

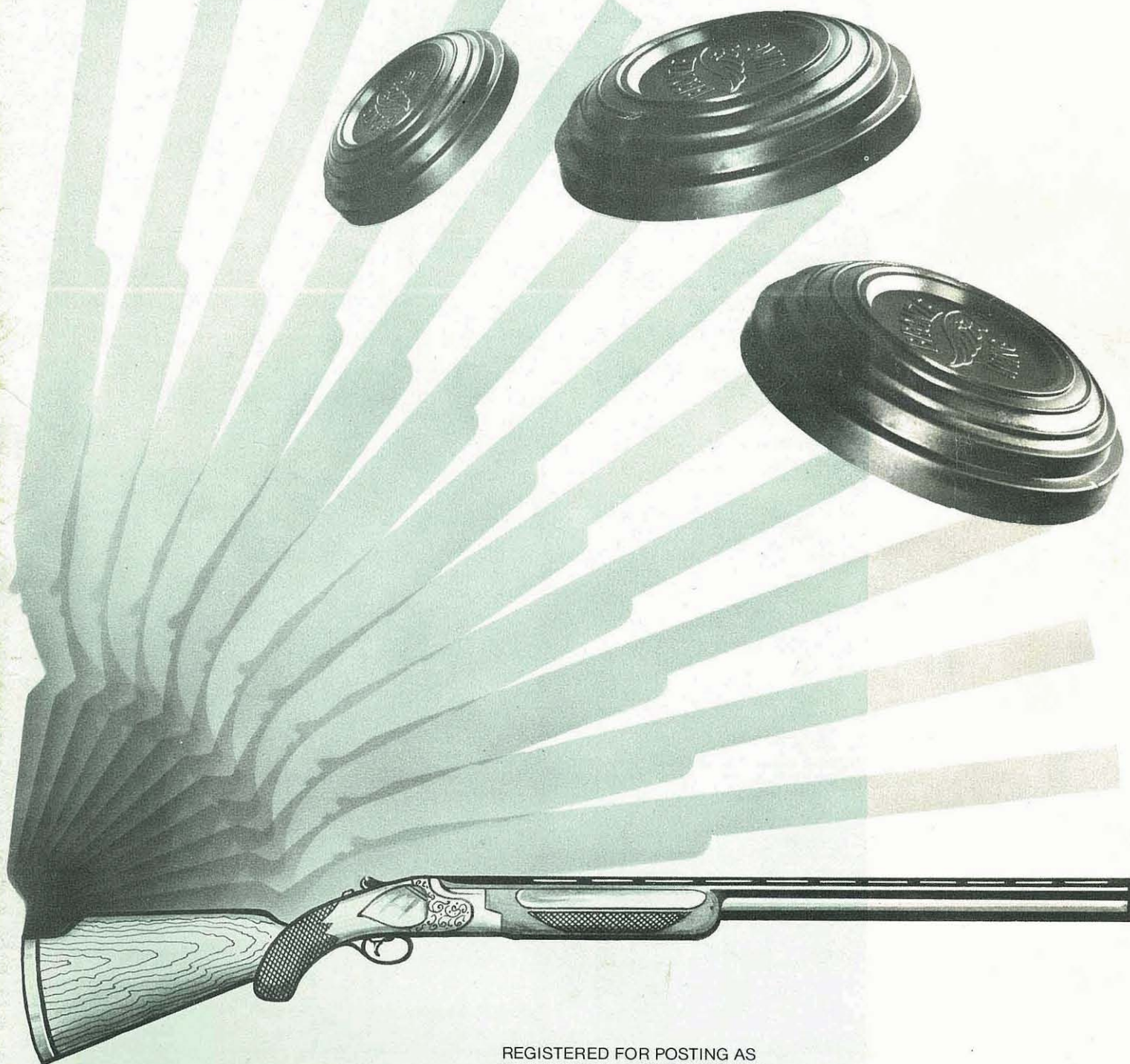

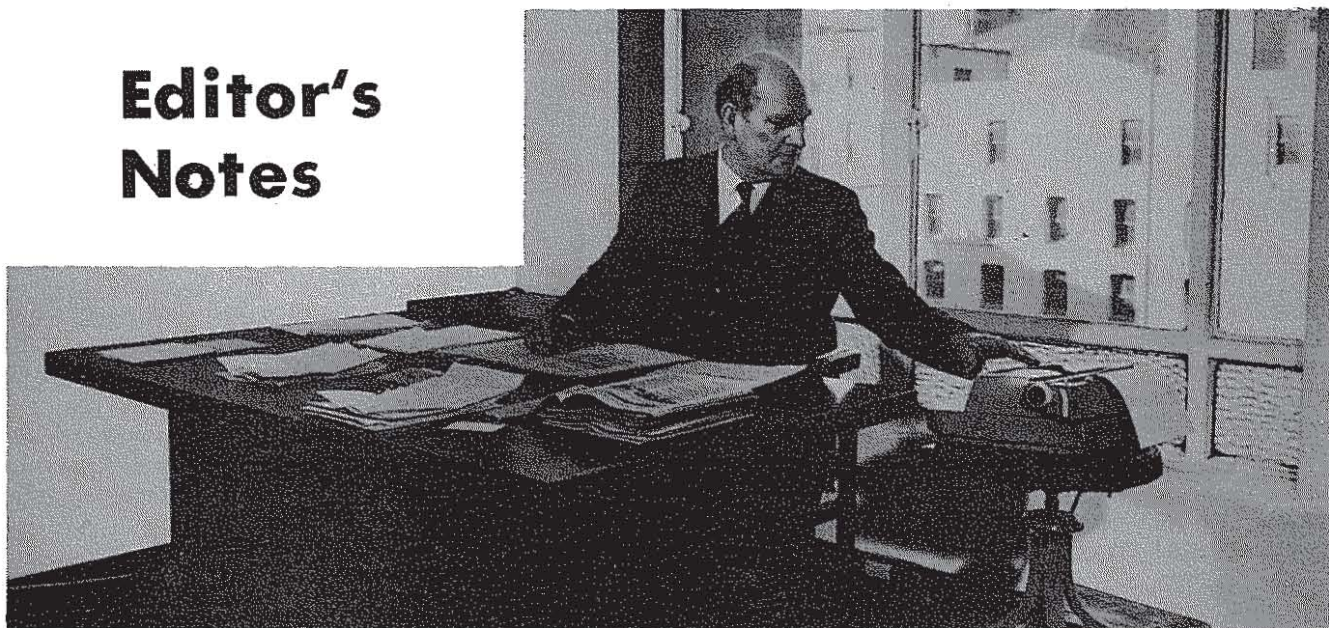

Editor's Notes



The Association's 39th Annual General Meeting of member club delegates and representatives was held on March 7, 1975, at Launceston, Tasmania and at the meeting:

1. Delegate/representative attendance was:

However, of these, two from New South Wales, who signed the register and subsequently voted, claimed they were the club delegates yet ACTA had had neither requests from the clubs concerned for the appropriate forms, nor had any such indication been received, nor at the date of final compilation of those meeting minutes from the stenographer verbatim draft and the association secretary draft have any of these clubs replied or responded in any way to the forms as were subsequently mailed to them on 21-3-75 to confirm any such delegate change. The situation was reported to national president Mr Gordon Hall as the meeting was commencing. Mr Hall asked that the clubs be sent the forms as indicated above trusting that they be confirmed.

2. Recorded "with sympathy and regret the loss during 1974 of our executive committeeman and mate Mr Harold Smith."

3. Recorded (i) that Australian shotgunners had won the 1974 International Trap Teams' Match with

its 7288:7500 points score. This was the 12th occasion within the 28 matches to 1974 that Australia had emerged the winners.

(ii) that the West Australian team won the 1974 Interstate Skeet Teams' match with its score of 485:500.

(iii) that the New South Wales team won the 1974 Interstate Trap Teams' match with its score of 1480:1500.

(iv) that the venue for the 1976 Australian National Clay Target Championships will be Perth, Western Australia.

4. Chairman: "There will be no team sent (at ACTA cost) this (1975) year as many costs were received for the 1974 overseas teams for which we were unprepared."

5. Chairman: National President Mr Gordon Hall — "Before we move to the election of officers I will ask your indulgence for one moment. As you are aware, this is the final meeting, as far as I am concerned as president of your association and I would like to read a report of my own and I would like it written into the minutes if you agree." (The report, as published in May 1975 ACTA Shooting News, was received with acclamation).

6. Mr Massey, Executive Committeeman from Clermont, Queensland then came to the chairman's table and in taking over the microphone, addressed the meeting:—

I am going to take over and I am going to be president for a few moments. The purpose of this is on behalf of the executive committee to say a few words about our president who is retiring.

During his term of office we all have seen a lot of changes in procedures to the different things in clay target shooting and as you realise all of those changes

have been for the betterment of the association. We of the executive have been helped greatly by having a president of the calibre of Gordon, without him I do not think some of the difficult decisions could have been made in the manner in which they have been made. I know that a lot of people may disagree with some of the decisions the executive make but after all some of those people who disagreed — it might do them good sometime to go up and sit on the executive. Gordon's position as president, as you all realise, is demanding, he is a target for — here from everyone of you and he has a great ability of keeping harmony and also overcoming all these problems. His personal expenses are great and as you also know he is not reimbursed for these things.

I, on behalf of the executive commend him on the term of office which he has now retired from and I will say this, that he has set a very high standard for the president who is going to follow him.

Ladies and gentlemen, on behalf of the executive committee I would like to make this small presentation in appreciation from us to our retiring president Gordon Hall.

(Acclamation)

Mr Hall replied (feelingly):

Thank you very much. I think that was very nice of you. I appreciate it greatly. I see that it is a whisky jug, with one pint capacity. This would be about right after tonight. Thank you very much Noel, and for the sentiments expressed. I think I have said sufficient and you know my feelings, it is unnecessary to say any more.

7.1 For the conduct of the balloting for the position of association president, chairman Mr Hall then called for scrutineers who were not delegates and accepted were:

7.2 Robin Bailey (Perth), Elgin Gates (USA), Mervyn Lyons (Queanbeyan-Canberra), Richard Burton (Geraldton).

7.3 A double count was made of club delegates/representatives who had been asked to stand and 118 serially numbered ballot papers (for 113 delegates and 5 executive committeemen) were issued to the scrutineers after the chairman had checked that all delegates and members of the executive committee entitled to vote had received ballot papers.

7.4 Having received the results of the ballot from the scrutineers, the chairman announced Mr Allen Pedersen as association president for 1975.

(Acclamation)

7.5 Mr Pedersen responded to further acclamation.

7.6 Mr Hall then congratulated Mr Pedersen and stated "Mr Pedersen, you will have my support in every way possible."

8. It was then moved and carried by acclamation that Mr Gordon H. Hall be granted an Honorary Life Registration within the association.

9. (NOTE: Inserted by Secretary).

9.1 At a meeting of the executive committee in

Launceston on the previous Sunday (March 2), Mr Hall had extended his "good wishes to both candidates (for the 1975 national presidency) and it has been the practice that the newly declared person stands when he is elected . . . I seek your guidance accordingly."

9.2 Chairman had then read a letter from the association solicitors on the matter, as had been requested by him.

9.3 The executive committee had then accepted a motion that "the existing president be requested to continue until the business of the meeting is concluded."

10. Chairman read a telegram of good wishes from Mr R. H. Sailer, President American Amateur Trapshooting Association which was received with acclamation.

11. Balloting for the positions of executive committeemen.

11.1 Chairman: You will recall at the last annual meeting, we passed that there will be one additional member from Western Australia, South Australia and Queensland.

I am delighted to welcome the representative from Western Australia and I DECLARE MR ROBIN BAILEY the second executive member from Western Australia in conjunction with Mr Holtfreter.

(Acclamation)

11.2 Chairman: From South Aust., Mr Mules has held the field for South Australia for many years and now he is to be assisted by Mr Robert J. Rossiter and I DECLARE MR ROSSITER the duly appointed second executive member for South Australia.

(Acclamation)

11.3 For Tasmania there is only one person to be elected and I DECLARE MR DONALD R. TAYLOR re-elected unopposed.

(Acclamation)

11.4 Three scrutineers (Robert Schwartz, Geelong; Frank Buemi, Narrogin; Bruce Hall, Bairnsdale) were then called to distribute, collect and count 21 ballot papers and from the results they handed to him the chairman DECLARED MESSRS. L. S. R. STEWART and G. R. PORTER as duly elected executive committeemen for the State of Queensland.

(Acclamation)

11.5 Five scrutineers (Terry McCarthy, Metropolitan; Ossie Schmidt, Cunnamulla; I. J. Halbert, CMT-Cunderdin, Ossie H. Schmidt, Charleville) were then called to distribute, collect and count 36 serially numbered ballot papers and from the results the chairman DECLARED MESSRS. A. M. BURGESS and E. F. HAWKINS as duly elected executive committeemen for New South Wales.

(Acclamation)

11.6.1 Five scrutineers (S. E. Rooke, Wagga; Len Toyne, Tasmanian; Richard Burton, Geraldton; Fred Lang, Terranora Lakes; John Hall, Burnie) were then called to distribute, collect and count 40 serially

numbered ballot papers and from the results the chairman DECLARED MESSRS. LAURIE CONNORS and KEVIN DOBSON as duly elected executive committeemen for the State of Victoria.

(Acclamation)

11.6.2 The chairman then noted from the scrutineers that three of the Victorian voting papers were invalid.

12. Mr Gordon Hall then handed the chairmanship of the meeting to newly elected national president Mr Allan Pedersen.

13.1 Mr Allan Pedersen, a duly elected Victorian Executive Committeeman for 19 years, (and also being the association vice-president for the 1974 year) had now been elected by the meeting as the association's national president for 1975, but, as his term of office as a committeeman had one year yet to be completed, a casual vacancy occurred for this 1975 year.

13.2 Under the Association Articles the executive committee during a subsequent committee meeting on Monday March 10, 1975, elected Mr Robert F. Buchan to fill the casual vacancy on the committee during the 1975 year.

13.3 Under the Association Articles a person so appointed "shall retain his office only until the next annual general meeting."

14.1 Under the Association Articles, "the members of the executive committee shall at the first meeting of the committee held after each election elect from their number a vice-president who shall hold that office until the next annual general meeting."

14.2 Consequently, during the executive committee meeting on Monday, March 10, 1975, from a secret ballot, the chairman DECLARED MR PETER L. PAPPS AS THE DULY ELECTED NATIONAL VICE-PRESIDENT OF THE ASSOCIATION FOR 1975.

GENERAL BUSINESS

15. Chairman — Mr Pedersen — "A postal poll was conducted with all member clubs during the period November 10 till January 31 for the executive committee to obtain an indication of the feelings for the continuation of A, B and C graded championships OR for the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and front marker placings for championships.

It was rather disappointing that of the 236 clubs who were sent the ballot paper, only 132 lodged their written opinion.

The outcome was that 89 were AGAINST and 43 were FOR a continuation of grading and this is taken as a recommendation to next executive committee meeting of which the committee will take due notice."

16. After some discussion that, with respect to increased costs and values, that the \$10 club annual affiliation fee be increased a MOTION was CARRIED that the executive shall look at a pro-rata scale of fees for clubs.

17. After some discussion a MOTION was CARRIED that the existing sequence of the national

championships be amended to 1976 Western Australia, 1977 Queensland, 1978 New South Wales, 1979 South Australia, 1980 Western Australia, 1981 Victoria.

(NOTES: 1. This motion of switching the venue for the years 1978 and 1979 was carried by a majority of one vote from a show of hands (43 FOR and 42 AGAINST).

2. The reason for the committee's previous sequence was to refrain from having the nationals too frequently in the one area).

18. After some discussion it was CARRIED as a submission that the executive committee examine and try to implement postal voting for national president and members of the executive committee.

19. It was CARRIED that Mr George Biggs be appointed an Honorary Life Registered Shooter on his retirement after almost 25 years of service on and off the executive committee.

20. Chairman Mr Pedersen thanked everyone present for attending; congratulated Mr Hall on his successful years before his retirement; hoped all would have good shooting for the rest of the series at Launceston; closed the meeting at 11.20 p.m.

The ACTA Executive Committee met before and during the 1975 National Championships at Launceston during early March and decided:

1. their next scheduled meeting be in Melbourne during September 8, 9 and 10, 1975.

2. at the 1975 Australian National Clay Target Championships that New Zealand shooter contestants, from the recordings on their registration cards they be accepted as 11-12 metres for "C" class, 13-15 metres for "B" class, 16 and over for "A" class and that in the handicap events they be accepted at their open handicaps plus one metre.

3. that the venue for the 1976 National Championships be the Perth Gun Club, Western Australia.

4. The 1976 national programme to be:
Wednesday, February 25, Skeet over 5 Skeet layouts.
Thursday, February 26, DR.
Friday, February 27, Grand H'cap.
Saturday, February 28, DB.
Sunday, February 29, SB.
Monday, March 1, A.N.Z. Pts.
Tuesday, March 2, Champion of Champions and International Match. These events over 5 traps.

5. Ansett Airlines be accommodation and travel agents for the 1976 National Championships.

6. The Australian section of the 1975 International Trap Teams' Match be shot from 14.683 metres (16 yards).

7. Allocated 1975 championships to the Melbourne Gun Club of Victorian State Single Barrel, Skeet, ISU Trench, ISU Skeet — at dates yet to be determined.

8. After noting a letter from the association solicitors, as had been requested by Mr Hall, the committee decided by a majority vote that the existing president be requested to continue until the business of the annual general meeting is concluded.

9. To call in the handicap cards of all shooters for the handicap events and class events of the 1975 national programme. The cards were checked and many were amended.

10. Welcomed new executive committeemen Messrs. R. H. Bailey (Perth, W.A.), R. J. Rossiter (Southern, S.A.), G. R. Porter (Brisbane, Q), L. G. Connors (Mildura, Vic.).

11. By majority vote that association vice-president for 1975 be Mr Peter L. Papps of Queanbeyan-Canberra Gun Club (vide Association Article 24).

12. To fill the casual vacancy on the committee and that Mr Robert F. Buchan of Melbourne Gun Club (Vic.) be so appointed until the next annual general meeting (vide Article 31).

13. That all clubs be given the option of running Commonwealth, State, District and Club Championships as graded events, OR as 1st, 2nd and 3rd plus handicap group trophies.

14. That clubs MUST conduct championship events graded or otherwise, as advertised.

15. That shoot-off targets be included in percentage calculations.

16. That the respective rule amendments, both trap and skeet, as separately listed in the May 1975 ACTA Shooting News be effective as from 1st May, 1975.

17. That the 1975 Australian Trench Championships (at Hobart in March 1975) have no bearing on the selection of any shotgunners who may go to the 1975 UIT (ISU) World Moving Target Championships at Munich.

18. That an elimination and selection programme be published in preparation for a team for the 1976 Olympic Games in Montreal.

(NOTE: Contained separately within this publication.)

19. Clubs are directed that they may charge over the maximum nomination fee for championships if the normal cost of clay targets, standard or mini, at the particular club is above the state capital city price on the basis of the nett profit differential per thousand.

Contained herein are the elimination arrangements for an Australian Clay Target Team of four shooters (combined trench/skeet) for the 1975 World I.S.U. Moving Target Championships at Munich, Western Germany.

1975 championship allocations — Queensland State Night Continental Double Barrel Championship re-allocated to Central Burnett Gun Club — at a date yet to be decided.

The New Zealand National Championships for 1976 will be conducted by the Christchurch Gun Club on their grounds at Yaldhurst, approximately seven miles west of Christchurch City. The dates for the tournament will be from 20th to 27th March, 1976. Programme yet to be finalised.

A.C.T.A. Open Championships

Applications for Open Championships to be contested during 1976 (that is Commonwealth, State and District Titles) are required, under Rule 27, to be lodged, in writing on the prescribed form number 16, not later than Friday, June 27, 1975. (See page 4.)

Late applications receive no consideration.

Annually these applications are then collated and passed to the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee members concerned, and, where a State Association exists, then the respective committeemen will place these before such body for consideration.

At each September meeting of the full A.C.T.A. Executive all such application lists are tabled, considered and the decisions ratified for publication in A.C.T.A. Shooting News.

Member clubs are requested to measure their applications and to apply only for championships which can be satisfactorily conducted by the club between January 1 and December 31, 1976.

Preference will be given to clubs which — (a) have the capacity to conduct the various types of shoots, i.e., the capacity in both equipment and current management. (Note — oscillating traps must be used, that is — Snipe, Dams, Winchester, and the like, but NOT "plus" traps.)

(b) have submitted proposed dates together with their requested title events.

Those championships allocated by the Executive Committee for the 1975 year will be published in November 1974, "Clay Target Shooting News".

If no club advertising material has arrived two months before a Commonwealth Title event, then the Secretary-Editor is empowered to insert an appropriate advertisement and to charge the club concerned at the late insertion rate.

Clubs allocated State Titles events by the Committee are expected to advertise these State events in A.C.T.A. "Shooting News".

Shoot approvals will be issued, in writing, and are subject to the correct interpretations of A.C.T.A. Rules by the clubs concerned and are designed to avoid clashing of major programmes with nearby clubs.

Commonwealth, State or District Championships will not be allocated to clubs which fail to either apply the handicapping formula correctly, or which fail to submit handicap returns for each shoot.

No trophies or prize monies may be handed to any shooter without the previous submission of his

current handicap card (see Rule 18) correctly classified and progressively marked showing his shooting performance to date. It is the responsibility of each shooter to keep his own handicap card up to date, and this information he always gains by looking at the scoreboard during, and after, contesting any

event. It is then the responsibility of the club secretary to notify A.C.T.A. central records, using the handicap return form, of any changes in —

- (a) a shooter's class for common mark shooting;
- (b) a shooter's change of handicap as prescribed in the handicapping formula.

Two instances have occurred recently where approaches have been made direct by individuals to ACTA insurers asking whether fire or storm and tempest or malicious damage or personal accident problems are included.

The facts are, the policy is as desired by the executive committee on behalf of all member clubs.

A number of insurance companies were originally asked to quote to us on shooter to shooter coverage as is prescribed within the requirements of international amateur shooting and the selected insurer so accepted by the committee provided not only the most competitive rate but also was the only insurer willing to provide us with shooter to shooter coverage within the meaning of the Acts and of unincorporated clubs in particular.

One problem is that the executive committee have neither right nor power to negotiate other covers on your behalf unless this is fully and specifically so approved in general meeting.

However, on behalf of the member clubs within this association the executive committee could negotiate further covers but such extensions to the existing coverage would incur increased premium charges.

The committee is aware of its limitations in that each club chooses to spend its own funds as it chooses, bearing in mind that clubs vary in their respective shooter member numbers, the extent and value of buildings and equipment and whether ancillary personnel are hired or just voluntary.

The existing policy covers "the legal liability", plus costs, of any registered shooter "for any accidental bodily injury to persons and/or damage to property whilst participating in an organised shoot or acting as individuals at a closed range."

The policy coverage is restricted "to association approved shooting ranges only."

Thus, self inflicted injuries or damages to a shooter's own property would not be covered. Shooters, as in their private lives, may choose to arrange their own personal accident insurance or not — but this is an individual matter for each shooter to decide — and this comment would also include those shooters working in voluntary capacities as referees etc.

1975 ISU World Moving Target Championships

Munich, Western Germany, September 11-22, 1975

Contained separately within this publication is the Australian elimination procedure for a shotgun team of four shooters (combined trap/skeet shooters).

Any such shooter who so qualifies and is subsequently selected, must be prepared to meet his own air fare/accommodation etc. expenses, as the executive committee has decided not to grant any allocation from ACTA funds for overseas teams during 1975.

The general regulations for the 1975 World Moving Target Championships in Munich, Federal Republic of Germany, are:

1. Dates

10 to 19 September, 1975.

2. Participation

To all shooters who are:

- (a) amateur
- (b) belong to a shooting federation affiliated to the International Shooting Union.

3. Secretarial Arrangements

Through the organising committee located in Wiesbaden.

4. Accommodation

Sufficient room has been made at the Holiday Inn Hotel, Munich (telephone 089-34-0971 or telex 05-215-439). Twin bedded room DM40 per person, single room DM50 (service included).

(Note: At this time of going to press, exchange rate is 3.112 DM to the Australian dollar.)

5. Transportation

Between the ranges and Holiday Inn Hotel will be free of charge for all officials, coaches and shooters. Distance approximately 4 kilometres. The Olympic Shooting Range is situated north of Munich on Federal Highway number 13.

6. Technical Information

The Olympic Shooting Range is divided into four areas. The first one contains the organisational building and restaurant with all the necessary rooms for the competition management, press, technicians and participants.

The second area is located to the west of the organisational building and contains the Rifle Hall with 102 50-m firing points for Small Bore Rifle shooting and 41 firing points for the 300 m Free Rifle and Free Pistol events.

The third area lies to the east of the organisational building and contains the Pistol Hall with eight silhouette installations at a shooting distance of 25 m for the Rapid Fire Pistol event and two installations at

a shooting distance of 50 m for the Running Target event.

In front of the Pistol Hall there are the three Trap and Skeet ranges, one spectator stand, restaurant, offices and seven rest rooms for the competitors.

7. Press

In the organisational building there will be a press centre with an interviewing room, typing pool, information centre, telephone and telex facilities.

8. Spectators

Some 5,000 spectators will be able to watch the competitions from the spectators' areas in the Rifle and Pistol Halls and from the stand on the Trap and Skeet ranges.

The Olympic Shooting Range can be reached in a matter of minutes by bus or private car on the B 13 road. Sufficient parking for cars and buses will be provided.

9. Entries

The member federations of the International Shooting Union are requested to submit their:

(a) Preliminary entries until 15th May, 1975 at the latest stating the events in which participation is intended, and the number of shooters.

(b) Final entries until 31st July, 1975 at the latest. The following data are to be submitted to the organising committee:

1. List of names of all officials, coaches and shooters as well as particulars in which events the shooters, who have been entered, will compete.

2. Day, time and place (railway station, airport) of arrival of all participants entered.

10. Entry Fees

(a) Team entry fees: For each team event an entry fee of DM 50 has to be paid.

(b) Individual entry fees: For each shooter in each event an entry fee of DM 20 is to be paid at the cash office of the organising committee.

11. Practice Targets

A fee of DM 5 is to be paid for 25 targets.

12. Drawing of Lots

The drawing of lots will take place one day before each competition and directly after an elimination in the presence of the team captains.

13. Ammunition

Trap and skeet cartridges and small bore rifle ammunition of various German and foreign makes will be for sale on the ranges.

14. Color of the Targets

Trap: black with white ring. Skeet: all black.

15. Visas

As far as visas for entry into the Federal Republic of Germany are required, those members of the International Shooting Union are asked to apply for issue at the diplomatic authorities of the Federal Republic of Germany in the respective country at least three weeks prior to departure.

ELIMINATION AND SELECTION PROCEDURE for championships and Olympic Games at Montreal, Canada, 1976.

(Dates for 1976 elimination and the actual "Games" dates will be made known when confirmed.)

A sub-committee was appointed by the ACTA executive to arrange on Monday 10th March, 1975 eliminations and selection of teams for the ISU World Moving Target Championships in Munich, Western Germany, on 11th to 22nd September, 1975 and for the 1976 Olympic Games at Montreal, Canada.

Members of the sub-committee are Messrs. Burgess, Buchan, Taylor and Papps. R. Buchan was appointed convenor of meetings.

Dates for both shoots at Munich and Montreal will be different.

Dates for Montreal eliminations and final will be published later.

Locations will remain the same for both eliminations and final. Trench: Melbourne, Canberra, Hobart with finals at Melbourne. Skeet: Melbourne, Hawkesbury, Perth with finals at Melbourne. Other skeet or 15 trap ISU grounds would be considered after suitable applications by clubs concerned.

The ACTA selected all venues, as they were the only 15 trap trench grounds and ISU skeet trap grounds in Australia at the time of selection.

Clubs will be responsible for the conduct of eliminations and final.

All results to be forwarded to the ACTA secretary.

The ACTA selection committee reserves full right on selecting team members.

Rules for eliminations and final for Munich

1. Team will be a maximum four for both trench and skeet.

2. Team members will not receive any financial assistance from the funds of the ACTA.

3. Team members will be responsible for their own cost of travel, accommodation and uniforms.

4. No team member will be allowed to compete in

the World Moving Target Championships in Munich 1975, without the sanction of the ACTA, please note.

5. Members seeking selection must compete in eliminations plus final elimination.

6. Competitors must shoot at a minimum of 400 registered targets, maximum of 600 targets.

7. A competitor shoots at 600 targets, he must delete his lowest 200 target score.

8. To compete at the final at Melbourne, a competitor must have a 90 per cent or more over the 400 target eliminations.

9. Competitors at their own discretion may compete at any of the clubs selected and a minimum of 200 targets at either clubs.

10. All targets must be in competition, it is the responsibility of the competitor to see that the club's secretary forwards results to the ACTA office.

11. Competitors who have achieved 90 per cent or better in the 400 target eliminations must compete at the final, where they will be required to shoot at 300 targets.

12. Selection of teams will be from the highest percentage of broken targets within 700 targets (i.e., 400 plus 300).

13. Trench and skeet final will be held on Saturday and Sunday, 12th and 13th July, 1975 at the Melbourne Gun Club, Victoria Road, Lilydale. (Melbourne Gun Club are conducting eliminations/qualification shoots on Sunday, May 4, 18; Saturday, May 31; Sunday, June 1, 15 and 29.)

14. Cost will be at the rate of 10 cents per target (i.e., \$20 per 200 targets. Final 3).

15. Cartridges must not exceed 1½ oz.

16. Rules as laid down by the ISU. UIT must be strictly adhered to.

17. *Competitors Note:* Method of eliminations and final elimination will remain the same for both Munich and Montreal. Only dates will be different. The number of targets for Olympic Games selection will be a minimum 600 trench at selected venues PLUS 400 at Melbourne G. C. with eliminations to be completed by end January 1976 and final elimination at Melbourne G. C. during February at a date to be announced.

Some 18 Australian shooters plus wives and children attended the New Zealand Championships at Waitemata Gun Club, about 20 miles from Auckland. The Waitemata Gun Club did a marvellous job of preparing the grounds, there were 6 down the line layouts and 4 skeet, an excellent clubhouse the setting on top of a large hill overlooking some miles of beautiful countryside.

The first day of the pre-nationals we saw Wayne Pilkington finish in 4th place for the TV set. He won two beautiful lounge chairs for his score 160:161.

The first national title was the skeet. Total entry 264 with only three possibles, the best Australian score being 48:50.

Event 2 was Double Rise. Entry 301 with one possible, 30:30. 17 shooters shot off for 2nd to 4th place. Amongst them was Wayne Pilkington and Barney Rooke finishing about 6th place.

Event 3, 25-target sparrows. 341 entries, 22 possibles, no Australian made the shoot-off.

Event 4, 50-target Single Barrel. 327 entries, 6 possibles including Brian Lowry of Geelong and Elgin Gates of USA, Elgin taking first place for the 2nd year in succession.

Event 5, 50-target Double Barrel. 435 entries with 38 possibles including Bob Smith of Goulburn, Barry Kable of Sydney, Ray Melville of Tamworth and Elgin Gates USA. The shoot off went to 110 targets when it was called off owing to failing light. At that time only 4 shooters remained including Kable and Gates, but unfortunately for Elgin Gates he was flying out to Sydney the next morning and had to withdraw. The next morning in misty rain and 15 targets later we saw Barry Kable win the New Zealand blue ribbon event.

COMPETING CLUBS

Any affiliated club in Victoria can enter the competition, and they may enter as many teams as desired for any round.

TEAMS

Teams shall consist of 5 shooters with at least 3 of these shooters financial members of the club for which they are competing. All shooters competing must produce their current ACTA registration card.

EVENTS

Home clubs will conduct the events on their respective dates.

Each round will consist of two separate events:

(1) A 20 target Double Barrel Common Mark event;

(2) A 20 target Handicap Double Barrel event.

Both events will be part of the home club's normal programme, with the TEAMS PREMIERSHIP round being shot in conjunction.

SQUADDING

Each team of 5 shooters from a participating club will be made into a separate squad, and will shoot as a team.

The same shooters must shoot in the one team in both events on any particular round.

SCORING

Each participating club will receive 5 points in each round at which they are represented by at least one team.

The winning team each round will be the team whose members have broken the most targets over both programmed events. This makes a team possible of 200.

Points will be allocated for the first four placings each round, with the stipulation that any one club can only receive points for one placing, irrespective of the number of teams entered from that club. This means that no matter how many teams are entered from a club, the highest scoring team from that club will be the only team whose score will count.

Points allocated to the winning team each round = 5 points.

Points allocated to the second team each round = 3 points.

Points allocated to the third team each round = 2 points.

Points allocated to the fourth team each round = 1 point.

These points are in addition to the club's 5 points for attendance.

SHOOT OFFS

Should any shoot offs be required to decide the winning team or Team High Gun each round, such shoot offs will be conducted from Handicap marks. In team event, 5 targets per shooter.

TROPHIES: EACH ROUND

The winning club each round will receive a special pennant.

The winning team members each round will receive a suitable trophy as a memento of their effort.

The TEAM HIGH GUN over the two events each round will receive a suitable trophy.

A complete list of up-to-date scores and positions of both clubs and individual shooters will be posted out each month.

TROPHIES: FOR SEASON

The PREMIER CLUB will be the club who has received the most points.

If any shoot off is necessary, it will be conducted after the final round.

If a shoot off is held, the clubs concerned may nominate their best team as their representative.

The PREMIER CLUB will receive the IMI AUSTRALIA PERPETUAL SHIELD to hold for twelve months, plus a replica to retain at their club.

The individual shooter who has broken the most targets over the 9 programmed rounds will receive the MICHAELIS BAYLEY OVERALL HIGH GUN trophy.

The individual shooter who has broken the most targets over the 9 programmed common mark events will receive the WINCHESTER AUSTRALIA HIGH GUN (Common Mark) trophy, plus the special sash donated by KINGFLIGHT INDUSTRIES.

The individual shooter who has broken the most targets over the 9 programmed Handicap events will receive the GUTHRIE TRADING HIGH GUN (Handicap) trophy, plus the special sash donated by KINGFLIGHT INDUSTRIES.

NOMINATION FEES

Each competing TEAM will be charged a nomination fee of 50 cents per shooter per round. The total of these 50 cents is to be forwarded to the secretary of the premiership committee, and these funds will be used in the following manner:

Advertising, printing and postage expenses.

Purchase of pennants for each round.

Balance to be used to cover expenses for the presentation celebrations after the final round.

PRESENTATIONS

The presentation of all trophies will be held after the last round at METROPOLITAN. Any necessary shoot offs will be conducted on that date. We hope that we will be able to arrange a free night of food, drink and entertainment for all competing clubs.

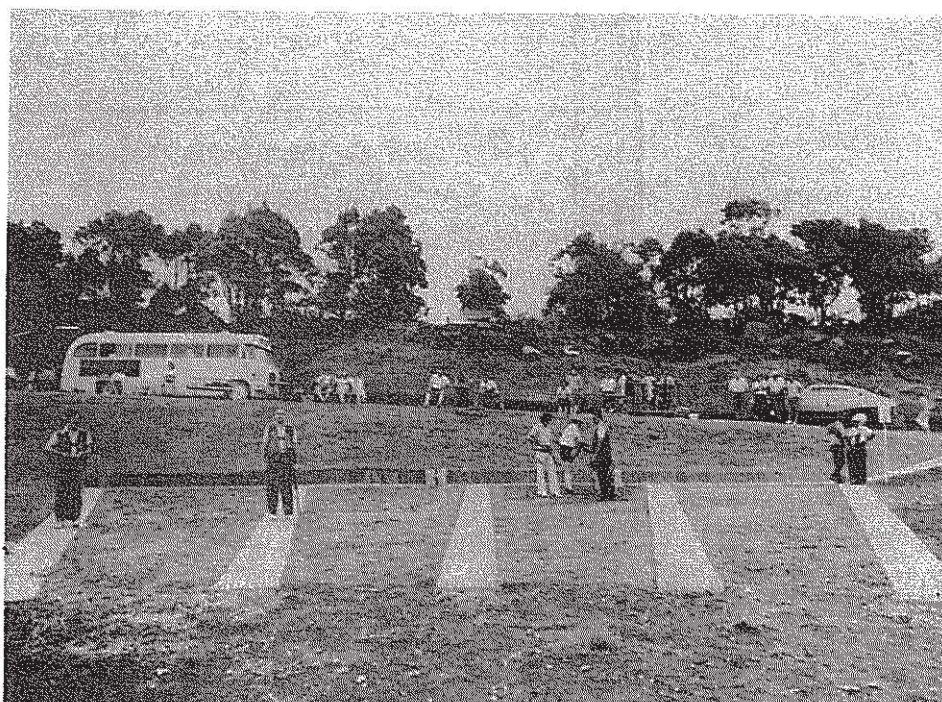

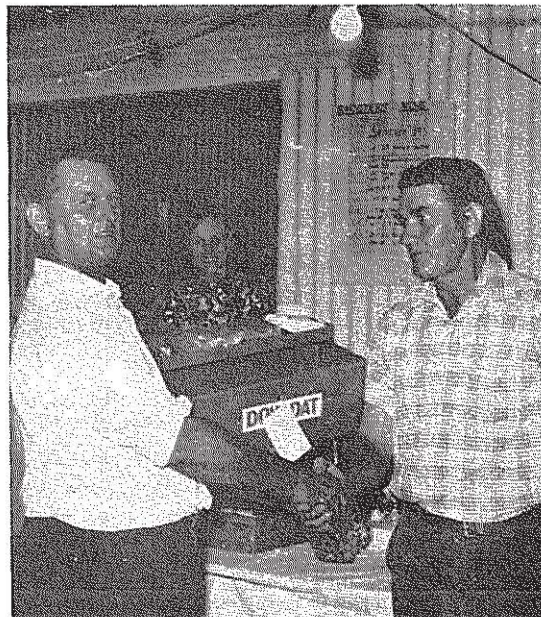
