise the 1974 World Championships.

The various events were held in the Berner Upperland, probably the most beautiful part of Switzerland.

Bergfeld, an outer suburb of Bern, the Capital of Switzerland, hosted the moving target events of trench, skeet and running boar, whereas smallbore, pistol, air rifle, air pistol and 300 metre events were held on ranges near Thun, a picturesque town at the foot of a magnificent mountain range.

The opening ceremonies took place at the stadium Lachen in Thun on September 19th.

After the official marching parade of 1100 competitors representing nearly 60 nations, Mr J. Burkhard, President of the Swiss Shooting Association, welcomed all shooters and guests, followed by a speech in four different languages by Dr. Kurt Hasler, President of the ISU.

The official UIT (ISU) flag was hoisted and the 41st World Shooting Championships were declared open.

A large crowd of spectators was recorded and the stadium was filled to capacity.

Shortly after the ceremony, all competitors, team managers and officials, together with VIP's and international press personnel, were invited to a cocktail party aboard three boats for a tour around the Thuner lake. The journey lasted for nearly two hours and the scenery was absolutely breathtaking. Surrounded by high mountains, the shore line was covered with picturesque swiss houses and magnificent old castles. About 6.30 p.m. the tour ended and all competitors and team members retired to their various hotels to catch an early night and prepare for the strenuous days of the competitions.

The running boar range was situated alongside the trap and skeet layouts at Bergfeld. Unfortunately, the building housing the two layouts was too small to allow spectators to watch the competitors. However, the whole event was televised and 4 sets of monitors were located in the huge dining tent. Two monitors for each station were used, one showing the competitor from a ¾ frontal view, whereas the other showed the target scoring area. This allowed the spectators to see the shooter and his score on the target at the same time. A small monitor was also mounted in front of the competitor, so he could see his score immediately he fired the shot.

Soon after the first few competitors started their first slow run, the pace was set to what proved at the end, one of the most exciting competitions held.

Russian competitor, Valeri Postoianov, scored a 198:200, setting a personal record for himself.

History repeated itself when after the first day the Russian team took the lead and eventually set a new world team record of 1527 points, 31 points higher than the official record set in Melbourne last year.

A reason for the higher scores set this year is not only the improved ability of the competitors, but also a major factor was the new target being used for the first time in international competitions which had a larger 10 ring scoring area. This area was enlarged from 50 to 60 millimetres. Even the Russians had to admit that some of their 10's would have been 9's on the old target.

The USSR continued to set the pace on the second day and managed to open the gap between their nearest competitors (Germany) even more.

America had all the confidence in the world at the beginning of the match to keep up with the Russian team this year, but found themselves in 6th place after the first day. However, on the second day they re-won their spirit, and managed to win the bronze medal with a hard-earned 1466 points.

The results after the completion of the fixed run team events were: 1. USSR (new world record): 1527 points; 2. Germany: 1475 points; 3. USA 1466 points.

The Australian team found the going a bit tough, however they did not disgrace themselves and finished up in tenth position with 1369 points. Last was Japan with 1216 points.

New world records also fell in the individual scores. 25 year old Columbian, Helmut Bellingrodt, who won the bronze in Melbourne last year, put in a terrific effort in his last fast run (96:100) to win the individual lorrels in the fixed run event.

He tied a score of 577:600 with Valeri Postoianov, but was declared winner on countback. This score broke the existing world record by 4 points. Russian shooter Alexandr Gazov ran a close third with 572 points.

Altogether 64 shooters competed in this event and top Australian shooter was Mark Kotrick in 30th position with 537 points, followed by Les Johnson (37) 528, Kym Cobbin (41) 526 and John Peek (57) 469.

In the mixed run event (40 shots) the team trophy again was won by the USSR setting another new world record with 1533 points. Second place was filled by the Hungarian team with 1482 points and third was Sweden with 1468 points. The Australian team finished tenth with 1406 points.






AUSTRALIAN CLAY TARGET SHOOTING NEWS

Individual Australians did rather well in this event, but their biggest handicap was lack of experience. Nerves were on edge and this seemed to effect the younger competitors more than the older age group. This was peculiar to the competitors from all nations.

It could be pure coincidence, but the more mature Australians seemed to have better control over themselves and this showed up in their scores.

Les Johnson, our oldest RB shooter, tied his score of 365 with Charly Davies (USA) and Per Andes Lingunan (Sweden) both known to our readers from their performance in Melbourne last year. Les finished up in 15th place. Mark Kotrick finished up 29th, with a score of 354, only one point behind Ed Moeller (USA). Five points behind in 34th place was Kym Cobbin with a score of 349 and John Peek finished 39th with 338 points. Last competitor was Kobori Eiji of Japan with 248 points.

Of course the title and new world record again went to USSR shooter Valeri Postoianov with a score of 385 points. Postoianov bettered the world record he set in Melbourne last year (383) by two points. Again he admitted that the new target helped him to achieve this success. Second was Alexandr Kediarov (USSR) (384) and third place went to another Russian competitor, Alexandr Gazov with 383 points.

Having a chat with the Russian coach, Iogan Nikitin, we found that he actually speaks perfect English, so in fact did the whole Russian team. This was quite amazing, as the same fellows in Melbourne in 1973 pretended not to speak a word. However, most of the Russian team's success in winning is due to the fact that every member practises 5 hours a day!! Makes you wonder when they work, doesn't it?

#### Shot gun

The shotgun range was also located at Bergfeld, near Bern. The grounds featured 3 skeet layouts and 3 trench. The background on all layouts was heavily timbered pine forest and yellow clays had to be used.

The clubhouse at this range was one of the most elaborate ones ever seen. The whole decor was kept in a traditional European hunting setting. Three large and heavy oak tables had the foundation members' names carved into the top and matching handcarved chairs featured each member's family crest. The walls were adorned with hunting trophies and the main "chandelier" was a mounted eagle holding a heavy log in his claws, from which a dozen lights were suspended.

In one corner of the room was a heavily carved and decorated bar and opposite to this was a magnificent stone fireplace. On the mantlepiece was a collection of handcarved wooden game animals, donated as trophies by some of the members.

An interesting feature were the tall partition nets in between the shooting stations, to stop the clays from crossing into the other layouts in the skeet events. Saturday the 21st September was the first day of the trap events.

Right from the beginning French competitor Michael Carrega set the pace. Carrega has won two world championships in the past, the last one in Phoenix in 1970.

This seasoned Frenchman shot his first 75 birds without a miss. Two Americans, James Poindexter and Walter Zobell, only missed one bird each at this stage.

Last year's world champion, Russian competitor Alexandr Androschkin, lost concentration and was three targets down.

At this stage the whole French team showed a considerable lead, with East Germany and both USA and Italy hard on their heels.

However, after the second day, the battle really began, and as an end result and 600 targets there was only one target between France and Italy. The victory and gold medal finally went to the French team, due to the excellent shooting ability of Carrega (149 points) and Jean-Jacques Band (146). The Italian team was probably the most evenly matched team with only 2 points separating the individual scores. They managed to secure the silver medal with only one target behind the French.

Thanks to Poindexter and Blasi, America secured the bronze.

Results of the team event trap, gentlemen: 1st France 578 points; 2nd Italy 577 points; 3rd USA 571 points; 10th Australia 555 points; 27th PNG 436 points.

An outstanding achievement was made by Australia's Jimmy Ellis, who put up a fantastic battle to finish in 4th place with only one target separating him from the bronze medal. Olympic Trench has only been shot by the Australian for 10 months and knowing Jim's lack of practising due to his job, it is even a bigger credit to his shooting ability. (Jim toils in the far north west of Western Australia.


40 year old Michael Carrega equalised the world record of 199:200 set by Angelo Scalzone during the Olympic Games in Munich in 1972.

A real battle developed between the two Italian shooters Giorgio Rosatti and Silvano Basagni, who after 200 targets equalled score with 195 targets. The first round of 25 birds in the shoot-off still showed no decision and a second round had to be shot. However, Rosatti showed a remarkable coolness and finally secured himself the silver medal after the 41st bird in the shoot-off.



#### Trap - ladies

An outstanding performance by Canadian lass Susan Nattrass won her the world champion title and gold medal. Outstanding in so far that Susan only the week previous to winning this title left a hospital bed in Edmonton after an operation on her stomach. By winning the gold medal, Susan also equalled the world record set by Baroness Von Soden in 1963 (143:150). The only chance Susan had to practice in Bern was one round of 25 targets the day of the official opening.

After the first day of shooting and 75 targets on the scoreboard, French shooter Francoise Robrolle held second place, but lost this position to Audrey Grosch (USA) by one point at the end of the competition. World champion Von Soden had to settle for 9th place.

#### Skeet

Up until now the weather was relatively good for the time of the year in Switzerland. Although it got colder from day to day, and one could watch the snowline creeping down the mountains every morning, it did not effect the shooting very much. Until the first morning of practice in the skeet events. The wind became so strong that it pulled some of the dividing nets down and then the rain came. It eased off a bit when actual competition started, but the conditions were still far from good.

After the first day's shooting Poland looked like winning the gold in the team event, followed by Denmark and then Russia. However, the Russians proved to be too strong and after a shoot-off took the

title from Poland with a score of 572:97. Denmark slipped back to fifth place and the US team managed to move into 3rd and secure the bronze medal.

1st Korchinskaia Larisa USSR, 142; 2nd Brixner Saskia Germany, 141; 3rd Melande Eivor Sweden 140.

And so on the eve of September 28th the 41st World Shooting Championships ended. The closing ceremony again was held at the stadium Lachen and it rained, rained, rained. Altogether twelve new world records were set and seven existing records equalised. It was the feeling of everyone that this could have been improved if the weather would have been kinder in the last few days. Nevertheless, it was one experience a lot of Australians will not forget and will encourage them to be one of the competitors again at the next eliminations.

In 1978, Seoul, Capital of Korea, will be the host for the 42nd World Shooting Championships.

## BONANZA WINCHESTER TOURNAMENT IN 1975

## More prizes to win — more clubs participating

Twenty gun clubs in six states will be conducting the 1975 Winchester Tournament between January and June, inclusive.

State finals, a new feature of the tournament will be held between mid June and mid July. Another new feature is a teams event to be contested by the A, B and C Grade winners at each location shooting as a team against their counterparts at other locations. Valuable prizes will be awarded to the winning team.

The Grand Final, where the six state finalists will compete for an overseas air ticket and liberal expense allowance, will be held at the Brisbane Gun Club during the club's Exhibition Carnival Shoot in August 75.

An enlarged prize list includes: twenty portable television sets, sixty gas barbecues, three model 1400 ventilated rib automatic shotguns, many thorsands of shells, a weekend in Brisbane for each state level winner, assistance to location winners to travel to attend the state final event, and for the grand final winner — a return air ticket to New Zealand to attend the 1976 New Zealand National Championships plus 5200 expense allowance.

Here is what you can win for one \$12 nomination:

Grand final winner: Return air ticket to New Zealand plus \$200 expense allowance; Winchester Perpetual Cup to hold for a year; Replica cup to keep; Overall grand final winner's badge; Overall grand final winner's sash.

Second and third places recognised with a sash and badge each.

State final winner: Return air ticket to Brisbane from the respective interstate capital city (Townsville in case of NQ); Two nights accommodation at Brisbane to contest the grand final (B&B); Winchester shells free for state and grand final contestants; State final winner badge and sash.

## State final

Same as club level event. It is anticipated that conducting clubs will shoot a club event in conjunction.

The nominations into a club event held in conjunction will be added to travel subsidies enabling state finalists to compete in both tournament, state final and club event at no additional cost.

100 targets double barrel off 16 metres, broken targets to count, shoot to finality. Tied places shoot-off as points score.

#### Teams event

The A, B and C grade winners at each location will shoot as a team at 30 targets off 16 metres points score. The total of the team members' points will be the location team score. The team with the highest score will be the winning team.

Any tie among teams will be broken by count back procedures.

The managing director of Winchester Australia, Mr Ross Baillie in issuing an invitation to all registered ACTA shooters to compete said that the support given by shooters to previous tournaments had encouraged Winchester to expand the tournament in 1975. He said that he hoped that the extensive prize list provided by Winchester would be recognised by shooters as indicating Winchester's genuine desire to make worthwhile contributions towards shooting

The total value of the prizes exceeds \$12,500. Mr Baillie said that if support for the tournament continued along the growth pattern so far established, he expected many more clubs would have the opportunity of participating in future tournaments.

Mr Baillie expressed appreciation for the practical contributions and co-operation of the ACTA, the officials of conducting clubs and participating shooters who have helped to make the tournament the success is has undoubtedly been over the six years it has been conducted.

Mr Baillie wished all contestants success in the forthcoming 75 Winchester Tournament.

## SAFETY PROCEDURES

All affiliated ACTA member clubs and their registered shooters are familiar with and do constantly put into practice the SAFETY procedures that have been handed down to us from our forbears.

Constant attention to these methods provides the training and confidence required by our sons and daughters so that they in turn can follow their chosen sports with the utmost satisfaction and confidence.

It is the application of these self-imposed procedures that becomes our aim in bringing out the best of all competitors. Safety procedures go hand in hand with competitor satisfaction.

From time to time we shall publish various aspects of shotgun shooting procedures. Although these aspects may principally portray the two accepted methods of clay target shooting, that is down the line (or trap) shooting and skeet shooting, we are also covering field shooting, as many of us are still ardent field shooters for furred or feathered game and the safe gun handling procedures are common throughout such usages.


The following sequence of photographs provides a pictorial basis for the training of newcomers to clay target shooting, and the procedures are world wide.


Right: The referee stands at the rear of the shooters, between the tracks, so that he has an uninterrupted view at all times of the tracks, the shooters and the shoot procedure. The decision of the referee is final and he is solely in charge of all operations on the shooting tracks. Shooters when moving to the tracks must keep clear of the referee.


Below right: The WRONG way to hold and release the target from an electric release trap. Using the tip of the thumb or the tap of any finger frequently produces a "SLOW PULL."

Below: The correct way to release a button for the instant flight of a target from an electric release trap.














This man might be a successful grazier type but he also knows when and how to place his empty shotgun safely and carefully in the gun rack.









Shooters lined up on 27 yds at Mildura Gun Club for a new type of novelty event known in America at the Annie Oakley. In centre, Ken Wakefield lines up to shoot with Ted Wilkinson backing up. Should Ken miss and Ted break the target, Ken is out. It then becomes Ted's turn to shoot with next shooter in line backing up and trying to put him out should he miss.

If you shoot at a target already broken by the shooter you are backing up you are out yourself.

A shooter is allowed two misses and is automatically out on the second miss. There is no penalty to a shooter backing up should he miss. The last shooter in line is backed up by the first shooter. The event is continued until only one shooter is left and he takes whatever money was in the box when the event started. The event is shot single barrel. Mildura 2nd and 3rd November, 1974.
