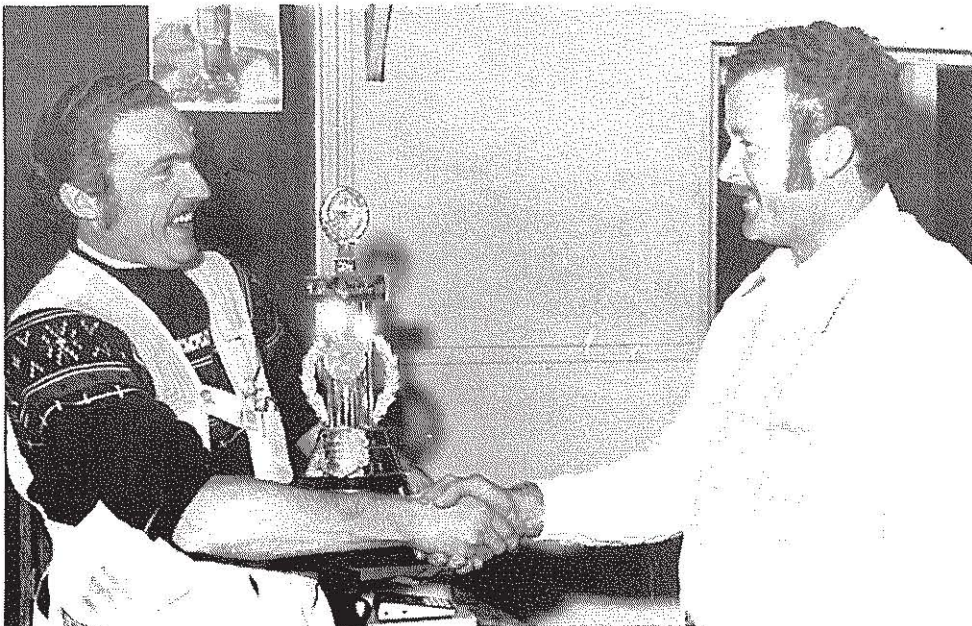

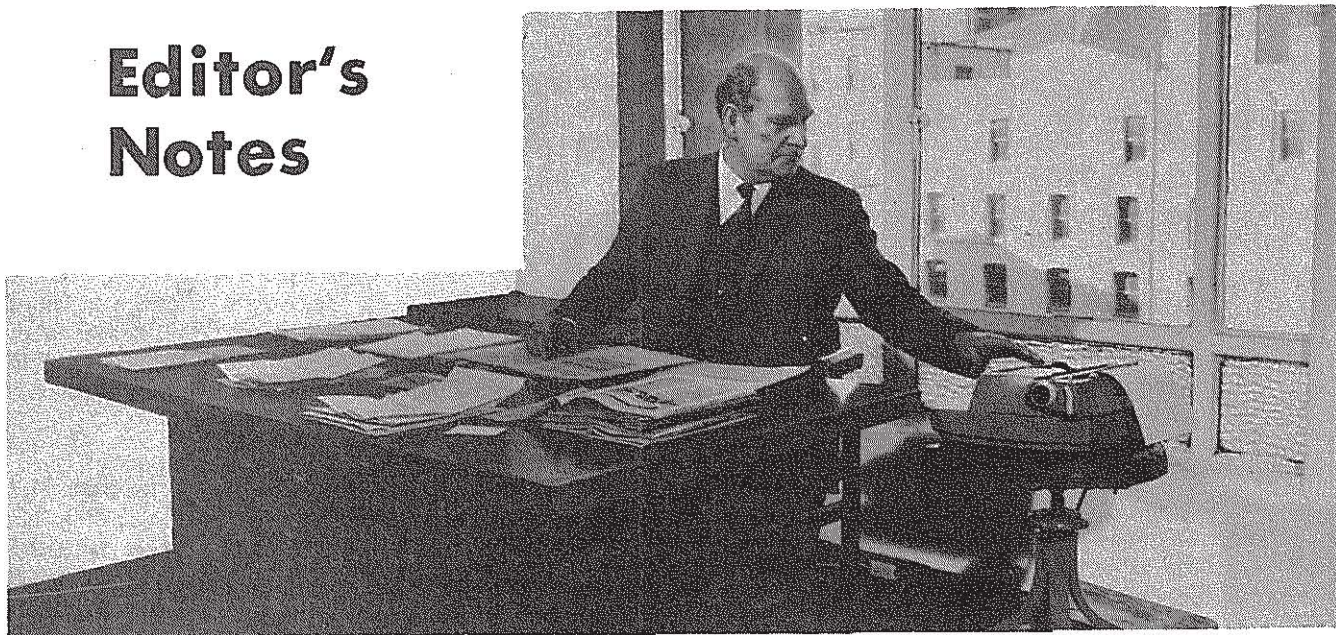

Editor's Notes



By direction of the Executive Committee the publication of a full list of shooter registrations from ACTA central records is now discontinued because of the growth of shooter numbers and also because of the increasing cost of space in any publication.

Clubs and shooters alike are reminded that all shooters are required to present their current handicap cards when nominating at clay target shoots and for shooting scores to be entered on the cards together with any alterations from common mark class and/or handicap events.

During May each year, a reminder notice is mailed to those shooters who appear to have overlooked their annual registration renewal. By simple oversight, some shooters holding current handicap cards received such notices.

Early this year we renewed much of our mechanized mailing list — because of wear and tear — and it was during this period some sections were slow in being discarded, however, some shooters have found that their registration renewals, although paid to their club, had not been forwarded to the association.

On July 12-13, at the Melbourne Gun Club, a managing sub-committee conducted the final eliminations to select a team of four clay target shooters to represent Australia at the 1975 World Moving Target Championships at Munich, Western Germany in September. Australian shotgunners should be well represented overseas during August/September 1975 as:

1. August 10 to 14 some will be attending the New Caledonia Championships in Noumea (see July Shooting News).

2. August 23 to September 3 a group will be shooting clay targets in Singapore.

3. September 10 to 19 — our top four available trench shooters will be competing at Munich in the 1975 World Moving Target Championships. No Skeet shooters, either team or individual, are being sent to Munich as in the opinion of the managing sub-committee, we have no shooters available with sufficient qualifying background.

Australian sport took a major step forward with Australia's first national seminar for sports coaches held in Melbourne from 29 to 31 May.

Delegates acclaimed the seminar as one of the most significant steps taken to develop sport in Australia and decided to form an Australian Coaches Association.

More than 230 coaches from nearly 70 different sports attended the three-day seminar organised by the Australian Department of Tourism and Recreation and the Australian Sports Council. ACTA had a representative present.

The seminar formed a major element in the Australian Government's sports assistance programme for 1975.

The seminar brought together top coaches to discuss common problems, explore modern training methods, evaluate recent research and promote discussion of a national coaching scheme in Australia.

Delegates agreed that the seminar will have far reaching effects in the application of better coaching techniques as its conclusions are absorbed throughout Australia.

The seminar agreed that there was an urgent need to upgrade sports coaching if Australia was not to slip behind in international performance.

The Minister for Tourism and Recreation, Mr Frank Stewart, said after the seminar that coaches throughout Australia now had a basis on which to build a national coaching system.

Within the State of Victoria, a Firearms Training Fund was established in 1973 by the Victorian State Government to be administered by the Victorian Chief Secretary as indicated in May, 1974 ACTA Shooting News. A number of clubs acted as hosts and supplied grounds, equipment and referees free of cost to recognised school groups. Expenses were meticulously kept and applications were submitted by the clubs concerned to ACTA Secretary for approval and for onward submission with recommendations. From an initial fund of \$7,000 some \$2,375.10 has recently been distributed to eight clay target shooting clubs for reimbursement of their listed outgoings.

A list of such recent payments directly from the fund to the respective clubs is contained within an explanatory 13-6-75 letter as received from the Chief Secretary and as included in the "Editor's Mailbox" section within this August, 1975 publication of ACTA Shooting News.

Host clubs who can substantiate similar training activities during 1974/1975 may make application to ACTA Secretary for the prescribed form which should be completed and returned for inclusion in a joint submission by the Association Secretary by August 15.

The chief secretary also requires that all school clubs, who conduct firearms training with shotguns, affiliate with the controlling body of clay target shooting in Australia — The Australian Clay Target Association — otherwise they cannot be considered for financial assistance from the firearms training subsidy.

Such clubs must have their own shooting ground

and/or an arrangement with an ACTA affiliated member club. Students must register as students — that is, for \$1.00 per calendar year and for which they would receive an ACTA registration handicap card. The school would receive a copy of ACTA Shooting News for its library. Registered students would be included in the ACTA shooter to shooter insurance policy.

As some member clubs appear to be a little unclear as to the coverage in the ACTA shooter to shooter policy, a self-explanatory copy of ACTA's letter of 3 July, 1975 to the Upper Hunter Gun Club, New South Wales is contained within this publication under the "Editor's Mailbox" section.

Shooters when travelling interstate with their shotguns are advised that at any time the police in each state may challenge or seek to investigate the contents of a vehicle or baggage for unusual transport of firearms. Most of the Australian States require that each shooter must carry a current shooting permit when in possession of firearms and as each state within the Commonwealth issues and administers its own shooting permits applicable within its own state then shooters proceeding from one state to another state are recommended to make enquiries at the nearest police station when they cross any border.

The Executive Committee of this Association is next scheduled to meet, under its Articles, on Monday and Tuesday, September 8 and 9 and maybe into the third day Wednesday. The meeting will be conducted in the Naval and Military Club, 27 Little Collins Street, Melbourne, commencing 9.30 a.m. each day.

To whom it may concern. The State of New South Wales is about to adopt stricter gun handling and shooting laws in line with the State of Victoria.

The New Zealand National Championships for 1976 are scheduled to be conducted at Christchurch as:— March 20-21: Pre-National Shoot; March 22: Single Barrel Championship and N.Z. v Overseas Visitors Teams' Match; March 23: Single Rise Double Barrel Championship; March 24: Mackintosh Team Qualifying Matches (2) and Glenn Cup; March 25: Mackintosh Team Match and Sparrow Championship (Mini Targets); March 26: Double Rise Championship and Skeet Championship; March 27: Completion of Skeet Championship and Aust. v N.Z. Skeet Match.

An evening to welcome overseas visitors will be held on Monday, March 22.

EAR PROTECTION FOR THE SHOOTER

Investigations show that many efficient and acceptable devices are available providing a range of noise protection sufficient to reduce nearly all excess noise to a safe limit.

In many instances, a number of ear protectors are suitable for any particular noise and whilst selection can be made on particular features or on price, it has been found generally that ear muffs provide the greatest value.

Types of ear protectors available are ear muffs, ear plugs, canal caps and fibreglass wools. Of these, the fibreglass wools are temporary disposable ear plugs only and may be wax impregnated at the time of preparation and fitting into the ear canal.

Deafness is not necessarily noise caused and may be congenital.

Noise from shotguns could cause acoustic trauma or deafness. This takes the early form of ringing in the ears with a small notch in the hearing at high frequency level (4000 cycles per second). Initially this causes a temporary deafness then the hearing is restored after a few hours.

With continued exposure, this notch in the hearing response curve becomes wider and deeper until the point is reached where it becomes a permanent impairment. (One of the ill effects of this could occur if someone said "have a drink", and we might not hear it!!!), but these consequences need not necessarily be so because of the considerable range of ear protective devices available.

In a comparison of ear muffs with ear plugs, most of the ear muffs tested showed less variance and therefore superior fit to the best ear plug — this can be expected as it is relatively easier to make an airtight seal over the large, almost flat surface of the side of the head than inside a narrow, irregularly shaped ear canal.

For consistent trapshooting, ear muffs are probably the greatest protection available. However, in addition there are various types of plugs and fibreglass wools for those shooters who are unable to tolerate the weight and pressure of ear muffs.

In the field, duck shooters could find muffs an obstruction and the smaller types of protection plugs or fibreglass wools could be more suitable.

Where high noise level causes discomfort and occasionally pain, it is not difficult to motivate people to use ear protectors but it is difficult to convince people of the necessity for the use of ear protectors where noise levels do not have any noticeable subjective effect.

It should be remembered that once hearing is lost, there is no regeneration and shooters should give serious thoughts to the wearing of ear protectors when these are so readily available. New shooters should be made aware of the problems of hearing loss so that adequate precautions can be made.

All ear protection campaigns have the complete co-operation of the Commonwealth Acoustic Laboratories in all States of the Commonwealth and in their programmes to prevent hearing loss to sportsmen by international recognition these safety measures are fully advocated by all the advanced countries of the world.

Dear Mr Neill,

Answering your 23-6-75 letter seeking "information concerning insurance coverage for members of the public who are spectators at our shoot. Are they covered, or is it necessary for us to take out a special policy."

The ACTA policy is to cover an injury to a **THIRD PARTY** (including other shooters and for damage to property belonging to a third party) as a result of any shooting activity during participation in an authorised shoot.

Some shooters have their own **PERSONAL ACCIDENT** insurance policies and such shooters would be so covered whether at a shooting ground or at their normal daily happenings.

However, clubs may, of their own free will, take out their own separate coverage on general liability for activities outside the sphere of ACTA shooting of events or practice.

Thus, the situation with ACTA's insurance is: **A shooter to shooter injury is covered or provided for in the liability to the other shooter or to any third party**
(Items 1-7 as below are not covered by ACTA policy.)

1. Shooter shoots his own foot.
2. Official (or voluntary helper) injures himself whilst acting as an official.
3. Visitor alighting from a car slips on a banana skin.
4. Club officials and helpers burn off the grass before high summer and whilst doing so the fire gets out of control and causes damage to a car belonging to one of the officials or helpers or to any other person.
5. During the period of a shoot, some children clamber onto a motor vehicle and cause damage.
6. A lady (or a male) visitor is scalded with a cup of tea in the clubhouse.
7. Trap mechanics, trap loaders, scorers, referees (who are paid) must by law be protected by a workers' compensation policy effective within the Australian State concerned and which must be obtained by each club.

Mr Neill, we can insure against anything but this will cost money. The Executive Committee, under the requirements of the International Olympic Committee sought and obtained the above policy and no further

extension of the policy is deemed necessary, to the best of their finding and to their belief of shooter desires.

I trust that the above sets the facts out more simply and fully answers your questions.

Dear Merv,

May I take a few minutes of your time, and perhaps a few lines in the A.C.T.A. News to say "Well Done" to the many people involved in schoolboys clay target shooting, and in particular to Mr Lyn Barr, the Principal of the Rainbow High School for his efforts.

As a registered A.C.T.A. Referee and trap shooter for a number of years, I am prompted to write to you and enclose cutting from local newspaper in respect to a Winchester-sponsored Schoolboy's Championship held at Rainbow High School on June 19 this year. I attended this Shoot in the company of Ken Lowry and Brian Mark both of Winchester Aust. Pty. Ltd.

On arrival at the shooting grounds, situated on the School property, I found a single DTL layout using the old Rainbow Gun Club's Snipe Traps, and a hive of activity behind the shooting lanes, which included a barbecue, a tent with a fine display of shooting equipment, P.A. System, well defined safety area, spectator area and seating accommodation, Score Boards etc., in fact a credit to the organisers.

Of the 98 students taking part in the days activities, over 80 were shooters. Of these two were girls. They came from eight different schools and spectators were estimated to be in excess of 200.

Shooting was divided into two sections — Junior, and Senior — with a team trophy and individual trophies 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each section. Conditions were not good as we know them in as much as the Trap (because of the area available) faces North. The day was very bright with a blustery wind from right to left. All shooting was single barrel, ten targets, two visits. The result from the boys would leave some of our seasoned shooters with very red faces. Although no possibles were shot, two junior boys scored nine each with another four scoring eight each. In the senior event five boys shot eight each. Some very fine shooting was seen in the shoot-off to break up the placings in both events.

Overall, the highlight of the day was the very competent manner in which, without exception, the boys handled the guns. I did not see even the most minor breach of safety.

On speaking to Mr Lyn Barr, I discovered that he has been promoting schoolboy shooting for over 10 years, in fact, Rainbow is his third school where he has had some success. His previous endeavours were at Mansfield and Corryong High Schools where he was involved in the North-East Schoolboy's Championship held at Benalla.

Here 200 boys took part, some travelling from as far away as White Hills in Bendigo. At Rainbow school he formed a club, and as a basic course for the boys, six weeks of lectures embracing all aspects of shooting and safety concluding with shooting at sports periods in the form of Clinics through to small competitions in squads. Mr Barr said that this is the third year that he has been able to receive a grant from the Commonwealth Innovation fund of \$400 per year to assist. Also this year from the Treasury fund set up from Junior licence fees he has received a grant of \$140.

Under supervision, one of the senior boys from Rainbow High School reloads all the cartridges used for their shooting. The cost to date averages around four cents per shot for these boys.

May I, along with the many grateful boys, parents and organisers of the sport, add my thanks to Winchester Australia for their part in this excellent event and for their very generous donation of trophies and clay targets.

I am also led to believe that I.M.I. Aust. is also to be congratulated for their foresight in sponsoring another shoot of this type at Rainbow to be held on December 4, 1975.

Wagga Travel Service, in conjunction with Barney Rooke, are arranging for Australian shooters, their families and friends, to visit New Zealand, departing Sydney by Air New Zealand, 7.30 a.m. March 17, with the main body of shooters, returning 10 days later.

The following is the approximate costings of what each person will have to pay.

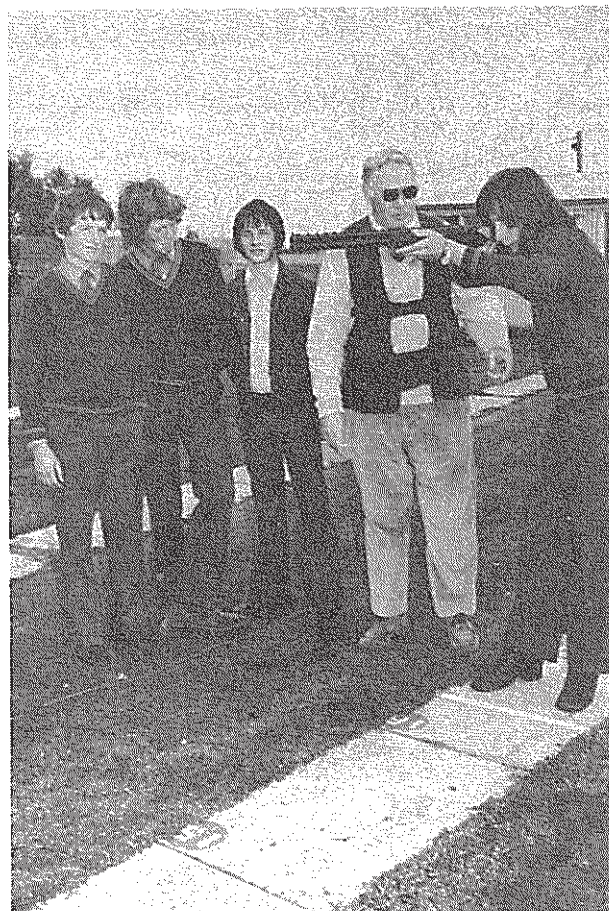
